George H. MCCASKEY CHAIRMAN

George Halas McCaskey became the fourth Chairman in Chicago Bears team history on May 5, 2011, following in the footsteps of grandfather, George Halas, father, Edward W. McCaskey and brother, Michael.

George is one of the 13 grandchildren - and namesake - of George Halas, the founder and patriarch of the Chicago Bears. Like his brothers and sisters, he grew up around the Bears. His first part-time job, at age 14, was as an office assistant at the team's headquarters in Chicago's Loop. He later worked for several summers as a ball boy at Bears training camp, calling it one of the best experiences of his life.

George has worked to carry on the storied tradition of the Bears with a yearly goal of winning the NFL Championship, uphold the integrity and values established in the previous 102 years of the club and oversee the franchise's leadership role in the Chicagoland community. One of the club's recent developments and accomplishments has been the addition of the Bears Diversity, Equity and Inclusion department within the front office. Started in 2021, the DEI department will continue to form an integrated approach to all DEI efforts that will permeate throughout the club while also advancing a culture of inclusivity and belonging resulting in more equitable outcomes.

Prior to his role as the club's Chairman, George previously served as the team's senior director of ticket operations, working in the ticket office for 20 seasons, joining the Bears in 1991 as ticket manager. He has been a member of the Bears' Board of Directors since 2004.

George attended Arizona State University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in Broadcasting in 1978, his law degree in 1981, and a Master of Laws (LL.M.) degree in 2021. He passed the Illinois bar exam in 1981, but now describes himself as a "recovering lawyer". He worked in television news in Phoenix, Peoria, Tulsa and Chicago, before serving as an Assistant State's Attorney in Lee County and DeKalb County, III.

In his spare time, George enjoys officiating youth sports, including baseball, soccer and basketball. McCaskey and his wife Barb have one child, a son, Conor.

Ted PHILLIPS PRESIDENT AND CEO

Ted Phillips was named President and Chief Executive Officer on February 10, 1999. He is the fourth person to serve as president in the organization's storied 102-year history following Michael McCaskey, George "Mugs" Halas, Jr., and George S. Halas.

Since taking on the top leadership role, Phillips has insisted on attention to detail and smooth execution at every level of the Bears operation. He has solidified the long-term stability of the Club, while staying keenly focused on bringing a 10th championship to the NFL's premier franchise.

Phillips has revitalized both the business and football operations by hiring high character, intelligent and driven individuals who share common goals and philosophies on how to build a consistent winner both on and off the field.

During the 2021 season, Phillips restructured the front office in an effort to further promote the club's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion efforts by adding a Senior Vice President of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. This newly created position will provide executive leadership and guidance to develop and implement a comprehensive DEI strategy across the organization.

Drawing from more than 35 years of experience with the Chicago Bears, Phillips has shown effective leadership skills by empowering his executive staff to create an environment of collective responsibility in running the day-to-day operations of the club. Phillips is involved in all critical decisions of the Bears and continues to strive to make all aspects of the Bears organization the best in the NFL. Always insisting on a team-first attitude, Phillips has surrounded himself with individuals who fit the organization's character, culture, and values. That team dynamic was crucial in the Bears return to the Super Bowl for the first time in 21 years following the 2006 campaign.

Under Phillips direction, the Bears completely transformed the spaces the organization operates out of both in the city of Chicago and at Halas Hall in Lake Forest. The Bears relocated staff members based out of Soldier Field to a new downtown office space in 2018. The new office space, located at 123 North Wacker Drive, allows Bears staff members to work in the heart of the city, where they are closer to partners and will have workspace that will allow for stronger collaboration and future growth.

In 2012, Phillips oversaw a Halas Hall renovation project that added over 30,000 square feet to the team's headquarters, which opened in 1997. The renovations included additions to the weight and training rooms, an upgraded locker room, additional meeting spaces and offices, and a new event center which features a broadcast studio and conference space.

Then from 2017-19, Phillips oversaw an additional renovation and expansion to Halas Hall, which was completed in August 2019. The expansion is highlighted by a sparkling 162,500-square-foot football operations addition to the already-existing 143,000-square foot facility and a 30,600-square-foot remodeling project on the northeast side of the building. The project, which broke ground in January 2018, has completely transformed the look and feel of the entire facility. Position meeting rooms and the draft room doubled in size, while coaches' offices increased by 50 percent, allowing for improved collaboration. A 3,250-square-foot players' lounge was created, along with a 1,700-square-foot player locker room that now includes a barbershop. The coaches/scouts locker room was also expanded and now includes a sauna and steam room. The weight room increased in size by 2,000 square feet, while the equipment room, recovery space and nutrition/fuel station doubled in size. A 13,000-square-foot indoor turf space was also added, among many other amenities. Additionally, two new football fields were built to the east of the Walter Payton Center in 2018. The new fields allow the Bears to spread out the field use over four fields throughout the offseason and during in-season practices. That project also added a training slope, a storage facility and a small practice viewing suite, much like the existing viewing suite used at Halas Hall for corporate partners and other VIP guests.

Phillips' other highlights include creating and continuing a strong customer service mentality throughout the organization, returning the Bears training camp to Illinois, and presiding over five division championships (2001, 2005, 2006, 2010, 2018) after a decade-long drought.

On the field, the Bears training camp site returned to the State of Illinois in 2002, turning out in record numbers on the campus of Olivet Nazarene University in Bourbonnais, Ill., a site they used through the 2019 preseason. The Bears began utilizing their newly renovated facilities when training camp returned to Halas Hall in 2020 and are entering their third season of hosting camp in Lake Forest, Ill.

Phillips' leadership was also key in negotiating a new home for the team at Soldier Field. Following an upgraded renovation in 2003, it not only made the club more financially competitive, but it also helped provide the best fans in professional sports with many new stadium amenities and improved the overall gameday experience along the lakefront which has been critical in creating a great home-field advantage

Phillips served as the Bears Vice President of Operations for six seasons starting in 1993. Recognized for his many years of handling the Bears contract negotiations and team finances, Phillips currently serves on the NFL's CEC Executive Working Group, the NFL's CBA Player Benefits Plans Committee and is Chairman for the NFL's Employee Benefits Committee. Phillips also currently serves on the Board of Directors of Bears Care, the philanthropic arm of the Chicago Bears, and the Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce.

Before becoming Vice President of Operations, Phillips served as the Director of Finance from 1987-93. Phillips joined the Bears staff on September 28, 1983, as the team's Controller, a position he held for four years.

Prior to joining the Bears, Phillips was employed as an auditor and tax accountant with the international accounting firm Ernst & Whinney (now Ernst & Young), from 1979-83. He graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 1979 with a degree in business and accounting. Phillips earned a Master of Marketing and management degree from the Kellogg Graduate School at Northwestern University in 1989.

Phillips was born in Oneida, N.Y., grew up in Nashua, N.H., and he currently resides with his wife Ann in Libertyville, III. He has three sons, Matthew, Max, and Frank.

Ryan Poles was named the seventh general manager in franchise history on Jan. 25, 2022.

"We are thrilled to be able to add someone of Ryan's background and football expertise to our organization," Chairman George H. McCaskey said. "His accomplishments with the Chiefs speak for themselves and amplified the team's standing as one of the premier franchises in professional sports. We are confident that under his leadership, we will reach our goal of bringing a Super Bowl championship to Chicago."

Poles, 36, recently completed his 13th season with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2021, and his first as the club's Executive Director of Player Personnel. Prior to last season Poles served for three seasons as the club's Assistant Director of Player Personnel (2018-20), a season as the Director of College Scouting (2017), four seasons as the College Scouting Coordinator (2013-16) and three seasons as the College Scouting Administrator (2010-12). Poles originally joined the Chiefs in 2009 as the team's Player Personnel Assistant.

During his 13 years in Kansas City the Chiefs captured one Super Bowl title, two AFC championships and seven AFC West division championships.

"I am extremely grateful to George, the McCaskey family and the rest of the Bears organization for this opportunity," Poles said. "The Chicago Bears are one of the flagship franchises in the National Football League and are recognized as one of the most prestigious clubs in all of sports. It's an honor for me to join such a well-regarded organization. Together with my family, I'm looking forward to hitting the ground running to help get this organization, its fanbase and the city what they deserve: a winning team and a Super Bowl trophy."

Poles oversaw all aspects of the college scouting across the country for the Chiefs while assisting with the pro personnel process and preparing for free agency. He also assisted General Manager Brett Veach with the coordination of the NFL Draft and overseeing the team's out-of-town area scouts. Poles was instrumental in helping the Chiefs land top draft prospects such as All-Pros Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce. This past season the Chiefs tied for second in the NFL with six Pro Bowl selections in Mahomes, Kelce, Tyreek Hill, Orlando Brown, Chris Jones and Tyrann Mathieu and tied for first in the NFL with seven selections in 2020. In total since 2009, the Chiefs have had 69 Pro Bowl selections with 28 different players.

Prior to joining the Chiefs, Poles served as a Recruiting Assistant for his alma mater, Boston College (2008-09), after signing with the Chicago Bears as an undrafted free agent in 2008.

The Canandaigua, N.Y., native played offensive tackle for five seasons for Boston College (2003-07), protecting current Atlanta Falcons QB Matt Ryan and playing alongside Bears Co-Director of Player Personnel, Trey Koziol. Poles was honored with the Paul Cavanaugh Award in 2007 as the student-athlete with total commitment to football both on and off the field and for his dedication to volunteerism, ethics and community. He played his prep football at Canandaigua Academy in Canandaigua, N.Y.

Poles also was named to two "40 Under 40" lists in the past three years: Ingram's Magazine in 2019 and by The Athletic in 2021

Poles graduated from Boston College in 2007 with a degree in Communications. He and his wife, Katie, have two children: Mason and Jordyn.

On Jan. 29, 2022, Bears general manager Ryan Poles announced the hiring of Ian Cunningham as the team's new assistant general manager.

Cunningham brings 14 years of NFL front office experience to the Bears' personnel staff. He comes to Chicago after most recently serving as Director of Player Personnel for the Philadelphia Eagles, a position he was promoted to at the beginning of the 2021 season. Prior to his promotion, Cunningham worked as the Assistant Director of Player Personnel (2019-20) and oversaw the college scouting department from 2017-18 as the Director of College Scouting.

A two-time Super Bowl Champion (XLVII and LII) as a member of the Baltimore Ravens' and Eagles' front office, Cunningham's NFL front office career began in 2008 when he was hired in Baltimore as a Player Personnel Assistant. After five seasons as an assistant, he worked as a Southeast Area Scout for the Ravens for two seasons (2013-14) before taking on additional responsibility as the Southeast/Southwest Area Scout from 2015-16.

As the Director of College Scouting during the 2017-18 seasons in Philadelphia, Cunningham was instrumental in both identifying and selecting several key members of the Eagles' current roster, including TE Dallas Goedert, CB Avonte Maddox, OL Jordan Mailata, DE Josh Sweat and undrafted free agent linebacker, T.J. Edwards. Collectively, the group has accounted for 236 games played and 138 starts over the past four seasons.

The 2019 season marked Cunningham's first as Philadelphia's Assistant Director of Player Personnel, a promotion he held for two seasons before the club named him Director of Player Personnel at the start of the 2021 season. The Eagles' 2021 Draft class featured two Top-40 picks in Devonta Smith (1st, 40th overall) and Landon Dickerson (2nd, 37th overall). Both emerged as key contributors to the Philadelphia offense making a combined 29 regular-season starts. Smith appeared in all 17 games and made 16 starts, immediately becoming the team's top target with team-leading figures in receptions (64), receiving yards (916) and receiving touchdowns (10). Smith's 916 receiving yards also broke an Eagles rookie record, passing Desean Jackson's 912 receiving yards in 2008. Dickerson also proved worthy of being a top selection, making 14 starts on an offensive line that helped the Eagles average a league-best 159.7 rushing yards per game. Dickerson appeared in 859 offensive snaps and allowed just two sacks on the season.

Prior to joining the front office ranks, Cunningham was an offensive lineman who signed with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2008 as an undrafted free agent. He graduated from the University of Virginia in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in psychology, before going on to earn his master's in education in 2008. A four-year letter recipient for the Cavaliers, Cunningham tallied 31 starts and earned honorable mention freshman All-America accolades from Rivals.com as well as ACC All-Freshman Team recognition from The Sporting News.

Cunningham is originally from Carrollton, Texas, where he attended Hebron High School. The high school standout earned numerous all-state and all-area honors and participated in the 2003 U.S. Army All-American game.

Matt Eberflus was named the 17th head coach in franchise history on January 27th, 2022.

"I couldn't be more excited to have Matt become the next head coach of the Chicago Bears," Bears GM Ryan Poles said. "His experience, passion, character and attention to detail made him the right man for both the job and the culture we intend to establish here at Halas Hall. Throughout the search, Matt impressed me when detailing his vision and plan for our team. We look forward to getting to work and assembling a top-notch staff and roster that will help us consistently compete for championships."

Eberflus comes to Chicago with 30 years of coaching experience, including 13 in the NFL, and recently completed his fourth season as defensive coordinator for the Indianapolis Colts in 2021. Under Eberflus the Colts were the only NFL defensive unit to be ranked in the top-10 in scoring, run defense and takeaways in each of the past two seasons. The Colts finished in the top-10 in the NFL in run defense and takeaways in all four of his years, top-10 in scoring defense in three of the four and were the least penalized defense in the league in 2019 and 2021.

"I would like to thank Ryan and the McCaskey family for this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to lead the Chicago Bears, one of the most storied franchises in all of sports in one of the greatest cities in the world," Eberflus said. "I am truly humbled and honored to be named your head coach and together we will do everything in our power to bring a Super Bowl championship back to Chicago."

