## Struggling to Hold Leads as of Late

In two of the last three matches where Le Rouge has taken the lead, they have seen their hard work undone by an equalizer from the opposition. Indy Eleven come into this match in a scoring slump, having not scored a goal in over 270 minutes of play, going all the way back to their 4-3 loss to the Colorado Springs Switchbacks on June 18.

## FINALLY... A COMPETITIVE MATCHUP

This is the first time that Detroit City FC and Indy Eleven will be meeting in a competitive match. These two men's sides have played each other in friendlies every year since 2019. Only one of those matches was in front of fans and that was the inaugural 2019 matchup at Keyworth Stadium.

## A FAMILIAR FACE ON THE TOUCHLINE

Indy Eleven staff and fans will be quite familiar with Detroit City FC head coach Trevor James as James spent time working for Indy Eleven as recently as 2017 where he was the Technical Director and helped oversee the clubs transition into the USL following the collapse of the North American Soccer League (NASL).

## ODD ONE OUT

Due to the loan agreement with Indy Eleven for #22 Karl Ouimette, Ouimette will miss this weekend's match as he is not eligible to play against his parent club. He will also be missing the match at Keyworth Stadium against Indy Eleven on September 3. Ouimette made 100 appearances for Indy Eleven since 2018.

## BACK IN THE SADDLE AGAIN

Detroit City FC had a huge boost to its squad on Saturday night as midfielder #6 Brad Dunwell made his first start since getting injured on April 9 against Atlanta United II. Dunwell started in the midfield alongside #8 Abdoulaye Diop and played 67 minutes. In his time on the pitch he had a passing accuracy of 91.7% in total and 84.2% in the opponents' half.

**WELCOME TO DETROIT CITY FC, DOMINIC GASSO**

On Tuesday July 5, Le Rouge announced the signing of Dominick Gasso. Gasso formerly played for the Flint City Bucks Academy, Vardar Soccer Academy and he also represented Le Rouge in the USL Academy Cup. Gasso will be eligible to compete not only for Le Rouge's first team, but also the Academy Cup squad.

**DEFENDERS AND THEN SOME**

Detroit City FC has registered 17 assists in its 18 matches in the USL Championship this year. Of those 17, 10 of them have come from players who are registered as defenders. Leading the way for the club is defender #20 Deklan Wynne who picked up his fifth assist of the year last time out against Hartford Athletic as his strike on the half-volley found #19 Pato Botello Faz unmarked in front of goal to give Le Rouge its only goal of the match. Rhys Williams has three assists himself while centerbacks Devon Amoo-Mensah and Matt Lewis have one assist each.

**TWO DOWN, ONE TO GO**

For the second time this season Le Rouge will have its squad tested as they have three league matches over a span of seven days. The first time this happened this season Le Rouge faced Loudoun United FC at home (W, 4-2), The Miami FC away (D, 1-1) and wrapped it up by hosting Atlanta United II at Keyworth Stadium (W, 3-1). Le Rouge dominated Las Vegas Lights FC (W, 1-0) and saw a strong first-half undone as the visiting Hartford Athletic found an equalizer in the second half (D, 1-1). Detroit City FC now travels down to Indianapolis to take on Indy Eleven in what could be a huge match as the second half of the season gets underway.

**TO THOSE WHO WAIT...**

After 1,286 minutes in the USL Championship this season and getting off a team-high 22 shots after 17 matches in this years campaign, #11 Connor Rutz opened his scoring tally in the USL in the 63rd minute with a well placed header against Las Vegas Lights FC in Detroit City FC's 1-0 win in the Sin City last Saturday. It had been 1,343 minutes of play since Rutz last found the back of the net in league play, going all the way back to the 3-2 win over the Michigan Stars on November 20, 2021.

**AGING LIKE FINE WINE**

Although forward Antoine Hoppenot is the oldest player on the Detroit City FC roster, just edging out Billy Forbes by 20 days, he is on pace to match his best attacking season yet in his storied career which has spanned across 11 seasons. According to FBRef.com, Hoppenot is currently sitting at 0.65 goals+assists per 90 minutes played. The best season he is currently tied with came in 2020 for Louisville City FC where Hoppenot generated 0.65 goals+assists per 90.

