The uniqueness of George S. Halas, 85-President. Chairman of the Board. Chief Executive Officer-is chronicled properly in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton. Ohio

A plaque hanging in the Pro Football Hall of Fame reads in part

".... Heading the Chicago Bears for more than a half-century, George S. Halas, the team's founder and for 40 years, its head coach, is one of the most enduring personalities in any sports endeavor. He is a survivor of the little band of enthusiasts who met in a Canton automobile agency to organize the American Professional Football Association on September 17, 1920. The Bears are one of two surviving charter franchises of the APFA, which was the direct forerunner of the NFL . . .

"The Bears' success on the playing field has been legendary .... More Bears have been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame than from any other club-17 Bears, including Halas, to be exact

home town boy who didn't have to travel to make good but rather pyramided one success upon another right in Chicago.

Halas is a man of unique stature and distinguished status, active in the operation of the Chicago Bears since 1920 when he founded the team. 1980 is the sixty-first year since the Bears came into being as the Decatur Staleys.

No other football coach, professional or college, has equalled his personal winning record. The 40 years he has been the coach of the Bears break down into four separate 10-year tenures: 1920-29, 1933-42, 1946-55, and 1958-67.

In those years, the Bears won 326 games, including playoff wins.

Halas, born February 2, 1895, and raised on Chicago's West Side, prepped at Crane Tech High School, went on to the University of Illinois, earning a B.S. degree in Engineering and lettering in football, basketball, and baseball. After graduation in 1918, he went into the Navy for the first of his two tours of duty.

Halas was named Player of the Game in the 1919 Rose Bowl as an end on the Great Lakes team that heat the Marines 17-0.

An ensign in World War I, Halas entisted again in World War II, becoming Welfare and Recreation officer of the Navy's Pacific Fleet under Admiral Chester W. Nimitz. He was decorated with the Bronze Star. A commander when he left active duty in 1946. Halas retired as a captain in the Naval Reserve. He was also awarded the Distinguished Citizens Award—highest honor the Navy can bestow on a civilian.

After leaving the Navy for the first time. Halas played right field briefly for the New York Yankees who optioned him to St. Paul in the American Association. A hip injury shortened his baseball career. In 1920, he turned a course that became a highway to success for him.

Halas went to work for a Decatur, III. corn products firm owned by an enthusiastic sports fan. Mr. A. E. Statey. Mr. Statey sponsored a semi-pro baseball team managed by the famous ex-New York Giants pitcher, "Iron-Man Joe" McGinnity. Halas played shortstop, captained the team.

Late that summer, Mr. Staley commissioned Halas to organize an independent football team.

The Decatur Staleys were forerunners of the Bears. In 1921, they were known as the Chicago Staleys under an agreement with the corn products firm. In 1922 the team was officially named the Chicago Bears.

As a player, Halas set an NFL record that stood for 49 years. He ran 98 yards for a touchdown with a Jim Thorpe fumble in a 26-0 win over the Ocrang Indians at Wrigley Field November 4, 1923. Halas played end for the Bears from 1920-'29; he was named to the NFL All-Pro squad of the 1920's.

Halas intensity and competitive drive gave the Bears color and dramatic flair. He seeks continuously to add dignity to the sport he loves so deeply. Halas is responsible for these innovations.

The first pro team to practice daily; the first to take game movies for study and strategical purposes; the first to have its own team band; the first to have its own team song; the first to publish and distribute a club newspaper; the first to have radio broadcasts of games; the first to have a homecoming game dinner for all ex-Bears; the first to issue Player Diplomas.

When Halas signed Red Grange in 1925 and arranged a coast-to-coast tour, the Bears brought NFL football to cities that had hardly heard of it.

The most powerful influence on Halas in dedicating his professional life to pro football, was Coach Bob Zuppke's farewell talk to the 1918 Illinois team. Halas never forgot Zuppke's words:

"Goodby makes no sense whatsoever. Just when all of you begin to know something about football after three years, I lose you. Football is the only sport that ends a man's career just when it should be beginning."

Halas realized professional tootball is only an extension of a player's competitive life and has always cautioned veterans and rookies alike.

"Don't regard pro football as a complete career in itself. Don't see it as the beginning and the end of your earning power. Plan for the years beyond. Use the glamour of the game to attract attention to yourself by playing well. That will develop an off-season occupation, and then the assurance of a substantial future."

