More On The Mutiny Against MetroStars

... the Mutiny are a perfect 4-0 against the MetroStars at Houlihan's and lead the series, 6-2...midfielder Jim Rooney and defender Kerry Zavagnin are not eligible for Sunday's game for the MetroStars. Both were ejected from the win over San Jose last Saturday...Brazilian forward Gilmar has five points and fellow forward Frankie Hejduk four points to lead current Mutiny players against the MetroStars...MetroStars forward Eduardo Hurtado had four goals and two assists for ten points in four games against the Mutiny while playing for Los Angeles the last two years, including a hat trick in last year's 6-1 Galaxy Rose Bowl romp on Sept. 7...Giovanni Savarese has three goals in seven games against the Mutiny over two seasons...Lalas had one goal and two assists in eight games against the Mutiny while playing for New England...when Tony Meola plays in goal Sunday, it will mark his seventh appearance against the Mutiny, more than any other keeper in the league...

Quill In California

Mutiny forward Eric Quill is off to Project-40 Wars again this weekend. After being on the bench in the Mutiny's 1-0 Houlihan's Stadium loss to Columbus last Thursday, Quill left for Salinas, Ca., and last Friday's game against the California Jaguars. Eric is scheduled to play today in San Francisco against the San Francisco Bay Seals.

Thus far this season, Quill is the leading scorer for Project-40 (1-1), with one goal and one assist for three points.

Quill was the Mutiny's first player in Project-40, which offers a college education to those players wishing to forego collegiate soccer eligibility for a chance to compete for a MLS team. Quill joined the Mutiny from Clemson during the 1997 season and played in two games for Tampa Bay last year.

The Mutiny's other Project-40 player – defender Chad McCarty of the University of Washington – is currently sidelined with a broken ankle.