**BILLY FORBES' SUCCESS FOR HIS NATIONAL TEAM**

Following a successful stint with the Turks and Caicos national team, forward Billy Forbes was named to the CONCACAF Nations League C Best XI. Forbes is the current captain of the Turks and Caicos National Team and a highlight of his stint with the side this time was his two-goal performance against Sint Maarten on Saturday, June 11th. Forbes is the federation's all-time leading scorer, netting 11 goals in 22 international appearances.

**A HELPING HAND**

Forward Antoine Hoppenot ranks sixth all-time in the USL for total career assists. Currently, Hoppenot sits at 37 assists during the regular season throughout his career, just one off of Maikel Chang who occupies the fifth spot in the all-time rankings. Hoppenot has notched four assists this season, leading Detroit City FC. His best return in the assists category came in 2018 when he registered 12 assists for Reno 1868 FC in 2,407 minutes of play.

**STEVE CARROLL: WEEK 15 TEAM OF THE WEEK**

Stephen Carroll made his first appearance on the Team of the Week. The Irish center back won eight of 11 duels and won three tackles. Carroll made eight clearances, six interceptions and five recoveries in Le Rouge's 1-1 draw against El Paso Locomotive FC on ESPN. Carroll is currently ranked No. 24 in FotMob's Top-100 players in the USL Championship with an average rating of 7.42.

**LONG TIME SINCE...**

Before the 2-0 loss to Sacramento Republic FC on June 11, it had been 648 days since Detroit City FC last lost by a multiple-goal deficit at Keyworth Stadium, the most recent time this occurred was against the Michigan Stars in the NISA 2020 Fall Championship bubble tournament. The last time

## LEARNING FROM MISTAKES

Detroit City FC has never lost back-to-back games under Trevor James. The last time Le Rouge has lost back-to-back fixtures was July 10 and 15, 2016, to Lansing United and Michigan Stars, respectively.

## A SOLD OUT CROWD AT KEYWORTH

June 18th's match at Keyworth Stadium marked just the second time that Le Rouge has announced an official sellout at Keyworth and first-ever presale sellout. During the 2017 NPSL playoffs, DCFC sold out for the national semifinals against Midland-Odessa. The attendance was announced at 7,553.

## DUNWELL REMOVED FROM INJURY REPORT

Midfielder Brad Dunwell has returned to the lineup after suffering an injury in the second half at Atlanta United 2, a hard challenge that drew a straight red. After starting five of the first six matches this season, Dunwell hadn't seen game action in 77 days. He made his first appearance since his injury on June 25 where he saw 30 minutes of action in the 2-0 loss to Memphis 901 FC on the road.

## DEFYING THE XG NUMBERS

Through 17 games this season Detroit City FC has a goal differential of +7. This is even more impressive when you look at the underlying numbers such as xG. Through 17 matches Le Rouge has an xG differential of +0.9. Their best xG performance of the season came in the 2-1 win at Hartford Athletic where they generated 2.8 expected goals. Their worst xG performance of the season came in June 4's 1-1 draw away to the Riverhounds where they allowed Pittsburgh to generate 2.3 expected goals. xG numbers used are based off of models from fivethirtyeight.com.

## KEEPING OUT OF THE LOSSES COLUMN

Detroit City FC has only lost four matches all season thus far in the USL Championship, the season opener at San Antonio FC (1-0), away to FC Tulsa (3-1), at home against Sacramento Republic FC (2-0) and most recently on the road against Memphis 901 FC (2-0). They are tied for second in the Eastern Conference for fewest number of losses and are tied for second for fewest losses in all of the USL Championship.

## CONVERTING ON CHANCES

Detroit City is 18th in the league with 3.6 shots on target per match but sits 17th in conversion rate at 15% and tied for 13th with 25 goals this season. Forward Pato Botello Faz leads the team in missed big chances with nine - Le Rouge has missed 20 big chances as a team - ranking 14th in the league.