Four times, Halas has interrupted his coaching activities of his own volition.

He turned over leadership to Ralph Jones from 1930 through 1932. When Halas left for the U.S. Navy on November 1, 1942, Luke Johnsos and "Hunk" Anderson shared head coaching responsibilities through 1945. John "Paddy" Driscoll coached in 1956 and 1957.

Coincidentally, in 1933 and again in 1946 when Halas resumed head coaching duties after having

been away, his Bears' team won world championships immediately. Taking over for Driscoll in 1958, Halas needed a little more time to develop the "big" winner, but that did happen in 1963 when the Bears won their eighth championship. (Halas' Bears actually won nine championships, but only eight are recognized by the NFL at this time. Number nine was 1924 when the Bears whipped the Cleveland Bulldogs 23-0 in Wrigley Field Dec. 7, 1924. In those days, championships were awarded at post-season League meetings. Halas says with a grin ".... Lleft the meeting room to go to the washroom and when I got back they had awarded the Championship to Cleveland.")

The Associated Press, The Sporting News, and The United Press International named him Coach of the Year after the 1963 and 1965 seasons.

Halas retired from coaching May 27, 1968.

The team rather than the individual has always been the philosophy of the Bears. The Bears are tied with the old Canton Bulldogs for most consecutive regular season games without defeat. The Bears turned the trick from 1941 through '43 (23 wins, one tie). The Bears scored most straight victories, all games, 18 in a row (1933-'34 and again in

1941-42). Their 17 straight regular season victories (1933-34) were another record—and they share second place in this category with 16 in a row: Bears (1941-42) and Miami (1971-73).

The Bears played an incredible 30 games without a defeat from 1932 to 1933. That span included season, championship, and pre-season games.

During the 1940's, the team reached the height of its power with four straight Western Conference titles; three world championships; a fantastic four season record (including pre-season games) of 62 victories, 7 losses, 1 tie for an astronomical winning percentage of .899; 2,164 points against 842. The 1940 team, which defeated the Washington Redskins with an all-time high scoring mark of 73-0 for the world championship, was voted the greatest professional team of all time by the National Academy of Sports Editors in 1963.

Halas has won many honors and awards over the years, among which is the prestigious Sword of Loyola and an honorary doctor of laws degree from Lake Forest College.

His autobiography—Halas by Halas—was published October, 1979 by McGraw Hill, and is now in its third printing.

# EDWARD W. McCASKEY Vice President

Community involvement programs are a natural for the Chicago Bears Vice President Ed McCaskey, who once was a professional night club singer.

An executive with the Bears since 1967, McCaskey has been the spearhead for the Club's civic projects.

A close friend of the late Brian Piccolo, whom he considered a son, McCaskey worked closely with Screen Gems in the production of the movie "Brian's Song." He represents the NFL owners on the Brian Piccolo Golf Tournament Committee that has donated over \$280,000 to the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York, as a memorial to Brian Piccolo



Entering the business world after World War II, McCaskey was in the music publishing business in New York and associated with the late Jimmy Dorsey.

Since coming to Chicago in '49, he has been merchandising manager for the National Retail Tea and Coffee Association, executive vice-president of Merchandise Service, Inc., and an account executive for E. F. MacDonald Co.

Born April 27, 1919, in Philadelphia, McCaskey sang with dance bands before enrolling at the University of Pennsylvania in 1940.

He was a football tackle at Lancaster (Pa.) Catholic High School prior to graduation in '37.

He continued a singing career during his collegiate days and was elected a class president at Penn. After graduation in '43, McCaskey served with the 80th Infantry in France—enlisting as a private and leaving the Army with Captain's rank.

In addition to the Piccolo Committee, McCaskey serves on the board of trustees of Rosary College, as trustee of the Piccolo Children's Fund, the Illinois Chapter of the National Hemophilia Foundation, the Chicago Association for Retarded Children, and the Charlie Conacher Cancer Research Fund at the Toronto General Hospital.

McCaskey and his wife Virginia have 11 children, 11 grandchildren, and reside in Des Plaines.

