## George S. Halas Chairman of the Board



A plaque hanging in the Pro Football Hall of Fame reads in part:

"... Heading the Chicago Bears for more than a half-century, George S. Halas, the team's founder and for 40 for 57 years its head coach, is one of the most enduring personalities in any sports endeavor. He is also the only survivor of the little band of enthusiasts who met in a Canton automobile agency to organize the American Professional Football Association on September 17, 1920. The Bears are one of two surviving charter franchises of the APFA, which was the direct forerunner of the NFL...

"The Bears' success on the playing field has been legendary . . . More Bears have been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame than from any other club — 15 long-term Bears, including Halas, to be exact . . ."

That quote doesn't tell you a lot about one George S. Halas. But then, Halas the man, Halas the coach, the Chicago Bears and, in some aspects, professional football are one in the same. Inseparable. Each of the four has a separate birthdate, yet they are one in the same.

Halas is a man of unique stature and distinguished status, active in the operation of the Chicago Bears since 1920 when he founded the team. This year, 1976, is the fifty-seventh since the Bears came into being as the Decatur Staleys.

Except for duty in the U.S. Navy in World War II, he has been active with the Bears for all those years — as player, then coach and always the owner. No one in professional football has been continuously associated with one team that many years — and quite likely, it's a record for any individual and any team in any pro sport.

No other football coach, professional or college, has equalled his personal winning record. The 40 years he has been the coach of the Bears break down into four separate 10-year tenures: 1920-29, 1933-42, 1946-55, and 1958-67.

In those years, the Bears won 326 games, including playoff wins.

Halas, born February 2, 1895, and raised on Chicago's West Side, prepped at Crane Tech High School, went on to the University of Illinois lettering in football, basketball, and baseball. After graduation in 1918, he went into the Navy for the first of his two tours of duty.

Halas was Player of the Game in the 1919 Rose Bowl as an end on the Great Lakes team that beat the Marines 17.0

An ensign in World War I, Halas enlisted again in World War II, becoming welfare and recreation officer of the Navy's Pacific Fleet under Admiral Nimitz. He was decorated with the Bronze Star. A commander when he left active duty in 1946, Halas retired as a captain in the Naval Reserve. He has also been awarded the Distinguished Citizens Award — highest honor the Navy can bestow on a civilian.

After leaving the Navy for the first time, Halas played right field briefly for the New York Yankess who optioned him to St. Paul in the American Association. A hip injury shortened his baseball career. In 1920, he turned a course that became a highway to success for him.

Halas went to work for a Decatur, III., corn products firm owned by a rabid sports fan, A. E. Staley. Staley sponsored a semipro baseball team managed by the famous ex-New York Giants pitcher "Iron-Man Joe" McGinnity. Halas played shortstop, capitained the team.

Late that summer, Staley commissioned him to organize an independent football team.

Those Decatur Staleys were forerunners of the Bears. He also adopted the nickname in 1922, the year after moving the team to Chicago. In 1921, they were known as the Chicago Staleys under an agreement with the corn products firm.

As a player, Halas set an NFL record that stood for 49 years. He ran 98 yards for a touchdown with a Jim Thorpe fumble in a 26-0 win over the Oorang Indians at Wrigley

Field November 4, 1923. The record stood until Oakland's Jack Tatum returned a Green Bay fumble 104 yards in 1972. After he played end for the Bears from 1920-'29, he was named to the NFL All-Pro Squad of the 1920's.

Halas and the Bears are responsible for these innovations, some unorthodox at the time they were introduced:

First pro team to practice daily; to take game movies for study and strategical purposes; to hire its own band whose repertoire featured its own team song "Bear Down, Chicago Bears"; to publish and distribute a club newspaper to fans; to encourage radio broadcasts of games; to have a homecoming game every season with an evening banquet for all ex-Bears.

When Halas signed Red Grange in 1925 and arranged a coast-to-coast tour, the Bears brought N.F.L. football to cities that had hardly heard of it.

They won 13 games and played the first seven within a nine-day span.

Pro football historians agree that the Halas-directed, Grange-starring, nationwide tour brought unbelievable attention to a sport whose average game attendance had been in the modest 10,000's and 20,000's.

Perhaps the most powerful influence on Halas a year or two before he dedicated himself to pro football was Coach Bob Zuppke's farewell talk to the 1918 Illinois team. Halas never forgot Zuppke's words:

"Goodby makes no sense whatever. Just when all of you begin to know something about football after three years, I lose you. Football is the only sport that ends a man's career just when it should be beginning."

