Credentials: 2023 Rocket City Trash Pandas media credentials will be issued only to accredited media members at the discretion of the Trash Pandas Media staff. Any media wanting to cover an individual game must communicate their intentions to the Trash Pandas no later than 24 hours before the first pitch of any game. Credentials must be visibly worn at all times. In order to obtain a credential, all media members must complete and sign the 2023 Minor League Baseball Terms and Conditions of Credentials for Professional Development League Events.

Photographers: Photo credentials will be issued to legitimate news organizations and to photographers authorized by the Trash Pandas. All photos MUST be for news-gathering purposes or for companies licensed by Major League Baseball/Minor League Baseball. Priority will be given to news organizations on deadline. Photographers are prohibited from placing equipment on the playing field, in the dugout, or in the clubhouse.

Media Entrance: Media may pick up their credentials at the Trustmark VIP Gate at Toyota Field and may enter the ballpark through the VIP gate. All bags are subject to inspection upon entry. Valid photo ID will be needed to pick up credentials. Media will have access to the Northrop Grumman Press Box, but seating is limited.

Clubhouses: Per 2023 rules imposed by Major League Baseball, the clubhouses are off limits to all members of the media at all times.

In-Season Interviews: Before Trash Pandas home games, players and coaches will likely be available for in-person interviews at the conclusion of batting practice (around 4:15 p.m. for a 6:35 p.m. game). Media seeking interviews must submit their request to the Trash Pandas ahead of time. Pre-game interviews will be conducted in the area near the Trash Pandas dugout. No starting pitchers will be made available pre-game on a day in which they are starting. Requests for interviews with players/coaches from visiting teams must go through the visiting team's Media Relations staff.

Postgame Interviews: Following each Trash Pandas home game subject to availability, Trash Pandas Manager Andy Schatzley and select players will be available for interviews. Media wishing to talk to any Trash Pandas player or coach must communicate that request to a member of the Trash Pandas Media Relations staff before the conclusion of the game.

Television Policy: TV stations wishing to have a live pre-game guest for their newscasts must contact the Trash Pandas no later than noon on game days for night games, or by 6 p.m. the day prior to day games. Roving cameras are allowed with permission from the Trash Pandas. Cameras are permitted throughout the public areas but must not block any aisles or the view of any fans. Camera lights may be turned on unless facing the field of play.

Use of Photography/Video: Media outlets needing use of Trash Pandas photography or Trash Pandas video may contact Aaron Cheris. Accredited members of the media may use Trash Pandas photographs for non-endorsement projects only.

Autograph Policy: Under no circumstances are credentialed media members permitted to seek autographs, foul balls, or other baseball equipment at any point. Members of the media found to be in violation of this policy may have their credentials revoked by a member of the Trash Pandas staff.

*All Media guidelines for the 2023 are subject to change at any point and for any reason.

Josh Caray will handle the play-by-play for all 138 games for the 2023 season, as well as pre-game and post-game broadcasts. Additionally, all home and away games will be streamed online through MiLB TV (subscription required).

WHAT IS A TRASH PANDA?

The name was chosen in a name-the-team contest and is a reference to the area's association with the space industry and the determination and ingenuity of raccoons, aka Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas, slang for raccoon, was included in the original 10 nominations following several Brandiose-led focus groups in Madison and Huntsville. The ballot descriptor read: Our community is known for engineering, and no creature in our galaxy is as smart, creative, determined and ingenious a problem solver - dedicated to the challenge at hand - as our local raccoons!

In July 2018, after the results from several focus groups in Madison and Huntsville, 10 names were selected, based on their uniqueness and how each name relates to the characteristics of the area: (Alphabetically) Army Ants, Comet Jockeys, GloWorms, Lunartics, Moon Possums, Puffy Head Bird Legs, Space Chimps, Space Sloths, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas. The focus groups were led by San Diego-based Brandiose, the Minor League Baseball industry's premiere branding partner.

Over the next few weeks, two rounds of online voting took place. The first round narrowed the list to Comet Jockeys, Moon Possums, Space Chimps, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas.



Trash Pandas won the final round with 44.75 percent of the vote to ThunderSharks 19.25 percent. Moon Possums was third (12.57 percent); Space Chimps fourth (12.05 percent); and Comet Jockeys fifth (11.38 percent).

By the way, Trash Pandas dominated both rounds.

More than 28,500 nominations and votes were recorded. According to Brandiose, this represented - by far - the largest community participation in a Name the Team contest in the history of Minor League Baseball.

The team name was announced at a local microbrewery in September 2018 with nearly 1,500 fans on hand. Trash Pandas was nominated by Matthew Higley of Lacey's Spring, Ala. He received two box seats for the first five seasons and threw out the ceremonial first pitch at a Trash Pandas home game.

The regional identifier was also chosen by the community. Out of 13,559 votes cast, 67.4 percent chose Rocket City over North Alabama (18.09 percent) and Madison (14.51 percent).