Eberflus' impact in Indianapolis was immediate. After inheriting a Colts defense that finished 30th in the NFL in both scoring and total yards in 2017, Eberflus helped the unit improve to 10th in scoring and 11th in yards in his first year in 2018. After finishing with a 4-12 record in 2017, the Colts rebounded to earn a wild card berth with a 10-6 mark in 2018, beating the Texans in the first round of the playoffs before losing to the Chiefs in the divisional round.

With a coaching background rooted in the linebacker position, Eberflus helped develop linebacker Darius Leonard into one of the most productive linebackers in the NFL. Since being selected by the Colts in the second round of the 2018 NFL Draft, Leonard is a three-time Associated Press All-Pro and three-time Pro Bowler. His career totals include 538 tackles, 30 tackles for loss, 15.0 sacks, 11 interceptions, 30 passes defensed, 17 forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries. Leonard went on to win 2018 AP Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2018 under Eberflus' guidance.

In 2021, the Colts tied for first in the NFL in fumble recoveries (14) and tied for third in both interceptions (19) and opponent three-and-out percentage (.227). They also tied for fourth in red zone takeaways (4), ranked fifth overall in forced fumbles (17) and ninth in points allowed (21.5).

Two years ago in 2020, the Colts finished in the top-10 in numerous categories, including total defense (332.1 yards per game, eighth), rush defense (90.5 yards per game, second), interception rate (2.67, eighth), takeaways (25, tied-fifth), first downs allowed per game (20.6, eighth), goal-to-go percentage (70.00, tied-ninth), points per game allowed (22.6, tied-10th) and safeties (three, tied-first). It marked the first time since 1971 that the Colts finished in the top-five in run defense and the first time since 2007 that Indianapolis ranked in the top-10 in total defense.

In 2019, the Indianapolis defense was stout against the run and finished seventh in the league after allowing 97.9 yards per game. It marked the first time that the Colts, who ranked eighth in rush defense in 2018, finished the year ranked in the top-10 in run defense in back-to-back seasons since 1976-77. The Indianapolis defense also ranked in the top-10 in interceptions (15, seventh) and takeaways (23, tied-10th).

In 2018, Eberflus was part of a Colts team that finished with a 10-6 regular season record, won in the AFC Wild Card Round and had an appearance in the AFC Divisional Round. Indianapolis became the third team in NFL history to start a season 1-5 and make the playoffs. Additionally, the Colts were the second team in NFL history to start a season 1-5 and win a playoff game.

Inheriting a defensive roster infused with youth in 2018, Eberflus guided a Colts defense that finished 11th in the league in total defense. The unit also ranked eighth in rush defense, which was the team's best mark since 1995 (sixth). Indianapolis finished 10th in the NFL in points allowed and registered the second-most tackles for loss in the league (91). The Colts were one of only three teams to not allow a 100-yard rusher despite facing five of the top-10 rushers in the NFL. The Indianapolis defense forced at least one turnover in a league-most 15 games, including multiple turnovers in seven games. They also forced a turnover in each postseason contest.

For his efforts, Eberflus finished third in the voting for the 2018 Associated Press NFL Assistant Coach of the Year. Fherflus began his NFL career with the Browns as a linebackers coach (2009-10) before spending seven seasons with the Cowboys as linebackers coach (2011-17)—and adding passing game coordinator to his duties in 2016-17.

From 2016-17, the Cowboys boasted one of the league's best rushing defenses, including No. 1 overall in 2016. In 2017, he guided a linebacker group that accounted for 34 percent of the tackles for the league's No. 8 ranked defense (318.1 yards per game) and rushing defense (104.0 yards per game).

In 2011, Eberflus' first season in Dallas, he inherited a group that was spearheaded by All-Pro DeMarcus Ware, who registered 19.5 sacks, good for second in the NFC and the NFL and tops amongst all linebackers in the league, en route to his sixth consecutive selection as a Pro Bowl starter.

Before entering the NFL, Eberflus was a college coach for 17 years. He started his career at Toledo, his alma mater, as a student assistant (1992), graduate assistant (1993), outside linebackers coach (1994-98), defensive backs coach (1999-2000) and recruiting coordinator (1994-95).

After leaving Toledo, Eberflus spent eight seasons as defensive coordinator at Missouri from 2001-08, serving as the team's associate head coach/defensive coordinator/safeties coach (2006-08) and defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach (2001-05). While with Missouri, Eberflus helped guide the Tigers to the Big 12 North Division title in 2007 and 2008, compiling a 22-6 record over that span.

As a player, Eberflus was a four-year letterman and three-year starting linebacker at Toledo. He earned first-team All-MAC honors and led his team in tackles as both a junior and senior. As a senior he was voted team captain and was awarded the Nicholson Award as the team's Most Valuable Player. Eberflus earned a degree in education in 1993 and was inducted into Toledo's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Eberflus and his wife, Kelly, have two daughters, Grace and Giada.

Alan Williams is in his first season as defensive coordinator for the Bears in 2022.

Williams brings 30 years of coaching experience to Chicago, including 21 seasons in the NFL. He joins the Bears after spending the past four seasons as the Indianapolis Colts' safeties coach, his second stint with the club after previously serving as the defensive backs coach for 10 seasons (2002-2011). He has additional stops with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2001), Minnesota Vikings (2012-13) and Detroit Lions (2014-17).

Under Eberflus and Williams, the Colts were the only NFL defensive unit to be ranked in the top-10 in scoring, run defense and takeaways in each of the past two seasons. From 2018-21, the Colts finished in the top-10 in the NFL in run defense and takeaways. They also ranked in the top-10 in scoring defense in three of their four seasons with the organization and were the least penalized defense in the league in 2019 and 2021. The Colts also have finished in the top-10 in run defense in each of the last three seasons and reached the playoffs in two of the last four seasons (2018 and 2020). Last season, the Colts were tied for third in the NFL with 19 interceptions.

In 2020, under Williams' guidance, the Colts ranked sixth in the NFL in passes defensed (78). Indianapolis also tied for seventh in the league in interceptions (15) and games with two-or-more interceptions (four). The team led the league with four interceptions returned for touchdowns. In his second season, safety Khari Willis compiled 82 tackles (63 solo), 3.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, two interceptions (one returned for a touchdown), six passes defensed and one forced fumble. He finished third on the team in total tackles for the second consecutive season.

In 2019, the Indianapolis defense was stout against the run and finished seventh in the league after allowing 97.9 yards per game. The Colts defense also ranked in the top-10 in interceptions (15, seventh) and takeaways (23, tied-10th).

In 2018, Indianapolis' defense finished 11th in the league in total defense. The unit also ranked eighth in rush defense and 10th in the NFL in points allowed and registered the second-most tackles-for-loss in the league. Indianapolis was also one of only three teams to not allow a 100-yard rusher despite facing five of the top-10 rushers in the NFL. The Colts defense forced at least one turnover in a league-most 15 games, including multiple turnovers in seven games.

In his final season with the Detroit Lions in 2017, Williams guided a defensive unit that posted the fourth-most interceptions in the NFL (19) while tying for the league-high in interceptions returned for touchdown (three). The Lions also tied for 10th in passes defensed (79). Williams helped guide cornerback Darius Slay to his first career Pro Bowl and Associated Press All-Pro Team selections. Slay had a career year as he registered 60 tackles (54 solo) and set career highs with eight interceptions, 26 passes defensed and one fumble recovery. Slay finished first in the NFL in passes defensed and tied for first in interceptions.

In 2016, the Lions were one of only two teams (Tampa Bay) in the NFL with three safeties who recorded two-or-more interceptions and one of five teams who featured four safeties with at least one interception. Detroit's seven interceptions by safeties marked the third time since 2000 that Lions safeties registered seven-or-more interceptions in a season since 2000.

In Williams' first season as the defensive backs/safeties coach with Detroit in 2014, he had an immediate impact on the Lions' secondary. By the end of the season, the Lions had allowed the fewest rushing yards (1,109 yards/69.3 yards per game) in the NFL. Detroit's safeties unit also led the NFL in interceptions (11) and ranked fourth in passes defensed (20). Defensive Back Glover Quin had the most productive season of his career under Williams, compiling 73 tackles (57 solo), a career-high seven interceptions and 10 passes defensed; all of which earned his first-career Pro Bowl selection.

Williams' first tenure as a defensive coordinator was in Minneapolis with the Vikings (2012-13). Under Williams' guidance, the Vikings were tied for seventh in sacks (85.0) and ninth in tackles for loss (91.0). In 2013, despite being forced to play with a depleted secondary majority of the season due to injuries, safety Andrew Sendejo, cornerback Marcus Sherels and cornerback Shaun Prater all logged their first career interceptions under Williams. Veteran defensive end Jared Allen also had a standout season, leading the team in sacks with 11.5 while fellow defensive end Brian Robison recorded a career-best 9.0 sacks.

Prior to his stint in Minneapolis, Williams spent a decade coaching the Colts secondary, where he worked with some of the NFL's best safeties, including Antoine Bethea and Bob Sanders. From 2002-2011, the Colts ranked in the top-six in the NFL in passing defense five times and only once did not finish in the top-15. Williams guided Bethea (2007, 2009) and Sanders (2005, 2007) each to two Pro Bowl seasons. In 2007, Sanders was named the Associated Press Defensive Player of the Year, the first Colts player to ever receive the honor.

From 2002-2010, the Colts earned nine-consecutive playoff berths. During the playoffs, the defense recorded 18 interceptions, including seven during the team's playoff-run to their Super Bowl XLI win over Chicago in 2006. In 2008, Williams' secondary also helped the Colts defense set an NFL record for fewest passing touchdowns allowed with six, the lowest number ever surrendered in a 16-game season.

Williams NFL coaching career began with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2001, while he served as a defensive assistant under former head coach Tony Dungy. In Tampa Bay, Williams worked with All-Pro players such as John Lynch and Ronde Barber. He also coached alongside current Steelers Head Coach Mike Tomlin and helped the Bucs reach a 9-7 record and an NFC Wild Card

A former running back standout at William & Mary (1988-91), Williams returned to his alma mater to begin his collegiate coaching career in 1996. At William & Mary, he coached the running backs (1996-97) and defensive backs (1998-2000) for five seasons. Williams got his start in coaching as an assistant head coach at Norview (Va.) High School, where he tutored the running backs and defensive backs from 1992-95.

A Norfolk, Va. native, Williams and his wife, Lisa, have three children - Christian, Solomon and Nathan.





GETSY OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

School: Akron Hometown: Munhall, Pa. Birthday: Feb. 16, 1984

Luke Getsy is in his first season as offensive coordinator for the Bears.

Getsy comes to Chicago with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven in the NFL, all coming with the Green Bay Packers. During his seven seasons in Green Bay, Getsy was part of five NFC North Division Championships and six postseason runs

Most recently in 2021, Getsy completed his second season as quarterbacks coach and passing game coordinator for the Packers, where he helped guide Aaron Rodgers to both an MVP-caliber season and his fourth consecutive Pro Bowl honor. Since Getsy took over his current role at the start of the 2020 season, Rodgers has recorded 24 games with multiple touchdown passes and zero interceptions, passing Tom Brady's 19 games during the 2010-11 seasons for the most in a two-season span in NFL history.

In 2020, Getsy helped guide an offense that led the league in scoring (31.8 ppg), set an NFL record for red zone touchdown percentage (80.0 pct., No. 1 in the NFL since 1981) and posted the team's highest third-down percentage since 1970 (49.4 pct.). Getsy coached Rodgers to NFL Most Valuable Player honors from the Associated Press for the third time in his career (2011, 2014), joining Peyton Manning, Tom Brady and Brett Favre as the only players to earn the honor three or more times since 1961. Rodgers' 121.5 passer rating that year ranked No. 2 in league history behind only his own 122.5 rating in 2011, while his league-leading 48 touchdown passes and 70.7 completion percentage both were team records. Rodgers was also named to his ninth career Pro Bowl and led the league with a 9.60 TD/INT ratio, the top mark in NFL history among QBs with 30-plus passing touchdowns in a season.

In his first season leading Green Bay's quarterbacks room in 2019, Getsy helped Rodgers earn his eighth career Pro Bowl selection after throwing for 4,002 yards and 26 touchdowns with four interceptions, his second consecutive season with 4,000-plus passing yards. Rodgers led the league in lowest INT percentage (0.70), the second best single-season mark in team history, and tied for the NFL lead with 12 zero interception games.

In his lone season at Mississippi State in 2018 as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach, Getsy helped the Bulldogs rank No. 2 in the Southeastern Conference in rushing offense (223.6 ypg, No. 20 in the nation) and yards per carry (5.66, No. 12 in the nation).

As wide receivers coach with the Packers in 2016-17, Getsy worked with WR Davante Adams, who was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in both seasons. Adams led the team with 74 catches for a teamhigh 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 TDs in 2017 on his way to earning Pro Bowl recognition for the first time in his career.

In Getsy's first year as receivers coach in 2016, Green Bay was one of two teams in the NFL (New Orleans) to have three wide receivers (Jordy Nelson, Adams and Randall Cobb) with 60-plus receptions and 600-plus receiving yards. Adams posted then-career highs with 75 catches for 997 yards (13.3 avg.) and 12 touchdowns. Nelson led the NFL in receiving touchdowns (14) and Adams was tied for No. 2 (12) as they became only the second teammate duo in franchise history with 12-plus TD catches each in the same season (Nelson and Cobb, 2014).

In 2015, Getsy helped guide an offense that posted eight zero turnover games, tied for the best mark (2009) in franchise history to that point (since 1933). In his first season in Green Bay in 2014, he was part of an offensive staff that helped the Packers lead the league in scoring (30.4 ppg) and tie for No. 1 in the NFL in fewest giveaways (13).

Getsy spent the 2013 season working with the wide receivers group at Western Michigan, where he tutored current Jets WR Corey Davis, who earned second-team All-Mid-American Conference honors and was named Freshman of the Year in the conference after catching 67 passes for 941 yards (14.0 avg.) and six touchdowns. Davis also earned Freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America. Getsy helped build the Broncos' 2014 recruiting class that was rated in the top 50 nationally and the best in MAC history by Rivals.com. He recruited LS Wyatt Pfeifer of Delaware, Ohio, to Western Michigan, the only MAC signee to be selected to the U.S. Army All-American Bowl.