Halas, of course, had much to do with changing Zuppke's appraisal. Professional football is an extension of a player's competitive life but Halas has always cautioned veterans and rookies alike:

"Don't regard pro football as a complete career in itself. Don't see it as the beginning and the end of your earning power. Plan for the years beyond. Use the glamor of the game to attract attention to yourself by playing well. That will develop first, an off-season occupation, and then assurance of a substantial future."

Four times, Halas has interrupted his coaching activities of his own volition.

He turned over leadership to Ralph Jones from 1930 through 1932. When Halas left for the U.S. Navy on November 1, 1942, Luke Johnsos and "Hunk" Anderson shared head coaching responsibilities through 1945, and from 1956-57. John "Paddy" Driscoll spelled him.

Coincidentially, in 1933 and again in 1946 when Halas resumed head coaching duties after having been away, his Bears' team won world championships immediately. Taking over for Driscoll in 1958, Halas needed a little more time to develop the "big" winner, but that did happen in 1963 when the Bears won their eighth championship.

The Associated Press, The Sporting News, and The United Press International named him Coach of the Year after the 1963 and 1965 seasons.

He retired from coaching May 27, 1968.

During the early 1940's, the team probably reached the height of its power with four straight Western Conference titles; three world championships; a fantastic fourseason record (including pre-season games) of 62 victories, 7 losses, 1 tie for an astronomical winning percentage of .899; 2,164 points against 842. The 1940 team, which destroyed the Washington Redskins with an all-time high scoring mark of 73-0 for the world championship, was voted the greatest professional team of all time by the National Academy of Sports Editors in 1963.

He also coached the West to a 31-17 win in the 1964 Pro Bowl.

Halas has won a host of civic honors over the years. Among the most recent are the Chicago Boys Club's 1976 Chicago Man of the Year title and the 1976 Leahy Award.

## James E. Finks Vice President, General Manager



"Rarely does any organization find precisely the right man at precisely the right time to lead it. The Chicago Bears were the exception in September of 1974 when we attracted Jim Finks to join us," intimates George Halas, Sr., founder of the team and Chairman of the Board.

Finks, 48, has earned that kind of respect from football executives since he broke into the National Football League (NFL) in 1949 as a rookie quarterback with the Pittsburgh Steelers from Tulsa University.

Since that time he has been an NFL regular at both defensive back and quarterback, a college coach, a Canadian Football League (CFL) scout and general manager, Club Vice President and General Manager, and League Executive — all with distinction.

Finks joined the Bears September 12, 1974, after serving as a consultant to the NFL Management Council through the turbulent summer of '74 and its player strike.

His 10-year association with the Minnesota Vikings (1964-73) brought the Vikings to the top of the professional game. Finks joined the Vikings as general manager and six seasons later saw the Purple Gang in its first Super Bowl.

That same season Finks was named Vice President of the Minnesota Club — retaining his general manager's duties.

As Viking fortunes increased to include 47 victories in his last four seasons (1970-73), Finks resigned his post in Minnesota. He was the Club's Executive Vice President when he tendered his resignation following the Viking Super Bowl.

Finks was a T-formation collegiate quarterback at Tulsa before he entered the NFL with the Steelers. Pittsburgh still employed single wing offense, however, and the 5-10, 175-pound passer found himself defending passes. From 1949-51, Finks was a regular in the Steeler secondary.

In 1952, the Steelers converted to the T-formation and Finks switched back to quarterback. In '53, he joined Otto Graham as the Eastern Conference quarterbacks in the Pro Bowl.

Although he retired after only four years as a quarterback and seven NFL seasons with the Steelers (at age 28), Finks established Club records for completions and attempts and three times threw four touchdown passes in a game.

Only Bobby Layne threw more total yards or touchdowns than Finks in Pittsburgh.

Finks left the pro game to coach Notre Dame's 1956 backfield under Terry Brennan.

He scouted for Calgary in the Canadian League the following season and took over as general manager of the Stampeders in late 1957. He remained with the Stampeders until moving to Minnesota in '64.


In the Twin Cities area, he was a prominent civic figure: once Chairman of the United Negro College Fund and also Chairman of the Minneapolis United Fund Campaign.

In 1968, he was on the first NFL negotiating committee that met with the Players Association.

Finks and his wife Maxine, have four sons — Jim, Jr., David, Danny and Tommy. He is a native of Salem in south central Illinois, about 70 miles east of St. Louis.

At Tulsa University he lettered in football, baseball and basketball and after graduation (in '40) played two summers in the Cincinnati Reds farm system while devoting the autumn and early winter to pro football.



## Jack Pardee Head Coach



Picture your 15-year NFL linebacker turned head coach.

If the iconoclastic image you get is one of a closecropped, clean-cut Marine DI look with qualities like talent, compassion, and devotion to Church, family and football packaged inside a 40-year-old, 6-2, 225-pound frame you have the Chicago Bears' Jack Pardee in focus.