**STAYING DISCIPLINED**

Detroit City FC is one of the least penalized teams in the USL Championship conceding just 206 fouls through 18 matches - ranking third in the league. Las Vegas leads the category at just 176 fouls. Le Rouge is also tied with Monterey Bay FC for fewest cards with 31 yellows. DCFC remains one of two teams without a red card this year alongside The Miami FC.

**TURNING UP THE PRESSURE**

Detroit City ranks second in the league in winning possession in the final third, causing 6.7 turn-overs per match in the attacking end of the pitch per match. Louisville City pace the league in the category. At Keyworth Stadium on May 21, forward Antoine Hoppenot won the ball off Atlanta United II's keeper in the box and slotted it for his fifth goal of the season. Le Rouge ranks inside the USL Championship top six with 224 interceptions - coming out to 12.4 per match.

**HOPPENOT NOMINATED FOR LEAGUE'S PLAYER OF THE MONTH OF MAY**

Forward Antoine Hoppenot was nominated as the league's May Player of the Month, tallying two goals and three assists in three outings. Hoppenot has scored a team-high five goals in league play while forcing an own goal from Loudoun United on May 14. Hoppenot's 14 points in USL matches this season is a team-high along with leading Le Rouge with four assists. The 31-year old has notched 37 goals and 37 assists in his USL career.

**NO REST FOR THE WEARY: PLAYING EVERY MINUTE OF 2022 THUS FAR**

Centerback Devon Amoo-Mensah along with goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher has played every minute of every match this season - including three Open Cup fixtures, totaling 1,920 minutes of play. Left back Deklan Wynne has started every fixture this season as well. Centerback Steve Carroll missed his first minute of action this season on May 18, missing the road match at Miami FC for his honeymoon.

**NATE STEINMONSTER**

Goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher has posted 27 clean sheets in 51 matches since 2020. Steinwascher ranks tied for seventh with five clean sheets this year and is tied for second with 53 saves among all USL Championship keepers. Steinwascher's PK save in week one at San Antonio was named Save of the Month by the league - he's earned five save of the week nominations.

**CITY'S DEFENSE UNDER TREVOR JAMES**

Detroit City sits sixth with 18 goals conceded this season, with New Mexico United FC leading the league at 13. Le Rouge led the USL Championship in goals conceded at four through April and didn't surrender multiple goals until May 7 at FC Tulsa (L, 3-1). Under Trevor James, Detroit City has allowed more than one goal in a match in just 11 of the Gaffer's 92 matches with the Club.

**THREE-PLUS GOAL PERFORMANCES**

May 21's three-goal performance was the fourth three-plus goal effort by Detroit City FC this season. Le Rouge tallied three in the Open Cup against the Michigan Stars on April 5 and four on the road at Atlanta United 2 on April 9. In two of those matches, DCFC went to the locker room up 3-0. Under Trevor James, Le Rouge has scored more than three goals in 31 matches since 2019 - highs of 10 v Livonia City FC in 2021 NISA Independent Cup and 6-1 at New Amsterdam FC on Sept. 29, 2021 in league play.

**DON'T PANIC, LOCKER ROOM ADJUSTMENTS**

Trevor James and company have proven all season that regardless of the first half scoreline, they can flip the script in the second 45 minutes. Le Rouge has outscored its opponents 16-9 in the second half of play in 2022. After falling behind in eight matches this season, Le Rouge has earned a result in five.

**BREAKING DOWN CITY'S 25 GOALS IN LEAGUE PLAY**

Le Rouge has netted 25 goals this league season through 18 matches, boasting a +7 goal differential which ranks 9th in the USL Championship. All 25 of City's goals have come inside the box and primarily have come off the right foot - 15 of 25. Le Rouge has just two headers that found the back of the net in league play this year, coming from Antoine Hoppenot on April 9 at Atlanta United 2 and Connor Rutz against Las Vegas Lights on July 2. Hoppenot's was his first-ever professional goal scored from a header.