### JIM FINKS

### Vice President, General Manager, Chief Operating Officer



The setting was late December in the media workroom at the Club's training complex Halas Hall. General manager Jim Finks was summarizing his feelings a week after his fifth team suffered a playoff defeat at Philadelphia:

"We're getting awfully close to being where people want us to be—a contending football club. I didn't have a timetable to getting to that point but a lot of unusual things have happened to this team both good and bad over the last few years . . . but our 1980 goal will be to win a lot of games, to win our Division and be in Soldier Field for the playoffs."

Some 304 players have passed through Bear lockerrooms in those five seasons since that first Finks-directed 1975 training camp began to shape the Bears of the 1980s

The guts of the 45-man roster that travels to Green Bay to open the '80s will be looking for their third playoff bid in four years. Over the past three seasons, they have compiled a 26-20 record which is tops among the five NFC Central Division teams.

While that three-year record is less than awesome, the six Bear teams prior to '75 could only win 24 games.

With the Bears coming on in the late '70s, it can be said that Finks' teams have ruled the Division in the last decade.

Finks joined the Bears two days before the 1974 opener on September 12 as executive vice-president, general manager and chief operating officer. After moving to Chicago, he spent the remainder of that season scouting future talent—players, coaches, front office personnel—while observing the Club's existing operation and personnel.

When the '74 season ended, Finks began to shape his team with only five staffers and three players surviving the rebuilding process.

The Bears enter the '80s with a solid group of playoff veterans, operating out of the Halas Hall complex equalled by few organizations in prosports, and playing in a rejuvenated Soldier Field.

Finks, who will be 53 Aug. 31 (1927), broke into the NFL in 1949 as a rookie quarterback with the Pittsburgh Steelers from Tulsa University.

Since that time, he has been an NFL regular at

both defensive back and quarterback, a college (Notre Dame) coach, a Canadian Football League (CFL) scout and general manager, an NFL Club Vice President and General Manager, and League Executive—all with distinction.

Finks joined the Bears after serving full time with the Management Council through the turbulent summer of '74 and its player strike. Previously his 10-year association with Minnesota brought the Vikings to the top of the professional game. Finks joined Minnesota in 1964 as its general manager and six seasons later saw the Purple Gang in their first Super Bowl (Jan. 11, 1970).

That same season (1969) Finks was named Vice President of the Minnesota Club—retaining his general manager's duties.

As Viking fortunes increased to include 47 victories in his last four seasons (1970-73), Finks resigned his post in Minnesota. He was the Club's Executive Vice-President when he tendered his resignation following the Vikings second Super Bowl.

Finks was a T-formation collegiate quarterback at Tulsa before he entered the NFL with the Steelers.

Pittsburgh still employed a single wing offense, however, and the 5-10, 175-pound passer found himself defending passes. From 1949-'51, Finks was a regular in the Steeler secondary.

In 1952, the Steelers converted to the T-formation and Finks switched back to quarterback. In '53, he joined Otto Graham as the Eastern Conference quarterbacks in the Pro Bowl.

Finks left the pro game to coach Notre Dame's 1956 backfield under Terry Brennan.

He scouted for Calgary in the Canadian League the following season and took over as general manager of the Stampeders in late 1957. He remained with the Stampeders until moving to Minnesota in 164.

In 1968, he was on the first NFL negotiating committee that met with the Players' Association.

An avid tennis player, Finks and his wife Maxine have four sons—Jim, David, Dan and Tom, He is a native of Salem in south central Illinois about 70 miles east of St. Louis.

# NEILL ARMSTRONG THead Coach

was Armstrong from his end position who called the Oklahoma A&M signals—not the quarterback. A&M was a college football power during the 1943-46 Armstrong years going 21 games without a loss during that span and winning post-season games in the Cotton and Sugar bowls.

Following those collegiste triumphs. Armstrong was the Philadelphia Eagles' number one draft choice in 1947 as an offensive end and defensive back. In his tive NFL seasons (1947-51), the Eagles played for the NFL championship three times win.

ning in '48 (over the Chicago Cardinals 7-0) and 1949 (over the LA Rams 14-0).

Continuing his playing days until 1954 in the CFL with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, Armstrong began his coaching career with a seven-year tour as an asserstant at his Alma Mater Oklahoma State from 1955 to 1961.

His first coaching exposure to professional football came with the Houston Oiler teams of Frank "Pop" by that were 17-11 in 1962 and 1963 in the intant American Football League. The '62 Oilers advanced to the AFL championship where they fell in sudden death overtime 20-17 to the Dallas Luckans.