The first non-Bear apprentice to guide the field fortunes of the Club in more than 40 years, Pardee succeeded Abe Gibron December 31, 1974. He is only the eighth head coach in the Bears' 57-year pro football history.

An outstanding student of the sport, Pardee is the youngest head coach in the National Football League yet his credentials are impressive as both player and coach.

A standout linebacker during a 15-year NFL career interrupted by a successful bout with cancer, Pardee first entered the League in 1957 as the Los Angeles' Rams second round draft choice.

Even then, the Pardee accomplishments were many. An honor student in business administration at Texas A&M and all-Southwest conference football star for Paul (Bear) Bryant, Pardee completed his collegiate career with outstanding performances in both the Blue-Gray and North-South post-season all-star games.

He continued the stellar play in his 196 pro games during 13 seasons at Los Angeles and two with the Washington Redskins. Pardee's 22 career interceptions, five touchdowns and (1963) all-Pro honors, don't indicate his true value to either club.

Known as a coach on the field, Pardee called defensive signals for both clubs late in his career.

When the Redskins completed one of the biggest

trades in recent years involving Pardee, six other players and eight draft choices prior to the 1971 draft, Jack responded with an all-League performance for George Allen.

He retired following the 1972 season to return to coaching as the Redskins linebacking coach.

While recovering from the cancer surgery that interrupted his career in 1965, Pardee got his first taste of the coaching business as an assistant at Texas A&M.

Pardee accepted his first head coaching assignment in the financial-plagued World Football League with a franchise that was to be located in Washington, later moved to Norfolk, and became the Florida (Orlando) Blazers.

As coach and general manager of the Blazers, Pardee's leadership qualities garnered national attention.

In a general atmosphere of financial disaster, without paydays or paychecks, Pardee earned an amazing loyalty from his players which enabled the club to post a 14-6 record and enter the WFL championship game. Birmingham edged the Blazers 22-21.

The respect continues.

Pardee was voted to the Texas all-time pro team in November of 1975 — two months before coaching the South team in the 1976 Senior Bowl.

Born April 19, 1936 in Exira, Iowa, Pardee spent his formative years in Texas.

His family moved to Christoval, Texas when he was a youth. It was at Christoval High that Jack started playing football — six-man style.

He and his wife Phyllis Lane Perryman (Houston) have five children: Steven, 17; Judee, 16; Ann Marie, 15; Susan, 13; and Ted. 7.

#### **RAY CALLAHAN**

#### OFFENSIVE LINE

A former collegiate head coach and Kentucky's 1962 prep coach of the year, Ray Callahan begins his third year on Jack Pardee's staff and fourth in professional football this

Florida Blazers line coach and offensive coordinator in 1974, Callahan's first season in professional football was 1973 when he tutored the talented Baltimore Colts linebacking corps. He joined the Bears with Pardee in January 1975.

The former two-way player at Kentucky (1952-56), left a highly successful high school coaching career in 1963 to become line coach at his Alma Mater. In 1967 he moved to the University of Cincinnati as its line coach.

Two years later, he was appointed Cincinnati's head coach guiding Bearcat fortunes from 1969 to 1972.

Born April 28, 1933 at Lebanon, Ky., Callahan was graduated from Kentucky in 1956 and then served as a lieutenant in the Army Infantry.

He and his wife Lee have four children and reside in Hoffman Estates.

## **BRAD ECKLUND**

#### DEFENSIVE LINE

The Dean of the Chicago Bear coaching staff, Brad Ecklund begins his 16th year in professional football coaching this fall as Jack Pardee's defensive line coach.

Ironically, Ecklund left the Bears' personnel department in 1973 to join Pardee on the field at Florida. He journeyed back to Chicago with Pardee in January 1975.

His first professional coaching job was with Dallas from 1960-64, the first four seasons of the Cowboys existence.

Ecklund left the Cowboys to help organize CEPO (the Central-Eastern Personnel Organization). He remained with CEPO until returning to coaching with Atlanta (1966-67).

Stints as offensive line coach at New Orleans (1968-70) and Philadelphia (1971-72) followed.

Ecklund entered professional football with star center billings from his collegiate career at Oregon (1945-48). He served as a sergeant in the Marine Corps during World War II.

After six seasons as a center and middle linebacker with the New York Yanks, Dallas Texans and Baltimore Colts, Ecklund retired in 1954. He was named all-Pro with the Yanks in '49, '51 and '52 and was the Colts MVP in '54.

Four years of high school coaching and a 1959-stint on the staff at Oregon preceded his professional coaching career.

Born May 9, 1922 at Los Angeles, the 1949 Oregon graduate, is married to the former Ruth McKenney. The Ecklunds have three children and reside in Schaumburg.

