# FINAL 2022 ALTOONA CURVE GAME NOTES 

WE＇RE WINNERS：For the first time since 2018，the Curve finished their season with a winning record at 71－66．After finishing the first half of the season in 4th place in the Southwest Division with a $33-36$ record，Altoona rallied to a $38-30$ finish in the second half；falling just 2.5 game shy of the postseason．Altoona finished the regular season by going 11－5 in September．
RECORD SETTING：The 2022 Curve set a host of franchise records including：Most home runs in a season（143），most home runs hit in home games（74），most players $20+$ HR（ 2 players－Andres Alvarez and Aaron Shackelford），matched for 4th time in franchise history），most stolen bases in a season（162），most lead－off home runs hit in a season（6），most strikeouts in a season（batting，1，254），fewest complete games thrown in a season（0），most strikeouts in a season（pitching，1，247），most wild pitches thrown（98），most starting pitchers used（matched，22） and most consecutive Games with a home run（12）．

Altoona also matched or set several single－game records including runs scored in a game（ $5 / 19 \mathrm{vs}$ ．Richmond，19），hits in an inning（matched $6 / 2 \mathrm{vs}$ ．Bowie，9），most triples in a game（matched， $6 / 2 \mathrm{vs}$ ．Bowie，3），and most home runs allowed in an inning（ 4,4 th inning on $4 / 13 \mathrm{vs}$ ． Richmond．）

SHACK ATTACK：Aaron Shackelford led Pirates minor leaguers with 26 home runs，passing Josh Bonifay for the second－highest single－ season total in franchise history（Adam Hyzdu－31，2000）．Shackelford，Matt Gorski and Endy Rodriguez are the first trio of Pirates minor leaguers to homer at least 24 times in the same season since 2005 （Brad Eldred，Josh Bonifay，Jose Bautista and Pat Magness）．Shackelford ranked among the league leaders in HR（T－3rd，14），XBH（T－4th，29）and RBI（T－10th，39）in the second half（ $6 / 28-9 / 19$ ）．

WE＇VE ENTERED A HOUSE OF WORSHIP：Despite allowing a career－high 7 runs in his final start with Altoona，right－hander Quinn Priester＇s 2．87 ERA ranked 4th－best among qualified Double－A pitchers since his debut on June 19．Akron＇s Tanner Bibee leads qualifed pitchers in that timeframe（1．60）．Priester also ranked T－1st in GS（15），and 8th in IP（75．1）．Quinn was named the Eastern League＇s Pitcher of the Week，the second weekly award collected by the Curve this year following Mike Burrows on May 29.
20／20 VISION：Infielder Andres Alvarez recorded the first 20／20 season in Altoona＇s franchise history with his two－run home run on Sunday， September 4 against Akron．With Aaron Shackelford already hitting the total，Altoona has 2 players with 20 HR on the same team for the first time since 2005 （Jose Bautista／Josh Bonifay）and just the fourth time in 24 seasons of the franchise＇s history．Alvarez and Shackelford recorded the 11th and 12th 20－homer seasons in franchise history．

Matt Gorski later joined the 20／20 club with his 20th stolen base of the season on Sunday，September 11 at Erie．While the majority of Gorski＇s production took place in Greensboro，he and Alvarez are the first duo in Pittsburgh＇s minor leagues to record a $20 / 20$ season since 1992 when Keith Thomas and Al Martin both did it．20／20 seasons by Pirates minor leaguers since 1992 include：Adam Boeve（2007），Craig Stansberry（2005），J．J．Davis（2003），Chad Hermanson（1998），Jose Guillen（1996）

ENDY＇S POP：Catcher Endy Rodriguez homered from both sides of the plate in Altoona＇s 13－7 win over Akron on Thursday，September 1．It was just the 5th time in franchise history that Altoona had a player homer from both sides of the plate and first time at PNG Field．Rodolfo Castro last turned the trick on $6 / 5 / 21$ at Richmond．Others to homer from both sides of the plate in the same game in franchise history include：Shawn Garrett $5 / 2 / 03$ at Reading，Hector Gimenez $5 / 5 / 10$ at Richmond，Shelby Ford $5 / 15 / 10$ at Richmond．In his 31 games with the Curve，Rodriguez hit ． $356 / .442 / .678 / 1.120$ with $142 \mathrm{~B}, 8 \mathrm{HR}, 32 \mathrm{RBI}, 18 \mathrm{BB}$ and $1-1 \mathrm{SB}$ ．Between his promotion to Double－A and the end of the regular season he ranked 2nd in 2B（14），2nd in XBH（22），9th in SLG\％（．678），9th in RBI（32）and 9th in OPS（1．120）among all minor leaque players．He was the lone player in MiLB w／35＋2B，20＋HR， $50+$ BB and less than $100 \mathrm{~K}(\mathrm{~h} / \mathrm{t}$ Josh Norris of Baseball America）．