In 1964, Armstrong left Houston for his first head coaching assignment at Edmonton in the CFL. During a six-year reign with the Eskimos, Armstrong led a once downtroden team into the Grey Cup playoffs three times.

Following the 1969 Canadian season. Armstrong shunned a collegiate administrator's position to join ex-CFL coaching rival and former Philadelphia-winning teammate Bud Grant with the Minnesota Winnipeg teammate Bud Grant with the Minnesota

The Vikings were in the midst of their first Super Bowl drive when Armstrong joined them in No-vember. In 1971, Grant named him Minnesots's determive coordinator. Well Ford Armstrong, 54 (3.9.26), is the kind of guy you'd want heading your side over the highs and lows that make up a 20-game football season . . . . Unshakeable.

In his first two seasons as coach of the Chicago Bears. Armstrong has piloted his feam through a senes of emotional and physical obstacles to a 14-7 record in their last 21 games. Over the second half of the 1979 season, his Bears carried the NFL's best record—a 7-1 mark—into the Super Bowl tournament playdowns. It was Chicago's second playoff this in three years... an Armstrong pace.

A competitor in playoffs after 12 of his 16 MFL seasons as player and coach, Armstrong has been in eight additional playoffs as his 27-year football career progressed through the collegiate, AFL, and CFL levels.

His third Bear team intends to host the NFL playoffs in Soldier Field.

Since Armstrong took over as Chicago's head coach Feb. 16, 1978, after seven years as Minnes oots Viking detensive coordinator, the Bears have last year. They established their playoff credentials by allowing fewer points than all but two MFL

### JERRY FREI ......OFFENSIVE LINE

The anonymity with which Bear offensive linemen have been treated when post season "all" teams are drawn up suggests perhaps their coach is Rodney Dangerfield.

Yet Jerry Frei (pron: fry), who begins his third season as the Chicago Bears offensive line coach, has produced a unit the envy of most teams in the League. The men who spring the sprinters take particular pride in the Club's ranking among the NFL's top five rushing teams the last two seasons.

A coach for 28 years, the 55-year-old Frei tutored the blocking corps at Denver and Tampa Bay before joining Neill Armstrong's Bear staff.

Frei was an offensive lineman as a collegian on the standout Wisconsin teams of 1942, 1946-47. Among his Badger teammates who would later star in the NFL were Elroy Hirsch, Pat Harder, and Don Kindt.

A native midwesterner who was born June 3, 1924 at Brooklyn, Wisc., Frei began his pro coaching career with the Broncos in 1972. He joined John McKay's first Buccaneer staff in 1976.

A 1948 graduate of Wisconsin, Frei spent 12 years as a collegiate assistant coach at the University of Oregon from 1955 through 1966.

He succeeded Len Casanova as the Ducks' head coach in 1967. Although Oregon compiled a 22-29-2 record during his five years as head coach, the Ducks' 1970 record of 6-4-1 was good for second place in the Pac-8. That finish remains Oregon's highest ever Pac-8 standing.

Twice during that 1970 season Frei was named "Coach of the Week" after the Ducks upset Southern Cal and Air Force. His first collegiate coaching experience came from 1952 to 1954 at Willamette University.

### DALE HAUPT......DEFENSIVE LINE

Steady improvement is something every teacher would like to see from his pupils. Same goes for coaching.

The year before Dale Haupt joined the Chicago Bear staff as defensive line coach, the Bears made just 27 sacks. That was 1977

In 1978, Haupt's first season as a pro coach, the production rose to 40. It jumped again last season to 47. Those figures indicate steady, and perhaps spectroling improvement.

spectacular improvement.

Haupt enters his third year with the Bears looking for another year of prog-

At Duke in 1977, Haupt spent 17 years coaching major college football. After six of those seasons, his teams went to bowl games.

Born April 12, 1929 at Manitowoc, WI, the three-time University of Wyoming letterman spent six years tutoring linemen in the Atlantic Coast Conference. His one year at Duke was preceded by a five-year stint at North Carolina (1972-76).

Wyoming's most valuable player as junior guard-linebacker in 1952, Haupt was the Cowboys' captain as a senior. A two-time all-conference pick, he played with the 1954 Green Bay Packers before entering the

Army.

