## MATCH PREVIEW

Legion FC hits the road to take on Indy Eleven as the Three Sparks battle for a home playoff game in its race with 4<sup>th</sup> place Pittsburgh. This match will be the first time IND and BHM meet this season, with their second tie being the last game of the regular season on October 12<sup>th</sup>. In the head-to-head against each other, BHM has four wins over Indy's two, with Legion having won three games in a row. Legion come into the match as the favorite with a 49% likelihood to win according to FiveThirtyEight. Juan Agudelo (seven goals, four assists) leads the line and is up for USLC Player of the Month for August, while Enzo Martinez (11 goals, five assists) is an MVP candidate.

Indy have recently found great form. On August 27, the Indianapolis side earned an impressive win over leaguewide point leaders San Antonio FC, and just four days later defeated Eastern Conference leaders Louisville City FC. Those two wins, and then a draw against Detroit in its last game, came after a twelve-game winless streak. Stéfano Pinho is the main attacking threat that the Three Sparks need to keep an eye on – the Brazilian has scored nine on the season and found the net twice in the Blues' victory against Louisville.

#1 - Matt VanOekel



HEIGHT: 6' 4" WEIGHT: 205 DOB: 09/20/1986 HOMETOWN: Chesapeake, VA POSITION: Goalkeeper

VanOekel made 27 appearances for the Three Sparks in 2021, and Legion's Defensive Player of the Year earned himself nine clean sheets (tied for 4th in USLC) and 84 saves (7=) with a 76.4% success rate enroute to a USLC All-League Second Team nod. In 14 appearances for Legion FC in 2020, MVO racked up four clean sheets (tied for 9th in USLC) and 36 saves (12th) for a goals against average of 1.21.

He played for OKC Energy FC in 2018 and with Real Salt Lake in Major League Soccer in 2017. In 2015, VanOekel signed with NASL team FC Edmonton and was named the 2016 NASL Golden Glove winner. He kicked off his career with the Minnesota Thunder in 2009 and stayed with the team as they transitioned from playing in the USL to the North American Soccer League as the Minnesota Stars and then, Minnesota United. VanOekel featured in 118 games with United, winning the 2011 NASL Championship and the 2014 NASL Spring Season title.

#### #3 - Phanuel Kavita



HEIGHT: 6' 1" WEIGHT: 185 DOB: 03/09/1993 HOMETOWN: Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of the Congo POSITION: Defender

Team MVP in 2021, Phanuel Kavita thrived in his first season with Legion FC. Always making an impact, Kavita played in every game with 32 appearances and was only subbed-off once. He led the club with 25 blocks and an 87.7% passing accuracy. Additionally, he racked up 87 clearances and 33 interceptions.

Kavita then spent the past three seasons playing for Saint Louis FC where he made 88 appearances, 84 of which were starts, and bagged three goals and one assist. In 2019 and 2020, he started 54 of the 56 STLFC matches and played every single minute in all 54 of those games. He finished this past campaign as Saint Louis's leader in passes, blocks, and minutes played, was second in clearances, and fourth in tackles and tackles won.

Kavita moved from Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, to join the Real Salt Lake Academy, before playing at Clemson University from 2011-2014. He started in all 81 games, won the 2014 ACC Tournament Championship, and was named to the All-ACC Tournament team.

### **#4 - Freddy Kleemann**



HEIGHT: 6' 4" WEIGHT: 201 DOB: 03/19/1999 HOMETOWN: Newbury Park, CA POSITION: Defender

Kleemann made two appearances on loan in Birmingham in 2021 and in 107 minutes racked up eight clearances, two blocks, one interception and one tackle. The California native was drafted 11th overall by Austin in the 2021 MLS SuperDraft, and then played in three games for the Texas club last season.

Prior to being drafted, the 6'4" center back anchored the backline at the University of Washington. He made 28 appearances over the course of two seasons for the Huskies, starting 18 of 19 matches played in 2019 and while also helping his side tally 12 shutouts. Kleemann scored one goal and added one assist during his time in Seattle.

