Kevin's nickname for himself is "The Jaguar" ... 2022 Myrtle Beach hitting coach Steven Pollakov said "he came up with that. He's got those long legs and he's calm, and when he wants to attack, he attacks. He's the Jaguar."

FACTS & INFORMATION

- Kevin owns a .281 average (199-for-708) with 31 doubles, 14 triples, 21 home runs, 128 RBI and an .812 OPS in 187 career minor league games across four seasons with the Yankees (2019-21) and Cubs (2021-22) organizations.
- Entered the 2023 season ranked as the Cubs No. 2 prospect and No. 87 overall according to *MLB Pipeline*.
 - Finished the 2022 season ranked as the Cubs No. 3 and the No. 86 overall prospect per *MLB Pipeline*.
- In 2022, led the Carolina League with 85 RBI, while setting career marks in doubles (19), triples (6), home runs (15) and walks (55).
- Was acquired from New York (A.L.) July 29, 2021, with RHP Alexander Vizcaino for 1B Anthony Rizzo.
- Was ranked by *MLB Pipeline* as the No. 12 prospect in the 2018 international signing class.

CAREER REVIEW

- Kevin in **2022** played in a career-high 112 games with Single-A Myrtle Beach and led the Carolina League with 85 RBI.
 - Finished among the league leaders in total bases (3rd, 193), extra-base hits (T-3rd, 40), hits (4th, 117), runs (6th, 76), home runs (T-6th, 15), OPS (7th, .811), slugging percentage (8th, .451) and average (9th, .273).
- Batted .318 (21-for-66) with two home runs and 15 RBI vs. left-handed pitching, compared to .265 (96-for-362) with 13 home runs and 70 RBI vs. right-handed pitching.
- In June, hit .304 (28-for-92) with six doubles, one triple, six home runs, 23 RBI and a .958 OPS in 25 games.
- Tallied a 10-game hitting streak from June 4-15, batting .359 (14-for-39) with two doubles, one triple, three home runs and 11 RBI.
- June 12 at Carolina, went 4-for-6 with a triple, two home runs and a career-high eight RBI ... the night marked his first career multi-homer game.
- Following the season, was ranked by *MLB Pipeline* as the Cubs' No. 3 prospect and the No. 86 overall prospect in the MLB.
- Split the **2021** season between the Rookie Level FCL Yankees and the ACL Cubs, batting a combined .345 (41-for-119) with four doubles, five triples, five home runs, 24 RBI and a 1.012 OPS in 34 games.
- Played in nine games for the FCL Yankees, going 10-for-27 with one double, one home run and three RBI.
- Was traded from the Yankees to the Cubs, July 29 with RHP Alexander Vizcaino for 1B Anthony Rizzo.
- Following the trade, batted .337 (31-for-92) with three doubles, five triples, four home runs and 21 RBI in 25 games for the ACL Cubs.
- His five triples were tied for the second-most in the ACL.
- Following the season, was ranked by *MLB Pipeline* as the Cubs' No. 16 prospect.
- Did not play in a game in **2020** due to the cancellation of the minor league season.
- In **2019**, completed his first professional season, splitting 41 games between the DSL Yankees and the GCL Yankees East.
- Did not play in a game in **2018** after signing with the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 12.

- ◆ Is his third stint with the organization as he was selected off waivers from Detroit Feb 5, 2021 and appeared in 89 games for Chicago that year ... signed a big league deal with Chicago March 19, 2022, before he was traded to Arizona, March 27, for a cash consideration.
- ◆ Has appeared in 192 major league games spanning three seasons between the Tigers (2020), Cubs (2021), Diamondbacks (2022) and Padres (2022).
- ◆ Owns a .209 average (93-for-446) with 14 doubles, five triples, 12 homers and 47 RBI.

