



CLUB HISTORY

1996 / 16-16-0

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS, U.S. OPEN CUP CHAMPIONS

The club's inaugural season in 1996 proved to be a fruitful one for the Black-And-Red. After a slow start in League play, United found the right balance and went into the postseason as the team to beat. They proved to be just that, defeating the Los Angeles Galaxy 3-2 in overtime via a golden goal header by defender Eddie Pope to capture the first MLS Cup title on October 20. One trophy was not enough for the Black-and-Red that fall, as three days later, United shut out the Rochester Raging Rhinos of the A-League (now the USL First Division) 3-0 to win the U.S. Open Cup, the country's oldest soccer tournament. The Black-and-Red became the first club to capture America's version of the "double."

1997 / 21-11-0

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS, SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS

The team's second season was another banner year for United, as the team rolled through the regular season with a League-best record of 21-11. D.C., went a perfect 5-0 in the MLS Cup Playoffs, which culminated in a 2-1 victory over the Colorado Rapids in MLS Cup '97 in front of a record – and rabid – home crowd of 57,431 at RFK Stadium.

1998 / 24-8-0

CONCACAF CHAMPIONS' CUP WINNERS, INTERAMERICAN CUP WINNERS

United failed to capture domestic honors for the first time in its short history, losing to the Chicago Fire 2-0 in MLS Cup '98. Though United would be disappointed on the home front, their previous success gave them the opportunity to seek honors on a larger stage. After reaching the semifinals of the CONCACAF Champions' Cup in 1997, the Black-and-Red made it one step further to the finals in 1998, where it faced Mexican "supercampeon" Toluca. A dramatic 1-0 victory at RFK Stadium not only gave the Black-and-Red its first international trophy, but also a chance for a second by earning a berth to the 1998 InterAmerican Cup. Legendary Brazilian side Vasco da Gama would be South America's representative, and it proved to be a formidable side, winning the first leg of the championship at RFK Stadium by a 1-0 score. However, United shocked the Brazilian team, and much of the soccer world, by winning the away leg at Lockhart Stadium in Ft. Lauderdale by a 2-1 margin. Thanks to a pair of road goals, United won the fixture on the away goals rule and came away with the InterAmerican Cup trophy and the title "Champion of the Americas." That contest proved to be a fitting farewell for head coach Bruce Arena, who left the District of Columbia to conquer further international battles as the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team.

1999 / 23-9-0

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS, SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS

The 1999 season would feature a new coach, as former Tampa Bay Mutiny and New England Revolution Head Coach Thomas Rongen took over on the United sideline. The club produced the same successful results its supporters now demanded, as the squad earned its second Supporters' Shield for the League's best regular season record (23-9) and once again represented the Eastern Conference in the MLS Cup. Just as in 1996, MLS Cup '99 featured the Black-and-Red and the Galaxy in Foxborough, but this time dramatics were not necessary as a pair of first-half goals gave United a 2-0 victory and its third Alan I. Rothenberg Trophy in four seasons.

2000 / 8-18-6

For the first time in club history, United failed to qualify for postseason competition or capture any sort of silverware. The team managed a record of just 2-9-1 to start the season and never recovered from its early struggles, finishing last in the Eastern Division. The team's midseason 3-1 win over Newcastle United at RFK Stadium was one of the rare positives in a difficult campaign. Another of the bright spots during the 2000 campaign was the debut of 16-year old midfielder Bobby Convey, who at the time of his first game – March 25 versus the Los Angeles Galaxy – was the youngest player to play in an MLS game.

2001 / 8-16-2

The 2001 campaign saw United supporters suffer another difficult year as the club finished last in the Eastern Division and missed out on the playoffs in consecutive seasons. For the second year in a row, United had a player debut as the youngest in League history when Santino Quaranta came on as a substitute against the New England Revolution on May 9. The 16-year-old also became the youngest player to be named as a Player of the Week and an MLS All-Star.

2002 / 9-14-5

After two disappointing seasons, United named former Miami Fusion skipper Ray Hudson as the club's third head coach on 1/8. Hudson saw his new club's push for the postseason last until the final match of the schedule, but the Black-and-Red missed out on the MLS Cup Playoffs for a third straight season. 2002 did have some bright spots, however, with a trio of club and League firsts. Domestically, United hosted the 2002 MLS All-Star Game at RFK Stadium for the first time and also won the inaugural Atlantic Cup trophy in its yearly season series with New York. Internationally, the Black-and-Red became the first MLS side to travel to England when it defeated Tottenham Hotspur 1-0 in a tribute match at the famed White Hart Lane in October.

2003 / 10-11-9

Following a third unsuccessful campaign, the club used the time before the start of the 2003 season to make drastic changes to the squad. U.S. National Team star Earnie Stewart was allocated to the club, bringing the veteran home from Holland, where he enjoyed unparalleled success for an American expatriate. Richie Williams, Eddie Pope and Jaime Moreno all headed north to join the New York MetroStars, while defender Mike Petke made the reverse journey to join the Black-and-Red. Former Indiana University standout and MLS All-Star Dema Kovalenko was also brought in to shake things up in the midfield, while his Fire teammate and Bulgarian legend Hristo Stoichkov was added as a player/coach. Though United struggled early in the season to pick up points, the off-season moves did pay off, as the club posted a regular season record of 10-11-9, sending the club back to the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since last winning it all in 1999. However, a fourth MLS Cup was not in the cards and United fell to the Chicago Fire in the first round of the postseason.

