QUOTEWORTHY

Here is what Head Coach **Clint Peay** and midfielder **Jake Rozhansky** had to say ahead of Sunday night's home opener against Rochester New York FC:

New England Revolution II Head Coach Clint Peay

On how important it is to see improvement in young players game over game:

Peay: "It's important. We recognize that from the first week we were not going to be the finished product and it's going to be a process and with younger guys, it takes time as well. So, our philosophy as a staff is just to kind of keep chipping away at the things that we need to improve upon. And as we think about the bigger picture and how we want to play the game, how do we kind of reinforce those things through the course of the season so that the chemistry, the cohesion really starts to take form and really, the group almost has a life of their own in terms of making decisions on the field and reading the game and letting their personalities take over at the end of the day."

Revolution II Midfielder Jake Rozhansky

On how he aims to fulfill the captain role every week:

Rozhansky: "Yeah, honestly, I got the armband last year and I was pretty surprised because I got it in the first game as a new player. I think knowing Clint [Peay] for a while now in my youth soccer days, he kind of sees that I have leadership qualities and he just wanted me to instill that in the younger players. As you know, I am probably the oldest this year, one of the older players in the club for Revs II. So yeah, just trying to bring those leadership qualities, lead by example for the young guys."

New England Revolution II will host Rochester New York FC in their home opener at Gillette Stadium on Sunday evening. The contest kicks off at 6:00 p.m. ET and will stream on MLSNEXTPro.com. Sunday's match will also mark the first Revolution II home game where fans will be in attendance. Revolution II Season Memberships and single-game tickets are on sale now. Revolution II is coming off a 2-2 draw against New York City FC II, in which it earned an extra point with the first shootout victory in MLS NEXT Pro history. Both of New England's goals came from Homegrown midfielder Damian Rivera, who recorded the first multi-goal game of his career and the third brace in team history. Midfielder Michel Costa da Silva also recorded the first assist of his career on Rivera's second goal. Goalkeeper Jacob Jackson got the start in net. New England's first round pick in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft made eight saves in his professional debut.

Alongside Jackson, José Ítalo, Ben Reveno, and Trevor Zwetsloot also made their professional debuts with 90-minute performances in the season opener, with Malcolm Fry debuting with a substitute appearance. Fry became the 19th Revolution Academy player to make their professional debut with Revolution II, playing 11 minutes. New England also saw starts from Academy graduates Esmer Bajraktarevic, Hikaru Fujiwara, and Meny Silva with substitute appearances from Colby Quiñones and Isaiá Louis.

Rochester New York FC played its first match as an organization in over 1,600 days last Friday, their season on the road vs. St. Louis CITY2. Bruno Baltazar's squad recorded three shots while goalkeeper Caíque Luiz Santos da Purificação made two saves on four shots faced. Rochester led their game in possession (57.1%), duels won (55), and tackles won (12), but ultimately fell in the game by a score of 2-0.

LAST TIME OUT: REVS II SECURE SHOOTOUT VICTORY AT NYCFC II

New England Revolution II (0-0-1, 2 pts.) opened the 2022 MLS NEXT Pro season with a 2-2 draw against New York City FC II (0-0-1, 1 pts.), earning an extra point with the first shootout victory in MLS NEXT Pro history, 4-3. Homegrown midfielder **Damian Rivera** notched both the opening goal and the equalizer to record the third brace in team history.



Tied after 90 minutes, the match went to a penalty shootout, the first in MLS NEXT Pro history. **Esmir Bajraktarevic, Trevor Zwetsloot, Jake Rozhansky, and Meny Silva** all converted in the shootout to earn New England the extra point in their season opener, marking the third consecutive season Revolution II has earned a result in their first game of the season.