- ◆ Adbert is 9-16 with a 4.48 ERA (86 ER/172.2 IP) in 45 major league games (27 starts) with Chicago in all or parts of the last four seasons.
- ◆ Is in his 11th season with the Cubs organization since signing with the club as a non-drafted free agent in Dec. of 2012.
- ◆ Has gone 33-29 with a 3.74 ERA (210 ER/505.1 IP) in 111 career minor league contests (90 starts).
- ◆ Ranked as the second-best prospect in the Cubs organization entering 2018 by *Baseball America* ... the publication ranked him the sixth-best prospect in the organization heading into 2019.
- ◆ Was an MLB All-Star Futures Game selection in 2019.
- ◆ Made his major league debut June 20, 2019 vs. New York (N.L.), earning his first career win in relief (1 ER/4.0 IP).
- ◆ Was added to the 40-man roster, November 20, 2017.
- ◆ Was an All-Star with South Bend in the Midwest League in 2016 and with Myrtle Beach in the Carolina League in 2017 ... was the starting pitcher in the 2017 Carolina League All-Star Game.
- ◆ A native of Venezuela, made his pro debut in 2013 with the Venezuelan League Cubs rookie league team.

CAREER REVIEW

- ◆ Adbert in **2022**, missed the majority of the season (March 18-Sept. 17) with a right shoulder/lat strain.
 - Made five minor league rehab starts with the ACL Cubs and Triple-A Iowa, going a combined 0-1 with a 5.84 ERA (7 ER/9.1 IP).
- ◆ Appeared in six games out of the bullpen for the Cubs, going 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (5 ER/13.1 IP) with 19 strikeouts, compared to two walks.
- ◆ Held the opponent scoreless in four of his six games, tossing at least 2.0 innings in five of those outings.
- ◆ Opponents batted .184 (9-for-49) against him ... held left-handed hitters to a .176 average (3-for-17).
- ◆ Made his season debut on Sept. 17 vs. Colorado, allowing two runs in 2.0 innings with five strikeouts.
- ◆ On Oct. 1 vs. Cincinnati, became the first Cubs reliever since Adrian Sampson (Sept. 2, 2021 vs. Pittsburgh) to not allow a baserunner in a relief outing of at least 3.0 innings.
- ◆ Adbert made a career-high 29 outings (21 starts) in **2021** for the Cubs, going 5-13 with a 4.58 ERA (64 ER/125.2 IP).
 - Went 4-13 with a 5.16 ERA (61 ER/106.1 IP) as a starter compared to 1-0 with a 1.40 ERA (3 ER/19.1 IP) as a reliever.
- ◆ Was limited by two injured list stints (June 8-21, blister on right middle finger and Aug. 14-Sept. 1, left hamstring strain).
- ◆ Posted a 3.90 ERA (26 ER/60.0 IP) with a 4-5 record in 14 games (10 starts) at Wrigley Field ... was 1-8 with a 5.21 ERA (38 ER/65.2 IP) and one save on the road.
- ◆ Allowed three runs or less in nine consecutive starts from April 12-June 2, the longest stretch by a Cub starter since Yu Darvish (11-straight, Sept. 22, 2019-Sept. 15, 2020).
- ◆ Opposing hitters batted .181 (36-for-199) with 78 strikeouts against his slider.
- ◆ Twice pitched a career-high 7.0 innings, May 22 in St. Louis (2 ER) and July 3 in Cincinnati (3 ER).
- ◆ Tied his career high with eight strikeouts July 22 in St. Louis.
- ◆ Suffered a career-high nine-straight losses from June 7-Sept. 1.
 - Earned his first career save Sept. 1 in Minnesota (4.0 IP, 1 H, 5 SO), becoming the first Cub rookie with a 4.0-plus scoreless inning save since Paul Reuschel, June 13, 1976 vs. Houston.
 - Went 1-1 with a 2.95 ERA (7 ER/21.1 IP) in six games (four starts) for Chicago during the **2020** season.
 - Went 1-1 with a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP) in his four starts and posted a 1.80 ERA (1 ER/5.0 IP) in his two relief outings.
 - Limited righties to a .128 average (5-for-39), while lefties batted .219 (7-for-32).
 - Made his season debut in game two of the doubleheader, Aug. 19 in St. Louis ... allowed one unearned run in 5.0 innings.
 - Stuck out seven batters in 4.0 innings of relief Sept. 22 in Pittsburgh.
 - At 25 years, 205 days of age, was the youngest Cubs reliever to record seven or more punchouts in a game since Angel Guzman (24.184 years of age) struck out eight in 5.1 innings June 16, 2006 vs. Detroit.
 - Earned the win in his final start of the regular season Sept. 27 at Chicago (A.L.), striking out a career-high eight batters over 5.0 innings.
 - Made his major league debut with Chicago in **2019**, but spent the majority of the campaign with Triple-A Iowa.
 - Posted a 7.30 ERA (10 ER/12.1 IP) in four games with the Cubs ... allowed seven runs in 2.2 innings, July 1 in Pittsburgh and allowed three runs in 9.2 IP (2.79 ERA) in his other three outings.
 - Recalled from Iowa June 20 and made his MLB debut that night in relief vs. the Mets ... earned the win, allowing one run in 4.0 innings ... retired 12 of his first 13 batters.
 - Made his first career start June 25 vs. Atlanta ... allowed one hit (Ronald Acuña Jr. leadoff homer).
 - Became the third pitcher in MLB since 1920 to pitch at least 4.0 innings and allow one or fewer hits in each of his first two career appearances, joining Detroit's Eric King (1986) and St. Louis' Von McDaniel (1957).
 - Was selected to the MLB All-Star Futures Game in Cleveland, Ohio ... did not pitch in the game.

