CREDENTIALS: All working members of the media are required to have a press pass. Requests for credentials must be made at least 24 hours prior to game time. Credentials will only be issued to legitimate working media and will be made available at the Jumbo Shrimp Will Call area near the box office. Season credentials are issued to news agencies that cover the Jumbo Shrimp on a daily basis.

Media credentials issued by the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp are deemed as nontransferable personal licenses and must be clearly displayed at all times. The credential provides evidence that the bearer has been authorized to enter as a working member of the media. The credential is the property of the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and is revocable by the Jumbo Shrimp staff at any time. The bearer of Jumbo Shrimp media credentials: 1) agrees to careful search and inspection of prohibited items and/or confiscation of prohibited items; 2) agrees to comply with all ballpark and Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp rules and regulations; 3) assumes all risks and dangers incidental to attendance at the events, whether occurring prior to, during, or after the events; 4) understands that the requesting of autographs or equipment from players and coaches is strictly prohibited and that such requests will result in ejection and confiscation of credential

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers will receive a pass that will allow for photography throughout the stadium, provided it does not interfere with the action on the field or with a fan's view of the game. A photography pit is located in each of the home and away dugouts on the far ends closest to the outfield. Photographers are required to stay within the specified areas of the ballpark. There is no photography of any kind allowed in the clubhouse.

ON-FIELD INTERVIEWS: Players and coaches will be made available for interviews during batting practice, provided that it does not interfere with pregame work. <u>All interview requests</u> for on-field interviews must be coordinated and cleared with the Jumbo Shrimp media relations staff prior to arrival at the ballpark. Media must exit the field of play no later than 30 minutes prior to game time unless otherwise authorized.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Following each Jumbo Shrimp home game, <u>UPON REQUEST TO THE JUMBO SHRIMP MEDIA RELATIONS STAFF</u>, players and coaches may be available for interview after games.

PRESS BOX: Members of the media may access the Jumbo Shrimp press box. Game notes, team stats, starting lineups, starting pitcher day-to-day stats, rosters, transactions and other pertinent information will be made available to the media prior to and during each game in the press box. Wireless internet access is available; contact the Jumbo Shrimp media relations staff for information.

OWNER & CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER



Ken Babby, a native of Potomac, Maryland, is the founder of Fast Forward Sports Group, owning the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (AAA) and Akron RubberDucks (AA) minor league baseball teams.

Before founding Fast Forward Sports Group, Babby spent 13 years on the business side of The Washington Post, starting as a summer intern, rising to the role of Chief Revenue Officer of Washington Post Media and General Manager of Washington Post Digital. Ken oversaw the company's \$500M in annual advertising revenue and led the Post into the digital era overseeing all aspects of the company's digital, mobile and video strategy and operations. The entrepreneurial growth of Post's digital business and national growth caught the attention of Amazon Founder Jeff Bezos, who acquired the media company in 2012.

In September 2015, Babby purchased the Jacksonville Suns, Southern League affiliate of the Miami Marlins. He invested

more than \$3 million into fan areas at the Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville before rebranding the team as the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp after the 2016 season. In the inaugural season as the Jumbo Shrimp, attendance increased by more than 61,000 - the most of any Double-A ballpark and a ballpark-record 23 percent – to more than 325,000 for the first time in seven years. The Jumbo Shrimp won the Southern League's Organization of the Year. In 2021, the Miami Marlins selected Jacksonville as their new AAA affiliate a testament to continued benefits of community and facility investment.

Babby purchased the Akron Aeros, Eastern League affiliate of the Cleveland Indians, in October 2012, and rebranded the team as the Akron RubberDucks after the 2013 season. Babby has privately invested more than \$8 million in Canal Park, which has welcomed more than 340,000 fans each of the past four seasons. In 2015, Akron earned the Larry MacPhail Award for the most outstanding and creative marketing and promotional efforts in Minor League Baseball. In 2016, Akron hosted the franchise's firstever Eastern League All-Star Game and was the Eastern League nominee for the John H. Johnson President's Award, Minor League Baseball's top award for an organization. Since Babby's acquisition, the franchise has grown average attendance by 38%. In 2019, as recognition of the club's successes in the community the Sports Business Journal named Akron a Top 10 minor league sports city in the US.