As the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2011-12), Getsy helped guide the Crimson Hawks to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title and a final ranking of No. 6 in Division II in 2012. The team ranked No. 10 nationally in rushing offense with an average of 259.3 yards per game, led by a pair of 1,000-yard rushers in Harvie Tuck (1,660) and De'Antwan Williams (1,325). Tuck was named the PSAC Offensive Player of the Year for the Western Division in 2012.

Prior to his arrival at IUP, Getsy served as an offensive graduate assistant at the University of Pittsburgh in 2010. He was part of a staff that helped guide the Panthers to a share of the Big East title and an appearance in the BBVA Compass Bowl, where they beat Kentucky, 27-10.

He began his coaching career at his alma mater, the University of Akron, serving as a graduate assistant from 2007-08. As a player at Akron, Getsy set 24 individual school records in his two seasons with the Zips after transferring from Pittsburgh.

Following his collegiate career, Getsy was signed by the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent in May 2007 and was with the club through the preseason. Getsy earned first-team AP all-state honors as a senior at Steel Valley High School in Munhall, Pa., after completing 100 of 172 passes for 1,654 yards and 16 touchdowns. The first four-year starter in school history, he finished his career as the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League's all-time leading passer with 6,021 yards and led his school to the WPIAL playoffs four times. Getsy was selected to the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's "Fabulous 22" team and the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review's "Terrific 25" squad.

Getsy and his wife, Tina, have three sons, John, Paul and Adam, and a daughter, Nora.



Richard HIGHTOWER PECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR

School: Texas Hometown: Houston, Texas Birthday: Sept. 15, 1980

Richard Hightower is in his first year as special teams coordinator with the Bears in 2022. He returns to Chicago after previously serving as assistant special teams coach for the Bears in 2016.

Hightower arrives with 15 years of NFL coaching experience, including the last five as special teams coordinator with the San Francisco 49ers

Last season the 49ers' special teams played a big role in the team's postseason run to the NFC Championship game. In the divisional round win at the Packers, Hightower's unit blocked a punt for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter to tie the game, and also converted on the game-winning field goal as time expired. They also blocked a field goal as time expired going into halftime to keep it a one-possession game. Then to open the second half, Deebo Samuel set the 49ers up with great field position with a 45-yard kickoff return

Punter Mitch Wishnowsky had an outstanding year in 2021. He earned his second-career NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honor after Week 2 after his outing against the Eagles where he recorded two punts that pinned Philadelphia inside their own 10-yard line, neither resulting in points, and finished the day with five punts for 226 yards (45.2 average) with three landing inside the 20. He also earned NFC Player of the Month honors for September. That month, Wishnowsky registered 11 punts for 515 yards (46.8 average), including a long of 59. Those 11 punts were returned for a total of only 19 yards and of his 11 punts, six landed inside the opposition's 20-yard line. Wishnowsky and special teamer Trenton Cannon also were named Pro Bowl alternates following the 2021 season.

From 2017-20, the 49ers kicking unit tied for second in the NFL in made field goals (124) and fifth in field goal percentage (88.6). In addition, San Francisco's punt coverage ranked second over that time span, holding opponent punt returns to an average of 6.2 yards per return.

In 2020, Hightower helped Wishnowsky record the ninth-most punts inside the 20-yard line (25) in the NFL while finishing in the top-12 in both net (41.6, 12th) and gross (46.9, 11th) average. Kicker Robbie Gould converted 19 of 23 field goals (82.6 percent) and earned NFL Special Teams Player of the Week honors in Week 12.

In 2019, Hightower led the 49ers special teams unit that had an average starting field position of the 32.1-yard line, ranking second in the NFL. San Francisco also held opponents to an average starting field position of the 24.7-yard line, which ranked seventh. Kicker Robbie Gould connected on 23 of 31 field goal attempts and finished the season with 110 points, marking his thirdconsecutive 100-or-more point season with the 49ers. He was also named Special Teams Player of the Month for December for the third-consecutive season since joining the 49ers in 2017. Wishnowsky registered a 44.9 punt average which ranked second among all rookies in franchise history (min. 20 punts) and wide receiver Richie James Jr. ranked seventh in the NFL in punt return average (8.0) and 10th in kickoff return average (21.4).

Under Hightower's tutelage in 2018, San Francisco's special teams units flourished. Gould set the 49ers single-season franchise record for field goal percentage (97.1), as he connected on 33 of 34 field goal attempts and finished the season with 126 points. He also set the franchise record for most consecutive field goals made (33) and finished the season connecting on each of his final 23 attempts. Gould was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for December and was a two-time recipient of the NFC Special Teams Player of the Week Award (Week 2 & 15). Rookie WR Richie James Jr. was named All-NFC kick returner by the PFWA as he averaged 25.2 yards per kickoff return, which ranked seventh in the NFL. James Jr. also registered the team's first kickoff return for a touchdown (97 yards) since 2011.

In 2017, the 49ers special teams units excelled under Hightower's guidance. In his first season with the 49ers, Gould had a career year, leading the NFL with a career-high 39 made field goals and finishing third in the NFL with a career-high 145 points. Gould's 39 made field goals were the second-most in a single-season in franchise history (K David Akers - 44 made field goals in 2011) and tied for the third-most in a single-season in NFL history. P Bradley Pinion set a career high with a 41.3 net punting average and the punt coverage unit ranked second in the NFL, allowing 4.2 yards per return. The 4.2 opponent punt return average was the eighth-best in the NFL since 2001.

As an assistant special teams coach with Chicago in 2016, the Bears kickoff coverage team finished seventh in the NFL in opponent drive start average. Deonte Thompson led the NFL in kickoff returns with 35 and ranked second with 810 yards. Punt returner Eddie Royal scored on a 65-yard touchdown on Monday Night Football against the Philadelphia Eagles, while Sherrick McManis led the Bears in special teams tackles and finished top 10 in the NFL, recording 13 stops.

In 2015, Hightower first joined San Francisco as an assistant special teams coach. That season, Hightower helped the 49ers punt coverage unit rank eighth in the NFL allowing just 6.4 yards per return, while working with rookie P Bradley Pinion. K Phil Dawson was 10th in the NFL with an 88.9 field goal percentage (tied for the fourth highest percentage of his 17-year career at the time).

Hightower spent the 2014 season working on offense in Cleveland assisting the wide receivers after working as an assistant special teams coach for four seasons in Washington (2010-13). With Washington, he worked under longtime special teams coordinator Danny Smith. Hightower also spent two seasons (2012-13) as the assistant defensive backs coach with Washington. Over his four seasons in Washington, they ranked third in the NFL in kickoff coverage, allowing just 21.2 yards per return, including leading the league in 2010 and 2011. Hightower's coaching on special teams helped Lorenzo Alexander lead the NFL with 21 special teams tackles en route to being named the NFC's special teams player in the Pro Bowl, in 2012. Hightower was also instrumental in the development of first-year kicker Kai Forbath, who broke an NFL record by hitting his first 17 field goal attempts and led the NFL with a 94.4 field goal percentage.

As assistant defensive back coach, Hightower helped the unit rank sixth in the NFL in interceptions (37) and tied for second



in the NFL in interception returns for touchdowns (seven) over the two-year span. DeAngelo Hall led the NFL in defensive touchdowns (three). In 2012, Washington ranked first in the NFC in passes defensed and had four returned touchdowns.

From 2006-08, Hightower was on Houston's coaching staff as a coaching assistant (2006-07) before being elevated to special teams assistant (2008). In Houston, he served under widely respected then-special teams coordinator Joe Marciano, who had more than 30 years of experience coaching special teams at the time. In 2008, Houston was 11th in the NFL in kickoff coverage (22.3 yards per return). Punt returner Jacoby Jones finished fifth in the NFL and second in Houston single-season annals with a 12.1 average, including a franchise single-season record two punt return touchdowns. Kicker Kris Brown set franchise records for points (124), field goals made (29) and field goal percentage (87.9). In 2007, the kickoff return unit featuring Jerome Mathis and Andre Davis became only the fourth team in NFL history to score four touchdowns on kickoff returns in a single season.

In between his time in Houston and Washington, Hightower spent the 2009 season as wide receivers coach at the University of Minnesota. Under his tutelage, Eric Decker was named a First-Team All-Big Ten selection that season before being selected by the Denver Broncos in the third round (87th overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft.

A native of Houston, Hightower earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from the University of Texas where he was a three-year letterman and special teams standout for the Longhorns. He went to Austin as an academic scholar and later earned an athletic scholarship after walking on. Following his senior season, then-head coach Mack Brown and his staff voted Hightower the D. Harold Byrd Leadership Award winner.

Hightower and his wife, Lanet, have two sons Jaxson and Kaden and a daughter, Reagan.

AIKMAN EFFICIENCY RATINGS

Established in 1995, the Aikman Efficiency Ratings measure offensive and defensive performance using a combination of seven key statistics identified by Troy Aikman, and then measured against league norms (and extremes). An offense or defense performing exactly at league norms in all categories will achieve a score of 75 while an exceptional unit would score 90 or more. Each unit starts with a base of 50 points and then has points added (or in two cases subtracted) to build the final ranking. (*Super Bowl winner; #Super Bowl loser)

Dave BORGONZI LINEBACKERS

School: Amherst Hometown: Everett, Mass. Birthday: Nov. 19, 1982

Dave Borgonzi is in his first season as linebackers coach for the Bears in 2022.

Borgonzi joins the Bears with 16 years of coaching experience, including 11 seasons in the NFL with stops in Indianapolis (2018-21), Tampa Bay (2014-17) and Dallas (2011-13). Most recently, he spent the past four seasons with Eberflus in Indianapolis coaching the linebackers.

Under Eberflus and Borgonzi, the Colts were the only NFL defensive unit to be ranked in the top-10 in scoring, run defense and takeaways in each of the past two seasons. The Colts also finished in the top-10 in the NFL in run defense and takeaways in all four of their years with the organization. The duo also helped Indianapolis reach the playoffs in two of the past four seasons (2018 and 2020).

Borgonzi helped mentor All-Pro LB Darius Leonard into one of the most productive players at his position in the NFL. Since being drafted by the Colts in 2018, Leonard has become a four-time Associated Press All-Pro and three-time Pro Bowler. His career totals include 538 tackles (343 solo), 30.0 tackles for loss, 15.0 sacks, 11 interceptions (one returned for a touchdown), 30 passes defensed, nine forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries. He has recorded 120+ tackles in each of his first four seasons

Borgonzi also received strong contributions from Bobby Okereke. In his third season with Borgonzi's linebackers unit in 2021, Okereke registered a career-high 130 tackles (89 solo), three tackles for loss, two interceptions, four passes defensed and 1.0 sack for minus-9 yards.

In 2019, the Indianapolis finished seventh in the league after allowing 97.9 rushing yards per game, marking the first time that the Colts, who ranked eighth in rush defense in 2018, finished the year ranked in the top-10 in run defense in back-to-back seasons since 1976-77

In 2018, Borgonzi assisted with and developed a linebackers group that featured four notable rookies (Matthew Adams, Zaire Franklin, Leonard and Skai Moore) and one second-year player (Anthony Walker). The group was spearheaded by Leonard, who finished his rookie season as the NFL leader in total tackles (163) while adding 12.0 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, eight passes defensed, two interceptions, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Leonard was named Associated Press First Team All-Pro and AP Defensive Rookie of the Year.

Prior to his four-year tenure in Indianapolis, Borgonzi served as defensive quality control/assistant linebackers coach in Tampa Bay for four seasons (2014-17). In 2016, the Buccaneers defense forced 29 takeaways, the third-highest mark in the league, along with 17 interceptions, tying them for the fourth most in the NFL.

In 2015, Borgonzi helped a defense that ranked in the top-10 in yards allowed (340.4), while allowing the second-lowest rushing average in the NFL (3.45). Lavonte David (147 tackles) and Kwon Alexander (93 tackles) finished as the top two tacklers on the team.


Prior to joining the Buccaneers, Borgonzi was with the Dallas Cowboys for three seasons serving as a coaching assistant. In his first two seasons, he assisted on the defensive side of the ball, specifically focusing on the secondary (2011-12). In 2013, he became an offensive assistant, spending majority of his time assisting the offensive line.

Before the NFL, Borgonzi spent five years coaching at the collegiate level. He spent time at both Harvard (2008-2010) and Syracuse (2006-07). While in Cambridge, Borgonzi served as the assistant defensive secondary coach and helped with recruiting. At Syracuse, he spent two years as a graduate assistant working with the secondary and defensive line, all while earning his master's degree in education. He also assisted the team with special teams and recruiting.

A native of Everett, Mass., Borgonzi graduated from Amherst College with a degree in law, jurisprudence and social thought. While at Amherst, he was a three-year starter at linebacker (2001-04) and was named team captain his senior year.

Borgonzi and his wife, Alyssa, have daughter, Gianna, and a son, James.





Andre Curtis is in his first year as the safeties coach for the Bears in 2022.

He joins the Bears with 22 years of coaching experience, including 16 in the NFL. He spent the past seven seasons in Seattle where he most recently served as the team's defensive passing game coordinator (2018-22).

During his tenure in Seattle, six defensive backs combined to make nine trips to the Pro Bowl in Kam Chancellor (2015), Richard Sherman (2015, 2016), Earl Thomas (2015, 2017), Shaquill Griffin (2019), Jamal Adams (2020) and Quandre Diggs (2020, 2021)

In 2021, Curtis coached Diggs to his second-career Pro Bowl selection after recording five interceptions for the second-straight year. Diggs is currently the only player in the NFL to record at least three interceptions in each of the last five seasons. With Curtis' assistance, the safety also recorded a career-high 94 tackles. Meanwhile, Adams also had a standout season despite missing five games due to injury. Adams finished the season with 87 total tackles, two interceptions and five passes defensed.