Detroit City FC went 6-2-2 in its first 10 matches as members of the USL Championship, amassing 20 points which matches the Tampa Rowdies of 2017 as the best start in league history for a new member. Le Rouge's +8 goal differential through the first 10 matches is tied with 2019 New Mexico United for the second-best mark to start a tenure in the USL Championship, with the 2017 Rowdies boasting a differential of +9. Since 2017, nine of 19 expansion sides have made the playoffs.

**SWISS ARMY KNIFE: MICHAEL BRYANT**

**MILESTONE TRACKER: TREVOR JAMES' 100TH MATCH AT THE HELM**

Head coach Trevor James is approaching his 100th match as a head coach and at Detroit City FC. James started in 2019 while the Club transitioned from NPSL into the Member's Cup and then fully professional with NISA. City has played 92 matches under the guidance of James (excluding friendlies). As the schedule sits, his 100th match would come on August 27 at Charleston Battery.

**MAXI RODRIGUEZ: TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK 10**

For the third time this season, midfielder Maxi Rodriguez was named to the USL Championship's team of the week (weeks 3, 7, 10). Rodriguez scored once in Le Rouge's 4-2 victory over Loudoun United on May 14 and had a pair of shots to add to an industrious display in midfield where he won 12 of 17 duels and 4 of 6 tackles while recording 13 recoveries and three interceptions for City.

**THREE GOALS ALLOWED AT FC TULSA**

Le Rouge's three goals allowed at FC Tulsa on May 7 was the most goals surrendered under Trevor James and most since allowing four at Kalamazoo FC on July 7, 2018.

**MAGIC U.S. OPEN CUP RUN ENDS IN PENALTIES**

Detroit City's run through the 107th Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup came to an end in penalties on May 10 in the Round of 32 against Louisville City. After a 14th minute PK from Maxi Rodriguez - setup by a run from Francis Atuahene - Lou City responded 10 minutes later with an equalizer and would win 4-2 in penalties. Le Rouge defeated the Michigan Stars, 3-0, in the second round and the Columbus Crew, 2-1, in round three. DCFC advanced out of the second round for the first time in Club history.

**COACH OF THE MONTH TREVOR JAMES**

Trevor James was named the USL Championship's Manager of the Month for the month of April. Detroit City went 6-1-0 through April with a +13 goal differential. Le Rouge posted four clean sheets and defeated the MLS' Columbus Crew in the third round of the Open Cup during the unbeaten run. City's longest unbeaten streak came to a close last fall, going 27 matches without a loss, setting a record among active professional leagues in the U.S.

**WELCOME TO DETROIT CITY, KARL OUIMETTE**

Le Rouge announced the season-long loan of Karl Ouimette on May 2 from Indy Eleven. Ouimette has 100 appearances with Indy since 2018 - totaling seven goals. The centerback began his professional career with the Montreal Impact before signing with the NY Red Bulls in 2015, making 15





appearances for the MLS side. Ouimette has made 18 caps for the Canadian national team - most recently in 2016.

### COOL AS YOU LIKE: MAXI RODRIGUEZ FROM THE SPOT

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez' opened the scoring from the spot against Louisville City FC on May 10 in the Open Cup - it was his third PK of 2022 and seventh since coming to Detroit in 2021. Rodriguez took over the penalty kick duties in the fall of 2021, going 4-of-4 from spot last fall and 3-of-3 thus far this season - remaining perfect while donning Rouge and Gold. He also netted his attempt in the shootout against Lou City on May 10 in the 2022 Open Cup.

### LATE HEROICS

Steve Carroll - while being pulled to the ground - notched the game winner in the 93rd minute in Hartford on April 24. It was Carroll's second goal of the season and sixth since August of 2021. Both of Carroll's goals this season have come off set pieces. Since 2019, DCFC has had nine game winners after the 75th minute. Four of those came in the 2021 season - Le Rouge has had two late winners this season, coming in the 86th against the Columbus Crew and in stoppage time at Hartford Athletic.

