MATCH PREVIEW

New England Revolution II will host FC Cincinnati at Gillette Stadium on Sunday afternoon in their first of two meetings this season. The match kicks off at 2:00 p.m. ET and will stream on MLSNEXTPro.com. Revolution II Season Memberships and single-game tickets are on sale now. For more information, email tix@revolutionsoccer.net or call 1-877-GET-REVS.

Revolution II is coming off a 3-1 win against Rochester New York FC, their first victory of the 2022 season. Midfielder Michel Costa da Silva kicked off the scoring, notching the first goal of his career. Defender Sean O'Hearn also recorded his first professional goal with a free kick in first-half stoppage time, while Homegrown midfielder Damian Rivera scored his third goal in two games to cement New England's win. Goalkeeper Jacob Jackson earned the start in net for the second match in a row, making eight saves on nine shots.

The home opener also saw two professional debuts with 17-year-old Academy product Jack Panayotou and Brazilian midfielder Ryan Lima both coming on as subs in the second half. Panayotou became the 20th Academy player, and Ryan the 36th player overall, to make their professional debuts with New England's developmental team to date.

During the team's bye week, Rivera notched his second career MLS appearance with the first team against Inter Miami CF. The Rhode Island native entered as a substitute in the 83rd minute, spelling fellow Homegrown Player Justin Rennicks. Rennicks had featured extensively for Revolution II over the past two seasons and was able to break through for his first career MLS goal in the 11th minute against Inter Miami.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR VS. FC CINCINNATI 2:

- Revolution II extending their point streak to three games with a win or draw to open the season.
- Goalkeeper Jacob Jackson making his third professional start.
- Midfielder Michel hitting 1,800 minutes played with a 14-minute appearance.
- Academy graduates Esmir Bajraktarevic and Meny Silva both making their third consecutive starts of the season. Bajraktarevic has logged 90-minute performances in each of the season's first two games.
- Homegrown midfielder Damian Rivera returning to the second team after earning his second MLS appearance on April 9. Rivera has scored three goals in the first two MLS NEXT Pro games.
- New England adding to the 36 players – and 20 Revolution Academy products – who have made their professional debuts with Revolution II thus far.

LAST TIME OUT: REVS II NOTCH FIRST WIN OF SEASON VS RNYFC

New England Revolution II (1-0-1, 5 pts.) hosted Rochester New York FC (1-2-0, 3 pts.) for their home opener on April 3 where they secured the 3-1 win with goals coming from **Michel**, **Sean O'Hearn**, and **Damian Rivera**. Both Michel and O'Hearn's goals were the first of their careers while Rivera scored his third goal in two games so far this season.

"I think both players come to train everyday really hard, put in the effort, are looking to get better, and its good," Head Coach **Clint Peay** said postgame. "Michel worked very hard and has been eager to score, so I'm happy he finally got the monkey off his back. And then for Sean [O'Hearn], great free kick. He's always talked about how he should be the guy taking it and he proved himself correct."



Goalkeeper **Jacob Jackson** made his second start in as many games, blocking eight of the nine shots he faced including on coming off an indirect kick in front of his net.

The home opener also saw two professional debuts with Academy midfielder **Jack Panayotou** and Brazilian midfielder **Ryan Lima** both coming on as subs in the second half. Panayotou became the 20th Academy player and Ryan became the 36th total player to make their professional debuts with New England's developmental team to date.

MICHEL AND O'HEARN ON THE BOARD

Defender **Sean O'Hearn** and midfielder **Michel** both recoreded their first career goals vs. Rochester New York FC.

O'Hearn joined Revs II in 2021, becoming a pillar of the team's defense. He's logged just over 2,000 minutes played in 26 games with 23 starts. His goal came from a free kick just above the top left corner of the box, as he sailed it over three defenders and Rochester's goalkeeper to pick the top corner. O'Hearn spoke postgame on what notching his first goal was like.

"Well, I'm the one who thinks I should take it, but I've let Esmir [Barjraktarevic] and other people like Tico [Damian Rivera] take it in the past because they feel confident and I stepped up and I took it. It was a tall wall, like probably everyone in the wall is like 6-5 or 6-4. I just got it up over the wall and I was really excited to get my first goal on a free kick like that."



Michel opened the scoring in the game, stealing possession and going right to goal. The midfielder also joined Revs II in 2021 logging over 1,700 minutes in 23 appearances so far. The Brazilian spoke postgame on how that first tally culminates everything he's worked for in his career so far.

"It was amazing because this is what I've been working for my whole life. And I'm glad, because I work so hard and I put myself in a position where I could make it happen. I'm going to keep working hard and enjoy the game of football."