Ken was named to Sports Business Journal's coveted "Forty Under 40, list in 2016. For the growth of the Akron franchise, he was a winner of the EY Entrepreneur of the Year® 2017 Award in the Northeast Ohio region. Ken credits the success of team every step of the way. Akron General Manager and Fast Forward Sports Group President Jim Pfander was the 2016 Eastern League Executive of the Year, and Jacksonville General Manager Harold Craw was the 2017 Southern League Executive of the Year, becoming the first African-American to win Executive of the Year for any league in Minor League Baseball.

Babby's two-fold mission is to create a memorable, unique, affordable and enjoyable fan experience, and maximize the opportunity to create change in the community through charitable, wellness and education initiatives. He serves on numerous boards in Northeast Ohio and Northeast Florida including Baptist Hospitals of Florida and Greater Akron Chamber of Commerce, and trustee at Wheaton College and Jacksonville University. Ken is a graduate of Wheaton College (MA) with an MBA from Johns Hopkins University.

Ken is married to his wife, Liz, and has a teenage son, Josh. Ken's father (Lon) is a long-time sports executive serving as an NBA agent and prior as General Counsel of the Baltimore Orioles, and later President, Basketball Operations at the Phoenix Suns.



HAROLD CRAW

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT/GENERAL MANAGER



Harold Craw, promoted to Executive Vice President / General Manager of the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp in December of 2019, was originally named the General Manager of the Jacksonville Suns in September of 2015, when Fast Forward Sports Group, LLC, officially took ownership of the Southern League club. In 2017, Craw became the first African-American to win Executive of the Year for any league in Minor League Baseball. He was voted the 2017 Southern League Jimmy Bragan Executive of the Year by the general managers of the league member clubs.

After helping the franchise draw nationwide attention following its Nov. 2, 2016 rebrand, Craw oversaw an incredible 23 percent increase in attendance

for the inaugural Jumbo Shrimp season in 2017, the largest increase for any Double-A club. The success carried over to the following campaign, as the July 3, 2018 crowd of 11,762 was the largest at the Baseball Grounds in 10 years and the four crowds over 8,700 were the four largest in the Southern League in 2018. The Jumbo Shrimp's average attendance of 5,037 in 2018 also marked the first time in eight years that Jacksonville has averaged at least 5,000 fans in consecutive seasons.

With 19 seasons of Minor League Baseball experience, Craw oversees marketing and sales, community engagement, game-day experience, and all other operational aspects of the organization at the dawn of a new era of affordable family fun at 121 Financial Ballpark.

A native of Chattanooga, Tenn., Craw graduated from Emory and Henry College (Va.) with a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education, and he earned a Master's Degree in Sport Management from East Tennessee State University in 2001. He started his Minor League Baseball career in 2002 with the Johnson City (Tenn.) Cardinals as its Director of Stadium Operations. Craw spent more than 10 seasons with the Charleston (S.C.) River Dogs from 2003 to 2012, twice being recognized by the South Atlantic League as Sales Executive of the Year and for community relations. Craw was the General Manager of the Quad Cities River Bandits and a Senior Corporate Sales Executive, and later Assistant General Manager, of the Chattanooga Lookouts before being hired by Fast Forward Sports Group to lead the Suns.

In each community he has lived, Craw has been an active volunteer, including co-founding and cochairing the Charleston RBI Baseball League and mentoring middle school youth through Jacksonville's Duval County Public Schools 5000 Role Models program. He and his wife, Angie, live in Jacksonville with their daughters, Cameron and Jasmine.





NOEL BLAHA

VICE PRESIDENT, MEDIA AND MARKETING



Noel works closely with the General Manager in overseeing the media relations, merchandise and promotions departments, while also playing an integral role in the corporate partnership department. Noel began his tenure as assistant general manager in 2015 before being elevated to Vice President, Marketing and Media in March 2021.