New England saw five players make their professional debuts including current Academy player, **Malcolm Fry**, and both of New England's 2022 MLS SuperDraft picks, **Jacob Jackson** and **Ben Reveno**. Jackson recorded eight saves on ten shots faced, including a point-blank save in the 69th minute just moments prior to Rivera netting an equalizer down the other end for New England. Seven current or former Revolution Academy products featured in the contest for New England: Rivera, Silva, Bajraktarevic, **Hikaru Fujiwara, Colby Quiñones, Isaie Louis, and Malcolm Fry.**

MENY ON THE SPOT: REVS II WIN FIRST MLS NEXT PRO SHOOTOUT

Ahead of the inaugural MLS NEXT Pro season, the league announced that it would be implementing the penalty shootout for regular season games that end in ties, aiming to challenge players with high-stakes, pressurized situations that will aid their development.

In New England's first game of the season, they got to showcase the shootout for the first time as their game vs. NYCFC II ended with a 2-2 tie.

Revolution II scored on four of their five chances with NYCFC II scoring on three of their opportunities. **Esmir Bajraktarevic, Trevor Zwetsloot, Jake Rozhansky, and Meny Silva** all converted on their shots to lead New England to the league's first shootout win.

Silva was the fifth shooter for Revs II, making his shot the deciding factor. The forward spoke after the game on what the pressure felt like heading into his opportunity.

"I was a bit nervous because the other team's fans were just behind the net, you know, a lot of pressure but I was also thinking to myself, 'If you score, you get to just watch them not say anything anymore, because you won the game for your team.' But yeah, I was kind of nervous," Silva said.



RIVERA NOTCHES THIRD BRACE IN TEAM HISTORY

Homegrown midfielder **Damian Rivera** earned the start for Revolution II in the season opener for the second consecutive season, logging 79 minutes.

Rivera opened the scoring in the match in the seventh minute with a right footed shot from the center of the box.

After the team went down by a goal, a save from goalkeeper **Jacob Jackson** led to some attacking zone time, where **Michel** would serve a pass to Rivera, who sent the ball into the net from the left side of the box.

"Definitely excited to get those two goals under my belt," Rivera said post-game. "I've been working hard this preseason and to get those goals, it's another confidence booster, and it's really exciting."

The first multi-goal game of Rivera's career also serves as the teams third brace in their history. Both goals acted as bookends to two things the team has been working on: scoring goals first and fighting back when they're down.

"Yeah, first of all, it was huge," Head Coach **Clint Peay** stated. "We talked about scoring first, so it was good for not only **Damian [Rivera]**, but the team, to give us a lift and give us a boost and then going down a goal, getting back the way we did, fighting and taking a moment of transition, going straight to goal in an effective way was something that we talked about a lot and it's good to see that we were able to capitalize on it"

NEWCOMERS SHINE IN FIRST APPEARANCES FOR REVS II

In Sunday's season opener vs. New York City FC II, Revolution II saw five-offseason signings make their first appearance for the club. Jacob Jackson, Ben Reveno, Trevor Zwetsloot, and Jose Italo all started for New England while Michael DeShields came off the bench in the second half.

Jackson and Reveno, both selected by New England in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft, each started and played 90 minutes. Jackson made eight saves on the day.

Italo, who logged the full 90 minutes, was one of three Brazilian players to sign with Revolution II this offseason. Zwetsloot, who signed from the Melbourne Knights, also played the full 90.

Goalkeeper Jacob Jackson started in net vs. NYCFC II, making his professional debut with Revolution II. The Escondido, California native was selected 24th overall by New England in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft and spent the majority of his preseason training with the first team.



During Sunday's match, the goalkeeper made eight saves on ten shots faced. The point-blank save he made in the 69th minute gave his team the momentum needed to head straight into the attacking zone and tie the game.

Jackson, 21, made history as the first goalkeeper ever taken by the Revolution in the first round of the MLS SuperDraft and joins five other first-round picks on the Revolution roster. The Escondido, Calif. native was named the West Coast Conference Goalkeeper of the Year and an All-WCC First Team selection in each of the last two seasons, ranking sixth in the nation with a 0.67 goals against average as a senior during the fall of 2021. Among goalkeepers selected in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft, Jackson ranked third in career GAA, posting an 0.68 mark over three seasons.

