

Matt Potter, former United States Women's National Team (USWNT) Assistant Coach, U-23 USWNT Head Coach and decorated NCAA Coach was named head coach of the Kansas City Current on January 11, 2022.

"There is a clear vision for the Kansas City Current, both on and off the field," stated Potter. "It's a vision that reflects the city, its people, and sports teams with great sporting traditions built on energizing a community by aiming high and unmatched work ethic. These attributes align with my own ambition and values. I look forward to the challenge of competing in one of the premier women's soccer leagues, with players that share that philosophy. The Current is truly on the move, and I can't wait to get started."

In 2012, Potter took the reins of the University of Oklahoma program. He led the Sooners to two NCAA tournament appearances and three double-digit win seasons.

A native of Mere, England, Potter spent his teenage years manning the central midfield for Watford FC before attending the West London College of Brunel University, where he led his team to the National British College title. Potter holds a USSF Pro License, USSF Talent Scout License, USSF A License and United Soccer Coaches Premier License.



PROFESSIONAL

2021: Kansas City Current - Edmonds arrived in KC via trade during the preseason. She played nearly every position on the field in 21 games, leading all players in starts (21) and minutes (1,721). Scored a penalty kick against Gotham on 10/22/21 to



equalize and keep the team's home unbeaten streak alive. Served as team captain for six matches.

2016-2020: Orlando Pride - Edmonds was traded to the Orlando Pride in December of 2015. She started in all of the 19 games where she scored six goals while playing midfield. She scored two goals in the 2017 season and 1 goal in the 2018 season for the Pride.

2014-2015: Western New York Flash - Edmonds signed with the Western New York Flash in the NWSL for the 2014 season where she started 19 of 22 games. She recorded an assist while playing defender. The Flash finished the season in seventh place. In the 2015 season, Edmonds made 10 starts in her 11 appearances while recording one assist. Again, the club placed seventh place.

2012-2013: WFC Rossiyanka -

Edmonds joined WFC Rossiyanka of the Russian Premier League for the 2012-2013 season where she made 13 appearances while recording seven assists and scoring two goals. Rossiyanka finished in first place in the regular season with a record of 10-1-3. Edmonds made two appearances with the club in the 2012-13 UEFA Women's Champions League. Edmonds made 13 starts in 13 games in the 2013 season where she scored one goal while the team placed fourth in the regular season with a record of 8-4-2. She then made four appearances for the club in the 2013-2014 UEFA Women's Champions League.

2011: Stjarnan - Edmonds signed with Icelandic Team Stjarnan and helped the team win the league championship and Icelandic Women's Cup.

INTERNATIONAL

On October 27, 2016, Edmonds was called up to the U.S. Women's National Team training camp for the first time.

COLLEGE

2005-2008: Rutgers University - During Edmonds' freshman season, she became the first rookie to lead the team in scoring since Carli Lloyd. She recorded six goals while tallying six assists while being named the SoccerBuzz All-Region Freshman First-Team. In her sophomore season, she scored two goals and recorded one assist in 16 games. Her senior year, she was a starter for all 22 games and scored five goals with six assists.

PERSONAL

Versatile player can play defense, midfield and forward positions. Led Orlando in scoring (2016) earning NWSL Player of the Week in 2016 (week 12). Has over 100 NWSL career appearances.





HAILIE MACE #4 DEFENDER

Acquired: Via Trade, 2021

PROFESSIONAL

2021: Kansas City Current - Mace was one of three players traded to Kansas City midway through the 2021 season, along with Kristen Hamilton and Katelyn Rowland. She made her debut KC July 23 against her old team. She played 13 games (12 starts) for

Kansas City, scoring her first goal for KC against the Chicago Red Stars on Oct. 16. **2020-2021:** North Carolina Courage - Mace was traded to the Courage from Sky Blue FC just before the 2020 season. She played in every Challenge Cup match for NC in both the 2020 and 2021 Challenge Cup tournaments. She played 10 games and scored 2 goals for NC before being traded midway through the season. **2019:** Mace was the 2nd overall pick in the 2019 NWSL Draft by Sky Blue. Rather than sign with them, she elected to play in Australia on a short-term contract with Melbourne City. Shortly after that, Mace signed with FC Rosengård in Sweden. She made 16 appearances for her Swedish side and scored four goals.

INTERNATIONAL

After several stints with the U-23 US National Team, Mace earned her first call-up to the senior team in 2018. She did not make the game roster for the 2018 SheBelieves Cup, but earned her first cap later that year as the US defeated Mexico 6-2 on April 8. Mace subbed into the match in the 59th minute. Mace made two more appearances for the USWNT that year in a pair of friendlies against Chile.