TRASH PANDAS CELEBRITIES



SPROCKET - MASCOT

It all started on a run-of-the-mill October Day in Alabama. Kids were playing, birds were chirping, everything was normal in the world, until it wasn't.

At a local waste dump lived a little bandit-eyed rascal named Sprocket. He spent his mornings moving from trash can to trash can looking for that day's "breakfast."

This particular morning was going just as he had planned when, CRASH! A pile of hazardous waste came raining down upon this tiny raccoon, but something was different.

This tiny raccoon was no longer tiny. In a matter of seconds, Sprocket had grown five feet in length and was walking on his two back feet. So how did Sprocket react to this rapid transformation?! He started dancing!

Sprocket's favorite baseball movie is *Angels in the Outfield*. His favorite color is red, and his favorite song is *Sweet Home Alabama* by Lynyrd Skynyrd.

SALLY, BUZZ & NEIL

IN-GAME ASTRONAUT RACERS



SALLY (Blue): The first female racer, Sally's rides to victory are often neck and neck with fierce rival Buzz. With her youthful spirit, Sally is never deterred in her quest to reach the finish line.

BUZZ (Orange): Usually running neck and neck with rival racer Sally, Buzz uses a measured approach in the nightly Astronaut race. Buzz is never first out of the gate, and as the first of the racers with a doctoral degree, relies on his smarts to compete in his quest for victory at Trash Pandas games.

NEIL (White): After getting off to a quick start, Neil's all or nothing approach stumbles more often than not in the nightly race at Toyota Field. Although his path to victory is often clouded in misfortunes, Neil's rare upset wins are always memorable and inspiring.

TRASH PANDAS TIMELINE

October 2017: The Southern League approves the sale of the Mobile BayBears to BallCorps LLC, setting up an eventual move to Madison.

November 2017: BallCorps LLC closes on the purchase of the Mobile BayBears.

January 2018: The Madison City Council signs a deal with BallCorps LLC for a \$46 million multi-use stadium.

May 2018: The Southern League approves relocating the Mobile BayBears to Madison for the 2020 season.

June 2018: Nearly 2,000 people are on hand for the stadium's groundbreaking ceremony at the Town Madison development site.

September 2018: After more than 28,000 votes were cast in a name-the-team contest, BallCorps LLC announces the team will be called Rocket City Trash Pandas.

October 2018: The first concrete for the stadium is poured. Hundreds of fans turn out at Madison's Dublin Park for a logo reveal celebration.



November 2018: Trash Pandas open the Emporium at Bridge Street Town Centre for the holiday season and set Minor League Baseball merchandise sales records before closing at the end of the year.

May 2019: Team passes \$1 million in merchandise sales.

June 2019: Trash Pandas unveil the team uniforms at

Huntsville's Big Spring Park in front of several hundred fans.

August 2019: Trash Pandas release inaugural season schedule and inaugural mission logo.

October 2019: First seat is installed in Toyota Field; Sod is laid for the berm and the infield and outfield grass; Toyota Field naming ceremony held.

November 2019: Final concrete pour is made; Trash Pandas mascot Sprocket is named.

December 2019: Center field Batter's Eye installed; Trash Pandas surpass \$2 million mark in merchandise sales; Home plate field box seats installed; Right- and left-field foul poles installed; Kids Zone completed.

January 2020: Jay Bell is named the team's first manager.

March 14, 2020: Toyota Field is open to the public for the first time; single-game tickets go on sale.

March 18, 2020: The Trash Pandas front office closes in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

May 4, 2020: The front office returns to Toyota Field to begin plans for the summer with the season still in flux.

June 1, 2020: The Trash Pandas host their first event since coming out of the shutdown with a week-long Kids Camp.

June 6, 2020: The Trash Pandas hold their first event open to the general public with a Block Party at Toyota Field. The party draws approximately 1,500 fans.

June 17, 2020: The first baseball game at any level is played at Toyota Field as the Trash Pandas host The Rocket City Classic. 15 travel select teams play over a five-day span. The first game is between Viper Baseball Academy (VBA) and 43 at 3 p.m.

June 30, 2020: The inaugural 2020 season is cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

February 12, 2021: The Trash Pandas sign a Player Development License with the Los Angeles Angels, keeping Rocket City an Angels' affiliate through 2030.

April 1, 2021: The Trash Pandas surpass the \$4 million mark in merchandise sales.

May 5, 2021: After a rainout on May 4, the Trash Pandas take the field for the first game in team history, one year and one day after the Trash Pandas front office returned to Toyota Field following the shutdown due to the pandemic. David MacKinnon leads off with a single and comes home to score the first run in team history, but Rocket City falls to the Lookouts 6-1.

May 11, 2021: Liftoff at Toyota Field as a sold-out crowd of 7,500 enjoys the first Trash Pandas home game, a 4-3 loss in 10 innings to the Tennessee Smokies.

February 25, 2022: Andy Schatzley named the second manager in Trash Pandas history.