### WELCOME TO DETROIT, MACKY DIOP

On Wednesday, April 27, Le Rouge announced the trade of Macky Diop from Birmingham Legion. The terms of the deal were undisclosed. Diop made nine appearances and two starts in 2022 ahead of coming to Detroit. Before signing with Birmingham, Diop scored nine goals for Atlanta United 2 from 2020-21 while playing with DCFC's Laye Diop. The Dakar, Senegal, native came to the U.S. to play college soccer, tallying 13 goals in 16 appearances for Radford University.

### MAXI RODRIGUEZ NAMED TO TOTW - WK 7

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez was named to the USL Championship's Team of the Week for the second time this season (team of the week after week three v Pittsburgh). Rodriguez helped drive Detroit to a 2-1 victory at Hartford Athletic on April 24, completing 55 of 67 passes and recording one assist, two shots and four chances created while also making four interceptions and nine recoveries.

### DETROIT CITY IS THE BUZZ AROUND TOWN

Our Open Cup match was our highest engagement date on social media in the past year. On April 19, we received nearly 29,000 engagements across all platforms. We were second in the league for total engagement and generated over \$21,000 in brand valuation for our sponsors. Our 3 second video views were in the top 50% of all professional sports teams on Facebook and in the top 25% of reactions to our videos across the past two weeks.

### UNDEFEATED V THE MLS

In its first-ever match against an MLS side, Detroit City FC knocked off the Columbus Crew, 2-1, to advance to the round of 32 of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez had a second-half brace - with the winner coming from the PK spot in the 86th minute. The Crew's lone goal came in the 7th minute on a PK from Gyasi Zardes - a former Academy signing of Trevor James while the duo were with the LA Galaxy.

### WILLIAMS, STEINWASCHER EARN TOTW - WK 6

Following Le Rouges 1-0 victory over Birmingham Legion on April 15, right back Rhys Williams and goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher earned league plaudits. Williams earned a spot on the team of the week - for the second time this season - after another strong defensive performance, winning 14 of 20 duels and 7 of 8 tackles while making four interceptions and 15 recoveries. Steinwascher earned honorable mention honors making four stops - including a crucial one late for his 25th clean sheet in 40 matches since 2020.

### HOPPENOT, AMOO-MENSAH NAMED TO TOTW - WK 5

Forward Antoine Hoppenot and centerback Devon Amoo-Mensah were named to week five's USL Championship Team of the Week. Hoppenot recorded one goal and one assist, had four chances created and two shots and won 7 of 12 duels to lead DCFC's 4-0 victory against Atlanta United 2. Amoo-Mensah recorded one assist, had two chances created and completed 51 of 57 passes while making 13 recoveries in the win.

## STEINWASCHER EARNS SAVE OF THE MONTH HONORS

Goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher made a lot of noise to start the season, earning three-straight save of the week nominations. His week one penalty stop at San Antonio FC won the league's Save of the Month honor for March. The first-half stop kept the game scoreless and swung momentum into City's direction. After three-straight save of the week nominations to open the season, Steinwascher has only seen two shots since as Le Rouge's backline has gone more than two matches now without allowing a shot on frame.

## RODRIGUEZ NAMED TO LEAGUE'S TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK 3

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez tallied the equalizer in the 73rd minute last weekend against the league's top offense in the Pittsburgh Riverhounds, beating the keeper just inside the left post from the penalty spot. Rodriguez was named to the USL's Team of the Week following his performance - completing 49 of 61 passes and winning 12 of 15 duels. Rodriguez is the second City player named to a TOTW this season, as goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher earned a spot on week one's TOTW.

## STEINWASCHER WITH 3-STRAIGHT SAVE OF THE WEEK NOMINATIONS

Nate Steinwascher has made multiple big saves already this season and earned three-straight Save of the Week nominations to open the campaign. Week three versus Pittsburgh, the Riverhounds outshot DCFC 7-1 in the first half, forcing two diving stops from Steinwascher - highlighted by going fully horizontal to turn aside a streaking header in the 17th minute. In week two v Charleston, Steinwascher faced just one shot on frame - coming in the 91st minute. The former all-state center-back at Sterling Heights Stevenson high school made a kick-toe save to secure City's three points. In week one at San Antonio, Steinwascher turned aside a penalty kick in the 19th minute to keep the match scoreless.