#### **ROSS FICHTNER**

### SECONDARY

A nine-year veteran of defensive backfield play in the National Football League, Ross (Rocky) Fichtner (pron: FEET-ner) begins his third season coaching Jack Pardee's secondaries.

He returned to football in 1974 at Florida for the first time since completing his playing days with the New Orleans Saints in 1968.

Fichtner's best afternoons in football were spent with the Cleveland Browns from 1960 through '67. He played 102 games with the Browns during that eight-year span and intercepted 27 passes returning three of them for touchdowns.

Fichtner was Cleveland's most valuable defensive player in 1966. In a game against Dallas that year the strong safety had three interceptions. The Browns won the NFL championship in '64 and played for the '65 title.

Cleveland selected the former Purdue quarterback-defensive back on the third round of the '60 draft. His play with the Boilermakers from 1957-'59 earned him a spot on the College All-Star team that played the Baltimore Colts in 1960.

Fichtner was also MVP in the '59 Blue-Gray game.

Born Oct. 26, 1938 at McKeesport, Pa., Fichtner and his wife Karen reside in Hoffman Estates.

#### JOHN HILTON

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

With Jack Pardee's emphasis on special teams play for the Chicago Bears, John Hilton's coaching assignment is a demanding one.

A 10-year veteran of professional football as a tight end, Hilton joined Pardee's staff in March, 1975, as the Chicago special teams coach.

Completing his playing career in the fall of '74 at Florida, Hilton spent five of his nine National Football seasons with the Pittsburgh Steelers and had his best statistical season with the Three Rivers Gang in '66 when he caught 46 passes for 602 yards and four touchdowns.

Hilton was drafted as a future by Detroit in 1964 and signed with the Steelers in '65 following a record setting collegiate career at the University of Richmond.

A native of Albany, N.Y., (born March 12, 1942), Hilton had tours with Green Bay (1970) and Minnesota (1971) before closing his NFL days with Detroit (1972-73). Thus, his Central Division swing is complete.

In his nine seasons he played in 107 games, caught 144 passes for 2,047 yards and 16 touchdowns.

Hilton, who led the Southern Conference in receiving three times, played in 18 regular season WFL games in 1974 catching seven passes for 83 yards.

Hilton and his wife Penny have one son and reside in Palatine.

#### FRED O'CONNOR

#### OFFENSIVE BACKS

The personification of Jack Pardee's teaching philosophy for his coaching staff could be his offensive backfield coach Fred O'Connor.

Entering his 11th year in coaching and third with Pardee, O'Connor spent eight of those years tutoring the collegiate game.

A former quarterback and running back at East Stroudsburg State College from 1958-62, O'Connor was graduated from the Pennsylvania school in 1962.

All 11 of O'Connor's coaching years have been spent teaching offensive football.

He began that career as offensive coordinator at C.W. Post College in New York in 1966. In 1970 he moved to Villanova in the same capacity.

Stints at Maryland (1971) and Southern Mississippi (1972) intervened before O'Connor returned to Villanova as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 1973. He began his professional coaching career with Pardee at Florida in 1974.

Born September 1, 1939 in Brooklyn, O'Connor and his wife Margaret have two children and reside in Arlington Heights.

#### JERRY STOLTZ

#### RECEIVERS

The only native Chicagoan on the Bears coaching staff, Jerry Stoltz enters his eighth National Football League season this fall as Jack Pardee's receiver coach.

A 1955 Fenger High graduate, Stoltz first joined the Bears following the 1972 season. He has been a NFL coach since 1969 when he left the college coaching ranks at Purdue to join the New England Patriots.

As a collegian at Toledo, Stoltz played quarterback, running back and defensive back in the Mid-America Conference. He was an all-league selection for his secondary play and was quarterback co-captain at Toledo during his senior season.

Following his 1961 graduation, Stoltz stayed at the Ohio school as a student assistant while working on a master's degree in physical education.

Armed with that post-graduate degree, Stoltz chose to start his coaching career full time there in '62.

He moved to Notre Dame for the 1963 season. Stoltz was backfield coach at Miami (0.) from '64 through '66.

He headed the scouting and helped with the Purdue offense during the '67 and '68 seasons.

Born June 25, 1937 at Belleville, Illinois, Jerry and his wife Rosemary have four children and reside in Hinsdale.

#### **BOB BOWSER**

#### SPECIAL ASSISTANT

After three years in professional football public relations, Bob Bowser enters his second season this fall as Jack Pardee's special assistant.

Associated with Pardee since 1972, Bowser was one of six former Florida Blazer staffers to migrate north with the head coach in January, 1974.