March 9, 2022: SEC baseball comes to Toyota Field for the first time, with Auburn defeating Tennessee Tech 4-3 in front of an energetic crowd of 6,710

April 8, 2022: The second season in Trash Pandas history begins on a high note with an 8-2 road victory over the Birmingham Barons at Regions Field.

June 19, 2022: Rocket City defeats Montgomery 7-2 at Toyota Field, clinching the First-Half North Division title and the first playoff berth in team history. Bryce Teodosio gave the Trash Pandas the lead in the seventh inning with a go-ahead inside-the-park home run, the first Trash Pandas inside-the-park home run.

September 3, 2022: Chase Silseth, Luke Murphy, and Eric Torres combine on the first no-hitter in Trash Pandas history in an 8-0 win over Biloxi at Toyota Field.

September 15, 2022: Trash Pandas clinch Second-Half North Division title with a 5-2 win over Birmingham at Toyota Field.

September 20, 2022: Trash Pandas go on the road and beat Tennessee 9-5 at Smokies Stadium in the first playoff game in team history.

September 22, 2022: Trash Pandas drop first playoff game in Toyota Field history, 4-2 to Tennessee.

September 23, 2022: The Trash Pandas are eliminated with a 3-1 loss to Tennessee, dropping the North Division series two games to one.

October 15, 2022: Toyota Field is transformed into a gridiron for the first football game in the facility, a 47-31 Jacksonville State win over North Alabama in a unique one-way game in front of 10,124 fans.

GARRETT FAHRMAN

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER

After a stellar baseball career at Concord College in Athens, WV, Garrett Fahrman coached for three years at his alma mater before leaving the field for the front office and his first stop as stadium operations manager for the Carolina League's Potomac Cannons.

Originally from Latimer, Iowa, Fahrman earned a Master's in Sport Management from Slippery Rock University before climbing up the MiLB ranks. Fahrman then went west to join the Fresno Grizzlies as Senior Vice President of Operations. At the time, the Grizzlies were the Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants.

Following nearly six years in Fresno, opportunity arose for Garrett, this time back East - another 3,000-mile trek across the country.

With the best wishes of the Grizzlies staff, Fahrman was to take the reins as Director of Operations for the Lehigh Valley IronPigs. The IronPigs, whose logo was created by Brandiose, the creator of the Trash Pandas' logos, are the Philadelphia Phillies' Triple-A affiliate.

After four years in Lehigh Valley, Fahrman went back out west for one season to Salt River Fields in Scottsdale, AZ. Spring Training home of the Colorado Rockies and Arizona Diamondbacks. From there, he headed back out west and was out of baseball, working as a real estate agent and for a property insurance company before the allure of the Trash Pandas got him back in the game. He began in Rocket City in July 2019 and was named General Manager in August.

With his strong baseball management background and outstanding business background, Garrett has the perfect combination to be the Trash Pandas first general manager. Garrett and his wife Natalie, make their home in Madison with daughters Riley (11) and Kinsley (9).



LINDSEY KNUPP

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

To say Lindsey "brought home the bacon," is, well, the truth.

Before arriving in the Rocket City, Knupp oversaw what many called the best in-game experience in Minor League Baseball. Through her efforts, the Lehigh Valley IronPigs won the 2019 Larry MacPhail Award, recognizing the top promotional effort in the sport. No stranger to personal accolades herself, she was the 2015 recipient of the Rawlings Woman Executive of the Year award, which is presented annually by Minor League Baseball to the woman who has made outstanding contributions to her club, league, or the sport in general.

A graduate from Shippensburg (PA) University where she was also a two-time All-American in field hockey, Knupp is the caretaker of the Trash Pandas' public image, heading the team's marketing, game promotions, giveaways, and all entertainment in Toyota Field, ensuring the experience in the ballpark is second to none.

In fact, her title could very well be Vice President of Fun. That "title" followed her from Lehigh Valley where she came up with the idea of a cap with a strip of bacon on the front. It turned out to be the team's best merchandising campaign.

And, because of ideas such as those over her 12 years with the IronPigs, the team won five Golden Bobblehead Awards for its promotions in that span, including: Best Non-Game Day Event (2011), Best In-Game Promotion (2013), Best Theme Night (2016), Best Digital Campaign (2018) & Best Overall Promotion or Event (2018).

Her promotions have been noticed by the likes of The Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Sports Illustrated and ESPN, where sports business analyst Darren Rovell said Lindsey is among the "Best Marketers in Minor League Baseball."

Prior to joining Rocket City in November 2019, Knupp was the Director of Sales and Marketing for the Lehigh Valley Zoo. She also worked for the Reading Phillies for three seasons before joining the IronPigs in 2007.



ROB STERNBERG

VICE PRESIDENT, PRODUCTION & ENTERTAINMENT

Born during Game 2 of the 1986 World Series, Rob was destined for pro baseball.

Entering his 12th season in Minor League Baseball, his previous stops include the Binghamton Mets, Northwest Arkansas Naturals, Omaha Storm Chasers, and most recently, the Lehigh Valley IronPigs. Currently, he has worked for a team in every league at both the Double-A and Triple-A levels.