WALK-LESS

Adbert did not walk a batter in a career-high 23.0 consecutive innings from May 11-28, 2021, the Cubs' longest stretch by a starter since Yu Darvish (36.0 IP) from July 23-August 27, 2019.

DUAL THREAT

By making 21 starts and earning one save in 2021, Adbert became the first Cubs pitcher since Mike Bielecki in 1990 with 20-plus starts and a save in the same season.

SAVING THE DAY

Adbert recorded his first career save Sept. 1, 2021 in Minnesota, becoming the first Cubs rookie with a 4.0-plus scoreless inning save since Paul Reuschel June 13, 1976 vs. Houston.

- ◆ With the Cubs from June 20-July 1 and again from Sept. 2-8.
- ◆ Went 2-4 with a 4.41 ERA (32 ER/65.1 IP) in 15 starts for Iowa ... made one start with Myrtle Beach, May 12, to begin his season ... started the season on Iowa's injured list while recovering from a back strain.
- ◆ Named PCL Pitcher of the Week, May 27-June 2 ... made two starts in that span, going a season-high tying 6.0 innings in each start ... allowed a combined three hits and one run, while fanning 17 batters.
- ◆ Reached the Triple-A level for the first time in his career in **2018**, but had his season cut short due to a right lat strain.
- ◆ Went 2-4 with a 4.76 ERA (21 ER/39.2 IP) in eight starts, walking 13 and striking out 27.

Cody participated in the 2007 Little League World Series and has appeared in three different MLB World Series for the Dodgers ... he is one of 14 major league players to have played in both the Little League and MLB World Series.

- ◆ Hit four home runs in the postseason, the second-most on the team, leading the Dodgers to a World Series championship.
- ◆ Blasted the go-ahead home run in Game 7 of the NLCS vs. Atlanta, a solo home run in the seventh inning off Chris Martin.
- ◆ Enjoyed a career year in **2019**, during which he was named the National League MVP, while receiving Gold Glove, Silver Slugger and All-Star honors.
 - Became the 12th Dodger to win the N.L. MVP and the first to win the MVP, Gold Glove and Silver Slugger awards in the same season.
 - Joined Jackie Robinson and Don Newcombe as the only Dodgers to have won both the Rookie of the Year and MVP.
- ◆ Ranked among the N.L. leaders in total bases (1st, 351), runs (2nd, 121), extra-base hits (2nd, 84), slugging percentage (2nd, .629), home runs (3rd, 47), OPS (3rd, 1.035), on-base percentage (3rd, .406), walks (6th, 95), RBI (7th, 115) and batting average (9th, .305).

LOVING LIFE ON THE ROAD

David hit all four of his homers during the 2022 season away from Wrigley Field.

- ◆ Had a career-high eight-game hitting streak May 21-29 ... went 11-for-22 (.500) with two doubles, two homers and five RBI during the streak.
- ◆ Had a career day, June 5 vs. Colorado, going 4-for-4 with a double, homer, run scored and career-high seven RBI ... first-career four-hit game ... marked the most RBI by a Cub second baseman since Ryne Sandberg June 23, 1984 vs. St. Louis.
- ◆ Had consecutive multi-hit games Aug. 30-September 5, going 4-for-5 with a double, homer and four runs scored during that span ... however, hit .172 (5-for-29) with zero extra-base hits in his final 18 contests beginning Sept. 6.
- ◆ In **2018**, David made his major league debut April 21 and registered many clutch hits for the Cubs, including two walk-off homers and seven game-winning RBI.