In 2020, he coached Adams and Diggs to the Pro Bowl. With Curtis' assistance, Adams set the NFL record for most sacks by a defensive back in a season (9.5) and became the first defensive back to lead his team in sacks since 2011 (Roman Harper, 7.5). Diggs led the team with five interceptions, tying him for fourth in the NFL. In total, Seattle intercepted 14 passes, tying them for 10th in the NFL with 22 takeaways.

The 2019 season saw cornerback Griffin earn his first Pro Bowl appearance after he posted a career-high 65 tackles (45 solo) and 13 passes defensed, ranking 14th in the league. Cornerback Tre Flowers record a career-high three interceptions. Curtis also began tutoring Diggs mid-season, after a trade with Detroit. Diggs presence was immediately felt with veteran leadership and three interceptions, returning one for a touchdown.

By the end of the 2018 season, Seattle's secondary saw three new starters in the backfield in Flowers, safety Bradley McDougald and safety Tedric Thompson, teaming with Griffin.

In 2017, Curtis oversaw Seattle's defensive backs unit, a position he was promoted into in 2016. During the 2017 season, Thomas returned from a broken leg suffered in 2016 and was named All-Pro for the fifth time. He also was selected to his sixth-career Pro Bowl after recording 88 tackles (56 solo) and two interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown. In 2016, Curtis coached Sherman to his fourth Pro Bowl, after the cornerback recorded a team-leading four interceptions in 2016.

In his first season with Seattle in 2015, he worked as an assistant secondary and safeties coach. With Curtis' help, the Seahawks secondary boasted three Pro Bowlers in Chancellor, Sherman and Thomas for the third consecutive season as they helped Seattle rank second in total defense (291.8 ypg) and in pass defense (210.3 ypg) in the NFL.

Prior to his arrival in Seattle, Curtis spent two seasons with the New Orleans Saints as the assistant secondary coach (2012-14). In 2014, he worked closely with safety Kenny Vaccaro and cornerback Keenan Lewis. Vaccaro was a PFWA All-Rookie selection as he led the secondary with 93 tackles and Lewis led the team with a career-high four interceptions in 2013.

Curtis joined the NFL as a defensive quality control coach for the N.Y. Giants from 2006-08. He then went on to coach the defensive backs/safeties for the St. Louis Rams from 2009-11. In 2011, the Rams finished seventh in the NFL in pass defense (206.7 ypg).

Prior to the NFL, he coached the defensive ends at Georgia Southern (2004-05) and linebackers at his alma mater, Virginia Military Institute (VMI), from 2000-03. While on the VMI staff, Curtis worked for the N.Y. Jets during training camp in 2002. He assisted the Tampa Bay Buccaneers during training camp in 2013 as a part of the NFL's Bill Walsh Minority Coaching Fellowship.

Curtis was a four-year letterwinner as a linebacker at VMI from 1996-99. He started 31 consecutive games and finished his career with 354 tackles, while earning second-team All-Southern Conference honors in 1998.

Curtis is a native of Beaverdam, Va., and has a bachelor's degree in economics and business from VMI.



REARS

YAS TIGHT ENDS

School: Stanford Hometown: Paramus, N.J. Birthday; Dec. 31, 1986

Jim Dray is in his first season as tight ends coach for the Bears in 2022.

Dray completed his second season on Arizona's coaching staff as an offensive quality control coach in 2021. Last season the Cardinals finished 11-6, good for second in the NFC West, and earned an NFC wild card berth. The Cardinals' offense finished fifth in the NFC with 26.4 points per game and fourth with 373.6 yards per contest.

Dray began his coaching career at his alma mater, Stanford, as an offensive assistant in 2018 prior to working in 2019 as an offensive quality control coach with the Cleveland Browns.


An eight-year NFL veteran, Dray was selected by the Cardinals in the seventh round (233rd overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft out of Stanford and played in 56 games (18 starts) with Arizona. He also played with Cleveland (2014-15), Buffalo (2016), and San Francisco (2016) and finished his career with 56 receptions for 605 yards and three touchdowns in 94 games.

He started 39 career games at Stanford and had 41 receptions for 455 yards and seven touchdowns, earning second-team All-Pac 10 honors as a senior while helping the Cardinal finish 11th in the nation in rushing yards per game that season (218.2).

A native of Paramus, N.J., Dray was named first team All-Bergen County, All-North New Jersey, all-league, as well as secondteam All-State as a junior and senior at Bergen Catholic (Oradell, NJ) High School. He finished his prep career with 66 receptions for 786 yards and five touchdowns, earning MVP honors in the 2003 state championship game.

Dray and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Leighton.





Justin Hinds is in his first season as assistant defensive line coach for the Bears in 2022.

Hinds comes to Chicago from Western Carolina where he served as defensive coordinator for the Catamounts in 2021. Prior to that he served as the defensive line coach for two seasons at Central Michigan from 2019-20.

Hinds mentored two All-MAC selections along the defensive line in 2020, including Troy Hairston II and Mohamed Diallo. Hairston was also dubbed the MAC co-Defensive Player of the Year in 2020 and led the MAC with 5.5 sacks and 12 tackles for

In 2019, Hinds was part of head coach Jim McElwain's staff that engineered a remarkable turnaround, taking a program that won one game in 2018 to an 8-6 finish, a Mid-American Conference West Division title, and a berth in the New Mexico Bowl. Hinds led a Chippewa defensive front that featured two All-MAC honorees in Sean Adesanya, who was named to the allconference first team, and Robi Stuart, who earned a spot on the third team. In addition, CMU ranked second in the league in 2019 in total defense.

Before moving to Central Michigan, Hinds was the defensive line coach in 2018 at Lafayette College in Pennsylvania. The Leopards finished among the top 25 teams in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in takeaways with 23, and they were second in the Patriot League with 15 interceptions.

Hinds helped cultivate similar success at Valdosta State, where he served as the defensive line coach under current WCU head coach Kerwin Bell. The Blazers program regularly ranked among the top teams in both the Gulf South Conference and NCAA Division II in interceptions, turnovers gained, first downs allowed, and third-down defense.

Hinds earned a bachelor of science degree from Rowan (N.J.) and a master's degree from Wagner (N.Y.) College where he coached the defensive line and outside linebackers in 2012-13. Hinds was a two-time All-New Jersey Athletic Conference defensive lineman during a four-year career at Rowan and then served as a graduate assistant on McElwain's staff at Florida in 2015 after coaching the 2014 season as a graduate assistant at Mississippi State.



ANOCKO QUARTERBACKS

School: Pittsburgh Hometown: Clearfield, Pa. Birthday: April 6, 1988

Andrew Janocko is in his first season as Chicago's quarterbacks coach in 2022.

Janocko comes to Chicago with nine years of NFL experience. He most recently served as the quarterbacks coach for the Minnesota Vikings in 2021. Prior to his seven seasons with the Vikings, Janocko coached the quarterbacks at Mercyhurst University in Erie, Pa., spent two seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and was a graduate assistant at Rutgers University.

While serving as the Vikings quarterbacks coach in 2021, Janocko tutored starting quarterback and 2022 Pro Bowl alternate selection Kirk Cousins. Under Janocko, Cousins finished the season with 4,221 passing yards, 33 touchdowns and a passer rating of 103.1 His passer rating ranked fourth best in the NFL, trailing only Aaron Rodgers, Joe Burrow and Dak Prescott. Cousins also was one of only two quarterbacks in 2021 to throw for over 30 touchdowns and fewer than 10 interceptions (Rodgers).

As the Vikings wide receivers coach in 2020, Justin Jefferson had one of the best rookie seasons in NFL history. Jefferson set an NFL rookie record with 1,400 receiving yards and a Vikings rookie record with 88 receptions, along with seven touchdowns. Jefferson became the first rookie wide receiver to earn Associated Press All-Pro honors (first or second team) since Randy Moss in 1998 and was tabbed to his first Pro Bowl. Veteran wide receiver Adam Thielen finished with a career-high 14 receiving touchdowns, the fifth most in team history.

In 2019, while assisting with the offensive line, the Vikings o-line allowed only 28 regular-season sacks, tying them for fifth fewest in the NFL. The mark also tied for the eighth fewest sacks allowed in franchise history. The offensive line also paved the way for Dalvin Cook to rush for 1,135 yards, the Vikings first 1,000-yard rusher since Adrian Peterson did so in 2015.

In 2018 the o-line protected Cousins as he set a team record for completions (425), posted the second-best completion mark in team history (70.1%) and threw for the second-most yards (4,298) by a Viking ever.

The 2017 Vikings offensive line was a key to the team going 13-3, winning the NFC North title and advancing to the NFC Championship Game. The line paved the way for several offensive players to have career years, highlighted by quarterback Case Keenum. Cook set a team record for rookies with 288 yards in the opening three games of the season but was lost to injury for the season in the fourth game. The Vikings jumped from last in the NFL in rushing in 2016 to seventh in 2017 and climbed from No. 28 in total offense to No. 11.

From 2014-16 Janocko aided the Vikings offense as an offensive quality control coach. In 2016, he saw newly acquired quarterback Sam Bradford set the NFL record at the time for completion percentage in a season at 71.6%. Janocko also worked with the Vikings tight ends, a group that was led by veteran Kyle Rudolph, who set the Vikings record for receptions in a season by a tight end with 83. In 2015, Janocko helped a unit rank fifth in the NFL in total rushing, headlined by Adrian Peterson's leagueleading 1,485 rushing yards.

Janocko arrived in Minnesota after coaching the quarterbacks at Division II Mercyhurst for one season in 2014. His first start in coaching came in 2011, when he was a graduate assistant at Rutgers, focusing on the quarterbacks unit under thenhead coach Greg Schiano. After impressing Schiano, Janocko's first NFL coaching opportunity came in 2012 when then-Tampa Bay head coach Schiano offered him a position to serve as an offensive assistant for two seasons (2012-13).

A three-year letter winner at Pitt, Janocko served as a backup QB and holder on special teams while offensive coordinator Luke Getsy worked as a graduate assistant for the Pittsburgh Panthers. Janocko spent his first two seasons as a walk-on before earning a scholarship his final two seasons. A three-time member of the Big East All-Academic Team, he graduated from Pitt in 2010 with a degree in history and minor in political science.

A native of Clearfield, Pa., Janocko was the starting quarterback at Clearfield Area High School, where his father, Tim, served as the head coach. He led the school to a pair of district championships and was a two-time Pennsylvania Football News All-

Janocko and his wife, Natalie, have a son, Noah.





Austin King is in his first season as assistant offensive line coach for the Bears in 2022.

King brings 10 years of coaching experience - two in the NFL and eight collegiate - to Chicago, having spent the five seasons prior to the Raiders with the Dayton Flyers, including his last three as assistant coach/offensive coordinator.

King recently completed his first season as tight ends coach with the Las Vegas Raiders in 2021 after serving as offensive quality control coach for the club in 2020.

In 2021, King helped tight end Darren Waller finish sixth in the AFC with 55 catches to go along with 665 yards and two scores despite missing six games. Waller's backup, Foster Moreau, filled in nicely during Waller's six-game absence with 30 catches for 373 yards and three touchdowns.

In his first season with the Silver and Black in 2020, King worked primarily with the offensive line and helped oversee a unit that surrendered just 28 sacks, ranking 10th in the NFL, while surrendering zero sacks against four different opponents. Additionally, the offensive line paved the way for RB Josh Jacobs, who surpassed the 1,000-yard mark and set career highs in rush attempts (273) and touchdowns (12) en route to earning his first Pro Bowl selection.

In 2019, King completed his fifth year with the Flyers and his third as the program's offensive coordinator. King's offense helped guide the Flyers to an 8-3 record and finish in the top-10 of the FCS in the multiple statistical categories, including the No. 1 scoring offense with 42.6 points per game.

For the second straight year, the Flyers' offense averaged over 7.0 yards per play, one-of-six Division I programs to do so from 2018-19. During King's tenure, the Flyers had numerous individual stars, most notably first-team All-American TE Adam Trautman, who was selected in the third round (105th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints. In his five years at Dayton, the Flyers went 38-19 (.667), including a PFL Championship in 2015 and a berth in the FCS Playoffs. As offensive line coach, he had eight different linemen achieve first-team or second-team All-League honors.

Prior to joining the Flyers, King spent one season with Syracuse as an offensive quality control coach with a focus on the offensive line. King's guidance helped OL Sean Hickey earn All-ACC recognition while also eventually being signed by the New Orleans Saints as an undrafted rookie free agent.

King began his coaching career at Toledo in 2012, where he spent two seasons as the program's offensive quality control assistant.

A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, King was selected as an offensive lineman in the fourth round (133rd overall) by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2003 NFL Draft. He appeared in 34 games and made one start over his four-year career (2003-06) with the Buccaneers and Atlanta Falcons.

King earned his B.A. in secondary education from Northwestern in 2004 and was a three-sport captain and first-team All-Ohio football player at Purcell Marian High school before graduating and playing four years for the Wildcats as a starter and earning an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors three times.



MORGAN **ENSIVE LINE**

School: Colorado Birthday: Sept. 24, 1976

Chris Morgan is in his first season as offensive line coach for the Bears in 2022.

Morgan, who has coached in two Super Bowls, is in his 14th season overall as an NFL offensive line coach after completing his first year as Pittsburgh's assistant offensive line coach in 2021. He arrived in Pittsburgh after a six-year stint with Atlanta (2015-20), where he served as the Falcons' offensive line coach for all six seasons, including one as run game coordinator (2018). Morgan was also an assistant offensive line coach in Seattle (2014), Washington (2011-13) and Oakland (2009-10).