In 2018, Rob helped the IronPigs win the coveted Golden Bobblehead for best promotion, LV Wants LeBron, a campaign to court LeBron James. The next year, Rob worked with Lindsey to help the IronPigs win the Larry MacPhail Award.

A graduate of Emerson College in Boston, Massachusetts, Rob has contributed in a number of roles for Minor League Baseball clubs including Public Relations, Marketing, and promotions, though his true passion lies in producing the in-game atmosphere.

Rob also has a podcast, The Minor Side, based on life in Minor League Baseball. It can be heard at minorside.com.

Rob and his wife Cristina, have three dogs, Shea, Betty, and Dino, and one cat, Pan.



JOSH CARAY
DIRECTOR, BROADCASTING & BASEBALL INFORMATION

Josh's baseball roots stretch from Atlanta to St. Louis to Chicago to Cooperstown. He is one of the latest in the Caray line to get behind the microphone and broadcast professional baseball.

Josh's grandfather is Hall of Fame broadcaster Harry Caray who called games for the St. Louis Cardinals, St. Louis Browns, Oakland Athletics, Chicago White Sox and Chicago Cubs over a legendary 50-plus-year career. His dad is Skip Caray, Atlanta Braves Hall of Famer, who called games for Turner Sports' coverage of the Braves, NBA, and NFL. His half-brother Chip is the St. Louis Cardinals' current TV broadcaster. Josh's nephews, identical twins Chris and Stefan Caray, are broadcasters for the Amarillo Sod Poodles, Double-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks.

Josh has developed a pedigree of his own, broadcasting college and pro sports. During the baseball offseason, Josh can be heard calling Alabama and UAB athletics on ESPN+. Rounding out his resume, Josh was a football broadcaster for Birmingham-Southern, studio host at IMG for Tulane University football and basketball, as well as UNLV basketball.

Since 1997, he has called games for the Huntsville Stars, Tennessee Valley Vipers (AFL), and Huntsville Flight (NDBL). For more than 20 years, he has announced Lincoln County Falcons high school basketball games.

HALO BLUE UNIFORMS



On December 11, 2022, the Rocket City Trash Pandas unveiled new Halo Blue Uniforms, their first addition to the on-field collection since the team began play in 2021.

The uniforms honor both the Trash Pandas' parent club, the Los Angeles Angels, and the local aerospace community. The Trash Panda will wear the uniforms for all Friday home games at Toyota Field during the 2023 season.

The uniforms were revealed for the first time in front of a crowd of 2,000 at Toyota Field, which was hosting an Artemis I Splashdown Party, a celebration in collaboration with the U.S. Space & Rocket Center to honor the splashdown of the Orion spacecraft in the Pacific Ocean following its flyby of the moon.

The blue color of the jerseys and caps is a tribute to the thin blue layer of atmosphere that surrounds the earth from an astronaut's perspective in space. The jersey features Rocket City across the chest and numbers on the back in white, with each sleeve also having a white stripe. The Angels logo will be featured on the right sleeve, paying homage to Rocket City's parent club.

The cap features the Trash Pandas' white "RC" logo, standing for Rocket City. The alternate logo consists of an "R" in the shape of a Rocket, while the "C" represents a halo.

"I'm a big fan of these," said 2022 Trash Pandas pitcher Kolton Ingram, one of the first players to model the uniform. "With the Rocket City on the front, it gives a different perspective to the all white uniform, and it gives us something else to stand out. It really matches well with the blue stripe on the pants and the blue belt we already wear."

"It's a different type of jersey. This gives us something else to stand out," said first baseman Sonny DiChiara, who modeled the uniforms with Ingram. "It's cool to see them on the field and how it matches with the whole entire uniform."

"Growing up, I always loved the old blue style jerseys the Angels used to wear," Ingram added. "So this really gives respect to that."

The jerseys will make their on-field debut on Friday, April 7, 2023, when the Trash Pandas host the Chattanooga Lookouts at Toyota Field at 6:35 p.m.

The season-long event is designed to embrace the culture and values that resonate most within Minor League Baseball teams' local U.S. Hispanic communities. Rocket City will wear new Lunaticos uniforms, complete with jerseys and caps for three home games at Toyota Field during the 2023 season:

- Sunday, May 7 at 2:35 p.m. vs. Tennessee
- Sunday, June 25 at 4:05 p.m. vs. Montgomery
- Sunday, August 27 at 4:05 p.m. vs. Birmingham

With the unveiling of the new Lunaticos identity, the Trash Pandas are now the only professional sports team in the state of Alabama with an alternate identity playing homage to its local Hispanic community. The Trash Pandas have hosted Hispanic Heritage night at Toyota Field in each of the first two seasons in team history.

Over the Trash Pandas' first two seasons, 23 percent of players are of Latin descent. Players from 11 different countries have taken the field for Rocket City, including five Latin countries including Colombia, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, and the Dominican Republic.