 - Was the Cubs first pinch-slam since David DeJesus' shot May 11, 2012 at Milwaukee, and the first at home since Derrek Lee May 19, 2007 vs. the White Sox.

- ◆ Graduated from Foothill (Calif.) High School in 2006 ... his number 22 was retired by the school in 2016.
 - Named California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Division II Player of the Year by the Los Angeles Times and Orange County Register as a senior ... went 12-0 with a 1.17 ERA during his final high school campaign.
 - Was an honor roll member all four years of high school.
- ◆ His father, Rod, was selected by Houston in the first round of the 1978 draft ... he pitched six seasons in the Astros, Yankees and Angels farm systems.

Boxberger was featured in the Rays' 2017 'Players & Pooches' calendar with his French bulldog, Ralph ... the calendar benefited the Pet Pal Animal Shelter in St. Petersburg, FL.

- ◆ In 30 games for Tampa Bay, he went 4-4 with five holds and a 3.38 ERA (11 ER/29.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts, a 1.16 WHIP and .215 opponent average ... his 12.27 strikeouts per nine innings pitched was the second highest rate of his career.
- ◆ Did not allow a hit in his first six outings, extending a streak from the previous season to 10 (Sept. 25, 2016-July 15, 2017) ... his streak was the second-longest in Rays franchise history.
- ◆ On November 30, he was traded to the Diamondbacks for right-handed pitcher Curtis Taylor.
- ◆ Was limited to 27 games in **2016** due to two stints on the injured list ... he went 4-3 with a 4.81 ERA (13 ER/24.1 IP) and seven holds.
 - Was placed on the injured list at the start of the season as he recovered from groin surgery ... was activated on May 30 but landed back on the injured list with a left oblique injury on June 1 after one outing ... was activated again on July 29.
- ◆ After returning from his second stint on the I.L., made 11-straight scoreless appearances from July 31-Aug. 26.
- ◆ His four wins ranked second among Rays relievers ... his first win of the season on Aug. 4 vs Kansas City snapped his seven-game losing streak.
- ◆ Lead the league with a career-high 41 saves in **2015** ... he went 4-10 with a 3.71 ERA (26 ER/63.0 IP) and 74 strikeouts.
 - His 74 strikeouts led Rays relievers.
- ◆ Was named an American League All-Star ... was selected to the team by manager Ned Yost ... did not play in the Midsummer Classic.
- ◆ Led major league relievers in losses ... became the second pitcher in major league history to record 40-plus saves and also 10-plus losses in the same season (also Colorado's Jose Jimenez in 2002).
- ◆ Suffered six walk-off losses, which were the most in the majors since Philadelphia's Brad Lidge also had six in 2009.
- ◆ Converted his first 15 save opportunities, one shy of the then-franchise record.
- ◆ Twice saved all three games of a three-game sweep, July 10-12 vs. Houston and Sept. 29-Oct. 1 vs. Miami.
- ◆ Recorded 25 of the Rays last 30 saves of the season from June 19-end of the season.
- ◆ Put up career-best numbers in ERA (2.37), strikeouts (104), WHIP (0.84), and strikeouts per walk allowed (5.20) during the **2014** season ... went 5-2 with two saves and 19 holds.
 - Opened the season in Triple-A Durham, going 1-0 with two saves, a 1.93 ERA and 18 strikeouts, compared to four walks, in six games.
- ◆ His 104 strikeouts ranked fourth among major league relievers and set a then-franchise relief record.

Ian has reached base safely in each of his last 31 games against the Pirates dating to April 10, 2021 ... moreover, he has reached safely in each of his last 40 starts against Pittsburgh since July 31, 2020.

TOP BILLING
Ian was the first University of Cincinnati Bearcat to be selected in the first round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft when he was selected by Chicago with the ninth pick in the 2015 draft.

- ◆ Hit .329 (48-for-146) with nine doubles, one triple, 13 homers, 34 RBI and a 1.075 OPS in 40 games from Aug. 17-end of the season, after hitting .179 (57-for-319) in his first 108 games this season.
- ◆ Recorded his eighth career multi-homer game on May 20 vs. Washington.
- ◆ Hit 14 of his 25 home runs after Aug. 12, tied for the third-most in the N.L. during that span.

