NEW BEARS HEADQUARTERS

On Friday, May 12, 1995, Bears President and CEO, Michael McCaskey, announced groundbreaking on a new \$15-million facility which will become the team's year-round headquarters. The facility will be an extension of Conway Park, a 200-acre office park, located on route 60 just east of the Tri-State Tollway in Lake Forest. The complex is expected to be completed by August, 1996.

The club purchased 37.5 acres of land from the Carroll family of Lake Forest and will initially utilize 20 acres to build the new office complex, indoor practice facility, and two outdoor football fields. The remaining land will remain unused, allowing the club flexibility for future expansion if needed.

The complex will include a 70,000 square-foot building — more than double the size of Halas Hall — that will house all club operations. Plans call for an expanded lockerroom, training room, and weight area that will include a lap pool for hydro-therapy rehabilitation. The new facility will also feature a theatre which accommodated 100-150 people and a racketball court. An indoor 100-yard field will also be part of the complex. The structure of the indoor practice facility is not yet determined, although designs have been submitted for a fabric roof.

The initial development phase includes preparation of the two outdoor fields which will be ready for the latter part of the 1995 season. One of the two outdoor fields will have an underground heating system which will keep the ground soft and grass growing into the early part of winter.

Two other elements of the outdoors area are a "climb-hill" and a jogging / bike path. The climb-hill is a popular form of conditioning which has become more widespread after being highly endorsed by Walter Payton. The jogging / bike path will be constructed throughout the 37 acres.

"Over the past several years I have visited the facilities of many NFL teams," says McCaskey. "The new complex will be a combination of ideas taken from those facilities along with some of our own. It will be a state-of-the-part pro football complex and allow our players the best chance to prepare for championship seasons."

EDWARD W. McCASKEY Chairman of the Board

The senior member of Bears' management and a well-respected leader of the National Football League is Ed McCaskey.

Named the second Chairman of the Board in the club's 75-year history on November 11, 1983, McCaskey succeeded team founder, George S. Halas. Prior to his current position McCaskey served 17 years as the team's Vice President and Treasurer.

McCaskey has been an executive with the Bears since 1967. His responsibilities include spearheading the club's civic activities and representing the team at the annual owners' meetings, Super Bowl and Pro Bowl.

An entertaining speaker along with his warm and outgoing personality have made McCaskey a natural for community involvement programs. He is a trustee for the Piccolo Children's Fund, the Chicago Association for Retarded Citizens, and the Charlie Conacher Research Fund at the Toronto General Hospital. He was also a member of the board of directors for the Michigan Avenue National Bank, NFL Films, and the Central States Institute of Addiction before he stepped down from those duties in 1987.

McCaskey's numerous charitable and civic contributions on behalf of the Chicago Bears and the McCaskey family have been well documented. Ed served as the guiding force behind the Brian Piccolo Fund since its inception in 1970 and was chairman of the Piccolo committee until 1987. The Brian Piccolo Fund was transferred recently to Rush Presbyterian in Chicago after the fund donated more than \$2 million to Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York. With this money, embryonal cell carcinoma, which was virtually 100 percent fatal when it took Piccolo's life in 1970, now has a 95 percent cure rate. McCaskey was a close friend of Piccolo and worked with Screen Gems in production of the popular movie "Brian's Song". He also was the liaison between the NFL owners and the Piccolo Golf Tournament.

McCaskey was in the music publishing business in New York and was associated with the late Jimmy Dorsey following a stint with the U.S. Army in WW II. McCaskey served with the 80th infantry in France—enlisting as a private and leaving with a Captain's rank. He was duly honored in the spring of 1988 when he received a Bronze Star Medal and Combat Infantry Badge acknowledging his satisfactory performance of duty while an infantry officer in active ground combat.

Before joining the Bears, McCaskey was a merchandising manager for the National Retail Tea and Coffee Association; Executive Vice President of Merchandise Services, Inc. and an account executive for E.F. McDonald Co.

Born April 27, 1919, in Philadelphia, McCaskey sang with dance bands for three years before enrolling at the University of Pennsylvania in 1940. While at Penn he was elected class president and also continued a singing career. McCaskey played offensive tackle at Lancaster Catholic High in Pennsylvania.

McCaskey and his wife, Virginia, have 11 children, 19 grandchildren and one great grandchild.



MICHAEL B. McCASKEY

President and Chief Executive Officer

As President and Chief Executive Officer of the Chicago Bears, Michael McCaskey focuses on making a return trip to the Super Bowl and finding the club a new stadium for the 21st century.

The Bears made significant progress on the field last season, winning 10 games while advancing to the NFL's final eight. Meanwhile, McCaskey's efforts to relocate the Bears to a new home are also on a fast track as McCaskey is pursuing a stadium designed specifically for football

which would be appealing for spectators and include first-rate amenities.

"A new stadium is an absolute necessity for the Bears and our fans," says McCaskey. "The Bears have been striving to get a new home for 25 years. With our lease expiring, building a new stadium is urgent."

In addition to the stadium proposal, McCaskey continues to upgrade the club's facilities to become among the best in the NFL. A new year-round headquarters is currently being constructed in Lake Forest, a structure which McCaskey says will be "as good as any football facility in the NFL."

The emphasis on upgrading facilities coincides with a team that continues to improve on the field. The Bears have been aggressive in free agent acquisitions under McCaskey's leadership as six free agents were added to the 1994 starting lineup on a team that improved two games over 1993. In addition, Dave Wannstedt, who was McCaskey's handpicked coach, garnered several Coach of the Year honors.

McCaskey's first decade was highlighted by eight playoff appearances, three trips to the NFC title game and a Super Bowl victory. Since being named the club's top executive on November 11, 1983, McCaskey has established himself as one of the most successful leaders in professional sports. The Bears have won 63% of their games and had eight winning seasons in McCaskey's 11 full seasons with the club. Chicago emerged as one of the most entertaining and visible champions in sports history in 1985 by posting an 18-1 record capped by a 46-10 victory over New England in Super Bowl XX. McCaskey received the highest honor bestowed on a football executive following the '85 season when his peers voted him *The Sporting News* NFL Executive of the Year.

McCaskey's impressive educational and business background have been invaluable in an era when NFL owners need to battle financial burdens with shrewd resourcefulness. He earned a Ph.D. in business and spent ten years as a business professor and consultant. The NFL has also utilized his strong business acumen, appointing McCaskey to the league's Finance Committee in 1989 and NFL Properties Executive Committee in 1994. The recommendations and input from those two committees are vital to the league's continued success and fiscal stability.

McCaskey met his family's wishes and assumed the enormous task of becoming the chief executive officer of a NFL franchise after operating a business consulting firm in Boston. His two predecessors in the club presidency were McCaskey's grandfather, George Halas — the founder of professional football and the Chicago Bears — and Michael's uncle, the late George S. Halas, Jr.

McCaskey was indoctrinated to pro football as a youngster. He spent summers in rural Indiana working at the Bears training camp and fall weekends at Wrigley Field watching his grandfather coach the team. McCaskey's interest in the game flourished as he enjoyed a playing career at Notre Dame High School in Niles and at Yale University, where he was a two-year letterman at wide receiver.

Following graduation in 1965, McCaskey spent two years with the Peace Corps teaching in Ethiopia — an association which led to his appointment in 1991 to the Peace Corps National Advisory Council. He then earned a doctorate in business at Case Western Reserve University before teaching at UCLA and the Harvard Business School. He started a consulting company with his wife, Nancy, and authored a book, *The Executive Challenge: Managing Change and Ambiguity* before joining the Bears.

During this past off-season, McCaskey established "Bears Care", a charitable fund of the Robert R. McCormick Tribune Foundation which will focus on youth athletic activities in addition to helping the physically challenged and economically disadvantaged. He is also personally involved with the Clearbrook Center — a school for handicapped children and Cardinal Bernadin's Big Shoulders Program which assists inner city Catholic schools. Born December 11, 1943, Michael and Nancy have two children: John Piersol (6/5/84) and Kathryn Cahill (5/11/89).



TED PHILLIPS Vice President of Operations / CFO

The task of managing the NFL salary cap and its complexities are in the capable hands of Ted Phillips, who has been involved in player contracts for the past 10 years.