Three former Trash Pandas represented Latin countries at the recent World Baseball Classic, with Gustavo Campero and Adrian Almeida taking the field for Colombia and Jhonathan Diaz representing Venezuela. Five former Trash Pandas with Latin heritage reached the Major Leagues in the past two seasons, all making their MLB debut with the Los Angeles Angels.

The 45-minute tour provides an inside look at Toyota Field and Trash Pandas baseball with stops including the clubhouse, dugout, and press box! Schools and summer camps often use this opportunity as a field trip location.

SPROCKET APPEARANCES

In addition to Trash Pandas games, mascot Sprocket loves to spend his time making visits to local community members. Appearances in 2022 included school visits, dropping the puck at a Huntsville Havoc game, parades, and even a trip to Los Angeles. Sprocket is available for appearances at events of all sizes

COLLECTION DRIVES

In 2022, the Trash Pandas hosted numerous different collection drives, with the items donated to local nonprofit organizations. The drives included toiletries, school supplies, toys, and canned food.

DOG DAYS

Each Wednesday, fans are invited to bring their four-legged friends to the park for Dog Day. For a \$1 donation to an animal-related nonprofit, dogs were allowed entry and all proceeds went back to that nonprofit of the night. In 2022, the Trash Pandas hosted 10 Dog Days, raising over \$700 for those organizations.

COMMUNITY CLUBHOUSE SALE

During the 2022 season, the Trash Pandas Foundation hosted two Community Clubhouse Sales which offered a variety of autographed and game used memorabilia to fans in a garage style fashion. Items included mystery autographed baseballs, autographed baseball cards, batting practice gear, specialty jerseys, game worn caps, and more. Those sales raised over \$22,000 for the foundation.

The Rocket City Trash Pandas Foundation was established in 2022 as the non-profit charitable arm of the Rocket City organization. Operated by our community relations team under the direction of Community Relations Director Maddison Kendrick, the foundation spearheads outreach around North Alabama through initiatives such as mascot appearances, jersey auctions, ballpark tours, team experiences, and more.

The Rocket City Trash Pandas Foundation is a 501c3 organization dedicated to educating and promoting healthy lifestyles through sport and to positively impact communities in the North Alabama region.

JERSEY AUCTIONS

One of the most popular fundraisers were jersey auctions. In 2022, the Trash Pandas wore six specialty themed jerseys during select games. Throughout the game, fans near and far had the opportunity to bid on the game-worn and autographed jerseys. Over \$100,000 was raised through the auctions, with the proceeds being split between the Trash Pandas Foundation and a local nonprofit. Specialty jerseys in 2022 included Space Night, Star Wars Night, Armed Forces Night, Patriotic Jerseys, Marvel "Thor" Jerseys, and a Huntsville Stars Throwback Jersey.

YOUTH INSTRUCTIONAL CAMP

Last June, the Trash Pandas held their 2nd annual instructional baseball camp for kids ages 7-10. Over the course of two days, campers had the opportunity to learn baseball skills and fundamentals from Trash Pandas players.

CONCESSIONS FUNDRAISING

Nonprofit organizations had the opportunity to fundraise for their organization during games by volunteering in our concession stands. Each volunteer was paid by the hour, with that money going directly to their organization. Through this program, over \$57,000 was raised.

COMMUNITY DONATIONS

The Trash Pandas are proud to support local non-profits and fundraisers through additional give back programs such as our in-kind donation program, and service opportunities for our front office staff. Anyone hosting a fundraiser is eligible to apply for tickets, autographed memorabilia, and other Trash Pandas swag to help raise funds for their event. To date, over \$7,500 of in-kind donations have been donated.

2022 TRASH PANDAS NOTES

FILLING UP ON HOME COOKIN': The Trash Pandas ended the 2022 season with the most home wins in all of Minor League Baseball, compiling a 49-20 record at Toyota Field in route to not losing a home series during the regular season. The 49 wins at home rank just ahead of the Triple-A International League's Nashville Sounds, who finished with 48.

CALL HIM 'MR. CLUTCH': Trash Pandas first baseman Preston Palmeiro had a flair for the dramatic in 2022. Most recently, he homered on the second pitch of Game 1 of the North Division Series in a 9-5 win at Tennessee on 9/20. His season started by driving in the game-winning run with an 11th inning walk-off single against Pensacola on 4/17. He also ripped a two-run single to complete a three-run, ninth-inning comeback against Birmingham on 5/21. He followed that up with a game-winning single in game two of a doubleheader against the Smokies on 5/29, before tying game one of a twin-bill a week later against Chattanooga on 6/4. However, nothing will surpass what he did on 8/20 against the Lookouts when he ripped a three-run walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth to give the Trash Pandas an 8-7 win. The former Orioles farmhand owned a .343 OBP, .398 slugging and .741 OPS, which are all higher than his career averages. Since 5/27, he went 86-292 (.295). He has five homers and 33 RBI over that stretch while seeing his average jump from .182 to .263. He hit .309 for the month of June and finished tied for second in doubles across the Southern League with 31.

