SALT RIVER: Refers to the Salt River Indian Community.
FIELDS: Refers to the 12 practice fields and Community's rich agricultural history.

CULTURES: Pima and Maricopa cultures are featured through language, story and architectural design at facility.

LOGO

DESIGNER: Royce Manuel, a Pima artist and calendar stick carver.
CONCEPT: Incorporates a rattlesnake (D-backs) and a mountain (Rockies)...emphasizes the surrounding scenic mountain ranges and illustrates the role of the rattlesnake in southwestern Native American legends.
FINAL GRAPHIC: Manuel's concept was refined by FocusEGd, which developed the final graphic image.

BANNER SPORTS MEDICINE PERFORMANCE CENTER

PARTNERSHIP: In 2020, in conjunction with a partnership with Banner Health, Arizona's largest employer and health system, the D-backs' team-specific facilities were renamed the Banner Sports Medicine Performance Center.

STADIUM FEATURES

SHADING: Approximately 85 percent of the 7,000 available bowl seats will be shaded as games progress.
SCOREBOARD: 1,150-square foot, high-definition video scoreboard that features LED technology.

HOURS: 2+ million staff hours from Nov. 2009-Feb. 2011, the largest sports project in the Southwest during that period.

COMMUNITY VENDORS: Many community members were employed as 15 American Indian-owned construction vendors were used.

LEED GOLD CERTIFICATION FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION

LEED GOLD-CERTIFIED: Was the first LEED Gold-certified sports venue of its kind in the country.

SUSTAINABLE ELEMENTS: Sustainable project elements include: stadium positioned to provide maximum shade; using native vegetation; minimizing stormwater runoff; maximizing the amount of fresh air brought in through its HVAC systems; grass-covered parking lots, rather than asphalt, double as playing fields for the community when not in use.



USS ARIZONA MEMORIAL





COACHING CAREER

- Is in his seventh season as the D-backs' manager (411-459; .472) and his 23rd in a managerial or coaching capacity in professional baseball.
- Became the winningest manager in D-backs' franchise history with his 354th win on May 10 vs. Marlins, surpassing Kirk Gibson (353, 2010-14).
- Honored with the Tommy Lasorda Managerial Achievement Award in 2019.
- Named the 2017 BBWAA NL Manager of the Year, the third D-backs manager to earn the honor, joining Bob Melvin (2007) and Kirk Gibson (2011).
- Was the seventh person to garner the honor in his first season as a manager: Hal Lanier in 1986 (Astros), Dusty Baker in 1993 (Giants), Joe Girardi in 2006 (Marlins), Matt Williams in 2014 (Nationals), Jeff Banister in 2015 (Rangers) and Dave Roberts in 2016 (Dodgers).
- Spent 4 seasons (2013-16) in the Red Sox' organization as the bench coach under John Farrell...was the first base coach on Farrell's staff with the Blue Jays from 2011-12.
- Acted as Boston's interim manager for 48 games from Aug. 14, 2015-end of the season while Farrell was on medical leave...guided the Red Sox to a 28-20 record.

HECKUVA RUN

- With a loss on Opening Day 2019, he had a losing record (0-1) for the first time in his career.
- His 324-game streak at or above .500 was the fourth-longest such streak by a Major League manager to start their career (see right).




HOW IT HAPPENED

- Named the club's eighth manager on Nov. 4, 2016.
- Met D-backs general manager Mike Hazen, who was an intern in Cleveland's baseball operations department, in 2001 at Spring Training when he was the Indians' Roving Coordinator...the duo also worked together in Boston from 2013-16.



Was presented a 2018 Rocky Mountain Emmy Award from FOX Sports Arizona after the network was honored with the award for his contributions while wearing a microphone in-game during a walk-off win on June 27, 2017 vs. Cardinals.

- Guided the D-backs to a second-place finish in the NL West (93-69), and a Wild Card win over the Rockies.
- His 93 wins were the most by an Arizona manager in his first 162 games, 1 more than Bob Brenly's 92 in 2001, and were 24 more than their total of 69 in 2016, the second-largest win difference in the Majors behind the Twins (26), and fourth-best increase in franchise history.
- A basketball enthusiast, he shoots around almost every morning at his house...on the road, he organizes games for the coaching and support staff, which has included visits to: Marquette University, University of Kansas, UCLA, Minnesota Timberwolves, Brooklyn Nets and Houston Rockets.
- Served as the assistant basketball coach for his son, Connor's, high school basketball team at New Way Academy in Phoenix for the 2018-19 season.

'SPARK'ING A CAREER

Cites Hall of Fame former Tigers manager Sparky Anderson as the biggest influence on his managerial career:

"...one of the things Sparky taught me from Day 1: Your family, your parents are the people that are going to be around to support you, they need to love you the most," Lovullo told the *Detroit Free Press*. "My thoughts and strategies of how I get to know the players on that level first...Having conversations beyond the game and asking about parents, children, understanding how important families are."