Phillips was promoted to Vice President of Operations on March 24, 1993 by club President Michael McCaskey. His primary duty continues to be negotiating all player contracts and serving as the Bears' in-house salary cap expert. He also oversees all departments within the organization, other than coaching and player personnel, and serves as the club's chief financial officer. He is also the Bears' main liaison with the NFL office and the NFL Management Council.

Prior to assuming his new duties, Phillips served as the club's Director of Finance since 1987. In addition to handling player contracts and the CBA, Phillips was also responsible for the accounting staff and served as the club's chief financial officer. He added the training, video, and equipment departments to his jurisdiction on January 19, 1989, following the retirement of Bear administrator Bill McGrane.

Phillips joined the Bears staff on September 28, 1983, as the club's controller, a position he held for four years. He assisted in preparing and constructing player contracts for two years (1985-86) prior to becoming a full-time negotiator in 1987.

Before joining the Bears, Phillips was employed as an auditor and tax accountant with the international accounting firm of Ernst & Whinney (now Ernst & Young), from 1979-83. He graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 1979 with a degree in business and accounting. He earned his masters in management from Northwestern University in 1989.

Born June 27, 1957, in Oneida, New York, Phillips grew up in Nashua, New Hampshire. He and his wife, Katie, have one son (Matthew).



TIM McCASKEY Vice President

An officer of the Bears since 1989, Timothy McCaskey joined the club in a full-time capacity March 24, 1993, when he was named Vice President.

Tim had been affiliated with the club part-time for four years before joining the Bears full-time after serving as Director of Taxes for IMC Fertilizer, Inc. He spent 18 years with that company and its predecessor, International Minerals & Chemical Corporation.

A 1967 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, McCaskey spent seven years with Ernst & Ernst (now Ernst & Young). McCaskey has four children (Kevin, Brian, Scott, and Laura).



ROD GRAVES

Director of Player Personnel

Rod Graves begins his 12th season in the Bears scouting department and his third as Director of Player Personnel. Graves was promoted to his current position on April 11, 1993 after spending nine years as a regional scout and one season as Director of College Scouting.

Graves coordinates the work of the Bears' regional college scouts and pro personnel department in filling needs through the draft and free agency. He also personally scouts the top college players throughout the country and works closely with Michael McCaskey and Dave Wannstedt and his coaching staff in preparations for the annual collegiate draft.

Graves has been a vital cog in the Bears draft success since his arrival. Among the players from his region who were drafted by the Bears are Wilber Marshall, William Perry, Neal Anderson, Wendell Davis, Trace Armstrong, and Donnell Woolford. He also scouted the likes of undrafted free agents such as Tom Waddle and James Williams.

Graves, 36, joined the Bears in 1984 as a regional scout, responsible for the east and southeast regions. He continued to scout those regions while being elevated to Assistant Director of Player Personnel on June 14, 1989. Before joining the Bears, Graves worked for the USFL's Philadelphia Stars where he spent 1982 as a regional scout and 1983 as Assistant Director of Player Personnel.

A native of Houston and a graduate of Texas Tech, Graves moved to the Chicago area in the summer of 1992 after being based in Atlanta. He is married (Alesia).



TIM LeFEVOUR

Director of Administration

Two key items on the Bears agenda are a new stadium and year-round facility — projects which Tim LeFevour is intricately involved.

LeFevour begins his 15th season with the Bears and his seventh as Director of Administration. In addition to his involvement with the stadium and training facility, LeFevour also works with the skybox operation, ticket office, grounds, equipment and video departments as well as the club's facilities, travel, mini-camp and training camp operations. He is the contact with the NFL office on administrative matters, oversees stadium affairs, and is the club's liaison with the Chicago Park District.

LeFevour spearheaded the construction of McBubble — the Bears' indoor practice facility in Waukegan — which was erected in 1990 and renovated in 1992. One year later, he coordinated the club's new office space and ticket office relocation to Lake Forest.

LeFevour joined the Bears as Skybox Manager in 1981 and was promoted to Stadium Operations Manager on February 22, 1984. In the latter role he was involved in the installation of 56 skyboxes and natural grass at Soldier Field. He was named Director of Administration on January 19, 1989.

Before joining the Bears, LeFevour worked for the Chicago Park District as a writer in the Public Information Office (1979-81) and was an assistant director at WGN-TV (1979).

LeFevour earned a BA degree in political science from Loras (Iowa) College in 1978. He is currently involved in several charitable and civic functions and is on the Board of Directors of the Brian Piccolo Golf Tournament and Red Cloud.

Born June 25, 1956, in Chicago, LeFevour and his wife, Judy, have four children (Megan, Matthew, Katie, Amy).



PATRICK McCASKEY

Director of Community Involvement

Patrick McCaskey was named to his current position on February 11, 1984 after serving the club as Public Relations Director (1982-83), Assistant Public Relations Director (1974-81), and Ticket Assistant (1974).

As Director of Community Involvement, McCaskey works with the following organizations: Athletes In Action, Bears Flag Football, Bears Learning Corps, Cabrini-Green Legal Aid Clinic, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, First Colonial Bankshares Foundation, Illinois Special Olympics, Lake Forest/Bears Golf Day, Lake County Special Education, Lawndale Community Church, Lewis University, Maryville Chuckwagon Day, Michigan Avenue National Bank, Notre Dame High School, Brian Piccolo Cancer Research Fund, and Saint Joseph Hospital.

He also manages home game anthem singers and halftime shows.

McCaskey's column, "Religion, Family, & Sports," is published in the northwest suburban Journal newspapers and in the Bears' home game programs. When he has speaking engagements for the Bears, he performs his stories and poems. He is a masters competitor for the Jim Spivey Running Club.

McCaskey and his wife, Gretchen, have three sons, Edward, Thomas, and James.



KEN VALDISERRI

Director of Marketing / Broadcasting

Ken Valdiserri was named to his current position on January 19, 1989, after serving the club as Director of Public Relations from 1984-88.

Valdiserri engineers the team's broadcast, marketing, promotional, and merchandising efforts. He oversees the development of all the team's corporate sponsorship programs and is responsible for the production and advertising sales of all the Bears "in house" television and radio broadcast properties.

In 1995, the club will again produce and sell the advertising for Bears' pre-season games, *The Dave Wannstedt TV Show*, and *Chicago Bears Weekly*, all which will be broadcast on WBBM-TV (Ch. 2) for the next two seasons. In addition, the team continues its "in-house" control of *The Dave Wannstedt Radio Show* (Monday's at 6:30 PM) and *Chicago Bear Insider*, both programs which air on the team's flagship radio station, WGN.

In 1991, the Bears became just the second NFL team to gain control of their broadcast and advertising sales of their pre-season games. The previous year the organization unveiled its 30-minute television show, *Chicago Bears Weekly*, and produced a quarterly newsletter for sponsors and season ticket holders.

In 1994, Valdiserri engineered the club's 75th anniversary marketing and promotional efforts which included the publishing of a 240-page commemorative book titled: *The Bears: A 75-year Celebration*. The team also hosted a "Throwbacks Weekend" at Soldier Field when the Bears played the Vikings, Sunday, September 18. The team has introduced a National Fan Club last year which quickly attracted over 4,000 members from all 50 states and 10 foreign countries.

Before joining the Bears on March 4, 1984, Valdiserri was Assistant Public Relations Director for the Chicago White Sox (1981-83) and an administrative assistant in the Baseball Commissioner's Office in New York (1980).

A graduate of the University of Notre Dame, Valdiserri spent three years working in the Irish sports information office while earning a degree in communication arts in 1980.

Born February 18, 1958, in South Bend, Valdiserri and his wife, Annika, reside in Chicago. They have one son, Niklas, born March 14, 1995.







DAVE WANNSTEDT

Third year

After just two seasons as a head coach in the NFL, Dave Wannstedt has already established himself among the elite in his profession. Wannstedt led the Bears back to the playoffs in 1994 after a three-year hiatus. The team's 9-7 regular season mark earned a wild card berth which led to first round upset of NFC Central champion Minnesota.

Wannstedt's performance did not go unnoticed among pro football critics. He was named NFC Coach of the Year by *Football News*, UPI and Kansas City's 101 Club and was among the top three finishers for the NFL Coach of Year by AP, Pro Football Writers, *The Sporting News*, *Pro Football Weekly*, and *Football Digest*.

