1996 Regular Season...joined Mutiny on August 3 from successful U.S. Olympic Team performance and made significant contributions down stretch...played in eight games, starting eight and getting 727 minutes of playing time...had one goal and two assists for four points...didn't play at San Jose on Sept. 18 because of scalp laceration, but returned for Sept. 21 season finale against MetroStars...crossed ball to Roy Lassiter's head at far post in 51st minute and earned second assist of season when Lassiter scored in 2-0 Mutiny win over D.C. United at Houlihan's Stadium on Sept. 14...had his finest game as member of Mutiny in 2-0 Giants Stadium win over MetroStars on Sept. 4...flashed to far post from right midfield position and slotted home Steve Pittman cross in sixth minute for first MLS goal, then crossed from right side to far post in 80th minute, setting up Lassiter's 22nd goal of season...played entire 90 minutes at right fullback in 3-1 win over New England at Houlihan's Stadium on August 31...performance came less than 24 hours after subbing final 25 minutes in 3-1 U.S. National Team win over El Salvador in Los Angeles...drew foul in penalty box in that game, leading to Joe-Max Moore penalty kick...arrived back home in Tampa at 11:30 a.m. on day of Revolution game...started both games of August 21-25 road trip to New England and D.C. United at right fullback in place of injured Cle Kooiman...made Mutiny debut at Dallas on August 10, starting in right midfield and playing full 90 minutes... did not start against MetroStars on August 17, but came on for Lassiter in 83rd minute...observed Mutiny for a week following return before getting chance...trained with Mutiny from April 1-5 during week off from Olympics...

1996 playoffs... started and played first 77 minutes at right

midfield at Columbus on Sept. 25... took three shots, including two on goal...came on for Derek Backman in 27th minute of game two and played remainder of 2-1 loss at Houlihan's Stadium on Sept. 28...almost scored in opening game of Eastern Conference finals at D.C. United on Oct. 10, but his 46th minute right-footed shot off sensational Giuseppe Galderisi through ball was stopped by United goalkeeper Mark Simpson...

National Team Performance...recalled to U.S. National Team following MLS season and started final CONCACAF World Cup qualifying game against Guatemala in El Salvador on Dec. 21...scored game-tying goal for U.S. in 49th minute of 2-2 standoff...also played in two of three U.S. Cup games from Jan. 17-22, starting Jan. 17 1-0 loss to Peru and coming on as reserve against Mexico on Jan. 19 in Los Angeles...only previous cap came in August 31 El Salvador game in Los Angeles... started all three first-round Olympic games for U.S. last summer and was so impressive, earned call-up for El Salvador game.. was a member of U.S. Olympic Team in 4-4 tie with Norway at University of Tampa's Pepin-Rood Stadium on Friday, Feb. 2...scored a goal and added an assist in 2-1 U.S. Olympic Team win over Denmark in La Jolla, Calif., on Feb. 5...started all seven games on pre-Olympic tour, missing only 58 minutes of total playing time...played full-time with the Under-23 National Team from Oct. 1, 1995 to end of Olympics...member of the U.S. Under-17 National Team in 1990...

Collegiate Performance...played 60 games over three years, making 51 starts, at UCLA...scored six goals and eight assists...all his goals came in 1994, three on penalty kicks...made Soccer Coaches' Association second team all-American and first team all-Far West in 1994...

Personal...Engaged to Kim Walters...favorite soccer team is Boca Juniors...favorite player is Claudio Canniga...favorite non-soccer team is the San Diego Chargers...loves to surf...favorite vacation spot is Jamaica...likes Bob Marley's music...