## DOMINATING THE THIRD DIVISION

Detroit City finished its time in U.S. Soccer's third division with a +42 goal differential over 36 matches played (excludes NISA Independent Cup matches). Le Rouge won the NISA 2020 Fall Tournament, 2020 NISA Independent Cup Great Lakes Region, 2021 NISA Legends Cup, 2021 NISA Spring Season, 2020-21 NISA Championship, 2021 NISA Independent Cup Great Lakes Region and 2021 NISA Fall Season. Every trophy available during DCFC's time in NISA, the Club won. During the run, City set a new U.S. Professional Soccer record (among active pro leagues), going 27 matches without a loss.

## BRINGING THE BEST OF NISA WITH US

Making the jump from NISA to the USL Championship with City is a core group that was a part of the Club's 2021 run through the third division. In total, seven different members of Detroit City's roster either won a yearly award or were named to the all-league team in 2021. Additionally, DCFC welcomed captains from two other NISA clubs in Michael Bryant (formerly Cal United Strikers) and Devon Amoo-Mensah (formerly Michigan Stars).

## U19 BOYS TAKE THIRD AT USL ACADEMY CUP

Le Rouge's youth programming has been the fastest-growing aspect of the Club over the past few seasons. DCFC teamed up with local youth clubs, creating an affiliate network throughout Metro Detroit. City made its Academy debut from March 31-April 3 at the second-annual USL Academy Cup, finishing third in the Premiere Division. Bosh Tanyi, who splits time between the Academy and USL Championship side, netted the match-winner on April 3 in the third-place bout against NC Fusion. Guershom Sylvain and John Palomino led the team with two goals each. Le Rouge's roster featured 30 of the top youth players in Metro Detroit - including 15 from Detroit City FC's youth affiliates.

## BOSH TANYI: YOUTH MAKING AN IMPACT

Bosh Tanyi returns to Detroit City FC for his third season. Tanyi will be eligible to compete not only for Le Rouge's first team, but also the Academy Cup squad. Bosh won Mr. Michigan Soccer in 2020, coming off back-to-back state titles with Grosse Ile HS under former DCFC standout Jon Evans. Last season, Bosh was a main fixture on DCFC's U23 squad that went 13-0-1 and won the Midwest Premiere League's East Division. In just 14 matches, the Le Rouge U23's posted a +29 goal differential, outscoring its opposition 40-11.

## STEINWASCHER SHINES IN DEBUT, EARNS WEEK ONE TOTW SELECTION

Goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher made a league-high five saves in his USL Championship debut on March 12 at San Antonio FC. Steinwascher made his presence felt early in the fixture, turning aside a penalty kick in the 19th minute after a hand ball in the box. Steinwascher was rated the No. 7 overall player in the USL Championship by FotMob through week one as Steinwascher was named to the USL Championship's Team of the Week.

## RECAPPING THE PRESEASON

Detroit City FC's preseason featured a handful of friendlies, two coming against USL Championship foes. Le Rouge opened the preseason in Indianapolis with Indy Eleven, battling to a 1-1 draw. Connor Rutz tallied City's goal off a free kick in the 4th minute. After jumping out to an early lead at Phoenix, DCFC and the Rising ended all squared at 2-2. Francis Atuahene netted both City goals, coming in the 26th and 29th minutes. Le Rouge's preseason also included friendlies with local universities, Oakland, Detroit Mercy and Michigan State.

The centerback from Cork, Ireland, has been a regular starter since his arrival in 2017. No other captain in DCFC history has lifted as much hardware, as the Club has claimed nine trophies since 2019 on the men's side. Carroll was the 2020 NISA Golden Ball winner and led all defenders with four goals during the 2021 NISA Fall campaign.