JUSTIN RENNICKS SCORES FIRST CAREER MLS GOAL

In Saturday's game at Inter Miami CF, Homegrown forward and Revs Academy product **Justin Rennicks** scored his first MLS goal.

"It's been just hard work and dedication," said Rennicks postgame. "I knew (the first goal) was going to come at some point, it was just a matter of when. So, I was glad to go out there and get it today."



The 23-year-old previously made 35 appearances with Revolution II during the 2020 and 2021 campaigns. Rennicks scored 9 goals with six of them being game-winners across over 2,700 minutes played with the second team. He's also the Revolution's only two-time UnitedHealthcare Academy Player of the Year award winner.

"Getting the goal was great," Rennicks stated. "You know, it's been a long time coming. It's been four years now and I've just been waiting to get that goal, so I finally got it"

TEAM NOTES

DAMIAN RIVERA MAKES APPEARANCE WITH FIRST TEAM

Homegrown midfielder **Damian Rivera** signed with the Revolution on Nov. 8, 2019 after more than three seasons in Revolution Academy. The 19-year old has scored three goals in two games so far with Revolution II this season and on Saturday, he earned his second all-time appearance with the first team.

Rivera entered the game in the 83rd minute, replacing another Homegrown player **Justin Rennicks**.



Rivera previously made a 28-minute appearance during the 2021 campaign in a 4-1 win over FC Cincinnati. Across over 2,800 minutes played with Revolution II, the midfielder has made 41 appearances scoring 11 goals with two assists.

IN GOOD HANDS: JACKSON STEADY IN HIS PRO DEBUT

Goalkeeper **Jacob Jackson** started in net vs. NYCFC II, making his professional debut with Revolution II. The Escondido, California native was selected 24th overall by New England in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft and spent the majority of his preseason training with the first team.



During Sunday's match, the goalkeeper made eight saves on ten shots faced. The point-blank save he made in the 69th minute gave his team the momentum needed to head straight into the attacking zone and tie the game.

Jackson, 21, made history as the first goalkeeper ever taken by the Revolution in the first round of the MLS SuperDraft and joins five other first-round picks on the Revolution roster. The Escondido, Calif. native was named the West Coast Conference Goalkeeper of the Year and an All-WCC First Team selection in each of the last two seasons, ranking sixth in the nation with a 0.67 goals against average as a senior during the fall of 2021. Among goalkeepers selected in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft, Jackson ranked third in career GAA, posting an 0.68 mark over three seasons.

PANAYOTOU BECOMES LATEST ACADEMY PLAYER TO DEBUT FOR REVS II

Since Revolution II launched ahead of the 2020 season, 36 different players have made their professional debuts with the team to date, including 20 current or former members of the Revolution Academy. Six Revolution Academy products made their professional debuts in 2021.

Revolution Academy midfielder **Jack Panayotou** (2004 - Cambridge, Mass.) became the 20th Academy player to make his professional debut with Revolution II on Sunday night.

Panayotou came in as a sub, replacing Academy graduate, **Hikaru Fujiwara**. The forward has recorded one goal and four assists so far with the U-19 team this season.

Alongside Panayotou, Academy graduate **Colby Quinones** also made an appearance off the bench in Sunday's match. Quinones, who made his debut in 2020 as the first Academy player to start a professional match in club history, entered the game in the 81st minute in place of defender **Sean O'Hearn**.

NOEL BUCK AND RYAN SPAULDING SIGN MLS CONTRACTS

Since the New England Revolution launched Revolution II ahead of the 2020 season, the club has completely transformed its pathway from its elite youth teams to the professional ranks. In only two seasons, five different players have ascended from Revolution II to sign with the first team, most recently the club's eighth Homegrown Player, **Noel Buck**, and defender **Ryan Spaulding**.

Buck, 17, is one of 30 players, along with Maciel and Bell, to make his professional debut with Revolution II since the club began play in 2020, and one of 18 current or former Academy players to do so. Buck signed his first professional contract with Revolution II in June 2021, one of six Academy players to sign a pro deal directly to the second team from the club's youth ranks: **Meny Silva**, **Dennis Ramirez**, **Colby Quiñones**, **Hikaru Fujiwara**, and **Esmir Bajraktarevic**.

Spaulding, 23, signed with Revolution II on January 16, 2020 and played two seasons with the USL League One side, setting team records in games played (42), starts (38), minutes (3,402) while totaling four goals and three assists in that span. A resident of Cary, N.C., Spaulding earned eight elections to the USL League One Team of the Week over the past two years and was one of three defenders named to the 2021 All-USL League One First Team, the first Revolution II player to earn the honor.