FINISHING ON A HIGH NOTE：After missing 10 weeks of the season with a right foot injury，Infielder Nick Gonzales reached base safely in 26－ of－28 games after his activation batting ．286／．408／．505（30－for－105）with 12 2B， $13 \mathrm{~B}, 3 \mathrm{HR}, 18 \mathrm{RBI}$ ，and 18 BB ．

TEAM AWARDS：On the final weekend of the season，Altoona honored five players with team awards．J．C．Flowers and Tahnaj Thomas took home the team＇s Fireman of the Year Award，Luis Ortiz was named Pitcher of the Year，INF Andres Alvarez earned the team＇s Unsung Hero Award and Jared Triolo was named Most Valuable Player．
POSTSEASON PROMOTIONS：After the regular season wrapped up，several Curve players finished out the regular season at Triple－A India－ napolis：OF Matt Gorski，INF Malcom Nuñez，RHP Quinn Priester，C Endy Rodriguez，RHP Colin Selby，and INF Aaron Shackelford．

AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS：Altoona finished the season T－1st in Team Batting Average with a .248 mark and 2nd in the Eastern League in reliever ERA（3．84）．It was a season that saw the Eastern League set league－wide records in HR（1，824），HR／Game（2．21）and HR\％（2．95）as well as records for strikeouts（ 15,631 ），K／Game（18．97）and Stolen Base success rate（ $76.39 \%$ ）．
THE TRACKS TO PITTSBURGH RUN THROUGH ALTOONA： 13 Curve alumni made their major league debut this season：INF Diego Castillo $4 / 7$－PIT），RHP Beau Sulser（ $4 / 26$－PIT），OF Jack Suwinski（ $4 / 26$－PIT），LHP Cam Alldred（ $5 / 12$－PIT），OF Cal Mitchell（ $5 / 24$－PIT），RHP Yerry De Los Santos（5／25－PIT），OF Canaan Smith－Njigba（6／14－PIT），C Jason Delay（ $6 / 14$－PIT），LHP Cam Vieaux（6／17－PIT），INF Liover Peguero（ $6 / 18$－PIT），OF Bligh Madris（ $6 / 20$－PIT），RHP Luis Ortiz（ $9 / 13$－PIT），INF Ji－Hwan Bae（ $9 / 23$－PIT）．

PUNCHED OUT: Altoona's bullpen filled all 10 innings in Friday May 13's 2-1 win over Somerset. With Zach Matson making his first professional start, he combined with Travis MacGregor Colin Selby, Enmanuel Mejia and Will Kobos for 19 strikeouts, one shy of the franchise record for most strikeouts in a game by the team's pitching staff. Altoona matched the record for K's in a 9-inning game with 17, but Somerset's rally with 2 outs in the 9th inning against Mejia sent the game to extras.

ADIOS, PELOTAI: The Curve hit a season-best 4 home runs in their 12-2 win over Richmond on Tuesday, May 17. Blake Sabol hit a pair of two-run homers to center field, which traveled an estimated 413 and 427 feet respectively, while Nick Gonzales added his third of the season and Andres Alvarez smacked his team-leading fifth of the year.