2004 / 11-10-9

MLS CUP CHAMPIONS

The beginning of 2004 was an exciting time for the Black-and-Red, as head coach Peter Nowak and teen phenom Freddy Adu both joined the club in January. Nowak became the fourth United coach in team history, while Freddy was the first overall selection in the MLS SuperDraft. Jaime Moreno returned to D.C. following a one-year stint with the New York MetroStars. After a 5-5-5 start during the first part of the MLS regular season, United began to buy into Coach Nowak's hardworking, aggressive and team-oriented strategy and finished the regular season with an 11-10-9 record. In the final game of the regular season, the team registered a thrilling 3-2 victory over the MetroStars that vaulted the team past New York and into second place in the Eastern Conference standings. United carried its hot streak into the playoffs and dispatched of the MetroStars in the first round and the New England Revolution in the Eastern Conference championship on the way to its fifth MLS Cup championship game. Led by MLS Cup MVP Alecko Eskandarian, United went on to defeat the Kansas City Wizards 3-2 and capture its fourth MLS Cup championship. In all, United finished the season with nine victories in its last 10 games while achieving its "Return to Glory."

2005 / 16-10-6

In 2005, after a middling beginning to the season, United rebounded and finished second in the Eastern Conference with a record of 16-10-6. Its 16 wins were the most since 1999, when the team won 23 games. Jaime Moreno again led the Black-and-Red charge, tallying 16 goals – tied for his career best. The year also featured appearances in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, Copa Nissan Sudamericana and an international friendly versus the reigning English Premier League Champion, Chelsea FC. The club's MLS season ended with a disappointing loss in the first round of MLS Cup Playoffs to the Chicago Fire.

2006 / 15-7-10**SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS**

D.C. United reasserted themselves as the best team in Major League Soccer in 2006, bringing home their third Supporters' Shield trophy with a 15-7-10 record. United started off the season in torrid form – going unbeaten from May 1 to July 29 – for a team-best 14 straight matches. Christian Gomez led the League's most potent offense, chalking up 12 goals and 11 assists on his way to the MLS MVP award. Other highlights for the year included a 4-0 victory over Scotland's Celtic FC and an impressive 1-1 draw against the famed Real Madrid of Spain. The club's MLS season ended with a 1-0 loss in the Eastern Conference championship to the visiting New England Revolution.

2007 / 16-7-7**SUPPORTERS' SHIELD WINNERS**

Tom Soehn became the fifth head coach in United history after Peter Nowak left to become an assistant coach with the U.S. Men's National Team. Soehn, who had served as an assistant under Nowak since 2004, got off to a slow start, beginning the season 0-3. The Black-and-Red, however, rebounded and for the second consecutive season had the most potent attack in MLS. United won its fourth Supporters' Shield, becoming the first team in League history to win the award in back-to-back years. The addition of Brazilians Luciano Emilio and Fred, along with veterans Jaime Moreno, Christian Gomez and Ben Olsen helped the team score 56 regular season goals. In August, Moreno scored his 109th career regular season goal, breaking the MLS record. He finished the season with 112 career goals. The campaign also featured the club's participation in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, the inaugural SuperLiga and Copa Nissan Sudamericana.

2008 / 11-15-4**LAMAR HUNT U.S. OPEN CUP CHAMPIONS**

Though the 2008 season saw United add their 12th major piece of silverware to the trophy case, the campaign was largely a disappointment as D.C. missed out on the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time since 2002. After a terrible 2-7 start in League play, the team found its groove through the middle part of the year, going 8-3-1 from May 4 until August 23. Unfortunately, injuries decimated Tom Soehn's side and the team's record down the stretch was a dismal 1-5-3. Matters were complicated by the most games in club history – an astonishing 47 fixtures. The team fell short in international competitions, failing to capture hardware in the CONCACAF Champions' Cup, SuperLiga and CONCACAF Champions League. The lone bright spot was the team's second Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup championship, which was captured after a 2-1 win over the Charleston Battery of United Soccer League's First Division.

2009 / 9-8-13

Despite the fact that United made significant changes to the 2008 team, the Black-and-Red found itself at the end of the 2009 campaign without hardware and, for the second year in a row, out of the playoffs. The team collected a League-record 13 draws as it put together a 9-8-13 mark. The club began the season admirably and found itself in first place in the Eastern Conference at the midpoint of the season with a record of 5-2-8. As the summer wore on and the games piled up, D.C., did not get the results it needed, managing a record of just 4-6-5 in the second half of the year. In non-League competitions, United also fell short. An impressive run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup ended with a deflating 2-1 loss to the expansion Seattle Sounders FC at RFK Stadium. The team showed vast improvement in CONCACAF Champions League play, finishing the group stage with a 3-2-1 record, but failed to advance to the next round. The play of rookies Chris Pontius and Rodney Wallace, along with newcomers Dejan Jakovic, Julius James and Josh Wicks, in particular, gave United fans hope the team would soon reestablish itself atop Major League Soccer.