FRY BECOMES LATEST ACADEMY PLAYER TO DEBUT FOR REVS II

Since Revolution II launched ahead of the 2020 season, 34 different players have made their professional debuts with the team to date, including 19 current or former members of the Revolution Academy. Six Revolution Academy products made their professional debuts in 2021.

Revolution Academy forward Malcolm Fry (2005 - Groton, Mass.) became the 19th Academy player to make his professional debut with Revolution II on Sunday night.

Fry came in as a sub, replacing Michel, and logged 11 minutes in the match. The forward has recorded three goals and two assists so far with the U-17 team this season.

Alongside Fry, Academy graduates Colby Quinones and Isaie Louis also made appearances off the bench in Sunday's match. Louis, who became the youngest player ever to suit up for Revs II in 2020, made his fourth professional appearance, logging a career-high 22 minutes while Quinones, who made his debut in 2020 as the first Academy player to start a professional match in club history, entered the game in the 71st minute in place of defender Sean O'Hearn.

Buck, 16, is one of 30 players, along with Maciel and Bell, to make his professional debut with Revolution II since the club began play in 2020, and one of 18 current or former Academy players to do so. Buck signed his first professional contract with Revolution II in June 2021, one of six Academy players to sign a pro deal directly to the second team from the club's youth ranks: **Meny Silva, Dennis Ramirez, Colby Quiñones, Hikaru Fujiwara, and Esmir Bajraktarevic**.

Spaulding, 23, signed with Revolution II on January 16, 2020 and played two seasons with the USL League One side, setting team records in games played (42), starts (38), minutes (3,402) while totaling four goals and three assists in that span. A resident of Cary, N.C., Spaulding earned eight elections to the USL League One Team of the Week over the past two years and was one of three defenders named to the 2021 All-USL League One First Team, the first Revolution II player to earn the honor.

ESMIR IS HERE: SIXTH ACADEMY PLAYER SIGNS WITH REVS II

Ahead of the 2022 season, New England Revolution II signed Revolution Academy midfielder **Esmir Bajraktarevic** to a professional contract. The Wisconsin native became the sixth Revolution Academy product to earn promotion to Revolution II. Bajraktarevic, 17, becomes second-youngest player to sign with Revolution II to date since the club began play in 2020.



Bajraktarevic joined the Revolution Academy's residency program in August 2021. The midfielder immediately began training with Revolution II and made his professional debut on Aug. 21. Bajraktarevic spent the final three months of the 2021 USL League One season with Revolution II, appearing in 11 games with five starts and logging 457 minutes. He netted his first professional goal on Sept. 11 at North Carolina FC, becoming the third different Academy player to score a goal in a professional match for Revs II in 2021. During the offseason, Bajraktarevic was invited to the United States Under-20 National Team January Training Camp, the youngest member of the roster.

REVS II TO WELCOME FANS AT HOME FOR THE FIRST TIME

For the first time in team history, New England Revolution fans will be able to attend the organization's developmental team's home games at Gillette Stadium beginning with the home opener on Sunday April 3.

Last week, Head Coach Clint Peay spoke with the media on what it will be like to have fans in the stands at Gillette for the first time and how this prepares players for the next level.

"It's always exciting when you when you walk into the stadium and there's people there to cheer for you and to root you on and give you that extra lift from the get-go," Peay stated. "The ability to play in front of fans also adds to the pressure that players have to deal with if they want to make it to the next level, and I think it will be a wonderful opportunity."

Revolution fans will have 12 opportunities to see the second team play at Gillette Stadium this season. All current Revolution Season Members received three complimentary "flex tickets" per season on their accounts while individual game tickets cost \$10 and are available through Ticketmaster.