LET'S HIT: The Curve picked up at least 10 hits in 6 -of- 8 games from May $14-22$. The Curve led the Eastern League with a .253 team batting average after play on May 23.
NICKY G IS FOR ME: Infielder Nick Gonzales heated up in the final weeks of May. Over his 8 game hit streak ( $5 / 11-5 / 21$ ) he batted . 467 ( 14 -for- 30 ) with 32 B, 2 HR, 7 RBI and 5 BB with 5 multi-hit games including 4 straight entering play on May 21.
A LOT OF DEBUTS: 2021 Curve LHP Cam Alldred became the 187th alumni in franchise history to reach the major leagues and that has begun a parade of former Curve players to the major league roster in Pittsburgh. RHP Yerry De Los Santos and OF Cal Mitchell were both called up over a two day span and become the 188th and 189 th Curve alumni to reach MLB.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS: The Curve set their franchise record with 19 runs scored in Sunday's win over Richmond. Seven players recorded multi-hit days led by Tucupita Marcano and Lolo Sanchez with 3 each. After falling behind 3-0 in the top of the first, Altoona scored a season-best 8 runs on 6 hits including back-to-back home runs by Aaron Shackelford and Andres Alvarez. The Curve scored a run in 6-of-8 innings at the plate. Marcano, Sanchez, Connor Scott and Shackelford combined for 12 runs batted in in the 6-7-8-9 spots in the order.
THE BABE: With a 3 -run homer in his Double-A debut on Tuesday, May 24 , Matt Gorski stood alone as the minor league leader in home runs with 18 on the season.
SEE YOU LATER: With Aaron Shackelford's 3-run homer on Wednesday, May 25, the Curve matched their franchise record with a home run in their 10th straight game. During the streak, the Curve have homered 19 times, tied for the second-most by an MiLB team ( 21 by Frisco, Norfolk and Tulsa) since May 14. After Matt Fraizer and Liover Peguero's solo homers on Thursday, May 26, the Curve set their franchise record with homers in 11 straight games. Aaron Shackelford's two-run homer on Friday, May 27, set the franchise record with homers in 12 straight games. During the streak, the Curve homered 22 times, tied for the third-most by an MiLB team ( 25 by Tulsa, and 24 by Erie) between May 14-28.
BURROWED: Mike Burrows was been unscored upon in five of his starts this year and allowed 2 runs or fewer in 8 -of-his- 9 starts this season. Following play on Thursday, May 26 , he ranked all over the EL Leaderboards: 3rd in ERA (1.90), 3rd in WHIP (0.87), 4th in BAA (.166), T-5th in K's (54) and 6th in IP (42.2).

Burrows was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for the week ending May 29 after his career-long start against Harrisburg in which he allowed 2 hits, 1 walk and struck out a season-high 8 batters. In 2021, Altoona's Roansy Contreras earned the award for the week ending May 25.

THAT BLAKE SABOL, SO HOT RIGHT NOW: Catcher Blake Sabol picked up a career-high 4 hits on Wednesday, May 18 and over his last 12 games ( $5 / 13-5 / 30$ ) he hit .381 with $42 B, 13 B, 3$ HR, 12 RBI and 9 BB (. 481 OBP).

## June Notes

AN INNING FOR THE RECORD BOOKS: The Curve matched their franchise record with 9 hits in a 9 -run 2nd inning on Thursday, June 2 against Bowie. Altoona matched their franchise record for triples in a game with 3 triples in the second inning by Brendt Citta, Matt Fraizer, and Andres Alvarez, and sent 13 men to the plate in the frame. The Curve were one hit shy of matching the franchise record for hits in an inning.

ALVY'S BIG START: Andres Alvarez picked up a career-high 5 RBI in Altoona's 13-12 win over Bowie on Thursday, June 2. After an RBI single and an RBI triple in the second inning, Alvarez smashed a go-ahead 3 -run homer in the 8 th inning to lead the Curve to a win. Through 29 games Alvarez set a new career-high with a team-best 9 home runs and his 21 RBI matched a career-best. His . 642 slugging percentage would be second in the league if he qualified for the Eastern League Leaderboards.
TREE TRIMMING: Jared Triolo picked up two hits in each end of the doubleheader on Wednesday, June 8 at Reading. His 12th and 13th multi-hit games of the season marked the third time this season that Triolo had two or more hits in back-to-back games. Over his a 14 G stretch ( $5 / 24-6 / 8$ ) Triolo batted: . $358 / .443 / .415$ with $32 \mathrm{~B}, 4$ RBI, 8 BB and $3-3$ SB. His 53 hits ranked 6 th in the Eastern League.

A FIRST FOR EVERYTHING: Altoona had gone 53 straight games without being shutout to begin the season, the second-longest active streak among MiLB teams this season, until they were shutout on Thursday, June 9 at Reading. Triple-A Jacksonville (Marlins) held the longest active streak of not being shutout at 56 games when Altoona's streak ended.
HE'S BACK: Prior to Altoona's game on Friday, June 10th game at Reading, the Curve activated C Henry Davis off the injured list after he missed about 3 weeks with a left wrist injury. Placed on the IL on May 18, Davis played a 2 game rehab assignment in Florida during which he caught a combined no-hitter with Bradenton on Thursday, June 9 thrown by fellow rehabber Quinn Priester (3 IP), Anthony Solometo (4 IP), Jake Sweeney (1 IP) and Yunior Thibo (1 IP).