2010 / 6-24-4

Steadying the ship in United's most tumultuous season, Ben Olsen took over as interim head coach from Curt Onalfo on August 7 at New England. The Black-and-Red showed marked improvement under Olsen, winning 2-0 over the Philadelphia Union on August 22 and beating eventual MLS Cup champions Colorado Rapids 1-0 on the road on October 1. United also reached the semifinal round of the 2010 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, falling in extra time to the Columbus Crew. The lasting image of the 2010 campaign was of club captain and 15-year MLS veteran Jaime Moreno taking his lap of honor around RFK Stadium on October 23 in his final match for D.C. United against Toronto FC. Moreno retired as MLS's all-time leading goal scorer with 133 tallies.

2011 / 9-13-12

United made big strides in 2011, as the team was in the playoff hunt until the final week of the season. The mid-season acquisition of Dwayne De Rosario provided United the playmaker it had been lacking as the Canadian tallied 13 goals and seven assists in 17 games en route to the League's scoring title and MVP award. Through 25 games, United had the best record of all Eastern Conference teams, but injuries to Chris Pontius and Dejan Jakovic were the catalyst to a 1-6-2 finish to the season. The year also included friendlies against reigning Dutch champion Ajax FC and England's Everton FC.

2012 / 17-10-7

After a disappointing end to the 2011 campaign and the fourth straight season without making the postseason, Head Coach Ben Olsen and the technical staff made the difficult decision to part ways with several club veterans. Santino Quaranta (10 seasons in DC), Clyde Simms (7 seasons), Devon McTavish (6 seasons), and Marc Burch (5 seasons) all departed as United rebuilt. United had an up-and-down season – that saw the club go undefeated at home since opening night and three named to the MLS All-Star Game roster (Olsen, Pontius, De Rosario), but finished the year on a high note after 2011 MLS MVP Dwayne De Rosario went down with an injury while on Canadian National Team duty. Instead of finishing the season poorly as many in the soccer world expected, United went undefeated in their next seven games to lock up their first playoff berth in five years along with the number two seed in the 2014 MLS Cup Playoffs.

2013 / 3-24-7

LAMAR HUNT U.S. OPEN CUP CHAMPIONS

Out of a season full of difficulty, injuries, bad luck and disappointment, D.C. United completed a stirring run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, capturing the title for the third time. United opened the competition with a penalty shootout win over its USL Pro affiliate, the Richmond Kickers, before beating Philadelphia, New England and Chicago en route to the final on the road at Real Salt Lake. Lewis Neal's goal was the difference at Rio Tinto Stadium, where the Black-and-Red stunned the hosts, 1-0. The trophy celebration brought relief as United set an MLS record for fewest victories in a season. Perry Kitchen, who made 31 appearances (31 starts), was named the team's most valuable player.

2014 / 17-9-7

With a rebuilt roster full of new faces and a maturing group of young players, D.C. United completed the biggest single season turnaround in MLS history, improving 45 points from their finish in 2013. Under the stewardship of General Manager Dave Kasper and Head Coach Ben Olsen, the Black-and-Red had one of the toughest defenses in MLS and a variety of contributions on offense while players in multiple positions throughout the squad had career seasons. Among them, Bill Hamid was a frontrunner for goalkeeper of the year, center back Bobby Boswell was a candidate for defender of the year in his first year back in D.C. after a six-season absence, rookie Steven Birnbaum locked down the backline alongside Boswell and Fabián Espindola was an outside contender for MLS MVP. United captured first place in the Eastern Conference and posted a perfect 4-0-0 record in CONCACAF Champions League group play to qualify for the quarterfinals of the competition in early 2015.

2015 / 15-13-6

En route to their 12th postseason appearance in 20 seasons, D.C. United set the pace early in the regular season. With three 1-0 victories in their first four matches, the Black-and-Red took over first place in early April and held it until mid-September, meanwhile establishing a new club record of 20 straight matches at home without a defeat. United utilized 29 different starting lineups in 34 matches, had a goal or assist from 18 different players, came from behind to win eight times and won 11 one-goal matches. The Black-and-Red went 3-0-1 in the group stage of the Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League.

GENERAL MANAGER AND VICE PRESIDENT OF SOCCER OPERATIONS

D.C. United General Manager and Vice President of Soccer Operations Dave Kasper has overseen the club's Major League Soccer team for nearly a decade and a half. Under his stewardship, D.C. United recently qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs for the second consecutive season and third time in four years. In 2014, Kasper was a critical leader in the biggest single-season turnaround in Major League Soccer history, as the Black-and-Red finished atop the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2007.