In 2020, Revolution II matches were played behind closed doors due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The team's home matches in 2021 were open only to family and friends, except for a match on May 16 against Chattanooga that was the nightcap of a double-header with the club's MLS side. Fans with tickets to New England's first-team game were able to catch a glimpse of Revs II live for the first time.



CLINT PEAY
HEAD COACH

Clint Peay is in his third season as the first head coach of Revolution II, the New England Revolution's developmental side that began play in USL League One in 2020, following his appointment to the position on Nov. 20, 2019. Peay brings to the club more than 18 years of coaching experience with a focus on youth player development including an eight-year tenure working in the U.S. Youth National Team program and 10 years as a collegiate head coach and assistant.

Peay, 47, spent the 2019 season as an assistant coach with USL Championship side North Carolina FC, where he worked alongside Dave Sarachan and helped guide the club to an Eastern Conference playoff berth. An experienced scout and evaluator of up-and-coming talent, Peay worked on U.S. Soccer's technical staff from 2012-19, beginning as a member of the Under-17 staff. He was later named head coach of the U-14 Boys' National Team in 2016, before advancing to manage the U-15 Boys' National Team in 2018, where he succeeded current Revolution Assistant Coach Dave van den Bergh in that role.

Prior to joining U.S. Soccer, Peay built his resume over four coaching stints at the collegiate level, including four seasons as head coach at Richmond University from 2009-12. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Georgetown University in 2003, before moving on to Davidson College from 2004-07, where he helped the Wildcats to back-to-back appearances in the conference final in his first two seasons. He later worked as an assistant coach with George Mason in 2008, helping guide the Patriots to the Colonial Athletic Association conference title in 2008.

A proven winner at the game's highest levels, Peay enjoyed a decorated playing career spanning a decade from his collegiate days at the University of Virginia (1991-95) through five MLS seasons with D.C. United (1996-2000).



MARCELO SANTOS
ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Santos is in his third season as assistant coach of Revolution II and his fourth with the club, having spent the 2018-19 as a head coach in the New England Revolution Academy. Before being promoted to the Revolution II staff, Santos was head coach of the Under-19 team after serving as the head coach of the Under-17 team during the 2017-18 season.

Prior to joining the Revolution Academy, Santos served as an assistant for Marquette University, where he coached for 10 seasons. He also spent years as a U.S. Soccer Federation network scout, responsible for identifying and evaluating potential U.S. Youth National Team players in Milwaukee and Chicago, conducting training evaluations for U.S. Development Academy clubs, and conducting training centers for players with international potential.

Santos, 40, joined Marquette as a volunteer assistant in 2008 and served in that role for four seasons prior to being promoted to full-time assistant on head coach Louis Bennett's staff. While coaching at Marquette, Santos saw the Eagles claim two BIG EAST regular season titles (2011, 2013), a BIG EAST tournament championship (2013), and two NCAA tournament appearances (2012, 2013). In 2011, Marquette's coaching staff was named BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year. At least a dozen of Santos' players went on to play professionally including Columbus Crew SC defender Axel Sjöberg, Austin Bold FC midfielder Calum Mallace, New York City FC goalkeeper Luis Barraza, New York Red Bulls defender Patrick Seagrist, and former LAFC, Seattle Sounders, and current MLS Pool goalkeeper Charlie Lyon.

In 2016, Santos served as head coach of Kokomo Mantis FC of the Premier Development League. In their lone season, Santos led Mantis FC to a 4-6-4 record and fourth place finish in the Heartland Division of the PDL Central Division.



YUTA NOMURA
GOALKEEPERS COACH

Yuta Nomura is in his third season as the goalkeeper coach for Revolution II, the New England Revolution's developmental side, following his appointment to the position on Feb. 3, 2020. Nomura spent the 2017-19 seasons tutoring goalkeepers on the coaching staff at the University of Central Arkansas in NCAA Division I.