Blazer public relations director during the Club's one-year life, Bowser was assistant PR director with the Washington Redskins for two seasons.

Born June 26, 1944, at Toledo, Ohio, and a 1968 Oregon graduate, Bowser was sports information director at California State College, Fullerton, from 1970 to '72.

With Pardee coaching the Chicago linebackers in addition to his overall responsibilities. Bowser will handle much of the head coach's paper work and administrative details. Bowser will have offices during the season with the coaching staff.

He and his wife Linda reside in Palatine.

#### TRAINER

Launching his fourth season as head trainer of the Chicago Bears, Fred Caito (pron: KAY-tow) actually started with the Club in 1967 - George Halas' last season as the team's head coach.

Caito was a student trainer at St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, Ind., when the late Ed Rozy hired him to complement his training staff during the camps of '67 and '68.

After Caito was graduated from St. Joseph's with a degree in physical education, he joined the Club as Rozy's full time assistant.

Caito earned a master's degree in physical education from Northwestern in '72 and the following season succeeded Bernie Lareau as the team's head trainer.

Fourteen-times Central AAU weightlifting champion, five-times U.S. champion, U.S. Olympic squad member, world record setter, Pan-American champion, member weightlifting Hall of Fame.

These are the credentials Clyde Emrich brought to the Chicago Bears when he joined the Club on a full-time basis in 1974 as physical coordinator, or strength coach.

Emrich, born April 6, 1931 in Chicago, has 30 years of activity in strength and conditioning. Self-taught, Emrich gave clinics in high schools and YMCAs throughout his competitive career.

He has implemented the isometric training and weight programs of the Bears on a part time basis since 1963.

The Amundsen high school product was the Central AAU champion 14 times, light-heavy and middle-heavy U.S. weightlifting champion five times, took eighth place while injured as a middle-heavy in the 1954 World Championship in Vienna and placed second as a middle-heavy in the 1955 World Championship in Munich.

In 1957, Emrich broke two world records. He was the first man under 200 pounds to lift 400 pounds and 409 pounds clean and jerk. In 1959, he set four records as the Pan-American middle-heavy weightlifting champion. As a result of these achievements, he was elected to the weightlifting Hall of Fame in 1968.

His duties with the Bears involve setting up programs for physical conditioning, training and rehabilitation.

Emrich and his wife June have two children, and live in Chicago.

# **Brian Piccolo Award**

Since the 1970 season, the Chicago Bears have presented their rookie of the year with the Brian Piccolo Award. Bear veterans vote the award to the rookie who best exemplifies the courage, loyalty, teamwork, dedication and sense of humor of the late Brian Piccolo.

A running back who died of cancer June 16, 1970, Piccolo was in his fourth season with the club when forced from the lineup because of the malignancy. He was 26 years old when he died and left a wife and three daughters, and legions of friends.

Piccolo played the first nine games of the '69 season when a persistent cough led to a chest x-ray that revealed the

He signed with the Bears as a free agent following the '64 collegiate season. As a senior at Wake Forest, Piccolo led the nation in scoring (111) and rushing (1,044).

He missed his first season with the Bears because of a leg injury suffered in a college all-star game.

In 1966, he became the alternate for Gale Savers, his roommate on road trips.

The 1975 winner (the sixth) Roland Harper is the first running back to receive the award. Like Piccolo, Harper came to the Bears unheralded. He was the 420th man selected in last year's player draft after spending his collegiate seasons at Louisiana Tech blocking for Charles (Quick Six) McDaniel.