During Kasper's 14-year tenure, D.C. United have won five major trophies: the 2004 MLS Cup, two MLS Supporters Shields (2006 and 2007) and two Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups (2008 and 2013). United also reached the 2009 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup final and have earned eight playoff appearances, including three as the first place team in the Eastern Conference. Kasper has managed 16 MLS Best XI selections, including three MLS MVPs: Christian Gomez (2006), Luciano Emilio (2007) and Dwayne De Rosario (2011). He has also had two goalkeepers of the year, Troy Perkins (2006) and Bill Hamid (2014), one defender of the year, Bobby Boswell (2006) and one rookie of the year, Andy Najar (2010). In addition to Najar, four other D.C. United players have been named a rookie of the year finalist in the last six seasons: Chris Pontius (2009), Perry Kitchen (2011), Nick DeLeon (2012) and Steven Birnbaum (2014).

Kasper, who was originally named Technical Director in Dec. 2001 and then General Manager in Sept. 2007, also has overseen the dramatic growth and success of D.C. United's youth development efforts, including the D.C. United Academy. He has been largely responsible for one of the strongest academy systems in Major League Soccer, bringing seven local products through the ranks to the First Team: Andy Najar, Bill Hamid, Ethan White, Conor Shanosky, Michael Seaton, Collin Martin and Jalen Robinson. Najar, who played for Honduras at the 2014 FIFA World Cup, was the first Homegrown player to be named MLS Rookie of the Year in 2010 and the first Homegrown player to permanently move to a European side when he was signed by Belgium's R.S.C. Anderlecht in January 2013. Hamid was the first Homegrown player to be named MLS Goalkeeper of the Year Award in 2014.

Kasper has a wide variety of soccer experience as a player, coach and front office executive. During his playing career, Kasper was a standout forward at the University of Maryland, earning All-ACC honors while also serving as a member of the U-20 U.S. Men's National Team. He played professionally for the Milwaukee Wave (1989-90) and the Pittsburgh Stingrays (1990-94) and transitioned into Duquesne University's first-ever head coach. Kasper was named general manager of the Pittsburgh Riverhounds in 1998 (USL-1). The following year, Kasper led the organization to the playoffs and to Organization of the Year honors.

Kasper lives in Ashburn, Va., with his wife, Lizzethe, and daughters, Alexandra and Isabella.



BEN OLSEN

HEAD COACH

Ben Olsen is the longest-tenured Head Coach in D.C. United history, having served since the middle of the 2010 season. With Olsen on the sideline, the Black-and-Red have qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs three times in the last four years, including back-to-back seasons in 2014-15, the first time since 2006-07. In 2014, Olsen was named MLS Coach of the Year after helping guide the Black-and-Red to the biggest single-season turnaround in Major League Soccer history, finishing the regular season in first place in the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2007 and with the most points in team history. Olsen has led the Black-and-Red to double-digit victories in three of the last four seasons and is one of 20 coaches in league history with at least 60 victories.

Following his retirement as a player, Olsen's coaching career began in 2010 as an assistant under Curt Onalfo. Midway through the campaign, Olsen replaced Onalfo, making his debut as Interim Head Coach on August 7 at New England. Olsen won his first match in charge on August 22 against Philadelphia and was hired permanently on November 29, 2010. At 33-years-old he was the youngest coach in Major League Soccer. In 2012, Olsen guided D.C. United to the MLS Cup Playoffs for the first time in five years and was named as a finalist for MLS Coach of the Year.

Arguably one of the most popular players in D.C. United history, Olsen was among the club's all-time leaders in several categories at the time of his retirement – second in games played (221), minutes played (17,098) and game-winning goals (13), third in assists (49) and seventh in goals (29). He won eight total trophies with D.C. United, including two MLS Cups (1999 & 2004). He was also a two-time All-Star (1998 & 1999), the 1998 MLS Rookie of the Year, the 1999 MLS Cup MVP, the 2003 USSF Humanitarian of the Year and was named to the MLS Best XI in 2007.

Olsen also had an illustrious career with the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 37 caps and scoring six goals. He was a member of the 2006 World Cup team and part of the team that reached the bronze medal game at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Olsen made his full international debut against Australia on November 6, 1998, and scored his first goal against Chile on February 21, 1999.

Prior to his professional career, Olsen spent three seasons at the University of Virginia from 1995-1997. During his time with the Cavaliers, the team posted a 56-8-8 record. The midfielder compiled 34 goals with 41 assists and started and played every game (69) of his collegiate career. After his junior season, he was named the 1997 Soccer America Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Hermann Trophy.



CHAD ASHTON

ASSISTANT COACH

Chad Ashton joined D.C. United's technical staff prior to the start of the 2007 season. He currently serves as an Assistant Coach to Ben Olsen after holding the same position under Tom Soehn from 2007-2009. In 2010, Ashton served as the club's Technical Director before a move back to the sidelines when Olsen was named Interim Head Coach midway through the 2010 season.

Ashton helped guide the team to the Supporters' Shield in his first season in 2007 and capture the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in 2008 and 2013. He joined United after ten seasons as the Head Coach of men's soccer at University of Denver, where he compiled a record of 85-85-14, ranking him as the second-

most winning coach in school history. In 2006, he was named Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Co-Coach of the Year after guiding the Pioneers to an 11-5-2 record. It was his second Coach of the Year honor, having also won the award in 2004.