Discharged with the rank 1st Lt. in 1957, Haupt coached high school football (Apopka, FL; Casper, WY; and Daytona Beach, FL) for three years before teaching the college game.

Haupt began his college coaching career at Tennessee where he was head freshman coach from 1960-63. He joined the varsity staff at lowa State (1964 & '65) for two seasons before a six-year tour at the University of Richmond (1966-71).

He coached in the 1968 and 1971 Tangerine Bowls, the 1972 and 1975 Peach Bowls, the 1973 Liberty Bowl, and the 1974 Astro-Bluebonnett Bowl.

Haupt holds a B.C. in education from Wyoming and a masters degree in education from East Carolina.



### HANK KUHLMANN ......SPECIAL TEAMS-RUNNING BACKS

When you've spent all of your adult life in sports, you collect a lot of hardware—medals, trophies, plaques, pictures, watches and rings.

But there's a special spot in Hank Kuhlmann's Libertyville home for a football in the midst of that hardware. On it is painted the legend 'Bears 23, Jets 13, Nov. 18, 1979'. It's a game ball. It's special because it symbolizes respect of players.

Tutor of Chicago's running backs and special teams for the past two seasons, Kuhlmann's charges annually rank among the NFL leaders as the Bears remain one of football's top rushing teams. Chicago has also blocked 14 kicks in the last two seasons.

After three years helping shake down Notre Dame thunder on collegiate opponents, Kuhlmann (pron: kool-man) returned to National Football Conference Central Division warfare in 1978.

Kuhlmann, 42, guided the Notre Dame running backs and special teamers as the Fighting Irish won the national collegiate championship in 1977—his third season on Dan Devine's staff.

Born Oct. 5, 1937 at St. Louis, Kuhlmann got his first exposure to the National Football League from 1972 to 1974 as tutor of the Green Bay Packer special teams.

A two sport all-Big Eight athlete as a running back and baseball catcher at the University of Missouri, Kuhlmann began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1963. For six of nine seasons, he was offensive backfield coach.

### 

Bear secondary coach Jim LaRue has what one might call a tough act to follow as he begins his third season on Neill Armstrong's Chicago coaching staff. Last year his pass defenders snatched 29 interceptions to lead the National Football Conference in steals.

A coaches' coach with 10 of his former quarterbacks in the business, LaRue joined the Bears after two seasons on the offensive staff of the Buffalo Bills. Prior to entering the NFL in 1975, he was an assistant coach at six major colleges and a successful head coach at the University of Arizona.

Leader of the Wildcats for eight seasons from 1959 to 1966, the LaRue coached Arizona team posted a 41-37-2 record, compiled a 8-1-1 mark as an independent in 1961, and won a share of the WAC title in 1964. The 8-1-1 mark

is the best one-year record in Arizona football history.

A two-way halfback in college at Carson-Newman, Duke, and Maryland during

the WWII years, LaRue is a Duke mathematics graduate who holds a master's degree in education from Maryland. He played in three bowl games as a collegian including the classic 1945 Duke-Alabama Sugar Bowl. Drafted by the professionals twice, LaRue opted for coaching and teaching.

LaRue, born August 11, 1925 in Clinton, OK, was athletic director and head coach at Bainbridge Naval Training Center in 1952 and 1953.

### KEN MEYER ..... OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

There's an old axiom of the entertainment business that says you're only as good as your last performance.

Bears 42, Cardinals 6, Dec. 16, 1979

Curtain call Ken Meyer, Offensive Coordinator, Chicago Bears.

Actually, while the Bears 1979 finale at Soldier Field did leave them dancing in the aisles, the Bears enter the 1980 season more optimistic than ever about their Division title chances in part due to their best offensive year in over a decade. Always strong rushers, the Bears produced a balanced 17 scores by the run and 16 via the air and cut interceptions from 28 to 16 last year.

Head coach of the San Francisco 49ers in 1977 and a pro coach for the past 13 years, Meyer directed the potent Los Angeles offense from 1973 to 1978 as the Rams racked up four successive division championships.

A coach since 1950 when he started his career in the Ohio high school





system, Meyer was head offensive coach under Paul (Bear) Bryant of Alabama from 1963 through 1967. There, led by quarterbacks Joe Namath, Steve Sloan, and Ken Stabler, the Crimson Tide played in five successive bowl games.