# **Bear Historical Highlights**

- 9/17/20 George Halas representing the Decatur Staleys meets with representatives of 12 other clubs at Ralph Hay's Hupmobile showroom in Canton, O., forming the American Professional Football Association — which later became the NFL. Membership is set at \$100.
- 1920 The Staleys shutout 12 of their 13 foes, lose only to the Chicago Cardinals (7-6 at Normal Park) and post a 10-1-2 record. Each player is paid \$1,900 for the season.
- 1921 Decatur Staley AC becomes Chicago Staleys, plays in Wrigley Field, and wins the APFA title with 9-1-1 record. A E. Staley gives George Halas the Club with \$5,000 to keep the Staley name for the season. Halas makes Dutch Sternaman his partner.
- 1/28/22 Franchise renamed Chicago Bears.
- 11/27/22 First Chicago player deal: Bears buy tackle Ed Healey's contract from the Rock Island Independents for \$100 — twice the going rate for a franchise that season.
- 11/4/23 George Halas makes a 98-yard fumble run (TD) against Oorang Indians.
- 11/22/25 Harold Red Grange signs with Bears and pro football leaves its cradle. His agent C. C. (Cash & Carry) Pyle negotiates a \$100,000 deal with the Rears
- 11/26/25 Halas takes the Bears and Grange on a 19-game coast-to-coast tour that sees the Club play 19 games from Nov. 26 thru Jan. 31 interruped by a two-week rest. The Bears post a 13-5-1 record during the incredible endurance run.
- 11/26/25 Grange's first game ... 36,000 see Bears and Cardinals go 0-0 in Wrigley Field with Grange held to 36 yards.
- 12/6/25 73,000 New Yorkers watch Grange ramble 30 yards with an interception for his only TD has the Bears defeat the Giants 19-7.
- 12/8/25 Chicago 19. Washington 0 in DC.
- 1/16/26 Grange gets 2 TDs as the Bears impress 75,000 in the LA Coliseum beating the LA Tigers 17-7.
- 1/31/28 Grange rambles for 99 yards and 2 TDs as the Bears destroy the Washington All-Stars in Seattle 34-0.
- 9/12/28 Bears begin daily practicing at Wrigley Field.
- 1930 After a 4-8-2 1929 season, George Halas replaces himself as head coach with Ralph Jones. Jones posts a 24-10-7 record during his three seasons.
- 1930 Bears fined \$1,000 by Commissioner Joe Carr for premature signing of Notre Dame RB Joe Savoldi. Savoldi plays just four games losing job to Bronko Nagurski.

- 1930 Bears and Cardinals play football's first indoor game on an 80-yard field at Chicago Stadium. It's an exhibition for unemployment relief.
- 11/16/31 New Yorkers (including Gov. Alfred E. Smith and Mayor Jimmy Walker) in field boxes at \$100 a seat watch Bears top Giants in Polo Grounds 12-6.
- 12/18/32 Bronko Nagurski hits Red Grange with a two-yard TD pass and the Bears top the Portsmouth Spartans 9-0 for the NFL championship. The game was played before 11,198 indoors at Chicago Stadium on an 80-yard field.
- 1932 Franchise loses \$18,000 prompting Dutch Sternaman to unload his half of the Bears to George Halas.
- 1933 George Halas returns as head coach.
- 1933 Bears have training camp at University of Notre Dame.
- 12/17/33 Bears use Rookie Jack Manders' accurate kicking for 11 points and defeat the Giants 23-11 in the NFL's first championship game. Some 26,000 Chicagoans watched in Wrigley Field as the Bears notched the winning TD a Bronko Nagurski pass to Bill Hewitt who lateraled to Bill Karr, covering 36 yards.
- 1934 Bears have training camp at Lane Tech High in the City.
- 8/31/34 A classic is born as 79,432 watch the NFL champion Bears held to a scoreless tie by the first College All-Star team in a game sponsored by Chicago Tibune Charities in Soldier Field.
- 12/9/34 Undefeated Bears slip before Giants in NFL title tilt at Polo Grounds 30-13 before 35,059. With Chicago leading 10-3 at the half, NY dons basketball sneakers and scores 27 points.
- 1934 Rookie Beattle Feathers becomes first proback to rush for 1,000 yards with 1,004 to lead NFL.
- 1935 Bears take training camp to St. John's Military Academy in Delafield, Wis.
- 1936 Joe Stydahar, tackle, West Virginia, is the first Bears draft pick.
- Bears obtain rights to NFL's first draft pick Jay Berwanger but the Chicago star elects to pass up pro football.
- 12/12/37 Bears win Western Division title but lose NFL Championship 28-21 to Redskins at Wrigley Field. Nemesis Sammy Baugh hits 18 of 33 for 335 yards and 3 TDs. Jack Manders scores 15 of the Chicago points. A Chicago player's share is \$127.78.
- 2/2/40 Detroit fined \$5,000 for tampering with Bears draft pick Clyde Bulldog Turner.

- 12/8/40 Ten Bears tally TDs as Chicago rips Washington 73-0 for the NFL title before 36,034 in DC. The rout signals the beginning of pro football's modern era with the formal unveiling of the T-formation. The Bears got \$873 per man. Chicago's defense intercepts eight Redskin passes permits but 22 yards rushing.
- 12/21/41 Shocked by Pearl Harbor only 13,341 watch the Bears rout the Giants 37-9 for the NFL crown in Wrigley Field behind FB Norm Standlee's two short TD runs and frosting TDs by George McAfee and Ken Kavanaugh.
- 12/13/42 George Halas departs for the US Navy prior to the NFL title game which Chicago loses 14-6 in Washington. Bears score of Lee Artoe's 50vard fumble return.
- 1943 Hunk Anderson and Luke Johnsos co-coach the wartime Bears for the next three seasons compiling a 15-11-2 record.
- 11/14/43 Sid Luckman becomes the first pro to pass for over 400 yards in a game. He hits the Giants with 433 and seven TDs.
- 12/26/43 The Bears blast Washington 41-21 in Wrigley Field for the NFL title before 34,320 fans. Sid Luckman throws five TD passes (2 each to Harry Clark and Danti Magnani). Bronko Nagurski scores his last Bear TD, a 3-yard smash.
- 8/8/44 Bears open training camp at St. Joseph's College, Rensselaer, Ind. The association lasts until the 1975 season.
- 11/22/45 George Halas returns to Bears from WWII and his tour of duty with the Navy. The 1-7 Bears respond winning their last two games for a 3-7 record.