The Bears were one of four NFC Central teams in the playoffs, a berth earned after a four-game winning streak at midseason moved the team from 4-4 to 8-4. The Bears posted a season-high 35 points in beating the Vikings in the playoffs, only to lose to eventual Super Bowl champion San Francisco the next week. Six of Chicago's seven losses in 1994 were against playoff teams and among the Bears wins were triumphs over four-time defending AFC Champion Buffalo and at Miami.

Wannstedt's first season in Chicago ended with a 7-9 record highlighted by two impressive winning streaks. After an 0-2 start, the Bears won three straight games including a 17-6 win against the then undefeated Philadelphia Eagles (4-0) at Veterans Stadium. A four-game winning streak, which included a NFL-first three road wins in 12 days, had Chicago in a first-place tie in the NFC Central with four games remaining. A season of close games saw six of the Bears nine losses decided by a touchdown or less. Nevertheless, the Bears were in the midst of the playoff chase until the 17th week of the season as the team improved two games from their 5-11 record in 1992. Again, Wannstedt was among the top vote getters in the NFL Coach of the Year award.

The Bears roster has changed considerably since Wannstedt's arrival. The 1993 team featured 23 new players who weren't on the 1992 team. The 1994 team had more significant changes by adding free agents Erik Kramer, Steve Walsh, Lewis Tillman, Andy Heck and trading for Jeff Graham, who emerged as the club's leading receiver last season. Wannstedt continues to also build through the draft. Five players from Wannstedt's first draft — Curtis Conway, Carl Simpson, Chris Gedney, Todd Perry and Albert Fontenot — joined 1994's rookie phenom, Raymont Harris, as starters.

Wannstedt was named the 11th head coach in club history on January 19, 1993. He was the choice of club President Michael McCaskey after serving four years as defensive coordinator of the Dallas Cowboys where he emerged as the most sought after NFL head coaching candidate following the 1992 season.

The exclamation point to Wannstedt's tenure in Dallas came in Super Bowl XXVII when his defense forced nine turnovers as the Cowboys routed the Buffalo Bills, 52-17. Wannstedt's '92 defense was the youngest in the NFL yet ranked first in the league, allowing an average of just 245.8 yards. Amazingly, the Cowboys did not have a defensive player named to the Pro Bowl. The Cowboys improved from a 1-15 team when Wannstedt became defensive coordinator in 1989, to a 16-3 club in his final season.

Wannstedt was named *The National's* NFL Assistant of the Year in 1990 as his club led the league against the pass and was 18th against the run. In 1991, the Cowboys improved to ninth against the run and this past season they were tops in the NFL allowing just 77.8 yards rushing per game. Wannstedt's success made him a finalist for the Pittsburgh Steelers head job following the 1991 season, prompting Jimmy Johnson to give Wannstedt the additional position of Assistant Head Coach in January, 1992.

Wannstedt began his coaching career in 1975 as defensive line coach at the University of Pittsburgh. After four years at Pitt he followed Johnson to Oklahoma State where he served two years as defensive line coach and two years as defensive coordinator. He joined Ted Tollner's staff at USC (1983-85) before becoming defensive coordinator at the University of Miami (1986-88). At Miami, his defense held opponents to 2.2 yards-per-carry and 10.9 points-per-game while averaging 48 sacks a season. Wannstedt's defenses produced 11 players who were drafted by the NFL, five in the first two rounds. As a collegiate assistant, Wannstedt's teams had a 106-44-4 record, including a 6-3 mark in Bowl games. Combined with a 5-2 mark in NFL playoff games, his overall post-season record is 11-5. In 20 seasons of coaching in major college and the NFL, Wannstedt has been on 14 winning teams, 10 Bowl teams and one Super Bowl champion.

A Pittsburgh native, David Raymond Wannstedt was born on May 21, 1952, and graduated from

Baldwin High. He attended the University of Pittsburgh where he earned a bachelors degree in physical education and a masters in curricular supervision. Wannstedt played offensive tackle (1970-73) and captained the team his senior year which featured freshman running back Tony Dorsett. Wannstedt was selected by the Green Bay Packers in the 15th round of the 1974 draft but spent the season on Injured Reserve with a foot injury. He subsequently joined Johnny Major's staff at Pittsburgh.

Wannstedt is active in charitable endeavors and serves on the board of directors of Children's Memorial Hospital. He and his wife, Jan, have two daughters — Keri (18) and Jami (14).

RON TURNER

Offensive Coordinator / QBs

Ron Turner joined the Bears staff as offensive coordinator prior to the 1993 season. In addition, Turner coaches quarterbacks and calls offensive plays from the press box. Bears quarterbacks Steve Walsh and Erik Kramer set club marks for pass attempts, completions, yards and completions percentage last season while the offense averaged 60 more yards per game over 1993.

The 41-year old Turner entered the pro ranks after a successful college coaching career. In 1992, in his only year as a head coach, Turner led San Jose State to a 7-4 record, second in the Big West.

The Spartans gained over 400 yards per game while averaging 30 points, ranking 15th in the nation. Turner was courted for the vacant Stanford head coaching position following the 1994 collegiate season but decided to remain with the Bears.

Turner spent the previous 15 years as an assistant at the major college level. He earned the SJSU top job after coordinating the Stanford offense for three seasons under Dennis Green where he helped develop Tommy Vardell (Browns) and Glyn Milburn (Broncos).

As a player, Turner was a second-team wideout JUCO all-American at Diablo Valley before transferring to Pacific. He led UOP in receiving in 1975 and 1976, totaling 40 catches for 666 yards and three TDs. The following season he spent with Pacific as a graduate assistant before landing as receivers coach at Arizona. In 1981, Turner joined Green at Northwestern where he coached Sandy Schwab to a pair of NCAA single game records (45 completions, 71 pass attempts) and several freshman marks.

Turner became the quarterback coach at Pittsburgh in 1983 before taking a similar post at USC in 1985. As part of Ted Tollner's staff, Turner worked with Dave Wannstedt who was a defensive assistant. In 1986, Turner's duties expanded to include receivers and offensive coordinator where he worked with 1988 Heisman runner-up, Rodney Peete and Sean Salisbury. In 1987 when Larry Smith took over the Trojan program, Turner was the lone assistant retained and moved to receivers coach. The following season, he joined Texas A&M as the quarterback coach. In his college tenure, Turner was part of six bowl teams.

Turner's brother, Norv, just completed his first year as Head Coach of the Washington Redskins, after helping the Dallas Cowboys win two Super Bowls as offensive coordinator. Ron was born December 5, 1953 in Marinez, CA. He and his wife, Wendy, have four children: sons Morgan and Cameron and daughters Callan and Madison.

BOB SLOWIK

Defensive Coordinator / DBs

Bob Slowik was among the first hires of Dave Wannstedt in January 1993, as defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. Slowik came to the Bears from the Dallas Cowboys staff, where he was a defensive assistant in 1992.

The Bears defense ranked as high as fifth in fewest total yards allowed in 1994 before finishing 13th. The pass defense ranked first in the NFL through 13 weeks and finished fifth, while the rush defense improved dramatically throughout the year, holding six of the final eight opponents under 80 yards on the ground. The Bears were the toughest in the NFC to score on In-the-20 and allowed just four scoring plays longer than 20 yards. Chicago finished 10th in the NFL in total points allowed. In 1993, Slowik's first year as a NFL defensive coordinator, his unit finished fourth in the NFL in fewest yards while allowing just 230 points, third best in the league.

At Dallas, Slowik's primary responsibility was the nickel defense which proved to be one of the league's best in 1992 — allowing teams an NFL-low 27.2% on third down attempts. The Cowboys defense was best in yards allowed (249.5/game), rushing yards allowed (77.8/game), first downs (241), rushing first downs (68), third down conversions (50), and third down defense (27.2%), and was second in the league in average gain per play.

Prior to joining the Cowboys, Slowik coached outside linebackers at East Carolina from 1990-92 helping the Pirates to their highest national ranking (ninth) and best record (11-1) in school history in his final year. Following a Peach Bowl victory over NC State on Jan. 1, 1992, Slowik was named defensive coordinator; soon thereafter he joined the Cowboys.