Meyer began his pro coaching career as Dick Nolan's backfield coach at San Francisco in 1968. He joined Weeb Ewbank's New York Jet staff the following year as top offensive assistant and was with the Jets for four seasons.

In 1977, the 49ers finished with wins in five of their last nine games, but could not overcome a 0-5 start.

Meyer, who holds a masters degree from Ohio State, was born July 14, 1926 at Erie, PA. He attended high school in Ashtabula Harbor, OH.

### TED PLUMB ...... RECEIVERS COACH

It's not surprising attention to detail is a long suit of Ted Plumb—coach. As a collegiate receiver at Baylor, Plumb modeled his play after Raymond Berry, the man who elevated the art of route running and catching footballs to a textbook science. Berry was Plumb's spring tutor for three years at Baylor.

The newest addition to Neill Armstrong's staff. Plumb joined the Bears in January to begin his seventh season in the pro coaching ranks. The 40-year-old Plumb will be working with Bear receivers.

Joining the Chicago staff after three seasons each with the Atlanta Falcons and New York Giants. Plumb has been a coach for the past 16 years. He started his NFL coaching career on the staff of Bill Arnsparger in New York working with the offensive backfield from 1974 to '76. Plumb joined Leeman Bennet with the Falcons as quarterback-receiver coach for the '77 season.

A college teammate of former Bear star Ronnie Bull, Plumb playe on Baylor.

Bear teams that earned bowl invitations in 1960 (Gator) and 1961 (Gotham) where they split with Utah State (24-9) and Florida (12-13). Baylor's 1960 record of 8-3 has been equalled but not surpassed.

He returned to Texas in '68 to join the staff at Texas Christian University for two seasons and followed those years with stints at Tulsa (1971) and Kansas (1972-73).

Raised in northern California, Plumb was born 8/20/39 at Reno, NV.

### JAMES (BUDDY) RYAN ..... DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

On reputation, football men expect the Chicago Bears to play tough defense. After all, it was the Bears who pounded enough lumps around the National Football League in the '60's to earn a Black and Blue nickname for an entire Division—the NFC Central.

After a long hibernation, the Bears are back among the toughest defenses in football. Coordinating the Chicago defenses for head coach Neill Armstrong (himself a defensive architect) is Buddy Ryan—entering his third year with the Club.

Under the Armstrong-Ryan combine, the Bears have risen from 22nd in the League in overall defense, to 9th in '78 and 6th last year. Only two other NFL teams surrendered fewer points than last season's Bears (249).

One of the few coaches to have been to Super Bowls with two different teams. Ryan, 46, also tutors the Chicago linebackers—a crew that has been completely reshaped in the last two years.

A 12-year veteran NFL defensive coach, Ryan was the Minnesota Vikings line coach for two seasons prior to joining the Bears in 1978 and was the first assistant hired by Armstrong.

Ryan, like Armstrong, is a graduate of Oklahoma State. From 1968 through 1975, he was on the defensive staff of the New York Jets under Hall of Fame coach, Weeb Ewbank.

He has been to the Super Bowl as an assistant coach twice—winning with the Jets in 1969 and losing with the Vikings in the 1977 game.

He began his coaching career at the University of Buffalo as defensive coordinator from 1961 to 1965. Ryan was also defensive coordinator at Vanderbilt (1966) and at the University of the Pacific (1967) before joining the Jets.

Ryan was born Feb. 17, 1934 at Frederick, OK.

# Halas Hall

The ultimate in bear dens, Halas Hall—the Club's new \$1.6 million player headquarters—opens its doors for its first full season of use July 26 when the Bears report to training camp.

Located at 250 N. Washington Street on the campus of Lake Forest College some 35 miles north of the Loop on Chicago's North Shore, its year around home to the team's players, coaching, training and equipment staffs, and film, personnel and public relations departments.

Named to honor George S. Halas, the Bears founder, chief executive, and one of the pioneers of the present day National Football League, the building is dedicated to the memory of George Halas, Jr., who died Dec. 16.

The Halases were the driving forces behind construction of the building in the collegiate setting.

Nearly a year in the building, Halas Hall was opened to the players in September of '79. Coaches and other staff members moved into the top floor of the complex in November. Finishing touches were not completed until May of 1980. Ground was broken on the project in November of '78.