ESMIR IS HERE: SIXTH ACADEMY PLAYER SIGNS WITH REVS II

Ahead of the 2022 season, New England Revolution II signed Revolution Academy midfielder **Esmir Bajraktarevic** to a professional contract. The Wisconsin native became the sixth Revolution Academy product to earn promotion to Revolution II. Bajraktarevic, now 17, became the second-youngest player to sign with Revolution II to date since the club began play in 2020.



Bajraktarevic joined the Revolution Academy's residency program in August 2021. The midfielder immediately began training with Revolution II and made his professional debut on Aug. 21. Bajraktarevic spent the final three months of the 2021 USL League One season with Revolution II, appearing in 11 games with five starts and logging 457 minutes. He netted his first professional goal on Sept. 11 at North Carolina FC, becoming the third different Academy player to score a goal in a professional match for Revs II in 2021. During the offseason, Bajraktarevic was invited to the United States Under-20 National Team January Training Camp, the youngest member of the roster.

RIVERA NOTCHES THIRD BRACE IN TEAM HISTORY

Homegrown midfielder **Damian Rivera** earned the start for Revolution II in the season opener for the second consecutive season, logging 79 minutes.

Rivera opened the scoring in the match in the seventh minute with a right footed shot from the center of the box.

After the team went down by a goal, a save from goalkeeper Jacob Jackson led to some attacking zone time, where Michel would serve a pass to Rivera, who sent the ball into the net from the left side of the box.

"Definitely excited to get those two goals under my belt," Rivera said post-game. "I've been working hard this preseason and to get those goals, it's another confidence booster, and it's really exciting."

The first multi-goal game of Rivera's career also serves as the teams third brace in their history. Both goals acted as bookends to two things the team has been working on: scoring goals first and fighting back when they're down.

"Yeah, first of all, it was huge," Head Coach **Clint Peay** stated. "We talked about scoring first, so it was good for not only Damian [Rivera], but the team, to give us a lift and give us a boost and then going down a goal, getting back the way we did, fighting and taking a moment of transition, going straight to goal in an effective way was something that we talked about a lot and it's good to see that we were able to capitalize on it."



HEAD COACH

Clint Peay is in his third season as the first head coach of Revolution II, the New England Revolution's developmental side that began play in USL League One in 2020, following his appointment to the position on Nov. 20, 2019. Peay brings to the club more than 18 years of coaching experience with a focus on youth player development including an eight-year tenure working in the U.S. Youth National Team program and 10 years as a collegiate head coach and assistant.

Peay, 47, spent the 2019 season as an assistant coach with USL Championship side North Carolina FC, where he worked alongside Dave Sarachan and helped guide the club to an Eastern Conference playoff berth. An experienced scout and evaluator of up-and-coming talent, Peay worked on U.S. Soccer's technical staff from 2012-19, beginning as a member of the Under-17 staff. He was later named head coach of the U-14 Boys' National Team in 2016, before advancing to manage the U-15 Boys' National Team in 2018, where he succeeded current Revolution Assistant Coach Dave van den Bergh in that role.

Prior to joining U.S. Soccer, Peay built his resume over four coaching stints at the collegiate level, including four seasons as head coach at Richmond University from 2009-12. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Georgetown University in 2003, before moving on to Davidson College from 2004-07, where he helped the Wildcats to back-to-back appearances in the conference final in his first two seasons. He later worked as an assistant coach with George Mason in 2008, helping guide the Patriots to the Colonial Athletic Association conference title in 2008.

A proven winner at the game's highest levels, Peay enjoyed a decorated playing career spanning a decade from his collegiate days at the University of Virginia (1991-95) through five MLS seasons with D.C. United (1996-2000).

Prior to joining the Revolution Academy, Santos served as an assistant for Marquette University, where he coached for 10 seasons. He also spent years as a U.S. Soccer Federation network scout, responsible for identifying and evaluating potential U.S. Youth National Team players in Milwaukee and Chicago, conducting training evaluations for U.S. Development Academy clubs, and conducting training centers for players with international potential.

Santos, 40, joined Marquette as a volunteer assistant in 2008 and served in that role for four seasons prior to being promoted to full-time assistant on head coach Louis Bennett's staff. While coaching at Marquette, Santos saw the Eagles claim two BIG EAST regular season titles (2011, 2013), a BIG EAST tournament championship (2013), and two NCAA tournament appearances (2012, 2013). In 2011, Marquette's coaching staff was named BIG EAST Coaching Staff of the Year. At least a dozen of Santos' players went on to play professionally including Columbus Crew SC defender Axel Sjöberg, Austin Bold FC midfielder Calum Mallace, New York City FC goalkeeper Luis Barraza, New York Red Bulls defender Patrick Seagrist, and former LAFC, Seattle Sounders, and current MLS Pool goalkeeper Charlie Lyon.