DOWN ON THE FARM

- Owned a 661-609 (.520) record in 9 seasons as a Minor League manager in the Indians (2002-09) and Red Sox (2010) systems...guided his clubs to 4 postseason appearances and 2 league championships.
- Earned both *Baseball America* Double-A and Eastern League Manager of the Year honors after leading Akron to the EL Championship in 2005...named Carolina League Manager of the Year in 2004 after leading his club to the title.

"Once we gathered numbers, it came back to 'How do you translate it to players?'" Banister said. "The answer is you keep it simple."

- Battled bone cancer and osteomyelitis (an infection of the bone or bone marrow) starting as a sophomore in high school and lasting throughout his professional career.
- Originally injured his left ankle while playing baseball, and during an examination of his slow healing injury, he was diagnosed with bone cancer.
- An infection of his left leg led to the development of osteomyelitis, which spread from his ankle to just below his knee and nearly led to having his leg amputated.
- Underwent a total of 7 operations on his left ankle and leg in 1980.
- Broke 3 vertebrae in his neck in a home plate collision at Lee College in 1983 and was paralyzed from the neck down for 10 days.
- Was not scheduled to play and was inserted when a Yankees' scout told his coach he hoped to see Banister catch.
- Doctors said he may never walk again and underwent 3 surgeries on his back and learned to walk again during the 1984 season.
- Entered the hospital weighing 225 lbs. and was discharged at 139.
- Recovered from the injury and was named a 1985 Junior College All-American and then transferred to the University of Houston.







- He and his wife, Ali, own horses in the Phoenix area and enjoy riding them in their free time...while with the Giants, he would tow his horses with him to Spring Training each year from North Carolina to Scottsdale.
- On his 125-acre ranch in North Carolina, he estimates he has 50 cows and 20 horses.
- On Opening Day 2015, he rode a horse around the warning track at Oracle Park to raise the 2014 World Series banner in center field.
- Growing up, his family owned horses, so he learned to ride at a very young age.

LONGEST HOME RUN BY A D-BACKS ROOKIE SINCE 2015 [SOURCE: STATCAST]



NO-HITTERS

RANDY JOHNSON ON MAY 18, 2004 @ BRAVES

Adept at setting records throughout his career, Randy Johnson added something new to his impressive resume when he retired all 27 Atlanta Braves he faced on May 18, 2004, at Turner Field. At 40 years, 251 days, he became the oldest pitcher in history to record a perfect game, bettering Cy Young, who was 37 years, 37 days on May 5, 1904. Johnson's gem was the 15th in modern day regular season history, the 16th including Don Larsen's perfect effort for the Yankees in the 1956 World Series.

Johnson fanned 13 in the 117-pitch performance which concluded with a 98-mph pitch to Eddie Perez to end the game. It was the first no-no in franchise history and first perfect game in the Majors since the Yankees' David Cone on July 18, 1999 vs. Montreal. It was also the first perfecto in the National League since the Expos' Dennis Martínez on July 28, 1991 @ Dodgers.

Jackson's 149 pitches were the most all-time in a no-hitter, while his 36 batters faced tied for the most and his 8 walks tied for the third-most all-time. He threw more than 60 pitches in the first 3.0 innings, causing the D-backs to warm-up 4 relievers.



***UNOFFICIALLY* MADISON BUMGARNER ON APRIL 25 @ BRAVES [GAME 2]**

Madison Bumgarner tossed MLB's first *unofficial* no-hitter (7.0 IP) on April 25, 2021 @ Braves [Game 2] under the new doubleheader rules that began in 2020, facing the minimum 21 batters.

In an effort to speed the proceedings during the coronavirus pandemic, Major League Baseball declared that games played as part of a doubleheader would be scheduled to last 7.0 innings instead of 9.0.

Although the game was officially a "complete game", the league stated that it would abide by the definition of the Elias Sports Bureau: *"No-hitters by teams and individuals shall not be credited in scheduled seven-inning games, unless the game goes to extra innings and the team (or individual in a complete game) pitches at least nine innings and does not allow a hit."*

It marked Bumgarner's 300th career start, 16th complete game and seventh shutout.

CHRONOLOGY

1990

June 28: A bill submitted by Rep. Chris Herstam, R-Phoenix, allowing Maricopa County to assess a quarter-cent sales tax for a baseball-only stadium, passes the Arizona Legislature. The tax can be levied only after a franchise is granted.

1993

July 25: MLB discusses expansion. Phoenix Suns owner Jerry Colangelo, with assurance Phoenix is a top prospect, begins a drive for investors and a stadium.