In Nomura's first season at Central Arkansas, he was part of a coaching staff that collectively won the Missouri Valley Conference Coaching Staff of the Year award. Central Arkansas finished 8-6-4 overall in 2018, including 4-1-1 in conference play. Nomura helped guide UCA to a 2018 Missouri Valley Conference title and a berth in the D-I NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament. After switching to the Sun Belt Conference in 2019, Nomura stayed on staff to help guide the Bears to a Sun Belt Conference regular season title with a 4-1 league record and a 10-7-1 finish overall.

Prior to his coaching days, the native of Tokyo, Japan spent parts of two seasons playing professionally in Sweden for BK Olympic, based out of Malmö, from 2017-18. In his first season, he helped lead the club to promotion back to the Västra Götaland followed by a ninth-place finish in Tier 4 for the 2018 season.

Nomura, 27, played collegiately for NAIA school Lindsey Wilson College in Columbia, Kentucky where he majored in communications. As a freshman in 2011, Nomura started all 23 games for the Blue Raiders, leading the team to an NAIA National Title and an undefeated season. That year, he set career-highs in save percentage (.838), shutouts (14), goals allowed (12), and saves (62).



DANIEL KIRWAN
SPORTS PERFORMANCE COACH

Daniel Kirwan is in his third season as the Sports Performance Coach for Revolution II, the New England Revolution's third-division professional side, following his appointment to the position on Feb. 3, 2020. Kirwan made the move to New England following five seasons with D.C. United in roles with the First Team, USL second team, and Academy programs.

Most recently, Kirwan served as the Strength and Power coach for D.C. United during the 2018 and 2019 seasons. Prior to holding that position, he was hired by the Black and Red as a Physical Preparation and Performance Analyst, a role he held from March 2015 through the end of 2017. His responsibilities included the development of supplemental training schedules along with strength and conditioning workouts.

Kirwan, 29, began his career as a Strength and Conditioning Student Assistant for the Clemson football program while attending the university. During his undergraduate tenure, he assisted in the development of 24 NFL players. He graduated from Clemson in 2015 with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology.

In January of 2019, Kirwan was hired by U.S. Soccer as a sports scientist, traveling abroad with the U-16 team to the UEFA Development Tournament in May 2019 and Malbork, Poland with the U-15 team in October of 2019. He also made the trip to Florida with the U-16 team in November, joining the staff that helped guide the youth team to victory at the 2019 Nike Friendlies.

His experience in developing younger talent stems from his early days when he also helped train high school athletes in his hometown of Bethesda, Md.

STAFF BIOS



BRUCE ARENA
SPORTING DIRECTOR

Bruce Arena is in his fourth season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first three seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has revived the Revolution by leading the side to three consecutive MLS Cup Playoff appearances. His .634 winning percentage with New England entering 2022 is the best of any manager in the club's history. Last season, Arena won his record fourth Supporters' Shield, the first in Revolution history, after guiding the team to 22 wins, 73 points, and 2.15 points per game - all MLS records. For his efforts, Arena was awarded with his league-leading fourth MLS Coach of the Year honor.

In 2020, his first full season in New England, Arena led the Revolution to the Eastern Conference Final. Arena's impact in New England was immediately evident upon his arrival in Foxborough. Arena made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games at the helm and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club. The team's historic renaissance came despite Arena only making one in-season addition to the roster, bringing in Argentine striker Gustavo Bou via a club-record transfer in July.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, four Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 16 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With 275 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS entering the 2022 season, and a regular season record of 240-136-112 (.607), Arena is the league's winningest active head coach and owns the second-best winning percentage in MLS history. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 55 (35-13-7), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 70, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup - the country's best showing since 1930 - as well as an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16 and is now an assistant coach with F.C. Cincinnati.



CURT ONALFO
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his fourth season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joins the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 - including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ - and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 50, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring for Ridgefield High School, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.