COLLEGE

2005-2008: UCLA - Mace led all freshman in 2015 in games played (19) and games started (15). Played and started all 22 games in 2016 and earned her first All-Pac-12 Honors. In 2017, along with being a MAC Hermann Trophy semi-finalist, she earned First-team All-American, All-West Region and All-Pac-12 honors. Missed all but 13 games in 2018 while playing with the U.S. Women's National Team. Still ranked 2nd on the team in scoring (9) and points (24).

LYNN WILLIAMS #6 FORWARD

PROFESSIONAL

2021: Despite missing several games for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, Williams played in 17 matches for the Courage, scoring 7 goals and 2 assists. She finished the season with 57 career goals, 2nd all-time in NWSL history. **2020:** Started four games for 360



minutes, three goals and assisted one goal in the Fall Series. Played and started five games for 416 minutes and scored three goals in the Challenge Cup. **2019:** Started in 23 of the 24 games she played during the season for a total of 2,052 minutes. She scored 12 goals and had 6 assists. **2018:** Williams started in 22 of the 23 games she played in during the season for a total of 1887 minutes. She scored 14 goals on the season, coming in second place in the Golden Boot race. She also had five assists during the season. Williams was named to the 2018 NWSL Second XI. **2017:** Williams started in 23 games and played for 2,006 minutes. She recorded nine goals and five assists during the 2017 season and took 83 shots.

2016: Started in all 19 games played, logging 1,670 minutes for the Flash. Scored 11 goals and tallied five assists in 2016, making her the NWSL Golden Boot winner and League MVP. **2015:** Selected by the Flash in the 2015 NWSL College Draft (No. 6 overall). Signed a contract with the Flash on March 17th. Had 17 appearances for the Flash, including 13 starts. Scored 4 goals and had 4 assists. Named the WNY Flash's Offensive Player of the Year.

INTERNATIONAL

2019: The forward was called into November camps with the USWNT after Vlatko Andonovski was named head coach. It was her first call up in a year and a half. She played 2 games for a total of 88 minutes. She scored two goals. 2018: Williams has played 20 minutes in one friendly game in 2018 with the US Women's National Team. She also made three appearance with the team during The SheBelieves Cup for a total of 44 minutes. 2017: Williams played in 11 games, four of which she started. She played a total of 484 minutes and scored three goals. 2016: Made four appearances and scored one goal for the USWNT. 2015: Member of the U-23 Women's National team in La Manga during the Six Nations Cup. Scored the game winner against England to lead her team to victory.

COLLEGE

2011-2014: Pepperdine University - Williams graduated from Pepperdine University. 2014: Accumulated 24 goals, 15 game- winning goals, and 398 shots, which ranks 1st in Pepperdine women's soccer history. She also finished her career with 39 assists and 102 points, both which ranked her second in school history. Led her team with 14 goals and 10 assists. Led her team to an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance. Earned her third straight All-WCC first team honor. 2013: Started the first 15 games of the season before suffering an injury. Finished the season with 11 goals and three assists. 2012: Led the team in shots with 97. Registered team-high five goals in WCC play. 2011: Started all 20 games as a true freshman. Finished the season with six goals and eight assists.

PROFESSIONAL

2021: Kansas City Current Ball started all 16 matches she appeared in for Kansas City in the club's inaugural season. She scored her first career goal on a headed cross from Katie Bowen in the 37th minute of a 3-0 victory over the Houston Dash on Oct. 13

2020: Utah Royals FC Ball was traded to Utah as the 2020 season began. 



MEDIA GUIDELINES

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials and access will be granted only to individuals with a legitimate working function at a game, training session or event. The bearer must be on a specific assignment. Credentials are non-transferable. Any unauthorized use of a credential subjects the bearer to ejection from the event. Resale or attempted resale is grounds for seizure and cancellation.

The following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the stadium or training facility:

- · Requesting autographs at any time.
- · Taking photographs with players/coaches
- · Using credential for family or friends of a working media member
- · Conduction of unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (Cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages, failure to abide by posted rules, etc.)

Credential Applications

Kansas City Current is accepting applications for Season-Long Credentials and Single-Game Credentials. Members of the media with season-long credentials will be given priority at all Kansas City NWSL home matches. Due to COVID restrictions, space is limited and media must RSVP to gain access. Media credentials do not guarantee entry into the venue without prior reservation.

All single-game credential requests must be submitted in advance two (2) days prior to the scheduled match. Applications and reservations can be found throughout the season at kansascitycurrent.com/credential-applications

Upon arrival at the venue, your name will be confirmed on a list of approved attendees for that particular match. Once your name is confirmed, you will receive a credential that allows you to enter and exit the venue. Your credential access will determine the areas of the venue you will be able to visit.

