Sept. 18: RubberDucks 8, Baysox 5: Akron overcame a 3-0, first-inning deficit to rally for a win that knocked Bowie out of playoff contention, ending the Baysox season at Canal Park for a second straight year. Jhonkensy Noel had four hits and three RBI. Marcos González homered in his first at bat since July 2, and Johnathan Rodríguez and José Tena each homered. Randy Labaut (4-1) went 3.1 scoreless innings. Cade Smith (2.2 IP) and Kyle Marman (1 IP) held Bowie hitless over the final 3.2 innings. The RubberDucks were 11-13 against the Baysox, their only losing record against an Eastern League opponent. They also tied Richmond (9-9) and Somerset (3-3).

<u>Second-half race:</u> With Akron defeating Bowie (41-28 second half, 68-70 overall) in the season finale, the Erie SeaWolves (41-28, 80-58) won the second-half Southwest Division title via a tiebreaker (better record over the final 20 games). Erie earned its first playoff berth since 2013 and won the Southwest Division before losing the title to Somerset. Akron finished two games behind Erie for the division's best overall record. Akron lost the first-half title on a tiebreaker with Richmond, which reached its first postseason since 2014.

Tena claims hits lead: José Tena led the Eastern League with 136 hits, the most by a RubberDuck in a season since Yandy Diaz had 150 in 2015. Tena became the fifth Canton or Akron player to lead the Eastern League in hits, joining Omar Ramirez (162 in 1993), Alex Ramirez (169 in 1996), Darren Stumberger (164 in 1998) and Jordan Brown (161 in 2007). Tena's six triples are the most by any RubberDucks since Todd Hankins had seven in 2016.

<u>Odor among the best:</u> Managing Akron for three seasons, **Rouglas** Odor has tallied 213 regular season wins. Only three-year managers **Brad Komminsk** (244), **Dave Wallace** (223) and **Joel Skinner** (221) have more wins for the franchise. No others have reached 200 wins.

Tough to repeat: Akron was eliminated from playoff contention with a loss Sept. 16, but still finished with the second-best record of any team in franchise history that followed a title winner. Only the 2006 Akron Aeros (87-55, also lost in the Eastern League Championship Series) had a better record in a season after Akron won a league title. Akron has never won back-to-back titles and last made consecutive playoff appearances with five straight 2005-2009.

Bibee named Eastern League August Pitcher of the Month:

Tanner Bibee was the third RubberDuck this season to win Eastern League Pitcher of the Month (also **Joey Cantillo** for May and **Logan Allen** for June). Akron won all six of Bibee's August starts, and he went 4-0 with a 1.32 ERA. He led the league with 34 innings and was third with 37 strikeouts. He allowed five earned runs on 24 hits and seven walks with a .194 opponents' average. Bibee pitched six innings in each of his final eight starts. Akron won his last nine. Bibee finished the year with a 2.17 ERA (fifth in full season MiLB), a 0.96 WHIP (eighth) and 167 strikeouts (eighth).

Guardians prospects: Akron featured each of the top five Cleveland Guardians prospects and 17 of the top 30 (according to MLB.com) throughout the 2022 campaign. According to MLB.com, top prospects to appear for Akron included the following players: #1 RHP Daniel Espino, #2 OF George Valera, #3 RHP Gavin Williams, #4 SS/2B Brayan Rocchio, #5 C Bo Naylor, #8 RHP Tanner Bibee, #9 LHP Logan Allen, #11 SS/2B Angel Martínez, #12 RHP Xzavion Curry, #16 OF/3B/1B Jhonkensy Noel, #17 SS/2B José Tena, #18 RHP Tanner Burns, #20 OF Will Brennan, #23 LHP Joey Cantillo, #24 C Bryan Lavastida, #26 LHP Doug Nikhazy, #29 RHP Hunter Gaddis Finished Eastern League season in Akron. Tena and Burns were the only players active with Akron at the start and end of its season.

Strikeout leaders: RubberDucks pitchers had 1,408 strikeouts, most in Double-A and a new Eastern League record. The league record was also reset the last two seasons (1,271 by Reading in 2019 and 1,300 by Somerset in 2021). The Akron franchise record had been 1,190 (2021), and the RubberDucks have reset the club record in three straight seasons ('19, '21, '22). Akron led Double-A in strikeouts for the first time. The starting staff had 742 strikeouts, most in minor league baseball. Akron led the EL in saves (46, tying the franchise record set in 2003), was second in hits allowed (989) and average against (.222), and was third in runs allowed (584), home runs allowed (131), and ERA (3.92, the club's highest since 2017 – 4.43).