### **#5 - Mikey Lopez**



HEIGHT: 5'9" WEIGHT: 160 DOB: 02/20/1993 HOMETOWN: Mission, TX POSITION: Midfielder

Lopez made 27 appearances for the Legion during the 2021 season with a role as both an attacker and defender. The Mexican-American scored two goals and was a tactical presence on the pitch, garnering four assists for the Legion to tie for second most on the squad. In 2020 Lopez finished the year second on the team in clearances (34), second in interceptions (24), second in blocks (7), third in tackles (25). The Texas-native was Legion FC's 2019 Defensive Player of the Year, and he finished first on the team in passes and tackles, and second in interceptions.

Lopez spent 2018 with San Antonio FC and the two seasons prior with New York City FC in MLS. Originally, he was the 14th overall pick in the 2013 MLS SuperDraft to Sporting Kansas City. He also spent two years at the University of North Carolina where he won the NCAA Championship and was named ACC Freshman of the Year. He made 17 appearances with the United States Under-20 National Team in 2012-13.





#### #6 - Anderson Asiedu



HEIGHT: 5' 6" WEIGHT: 160 DOB: 06/12/1996 HOMETOWN: Dormaa Ahenkro, Ghana POSITION: Midfielder

Asiedu tied for the most appearances for BHM during the 2021 season (33) and maintained a dominant presence on the pitch, leading the squad in passes (1,411) and duels (372) and was second in interceptions (45). Additionally, he scored his first professional goal. In 2020 he made 14 starts and racked up 25 interceptions (first on the team), 29 tackles (second), and added seven clearances, six chances created, and four blocks.

Drafted by Atlanta in the first round of the 2019 MLS SuperDraft, Asiedu was named MLS Combine Most Valuable Player. His collegiate career included two-year stints at both Monmouth and UCLA, where he started 71 games total, scored six goals, added seven assists, and earned spots on the All-Pac-12 second team twice, Pac-12 All-Academic team, All-MAAC first team, All-Northeast Region first team, and All-MAAC second team.

Asiedu was discovered at age 16 in Ghana, and then he moved to New Jersey and won a state and national championship with NJ-based prep school St. Benedict's in 2014, as well as the 2013-2014 USSDA U17/18 national title with the Players Development Academy.

#### #7 - Ryan James



HEIGHT: 5'9" WEIGHT: 155 DOB: 04/21/1994 HOMETOWN: Mississauga, Ontario, Canada POSITION: Defender

Playing in every match, James made 33 appearances in his first year with the Black and Gold in 2021 and was a vital part of its defensive structure and movement on the pitch. He led the team with 65 interceptions and secured four assists, tied for second most on the team. Additionally, James had a passing accuracy of 76.5 and won 27 tackles.

Before joining BHM, James played in 55 of 56 games in 2019 and 2020 for Pittsburgh, and played 19 times for Nashville SC in 2018. After being drafted in the 2016 MLS SuperDraft by Sporting Kansas City, he signed with the USL's Rochester Rhinos for the 2016 and 2017 seasons.

James spent his collegiate career at Bowling Green State University where he played in all 79 games in four years, making 69 starts, and racked up nine goals and 15 assists on his way to consecutive Second Team All Mid-American Conference selections following his junior and senior seasons.

#### **#8 - Bruno Lapa**



HEIGHT: 5'9" WEIGHT: 155 DOB: 05/10/1997 HOMETOWN: Curitiba, Brazil POSITION: Midfielder

Lapa started every match for Legion FC in 2020 before being named to the All-League First Team. He led the team in shots and chances created, tied for team lead in assists, and was second in goals. He also earned USLC Player of the Week honors in Week Four and was named Legion FC Team MVP. Battling injury, he made 22 appearances for the Legion in 2021 and scored 5 goals, tied for third most on the club. Additionally, the Brazilian was second on the squad in shots on target (23) and total chances created (38). He also led the team in chances created per appearance with 1.7.

After coming to the U.S. in high school and winning two national titles with Monteverde Academy in FL, Lapa played college soccer at Wake Forest from 2016 to 2019 and made 80 appearances in four years, scoring 23 goals and adding 15 assists. He was the 2018 ACC Midfielder of the Year, a MAC Hermann Trophy Semifinalist, and a United Soccer Coaches and College Soccer News First Team All-American.