It is a 32,000 square foot, three story building set at the foot of the College's Farwell Athletic Field. A regulation-sized grass football field and one some 70 yards long are located 15 yards from the player lockerrooms. In training camp, the Bears also use two other fields directly across Washington Street.

Halas Hall was designed by Allan M. Pickus Architects and built by Pickus Construction of Waukegan, Ill. The Bears studied similar facilities around the League before approving final designs and blueprints.

The lower floor of Halas Hall houses team meeting rooms, a player lounge, racquetball court, rookie lockers and shower areas, storage and utility rooms.

The central floor features the veteran player lockerroom, showers and sauna, training and weight rooms, coaches lockerroom, equipment room, laundry, photo lab, and media workroom with attached private interview areas.

The top floor holds reception areas, coaches offices, staff meeting rooms, public relations and PR workroom, personnel and scouting offices and work rooms, general offices, duplicating room, and computer scouting department.

The building's exterior and the landscaping was designed to fit unobtrusively into the suburban setting.

Most of its offices and player areas are equipped with closed circuit television system as a game-review-teaching aid.

Access to Halas Hall via automobile is easy:

From the Loop—Take Edens Expressway (41) north to Lake Forest exiting on Deerpath Road. Travel Deerpath east through shopping area to turn south on Washington to 250 N. Washington.

From O'Hare—Take 294 north exiting at Hwy 60 (2 tolls). Take 60 east to where it deadends into 41. Go north approximately 200 yards to the Deerpath Road exit. Proceed as above.

#### CHICAGO'S SOLDIER FIELD

The National Football League's oldest ballyard is getting younger as it enters its 57th season of use by Chicagoans.

During the past two winters, approximately one quarter of its some 60,000 seats have been rebuilt on new foundations which have turned the lakefront arena into a bowl for the first time.

Since the renovation began in early 1979, a new Astroturf playing surface has been added and all seats in the north end have been built on new stands. Last winter, the north endzone stands were connected to the east and west stands enclosing the arena.

Home to the Bears for 10 years, Soldier Field was opened for use in 1924 and dedicated with a track meet in September of that year. "Municipal Grant Park Stadium", as it was first called, sat a capacity of 45,000 people that first year of operation. The first football game played on its field was Nov. 22, 1924, as a capacity crowd watched Notre Dame edge Northwestern 13-6.

One of the country's oldest stadiums still in use (and the oldest used by any of the 28 NFL teams), Soldier Field has had an important spot in America's sport history. It hosted the first boxing event to draw a gate of over \$2.5 million (1927 Dempsey-Tunney), the first ski meet held in a stadium (with a 13-story man-made jump), and the all-time largest football crowd (123,000). The greatest crowd in the history of Soldier Field was 260,000 on Sept. 8, 1954, for the religious Marion Year Tribute.

Two weeks before that first football game 55 years ago, Chicagoans voted a bond issue to expand the Stadium to over 100,000 capacity.

While that construction was underway in 1925, Northwestern chalked up one of its all-time great victories tripping previously unbeaten Michigan 3-2. The three points were the only ones scored against Fielding Yost's Wolverines that season. The new 100,000-seat "Soldier Field" was dedicated Nov. 27, 1926, with Army battling Navy to a 21-all deadlock. The all-time collegiate attendance record of 123,000 plus was established Nov. 26, 1927, in Soldier Field as Notre Dame edged Southern Cal 7-6.

The only Big Ten playoff game ever contested was also played on the Chicago Lakefront when Purdue whitewashed Northwestern 7-0 in a benefit for the depression relief fund in 1931.

In the first professional game at the then mammoth stadium, the Bears snipped the Chicago Cardinals 10-0 in 1926.

The 41 College All-Star games were all played in Soldier Field with the Bears and Stars fighting to a 0-0 finish in the Aug. 31, 1934 inaugural before 79,342 fans.

Another landmark football clash played in Soldier Field was the interleague City prep championship game of 1937 (Austin 26, Leo 0) played before a high school record 120,000 fans. That series, which started in 1934, is still played.

When the Bears began using the facility as a regular season home Sept. 19, 1971, several changes were made in the Stadium's seating area and concept. The actual playing field was moved into the far south end of the stadium's floor and temporary bleachers were constructed in the north endzone. The remodeling, which included backing the bench type seats, cut Soldier Field's capacity in half (57,359) but brought ticket holders closer to the action.