Slowik was a two year starting cornerback at the University of Delaware where he helped the Fightin' Blue Hens to a 16-6 record his final two seasons. Delaware reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs his senior season. Slowik received both his undergraduate and master's degree in physical education from Delaware.

His coaching career started as a grad assistant for Delaware (1977). He then became a part-time defensive assistant at Florida (1979-82) where wife Carol was the Head Women's Track Coach. Slowik became the secondary coach at Drake in 1983 before joining the Rutgers staff in 1984 in the same capacity.

Slowik was born in Pittsburgh on May 16, 1954. Bob and Carol have four children: Ryan, Andrea, Bobby, and Steven.

ASSISTANT COACHES



TONY WISE

Assistant Head Coach / Offensive Line

Tony Wise's valuable contribution to the Chicago Bears was recognized during this past off-season when he was promoted to Assistant Head Coach. Wise, who joined the Bears after serving as the offensive line coach of the Dallas Cowboys from 1989-92, begins his third season with the Bears.

Wise's offensive line showed marked improvement from 1993, allowing just 25 sacks in 1994 (eighth best in NFL) compared to 48 the previous season. In addition, the unit was flagged for just two holding penalties all season. Although three of the five spots featured new starters from 1993 — tackles Andy Heck and James Williams and right guard Jay Leeuwenburg — the five starters missed just seven starts all season.

In his final season in Dallas, Wise's unit produced two Pro Bowl players in guard Nate Newton and center Mark Stepnoski. None of the Cowboys' starters on the 1992 offensive line was higher than a third-round pick. The Cowboys led the NFL in rushing in 1992 and were second in fewest sacks allowed. Wise joined the Cowboys in 1989 where he immediately endured a 1-15 season. There was a bright side as his line allowed just 30 sacks, tying the Cowboys record for fewest sacks allowed which was set in the 14-game season of 1974.

Wise was with Jimmy Johnson for four seasons in Miami where the Hurricanes had their two best offensive seasons ever in 1985 (461.5 avg.) and 1988 (452.5 avg.). In the 1988 Orange Bowl, the Hurricanes started three linemen at new positions but still defeated Oklahoma, 20-14.

Wise began his career at Albany State in 1973 coaching the outside linebackers. He served one-year stints at Bridgeport, Central Connecticut State, and Washington State before joining the Pittsburgh staff in 1977 where he first coached with Dave Wannstedt. Two seasons later he moved to Oklahoma State for a five-year stint where his line blocked for national rushing leader Ernest Anderson in 1981. He spent the 1984 season at Syracuse before joining Miami in 1985.

Anthony Charles Wise was born in Albany, NY on December 28, 1951, and graduated from Shaker High in Latham, NY. He lettered in football, lacrosse, and hockey at Ithaca College.



IVAN FEARS

Wide Receivers

Ivan Fears joined the Bears staff following the 1992 season after spending the previous two years as receivers coach of the New England Patriots. Fears' corps enjoyed a productive 1994 season as Jeff Graham caught 68 passes, the most by a Bear wide receiver since Dick Gordon's 71 catches in 1970. Curtis Conway improved from his rookie season to catch 39 passes despite missing four games with a thigh injury. One of Fears' former players at New England, Michael Timpson, was Chicago's key free agent addition on offense this past off-season.

Before joining the pro ranks, Fears spent the previous 11 seasons as receivers coach at Syracuse (1980-1990) under ex-Patriots coach Dick McPherson. Eight of the Orangemen's top 10 single season reception and yardage leaders were coached by Fears including current all-pro Rob Moore and former pros Scott Schwedes, and Tommy Kane. Two of Fears' coaching mates at Syracuse were current Bears' assistants Tony Wise and Clarence Brooks.

A three-year letterman at William and Mary (1973-75), Fears career as a running back was cut short by three knee operations. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for his alma mater in 1976, coached the wide receivers in 1977, and handled the quarterbacks for two years (1978-79) before joining the Orangemen.

The 40-year old Fears is a native of Suffolk, Virginia. He starred at John Yates High and was twice named the school's Outstanding Player of the Year. He also earned all-state honors as a senior.

Born November 15, 1954 in Portsmouth, VA, Ivan and his wife Beverly have two sons (Joshua and Aaron) and one daughter (Kimberly).



WILLIE PEETE


Running Backs

The most recent addition to Dave Wannstedt's coaching staff is Willie Peete, who joined the Bears as running backs coach on January 20, 1995. Peete has spent the last 12 seasons as a NFL assistant, including the last eight years in the NFC Central division. He replaces Joe Pendry, who joined the Carolina Panthers as offensive coordinator.

The most recent stop on Peete's 35-years in coaching was in Tampa Bay, where he spent the past two seasons as running backs coach on Sam Wyche's staff. He held the same position in Green Bay from 1987-91 after joining the NFL ranks on John Mackovic's staff in Kansas City (1983-86).

Peete's coaching career started at his alma mater, the University of Arizona, in 1960, where he served three years as a graduate assistant. He was a standout fullback for the Wildcats from 1956-59 where he played under former Bears assistant coach Jim LaRue. He graduated with a degree in physical education and a master's degree in secondary education. Peete coached Mesa (AZ) High School to the State AA football title in 1962 and then coached football and basketball for eight years at Westwood High in Mesa which included a state football title in 1963. Peete was inducted into the Mesa Sports Hall of Fame last year. He returned to Arizona in 1971 and coached running backs for 12 years on a staff that included Ron Turner (1978-80). Peete's youngest son, Rodney, later played under Turner for three seasons at USC (Dave Wannstedt was also on USC staff).

Born July 14, 1937, in Mesa, Arizona, Peete and his wife, Edna, have two sons who have excelled in football: Willie Skip is an assistant coach at Rutgers while Rodney is playing for the Philadelphia Eagles.



MIKE SHULA

Tight Ends

The youngest member of Dave Wannstedt's coaching staff is 30-year old Mike Shula who enters his third season as Tight Ends coach. Under Shula's direction, Chicago's tight ends caught a league-high eight touchdown passes in 1994.

Shula spent the 1991 and 1992 seasons with the Miami Dolphins as both a coaching assistant and pro scouting assistant working under Director of Player Personnel Tom Heckert.

He joined the Dolphins after spending three seasons working for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers under his college coach, Ray Perkins. He

started as an offensive assistant/quarterback coach in 1988 and 1989 and served as quarterback coach in 1990.

An all-SEC quarterback as a senior at Alabama (1983-86), Shula led the Crimson Tide to a pair of bowl wins. He became just the second player in school history to pass for over 2,000 yards in one season (2,009 in 1985). Shula graduated with a bachelor's degree in labor relations and was a 12th round selection by Tampa Bay in 1986. He was waived in the final cutdown and rejoined the team later in the season following the players strike.

Born in Baltimore on June 3, 1965, Mike is the third Shula coaching in the NFL. Father Don has been a head coach for 30 years and broke George Halas' all-time victory record in 1992 while brother David begins his fourth season in charge of the Cincinnati Bengals. He is single.

ASSISTANT COACHES



CLARENCE BROOKS

Defensive Line

Clarence Brooks was named the Bears defensive line coach on February 5, 1993 after spending 16 years as an assistant at the collegiate level. Brooks has the youngest group on the team with the top six linemen having four years or less experience in the NFL. Alonzo Spellman improved drastically last year and finished with seven sacks while Chris Zorich (5.5 sacks, 104 tackles), Albert Fontenot (4 sacks) and Carl Simpson were also key contributors. Brooks will mix '94 rookies John Thierry and Jim Flanigan into the rotation this year.

Before joining the Bears, Brooks spent three seasons in the same capacity at the University of Arizona. In 1992, the 'Cats allowed opponents just 1.9 yards per rush and recorded 40 sacks.

Prior to joining the Arizona staff, Brooks spent nine seasons at Syracuse (1981-89): the first six in charge of outside linebackers and the final three with the defensive line. He worked under Dave Wannstedt in 1989 when he was the Cowboys minority fellowship coach during training camp.

A native of New Bedford, Mass., Brooks earned several honors as an offensive guard at Massachusetts. He was the team captain in his senior season, leading the team to a victory in the Boardwalk Bowl. After graduating from Massachusetts in 1973 with a bachelor's degree in sociology, Brooks was a coach and teacher in the New Bedford school system. He got into coaching full time when Dick McPherson hired Brooks in 1976 as the defensive ends coach at Massachusetts.