<u>Pries posted numbers:</u> Micah Pries had 18 home runs, the most by a RubberDuck since 2018 (Bobby Bradley, 24). Pries also had the most RBI (73) for the club since Bradley had 89 in 2017, and the most extra-base hits (52) since Yu Chang had 53 in 2017. Pries and Daniel Schneemann each had 20 stolen bases, the most by a RubberDuck since Andrew Calica stole 27 in 2018.

Noel's hot stretch: After his Double-A average dipped to a season-low .186 through Aug. 19, **Jhonkensy Noel** went 31-for-95 (.326) with 12 doubles, a triple, four home runs, 15 walks, 20 runs and 21 RBI in his last 26 games, including a 12-game hitting streak Aug. 20-Sept. 2. Noel's 32 total homers this season tied for sixth in the minor leagues. He also led Guardians minor leaguers in extra-base hits (60) and was second in RBI (84) and total bases (237).

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: Bo Naylor appeared Oct. 1 for his major league debut, becoming the 13th player from the 2021 Akron club who has reached Cleveland this year. Naylor, outfielder Will Brennan and pitchers Xzavion Curry and Hunter Gaddis are the four players who began this season with Akron and made their major league debuts for Cleveland. In addition to Naylor, Brennan and Curry, the other 2021 RubberDucks who have appeared for the Guardians this season are Will Benson, Alex Call, Tyler Freeman, Oscar González, Steven Kwan, Bryan Lavastida, Cody Morris, Richie Palacios, Konnor Pilkington, and Tanner Tully. In total, Cleveland had 17 MLB debuts this season.



2022 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*Third Season*) – Odor, 54, is in his 35th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2022 season will be Odor's third as RubberDucks manager (tying him with Joel Skinner, Dave Wallace and Brad Komminsk for most seasons as Akron's manager). In 2021, Odor was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year after leading Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record. He also guided the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. Odor entered 2022 with a career record of 534-513 as a manager.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of major league infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, *Pitching Coach* (Second Season) — Owen Dew, 33, is in his sixth season in the Cleveland organization and second as RubberDucks pitching coach. In 2021, Dew led the Akron pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA (second best in the Double-A Northeast) and a franchise record 1,190 strikeouts. Prior to coming to Akron, Dew was the pitching coach for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers in 2017, AZL Indians in 2018 and Lake County in 2019.

Dew was a 21st round selection by Cleveland in 2010 out of the University of Central Florida. He spent parts of three seasons in the Cleveland organization, logging 58 appearances and 152.1 innings. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017.

#16 Junior Betances, *Hitting Coach* (Second Season) — Betances, 49, is in his 25th season with the Guardians organization as a player, coach or executive and second as the hitting coach for the RubberDucks. In 2021, Betances guided the RubberDucks hitters to a .254 average (third best in the Double-A Northeast) with 116 home runs and 577 RBI (second best in the Double-A Northeast).

Betances came to the organization via the 1996 Rule 5 draft after spending six seasons in the Brewers organization. He batted .289 over 165 games in 1998 and 1999 for the Akron Aeros. Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for Cleveland's Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, *Assistant Hitting Coach* (Second Season) — Mergenthaler, 33, is in his sixth year with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2021 as the bench coach for the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2018 and 2019, Merganthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

#27 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) – De La Cruz, 28, is in his fourth season with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron, where he was the bench coach in 2019. De La Cruz spent 2021 as the bench coach for Low-A Lynchburg. De La Cruz was signed by Cleveland in 2009 and played eight seasons in the organization. He appeared in 12 games for the RubberDucks in 2017.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (Second Season) — Legan is in his ninth season in the Cleveland organization and second season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Legan served as the athletic trainer for Lynchburg in 2019. He earned his bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from East Carolina and his master's degree in Exercise Physiology from the University of Akron.

Tyler Grisdale, Strength and Conditioning Coach (First Season) – Grisdale is in his first season with the Guardians. He spent two years in the Miami Marlins organization and four years with the Colorado Rockies, including as the Physical Performance Coach for the Spokane Indians (Colorado's High-A affiliate) in 2021.