Last season in 2021, Morgan assisted with an offensive line that helped pave the way for rookie running back Najee Harris to rush for 1,200 yards, the fourth best total in the NFL, and also break Franco Harris' franchise rookie rushing record of 1,055 yards set back in 1972. Harris totaled 10 touchdowns on the season, seven on the ground and three through the air, with 467 receiving yards, the third most among NFL running backs.

Morgan was named the Steelers' interim head offensive line coach in early January after Adrian Klemm departed for a coaching job at Oregon. In his first game as the primary offensive line coach against the Browns in Week 17, the Steelers rushed for a season-high 190 yards, the most by the Steelers in more than four years. The Steelers finished the 2021 season 9-7-1, won three of their last four and received a wild card playoff berth.

In 2019. Morgan coached an offensive line in Atlanta whose production allowed the offense to average 379.7 yards per game, the fifth-most in the NFL, and average 294.6 passing yards per game, the third-highest average in the league.

In 2018, Morgan coached an offensive line that blocked for an offense that averaged 389.1 yards per game, the sixth-most yards per game in the league. The offensive line's blocking was also a major part in the offense averaging 290.8 passing yards per game, which was the fourth-highest average in the NFL.

Under Morgan's guidance, the offensive line was able to keep quarterback Matt Ryan upright and able to throw for 4,294 yards and 35 touchdowns. The offensive line's production made it possible for the Falcons to average 6.2 yards per play in 2018, which was the fifth most in the NFL and the second-highest vards per play average in franchise history.

Morgan continued to oversee the growth of center Alex Mack, who was selected to his sixth Pro Bowl - his fourth straight selection. Tackle Jake Matthews was also selected to his first Pro Bowl under Morgan's guidance in 2018 as well.

In 2017, Morgan coached an offensive line that only allowed 24 sacks, which was tied for the third-lowest amount in the NFL. Morgan's offensive line was also a catalyst for the eighth-best offense in the league. The Falcons offense averaged 364.8 yards per game and blocked for quarterback Matt Ryan who averaged 249.4 passing yards per game, which was also the eighth highest in the league. Their blocking also helped the 10-year veteran reach his seventh straight 4,000 passing yard season.

Morgan coached Mack who was selected to his third consecutive Pro Bowl after anchoring the offensive line for the second year in Atlanta. In 2017, Morgan's offensive line showed its ability to sustain blocks by springing the offense for 230 big plays (plays that are 10+ yards) and allowing Ryan to average 7.8 yards per pass, both of which were the fifth in their categories.

Morgan's teaching was essential in helping the offensive line block for the Falcons running backs, who averaged 4.3 yards per carry, which was eighth in the NFL in 2017. The offensive line also blocked for an offense that was third in the NFL in explosive runs (12+ yards-or-more)

During his second season with the Falcons, Morgan's offensive line blocked for Ryan, who was awarded the NFL MVP award at the end of the 2016 season. The offensive line was a major reason why the team averaged a league-high and franchise-high 33.8 points per game. The Falcons broke the franchise record for most points scored in a season in Week 15, with the help of the offensive line, when they scored 540 total points on the season, which tied them with the 2000 St. Louis Rams for the eighth-most points scored in a season. Ryan threw for a career and franchise-high 4,944 yards and 38 touchdowns and also had a career-high 117.1 passer rating, which was the fifth-best all-time passer rating. Morgan also helped coach Mack, who was selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

Morgan's offensive line also helped pave the way for a rushing attack that racked up 1,928 yards on that season, which was fifth in the league in 2016. Under his guidance, the offensive line helped running back Devonta Freeman, who finished in the top-10 in rushing for the second year in a row and made it to his second consecutive Pro Bowl.

During Morgan's first year in 2015, his line helped produce the Falcons' first 1,000-yard rusher since 2011, while giving up the eighth-fewest sacks in the league last year.

Morgan spent the 2014 season as assistant offensive line coach for the Seattle Seahawks. In 2014, Seattle used eight different starting combinations on the offensive line, including playoffs, and still led the NFL in rushing yards, recording a franchise-high

Prior to arriving in Seattle, Morgan served as an assistant offensive line coach with the Washington Football Team (2011-13) and Oakland Raiders (2009-10). In 2012, Morgan helped direct a unit that rushed for a team-record 2,709 yards, marking the franchise's first team rushing crown since 1933 and their club's first NFC East title since 1999.

In 2010, Oakland ranked 10th in the NFL in yards per game (356.6) and sixth in points per game (25.6). Prior to Oakland, Morgan spent the previous five seasons coaching at the high school level in his native Texas, serving as offensive line coach, special teams coordinator, offensive coordinator and assistant head coach at Westfield High School in Houston.

Morgan served as an offensive graduate assistant at the University of Idaho after two years as an assistant coach at Copperas Cove (Texas) High. He played offensive line at the University of Colorado from 1995-1999 and earned his master's degree in educational leadership at Idaho.

Morgan and his wife, Holly, have three children.





David Overstreet II is in his first season as assistant defensive backs coach for the Bears in 2022.

Overstreet recently completed his fourth season with the Colts and his first as assistant defensive backs coach in 2021. He served as the team's defensive quality control coach the previous three seasons (2018-20). Overstreet has seven total years of coaching experience, including three seasons at the collegiate level. He has helped Indianapolis reach the playoffs in two of the last four seasons (2018 and 2020).

From 2018-21 the Colts finished in the top-10 in the NFL in takeaways and were tied for third in the NFL with 19 interceptions in 2021.

The Colts ranked sixth in the NFL in passes defensed (78) in 2020. Since 1994, it was the fifth-most passes defensed in franchise history. Indianapolis tied for seventh in the league in interceptions (15) and games with two-or-more interceptions (four). The team led the league with four interceptions returned for touchdowns as cornerbacks TJ. Carrie, Kenny Moore II and Xavier Rhodes and safety Khari Willis each found the end zone.

In 2019, the Indianapolis defense was stout against the run and finished seventh in the league after allowing 97.9 yards per game. It marked the first time that the Colts, who ranked eighth in rush defense in 2018, finished the year ranked in the top-10 in run defense in back-to-back seasons since 1976-77. The Indianapolis defense also ranked in the top-10 in interceptions (15, seventh) and takeaways (23, tied-10th).

In 2018, Overstreet was part of a Colts team that finished with a 10-6 regular season record, won in the AFC Wild Card Round, and had an appearance in the AFC Divisional Round. Indianapolis became the third team in NFL history to start a season 1-5 and make the playoffs. Additionally, the Colts were the second team in NFL history to start a season 1-5 and win a playoff game.

The Colts defense finished 11th in the league in total defense. The unit also ranked eighth in rush defense, which was the team's best mark since 1995 (sixth). Indianapolis finished 10th in the NFL in points allowed and registered the second-most tackles for loss in the league. The Colts were one of only three teams to not allow a 100-yard rusher despite facing five of the top-10 rushers in the NFL. The Indianapolis defense forced at least one turnover in a league-most 15 games, including multiple turnovers in seven games. The Colts defense also forced a turnover in each postseason contest.

Prior to Indianapolis, Overstreet spent two years (2016-17) on the coaching staff at Garden City Community College in Kansas where he served as cornerbacks coach and defensive pass game coordinator. In 2017, the Broncbusters registered an 8-4 overall record (5-2 in conference play) and made an appearance in the Heart of Texas Bowl. Garden City ranked sixth in the National Junior College Athletic Association with 18 interceptions. Overstreet was also a member of the 2016 Broncbusters team that registered a perfect 11-0 record and won the NJCAA Football Championship Game in the El Toro Bowl.

In 2015, Overstreet coached at Holmes Community College in Mississippi. The Bulldogs defense ranked 31st nationally in pass defense, limiting opponents to 187.0 yards per game through the air. The squad tallied 16 takeaways, including eight interceptions and eight fumble recoveries, while the secondary recorded a combined 30 pass breakups.

Prior to coaching, Overstreet was a four-year starter at the University of Missouri where he played both free and strong safety from 2002-06. He earned First Team All-Big 12 (Kansas City Star, Houston Chronicle) and Second Team All-Big 12 (Associated Press, Coaches) recognition in 2006. He was named a First Team All-Big 12 (Kansas City Star) selection following his junior year in 2005 in which he led the team with 100 tackles (71 solo).

After his collegiate career, Overstreet spent time with the Chicago Bears as an undrafted free agent. Once his professional football career ended, Overstreet went on to own his own marketing and sales firm.

Overstreet, who has a bachelor's degree in graphic design, was born in Dallas. He played at W.W. Samuell High School and was a three-sport athlete (football, basketball, and track).

Overstreet is the son of Texas Football Hall of Famer, the late David Overstreet, Sr., who played running back for the University of Oklahoma, the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League, and the Miami Dolphins.



STANT SPECIAL TEAMS

School: Nebraska Hometown: Rockford, III.

Carlos Polk is in his first year as assistant special teams coach for the Bears in 2022.

A Rockford, III. native, Polk brings 12 years of coaching experience back to Chicago, including 11 seasons in the NFL. Polk most recently was a part of the Jacksonville Jaguars organization, where he served as the assistant special teams coach for the 2021 season.

Polk has coached special teams in the NFL for 10 seasons, spending time with the Jaguars (2021), Dallas Cowboys (2013 and 2019), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2014-18) and San Diego Chargers (2010-12). His coaching career began in 2009, when he served as the assistant special teams coach for Grossmont College in El Cajon, Calif.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Polk was selected in the fourth round of the 2001 NFL Draft and played in seven seasons with the Chargers and one with the Cowboys. He appeared in 75 career games with six starts, racking up 121 tackles.

He attended the University of Nebraska and was inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 2010. Polk was a two-time All-Big 12 selection with the Cornhuskers and an All-American in 2000. He finished his career with 227 total tackles, ranking 17th in program history.

Polk attended Guilford High School in Rockford where he was one of the all-time leading tacklers in Illinois high school history. In four years, he recorded 453 career tackles, 10 fumble recoveries, seven blocked kicks and five interceptions. He received All-Conference honors three times and All-State honors once.

He and his wife, Monique, have two sons, DeVonn, and CJ., and two daughters, Deja, and Miracle.





James Rowe is in his first year as defensive backs coach for the Bears in 2022.

Rowe joins the Bears with 15 years of coaching experience, including four seasons in the NFL. He most recently served as the cornerbacks coach for the Indianapolis Colts alongside now Bears head coach Matt Eberflus.

In 2021, the Colts defense finished in the top-10 in the NFL in takeaways and were tied for third in the NFL with 19 interceptions. Rowe coached cornerback Kenny Moore II to his first-career Pro Bowl in 2021, after finishing the season with 101 tackles (81 solo), 6.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack, a team-high 13 passes defensed, four interceptions and one forced fumble. Rowe also worked alongside Bears new assistant defensive backs coach, David Overstreet II.

Prior to joining Eberflus' defensive staff in Indianapolis in 2021, Rowe spent the 2020 season at Appalachian State University where he tutored the cornerbacks. In 2020, Appalachian State was the only team in the FBS to hold opponents to less than a 50 percent completion percentage as the defense led the nation in passes defensed (74). Given Appalachian State's success under Rowe, he was named one of 56 candidates for the Broyles Award in 2020, which honors college football's top assistant coach.

Rowe began his NFL coaching career in 2017, when the Washington Commanders hired him as the assistant defensive backs coach. He remained with the organization for three seasons (2017-19). In 2019, he coached cornerback Quinton Dunbar, who recorded a career high in interceptions (four). In 2018, he helped oversee a defensive backs group that tied for ninth in the NFL in interceptions (15).

In his first season with Washington, Rowe helped the team allow the third-lowest completion percentage (57.6) in the NFL, which was the team's best ranking since 2005. The defense also finished ninth in passing yards allowed per game (213.8) and 10th in opponent passer rating (81.0)

In 2016, Rowe was the defensive coordinator at Valdosta State, where the team boasted an 8-3 record. He coached current Colts cornerback Kenny Moore II, who earned First Team All-America honors from the American Football Coaches Association. Rowe helped the defense lead all of Division II with 27 interceptions while holding opposing quarterbacks to a 96.2 passer rating

In 2015, Rowe served as a defensive graduate assistant at the University of Florida. While in Florida, he helped the Gators defense rank sixth in total defense, eighth in scoring defense and 11th in pass defense.

Prior to Florida, Rowe served in multiple roles at Jacksonville University (2012-14), including defensive coordinator (2014), wide receivers coach (2013) and graduate assistant/cornerbacks coach (2012). He was a graduate assistant at Bethel (Tenn.) University in 2011 and helped the Wildcats finish the season ranked 14th in the NAIA poll.

Rowe began his coaching career at Cocoa (Fla.) High School where he served as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach from 2007-2010

Rowe played baseball at South Florida and was a three-year letterwinner from 2005-07. He earned a degree in business administration from South Florida in 2009

He is a native of Cocoa, Fla. and is married to his wife, Tiffany.





Travis SMITH DEFENSIVE LINE

School: Cal Poly Hometown: Walnut Creek, Calif.

Travis Smith is in his first season as defensive line coach for the Bears in 2022.

Smith joins the Bears with 12 years of coaching experience, including the last 10 with the Las Vegas Raiders. He most recently served as the Raiders' assistant defensive line coach the past two seasons, where he coached alongside Bears new assistant offensive line coach. Austin King

This past season in 2021, Smith tutored defensive end Maxx Crosby to his first Pro Bowl, where he earned Pro Bowl Defensive MVP honors. The third-year defensive end posted a career-high 56 tackles, 8.0 sacks and 30 QBH and seven passes defensed on the season. He teamed up with defensive end Yannick Ngakoue, who added 10.0 sacks last season.