### **#9 - Edi Horvat**



HEIGHT: 5'9" WEIGHT: 155 DOB: 11/29/1998 HOMETOWN: Zagreb, Croatia POSITION: Forward

Horvat signed with Legion FC on January 11, 2022 and most recently competed for Slovenian Second Tier side NK Fužinar, where his seven goals were tied for seventh in the league through the first half of the season. He also added five assists in those 16 appearances this season, and his eight goals in 22 games last season were good for top 15 in the league.

The Croat kicked off his professional career as an 18-year-old playing for NK Aluminij Kidričevo in the Prva Liga, the Slovenian First Tier, and then he transferred to NK Brežice 1919 where he scored five goals in 21 appearances across two seasons. Before moving to Slovenia, Horvat recorded 16 goals in 20 games playing in his home country for the Inter Zaprešić Under-19s.





#### #10 - Prosper Kasim



HEIGHT: 5' 10" WEIGHT: 155 DOB: 12/15/1996 HOMETOWN: Accra, Ghana POSITION: Forward

Kasim made 25 appearances for the Black and Gold in 2021. He racked up five goals to tie for third most on the squad and had two assists (4=). He produced 33 key passes and 33 shots with a 15.2% conversion rate. He played in 15 matches in 2020 and was tied for third on the team in goals and assists with three each, was third in shots with 20, and was fourth in chances created with 12.

Kasim led BHM in minutes, shots, chances created, and regular season goals in 2019 to become season MVP. He spent the prior two years in Sweden's top flight, Allsvenskan, with IFK Göteborg. Göteborg acquired Kasim as an 18-year-old in 2015 from Ghanaian club International Allies. Legion FC Head Coach Tom Soehn tracked Kasim with Inter Allies since he was just 16 years old before bringing him over to the U.S.

### #11 - Marlon Santos



HEIGHT: 5' 8" WEIGHT: 145 DOB: 04/29/1995 HOMETOWN: Rio de Janeiro, Brazil POSITION: Forward

Santos signed with Legion FC on January 3, 2022 and most recently played for FC Tulsa for two and a half seasons, scoring seventeen goals and adding eight assists in 56 games. The attacker was named Tulsa's 'Offensive Player of the Year' this past season after finishing 2021 with nine goals and four assists and helping lead the team to the playoffs.

A native of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Santos got his professional career started with Brazilian club Nova Iguacu in Rio and went on to play for the likes of Bangu, Botafogo, and Madureira before moving to the United States. While he mostly was deployed as a winger with Tulsa, he has proven to be an effective attacking midfielder as well in his time in the USL Championship.

### #13 - Jake Rufe



HEIGHT: 6' 2" WEIGHT: 165 DOB: 01/22/1996 HOMETOWN: Huntsville, AL POSITION: Defender

Rufe played with Birmingham during the 2020 and 2021 seasons, making 20 appearances and racked up 18 tackles, 14 interceptions, and five blocks. In 2021, Rufe scored an exhilarating goal from inside Legion's own half in the last minute of BHM's 3-1 win over Indy Eleven, winning him the Fan-Voted Legion FC Goal of the Year.

He began his collegiate career at Indiana University, and following his freshman year, transferred to Western Michigan University. He then started 52 of a possible 55 matches while adding four goals and tallying two assists. At Western Michigan, Rufe earned Second Team All-MAC and Academic All-MAC honors. Rufe grew up in Huntsville, Alabama and was named Gatorade Alabama Boys State Player of the Year in 2014. Rufe is the third State POY to sign with Legion FC, following Chandler Hoffman ('08, '09) and JJ Williams ('16).

### #16 - Dante Johnson

HEIGHT: 5'7" WEIGHT: 145 DOB: 11/13/2003 HOMETOWN: Columbus, GA POSITION: Midfielder

Birmingham Legion FC announced the signing of midfielder Dante Johnson to a USL Academy contract on April 25, 2022, as a part of the club's inaugural academy class.

Johnson is a part of the 2003 class and just finished up his senior high school season in Georgia while preparing to play college soccer at Jacksonville University. After training with the Legion FC First Team this preseason, Johnson saw his first on-field action versus MLS powerhouse Atlanta United in February 2022, almost scoring late on in the match.