## MOVING THE CLUB FORWARD INTO THE USL

On November 9, 2021, Detroit City FC announced its intention to move from U.S. Soccer's third tier with NISA to the second division with the USL Championship. The move also included the women's team moving out of the UWS into the USL W League.

"It's clear that the time is right for Detroit City FC to move forward by joining the USL Championship," said Detroit City FC Co-Owner and Chief Executive Officer Sean Mann. "This puts us on track to accomplish many of our shared objectives such as fielding a professional women's side, enhancing our academy program, upgrading our facilities, and expanding our reach. Since 2012, our vision for Detroit City FC has been to become Detroit's soccer club for all time. We strive to be the most inclusive, community-focused, and supporter-driven club in the USA."

## DCFC WOMEN'S SIDE TO PLAY IN USL W LEAGUE

Detroit City FC launched its women's team in 2020, playing an abbreviated schedule due to COVID-19. The team played its first full season in 2021, competing in the UWS. Currently the W league side sits sixth in the Great Lakes Division with a mark of 1-2-3.

## ABOUT DETROIT CITY FC

Founded in 2012, Detroit City FC has established itself as one of the most talked about soccer teams in North America. Our club motto, Passion for Our City, Passion for the Game, evokes the three ideas the grassroots organization was built upon: to satisfy the demand for soccer in downtown Detroit, represent the city in a positive light, and build community through "the beautiful game."

The seed of DCFC was planted in 2010, on the soccer pitch at Belle Isle in downtown Detroit. That grass – the very same that was transported from the Pontiac Silverdome after the 1994 World Cup – was the original home of the Detroit City Futbol League (DCFL), a co-ed, recreational league that pitted players from teams representing the many historic neighborhoods of Detroit.

Founded as a community organizing endeavor aiming to bring city residents together, the league was wildly successful, quickly drawing over 1000 players a week to the games and after parties at bars across the city. Inspired by the success, DCFL founder Sean Mann pitched four friends an idea to further tap into the growing interest in the sport by founding a minor league soccer team to play in downtown Detroit. Ten years later, Detroit City FC has climbed the U.S. Soccer pyramid from an amateur success story to the second division of professional soccer.

## REGULAR SEASON STRUCTURE

The 2022 USL Championship season will see every team play each of its conference foes twice – once at home, once away. For Eastern Conference clubs, the remaining eight games will be against interconference opponents – four at home, four away. For Western Conference clubs, the remaining 10 games will be against a combination of interconference and intraconference opponents – five at home, five away.

## 2022 USL CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYOFFS

At the conclusion of the regular season, the top seven teams in each conference will qualify for the 2022 USL Championship Playoffs. The first overall seed in each conference will receive a bye to the Conference Semifinals of the playoffs. The bracket will be reseeded following the Conference Quarterfinals to ensure the first overall seed in each conference plays against the lowest-seeded remaining opponent. The USL Championship Playoffs will remain a single-elimination format,

## **A LOOK AT THE OPPOSITION: Indy Eleven**

This Saturday in Indianapolis, DCFC takes on the Indy Eleven for the first time this season. The Eleven currently sit in 8th place in the USL Championship Eastern Conference, holding a 6-3-8 record, good enough for 21 points. They have scored 22 goals so far this season, good enough for 19th most in the league. They also have conceded 27 goals which is good for 12th in the league and have a goal differential of -5. Indy has taken 160 shots which is the fewest in all of the USL Championship. Their conversion rate of 17% ties them for ninth place in the league. They have conceded 248 fouls so far in this campaign which places them in 12th spot overall. They have gone into the referees book 46 times this season (43 yellows, 3 reds). Indy has only had two clean sheets this season which ties them for 22nd in the league.

Coming into this weekend's game, Indy Eleven have not won since June 4th when they defeated the Charleston Battery 4-3. Since this win, they have a draw against Miami (1-1) and have lost four straight games to the Colorado Springs Switchbacks (4-3), the San Diego Loyal (5-0), Miami FC (1-0) and the Pittsburgh Riverhounds (1-0).