Born in New York on May 20, 1951, Clarence L. Brooks and his wife, Justa Gomes, have one son (Jason) and one daughter (Adrienne).



DAVID MCGINNIS

Linebackers

The dean of the Bears coaching staff is David McGinnis, who enters his 10th season as the club's linebackers coach. In McGinnis' nine years in Chicago, the Bears defense has ranked in the top 6 in fewest yards allowed seven times. Three different linebackers have led the team in tackles the last three seasons with Joe Cain's 129 stops pacing the Bears in 1994.

McGinnis was part of a defensive staff that led the NFL in fewest points allowed in 1986 (record low 187) and 1988 and ranked first or second in total defense in 1986, 1987, and 1988. McGinnis has coached Pro Bowl players at all three linebacker spots, Otis Wilson and Wilber Marshall on the outside and middle linebacker Mike Singletary — who made the Pro Bowl every season under McGinnis.

Prior to joining the Bears, McGinnis spent 13 years coaching at the major college level. His first assignment was as freshman coach at his alma mater, Texas Christian, in 1973-74. In 1975, he moved to Missouri to coach the linebackers and secondary. McGinnis joined the Indiana State staff in 1978 as secondary coach and was responsible for recruiting the Chicago area. He returned to TCU in 1982 for a season as defensive backfield coach before joining the Kansas State staff as defensive end and linebacker coach from 1983-85.

McGinnis was a two-year starter as a defensive back at TCU from 1970-72, earning academic all-SWC honors both seasons. His five interceptions as a junior tied Lyle Blackwood for most in the Southwest Conference.

Born on August 7, 1951, in Independence, Kansas, McGinnis grew up in Texas and attended Snyder High School. He is married (Kim).

ASSISTANT COACHES



CARLOS MAINORD

Defensive Assistant

Carlos Mainord, a 28-year coaching veteran, joined the Bears staff as a defensive assistant on February 9, 1993. Mainord works with the defensive backs and coordinates the Bears nickel defense. The Bears defense on passing downs has been among the league's best since Mainord's arrival. Chicago ranked fifth against the pass in 1994 after finishing third in 1993. On third downs, opponents converted 37.2% last season and 37.4% in 1993 — both in the NFL's top 10.

Before coming to Chicago, Mainord spent six years as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Texas Tech. He had three different stints with the Red Raiders, totaling 10 years at the school. In 1986, Mainord worked as the secondary coach for the national champion Miami Hurricanes with Dave Wannstedt after spending the three previous seasons in the same capacity at Texas Tech.

An all-district linebacker at Greenville (TX) High School, Mainord starred at Navarro Junior College before garnering all-America honors at McMurry College in 1965. Upon graduation he coached the linebackers at McMurry for two years before making his first appearance at Texas Tech as linebackers coach (1968). The following season he took the defensive coordinator position at Ranger Junior College rising to the head job in 1972. He capped his six seasons with 7-2-1 and 9-1 marks, including a Top 10 ranking, before taking a position as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator with Rice in 1978. He returned to Texas Tech in 1983 as the Red Raiders led the NCAA in pass defense and finished second in 1984.

Born in Greenville, TX on August 26, 1944, Mainord is married (Judy) and has four sons: (Matt, Mark, Tommy, and Cody) and one daughter (Cari).



DANNY ABRAMOWICZ

Special Teams

One of the key elements to the Bears success in 1994 was the special teams under the direction of Danny Abramowicz. The Bears special teams blocked five field goals, converted a fake punt, threw a TD on a fake field goal attempt, returned a punt for a touchdown, set new records for kickoff return yards in a game, recovered an onside kick, allowed the second-fewest punt return yards and fourth fewest kickoff return yards in the NFL.

Abramowicz, who begins his fourth season on Chicago's staff, graduated from Xavier University in Cincinnati in 1967 with a degree in education. He was a 17th round draft choice by the New Orleans Saints that year and played seven seasons with the Saints before concluding his career at San Francisco (1973-74). In 1969, Abramowicz led the NFL with 73 catches and was named all-pro and the Saints' MVP. He is second in Saints' history in catches (309), yards (4,875), and TDs (35), trailing Eric Martin who passed him in 1990. Abramowicz completed his pro career with 371 receptions for 5,704 yards and 39 TDs. In his final two seasons at San Francisco, Abramowicz became an outstanding special teams coverage player.

Abramowicz has been inducted into the Xavier and Saints' Halls of Fame, the National Polish Hall of Fame, and was named to the Saints' Silver Anniversary Team in 1991. Following his football career, Abramowicz was a salesman in the oil field industry and also spent five seasons on the Saints Radio Network as an analyst. He left private business in 1989 to become head coach at Jesuit High School in New Orleans where he compiled a 20-14 record before joining the Bears.

Born July 13, 1945 in Steubenville, Ohio, Dan and his wife, Claudia, have two sons (Danny, Andrew) and one daughter (Stephanie).

POINTS

Entering the 1995 season, the Bears had played 1,030 games in the regular season and playoffs. In all those games, not once have they finished with a final score of 4, 5, 8, or 11. The most common total for the Bears? Seventy-one times they were shutout, in 67 games they scored 17 points, and in 65 contests they tallied 14 points.

Opponents have never finished a game with a total of 4, 5, or 18. They have been shutout 129 times, followed by a total of 14 in 68 games and 21 points 63 times.

Points scored by both teams combined have ranged from 0 (17 times, all prior to 1933) to 89 (Colts 51, Bears 38, Oct. 4, 1958). However there has never been totals of: 1 (obviously), 4, 5, 11, 75, 83, 84, 86, and 88.





RASHAAM SALAAM

SALAAM NOTES:

- Born on October 8, 1974, Salaam was the youngest player picked in the 1995 draft — nearly six months younger than the second-youngest player selected, Corey Stringer of the Vikings. The second youngest player on the Bears roster is Jack Jackson (the other junior drafted by Chicago) who is still 23 months *older* than Salaam. Salaam is the youngest player in the NFL this year.
- Salaam wears number 31 with the Bears. He wore number 19 at Colorado, but that number is not eligible for runningbacks in the NFL. He considered number 45 (last worn on the Bears by Craig Heyward), but that number was being given extra attention as Michael Jordan's new jersey.
- Salaam is the fourth junior drafted by the Bears in the first round: Mark Carrier (1990), Alonzo Spellman (1992), Curtis Conway (1993). Overall the Bears have drafted six juniors including wide receiver Jack Jackson (fourth round of 1995) and Chris Gardocki (third round of 1991).
- As the fifth runningback selected, Salaam joins some lofty company of "overlooked" backs. Ricky Watters was the sixth back of 1991, Rodney Hampton was the fifth of '90, and Neal Anderson was the seventh of '86. Those three have totalled nine trips to the Pro Bowl.
- The last Bear runningback selected in the first round was Neal Anderson with the 26th pick of 1986. Anderson led the Bears in rushing for seven seasons and finished second only to Hall of Famer Walter Payton in rushing attempts (1,515), rushing yards (6,166), and rushing TDs (51).
- Salaam is the seventh player drafted by the Bears from Colorado, but the first first-rounder. The last Buffalo drafted was safety Dennis Collier taken in the seventh round last year (205th overall).
- Three Heisman Trophy winners have *played* with the Bears: QB Doug Flutie (who won the award in 1984), QB John Huarte (1964), and QB John Lujack (1947). Flutie played with the Bears in 1986, Huarte played in 1972, and Lujack played in 1948-51.
- Three Heisman Trophy winners have been drafted by Chicago: Tom Harmon won the award in 1940 and was drafted in 1941; Johnny Lujack, who won the award in 1947 but had already been drafted by Chicago in 1946; and Dick Kazmaier who won in 1951 and was drafted in '52.
- In 16 games last year, the Bears rushed for 1,588 yards on 487 tries (3.3 avg.). In 11 games with Colorado, Salaam gained 2,055 yards on 298 carries (6.9 avg.) last season.
- Including the playoffs, the Bears had just two rushes over 20 yards in 1994 — Salaam had 18.
- Salaam gained 67 yards on a touchdown run vs. Iowa State. The top *three* Bear rushes all season *totalled* 59 yards (25, 17, and 17).
- Exactly 20 years before selecting Salaam, the Bears also made their first-round pick a running back as Walter Payton was the fourth pick of 1975.