During the 1990s, Ashton played professionally with Colorado Foxes of the American Professional Soccer League, the Wichita Wings of the National Professional Soccer League and MLS' Dallas Burn.

Ashton was a three-time All-ACC midfielder at the University of North Carolina and finished his collegiate career in 1989 as the Tarheels' all-time leader in assists with 43, a record he still holds. Ashton also helped UNC to two NCAA tournament appearances, including a berth in the 1987 Final Four. In high school, he was selected as the Colorado High School Player of the Year in 1986.



ZACH THORNTON

DIRECTOR OF GOALKEEPING, ASSISTANT COACH

Zach Thornton joined D.C. United before the 2015 MLS season from Villanova University, where he served as the Associate Head Coach for the Men's Soccer team from January 2013 -January 2015. Prior to Villanova, Thornton volunteered his time at Loyola University for the 2012 season. He also holds a U.S. Soccer Federation National "B" Coaching License.

Thornton enjoyed an illustrious playing career, earning nine caps for the U.S. National Team, playing 16 season in MLS and for the Portuguese giant Benfica from 2003-2004, where he won the Portuguese Cup. Thornton won one MLS Cup, four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups, one Supporters' Shield and was MLS runners-up in 2000 and 2003. He was a six-time MLS All-Star, earned MLS

Goalkeeper of the Year honors twice, was named the MLS Comeback Player of the Year and was named to MLS Best XI twice.

He was also the Chicago Fire Team MVP in 2002, Chicago's Defensive Player of the Year in 2001 and '02 and Chivas USA's Team MVP in 2009. Thornton was named as an alternate for both the 1996 Olympics and the 2002 World Cup.

Before playing professionally, Thornton was an NSCAA All-American at Loyola University for soccer in 1993 and 1994, and earned All American Honor for lacrosse in 1994 and 1995. He was inducted into the university's Hall of Fame for both sports in 2003. At Essex Community College of Baltimore County, he was inducted into the NJCAA Soccer Hall of Fame in 2000, the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2015, and the CCBC Hall of Fame for both sports in 2012.



AMOS MAGEE

ASSISTANT COACH

Amos Magee joined D.C. United in 2014 as U-23 Head Coach and Assistant Coach to the First Team before moving solely to the First Team in 2015. Magee came to United after two seasons as the Head Coach of the Portland Timbers Reserves and Assistant Coach for the Timbers first team.

A native of St. Paul, Minn., Magee attended Wesleyan University and is the all-time leading scorer (35 goals and 85 points) for the Cardinals, as well as a member of the Wesleyan University Hall of Fame. After college, he played for United Soccer League (USL) side Minnesota Thunder for 12 seasons, becoming its all-time leading goal scorer (64) en route to being inducted in the USL Hall of

Fame in 2008. After his time with the Thunder, he had several loan stints with Major League Soccer (MLS) sides Tampa Bay Mutiny and Chicago Fire.

Magee began his coaching career with the Minnesota Thunder in 2006, and in 2007 led the U.S. Maccabi squad to a gold medal in the 2007 Pan American Maccabiah in Buenos Aires, Argentina. In 2008, he was named Director of Soccer Development for the Portland Timbers, then a USL side, until being named Head Coach of the Timbers Reserves in 2011.



ONE-GOAL WINS

D.C. United lead MLS with 11 wins in one-goal games in 2015. Chris Rolfe is tied for third in game-winning goals (5) and Davy Arnaud is tied for third with three game-winning assists. The Black-and-Red have played 18 contests decided by one goal, second only to Chicago, which is 5-14 in one-goal games.

COME-FROM-BEHIND VICTORIES

D.C. United recorded their MLS-leading eighth win after allowing the first goal with its 2-1 victory over New York City FC on Oct. 2. The Black-and-Red are 8-10-2 when allowing the first goal; No other MLS team has more than four victories in the same category. The Black-and-Red have also come from behind vs. Real Salt Lake on Aug. 1 (6-4), vs. Philadelphia on July 26 (3-2) and May 30 (2-1), vs. New England on June 21 (2-1), vs. Chicago on June 3 (1-0), vs. Orlando City on May 13 (2-1) and at Vancouver on Apr. 25 (2-1).

D.C. UNITED'S EVERCHANGING STARTING XI

D.C. United used 29 different starting lineups in 34 games in 2015, and 24 of 28 players on the roster have made MLS appearances. United's starting lineup was the same against New York City FC on Oct. 2 and Chicago on Oct. 18, the fourth time the team used the same first XI in back-to-back games in 2015.

A VARIETY OF CONTRIBUTORS

A total of 18 different United players have a goal or an assist in 2015. D.C. United are tied for first in MLS with Sporting Kansas City (18) and is just ahead of Vancouver (16), Portland (15), Los Angeles (15) and New England (13).

RECORD AGAINST EXPANSION TEAMS AT RFK

With its 2-1 win over New York City FC on Oct. 2, D.C. United improved to 11-1-2 against expansion and relocated MLS teams on their first visits to RFK Stadium, with the only loss coming against Seattle in 2009. In 2015, the Black-and-Red also topped Orlando City FC, 2-1, on May 13.

