# Carolina League Championship Series – Game 2 Charleston RiverDogs (1-0) at Lynchburg Hillcats (0-1)

RHP JJ Goss (1-0, 1.50) vs. RHP Trenton Denholm (0-1, 0.00)

Today's Game: The Charleston RiverDogs (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) travel to Viriginia to meet the Lynchburg Hillcats (affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians) in game two of the best-of-three league championship series. The RiverDogs took game one on Tuesday and will secure the title with a win tonight. A Lynchburg win would force a decisive gam three on Wednesday. RiverDogs-Lynchburg Season Series in 2022: Overall: RiverDogs 6, Lynchburg 6. At The Joe: RiverDogs 3, Lynchburg 3.

Last Time Out: The RiverDogs used three home runs in the early stages of game one on Tuesday to come away with a 7-5 victory. Lynchburg opened the scoring with three singles in the first inning off of starter Cole Wilcox to take a 1-0 lead. However, Carson Williams tied the game with a solo home run in the second at-bat of the bottom of the inning. The Hillcats put two more runs on the board to regain the lead at 3-1 in the top of the second. Once again, the RiverDogs countered with a solo home run, this time from Ryan Spikes to move within 3-2. Wilcox put up the first scoreless inning in the third and the offense pounced to take control of the contest. With the bases loaded and no outs, bobby Seymour tied the game with a sacrifice fly. In the next at-bat Willy Vasquez lined a three-run run home run that just cleared the center field wall to give the RiverDogs a 6-3 lead. Seymour added to the lead advantage with an RBI single in the fifth. The RiverDogs bullpen tandem of Jonny Cuevas and Roel Garcia shut down the Hillcats the rest of the way, allowing just two unearned runs in the sixth in closing out the series-opening win.

**Caminero in the Clutch:** 19-year-old Junior Caminero has lived up to his prospect status in the postseason to this point. He went 4-4 with a double and three runs batted in during game one against Myrtle Beach and followed that up with a 2-5 showing in game two. The native of the Dominican Republic added a double in four-at-bats during game one of this series on Sunday, leaving his postseason batting average at .538. Caminero was acquired by the Rays in a trade with Cleveland in November of 2021 and will be facing several former teammates in this series.

**Making Their Mark:** The RiverDogs finished the regular season with 88 wins this season, the most in Minor League Baseball. That number also represents the most wins in a single season in franchise history, surpassing the 1988 Charleston Rainbows who won 85 games. In two seasons as an affiliate of the Tampa Rays, the RiverDogs have compiled an incredible 170-82 record and .675 winning percentage. The next winningest teams in that same stretch are also Rays affiliates. Triple-A Durham has won 165 games and High-A Bowling Green 160.

**Two-Year Turnaround:** When the RiverDogs became an affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays prior to the 2021 regular season, they featured an all-time franchise record that was 100 games below .500 and never won a championship. After two seasons and 252 games with the Rays, they have improved to just 12 games below .500. The 2021 team set a franchise record for winning percentage and this year's club set the standard for wins. In the first 41 years of the team's history, a championship was never claimed, this year's team is one win shy of securing back-to-back titles.

Sasaki Bombs: Outfielder Shane Sasaki was named the Carolina League Player of the Month for August. The native Hawaiian hit .356 and led the league in hits (31), doubles (12), total bases (62) and OPS (1.149) and was second in average (.356) and slugging percentage (.713). Sasaki posted 11 multi-hit games, including the third and fourth four-hit games of his career. He was also named the league's player of the week for back-to-back weeks in August. Sasaki finished as the Carolina League batting champion and also led the league in on-base percentage, slugging percentage and OPS.

**Prized Pups:** The RiverDogs current roster contains 10 members of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Rays prospects. The highest ranked of the group is infielder Carson Williams who comes in at #3. Pitcher Cole Wilcox (#9) and infielder Willy Vasquez (#10) also sit in the top 10. The list is rounded out by outfielder Brock Jones (#12), infielder Junior Caminero (#19), pitcher Sandy Gaston (#22), catcher Dominic Keegan (#24), pitcher JJ Goss (#27), infielder Ryan Spikes (#29) and pitcher Nick Bitsko (#30). Williams is also rated as the #86 overall prospect in baseball by the publication.

# **RIVERDOGS FIELD STAFF**

### Manager: Blake Butera

Butera returns for his second season as the manager of the RiverDogs after leading the team to the franchise's first championship in 2021. Prior to his arrival in Charleston, he led the Hudson Valley Renegades to a postseason berth in his two seasons guiding the short-season club. Butera coached with Leones del Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the cancellation of the 2020 minor league season. At the time he received the managerial job in Hudson Valley, Butera was the youngest manager (25) in all of Minor League Baseball. The native of Metairie, Louisiana was drafted by the Rays in the 35th round of the 2015 Amateur Draft out of Boston College and appeared in 80 minor league games over two seasons. At Boston College, he was voted team captain his senior year and finished his career as the Eagles' all-time leader in walks (112) and at-bats (774). His father, Barry, reached Triple-A with the Red Sox and his brother, Barry, spent two seasons in the Astros minor league system after being selected out of Boston College in the 2009 Amateur Draft.

### Pitching Coach: R.C. Lichtenstein

Lichtenstein returns for his second year as the pitching coach for the RiverDogs and his 18<sup>th</sup> year in the Rays organization. He guided the 2021 pitching staff to the lowest earned run average and most shutouts of any Low-A team The pitching staff also led the Low-A East in strikeouts and allowed the fewest hits of any team in the circuit. Lichtenstein has served as pitching coach at several stops in the Rays farm system including Southwest Michigan (2005-06), Vero Beach (2007-08), Bowling Green (2009-11) and Double-A Montgomery (2012-19). Throughout his career in baseball, the 53-year-old has also coached in the Milwaukee Brewers organization and managed two independent squads.

### **Hitting Coach: Perry Roth**

Roth takes on his first assignment with the Rays in Charleston after coaching at the college level since 1996. He served as interim head coach at UAB in 2021 and spent 15 years with UAB's baseball program, also serving as recruiting coordinator, hitting coach and assistant head coach. Roth previously served as an assistant for two separate stints at Birmingham Southern and coached at Bradley, Illinois State and Greenville College.

### **Coach: Frank Jagoda**

Jagoda joins the RiverDogs for his first season in the Holy City. He initially joined the Rays in 2020 when he was slated to be a member of the Princeton Rays staff until the MiLB season was canceled. Jagoda was part of the 2021 FCL Rays staff that helped lead the team to the best record in the circuit and one of the top winning percentages in MiLB. He previously spent two seasons with the Minnesota Twins, serving as Rehab Coordinator in 2018 and a coach for the Fort Myers Miracle in 2019. Jagoda has also served as Director of USA Baseball and at the collegiate level for Patrick Henry Community College, Wingate University, Canisius College and Jamestown Community College.

# **Athletic Trainer: Ruben Santiago**

The 2022 season will be Santiago's seventh as an athletic trainer with the Rays. In 2021, he worked with the FCL Rays after spending the previous three seasons on the Princeton coaching staff. Santiago joined the organization from the Toros del Este in the Dominican Winter League in 2016 and spent his first two seasons with the Gulf Coast League Rays.

# **Strength Coach: Mia Salvemini**

Salvemini began the 2021 season with the FCL Rays and completed the campaign as the RiverDogs Strength and Conditioning coach. She is also a CrossFit Level One Trainer and has worked with athletes at Cressey Sports Performance. Salvemini was originally hired by the Rays in 2020 after graduating from the University of Tampa in 2019 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Performance with a concentration in Exercise Recreation and Leadership.