### #17 - Matthew Corcoran



HEIGHT: 5' 11" WEIGHT: 154 DOB: 02/17/2006 HOMETOWN: Dallas, TX POSITION: Midfielder

Birmingham Legion FC announced the signing of then 15-year-old midfielder Matthew Corcoran to his first professional contract on January 14, 2022. One of the top young prospects in America according to TopDrawerSoccer, Corcoran joined Legion FC's first team roster this preseason.

He played with the Dallas Texans before signing for the FC Dallas Academy, where he helped the under-15's win the FC Bayern Adidas Campus Cup in Munich, Germany in 2019 and the Dallas Cup in 2021. The Texan then made his professional debut in April 2021 with USL League One side North Texas SC.

### **#18 - Trevor Spangenberg**



HEIGHT: 6' 2" WEIGHT: 190 DOB: 04/21/1991 HOMETOWN: Valparaiso, IN POSITION: Goalkeeper

One of Legion FC's first-ever signings ahead of the 2019 season, Spangenberg has 34 saves across 13 appearances the past three seasons. He spent 2018 with the Richmond Kickers in the USL Championship, and spent some time in Richmond on loan in 2015, while a member of Major League Soccer's New England Revolution. He also played in the NASL for Puerto Rico FC for the 2016 and 2017 seasons.

Spangenberg's professional career began with MLS side Chivas USA, but prior to signing with Chivas, Spangenberg was a standout college player at Missouri State University, where he finished his senior year as the school's all-Ime career leader in goals against average (0.67) and led the Bears to the 2013 Missouri Valley Conference Championship. While in school, Spangenberg also played in USL League Two for the Laredo Heat in 2010 and Springfield Demize from 2012-2013.

### **#19 - Enzo Martinez**



HEIGHT: 5'7" WEIGHT: 150 DOB: 09/29/1990 HOMETOWN: Montevideo, Uruguay POSITION: Midfielder

Martinez joined Legion FC in January 2022 after six seasons with the USLC's Charlotte Independence. He led CLT in assists in 2021, was USLC All-League in 2016 and 2017, and sits just outside of the top 50 in career appearances in the USL Championship (153), is 48th in minutes played (12,004), and is tied for 21st in regular season goals (44) and tied for 11th in regular season assists (30). He is one of just three players in USLC history to have bagged 40+ goals and 30+ assists in the regular season.

Martinez's first stint in Major League Soccer came with Real Salt Lake when the club drafted him 17th overall in the 2012 SuperDraft. Then he signed with MLS-side Colorado Rapids for the 2018 season and played 25 times while adding three assists. Before turning pro, Martinez was a standout player at UNC, where he won the 2011 national title playing alongside Mikey Lopez. Martinez is also one of the greatest high school soccer players of all time, after ESPN named him the ESPN Rise High School Boys Soccer Player of the Decade in 2009.

### #20 - Zach Herivaux



HEIGHT: 6'1" WEIGHT: 160 DOB: 02/01/1996 HOMETOWN: Boston, MA POSITION: Midfielder

Herivaux made 23 appearances for BHM in its debut season in 2019, and he racked up one goal on five shots, created 14 chances, and added 19 interceptions, 20 clearances and 35 tackles while completing 85% of his passes. Returning in 2021, Herivaux made 25 appearances for the Black and Gold, scored one goal, had the second highest passing accuracy with 87.1% and led the club with a 92.5% accuracy in Legion's own half.

Herivaux also spent time in the USLC with San Antonio FC in 2017, on loan from New England, and played with SAFC in the 2020 season. He made eight appearances and added one assist. This will be Herivaux's seventh professional season after signing with the Revolution as the club's third-ever Homegrown Player in 2015. He made 10 career MLS appearances, including two starts, and eight appearances and two goals in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup play. He has also made 15 appearances for the Haitian National Team, registering two assists.





#### #21 - Alex Crognale



HEIGHT: 6' 5" WEIGHT: 205 DOB: 08/27/1994 HOMETOWN: Columbus, OH POSITION: Defender

Crognale made 27 appearances in 2021 and led the team in clearances (113) while finishing with the third highest number of interceptions (41). He also had six shots on target and scored two goals. In 2020 he was BHM's 'Defender of the Year' as he started every match in his first season in Birmingham and led the team in minutes, clearances, blocks, passes, aerial duels, and aerial duels won.