SUCCESS SINCE 2014

D.C. United (32-22-14, 110 points) own the third best record in MLS since the start of 2014, just behind 2014 MLS Supporters' Shield winner Seattle (35-23-10, 115 points) and Los Angeles (31-18-19, 112 points) and ahead of Dallas (32-22-12, 108 points) and New England (31-25-12, 105 points).

TALE OF TWO HALVES

D.C. United are tied for fifth in MLS in 2015 in goals scored in the second half, with 30 of 43 goals coming after halftime, including 27 of 43 in the 60th minute or later. The Black-and-Red also lead the MLS in least amount of goals allowed in the second half with only 0.62 goals on average, ahead of Portland (0.56).

THE INFLUENCE OF ESPÍNDOLA

Fabián Espíndola recorded his team-leading seventh assist and fifth goal of the season in D.C. United's 4-0 win over Chicago on Oct. 18. In 16 appearances this season Espíndola is averaging a goal or assist every 106 minutes. He is two shy of his career-high nine assists in 2014, and he has 16 assists in two seasons with D.C. United, three shy of the 19 assists he recorded in his first seven seasons in MLS. D.C. United are 9-5-2 when Espíndola plays in 2015, outscoring opponents 29-18, and 6-7-4 when he does not. Espíndola made his first start of 2015 in United's 2-1 win over Vancouver on Apr. 25, following a six-game suspension to start the season. He scored his first goal of the 2015 season and also tallied an assist against Columbus on May 2. Espíndola is coming off the most productive of his eight seasons in MLS. In 2014, he was tied for D.C. United's scoring lead with a career-high 11 goals and had a team- and career-high nine assists. He is one of only four MLS players with at least nine goals every year from 2011-14, a group that includes Landon Donovan, Thierry Henry and Chris Wondolowski. Espíndola also has two goals in 2015 outside of MLS play against Alajuelense in the 2014-15 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League.

ROLFE SETS NEW CAREER-HIGH, RE-SIGNS WITH D.C. UNITED

Chris Rolfe established a new career-high with his 10th goal of the season in D.C. United's 2-1 loss to Columbus on Sept. 19. The Ohio native is the leader among active MLS players with 9 goals against the club from his home state. The 2015 campaign is the fourth in Rolfe's nine seasons in MLS that he has recorded at least eight goals in a season and the eighth that he has scored at least six. His two-goal game against Real Salt Lake on Aug. 1 was his second multi-goal game of the season with his first coming against New England (2-1) on June 21. His streak earlier this season of four consecutive games with a goal or an assist is tied for the third-longest in MLS in 2015. Against Houston (Apr. 18) and Vancouver (Apr. 25), Rolfe had goals in back-to-back games, recording his first goal of the 2015 season with a spectacular free kick in the 36th minute of United's 1-1 draw with the Dynamo. Rolfe finished 2014 with six goals and six assists. He now has 64 career goals, good for ninth among active MLS players and 27th all-time. He is also tied for third in MLS with five game-winning goals. On Sept. 24, D.C. United announced that Rolfe and club agreed to a contract extension.

ROLFE PLUS ESPÍNDOLA EQUALS SUCCESS

Since the arrival of Chris Rolfe from the Chicago Fire in April 2014, D.C. United are 15-7-5 when Rolfe and Fabián Espíndola are both in the starting XI. The Black-and-Red are 6-6-2 in 2015 after going 9-1-3 with the pair in the lineup in 2014.

HAMID DOMINANT AGAIN IN 2015, CALLED UP TO U.S. MEN'S NATIONAL TEAM

Reigning MLS Goalkeeper of the Year Bill Hamid was called into the U.S. Men's National Team ahead of its friendly match against Costa Rica on Oct. 13. Hamid is second in the MLS in saves percentage (.759) and is seventh in the MLS in allowed per game (1.16 average). The 24-year-old - D.C. United's first Homegrown signing - is fifth in saves (101) and tied for fifth in shutouts (8). On May 1, Hamid and D.C. United agreed to a multi-year contract extension. Hamid and D.C. United recorded back-to-back shutouts with a 1-0 win at Chicago on June 24 and a scoreless draw at Toronto on June 27. Hamid's five other clean sheets have come against Chicago (October 18), Columbus (May 2), Orlando (April 3), Los Angeles (March 28) and Montreal (March 7, August 8).

BOSWELL RE-SIGNS WITH UNITED

D.C. United and defender Bobby Boswell have agreed to a contract extension. In his 11th season, Boswell has started 33 of 34 matches and is first in Major League Soccer among field players in minutes played (2,975). Since he returned to the Black-and-Red after being acquired in Stage 1 of the 2013 MLS Re-entry Draft, Boswell has started 67 of a possible 68 regular season matches, playing 6,020 of a possible 6,120 minutes. The 32-year-old is fifth all-time among field players in MLS starts (321) and minutes played (28,699). He scored his second goal of 2015 in D.C. United's 4-0 win over Chicago on Oct. 18.