Noel joined the Jacksonville front office in 2015 following 10 seasons with the Charleston (S.C.) RiverDogs as director of marketing, promotions director, box office manager and media relations assistant. With the RiverDogs, Noel helped oversee the 2012 South Atlantic League Home Run Derby from the flight deck of the USS Yorktown - a promotion that won two Minor League Baseball Golden

Bobbleheads. Noel also helped the RiverDogs win the 2013 Larry MacPhail Award for Minor League Baseball's top promotional effort.

A native of Aberdeen, Scotland, Noel earned a bachelor's degree from Cornell (Iowa) College and a master's degree from Bowling Green (Ohio) State University. He has also worked with the Toledo (Ohio) Mud Hens (Triple-A International League), as well as in minor league soccer and hockey.

A Cleveland native, Linda worked in sales for three different southwest Florida radio stations before entering baseball. Linda began her career in baseball in 1994 with the Fort Myers Miracle (Class-A Advanced Florida State League) and the Minnesota Twins' Spring Training. She began as Director of Sales and was later Vice President and President of Miracle Professional Baseball. In 2001, she became a senior officer of the Goldklang Group, and she was awarded the Rawlings Female Executive of the Year, given to an outstanding woman executive by the National

Scott Kornberg joined the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp in November 2018 as a broadcaster and the club's Media and Public Relations Manager. He was named the Jumbo Shrimp's lead broadcaster in February 2020 and was promoted to Director of Broadcasting and Media Relations following the 2021 season. Kornberg works as the primary contact between the media and front office and helps manage the Jumbo Shrimp's presence and coverage on a variety of platforms.

A native of Belle Mead, N.J., Kornberg was the broadcaster and manager of media relations for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans (High-A, Chicago Cubs) from December 2015 through the 2018 season. In 2017, he was named the Carolina League's co-Broadcaster of the Year. Kornberg also worked as the football and men's basketball

radio broadcaster with the Western Illinois University Leathernecks from 2014-18. After eclipsing 1,300 career managerial wins during the 2022 season, Daren Brown returns

as Jacksonville's manager for the second

consecutive campaign.

In Brown's first year with Jacksonville in 2022, the Jumbo Shrimp with an 80-69 (.537) record, placing third in the International League East Division. After stellar performances throughout the season, the Jumbo Shrimp saw 12 players from their roster make their major league debuts. Brown also juggled a franchise-record 79 players, including Jacksonville highs for both pitchers (39) and starting pitchers (25).

A native of Holdenville, Okla., Brown holds a 1,340-1,325 (.503) record as a minor league manager. The 55-year-old is currently in his third stint as a Triple-A skipper. He piloted Triple-A Tacoma in the Seattle Mariners' organization from 2007-13 and again in 2019, tallying 494 victories, which marks the most wins for any manager in Rainiers franchise history. Brown led Tacoma to consecutive division titles in 2009 and 2010, and during that latter season, helped the Rainiers win the

franchise's first outright Pacific Coast League Championship since 1969. Over this time period, Brown also earned a pair of call ups to the Mariners' coaching staff, including a stint as the club's interim manager for the final 50 games of the 2010 season.

After working as Seattle's baserunning coordinator in 2014 and bunting and baserunning coordinator in 2015, Brown steered Double-A Jackson to a 84-55 (.604) record and Southern League Championship in 2016. He skippered Double-A Arkansas during the 2017-18 seasons before returning to Tacoma for the 2019 campaign. In 2021, Brown managed the Kinsport Axmen, a summer collegiate baseball team in the Appalachian League.

The son of former major leaguer Paul Brown, who pitched for parts of four seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies from 1961-63 and 1968, Daren was selected in the 29th round of the 1989 draft out of Southeastern Oklahoma State University. He pitched for five seasons in Toronto's organization from 1989-93, reaching as high as Double-A Knoxville. From 1994-99, Daren served as a player-coach (1994-97) and player-manager (1998-99) for Amarillo of the independent Texas-Louisiana League. He retired as a player following the 1999 season, which saw Brown win the circuit's Manager of the Year and Amarillo take the league championship, and managed the Dillas for one more season.