- The only Bear to ever lead the NFL in punting is Fred Morrison (1950).


In his senior season at Wake Forest (1964) Piccolo led the nation in scoring (111 points) and rushing (1,044 yards). He signed with the Bears as an undrafted free agent, and in four years he rushed 258 times for 927 yards and four TDs. He also caught 58 passes for 537 yards and one touchdown.

Piccolo died of embryonal cell carcinoma on June 16, 1970. He was 26 years old and left his wife, Joy, three daughters, and legions of friends.

The award is presented to the player at a banquet following the Piccolo golf tournament which helps raise money for cancer research.







BEARS HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

1920s

- 9/17/20**—George Halas, representing the Decatur Staleys, meets with representatives of 12 other clubs at Ralph Hay's Hupmobile showroom in Canton, Ohio, forming the American Professional Football Association — which later became the NFL. Membership is set at \$100.
- 1920**—The Staleys shutout 10 of their 13 foes, lose only to the Chicago Cardinals (7-6 at Normal Park) and post a 10-1-2 record. Each player is paid \$1,900 for the season.
- 1921**—Decatur Staleys become Chicago Staleys, play in Wrigley Field, and win the APFA title with 9-1-1 record. A. E. Staley gives Halas the club with \$5,000 to keep the Staleys name for the year. Halas makes Dutch Sternaman his partner.
- 1/28/22**—Franchise renamed Chicago Bears.
- 11/27/22**—First Chicago player deal: Bears buy tackle Ed Healey's contract from the Rock Island Independents for \$100—twice the going rate for a franchise that season.
- 11/22/25**—Harold "Red" Grange signs with Bears and pro football leaves its cradle. His agent C.C. (Cash & Carry) Pyle negotiates a \$100,000 deal with the Bears.
- 11/26/25**—Halas takes the Bears and Grange on a coast-to-coast tour that sees the club play 16 games from Nov. 26 through Jan. 31 interrupted only by a two-week rest. The Bears post a 11-4-1 record on the trip.
- 11/26/25**—Grange's first game—36,000 see Bears and Cardinals go 0-0 in Wrigley Field with Grange held to 36 yards.
- 1/16/26**—Grange gets two TDs as the Bears impress 75,000 in the LA Coliseum beating the LA Tigers 17-7.
- 3/1/26**—Bears open offices at 111 W. Washington.

1930s

- 1930**—After a 4-8-2 1929 season, George Halas replaces himself as head coach with Ralph Jones. Jones posts a 24-10-7 record during his three seasons.
- 12/15/30**—Bears and Cardinals play football's first indoor game on an 80-yard field in Chicago Stadium. The exhibition aids unemployment; Bears win 9-7 before 10,000 fans.
- 11/15/31**—New Yorkers (including Gov. Alfred E. Smith and Mayor Jimmy Walker) in field boxes at \$100 a seat watch Bears top Giants at Polo Grounds 12-6.

- 12/18/32**—Bronko Nagurski hits Red Grange with a two-yard TD pass and the Bears top the Portsmouth Spartans 9-0 for the NFL championship. The game was played before 11,198 indoors at Chicago Stadium on an 80-yard field.
- 1932**—Franchise loses \$18,000 prompting Dutch Sternaman to unload his half of the Bears to George Halas.
- 1933**—George Halas returns as head coach and takes club out of town for training camp for the first time. University of Notre Dame is the host.
- 11/5/33**—Boston Redskins beat Bears, 10-0, ending Chicago's 16-game unbeaten string.
- 12/17/33**—Bears use rookie Jack Manders' accurate kicking for 11 points and defeat the Giants 23-21 in the NFL's first championship game.
- 1934**—Halas University, the Bears alumni association begins. Annually, Bear veterans return during season for Homecoming Weekend.
- 1934**—Bears hold training camp at Lane Tech High in the city.
- 8/31/34**—A classic is born as 79,432 watch the NFL champion Bears held to a scoreless tie by the first College All-Star team in a game sponsored by *Chicago Tribune* Charities at Soldier Field.
- 12/2/34**—Rookie Beattie Feathers becomes first pro to rush for 1,000 yards (1,004) leading the NFL.
- 12/9/34**—Undefeated Bears slip before Giants in NFL title tilt at Polo Grounds 30-13 before 35,059. With Chicago leading 10-3 at the half, NY dons basketball sneakers and scores 27 points.
- 1935**—Training camp is conducted at St. John's Military Academy in Delafield, Wisconsin.
- 1936**—Joe Stydahar, tackle, West Virginia, is the first Bear draft pick.
- 12/12/37**—Bears win Western Division title but lose NFL Championship 28-21 to Redskins at Wrigley Field. Sammy Baugh hits 18 of 33 for 335 yards and three TDs. Jack Manders scores 15 of the Bears points. A Chicago player's share is \$127.76.

1940s

- 12/8/40**—Ten Bears tally TDs as Chicago rips Washington 73-0 for the NFL title before 36,034 in D.C. The rout signals the beginning of pro football's modern era with the formal unveiling of the T-formation. Each player receives \$873.

12/15/46—With George Halas around for the full season, the Bears whip the Giants 24-14 before a record NFL title crowd of 58,346 in the Polo Grounds. After opening with a 21-yard TD pass to Ken Kavanaugh, Sid Luckman gets the winning score on a 19-yard bootleg.

1948—Bears make the first trade for a draft choice then select QB Bobby Layne.

12/11/49—Johnny Lujack sets NFL passing record with 468 yards against the Cardinals.

1950s

12/17/50—Bears and Rams tie for Western Division title with 9-3 marks but Rams trip Bears in LA 24-14 to break the tie.

1956—Halas retires for a third time. Paddy Driscoll gets the position.

12/30/56—Giants, with their sneakers again, trounce Chicago 47-7 before 56,836 in Yankee Stadium for NFL title.

11/2/58—Bears and Rams establish NFL attendance record drawing 90,833 paid (100,470 actual) in the LA Coliseum. Rams win 41-35.

1960s

10/22/61—Bears destroy the scorching 49er shotgun formation 31-0 with Bill George playing middle guard and the defensive line stunting.

12/29/63—Bears intercept five YA Tittle passes and capture NFL title from Giants 14-10 in Wrigley Field before 45,801 and closed circuit TV. QB Bill Wade gets both TDs on two- and one-yard runs. Each Bear earns \$5,899.

1964—Flanker Johnny Morris catches NFL record 93 passes.

1965—Bears set standard for draft by selecting LB Dick Butkus and RB Gale Sayers on first round.

1965—Rookie Sayers bursts into pro football with a NFL record 22 TDs.

12/12/65—Gale Sayers scores six TDs against 49ers.

1966—Gale Sayers sets NFL combined yards record with 2,440.

5/27/68—The all-time winningest coach in football history, George Halas, retires from coaching after 40 seasons with 324 wins, 151 defeats, 31 ties.

1970s

3/19/70—George Halas elected president of the National Football Conference as NFL-AFL merge.

6/16/70—Bear running back Brian Piccolo dies of cancer. Club establishes Piccolo Fund, raising almost \$2 million for cancer research.

12/13/70—Bears say goodbye to Wrigley Field by trouncing Green Bay 35-17. They will make Soldier Field their home in 1971.

9/19/71—The Bears open at Soldier Field by defeating the Pittsburgh Steelers 17-15.

9/12/74—Jim Finks joins Bears as Vice President and General Manager after serving as Vikings' GM and NFL Management Council Advisor.

12/17/74—After three seasons and a record of 11-30-1, Abe Gibron departs as head coach.

12/31/74—Former NFL star linebacker Jack Pardee is named Bear head coach—the first non-Bear to hold the job.

7/12/75—Bears open training camp at Lake Forest College after 31 seasons in Rensselaer, Indiana.

11/20/77—Enroute to leading the NFL in rushing with a Bear record 1,852 yards, Walter Payton dashes through Vikings in Soldier Field for a NFL record 275 yards.