- ◆ Was acquired from Texas July 31, 2012, with infielder Christian Villanueva, for pitcher Ryan Dempster ... was originally selected by the Rangers in the eighth round of the 2011 June draft.
- ◆ Earned Carolina League mid-season All-Star honors with Single-A Myrtle Beach in 2012.
- ◆ Originally selected in the 39th round of the 2008 draft by the Angels, but elected to attend Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H. ... earned his degree in Economics in the fall of 2013.
 - Earned first team All-Ivy League honors, tying for the Ivy League lead in victories (5), ranking second in strikeouts (70) and posting the third-lowest ERA (2.47) as a junior in 2011.
 - Garnered All-Ivy Honorable Mention during his sophomore campaign in 2010, finishing second in the conference with 54 strikeouts.
- ◆ Participated in the second-annual Cubs Rookie Development Program in January of 2014.
- ◆ Graduated from Capistrano Valley (Calif.) High School in 2008.

CAREER REVIEW

- ◆ Kyle was limited to 16 starts for Chicago in 2022 due to a right shoulder strain that put him on the shelf from July 6 through season's end.
 - Was diagnosed with a capsular tear in his right shoulder.
- ◆ Was 4-6 with a 4.80 ERA (45 ER/84.1 IP) in his 16 starts, walking 24 and striking out 66 ... walked two or fewer in his final 14 outings.
- ◆ Averaged 7.01 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ... pitched to a 1.29 WHIP.
- ◆ Three times tossed at least 7.0 shutout innings: April 23 vs. Pittsburgh (7.0 IP), June 24 at St. Louis (7.1 IP) and May 9 at San Diego (8.2 IP).

- ◆ Surrendered a career-high four home runs, April 18 vs. Atlanta, all coming in the first inning.
- ◆ Tossed his sixth-career complete game (7.0 innings in game one of a doubleheader) May 4 vs. the Dodgers.
- ◆ Went 16-straight starts without a loss from May 16-Aug. 6, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Jake Arrieta, 24 starts from July 30, 2015-May31, 2016).

- ◆ Made his major league debut July 10 in Cincinnati ... allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, including just one in his final 5.0 innings ... did not garner a decision in Chicago's 6-4, 12-inning win.
- ◆ Earned his first major league victory in his second start July 22 vs. the Padres ... spun 7.0 shutout frames in Chicago's 6-0 win.
- ◆ Began the season with Triple-A Iowa and was named a mid-season Pacific Coast League All-Star ... he went 10-5 with a 3.59 ERA (41 ER/102.2 IP) in 17 starts with the club.

- ◆ In **2011**, he split his first professional season between Single-A Spokane and Double-A Frisco in Texas' minor league system, going 2-2 with a 2.02 ERA (8 ER/35.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts in 21 games (one start) ... spent bulk of campaign with Spokane.

- ◆ Dansby is in his first season in the Cubs organization after signing a seven-year contract with the club in December 2022.
- ◆ Spent the first eight seasons of his professional career with the Arizona (2015) and Atlanta (2016-22) organizations.
- ◆ In all or part of seven seasons with Atlanta (2016-22), posted a .255 average (775-for-3,043) with 161 doubles, 13 triples, 102 home runs, 411 RBI, 58 stolen bases and a .738 OPS in 827 major league games.
- ◆ From 2018-22, committed just 42 errors in 5,574.2 innings at shortstop.
 - Among players with at least 4,000 innings at the position during that stretch, his 42 errors are tied for the fifth-fewest in the major leagues.

Dansby's wife, Mallory, is a forward on the Chicago Red Stars and is a member of the U.S. Women's National Soccer Team ... the pair got married on December 10, 2022.

- ◆ Went 3-for-4 with two home runs and a career-high seven RBI, July 31 vs. Milwaukee.
 - Became the second Braves shortstop with at least two home runs and seven RBI in a game since 1920 (Jeff Blauser - May 11, 1996 at Philadelphia).
- ◆ In 31 games from July 24-Aug. 27, batted .355 (43-for-121) with eight home runs and 31 RBI.
 - His .355 average during that span was the second-highest in the N.L. behind Austin Riley's .376.
- ◆ Appeared in all 16 postseason games en route to a World Series championship, batting .224 (13-for-58) with a double, two home runs and four RBI.