In 2020, Smith guided Crosby to a team-high seven sacks in his second year in the NFL, while also adding 38 tackles, one pass defensed and one fumble recovery after starting in all 16 contests for the first time in his career. Crosby's 17 career sacks are fourth-most in Raiders history by a player through his first two seasons and tied for fifth-most in NFL history by a player drafted in the fourth round or later since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

In his first season as assistant defensive line coach in 2019, Smith helped oversee a defensive line that showed significant improvements from the 2018 season, including a 22-spot improvement in rushing yards allowed per game (140.6 avg. in 2018 to a 98.1 avg. in 2019) and an eight-spot improvement in the team's sack total (13 to 32).

Smith also aided in the development of rookie defensive ends in Crosby and Clelin Ferrell. Crosby led all Raiders with 10 sacks on the year as he became just the fourth rookie since at least 2000 to record 10+ sacks and four forced fumbles. Crosby's 10 sacks ranked second in the NFL in 2019 and second in franchise history among rookies. Crosby also became the second rookie in club annals to earn AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after his 4.0-sack performance in Week 11, a mark tied for the second-most in NFL history among rookie defenders. Ferrell also benefited from Smith's guidance, as he posted 4.5 sacks, tied for the eighth-most by a rookie in Raiders history. The Raiders rookie defensive ends combined for 14.5 sacks on the year, the most among all rookie draft classes in the NFL.

As a defensive quality control coach in 2018, Smith primarily worked with the linebackers. He tutored a group that consisted of three new starters, including veteran linebacker Tahir Whitehead and second-year linebackers Marquel Lee and Nicholas Morrow. In his first season with the Raiders, Whitehead played 99.7 percent of the team's defensive snaps and led the team with 126 tackles (89 solo). His 126 tackles ranked seventh in club history.

In 2017, Khalil Mack led the defense with 10.5 sacks and added a career-high 78 tackles (61) and earned his third consecutive Pro Bowl selection.

Throughout the 2016 season, Smith worked closely with the defensive line, coaching third-year All-Pro Mack to his second consecutive Pro Bowl and first Defensive Player or the Year honor. Mack's eight-game sack streak during the regular season tied an NFL record, and he came away with a strip sack three consecutive games during that stretch. Mack's elite season earned him numerous individual accolades, including his second Pro Bowl nod, two AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors and being named AFC Defensive Player of the Month in November.

In 2015, Smith contributed to a defense that featured two Pro Bowlers in veteran safety Charles Woodson and second-year Mack. Smith worked with Mack as he developed into an elite defender, totaling 15 sacks to rank second in the league and third in franchise history, earning his first Pro Bowl selection.

Smith worked extensively with the linebackers in 2014. He helped tutor Mack as a rookie, who finished third in the voting for the Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In 2013, Smith helped a unit that included three new starters in veteran linebackers Nick Roach and Kevin Burnett and rookie linebacker Sio Moore. Roach played every snap at middle linebacker and posted career highs in tackles (152) and sacks (5.5), while Moore was named to the PFWA All-Rookie Team after recording 4.5 sacks in his first season.

Smith joined the Raiders after spending two years in the collegiate ranks. In 2011, Smith served an offensive technical intern at the University of Colorado. Prior to his time in Boulder, he coached at Santa Monica (Calif.) Junior College in 2010, assisting the tight ends and the defensive linemen. He also served as an undergraduate assistant coach at Cal Poly.

A native of Walnut Creek, Calif., he attended Foothill High School in Pleasanton, Calif., where he earned two letters as a line-backer and fullback. After graduating, Smith went on to earn a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Cal Poly State University, where his collegiate playing career was limited due to injuries.

Smith and wife, Christina, have a son, Jackson and a daughter, Harper.





TOLBERT PASS GAME COORDINATOR WIDE RECEIVERS

School: LSU Hometown: Conroe, Texas Birthday: Sept. 15, 1967

Tyke Tolbert is in his first year as Chicago's pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach.

Tolbert is a 19-year NFL coaching veteran who spent the past four seasons as the Giants' wide receivers coach, a position he previously held with Arizona, Buffalo, Carolina and Denver.

In 2021, as the Giants wide receivers coach, Tolbert was instrumental in developing rookie wide receiver Kadarius Toney. The rookie led all Giants receivers in receiving yards, recording 420 yards in just 10 games. He posted a season-high 189 receiving yards at the Cowboys on Oct. 10, 2021.

In 2020, wide receiver Sterling Shepard led the Giants and tied his career high with 66 catches, marking his third season where he has finished with at least 65 receptions. He was second in receiving yards (656 yards) and tied wide receiver Darius Slayton for a team-high three touchdown catches.

In 2019, Tolbert coached a group that had four different receivers surpass the century mark at least once throughout the season. Slayton missed the first two games with an injury but had one of the best seasons by a rookie wide receiver in franchise history. The fifth-round draft pick out of Auburn led the team with 740 receiving yards and eight touchdowns. Slayton ranked among the top-five rookies in Giants history for receptions, yards and touchdown catches.

In 2018, Shepard started all 16 games and finished second amongst the wideouts with a career-high 66 receptions and 872 yards. He also had four touchdowns to his credit. Despite missing the final four games with an injury, Odell Beckham Jr. led the wide receivers with 77 catches for a team-high 1,052 yards and six touchdowns.

Prior to joining the Giants, Tolbert spent seven years with the Broncos, including the team's 2016 Super Bowl season. From 2012-16 one of Tolbert's Denver standouts, the late Demaryius Thomas, recorded at least 90 catches and 1,000 receiving yards each season to join Pro Football Hall of Famers Marvin Harrison (5) and Torry Holt (6) as the only players to reach those marks in at least five consecutive seasons. Thomas was also selected to the Pro Bowl four times.

Tolbert was also instrumental in the continued development of Emmanuel Sanders, who signed with the Broncos in 2014 and was selected to his first two Pro Bowls (2014, 2016) after producing the first three 1,000-yard receiving seasons of his career. Thomas and Sanders formed one of the best wide receiver duos in the league. In 2016, Thomas (1,083) and Sanders (1,032) each topped 1,000 receiving yards for the third consecutive year to become just the seventh pair of wide receivers in NFL history to accomplish that feat as teammates.

Tolbert coached the NFL's top wide receiver tandem in 2014. Thomas recorded 111 catches, a franchise-record 1,619 yards and 11 touchdowns and Sanders hauled in 101 receptions to go along with 1,404 receiving yards and nine touchdowns. The two recorded the most receptions (212) and receiving yards (3,023) by an NFL duo. Thomas earned his third Pro Bowl selection and joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Jerry Rice and Harrison as the only receivers in NFL history with three consecutive 1,400-yard and 10-touchdown seasons. Thomas' 2014 campaign included a Broncos record of seven consecutive 100-yard receiving games and a 226-yard outing vs. Arizona in Week 5 that represented the highest single-game total in club history. Sanders was named to his first Pro Bowl in 2014 after posting the fourth-most receiving yards (1,404) and fifth-most catches (101) in league history by a player in his first year with a new team.

In 2013, Tolbert coached a unit that produced three players with 10-plus touchdowns, including Thomas (14), Eric Decker (11) and Wes Welker (10). He also coached two 1,000+ yard performers, Thomas (1,430) and Decker (1,288), as Denver scored 606 points, an NFL single season record that still stands. Thomas, whose 14 receiving scores tied a franchise record, earned his second Pro Bowl honor.

Tolbert's 2012 wide receiver group helped Denver's fifth-ranked passing offense score at least 30 points in a team-record 11 games. Third year wideouts Decker and Thomas became the youngest tandem in NFL history to record 1,000 yards and 10 touchdowns each in a season.

While serving as the wide receivers coach in Buffalo in 2004, wide receiver Lee Evans led all NFL rookies with nine touchdown receptions and a 17.6 receiving average. In Tolbert's only season with the Cardinals (2003), wide receiver Anquan Boldin earned Offensive Rookie of the Year honors and set a then-NFL rookie record with 101 catches for 1,377 yards – a record that stood until the 2021 season (Jaylen Waddle, Dolphins, 102 catches).

Tolbert's first professional coaching experience was with the NFL's Bill Walsh Minority Internship Program. He first interned with the Lions during training camp in 1997 before interning again in 2001 with the Cardinals.

Tolbert began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Louisiana State in the spring of 1994 and worked in the same capacity at Northeast Louisiana that fall. He then went on to coach the wide receivers at Ohio University in the spring of 1995, before returning that fall to Northeast Louisiana, where he tutored the team's tight ends for three seasons.

After coaching tight ends at Auburn in 1998, Tolbert spent the next three years (1999-2001) as the wide receivers coach/recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette. He then went on to coach the tight ends and work as the recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida in 2002 before transitioning to the NFL in 2003.

A Conroe, Texas native, Tolbert was a wide receiver and three-year letterman at LSU, where he graduated with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Tolbert and his wife, Linda, have two daughters, Morgan, and Madison.





VALKER **UNNING BACKS**

School: Syracuse Hometown: Rochester, N.Y. Birthday: Dec. 4, 1969

David Walker is in his first season as running backs coach for the Bears in 2022.

Walker joins the Bears with 25 years of coaching experience, including seven seasons in the NFL. His most recent stop was in Detroit, where he served as the Lions running backs coach for three seasons (2016-18). In 2018, Walker oversaw the only rushing unit in the NFL to feature three different running backs that each finished the season with at least 250 yards and three touchdowns on the ground (Kerryon Johnson, LeGarrette Blount and Zach Zenner).

Detroit's 2017 season saw RBs Theo Riddick and Ameer Abdullah continue as a dual-threat backfield package. Riddick finished the season with 53 receptions for 444 yards and two touchdowns, marking the third-consecutive season he has totaled 50 or more receptions in a season (80 in 2015, 53 in 2016). Abdullah totaled a career-high four rushing touchdowns in 2017, finishing the season with 552 yards on 165 carries.

In 2016, Walker displayed his ability to cultivate talent and develop different styles of players in his first season with the Lions. On top of Abdullah and Riddick, the 2016 season allowed RB Zach Zenner and 2016 seventh-round draft selection RB Dwayne Washington to earn valuable reps in the backfield.

With Walker's guidance, Detroit saw three running backs reach the end zone in their 2016 Week 1 victory vs. Indianapolis, with scores from Riddick, Abdullah and Washington. In the matchup, Abdullah collected 120 yards from scrimmage (63 rush, 57 receiving) and Riddick garnered 108 total yards (45 rush, 63 receiving), marking the first time since Nov. 28, 2013 (vs. GB: Reggie Bush, 182; Joique Bell, 128) that the Lions had two running backs total over 100 yards from scrimmage in a game.

Prior to Walker's time in Detroit, he served as the offensive coordinator at Carmel High School in Indiana for one season (2015)

Walker began his NFL career in 2011, when he joined the Indianapolis Colts' staff as the running backs coach for four seasons (2011-14). In his last season with the Colts, Walker helped RB Donald Brown lead the team with 537 rushing yards, a career-high six touchdowns and a 5.3 rushing average, the highest average by a Colts player since 1961.

In 2012, Walker's group averaged 27.5 rushing attempts and 104.4 rushing yards per game that season, the most for the team since 2007.


Prior to his time in Indianapolis, Walker spent six seasons at the University of Pittsburgh as the team's running backs coach (2004-10). While with the Panthers, Walker helped RB Dion Lewis and RB Ray Graham combine for more than 1,900 rushing yards in 2010. From 2007-08, he also worked with RB LeSean McCoy as he earned Big East Offensive Player of the Year in 2008

Walker's coaching career began at Carol City High School in Miami, Fla., where he worked as an assistant coach for the 1994 season before moving back to his alma mater, Syracuse, becoming the school's running backs coach, a position he held from

Walker played football for Syracuse University where he excelled at running back. He finished his collegiate career with 2.643 rushing vards, which marked the fourth best total in school history when he graduated.

Walker was born in Rochester, N.Y. He and his wife, Marilin, have two sons, Jalen and Jordan.





ILLIAMS **EFENSIVE QUALITY CONTROL**

School: West Chester Hometown: Chester, Pa. Birthday: Feb. 2, 1992

Ronell Williams enters his fourth season as a defensive quality control coach with the Bears in 2022 after being hired by the club on January 18, 2019.

Williams re-joined the Bears as a defensive quality control coach in 2019 after being hired by the club in 2018 when he was brought on during training camp as part of the NFL's Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship.

Prior to his arrival in Chicago, Williams completed his second year as a defensive analyst at Temple in 2018, guiding a defense that led the American Athletic Conference in interceptions (18) and was second in sacks (36) across 13 games. Williams spent the 2016 season at Widener University as an assistant coach, working primarily with the linebackers.

The former linebacker was a four-year letterman at Division II West Chester University where he led the team in tackles for three straight seasons (2011-13). He became the first sophomore and third defensive player in school history to earn first-team All-America honors by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) in 2012.



OUNG **ENSIVE QUALITY CONTROL**

School: Willamette University Hometown: Oakland, Calif. Birthday: Sept. 3, 1983

Omar Young is in his first season with the Bears as an offensive quality control coach in 2022.

Young joins the Bears with 13 years of coaching experience, including three in the NFL with two additional years of experience on the NFL personnel side. He joins the Bears after most recently serving as the running backs & co-special teams coordinator at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, Ill.

This past season in 2021, Young completed his third year with the Panthers and his second as the team's running backs & special teams coordinator after spending the 2019 season as an assistant.

Prior to his time at EIU, Young was an offensive quality control coach with the Green Bay Packers, a position he held for two years during the 2017-18 seasons, crossing paths with Bears offensive coordinator, Luke Getsy, who was a wide receivers coach during the 2017 season.

Young joined the University of South Carolina football staff in February 2016 as an analyst. Prior to his arrival in Columbia, he served as an offensive intern assisting with the running backs for the Cleveland Browns in 2015.

Young's first full-time coaching role at the Division I level came at the University of Colorado from 2013-14, tutoring the special teams and defensive units as the team's director of quality control. He spent the two prior seasons as a graduate assistant at SJSU, again working with the special teams in addition to handling the Spartans' quality control duties.