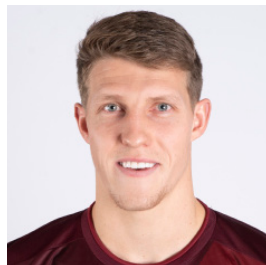
Forward Stéfano Pinho sits tied for 12th overall in the league with seven goals on the season, leading his team. He has 26 shots on the season, good for a tie for 26th place in the league. Pinho also leads the team with 201 duels and 98 aerial duels. He has created 10 chances this season and has a passing accuracy of 63.1%. Another Indy Eleven forward, Manual Arteaga also finds himself on the league leaderboard for goals, tied for 27th with five tallies. Arteaga leads his team with 29 shots which puts him tied for 17th overall in the league and he also leads his team with 18 shots on target. He has created 12 chances and has two assists in his 12 games played. In 15 games played, defender A.J. Cochran leads the team with 55 clearances and 16 blocks. Cochran has six shots, including one on target and has 13 interceptions.

Team of the Week nods from the league came to multiple Indy Eleven players this season including goalkeeper Elliot Panicco (Who was on loan from Nashville FC) (Week 3), Nicky Law (Week 6), Pinho (Week 7) and Arteaga (Week 13).

Indy Eleven's Head Coach is Mark Lowry and he became Indy's fourth permanent head coach on November 16th, 2021. His was previously with the El Paso Locomotive where he was the head coach for three seasons. His record over the three seasons was 42W-29T-19L in the USL Championship Regular Season, USL Championship Playoffs and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup 2019-2021. Prior to El Paso and Indy, Lowry coached at the Jacksonville Armada.



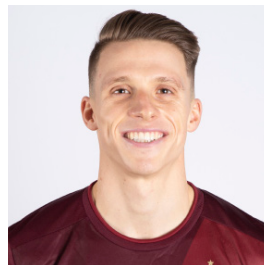

Trevor James will lead Detroit City FC in its inaugural USL Championship season after 30 years of coaching and scouting at the highest levels of soccer in the United States and Europe.

Following his retirement from professional soccer in 1985, James moved into the coaching ranks with stints as staff at Ipswich Town FC and Colchester United before working for Sir Bobby Robson as a freelance scout at FC Barcelona ('96-'97), Newcastle ('01-'02), FC Porto ('94-'96), Sporting Lisbon ('92) and the England national team during the buildup to the 1990 World Cup.

From 2006-2010, James was Assistant Coach for the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer, serving under three different head coaches during his tenure (Frank Yallop, Ruud Gullit, and Bruce Arena), as well as serving as the interim head coach on two occasions. In addition to his first team duties, he was promoted to Director of Player Development where he oversaw the creation and growth of the LA Galaxy Youth Academy.

As one of the most respected and longest serving assistant coaches in MLS, James served as Assistant Head Coach for the Portland Timbers from 2010-2012. From 2014 to 2015, James was the Director of Scouting and Assistant Technical Director for the Chicago Fire before he returned to a coaching role with Indy Eleven of the North American Soccer League (NASL) for the league's final season. He was named Technical Director of Indy Eleven in 2017 and oversaw the club's transition to USL.

James was announced as the general manager and head coach of Detroit City FC in January of 2019. James oversaw Le Rouge's move from an amateur side to a professional club - winning the 2019 Member's Cup before kicking off play in the National Independent Soccer Association in 2020. Detroit City FC went on a historic run in two years of play in NISA, recording a record of 28-5-3, including going 27 matches with a loss - setting a new U.S. professional record among active leagues. City posted a +42 goal differential in its time in the third division, outscoring opponents 62-20 (excludes NISA Independent Cup matches). Detroit City FC won every trophy available during its time in NISA: NISA 2020 Fall Tournament, 2020 NISA Independent Cup Great Lakes Region, 2021 NISA Legends Cup, 2021 NISA Spring Season, 2020-21 NISA Championship, 2021 NISA Independent Cup Great Lakes Region and 2021 NISA Fall Season.