BULLISH PEN: A huge key to Rocket City's success was the work of its bullpen. Specifically, the trio of Kolton Ingram, Eric Torres, and Luke Murphy have all been impressive. Ingram posted a 2.02 ERA with eight saves and 53 strikeouts in his last 44.2 innings of work with only 11 walks and 10 runs allowed. Torres, meanwhile, registered 18 saves and a 2-1 record in his last 38 innings with 13 hits and six ER allowed for a 1.42 ERA to go along with 56 punchouts. Murphy tied for second on the team with seven wins. In 33 appearances in 2022, he did not allow a run in 27 of them, including no runs at Toyota Field in the regular season. Over his last 24 outings, he went 3-0 with a 1.42 ERA over 25.1 innings and 28 strikeouts with four ER. Ingram led the Southern League with 13 holds while Murphy was close behind, ending the season with 12 holds to rank second.

2022 TRASH PANDAS NOTES

TAKING IT 'SERIES'OUSLY: Rocket City's performance in 2022 was remarkable due to the consistency of the team's performance from Opening Day until the end of the regular season. The Trash Pandas lost only four series on the year, all on the road. They were swept in May and July against Pensacola and Mississippi, lost four of six in a meaningless series at Birmingham in June after the first half title was clinched, then lost four of six to division-winning Montgomery in September. The Trash Pandas only swept one series; the season-opening three-game set at Birmingham. They either split or won their other 20 series for the season, including all 12 series at Toyota Field.

SAVING THE GAME: The work of back-end relievers Kolton Ingram and Eric Torres provided the Trash Pandas with a nice two-headed monster at the end of games. Torres' 22 saves are tops in the Southern League with Ingram owning 10 more and tied for fifth. Rocket City, as a team led the league in saves with 46. Torres' 22 saves set a new Angels' Double-A single-season record, passing the 21 saves by Jose Musset in 1993. Torres (right) was later named the Southern League Reliever of the Year for his strong performance. Luke Murphy recorded his first Double-A save in the second-half clincher on 9/15, becoming the 10th different Rocket City pitcher to record a save this season, after Torres (21), Ingram (10), Luis Ledo (4), Aaron Hernandez (3), Cristopher Molina (2), Nick Jones (1), Brett Kerry (1), Braden Olthoff (1), and Ben Joyce (1).



NEWCOMERS MAKE THEIR MARK: On 7/17, shortstop Zach Neto was drafted with the 13th overall selection of the 2022 MLB Draft. Two weeks later, catcher Logan O'Hoppe was acquired in a trade from the Philadelphia Phillies for outfielder Brandon Marsh. In their brief time as Trash Pandas, both made a quick impact. In just 30 games with Rocket City, Neto hit .320 (39-for-122) with four homers and 23 RBI in his Double-A debut. After his arrival in Rocket City on 8/9, he finished among the Southern League leaders in hits (2nd), average (4th), runs (T-4th), and RBI (T-7th). O'Hoppe brought his game to a new level once he joined the Trash Pandas on 8/4, hitting 11 home runs in 29 games to tie for the lead in all of Double-A for that span. From 8/4 until the end of the regular season, O'Hoppe led the Southern League in HR, RBI, OBP, SLG, and OPS. That led to his first MLB promotion with the Angels in late September.

ALL IN THE FAMILY: The 2022 Trash Pandas had numerous connections to famous Major League families. Preston Palmeiro is the son of four-time All-Star, three-time Gold Glove winner, and two-time Silver Slugger Rafael Palmeiro, one of six players in baseball history to have at least 500 home runs and 3,000 hits. Outfielder Torii Hunter Jr.'s father, Torii Hunter Sr., played 19 MLB seasons and hit .277 with 353 home runs and 1,391 RBI while winning nine Gold Glove Awards and making five All-Star appearances. Catcher Zach Humphreys' father, Mike, also played parts of three seasons with the New York Yankees from 1991-93.

CABBAGE EATS HIS SPINACH: Trey Cabbage was the undisputed offensive leader of the Trash Pandas for the early part of the season, hitting .327 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI over 30 games from 4/8-5/13, including a thrilling walk-off grand slam against Chattanooga on 5/6. His batting average was fifth in the league in that span, while his home runs, RBI, OPS (1.098), and OBP (.434) were first, while his slugging (.664) was third. His work allowed him to be named Southern League Player of the Month for April. However, his season came to a sudden end on 5/13 in Pensacola, when a collision at first base resulted in a season-ending arm injury.