- 10/6/80**—Payton gains 133 rushing and 14 receiving to raise lifetime combined yardage to 9,492—breaking Sayers' club record. Bears beat Tampa 23-0 at Soldier Field.
- 12/7/80**—Bears whip Packers 61-7 at Soldier Field equaling club record for points and setting records for first downs (33) and completion percentage (83.3%, 20 of 24). Vince Evans throws for 316—most by a Bear in 10 years.
- 1/4/82**—After four seasons and a 30-35 record, Neill Armstrong departs as head coach.
- 1/20/82**—Mike Ditka, assistant offensive coach of the Dallas Cowboys, becomes head coach.

- 1985**—Bears win first 12 games of season enroute to posting 15-1 regular season mark, tying the most regular season wins by team in NFL history. Chicago claims second straight NFC Central title as club record nine players are selected to Pro Bowl.
- 1/5/86**—Bears host first playoff game since 1963 and shutout New York Giants, 21-0.
- 1/12/86**—Bears blank Los Angeles Rams, 24-0, in NFC Championship game at Soldier Field and advance to Super Bowl XX.
- 1/26/86**—Chicago sets seven Super Bowl records in first appearance including most points (46) and largest margin of victory (36) in 46-10 rout of the New England Patriots. The game was witnessed by record-setting number of viewers via television worldwide. The next day the team was greeted by an estimated 500,000 people in a ticker tape parade in downtown Chicago.
- 1986**—Bears capture third straight NFC Central title with 14-2 mark; defense allows NFL record- low 187 points. Bears lose opening round game of playoffs to Redskins, 27-13.
- 12/20/87**—Walter Payton plays final regular season game at Soldier Field and rushes for 79 yards and two TDs. "Walter Payton Day" is celebrated prior to game when club president Michael McCaskey retires jersey number 34.
- 1987**—Bears win fourth consecutive division title with 11-4 mark in strike interrupted season. Team posts four straight winning seasons, a feat last accomplished by Bears between 1946-51. Redskins come back from 14-0 deficit to beat Bears, 21-17, in playoffs.
- 1988**—Bears post 12-4 record (tied for best in NFL) and advance to NFC Championship game before losing to eventual Super Bowl Champion San Francisco. Bears finish five-year period (1984-88) with 62 wins—most by NFL team ever in such a span.

GEORGE S. HALAS

Feb. 2, 1895 – Oct. 31, 1983

Leading the Chicago Bears for more than a half-century, George S. Halas, the team's founder and head coach for 40 years, was one of the most enduring personalities in sports history. Halas was active with the Bears starting in 1920 when he founded the team.

Halas was born and raised on Chicago's west side, prepped at Crane Tech High School before attending the University of Illinois where he earned a B.S. degree while lettering in football, basketball, and baseball. After graduation in 1918, he joined the Navy for the first of two tours of duty. He was named Player of the Game in the 1919 Rose Bowl playing end on the Great Lakes team that beat the Marines 17-0. A commander when he left active duty in 1946, Halas retired as a captain in the Naval Reserve. He was also awarded the Distinguished Citizens Award—the highest honor the Navy can bestow on a civilian.

After leaving the Navy, Halas played right field for the New York Yankees, but a hip injury shortened his baseball career. Halas went to work for a Decatur (IL) corn products firm owned by an enthusiastic sports fan, Mr. A.E. Staley, who sponsored a semi-pro baseball team, and later commissioned Halas to organize an independent football team.

PRO CAREER: As a player, Halas set an NFL record (which stood until 1972) when he took a Jim Thorpe fumble 98 yards for a TD in a 26-0 win over the Oorang Indians at Wrigley Field (11/4/23). He played end for the Bears from 1920-29 and was named to the NFL All-Pro squad of the 20s.

PRO COACHING CAREER: Four times Halas interrupted his coaching activities by his own volition. He first turned over the leadership to Ralph Jones from 1930 through 1932. In 1942 when he left for the Navy, Luke Johnsos and "Hunk" Anderson shared head coaching responsibilities until '45. John "Paddy" Driscoll coached in 1956-57. Coincidentally, in '33 and again in '46 when Halas resumed coaching, his Bears won world championships.

During the 1940s, his teams reached the height of their power with four straight Western Conference titles; three world championships; a fantastic four-season record (including pre-season games) of 62-7-1 (.899); scoring 2,164 points and allowing just 842. The 1940 team, which defeated the Washington Redskins 73-0 for the World Championship, was voted the greatest professional team of all-time by the National Academy of Sports Editors in 1963.

Resuming coaching in 1958, Halas needed five years to develop another championship, but in 1963 the Bears had won their eighth championship. *The Sporting News*, AP, and UPI named him Coach of the Year after the 1963 and 1965 seasons. Halas retired from coaching on May 27, 1968, with a career record of 324-151-31. His win total was best in NFL until Don Shula broke the mark 11-14-93. He is a charter member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

GEORGE S. HALAS, JR.

Sept. 4, 1925 – Dec. 16, 1979



"Mugs" Halas was an integral part of the Chicago Bears before his untimely death in 1979. The son of pro football founder George S. Halas, "Mugs" spent 30 years in pro football. He joined the Bears' front office in 1950, was named treasurer in 1953, and became president of the club in 1963. In his first season as president, the Bears were NFL champions. "Mugs" was the second of just three presidents in the franchise's 70-year history. He succeeded his father, George S. Halas, and was followed by current president, Michael McCaskey. His numerous contributions on a league-level included membership on the executive committee of the NFL Management Council.

"Mugs" learned football at a young age, serving as a ball boy while growing up. He earned a business degree from Loyola in 1949, before entering pro football on a full-time basis. "Mugs" is remembered for his love and devotion to the game.

SOLDIER FIELD

The Chicago Bears enter their 25th year at Soldier Field after playing their first 51 seasons at Wrigley Field. Soldier Field was opened in 1924 as a 45,000-seat Municipal Grant Park Stadium. The first football game played on its field was November 22, 1924, as a capacity crowd watched Notre Dame edge Northwestern, 13-6.

It hosted the first boxing event which drew a gate of over \$2.5 million (Dempsey-Tunney, 1927), the first ski meet held in a stadium, and the all-time largest football crowd (123,000). The largest crowd for any event in Soldier Field was 260,000 on Sept. 8, 1954, for the religious Marian Year Tribute.

The 100,000-seat stadium was dedicated November 27, 1926, with Army battling Navy to a 21-21 tie. The all-time collegiate attendance record of 123,000 plus was established Nov. 26, 1927 as Notre Dame beat Southern Cal 7-6. In the first professional game at the then-mammoth stadium, the Bears defeated the Chicago Cardinals 10-0 on November 11, 1926.

Plans for the stadium started in 1919 as a memorial to the soldiers of WWI. Soldier Field stands on 10,000 pile foundations driving an average depth of 62.5 feet through fill that replaced the lake waters. The stadium is maintained and operated by the Chicago Park District.

Other stadium notes since the Bears moved to Soldier Field:

1971 — September 19th, Chicago defeats the Pittsburgh Steelers 17-15 before capacity crowd of 57,000 in the Bears' first game since moving from Wrigley.


1979 — The stadium undergoes major reconstruction and renovation prior to the season including new lighting, playing surface, and lockerrooms; rebuilding of seating area (new chairbacks, arm rests, seats); and improvement of sightlines.

1982 — Additional rebuilding of seating areas was completed as well as new concourses with more restrooms and concession areas. A new press box, 60 deluxe skyboxes and a new scoreboard were also built. Capacity is increased to 66,030.

1988 — Surface was changed from artificial turf to natural grass and 56 skyboxes were added along south rim (increasing the total to 116). Capacity is increased to 66,946.

1992 — Four seats are added increasing the capacity to the current figure of 66,950.

1994 — The Park District spends millions to refurbish the stadium for World Cup. Capacity is reduced by six to 66,944.



TRAINING CAMP

For the 12th consecutive year, the Bears' training camp will be held at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville. The site, located 180 miles northwest of Chicago, provides the Bears with five practice fields; two lockerrooms; a weight room; meeting rooms; and dorms for players, staff, media, and guests.

DATES: Players report to camp on Thursday, July 20 with practices beginning the following day. The Bears will be in Platteville through Friday, August 18 with the exception of August 3-5 and August 13-15 when they play pre-season games.

