**1996 Regular Season**...first round draft pick, played in 15 games, getting nine starts and 725 minutes of playing time...earned one assist...came on in 65th minute of 2-0 win over D.C. United at Houlihan's Stadium on Sept. 14 and almost scored in first minute...his blistering right-footed shot to near post was saved in spectacular fashion by D.C. United goalkeeper Jeff Causey...started at New England on Sept. 12 after making reserve appearances in three previous Mutiny games got in final 15 minutes of U.S. Open Cup quarterfinal loss at Rochester on Sept. 7...played final ten minutes of 2-0 Giants Stadium victory over MetroStars on Sept. 4 came in for final 13 minutes of 3-1 Mutiny win over New England at Houlihan's Stadium on August 31...started both games on August 21-25 New England-D.C. United road trip and played 90 minutes in each game...started second straight game at left midfield in 3-1 Mutiny loss to D.C. United at Houlihan's Stadium on August 7...scored first (and so far only) point of professional career when he found a streaking Lassiter in the penalty box in the eighth minute of 3-1 Mutiny win over Colorado at Houlihan's Stadium on August 3...assist came in his third start, of season...made second start at Columbus on July 25 and lasted until 60th minute when ejected for second yellow card of game...served one-game suspension against Galaxy on July 27...made fourth appearance of season against Kansas City on July 18, coming on for final eight minutes of game...earned chance to play after starring for Tampa Bay Cyclones of the United Systems of Independent Soccer Leagues (USISL)...scored three goals on two-game road trip to help Cyclones win twice...had two goals in 5-1 win over New York/New Jersey Stallions at Toms River, N.J., on July 13, then scored goal in 4-3 overtime win over defending USISL champion Long Island Rough Riders in Plainview,

N.Y., the next night... played four games for Cyclones as part of joint agreement between the two leagues...played 90 minutes against Carolina on June 29 and 105 minutes against Hampton Roads on July 6...took three shots against Carolina and two more in Hampton Roads game...played as reserve for Mutiny at Kansas City on June 5 and at home against Columbus on July 4...played 31 minutes in May 26 Feyenoord exhibition...was his first appearance since suffering hip flexor injury in May 11 Mutiny debut at Colorado...started at left midfield and played first 54 minutes before succumbing to injury, which forced him to miss May 18 San Jose and May 23 Dallas games...

**1996 playoffs**... saw only playoff action in 4-1 Eastern Conference semifinals-clinching win over Columbus at Houlihan's Stadium on Oct. 2, getting in final minute for Steve Ralston...

**Collegiate Performance**...played four years for Coach Sigi Schmid at UCLA, starting 63 of 77 games...played over 6,000 minutes...scored 15 goals and eight assists for 38 career points...co-captain and defensive MVP of the 1995 Bruins team...named all-Far West first team as senior...helped Bruins garner 13 shutouts in 1995...

**Personal**...first team Parade all-American and 1992 Gatorade Player of the Year in New Mexico...was also New Mexico Player of Year in '92...played on numerous regional select teams...lists as his biggest personal thrill getting his first assist as a professional against Colorado at Houlihan's Stadium on August 3...playing in NCAA Division I Final Four with Bruins rates a close second...favorite soccer player is Pele...favorite soccer team is Manchester United...favorite sport other than soccer is basketball...favorite non-soccer team is the Chicago Bulls...favorite actor is Sean Connery...favorite actress is Nicole Kidman...favorite movie is Happy Gilmore...likes to listen to anything, especially Pearl Jam...hobbies include reading, hiking and biking, generally anything outdoors...favorite food is Mexican...can't stand people driving slowly in fast lane...hopes to work for an environmental organization, hopefully outdoors, someday...