The Jacksonville Red Caps were a Negro league baseball team that competed in the Negro American League from 1938 until 1942. The team played at Durkee Field, now known as J.P. Small Memorial Stadium, in 1938. They moved to Cleveland in 1939 and became the Cleveland Bears before returning to Jacksonville as the Red Caps in 1941 for two seasons. J.P. Small Memorial Stadium is one of only five Negro leagues ballparks still standing.

JACKSONVILLE HISTORY

Before the First Coast had its own professional baseball team, Jacksonville was already known as a baseball town. In 1888, Jacksonville hosted the first ever Major League Spring Training, as the Washington Statesman hosted the Philadelphia Athletics, Brooklyn Dodgers, Boston Nationals, and the Cincinnati Reds. Jacksonville would continue to host other Major League Spring Trainings for a few more years.

Professional baseball in Jacksonville was founded in 1904, when the Jacksonville Jays became apart of the newly formed South Atlantic League. Jacksonville hosted the first South Atlantic League game on the Southside of Town at Dixieland Park, when the Jays defeated Macon, 1-0. At that time, there were no bridges in Jacksonville, so fans would have to ride ferries across the St. Johns River to attend a game at Dixieland Park.

From 1904 to 1917, Jacksonville won two South Atlantic League titles, with the first coming in 1908 with a record of 77-34, and the second in 1912 after a 70-41 season. During this time period, Jacksonville went through some name changes. In 1911, the team was

known as the Jacksonville Tarpons, and for only the 1917 the team was known as the Jacksonville Roses.

In 1921, there were a few changes for the Jacksonville club, as they found a new home park at Barrs Field, which would later be named Durkee Field (currently known as J.P. Small Park). Jacksonville also changed its name to the Scouts and debut in the Florida State League (Class C). In 1922, the team changed to the Indians. Jacksonville changed its name to the Tars in 1926 and moved to the Southeastern League (Class B). They captured the Southeastern League title in 1927 before rejoining the South Atlantic League in 1936, but this time as a Class B team and then a Class A team in 1946.

Jacksonville joined the Nergo League ranks in 1938 as the Red Caps made their debut in the Negro American League. The team shared Barrs Field with the Tars. The Red Caps left after one season in 1939, but returned for the 1941 and 1942 seasons.

In 1952, Jacksonville officially had a second Minor League team, when the Jacksonville Beach Sea Birds debut in the Florida State League (Class D). The team played at South Penman and Shutter Avenue which was about a mile from the ocean. The Sea Birds lasted for three seasons, leaving after the 1954 season.

In 1953, the Tars were purchased by Samuel W. Wolfson and the team became the

Jacksonville Braves. Along with new ownership and name change, another great part of history happened as future MLB Home Run King Hank Aaron broke the South Atlantic League color barrier playing for the Braves. In his only season in Jacksonville, Aaron made a mark by recording a .362 average, with 22 homeruns, 36 doubles and 14 triples to earn League MVP honors. Aaron made his Major League debut a year later in 1954.

After playing at Durkee Field for more than 30 years, the city opened Jacksonville Municipal Ballpark in 1955, which was later named Wolfson Park. The following year, the Braves won their first and only South Atlantic League Championship. For the 1961 season, Jacksonville played in its final season in the South Atlantic League as the Jets.

In 1962, baseball became hotter in Jacksonville, as the Suns were born under owner Samuel W. Wolfson. The team also transitioned to Triple-A as a member of the International League. The Suns would be affiliated with the Cleveland Indians (1962-1963, 1971), the St. Louis Cardinals (1964-1965), and the New York Mets (1966-1968) during the 1960's. Jacksonville also hosted three future Hall of Famers in this decade as Phil Niekro pitched

in the River City in 1960, Tom Seaver was on the mound for the Suns in 1966 and Nolan Ryan pitched for the club in 1967. Randy Johnson would be the next and only other Hall of Famer to appear for Jacksonville in 1987.