Treatment of Credentialed Media

Postgame Media Access: Players from both teams will be available to media post-game in a mix-zone located outside the team locker rooms or in a location near the field of play. The mix-zone will begin 10 minutes after the conclusion of the match. Locker rooms will not be open to media at any point.

No individuals other than League or Club representatives shall be allowed in Club locker rooms following a game.

Under no circumstances shall any club and/or its players discriminate in any fashion against an accredited member of the media based upon race, creed, sex or national origin.

Seating Access: Accredited media members will have access to the stadium, professional workrooms and stadium seating, if available. During the match, accredited media will have access to the press box which will be restricted to only those accredited media members.

All credentialed media shall be seated in media seating areas, consistent with treatment afforded comparable media. In addition, all members of the media are to be afforded equal treatment and access to facilities and personnel, regardless of sex.

Traveling Media: Members of the working media who travel with a visiting team will not be treated in a discriminatory manner with regard to seating or any other privilege or facility accorded to the home media. Comparable seating and equipment should apply to home and road media (print and electronic).

Media Access to Practice: Kansas City Current will work to provide media access to practice whenever possible. If practices are closed, Kansas City Current will grant a 30-minute media access period at the start or end of practice at least once per week. In addition, Kansas City Current will make a member of the coaching staff and a player available for interviews at least once per week.

Game Day Guidelines for Photographers and Camera Operators: All photographers and television camera operators must stay behind the field boards at all times, unless released by the on-site photo marshal.

Each photographer will be permitted to use one monopod — but no tripods.

Stand-alone remote units on or around the goal posts will not be permitted without permission from the Home Team, the NWSL and the Referees.



MEDIA GUIDELINES

Photographer Access to field: Photographers shall be permitted behind the field boards in designated areas in Legends Field. Photographers must not be blocking viewing of fans or spectators in any capacity.

Once situated, no movement shall be permitted until halftime. Changes in this policy will be allowed in cases where stadium facilities dictate alterations. No photographers shall be allowed near the team benches.

Game Day Photographer Identification: In addition to their regular credential photographers will be issued colored bibs. Photographers will pick up their bib when they check-in at the stadium and return as they leave.

Game Day Photography Work Area: A work area will be provided for photographers, near the field where appropriate, with high-speed internet access.

NON-RIGHTS HOLDER VIDEO GUIDELINES

Video Footage:

All rights to match footage including all applicable copyrights belong to the National Women's Soccer League and its rights holders who broadcast each specific match.

Television Broadcasters

Game Action: Television broadcasters can use footage of NWSL events obtained either via 1) their own recording or 2) action dubbed from a NWSL rights holder broadcast with credit only in connection with its regularly scheduled news programming within a week of the game. This footage should not exceed two (2) minutes. Highlights aired as part of a continuous news program should not be longer than one (1) minute per 30-minute segment. Credits: NWSL / Kansas City.

Filming – Game Action: FOR TELEVISED EVENTS, NON-RIGHTS HOLDERS / ENG CAMERAS MAY RECORD THE FIRST 5 MINUTES OF EACH HALF. For non-televised events, non-rights holders / ENG cameras may record the entire game but are still subject to the aforementioned limits. This includes events that are web streamed live online.

Filming – Interviews and Scene Sets: There is no limit to the gathering of footage pre-game, at halftime and post-game. All footage gathered is subject to the usage guidelines indicated in this document.

Filming - In Seating Area: Video cameras looking to shoot in the concourse or seating area must contact home team and NWSL in advance of the event for approval.

Previews or Advances: In advance of a NWSL event, television broadcasters can use two (2) minutes of archival game action to preview an upcoming event. In the local/regional markets, broadcasters should mention the time and location of the game along with their report. Outside of the local markets, broadcasters should mention the time and broadcast information.

Television Broadcasters' Web Sites: Video produced for air as part of regular programming that is simulcast or archived online must be accompanied by a link to NWSLSoccer.com. Content produced exclusively for the Internet is subject to the guidelines for Online Video.

Online Video

Game Action: Online organizations (including print publications that post video online) are not permitted to film or use game action video without prior written approval by NWSL. Game action includes any footage of the field, teams, etc., following the beginning of the television broadcast window. Only video of off-field activities (i.e. interviews, training sessions) may be recorded.

Non-Game Video: Any video posted online that is recorded as part of media access is limited to the use of eight (8) minutes per day/activity date. Online video may not incorporate integrated advertising and must be accompanied by links to NWSLSoccer.com.

Professional Presentation: Online video is expected to be recorded, edited and presented in a professional manner. Video must be presented/hosted on an organization's website, and not solely on a site provided by a third-party (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, Facebook, etc.).

Online Video Sites: Organizations who regularly post video to online video sites (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, etc.) may not include advertising with video gathered as a result of media access. Allowing users to embed these videos is not permitted, and the description of any video must include a link to NWSLSoccer.com.