Crognale signed a homegrown contract with the Columbus Crew in 2016 and made 38 appearances from 2017 to 2019 in MLS and the U.S. Open Cup. He also played with USLC clubs Orange County and Indy on Ioans in 2018 and 2019. He grew up playing in the Crew academy before heading to the U. Maryland where he played in 73 games and scored 11 goals from 2013 to 2016. As a senior, he captained the Terrapins to their third straight Big Ten Tournament title, was Big Ten Defender of the Year, and was a First Team All-American.

#### #22 - Jack Heaps

HEIGHT: 5'9" WEIGHT: 145 DOB: 03/06/2005 HOMETOWN: Birmingham, AL POSITION: Midfielder

Birmingham Legion FC announced the signing of midfielder Jack Heaps to a USL Academy contract on April 25, 2022, as a part of the club's inaugural academy class.

Heaps is a member of the 2005 class who is currently undecided on his collegiate future. He just earned First Team All-State honors after his junior year high school soccer season at Mountain Brook High School and led his team to the State Title. He will add further depth to the Legion FC First Team midfield group.

### #23 - Grayson Dupont



HEIGHT: 5' 8" WEIGHT: 158 DOB: 01/16/1998 HOMETOWN: Birmingham, AL POSITION: Midfielder

Dupont is in his first year with Legion FC. He began his collegiate career at the University of New Mexico, where he played with former Legion FC goalkeeper Ford Parker. He spent three years with the Lobos, making 17 appearances and scoring one goal after redshirting his freshman year. Following his time at UNM, Dupont returned home to Birmingham to represent UAB. He made 25 appearances for the Blazers, scoring three goals and tallying one assist.

Prior to his collegiate career, Dupont attended and played soccer at Montverde Academy alongside Legion FC midfielder Bruno Lapa. During his time at Montverde, he won a high school national championship in 2016.

### #24 - Jonny Dean



HEIGHT: 5' 8" WEIGHT: 163 DOB: 05/15/1997 HOMETOWN: Macon, GA POSITION: Defender

Dean was awarded the Fan's Choice MVP Award in 2021 after he led the team in minutes (2,861), assists (five), and in chances created (48). He also finished the year with the second-highest goals above replacement player ranking in the USLC. He started every match in 2020 and tied for the team lead in assists, finished third in chances created, fourth in tackles, fourth in passes, fourth in interceptions, fourth in blocks, and scored his first professional goal.

Legion FC's 2020 'Newcomer of the Year' was drafted by Orlando City SC with the 13th pick in the second round of the 2020 MLS SuperDraft. Beginning his collegiate career at Wofford College in 2015, he tallied five assists and scored one goal on the way to being named to the All-SoCon Freshman Team. Dean then transferred to UCF and started 35 of a possible 50 matches from 2016 to 2019; he scored one goal and recorded 11 assists, ending his collegiate career by playing every minute of his senior season and captaining UCF to an appearance in the NCAA Tournament.





#### #29 - Sadik Balarabe



HEIGHT: 5' 11" WEIGHT: 160 DOB: 06/26/1992 HOMETOWN: London, England POSITION: Forward

Birmingham Legion FC announced the signing of Balarabe on July 15, 2022. Born in London, England, Balarabe came through the Reading academy ranks before moving to the United States in 2011 to play at Jackson College and then Saginaw Valley State University. While in the States, the forward made five appearances in USL League Two with the Chicago Inferno.

Balarabe kicked off his globetrotting professional career in January 2015 in Greece for Iraklis Psachna, then played in Portugal, Turkey, Cyprus, Spain, England and again in Cyprus and in total scored 66 goals in 160 appearances. While with Mağusa TGSK across two different stints in 2018-19 and then 2021-22, the Englishman won the league and league cup twice each, while also finishing as the Cypriot Cup Golden Boot winner in 2019 and 2022.

#### #30 - Marco Garcia

Birmingham Legion FC announced the signing of midfielder Marco Garcia to a USL Academy contract on April 25, 2022, as a part of the club's inaugural academy class.

Garcia is a Birmingham native in the '03 class that has committed to playing collegiately at Clemson University. As a homeschooled high school student, Garcia has trained more with the Legion FC first team this spring and will continue to do so this summer upon return from a recent injury. The midfielder made his First Team debut in the 2021 preseason contest versus Atlanta.