NO LEAD IS SAFE: Altoona held a lead after 5 innings in 30 of 55 games played this season, through play on June 10, and held an 20-10 record in those games.
TROUBLE WITH THE LONG BALL: Altoona pitchers surrendered 62 home runs through 55 games played, tied for 21 st-most by a pitching staff in minor league baseball and fourth-most in the Eastern League behind Hartford (73). The Curve allowed a home run in 34 of 55 games.
JUNE IS FOR THE K: Altoona pitching picked up 132 strikeouts through 13 games in the month of June, the most in the Eastern League.
ACE OUT, ACE IN: Prior to the game on Thursday, June 16th against Erie, the Curve announced the promotion of RHP Mike Burrows to Triple-A Indianapolis. Ranked as the No. 11 prospect in the Pirates Minor League System by MLB.com, Burrows was unscored upon in six of his starts this year and allowed 2 runs or fewer in 9 -of-his-12 starts. At the time of his promotion he ranked: 5th in ERA (2.94), 6th in K (69), 5th in BAA (.199), 9th in WHIP (1.10), T-1st in GS (12) and was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 30.

In his place, Altoona activated RHP Quinn Priester from the IL, ranked as the No. 4 prospect in the Pirates system by MLB.com. With Priester's activation, the Curve have the 2019 and 2021 Pirates first round selections on the active roster. Priester is expected to make his team debut on Sunday, June 19 against Erie.
LOLO'S BIG DAY: Outfielder Lolo Sanchez knocked his third home run, walked and picked up his second outfield assist of the season in the 9 th inning on Thursday, June 16 against Erie Sanchez homered in a second consecutive game on Friday marking the 5th time he's homered in consecutive games in his career and first since 7/18-20/2021 with Greensboro.

BIG LEAGUE CURVE: With 2018-21 Curve LHP Cam Vieaux making his major league debut on Friday, June 17, Altoona has had 192 alumni head to the majors after their time in Curve, PA. Vieaux became the ninth alumni this season to make his debut joining Diego Castillo, Beau Sulser, Jack Suwinski, Cam Alldred, Cal Mitchell, Yerry De Los Santos, Canaan Smith-Njigba, an Jason Delay. In 2016 and 2018 the Curve had 14 players make their debut, a figure that could easily fall by the time the 2022 season wraps up.
Curve INF Liover Peguero became the third player to be recalled directly to the major league roster on Friday afternoon when INF Tucupita Marcano went on the COVID IL on short notice. Peguero arrived in Pittsburgh in time for first pitch and made his major league debut on Saturday against San Francisco going 1 -for- 3 with a walk. He became the first Pirate born in the 21 s century to suit up for Pittsburgh.

SHACKDADDY: Curve INF Aaron Shackelford picked up his first career multi-homer game on Friday, June 17 against Erie. Shackelford's two-run homer in the fifth inning traveled approximately 462 feet. It was the second time this season that the Curve had a multi-homer game (Sabol, May 17 vs Richmond) and the 115 th in franchise history. The 2021 Curve had six multihomer games with three of them coming from Mason Martin.
BIG LEAGUE CURVE: With 2019-21 Curve OF Bligh Madris became the 194th alumni head to the majors after their time in Curve, PA with his major league debut on Monday, June 20 against the Chicago Cubs. Madris became the 11 th alumni to debut this season.

THAT'S ODD: With Wednesday's walk-off loss at New Hampshire, Altoona has lost 3 games in walk-off fashion this season. RHP J.C. Flowers has been on the mound in all three defeats: May 28 at Harrisburg, June 9 at Reading and June 22 at New Hampshire.
A GREAT START: Matt Fraizer knocked Altoona's second lead-off homer of the season on Thursday, June 23 at New Hampshire. Previously, Nick Gonzales homered on the game's first pitch on April 29 at Akron. It marked the 33rd time in franchise history that Altoona has hit a lead-off homer. Jonah Davis knocked a pair of them in 2021 for the Curve.

TRIPLE REHABBERS: The Curve welcomed UTL Tucupita Marcano, RHP Duane Underwood Jr. and LHP Dillon Peters on rehab on Tuesday, June 28 against Harrisburg. It marked the first time in franchise history that Altoona has hosted 3 rehabbing Pittsburgh Pirates in the same game. Marcano was recovering from a stint on the COVID IL (6/17), while Underwood was also recovering from a stint on $\operatorname{COVID} \operatorname{IL}(6 / 13)$ and Peters was recovering from a back injury ( $6 / 3$ ).

ONE HALF DOWN: With the first half of the season coming to an end on Sunday, June 26, the Curve finished the first half with a $33-36$ record in 4 th place in the Southwest Division. They ranked 1st in Team BA (.252), R (340), 2B (129), and 2nd in OBP\% (.335). In the month of June, Altoona led the Eastern League with 93 BB.