PONTIUS, KITCHEN, BOSWELL, HAMID JOIN ELITE IN DCU APPEARANCES, STARTS

Perry Kitchen (158 apps, 155 starts), Chris Pontius (152 appearances, 126 starts), Bobby Boswell (148 apps, 145 starts) and Bill Hamid (140 apps, 140 starts) continue to climb into elite company among D.C. United's longest serving players. Kitchen is sixth in starts, Boswell is eighth, and Hamid is 10th. In games played, Kitchen is eighth, followed by Pontius (9th), Boswell (10th) and Hamid (11th).

UNITED TO FACE QUERÉTARO IN 2015-16 SCOTIABANK CONCACAF CHAMPIONS LEAGUE QUARTERFINALS

D.C. United finished unbeaten (3-0-1, 10 points) in 2015-16 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League group stage play and have been paired with Querétaro FC of Mexico in the quarterfinals, which will take place between Feb. 23-25 and Mar. 1-3, 2016. In the group stage. The Black-and-Red came back from down 3-0, scoring three times in the game's final half hour. Combined with a 3-0 win over Montego Bay United at home and 2-0 and 1-0 wins over Panamian side Árabe Unido, United (3-0-1, 10 points) will finish first in Group H, ahead of Árabe Unido (1-2-0, 3 points) and Montego Bay United (2-0-1, 1 point). D.C. United are 10-0-2 in its last 12 Champions League group stage matches.

SABORÍO SCORES

Álvaro Saborío scored his second goal in consecutive games in D.C. United's 4-0 win over Chicago on October 18. The last time Saborío scored twice in consecutive games was in 2014, when he scored in four consecutive matches for Real Salt Lake. With his stoppage time game-winner against New York City FC on Oct. 2, Saborío scored his first game-winning goal for D.C. United. Saborío also scored in his debut for the Black-and-Red on July 26 following his acquisition from Real Salt Lake in exchange for Luis Silva. Saborío, a Costa Rican international, had 63 goals and 13 assists in 127 games over six seasons for Real Salt Lake. The trade reunited Saborío with Espíndola, who shared 65 goals and 21 assists between 2010 and 2012 for Real Salt Lake.

LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY SINCE 2011

D.C. United won their second straight match and clinched a home game in the Audi 2015 MLS Cup Playoffs with a 4-0 win over the Chicago Fire. It was the Black-and-Red's biggest margin of victory since 2011, the biggest win in history over the Fire and the first time that the team has won all three games in a regular season series against the Eastern Conference rival.

APPEARANCE MILESTONES

Chris Rolfe made his 200th MLS appearance in D.C. United's opening match of the 2015 season. D.C. United defender Sean Franklin made his 200th Major League Soccer appearance against New England on May 23, 2015, and he recorded his 200th MLS and 50th D.C. United start in the 4-0 victory against Chicago on October 18. Nick DeLeon made his 100th start for D.C. United in a 2-1 loss against Columbus on September 19. Chris Korb made his 100th regular season appearance for D.C. United in a 1-0 loss against Seattle on July 3.

HALSTI REPRESENTS FINLAND

D.C. United midfielder Markus Halsti made five appearances in 2015 for the Finland Men's National Team during 2015 European Championship qualifying. Finland (3-4-3, 12 points) finished fourth in 2016 European Championship qualifying Group F.

OPARE RE-SIGNS WITH UNITED

On Sept. 15, D.C. United announced that the team and Kofi Opare agreed to a multi-year contract extension. In his third season in MLS, Opare has one goal in a career-high 17 regular season appearances (16 starts). He has a combined four goals in three competitions: the MLS regular season, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the 2015-16 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League. He scored his second Champions League goal in United's 3-3 draw at Montego Bay United on Sept. 22.

SCORING, ASSIST LEADERS IN SCCL

D.C. United finished the 2015-16 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League with nine goals scored by six different players. Conor Doyle, Miguel Aguilar and Kofi Opare each had two goals apiece, with Michael Farfan, Jairo Arrieta and Jared Jeffrey also getting on the scoresheet. Farfan led the team with three assists, followed by Arrieta with two. Chris Pontius, Facundo Coria and Perry Kitchen also contributed assists. Conor Doyle's goal 36 seconds into D.C. United's 2-0 win over Árabe Unido on September 15 was the fastest D.C. United goal since Chris Pontius scored 31 seconds into a match at the New York Red Bulls on June 24, 2012. Jared Jeffrey scored his first goal for United since September 28, 2013, in United's 2-0 win against Árabe Unido in the Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League on September 15. Andrew Dykstra, Luke Mishu, Kofi Opare and Jairo Arrieta all played 90 minutes in each of four group stage matches.

BIRNBAUM'S SECOND MLS GOAL

Steve Birnbaum, a 2014 MLS Rookie of the Year finalist, scored his second regular season goal in D.C. United's 1-1 draw with Colorado on September 12. His first regular season goal came in the 2-1 loss against Toronto on June 6. Birnbaum scored his first goal for the Black-and-Red in the 2014-15 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League quarterfinals at Alajuelense in Costa Rica on Feb. 26.

KEMP'S 2015 SEASON

Taylor Kemp recorded his career-high sixth assist in D.C. United's 1-1 draw with Colorado on Sept. 12. In addition to his assists, Kemp scored his first goal of 2015 off a volley in the 59th minute of the 6-4 win against Real Salt Lake on August 1, a tally that was named MLS Goal of the Week.