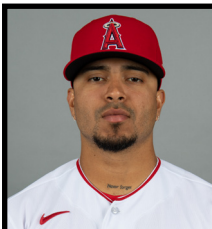

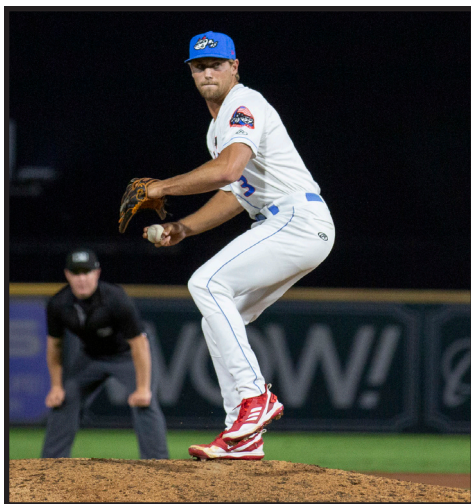

The BayBears played their final game at Hank Aaron Stadium on September 2, 2019, in a 5-4 loss to the Tennessee Smokies before a crowd of 1,554.

In 1984, Larry Schmittou brought baseball to Huntsville in a series of transactions that moved the then Double-A Nashville Sounds up to Triple-A, and resulted in the forming of the Huntsville Stars. The team began play at Joe W. Davis Municipal Stadium in 1985. Beginning their tenure as the Double-A affiliate of the Oakland A's, the Stars got off to a hot start in 1985, taking home the Southern League crown in their inaugural season. After becoming a Milwaukee Brewers affiliate in 1999, the Stars remained a Brewers affiliate at Joe Davis Stadium until 2014 before moving to Biloxi in 2015 to become the Shuckers. Due to construction delays in Biloxi, the Shuckers played 15 home games at Joe Davis Stadium in 2015, with the final game being a 7-2 Biloxi win over Birmingham on May 25, 2015.

In a ceremony prior to the first game at Toyota Field 5/11/21, the Trash Pandas retired the number 5 in honor of Huntsville baseball legend Don Mincher. A Huntsville native who played 13 MLB seasons, Mincher went on to serve as the Huntsville Stars' first President and General Manager before serving as President of the Southern League from 2000-2011. As a player, Mincher was a two-time All-Star first baseman in 1967 and 1969 before winning a World Series in his final season as a player with the Oakland A's in 1972. Mincher's number 5 was previously retired by the Huntsville Stars. Jackie Robinson's number 42 was retired across baseball in 1997 for breaking baseball's color barrier and for his tremendous contributions to the game. Both numbers hang atop the Inline Electric Rock Porch in right field.

2023 SOUTHERN LEAGUE PLAYOFF PROCEDURES

The Southern League Championship season will be played as a split season (i.e., the season will be divided into two halves). For a season consisting of 138 games (Double-A), the final game of the first half is the originally scheduled game #69 and the first game of the second half is the originally scheduled game #70. Any game that is suspended or postponed during the first half must be completed or made up prior to the first date of the second half, otherwise such game shall be cancelled. Win-loss records will be reset at the beginning of the second half. For the Trash Pandas, the first half will end on Sunday, June 25 vs. Montgomery and the second half will begin on Wednesday, June 28 at Birmingham.

The format for the Southern League Postseason will consist of four teams per participating in a best-of-three Division Series, followed by a best-of-three Championship Series. The four playoff participants will be the winners of each division from both halves based on the best winning percentage of each half. In the event the same Club wins both halves, the Club with the next best full season winning percentage in that division will advance. In the event of any ties, the following tiebreakers will apply in the order below:

1. Head-to-head record (if 3 or more Clubs, best winning percentage in games among the Clubs).
2. If the Clubs remain tied, best overall winning percentage over the last 20 games.
3. If the Clubs remain tied, best overall winning percentage over an additional game (i.e., the last 21 games, the last 22 games, etc.) until one emerges with a better winning percentage in that span.

The winners of the first half in each division will host game two and, if necessary, game three of the Division Series. The winners of the second half in each division will host game one of the Division Series. The winner of the Division Series from the South division will host game two and, if needed, game three of the Championship Series; the other Division Series winner will host game one.



MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL RULE CHANGES FOR 2023 SEASON

Major League Baseball recently announced a variety of experimental playing rules that will be in use during the 2023 Minor League season throughout each Professional Development League (PDL). Consistent with the preferences of fans, these changes are designed to enhance the quality of the game on the field by increasing action, providing additional opportunities for players to showcase their athleticism, and improving the pace of play. Below are rules that will be on display in the Southern League in 2023.

PITCH TIMER: To encourage a crisp pace of play, Pitch Timers will be used at all full-season PDL levels. The Pace of Game Procedures that will be used in 2023 are very similar to the regulations that were used at the PDL levels during the 2022 season. In the Southern League, the pitch clock will be 14 seconds between pitches with the bases empty, 18 seconds between pitches with runners on, and 30 second between batters. Inning breaks and pitching changes come with a two minute and 15 second timer. Batters will be required to be in the batter's box and alert to the pitcher with 8 or more seconds remaining on the Timer, which is a change from the 9-second threshold used at all PDL levels in 2022. If the pitcher makes a pickoff attempt at any base, feints a pickoff, or otherwise steps off the rubber with runners on base he shall be charged with a Disengagement. To ensure that pitchers do not circumvent the Pitch Timer regulations by stepping off the rubber, pitchers at all PDL levels shall be limited to a total of two Disengagements per plate appearance with runners on base. Consistent with the Disengagement Rule in use during the 2022 PDL season, the Disengagement count will not reset until the following plate appearance, even if a runner advances or is retired during a plate appearance.