Prior to his arrival in San Jose, Young gained experience at both the Division II and junior college levels. In 2010 he served as the secondary coach and special teams coordinator at Minnesota State Moorhead University and in 2009 he was the receivers coach at De Anza (Calif.) College.

Young gained scouting experience during the 2007-08 seasons working as an intern in the player personnel departments for the Oakland Raiders (NFL) and San Jose SaberCats of the Arena Football League.

While completing his undergraduate degree at Savannah State University, he worked as a student assistant and video coordinator for the football program, essentially starting his coaching career path in 2004. Young first attended Willamette University in Salem, Ore., where played two years as a defensive back. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in history from Savannah State University in 2005 and earned his master's in sport management from the University of San Francisco in 2008.

Young is married to the former Noel McCargar.





Tim Zetts is in his first season as assistant tight ends coach for the Bears in 2022.

Zetts brings 14 years of coaching experience to Chicago, with his most recent stop coming in Green Bay, where he served as an offensive assistant for the Packers during the 2021 season.

This past season in 2021, with Zetts' assistance, the Packers won the NFC North and claimed the NFC's No. 1 playoff seed for the second-consecutive season. Zetts helped oversee a Packers offense that allowed quarterback Aaron Rodgers to orchestrate an MVP-caliber season comprised of 37 touchdown passes and just four interceptions while compiling a league-best 111.9 passer rating. Rodgers led the league in passing touchdown percentage (7%) and tied Dak Prescott and Patrick Mahomes for the fourth most passing touchdowns (37). Zetts also assisted with wide receiver Davante Adams' success, who finished third in the league in receiving yards with 1,553. The Packers' offense also ranked in the league's top-10 in total scoring and receiving yards, tied the Bengals for sixth with 54 total touchdowns and finished ninth in receiving yards (4,526).

Prior to joining the Packers, Zetts spent two seasons (2019-20) at Austin Peay State University in Clarkesville, Tenn., where he served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Zetts led Austin Peay's offense during an abbreviated fall football schedule before the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) season was postponed until the spring of 2021. In his first season with the Governors in 2019, AP's offense led the Ohio Valley Conference in scoring offense (34.1 ppg), fewest sacks allowed (14) and third-down percentage (41.7) while finishing No. 2 in total offense (414.1 ypg), rushing offense (175.6 ypg) and pass efficiency (139.0). Austin Peay finished the season with 11 total wins (No. 1 in program history), won the OVC for the first time since 1977 and advanced to the FCS quarterfinals.

Zetts served as an assistant wide receivers/offensive skill quality control coach for Mississippi State University in 2018. At MSU, he coached alongside Bears' offensive coordinator Luke Getsy, who was in his first season as offensive coordinator for the Bulldogs. The Bulldogs' offense finished the year tied for No. 1 in the FBS with only three fumbles lost while also tying for No. 3 in the country with just nine total fumbles.

Prior to his stop in Mississippi, Zetts spent three seasons as a quarterbacks coach, including stops at Davidson College (2017), John Caroll University (2016, where he also served as an offensive coordinator) and Mercyhurst University (2015).

Zetts spent the 2012-14 seasons at Fordham while serving as the Rams' running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. While with the Rams, Zetts mentored running back Chase Edmonds, a fourth-round selection (No. 134 overall) by the Arizona Cardinals in the 2018 NFL Draft.

Before arriving Fordham, Zetts joined Getsy on the coaching staff at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, serving for one season (2011) as the running backs coach while also assisting with the kickoff return, punt return and field goal units for the Crimson Hawks.

Zetts began his coaching career at his alma mater, the University of Akron, serving as an offensive student assistant and assistant quarterback coach during the 2008-09 seasons. Zetts then went on to spend the 2010 season as an offensive quality control coach at California University of Pennsylvania.

Zetts played quarterback at Akron during the 2005-06 seasons, backing up Getsy as the Zips won the Mid-American Conference title in 2005. Zetts left Akron prior to the 2007 season to transfer to Saginaw Valley State. After suffering a knee injury, he returned to Akron to begin his coaching career as a student assistant in 2008-09. Zetts graduated from Akron with a degree in business and organization communications.

Zetts is a Youngstown, Ohio native. He and his wife Kellyn, have two sons, Dawson and Micah.



JIM ARTHUR Head Strength & Conditioning

Jim Arthur is in his first season as the team's head strength and conditioning coach in 2022 and this 12th overall with the Bears. Arthur possesses 20 years of NFL experience, including 11 in Chicago where he worked on the Bears' strength and conditioning staff from 2005-15.

Arthur completed his sixth season with the Miami Dolphins in 2021 after he was hired as assistant strength and conditioning coach on Jan. 25, 2016.

Prior to Miami, Arthur worked 11 seasons with the Bears' strength and conditioning staff, including seven as the team's strength and conditioning coach (2008-14). During his tenure, the Bears were 2006 NFC Champions and advanced to the NFC Championship Game in 2010.

Prior to Chicago, Arthur spent three years (2002-04) as a strength and conditioning assistant with the Buffalo Bills, where he first worked with his mentor, Rusty Jones. He also interned at Louisiana Tech during the summer of 2001 and at Boston College while finishing his master's degree in 2002.

Arthur began his coaching career at his alma mater, Springfield College, working as a student assistant until his graduation in 2000. He was also a graduate assistant for two seasons, where he earned his master's degree in applied exercise science in 2002.

A native of Cheshire, Conn., Arthur and his wife, Kendra, have a son, Rhett.



NOBLE LANDRY Assistant Strength & Conditioning

Noble Landry is in his first season as assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Chicago Bears

Landry comes to Chicago with six years of strength and conditioning experience, including three seasons in the NFL. Prior to his arrival in Chicago, Landry served as a strength and conditioning intern for the Indianapolis Colts for two seasons (2019-20) before being promoted to strength and conditioning assistant for the 2021 season.

A graduate of Denison University, Landry began his strength and conditioning career interning with the university in 2018. He then went on to work as a strength coach for Allegiate and assistant football coach at Orange Lutheran High School in Orange, Calif. In 2019, he spent a season working for Ohio State University as a strength and conditioning intern.



JIMMY MANGIERO Assistant Strength & Conditioning

Jimmy Mangiero is in his first season as assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Chicago Bears.

Mangiero joins the Bears with 11 years of strength and conditioning experience, including three seasons in the NFL. He most recently served as the assistant strength and conditioning coach alongside Bears head strength and conditioning coach Jim Arthur in Miami for three seasons (2019-21)

Prior to joining the Dolphins, Mangiero was the assistant head strength and conditioning coach for Boston College for six seasons (2012-17) before his promotion to associate head strength and conditioning coach during his final season (2018). Mangiero began his strength and conditioning career in 2011, after being named Temple University's assistant strength and conditioning coach. He also spent one season (2010) coaching the tight ends for Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove, Pa.

Mangiero is married to his wife, Paige, who is an athletic trainer. He is the son of Dino and Jamie Mangiero and has two brothers, Danny, and Chris. He played offensive line at Hofstra University.





JEFF KING Co-Director of Player Personnel

Jeff King was promoted to co-director of player personnel in May 2022.

King's promotion comes after spending the past two seasons as director of pro scouting with the Bears. After spending the 2015 season as a scouting intern for the Bears, King was hired full-time in 2016 as a pro scout before being elevated to assistant director of pro scouting in 2019.

Most recently, King was instrumental in helping the Bears sign 13 unrestricted free agents from other teams this offseason: quarterback Trevor Siemian; receivers Byron Pringle and Equanimeous St. Brown; fullback Khari Blasingame; center Lucas Patrick; guard Dakota Dozier; tight end Ryan Griffin; defensive tackle Justin Jones; defensive end Al-Quadin Muhammad; linebackers Nicholas Morrow and Matt Adams: cornerback Tayon Young and safety Dane Cruikshank.

King also helped the Bears sign two key free agents last August in linebacker Alec Ogletree and left tackle Jason Peters, both of whom emerged as valuable contributors and combined to make 31 of a possible 34 starts for the Bears in 2021.

A second-team All-ACC selection at Virginia Tech, King was selected by the Panthers in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft. The Virginia native played seven NFL seasons, five in Carolina followed by two with the Cardinals, appearing in 108 games with 84 starts and catching 156 passes for 1,323 yards and 12 touchdowns.

He was originally drafted by Baltimore in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft. Young has competed in 50 games with 24 starts across his career, totaling 122 tackles, 4.0 sacks, four interceptions, 16 passes defensed, 11 TFL, six OBH and four fumble recoveries.

Bears President & CEO Ted Phillips led the franchise to one of the team's greatest off-field achievements with the construction of the Lakefront Improvement Plan which included the new football stadium within the confines of historic Soldier Field. The Bears are entering their 20th season in the new stadium, playing the inaugural campaign in 2003. The aggressive construction schedule lasted just 20 months from the Bears last home game of the 2001 season (vs. PHI, Jan. 19, 2002) until re-opening against Green Bay on Sept. 29, 2003. The project earned many honors for design excellence and was named Midwest Construction magazine's overall Project of the Year in 2003.

- November, 2000: Bears President and CEO Ted Phillips and his team of experts answer questions and concerns of the Illinois General Assembly at the State Capitol. After three days of gathering support, the Illinois House and Senate passed Bill 1284 on Nov. 30, 2000, authorizing the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority to issue approximately \$406 million in bonds to help finance the \$630 million project. The debt service on the bonds were paid from the surplus and projected growth of the existing two percent Chicago local hotel tax plus a local distributive tax and state hotel tax subsidy. The remaining \$200 million was contributed by the Chicago Bears, including a \$100 million loan from the National Football League
- Nov. 15, 2000: The City of Chicago's Lakefront Improvement Plan was announced publicly by Mayor Richard M. Daley. The project replaced parking lots with 17 acres of new parkland, built an underground parking structure to serve the Museum Campus and Soldier Field, created easier access to the Museum Campus and added other amenities giving Chicagoans and tourists the ability to enjoy the lakefront year-round.
- Jan. 5, 2001: Gov. George Ryan signed House Bill 1284, designed to help fund a new stadium and enhance Chicago's lakefront.

The following is a number of facts concerning different elements of the Soldier Field project and the Lakefront Initiative:

LAKEFRONT IMPROVEMENTS

The project created approximately 17 acres of additional waterfront parkland for public enjoyment. This green space was programmed for year-round public uses such as a sledding hill, winter garden, a terraced park, an area for outdoor museum exhibits and other features. The year-round parking facility created 2,500 new underground parking spaces immediately adjacent to the Field Museum and Shedd Aquarium and 3,100 outdoor spaces between the stadium and McCormick Place to ensure Chicago's great tailgating tradition continues.

SOLDIER FIELD IMPROVEMENTS

The stadium features increased sideline seating from 40% of seats to over 60%, an increased number of new and improved restrooms (over 1,000 restroom fixtures) plus more variety and access at over 350 concession points of sale, three-level United Club lounge, a Bears Ring of Honor throughout the mezzanine level, a Bears Den gallery depicting historical events from Soldier Field's past and a bas-relief of George Halas.

Above and beyond the Bears games, Soldier Field is capable of hosting an increasing number of athletic events, prime concerts, and large civic, cultural and educational gatherings. The unique design allows for easy stage setup and takedown, along with a field that can accommodate international soccer events.

FUNDING THE LAKEFRONT IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Bears made a \$224 million contribution to this project, pay annual rent of \$5.7 million and accepted the cost overrun risks on the project. The entire cost of the Lakefront Project (\$630 million) was raised without asking for taxpayers' money. The plan was supported through a local City of Chicago hotel tax. There was no extension or increase of any taxes and the hotel tax was principally paid by visitors and tourists.

PRESERVING HISTORY

The historic colonnades and historic South Wall remained untouched as the new stadium was built within the existing exterior of Soldier Field. The Memorial Water Wall honors all soldiers who have served in the United States Armed Forces.





The Wall serves as an educational piece for families and visitors of the museum campus. A Doughboy statue was erected at the entrance of Gate O and the south concourse features a Medal of Honor tribute.

Following 31 seasons of football along the shores of Lake Michigan (pictured, top-left), the Bears took a brief oneyear hiatus from Soldier Field in 2002, playing home games at Memorial Stadium in Champaign so construction of the new Soldier Field (right) could be completed. The first game in the new stadium was Sept. 29, 2003 against division rival Green Bay. The Bears first season at the old venue was in 1971 after spending 50 seasons at Wrigley Field. Soldier Field was opened in 1924 as a 45,000-seat Municipal Grant Park Stadium. The first football game played on its field was Nov. 22, 1924, as a capacity crowd watched Notre Dame edge Northwestern, 13-6.

It hosted the first boxing event which drew a gate of over \$2.5 million (Dempsey-Tunney, 1927), the first ski meet held in a stadium, and the all-time largest football crowd (123,000). The largest crowd for any event in Soldier Field was 260,000 on Sept. 8, 1954, for the Catholic Church's Marian Year Tribute.

The 100,000-seat stadium was dedicated November 27, 1926, with Army battling Navy to a 21-21 tie. The all-time collegiate attendance record of 123,000-plus was established Nov. 26, 1927 as Notre Dame beat Southern Cal 7-6. In the first professional game at the then-mammoth stadium, the Bears defeated the Chicago Cardinals 10-0 on November 11, 1926.


Plans for the stadium started in 1919 as a memorial to the soldiers of WWI. Soldier Field stood on 10,000 pile foundations driving an average depth of 62.5 feet through fill that replaced the lake waters. The new stadium continues to be owned, maintained and operated by the Chicago Park District.