KORB TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEASON

Defender Chris Korb will miss the remainder of the season with a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee suffered at New York City FC on August 13. In his fifth season out of Akron, Korb had two assists in 18 appearances (17 starts) and made his 100th career appearance.

ONE SHOT, ONE GOAL

D.C. United were outshot by Montreal 25 to one in the 1-0 win on August 8. Their only shot came in the 13th minute when Chris Rolfe scored the only goal of the game. It marked the first time in MLS history that a team won when only registering a single shot.

ARRIETA'S 2015 FORM

Jairo Arrieta has made an impact in his first season with the Black-and-Red. He is the only player on the roster to have scored in four competitions: the 2014-15 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals, the group stage of the 2015-16 Scotiabank CONCACAF Champions League, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the regular season. Arrieta had a goal and an assist in United's 3-3 draw at Montego Bay United in Jamaica on Sept. 22. In league play, Arrieta provided the game-winning assist to Chris Rolfe in United's 1-0 win against Montreal on August 8. He had a pair of goals in D.C. United's 3-1 comeback victory over Chicago on June 3. He also had a game-tying goal against New England on May 23, a game-winning assist against Orlando City on May 13, and he scored the lone goal in United's season-opening victory over Montreal on March 7.

6-4 WIN AGAINST REAL SALT LAKE

D.C. United's 6-4 win over Real Salt Lake on August 1 was the third time in D.C. United history that the team has scored six goals in a game (6-1 over Dallas on July 7, 1996; 6-2 over the Metrostars on July 3, 2004). The 10-goal game was also tied for the second highest scoring game in MLS history behind the 11 goal match on May 6, 1998, when Los Angeles beat Colorado 7-4. There are three other 10-goal games: Kansas City Wizards over the Columbus Crew, 6-4, on May 6, 1998, the Metrostars over FC Dallas 6-4 on August 26, 2000, and a Metrostars tie with San Jose 5-5 on May 8, 2004.

UNBEATEN STREAK AT HOME

With a 3-1 win over Chicago on June 3, D.C. United set a new franchise record of 20 consecutive games at home without a loss in all competitions (16-0-4), including 16 straight in regular season play (12-0-4). United's record came to an end on June 6, 2015, in a 2-1 loss against Toronto FC. United's previous 19-game stretch at home without a loss came between March 30, 2012 and March 9, 2013.

ARNAUD AND THE 50/50 CLUB

With his assist on D.C. United's game-winning goal in the team's 2-1 win over Orlando City on May 13, Davy Arnaud recorded his third assist of 2015 and the 46th of his career. He is four assists away from becoming the 16th MLS player to reach 50 goals and 50 assists. Arnaud scored his 50th goal on May 3, 2014. Houston midfielder Brad Davis (55 goals, 121 assists) is currently the only other active player in the 50/50 club.

MORE ARNAUD MILESTONES

Davy Arnaud became the most fouled player in MLS history in D.C. United's 1-0 victory over the Los Angeles Galaxy on Mar. 28. In his 14th MLS season, the 34-year-old has suffered 746 fouls. Former D.C. United legend Jaime Moreno is second (703), and the closest active player is Houston midfielder Brad Davis (494). Arnaud is also the 18th most fouled player in 2015 having suffered 48 fouls this season. In addition, after reaching 300 career regular season appearances in 2014, Arnaud made his 300th MLS start in United's 2-2 draw with New York on Apr. 11. With 316 career starts, Arnaud is eighth all-time in MLS history and fifth among active players, behind Kyle Beckerman (350), Brad Davis (325), Brian Carroll (322) and Bobby Boswell (320).

WORRA MAKES DCU DEBUT

Undrafted rookie goalkeeper Travis Worra made his MLS debut in D.C. United's 2-1 win at Vancouver, replacing an injured Andrew Dykstra in the 58th minute. Worra finished with one save and zero goals allowed. The former University of New Hampshire product has gone 2-0-1 with two shutouts and a penalty kick save on loan with the USL Richmond Kickers in 2015.

USMNT CALL-UPS

Goalkeeper Bill Hamid was called into the U.S. Men's National Team camp for its international friendly against Costa Rica on Oct. 13. Hamid and midfielder Perry Kitchen were both part of the U.S. Men's National Team's roster for its 2-0 victory over Mexico at Alamodome in San Antonio on April 15. Kitchen made his second U.S. appearance in the match, playing the final 27 minutes. It was also the second appearance for Kitchen in 2015, as he made his U.S. senior team debut against Panama on Feb. 8. Defender Jalen Robinson was selected to the U.S. Under-23 men's national team for the Toulon Tournament in May-June. Hamid and Kitchen were both named to the provisional U.S. roster for the 2015 CONCACAF Gold Cup.

OLSEN REACHES 50 VICTORIES

With D.C. United's 1-0 win over Montreal on March 7, Head Coach Ben Olsen reached 50 career regular season victories. In his fifth full season, Olsen is the longest-serving coach in D.C. United history. 