BIGGER BASES: 18-inch bases will continue to be used at all full-season levels of play in the 2023 season after debuting in 2022. Previously, bases were 15 inches square. Depending on the level of stolen base activity observed early in the 2023 season, second base may be repositioned in the second half of the season so that the base is entirely within the baseline. This change has the effect of reducing the distance between first and second base and reducing the distance between second and third base.

RESTRICTIONS ON INFIELD POSITIONING: At all PDL levels, a minimum of four infielders (not including the pitcher and the catcher) will be required to be positioned within the outer boundary of the infield with two infielders entirely on each side of second base. Additionally, infielders may not switch sides during an inning unless there is a substitution for a defensive player other than the pitcher.

ENHANCED-GRIP BASEBALLS: During the 2021 season, MLB began working with the Dow Company, a materials science leader, to develop an alternative to the Delaware River mud currently applied to the baseball. The objective of this project was and remains to develop a treatment process that allows pitchers to secure a better grip on the baseball – particularly in extreme environmental conditions – while not altering performance properties. The baseballs that undergo this treatment process (“Enhanced-Grip Baseballs”) are Major League baseballs manufactured by Rawlings and are identical to the baseballs that will be in use during the 2023 Major League season. To evaluate the potential for these Enhanced-Grip Baseballs to be used at the Major League level in the future, Enhanced-Grip Baseballs will be used in the Southern League from Opening Day through July 13 (i.e., prior to the All-Star break). When games resume after the All-Star break, teams in the Southern League will use standard mudded Major League baseballs. This experimental design provides the best opportunity to collect feedback from players and coaches early in the season and to determine the impact that the treatment process has on performance properties (e.g., spin rate, drag).

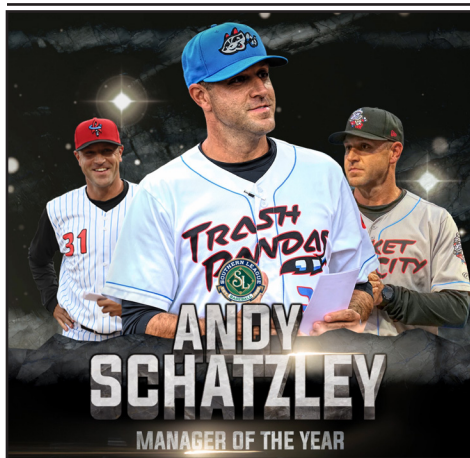

In his second professional season, Trash Pandas Manager Andy Schatzley guided Rocket City to the best record in the Southern League at 81-57, leading the team to the playoffs for the first time.

With a talented coaching staff that included Pitching Coach Michael Wuertz, Hitting Coach Kenny Hook, Coach Dann Bilardello, Strength and Conditioning Coach Henry Aleck, and Athletic Trainer Will Whitehead by his side, Schatzley took the reigns in the Trash Pandas' second season, pacing the team to both first and second half North Division titles.

Schatzley became the first Rocket City manager to be named Southern League Manager of the Year, which was previously won four times by Huntsville Stars managers, most recently by Don Money in 2007.



At the 2022 Baseball Winter Meetings, Trash Pandas Head Groundskeeper Charlie Weaver was named the 2022 Minor League Baseball Groundskeeper of the Year.

The award gives Weaver and the Trash Pandas the honor for the best field in the eight-team Southern League and throughout all 120 teams in Minor League Baseball for the 2022 season.

A Madison native, Bob Jones High School alumnus, and former pitcher for the University of Alabama in Huntsville, Weaver has been the Trash Pandas' Head Groundskeeper for the duration of the team's history, working with Assistant Groundskeeper Colby Hunter to maintain the playing surface at Toyota Field.

BASEBALL CALCULATIONS

ASSISTS

An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

BATTING AVERAGE

Divide the numbers of at-bats into the number of hits.

SLUGGING PERCENTAGE

Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

ON BASE PERCENTAGE

Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

CONSECUTIVE GAME HITTING STREAK

A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES PLAYED STREAK

A consecutive-game streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak.

DETERMINING THE MAGIC NUMBER

Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest team.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE

Multiply earned runs by 9 and then divide by innings pitched.

FIELDING PERCENTAGE

Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

SAVES FOR RELIEF PITCHERS

Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- He is not the winning pitcher; he must be credited with at least 1/3 of an inning pitched and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 1. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
 2. He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat or on deck; or
 3. He enters the game, regardless of how large the lead is, and pitches effectively as he completes the last three innings of the game.

No more than one save may be credited in each game.

WINNING PITCHER

The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game.

EXCEPTION: Do not credit a victory to a relief pitcher who is ineffective in a brief appearance, when a succeeding relief pitcher pitches effectively in helping his team maintain the lead. In such cases credit the succeeding relief pitcher with the victory.