Other stadium notes since the Bears moved to Soldier Field:


- 1971 Sept. 19, Chicago defeats the Pittsburgh Steelers 17-15 before capacity crowd of 55,701 in the Bears' first game since moving from Wrigley.
- 1979 The stadium undergoes major reconstruction and renovation prior to the season including new lighting, playing surface, and locker rooms; rebuilding of seating area (new chairbacks, armrests, seats); and improvement of sightlines.
- 1982 Additional rebuilding of seating areas was completed as well as new concourses with more restrooms and concession areas. A new press box, 60 deluxe skyboxes, and a new scoreboard were also built. Capacity is increased to 66,030.
- 1988 Surface was changed from artificial turf to natural grass, and 56 skyboxes were added along south rim (increasing the total to 116). Capacity is increased to 66,946.
- 1992 Four seats are added increasing the capacity to 66,950.
- 1994 The Park District spends millions to refurbish the stadium for the World Cup soccer tournament. Capacity is reduced by six to 66,944.
- 2000 Mayor Daley announces Lakefront Redevelopment Project (11/15).
- 2001 Project receives state and city approval.
- 2002 Demolition begins on stadium immediately following playoff game (1/19).
- 2003 Bears return to Soldier Field with Monday night re-opening on September 29 against Green Bay. Capacity is set at 61,500, over 5,000 fewer seats than the old stadium and the second smallest venue in the NFL
- 2019 Two days before kicking off the NFL's 100th season, statues of George Halas and Walter Payton were unveiled during a private ceremony outside the south end of Soldier Field. The statues are 12-feet tall and weigh 3,000 pounds.



On Sept. 5, 2019 the Bears hosted the Packers to kick off the NFL's 100th season. Soldier Field provides one of the most stunning and iconic backdrops in the NFL with its unique sightlines of the city and lakefront.



BEARS



On Sept. 3, 2019 – two days before the Bears kicked off their 100th season – two of the franchise's most legendary Hall of Famers were honored outside Soldier Field when statues of George S. Halas and Walter Payton were unveiled during a private ceremony outside Gate O at the south end of the stadium. Created by sculptor Chad Fisher, the statues are 12-feet tall and weigh 3,000 pounds.



Located on the west side of the stadium on the street-level main concourse, the bas-relief sculpture marks the gateway for a stadium visitor's trip through the history of the Chicago Bears.

Pure and simple, he loved this game that was as uncluttered and uncompromising as he was. Its requirements were courage, endurance, self-discipline and a competitive spirit. These were his prerequisites, too.

His teams played the game the same way he didtough, aggressive and smart.

Often graced by a running back of exceptional ability, the Bears were always marked by a punishing defense that never stopped coming at you.

George Halas was a founder of the NFL and a pioneer of the Chicago Bears. His devotion to both over the decades helped them grow to prominence.

We will always remember his energy, his joy in competing, and his passion for his beloved Bears and Bear fans.

The bas-relief is a time-line describing George Halas' contribution to the world of football and the history of the Chicago Bears.

Hall of Famers date back from the 1920's when George Halas founded the Chicago Bears, and represent different decades of team history.

The tremendous energy and influence of the two large George Halas reliefs tells the story and balances all of the action. George S. Halas is without doubt the overriding presence in the sculpture.

The laser-etched imagery shows the team in the 1920's - also Halas and his team celebrating a 1940's win against the Washington Redskins, fan images from Wrigley Field, a photo of Halas with George Jr. and Paddy Driscoll, and a fan grouping from the 1980's. Integrated in the composition is the famous "T" formation that George Halas invented.

THE DOUGHBOY STATUE

Just inside Gate 0 in the Grand Concourse stands the restored Doughboy Statue. Originally installed in Chicago's Garfield Park in the early 1930s, four decades later it was damaged, debased, but not forgotten. Chicago sculpture conservator Andrzej Dajnowski meticulously recast the missing parts and refurbished the entire statue and base to its original condition and it joins the other memorials to the American fighting men and women at Soldier Field.





THE MEMORIAL WATER WALL

The Memorial Water Wall, a 280-foot long wall of polished green granite with eight medallions honoring the different branches of the armed services, flanks the walkway that leads into the north entrance of the stadium. A veil of water continuously flows over the sculptured memorial.



The Chicago Bears moved into Halas Hall at Conway Park on March 3, 1997. The 38-acre complex is located in Lake Forest off of Route 60 just east of the Tri-State Tollway, approximately four miles from the former Halas Hall. The building is dedicated to Bears' founder, president and coach George Halas. The original Halas Hall, on the Lake Forest College campus, was dedicated by coach Halas in the name of his son, Mugs, in 1979.

The complex underwent a construction project following the 2012 season to expand and upgrade the Bears headquarters to enhance the football and business operations while providing new opportunities and experiences for fans,

The upgrade increased the 100,000-square facility with an additional 43,500-square feet of working space to accompany two outdoor practice fields, surrounded by a jogging path. One of the now four 100-yard outdoor fields is equipped with 14 miles of underground heating tubes, enabling the grass to remain soft and growing into early winter, as well as five miles of drain tubing that can capture and disperse nine inches of rainfall per hour and 2.5 miles of cooling pipes for the grass roots.

A state-of-the-art event center includes a 4,000-square foot broadcast studio and conference center that can host as many as 200 people for both events and original programming. The two-level entryway to the event center features interactive digital displays, video monitors and memorabilia, including some never-before featured pieces of Bears history such as the 1963 NFL championship trophy. A new press conference room and a relocated media

ED McCASKEY MEMORIAL GARDEN AND THE WALTER PAYTON CENTER

The team's indoor practice facility, the Walter Payton Center, was renovated during the summer of 2005 while construction of the Ed McCaskey Memorial Garden was completed in June, 2005.

The Walter Payton Center is a rigid structure, opposed to the inflated "bubble" the team used from 1990-96, and includes a full 100-yard field. The structure is 85 feet high, 200 feet wide and 400 feet long. The renovation included removal of the existing fabric roof and cladding on the outside of the building, replacement of the end walls and installation of a new, state-of-the-art synthetic turf and two-lane running track. A new heating and de-humidification system was also installed. The Bears renamed the indoor facility during a ceremony on Thursday, April 6, 2000.

Located south of Halas Hall, the Ed McCaskey Memorial Garden is a beautifully landscaped, clover-leaf-shaped garden bordered by a 30" stone seat wall and piers. A winding gravel road from Halas Hall leads to the opening of the garden where a variety of trees, shrubs and perennials have been planted.









Halas Hall includes a state-of-the-art broadcast studio and joining conference center allowing the team to bring in studio audiences for live programming.

courtyard was also added along with increased work space for media members.

The previous Halas Hall on the campus of Lake Forest College had 32,000 square feet of space, while the new building after the newest renovations (see pages 454-455) has over 300,000. In fact, the entire former Halas Hall would fit into the basement of the new building.

The Bears also added a practice viewing suite in 2013 on the second level of Halas Hall. The 40-person suite overlooks the team's practice fields and features many of the amenities of game suites at Soldier Field. A new kitchen and dining facility, including an outdoor patio was also added. Additional conference room and staff offices were also added throughout Halas Hall.

The Bears headquarters also has a new entry into the main lobby and 105 additional parking spaces. The architectural style is consistent with that of the original building. A main focal point is the entry point to the main lobby, featuring the classic Bears "C" on an impressive portico.

DIRECTIONS TO HALAS HALL

FROM THE LOOP – Take 90/94 (Kennedy Expressway) west to 94 north (Edens Expressway). Continue on 94 (the "spur"), which becomes the Tri-state Tollway. Exit at Town Line Road (IL Route 60) and turn right (east). Take a left at the first light, which is Field Drive. (The next light is Field Court; you can also make a left there and proceed around its bend until it merges with Field Drive). Drive about 1.2 miles north along Field Drive. Turn gently right onto Football Drive (the last road on your right) and proceed to the entry gate.

FROM O'HARE AIRPORT - Take 294 (the Tri-state Tollway) north. Exit at Town Line Road (IL Route 60), turn right (east), and proceed as directed.





In November 2017 the Bears announced a partnership with global design and architecture firm HOK to design a 162,500-square-foot football operations addition to the already-existing 143,000-square-foot Halas Hall and a 30,600-square-foot remodeling project on the northeast side of the building -- bringing the total square footage of Halas Hall to more than 300,000.


The magnitude of the project, which broke ground in March 2018, was completed in the fall of 2019 in time for the start of the Bears' 100th season. It has completely transformed the look and feel of all existing team space and provides even greater resources for the team's training and performance needs. The initial phase of the expansion project focused on enhancement of the team's football operations, including player training, education, performance, nutrition and rehabilitation.

The addition features a 13,000-square-foot indoor turf space for training and walkthroughs with a 133x26 video projection wall and adjacent virtual reality room, in addition to a 2,000-square-foot weight room expansion. Also included is an improved equipment room, recovery space and nutrition/fuel station that doubles the current size while the sports medicine space is four times larger than the old area and features a hydrotherapy pool.

Position meeting rooms and the draft room have doubled in capacity, while coaching offices have increased by 50 percent and allow for improved collaboration. A 3,250-square-foot player's lounge and separate huddle space also was created, along with an approximately 1,700-square-foot player locker room and a larger coaches/scouts locker room.

The team and staff café was expanded by 4,300-square-feet to support the organization's growth, as well as providing new food offerings. Basement storage space also has increased through the expansion.


Additionally, two additional football fields were added at the start of the 2018 season on the east side of the Walter Payton Center, which will allow the team to spread out the field use over four fields throughout the offseason and during in-season practices. That project also called for the addition of a training slope, a storage facility and a small practice viewing suite, much like the existing viewing suite used at Halas Hall for corporate partners and other VIP guests.

Bears training camp returned to Lake Forest for the first time in 36 years in 2020. The club moved camp to Halas Hall, the team's state-of-the-art facility north of Chicago.

The Bears are conducting training camp at Halas Hall for the foreseeable future, ending their 18-year stint at Olivet Nazarene University in Bourbonnais after the 2019 season. Prior to that, the Bears held camp at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville for 18 summers from 1984-2001. Prior to 2020, the last time the Bears held training camp in Lake Forest was in 1983 at the old Halas Hall facility on the campus of Lake Forest College.

Jeff Joniak, a 2019 Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame inductee, enters his 22nd season as the play-by-play voice of the Bears and 26th year as one of the hosts of the Bears pregame show which starts three hours prior to kickoff. Former Bear Tom Thayer, a 26-year Bears radio veteran, adds color commentary and insight. The postgame show from the locker room features exclusive analysis from head coach Matt Eberflus and key players from the game. Bears fans can also find special insight and analysis of the Bears at www.CBSChicago.com/Bears and ChicagoBears.com.

The Bears radio staff earned 2007 and 2012 Peter Lisagor Awards and the Associated Press Award for "Best Sports Reporting" (for coverage of Super Bowl XLI), the Silver Dome Award for "Best Play-by-Play" in 2006 and a 2007 and 2012 regional RTNDA Edward R. Murrow Award for the Bears Radio pre-game feature "Joniak's Journal". Additionally, Joniak hosts "The Bears Coaches Show" radio program on WBBM with Bears head coach Matt Eberflus each Monday night during the season. On game days, Joniak and Bears analyst Tom Thayer co-host Bears-produced television shows, "Bears Game Day Live" and "Bears Game Night Live" for which the duo earned Chicago Midwest Emmy awards in 2009 and 2012.

JEFF JONIAK: One of the more energetic and exciting voices of the National Football League, Jeff Joniak enters his 22nd season behind the microphone as the play-by-play voice of the Chicago Bears. Joniak's passion for the game and for the Bears is linked to a 36-year association with Chicago sports fans. Joniak has hosted Chicago Bears game day broadcasts since 1997 and serves as WBBM Newsradio 780 and 105.9 FM's director of sports operations while maintaining his afternoon drive-time sports anchor shifts. Throughout the year, Joniak serves as master of ceremonies for many different events related to his work with the Bears including the National Football Foundation Scholarship Awards ceremony, the Ed Block Courage Award ceremony, Lurie Children's Hospital annual fundraising event and the annual Bears Care Gala. Before tackling Halas Hall, Joniak co-hosted the gameday broadcasts for the Chicago Bulls during their championship years from 1991 to 1996. For the gripping coverage of the death of Walter Payton, Joniak and his staff won a prestigious Peter Lisagor Award. He also won two Lisagor awards for his coverage of the NFL Draft, AP awards for his sportscasts and Bears pre-game features. In Sept. 2019, Joniak was inducted into the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame.

TOM THAYER: Originally a Bears' fourth-round draft pick in 1983 after an All-America career at Notre Dame, Tom Thayer played for three seasons with the USFL's Chicago Blitz and Arizona Wranglers before joining the Bears. One of the team's strongest players, Thayer earned his starting role at right guard four games into the 1985 season and eventually compiled consecutive game and consecutive start streaks that led the Bears during the late 1980s. Thayer left the Bears in 1992 after a distinguished eight-year career at offensive guard. He retired in 1993 after one season with the Miami Dolphins. Before joining the Bears radio team in 1997, Thayer worked for two years as a Bears analyst on WFLD-TV's pro football programming. A former all-state lineman at Joliet Catholic High, Thayer resides in Chicago.

MARK GROTE: Entering his fifth season on the broadcast team, Mark Grote is the Bears reporter for 670 The Score and works the sidelines for WBBM Newsradio game broadcasts. He also participates as a host on the Score on a regular basis. Prior to joining the Bears, Grote was the pre and post game host from 2015-2017 on Chicago Cubs broadcasts and was thrilled to be on the air in 2016 just moments after the Cubs won their first World Series since 1908. Born and raised in Chicago's western suburbs, Grote is an Illinois State University graduate. He worked in the Illinois communities of Lincoln, Peoria and Springfield on his way to being hired as a sports anchor/reporter for WBBM in 2002. While at WBBM Grote covered many historic local sporting events, including traveling with the University of Illinois basketball team when the Illini reached the 2005 NCAA Championship game. Later that same year Grote was in Houston when the White Sox won their first World Series in 88 years. Grote was also part of WBBM's coverage of several Bulls and Blackhawks playoff series interviewing players and reporting live on the radio. In 2009, he joined the Score as a full-time contributor to the station's popular morning show. Grote lives in Chicago.