- 1961 Fire destroys Bears offices and Club moves to 173 W. Madison.

- 10/22/61 Bears destroy the scorching 49er shotgun formation 31-0 with Bill George playing middle guard and the defensive line stunting. A Wrigley Field crowd of 49,070 watch the Chicagoans yield just 6 first downs and 132 yards in total offense.
- 12/29/83 Bears intercept five YA Tittle passes and capture NFL title from Giants 14-10 in Wrigley Field before 45,801 and closed circuit TV. Champs share \$5,899 per man. QB Billy Wade gets both TDs on 2- and 1-vard runs.
- 1964 Flanker Johnny Morris catches NFL record 93 passes.
- 1965 Bears set standard for perfect draft selecting LB Dick Butkus and RB Gale Sayers on first round.
- 11/25/85 Sayers scores 6 TDs against the 49ers.
- 1985 Rockie Sayers bursts into pro football with a NFL record 22 TDs.
- 1986 Gale Sayers sets NFL combined yards record with 2.440.
- 5/27/68 The all-time winningest coach in football history, George Halas retires from coaching after 40 seasons with 320 wins, 147 defeats, 30 ties.
- 5/28/68 Jim Dooley named head coach of the Bears. During his four seasons, the Club posts a 20-36-0 record.
- 11/3/68 Gale Sayers becomes the first Bear to rush for over 200 yards when he dashes through the Packers for 205 yards on 24 tries.
- 1969 Low mark in Bear history with a 1-13 record.
- 3/19/70 George Halas elected president of the National Football Conference.
- 12/13/70 Bears say goodbye to Wrigley Field trouncing Green Bay 35-17. They will make Soldier Field their home in 1971.
- 1/27/72 Abe Gibron replaces Jim Dooley as head coach.
- 9/12/74 Jim Finks is named executive vice president, general manager, and chief operating officer after a distinguished career with the Vikings.

## RECORDS INTRODUCTION

When the National Football League was formed in 1920, probably the last thing the founders had to worry about was the compiling of statistics and records. Accordingly, a complete statistical history of the league, dating from 1920, is an impossibility. However, here are some reference points for when various statistical categories were first compiled officially:

Scoring: Scores of all games are available starting in 1920; for purposes of records, however, totals date from 1932, Individual scoring statistics also date from 1932. Extra point and field goal attempts start in 1937.

Rushing: Statistics begin in 1932.

Passing: Statistics begin in 1932. Until 1947, what is now called "yards lost attempting to pass" was recorded in the rushing statistics. From 1947 to 1951, "vards lost attempting to pass" was recorded, but was not included in either the net rushing or the net passing yardage totals (and consequently was not a part of "total net yards gained"). Starting in 1952, passing vardage team totals include "vards lost attempting to pass." although sacks were not recorded before 1963. Lateral passes were maintained as a separate category until 1950, at which time vardage gained or lost as a result of lateral passes was included in the category initiating the action (e.g., rushing).

Pass Receiving: Statistics begin in 1932.

Interceptions By: Individual statistics begin in 1940, but individual touchdowns are available from 1932. Team totals for interceptions and touchdowns start in 1932, and team vardage totals start in 1940.

Punting: Complete seasonal statistics begin in 1939, although frequently during the period 1933-1938 individual and/or team punting totals are listed on official score blanks. Such game totals are included as official records, where applicable.

Punt Returns: Complete individual totals date from 1941, although team vardage figures date from 1936, Touchdowns are available since 1932.

Kickoff Returns: Complete individual totals date from 1941, although team yardage figures date from 1940. Touchdowns are available since 1932.

Fumbles: Individual totals start in 1945. Team totals for fumbles and for total fumbles recovered begin in 1935, and the breakdown of own and opponents' recoveries dates from 1938.

First Downs: Statistics begin in 1933, while the rushing -- passing -- by penalty breakdown commences in 1939 (although some games in 1937-1938 include this information).

Penalties: Yards penalized dates from 1936; penalties start in 1941.