During the 1968 season, the Suns won their only International League Championship in their final season at the Triple-A level. In 1969, Jacksonville was without baseball for the season, but the Suns returned to the diamond in 1970 as a Double-A team in the Southern League. The Suns spent the 1970 season affiliated with the Montreal Expos and affiliated under the Indians once again in 1972. From 1972-1983, the Jacksonville ballclub was affiliated the Kansas City Royals.

A new era of baseball started in 1985, as Peter Bragan Sr. and his family purchased the Jacksonville ballclub. A few changes were to come, as Jacksonville became affiliated with the Montreal Expos and changed the name from the Suns to the Jacksonville Expos. Randy Johnson and future National League MVP Larry Walker would suite up for the Jacksonville Expos during the 1987 season.

Jacksonville remained as the Expos until 1991, when the team again became the Suns and affiliated with the Seattle Mariners (1991-1994). Future Major League stars, Alex Rodriguez and Brett Boone played for the Suns during their Mariners affiliation.

After being a member of the Southern League for over 25 years, the Suns finally captured

their first title in 1996 in their second season affiliated with the Detroit Tigers. The Suns were declared co-Southern League in the 2001 season in their first year as an affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

The Suns played their final season at Wolfson Park in 2002 before moving across the parking lot to the then-newly constructed Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville in 2003. In the stadiums first season, the team set an attendance record of 359,979 and in surpassed that record in 2005 as 420,495 fans walked through the gates.

The then-Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville would be a good luck charm for the Suns as they won three titles in the first seven seasons after the park opened. Jacksonville won the 2005 Southern League Championship before capturing consecutive titles in 2009 and 2010 during the first two seasons as a Miami Marlins affiliate. The 2010 championship was one to remember as the Suns won their first title at home with a walk-off solo home run by Chris Hatcher. In 2014, the Suns rode a hot streak, winning 16 of their final 17 games, to claim their sixth Southern League Championship. Jacksonville also won the 2014 title at home after sweeping the Chattanooga Lookouts, 3-0.

The Bragan Family rounded out their 31-year ownership tenure in 2015 by selling the franchise to Ken Babby of the Fast Forward Sports Group. Following the 2016 season

under Babby, the team would be changed from the Suns to the Jumbo Shrimp. Their

inaugural season garnered the Southern League's Don Mincher Organization of the Year, Promotional Trophy, and Jimmy Bragan Executive of the Year, won by General Manager Harold Craw. They also made the playoffs on the field by winning the second half South Division title.

On November 2, 2016, a new chapter opened in Jacksonville baseball history as the franchise was renamed to the Jumbo Shrimp. As Florida's largest city, yet in

many ways a richly connected and close-knit community, Jacksonville is truly a Big Small Town. It has unique water geography as the River City on the First Coast. The 2017 season was historic, as the Jumbo Shrimp won the Second Half South Division Title before falling to Pensacola in the South Division Championship Series. Their inaugural season also garnered the Southern League's Don Mincher Organization of the Year, Promotional Trophy, and Jimmy Bragan Executive of the Year, won by General Manager Harold Craw.

325,743 fans saw the Jumbo Shrimp play at home in 2017, an attendance jump of 61,342 fans, the largest of any Double-A ballpark from 2016 to 2017, the largest in 121 Financial Ballpark history, and second largest of any ballpark in domestic Minor League Baseball.

Meanwhile, in 2019, the club welcomed a total attendance of 327,388 come through the gates at 121 Financial Ballpark en route to winning their second Southern League Promotional Trophy in three seasons as the Jumbo Shrimp.

In December 2020, the Miami Marlins extended an invitation to the Jumbo Shrimp to become the club's Triple-A affiliate. The move continues a rise for the city of Jacksonville and Northeast Florida, which will now field a Triple-A baseball team for the first time since 1968.

The 2021 Jumbo Shrimp marked the return of Triple-A baseball in the city for the first time since 1968. In a memorable 75-55 season amidst a pandemic, the club recorded 21 wins in their last at-bats, including 11 walk-off victories at 121 Financial Ballpark.