PRACTICES: Practice times are subject to change, but tentatively the morning workout starts at 9:00 AM with the afternoon session at 3:00 PM. Practices are on the UW-Platteville campus and are open to the public free of charge.

SCRIMMAGE: The Cleveland Browns will provide the opposition in the 1995 Scrimmage which will be held on Saturday, July 29 at 11:00 AM at Pioneer Stadium (10,000 seats) on the UW Platteville campus. Tickets go on sale through the UW-Platteville Ticket Office beginning June 1 (608) 342-1161.

CLEVELAND BROWNS: The Cleveland Browns will be in Platteville on July 27-29. They will practice with the Bears twice on Thursday and Friday and for the scrimmage Saturday.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS: The Bears will practice with the New Orleans Saints at the Saints' training camp facility in La Crosse, WI on Tuesday, August 8. There will be both a morning and afternoon practice. The Bears will workout in Platteville on Monday and Wednesday.

MEDIA: Credentials are required to cover practices and press conferences. They can be obtained in the basement of Porter Hall. The media work room, equipped with phones, is also located in the basement of Porter.

Located on the picturesque campus of Lake Forest College, Halas Hall is the Bears' year-round home. Named to honor the late George S. Halas, the Bears founder and one of the pioneers of the NFL, the building is dedicated to the memory of George Halas, Jr., who died December 16, 1979.

Halas Hall was opened to the players in September of '79. Coaches and administrative staff members moved into the top level of the three-story complex in November. Finishing touches were completed in May of 1980.

In the spring of 1985, the Bears' corporate offices were moved to Halas Hall from downtown. One regulation-size grass football field and one 70-yard field are situated behind the building.

Designed by Allan M. Pickus Architects and built by Pickus Construction of Waukegan, IL, the lower floor houses team meeting rooms, a player lounge, a racquetball court, rookie and staff lockers and shower areas, storage and utility rooms. The ground-level floor features the veteran's lockerroom, showers, sauna, training and weight rooms, coaches' lockerroom, equipment rooms, laundry, video lab, darkroom, computer department, and media workshop.

The top floor holds the reception area, staff offices, coaches offices, conference rooms, duplicating room, and a mini-kitchen.

On June 7, 1993, the Bears moved parts of their operation into a second Lake Forest office. The Bears closed their downtown ticket office at 55 E. Jackson while the marketing, skybox, and accounting departments moved from Halas Hall to the new offices in order to have more space.

McBUBBLE

For the fifth year the Bears will have an indoor facility for practices in inclement weather or for preparing for games on artificial turf. Located in Waukegan, it is just 10 minutes north of the team's Halas Hall headquarters in Lake Forest.

The first bubble was completed on November 21, 1990. The air-supported structure can withstand winds up to 80 MPH and can be raised or lowered in a couple of hours. A temperature of 55° F is maintained inside, and lights from the old Comiskey Park allow for late-afternoon or evening practices.

McBubble was given a \$3,000 improvement in 1993. The astroturf field remains at 80 x 60 yards, but the ceiling was raised from 50 to 66 feet to allow for punting and kickoff practice.

FROM THE LOOP — Take Edens Expressway (94 North) to 41 North (Exit 29). Exit onto Deerpath Road and head east. BEARS RADIO PLAY-BY-PLAY

WGN 720-AM

WGN, the nation's most-listened to station, has been the radio home of the Bears' since 1985 and anchors a network of over 60 stations across the country. The station also is the home of the *The Dave Wannstedt Show*. Wayne Larrivee calls play-by-play with analysis from *Pro Football Weekly's* Hub Arkush, and ex-Bear Dan Hampton. Pre-game shows begin three hours prior to kickoff. The post-game show from the lockerroom features analysis from Dave Wannstedt and key players from the game.

WAYNE LARRIVEE

The play-by-play voice of the Bears since 1985, Wayne Larrivee is one of the most versatile and talented broadcasters in the country. Larrivee currently is a major part of all three Chicago sports handling the Cubs road games and describing the action for the Bulls on WGN-TV. Larrivee's credits also include Big Ten football and basketball on Raycom and ESPN and Notre Dame basketball (ESPN). A native New Englander, Larrivee attended Emerson College in Boston and handled play-by-play for the University of Iowa, University of Colorado, and the Missouri Valley conference. Before joining WGN, Larrivee was sports director of KCMO-radio in Kansas City where he served as the Kansas City Chiefs play-by-play voice.

HUB ARKUSH

Hub Arkush begins his seventh season as a member of the Bears radio team. Arkush is publisher of *Pro Football Weekly*, a weekly periodical devoted to pro football that is widely read in NFL circles. Arkush also serves as the founder and co-host of the syndicated radio and television shows with the same name. Arkush joined WGN in 1985 as a pre-and post-game analyst before filling in during Bears broadcasts in 1987. He is a highly sought after guest on sports talk shows nationwide. Arkush is a lifetime Chicagoan who attended Deerfield High School and the University of Michigan.

DAN HAMPTON

Dan Hampton retired from the Bears in 1990 after a distinguished 12-year career at defensive end and tackle. His toughness and ability to play with pain made him one of just three Bears to play in three decades (1979-90). A first-round draft pick from the University of Arkansas, Hampton finished his Bears career with 78.5 sacks, third-best in club history. Following his playing days Hampton jumped to the TV booth, describing action for the Bears' pre-season games in 1991-92 and working two years for NBC as a NFL Analyst. He currently also hosts a sports talk show in his hometown of Little Rock.

PRE-SEASON TV

For a second season, the Chicago Bears have teamed with WBBM-TV (CBS — Channel 2 in Chicago) in televising the two non-network pre-season games to Chicago and surrounding markets. The Bears are responsible for production and advertising sales of the games. FOX's Dick Stockton handles play-by-play duties while FOX analyst and four-time Super Bowl champion linebacker Matt Millen will describe the action.

The first and last Bears pre-season games will be shown on WBBM. The Bears-Panthers game on Friday, August 4 starts at 7:30 PM from Soldier Field, while the Bears-Colts game on Thursday, August 24 in Indianapolis begins at 7:00 PM in Chicago.

CHICAGO BEARS WEEKLY

For the sixth season, the Chicago Bears will produce a 30-minute television show, *Chicago Bears Weekly*. The show airs each Saturday night at 10:30 PM on WBBM-TV in Chicago beginning September 2 and continues throughout the season.

Every week the program presents an insider's view of the Bears' organization including interviews with Bears players and coaches. Each episode reviews the latest Bears game and analyzes the upcoming opponent.

CHICAGO BEARS INSIDER

The Bears radio coverage on game day begins three hours prior to kickoff; and for the fourth season *Chicago Bears Insider* opens the program. *CBI* is a 45-minute show which gives Bear fans an in-depth preview and analysis of the upcoming opponent. The program includes discussion of hot NFL issues, an in-depth interview with a player or coach, and a look back in time to a great moment from 1985 — the Bears' Super Bowl season.

THE DAVE WANNSTEDT SHOW (Radio)

Bears Head Coach Dave Wannstedt conducts his weekly radio show on WGN (720 AM) each Monday evening from 6:30 to 7:30 PM. The hour-long format allows Wannstedt to look at the latest news from Halas Hall and around the NFL. Fans have the opportunity to talk with the coach during the program's call-in segment.

THE DAVE WANNSTEDT SHOW (Television)

In his third season as Bears head coach, Dave Wannstedt continues his television program which was launched last season. *The Dave Wannstedt Show* airs Saturday evenings at 6:30 PM and again on Sunday mornings at 11:00 AM on WBBM-TV. Coach Wannstedt will be in the studio each week along with a WBBM Sports Anchor to review and preview player and team performances. A Bears "Player of the Week" will also be in attendance to provide additional insight.

LUNCHEON SERIES

The Chicago Bears / *Chicago Sun-Times* Luncheon Series is the "official" Chicago Bears luncheon held every week throughout the season. Each Tuesday a current Bear player, coach, or representative will appear along with a prominent Chicago sports anchor at one of the three Maggiano's locations in the Chicagoland area (downtown, Skokie, or Oak Brook). For the third season the event will be televised on SportsChannel on Tuesday evening at 10:30 PM with re-broadcasts later in the week.