Long Plays: Since the "Long" category was not always listed on official score blanks (longest run, longest punt, etc.). an attempt has been made to verify reports of long plays through newspaper accounts — even if they are not listed on the official sheets. Reliable newspaper findings have been included in this record section.

#### **Pro Hall of Famers**

George Connor, T-LB, inducted 1975. Played for Bears eight seasons from 1948-55 after college ball at Holy Cross and Notre Dame. At 6-3, 240, Connor was the first of the big, mobile outside backers. All-Pro five times but in 1951-2-3 on both offense and defense. Played in four Pro Bowls. Jersey numbers 71 & 81.

John (Paddy) Driscoll, HB, inducted 1965. Played five seasons for Bears 1926-31. Was Chicago Cardinal from 1919-25 after Northwestern days. Triple-threat performer with punting, dropkicking to go with running. Coached Bears in '56 and '57. Jersey numbers 1 & 26.

Danny Fortmann, G, inducted 1965. Played eight seasons with Bears from 1936 to 43 after college ball at Colgate. Received M.D. from U of Chicago 1940. Punishing blocker despite 6-0, 210-pounds, and helmetless style. All-Pro five times. Jersey number 21.

Bill George, LB, inducted 1974. Played 14 seasons with Bears from 1952 to 66 and finished career with Rams. All-Pro eight times. First great NFL middle linebacker. 'Created' the position switching from middle guard in '54. Longest active career in Bear history. Played in eight Pro Bowls. His jersey number 61 is retired.

Harold (Red) Grange, HB, inducted 1963. Played seven seasons with Bears: 1925, then 1929-34. Spent 1926-28 with own NY team. Showcasing the Galloping Ghost, Bears played 19 games from 11/26/25 to 1/31/26 from coast to coast posting 13-5-1 record. Made first all-Pro team 1931. His jersey number 77 is retired.

George Halas, End-Coach-Owner, inducted 1963. Started Bears as Decatur Staleys in 1920 has been with the Bears ever since (with time out for Navy duty in WWII). Co-organizer of forerunner of NFL. Coached for 40 seasons and retired with an all-time high 326 victories. Played pro ball for 11 seasons starting with Hammond Pros in 1919. Wore jersey 7.

Ed Healey, T, inducted 1964. Played for Bears five seasons from 1922 to 1927. First player purchased by Bears — from Rock Island where he played two seasons. Termed "the most versatile tackle of all time" by Halas. First president (1937) of Bear alumni association. College ball at Dartmouth, Wore jersey 16.

Bill Hewitt, E, inducted 1971. Played five seasons with

#### **Pro Hall of Famers**

Bears from 1932 to 1936 then four more seasons with Eagles. All-League in '33 and '34. Helmetless player who starred at Michigan. His number 56 is retired.

Sid Luckman, QB, inducted 1965. Played 12 seasons with Bears from 1939 to '50. Tailback at Columbia. All-Pro six times. Directed Bears to four NFL championships. Still leads NFL in percentage throws for TDs with 8%, 137 TDs. His number 42 jersey is retired.

Roy (Link) Lyman, T, inducted 1964. Played seven seasons for Bears between 1926 and '34. Started pro career with Canton in 1922, college star at Nebraska. Played defense with stunting style setting trend for modern play. Wore five jersey numbers during career 2, 11, 12, 14, 77.

George McAfee, HB, inducted 1966. Played eight seasons with Bears from 1940 to 1950 with time out for WWII. All-Pro in 1941. Still holds NFL punt return record with 12.78 yards a try. All-America at Duke. His jersey number 5 is retired.

Bronko Nagurski, FB-T, inducted 1963. Played nine seasons with Bears from 1930 to '37 and 1943 (after retiring). All-Pro three times. Most punishing runner of all time. Minnesota all-America. Fifth on all-time Chicago rushing list. His jersey number 3 is retired. Also wore number 16.

Joe Stydahar, T, inducted 1967. Played nine seasons with Bears from 1936 to 1946 with time out for WWII. First player drafted by Bears after college days at West Virginia. All-Pro four times. Played on three NFL championship teams. Wore jersey 13.

George Trafton, C, inducted 1964. Played 12 seasons with Bears from 1920 to 32 and never made a bad snap. College star at Notre Dame. First center to snap with one hand. Wore jersey 13.

Clyde (Bulldog) Turner, C-LB, inducted 1966. Played 12 seasons with Bears from 1940 to '52 with all-pro honors six times as center. Made 17 interceptions as LB. Played in first two Pro Bowls ('51 & '52). All-America at Hardin-Simmons. His iersey number 66 is retired.

Three other players in the Hall of Fame also wore Chicago colors although spending most of their careers with other teams: End Guy Chamberlain who played in 1920 & '21, guard Walt Kiesling 1934, and quarterback Bobby Layne, 1948.