### #47 - Mataeo Bunbury

Bunbury joined Birmingham on July 8 from Sporting Kansas City II where he has four goals and one assist to his name in 2022 in ten appearances in the MLS Next Pro league, playing primarily as a right winger. He also made seven appearances, including one against Legion FC, in 2021 in the USL Championship.

He joined the Sporting KC Academy in 2020 after two years with the Minnesota United FC Academy and a year with Minneapolis United SC. Bunbury has also registered one appearance with the Canadian National Team's Under-20 side and spent time with the Under-14 United States Youth Team.

Agudelo made his pro debut in 2010 for the New York Red Bulls and since then has made over 280 appearances for New York, Chivas USA, New England Revolution, Inter Miami and Minnesota United in MLS and scored 47 goals with 20 assists. He spent six seasons with the Revs, mostly under Legion FC President Jay Heaps and Head Coach Tommy Soehn. In 2014, he signed with Stoke City in the English Premier League and went on Ioan to FC Utrecht in the Netherlands where he played 14 times and scored three goals that season before returning to MLS.

Internationally, Agudelo represented the United States at the u-17, u-20, u-23 and senior team levels. In his 28 caps for the national team, he scored three goals and added two assists. He scored in his first-team international debut, a 1-0 win over South Africa in 2010, becoming the youngest goal scorer in USMNT history, at the time, six days shy of his 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.

## **HEAD COACH/TECHNICAL DIRECTOR - TOM SOEHN**



Coach Soehn joined Legion FC as the club's first-ever head coach in 2019 and led the team to the playoffs in both of its first two seasons. As a prior MLS Coach of the Year nominee, Soehn is a well-known and respected name in American professional soccer circles. Most recently, he served as a scout for the Columbus Crew, after spending four years as an assistant coach and interim head coach with the New England Revolution.

Soehn was named the Vancouver Whitecaps first Director of Soccer Operations in 2010, where he developed and managed the club's inaugural roster, player scouting, and identification and recruitment system as the club prepared to enter the MLS in 2011.

Soehn's most successful years coaching came in his time with D.C. United from 2004-2009. He won an MLS Cup and Supporter's Shield as an assistant coach before claiming a second Shield and a U.S. Open Cup championship as head coach.

## **ASSISTANT COACH - KHANO SMITH**



Smith joined Legion FC in 2019 having served two seasons as assistant coach for the Orlando Pride (NWSL). His side qualified for the NWSL semifinals in 2017. Prior to his work in Orlando, Smith was an assistant coach for Southern New Hampshire University, compiling a 19-1-1 record in his sole season.

Dating from 2003-2014, Smith's professional playing career was highlighted by 33 appearances with the Bermuda National Team. The left-footed winger scored 10 goals for his country. He appeared more than 100 times over six Major League Soccer seasons with the New England Revolution and his eight total goals included a game-winner that led the Revs to the MLS Conference Championship in 2005. Smith spent four seasons in New England sharing the field with Legion FC President and General Manager Jay Heaps. Smith also played for the Carolina Dynamo, Dandy Town Hornets, New York Red Bulls, Lincoln City, Bermuda Hogges and Real Boston Rams as a professional.

## **DIR. SPORTS SCIENCE & PERFORMANCE - DAN BARLOW**



Barlow also joined Legion FC in 2019 following a year as Strength and Conditioning Coach with the United States Men's National Team. In 2018, he was also the Strength and Conditioning Coach for a fellow USL Championship team, the Charlotte Independence.

He too brings prior MLS experience, having joined Legion FC President/GM Jay Heaps and Head Coach/Technical Director Tom Soehn in New England in 2017 as the Strength and Conditioning Coach for the Revolution. He also helped Real Salt Lake win an MLS Cup Championship, two Conference Championships, and appearances in the U.S. Open Cup and CONCACAF Champions Cup finals as Strength and Conditioning Coach and then Director of Sports Science and Performance from 2007 to 2016.

Barlow's career began with his alma mater, the University of Maryland, as S&C Coach. He later founded Barlow Consulting and spent time with the Heiden Institute for Sports Science and Human Performance.