Before support shoring was installed, exhibit halls were located under the 50 tiers of seats.

Plans for the stadium were begun in 1919 as a memorial to the soldiers of WWI. Soldier Field stands on 10,000 pile foundations driven to an average depth of 62½ feet through fill that replaced the lake waters.

Soldier Field is operated by the Chicago Park District.

#### RECORDS INTRODUCTION

When the National Football League was formed in 1920, probably the last thing the founders had to worry about was the compiling of statistics and records. Accordingly, a complete statistical history of the league, dating from 1920, is an impossibility. However, here are some reference points for when various statistical categories were first compiled officially:

Scoring: Scores of all games are available starting in 1920, for purposes of records, however, totals date from 1932. Individual scoring statistics also date from 1932. Extra point and field goal attempts start in 1932.

Rushing: Statistics begin in 1932.

Passing: Statistics begin in 1932. Until 1947, what is now called "yards lost attempting to pass" was recorded in the rushing statistics. From 1947 to 1951, "yards lost attempting to pass" was recorded, but was not included in either the net rushing or the net passing yardage totals (and consequently was not a part of "total net yards gained"). Starting in 1952, passing yardage team totals include "yards lost attempting to pass," although sacks were not recorded before 1963. Lateral passes were maintained as a separate category until 1950, at which time yardage gained or tost as a result of lateral passes was included in the category initiating the action (e.g., rushing).

Pass Receiving: Statistics begin in 1932.



SID LUCKMAN, QB, inducted 1965. Played 12 seasons with Bears from 1939 to '50. Tailback at Columbia. All-Pro six times. Directed Bears to four NFL championships. Still leads NFL in percentage throws for TDs with 7.9%, 137 TDs. His number 42 is retired.

CLYDE (BULLDOG) TURNER, C-LB, inducted 1966. Played 12 seasons with Bears from 1940 to '52 with all-pro honors six times as center. Made 17 interceptions as LB. Played in first two Pro Bowls ('51 & '52). All-America at Hardin-Simmons. His jersey number 66 is retired.





GEORGE McAFEE, HB, inducted 1966. Played eight seasons with Bears from 1940 to 1950 with time out for WWII. All-Pro in 1941. Held NFL punt return record until a few years ago with 12.78 yards a try. All-America at Duke. His jersey number 5 is retired.

GEORGE CONNOR, T-LB, inducted 1975. Played for Bears eight seasons from 1948-55 after college ball at Holy Cross and Notre Dame. At 6-3, 240, Connor was the first of the big, mobile outside backers. All-Pro five times but in 1951-2-3 on both offense and defense. Played in four Pro Bowls. Jersey numbers 71 & 81.





BILL GEORGE, LB, inducted 1974. Played 14 seasons with Bears from 1952 to '66 and finished career with Rams. All-Pro eight times. First great NFL middle linebacker. "Created" the position switching from middle-guard in '54. Played in eight Pro Bowls. His jersey number 61 is retired.

DICK BUTKUS, MLB, inducted 1979. Played for Beats nine seasons from 1965-73 after college ball at Illinois. Blessed with great speed and a treat emedous competitive desire at 6-3, 245 pounds. Butkus was all-NFL eight times and played in eight Pro Bowls. Jersey number 51.

#### 1980 Playoff Pairings and Priority

- 1. First Round—Wild cards play each other. Home clubs will be the clubs with the best won-lost percentage in the regular season. If tied in record, apply all applicable divisional tie-breakers.
- 2. Other Rounds—Sites for the AFC and NFC Divisional Playoffs and the AFC and NFC Championship Games are determined by the won-lost records of the divisional champions.

#### **Division Ties**

If, at the end of the regular season, two or more clubs in the same division finish with the best won-lost-tied percentage, the following steps will be taken until a CHAMPION is determined:

- 2. Best won-lost-tied percentage in games played within the division.
- 3. Best won-tost-tied percentage in games played within the conference.
- 4 Best won-lost-tied percentage in common games.
- 5 Best net points in division games.
- 6 Best net points in all games.
- 7. Strength of schedule.
- 8 Best net touchdowns in all games
- 9 Coin toss.

#### Wild Card Ties

If necessary to break ties to determine the two Wild Card clubs from each conference, the following steps will be taken:

- 1. If all the tied clubs are from the same division, apply division tiebreaker.