Nov. 10: At a news conference at America West Arena, Colangelo announces he will put together an ownership group to apply for an expansion franchise.

1994

Feb. 17: Maricopa County Supervisors vote 3-1 for the stadium tax, with 1 abstention. Baseball owners have until April 1, 1995, to award Phoenix a new franchise, or the stadium financing deal is off.

June 17: Ellerbe Becket beats out two other finalists working on the design of the new stadium. A site just south of Jefferson Street and west of 7th Street is selected for the retractable-roof, natural-grass showplace.

Nov. 2: In Chicago, the expansion committee hears presentations from Colangelo and other would-be ownership groups from Orlando and Tampa-St. Petersburg and 2 from No. Virginia.

1995

March 9: In Palm Beach, Fla., MLB's owners name the Arizona Diamondbacks and the Tampa Bay Devil Rays the 13th and 14th expansion teams in Major League Baseball history at a record \$130 million apiece. Richard H. Dozer is named President and Joe Garagiola Jr. becomes Vice President and General Manager.

March 11: Season ticket deposits are first taken at a celebration party on the plaza in front of America West Arena. Despite rain, 2,000-plus people show up to take part in the team's first official fan celebration.

April 5: A deal is finalized with Bank One to name the stadium Bank One Ballpark.

Aug. 17: The team unveils its first farm team, the Lethbridge Mounties, soon to be renamed the Black Diamonds, of Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada in the Pioneer League.

Nov. 15: Name Buck Showalter manager with a 7-year contract. Showalter was AL Manager of the Year in 1994 with the New York Yankees and led them to a Wild Card playoff spot in 1995.



STEVE PASCENTE MEMORIAL MEDIA LOUNGE | MARCH 12, 1954-OCTOBER 15, 1994

Steve Pascente was one of the most dedicated at his craft as a sports reporter/anchor for 12 News/KPNX-TV and died while on location covering football in Washington D.C. His wife, Julie, has kept his memory alive with the Steve Pascente Charitable Foundation, which supports a variety of foundations including Widowed With Children, The Steve Pascente Memorial Scholarships at Arizona State University and The Andre House. When the D-backs opened the 1998 season against the Colorado Rockies, Nick Pascente, the son of Steve and Julie, served as honorary batboy.

DICK DOZER MEMORIAL PRESS BOX | MARCH 12, 1925-JANUARY 4, 1994

Dick Dozer spent the majority of his life covering Major League Baseball for the *Chicago Tribune*, but he was hardly a stranger to the Valley. He arrived in Phoenix and wrote for the *Phoenix Gazette*, while also contributing his time in organizing the annual "Dream Game," an old-timers contest that benefitted the Phoenix Memorial Hospital Foundation, and working with the Mesa Ho-Ho-Kams. Dozer was BBWAA Chapter President in 1976. He passed away in 1994. His son, Rich, was an integral player in the D-backs' inception as team president from 1995-2006 and has an executive conference room named in his honor.

JOHN MICHAELSON RADIO BOOTH

The Arizona Sports 620 radio booth was named after John Michaelson prior to the 2001 season, honoring the veteran producer/engineer who passed away in the winter of 2000. A veteran behind the scenes in radio broadcasting for years, including three seasons on D-backs broadcasts, Michaelson was a tireless worker and friend to all who came in contact with him.

JOE GILMARTIN MEMORIAL SEAT | MAY 26, 1929-FEBRUARY 27, 2018

Joe Gilmartin, who passed away in 2018, was an iconic Valley writer who earned the highest honor with the 2014 Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's Curt Gowdy Media Award. He was a 16-time Arizona Sportswriter of the Year, a 2015 inductee into the Arizona Sports Hall of Fame and in 2004, was the second inductee into the Associated Press Sports Editors Arizona Sports Writers' Hall of Fame. Gilmartin covered 25 NBA Finals, 15 Final Fours, 20 Super Bowls and 14 World Series, including the D-backs' 2001 world championship run. He had a 34-year career with the *Phoenix Gazette* from 1962-96. He covered the Phoenix Suns as a beat writer and broadcast analyst, which led to his book "The Little Team That Could...And Darn Near Did!," a look back at the Suns' 1976 NBA Finals run. Late in his career, he served as a contributing writer to D-backs Publications and the D-backs' and Suns' websites. Gilmartin's son, Leo, has been a member of the D-backs' broadcasting department since 1996.

BOB BAUM HONORARY ASSOCIATED PRESS SEAT

Bob Baum, who retired in early 2019, covered the D-backs for the Associated Press for 21 seasons, starting in July 1998 through the 2018 season. Overall, Baum spent 43 years with the AP, highlighted by assignments to cover seven Summer Olympics, all but one in track and field, three Winter Olympics and most other major sporting events including two Super Bowls, one World Series and numerous NBA Finals, NCAA Final Fours and college football championships.