In 2016, Santos served as head coach of Kokomo Mantis FC of the Premier Development League. In their lone season, Santos led Mantis FC to a 4-6-4 record and fourth place finish in the Heartland Division of the PDL Central Division.



YUTA NOMURA
GOALKEEPER COACH

Yuta Nomura is in his third season as the goalkeeper coach for Revolution II, the New England Revolution's developmental side, following his appointment to the position on Feb. 3, 2020. Nomura spent the 2017-19 seasons tutoring goalkeepers on the coaching staff at the University of Central Arkansas in NCAA Division I.

In Nomura's first season at Central Arkansas, he was part of a coaching staff that collectively won the Missouri Valley Conference Coaching Staff of the Year award. Central Arkansas finished 8-6-4 overall in 2018, including 4-1-1 in conference play. Nomura helped guide UCA to a 2018 Missouri Valley Conference title and a berth in the D-I NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament. After switching to the Sun Belt Conference in 2019, Nomura stayed on staff to help guide the Bears to a Sun Belt Conference regular season title with a 4-1 league record and a 10-7-1 finish overall.

Prior to his coaching days, the native of Tokyo, Japan spent parts of two seasons playing professionally in Sweden for BK Olympic, based out of Malmö, from 2017-18. In his first season, he helped lead the club to promotion back to the Västra Götaland followed by a ninth-place finish in Tier 4 for the 2018 season.

Nomura, 27, played collegiately for NAIA school Lindsey Wilson College in Columbia, Kentucky where he majored in communications. As a freshman in 2011, Nomura started all 23 games for the Blue Raiders, leading the team to an NAIA National Title and an undefeated season. That year, he set career-highs in save percentage (.838), shutouts (14), goals allowed (12), and saves (62).



DANIEL KIRWAN
SPORTS PERFORMANCE COACH

Daniel Kirwan is in his third season as the Sports Performance Coach for Revolution II, the New England Revolution's third-division professional side, following his appointment to the position on Feb. 3, 2020. Kirwan made the move to New England following five seasons with D.C. United in roles with the First Team, USL second team, and Academy programs.

Most recently, Kirwan served as the Strength and Power coach for D.C. United during the 2018 and 2019 seasons. Prior to holding that position, he was hired by the Black and Red as a Physical Preparation and Performance Analyst, a role he held from March 2015 through the end of 2017. His responsibilities included the development of supplemental training schedules along with strength and conditioning workouts.

Kirwan, 29, began his career as a Strength and Conditioning Student Assistant for the Clemson football program while attending the university. During his undergraduate tenure, he assisted in the development of 24 NFL players. He graduated from Clemson in 2015 with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology.

In January of 2019, Kirwan was hired by U.S. Soccer as a sports scientist, traveling abroad with the U-16 team to the UEFA Development Tournament in May 2019 and Malbork, Poland with the U-15 team in October of 2019. He also made the trip to Florida with the U-16 team in November, joining the staff that helped guide the youth team to victory at the 2019 Nike Friendlies.

His experience in developing younger talent stems from his early days when he also helped train high school athletes in his hometown of Bethesda, Md.

BRUCE ARENA
SPORTING DIRECTOR

Bruce Arena is in his fourth season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first three seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has revived the Revolution by leading the side to three consecutive MLS Cup Playoff appearances. His .634 winning percentage with New England entering 2022 is the best of any manager in the club's history. Last season, Arena won his record fourth Supporters' Shield, the first in Revolution history, after guiding the team to 22 wins, 73 points, and 2.15 points per game - all MLS records. For his efforts, Arena was awarded with his league-leading fourth MLS Coach of the Year honor.

In 2020, his first full season in New England, Arena led the Revolution to the Eastern Conference Final. Arena's impact in New England was immediately evident upon his arrival in Foxborough. Arena made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games at the helm and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club. The team's historic renaissance came despite Arena only making one in-season addition to the roster, bringing in Argentine striker Gustavo Bou via a club-record transfer in July.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, four Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 16 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With 275 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS entering the 2022 season, and a regular season record of 240-136-112 (.607), Arena is the league's winningest active head coach and owns the second-best winning percentage in MLS history. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 55 (35-13-7), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 70, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup - the country's best showing since 1930 - as well as an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16 and is now an assistant coach with F.C. Cincinnati.



CURT ONALFO
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his fourth season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joins the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 - including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ - and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 50, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring for Ridgefield High School, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.


