## HEAD COACH



## WILMER CABRERA

The appointment marks Cabrera's return to the Rio Grande Valley. He was previously named the first Head Coach in the club's history in December 2015 and led the club to its most successful season, earning a second-place finish in the Western Conference in the regular season and a place in the USL Championship Playoffs.

The 53-year-old brings more than a decade of experience at U.S Soccer and Major League Soccer to the Toros. Most recently, Cabrera managed Club de Foot Montreal in MLS late in 2019 where he led the team to the Canadian Championship title, defeating Toronto FC.

Prior to Montreal, Cabrera spent two-and-a-half-years with Houston Dynamo FC (2016-19). During

his tenure, Cabrera's side won the 2018 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, making him the first head coach to win both the U.S. Open Cup and Canadian Championship in consecutive years.

By earning the U.S. Open Cup, Houston qualified to the 2019 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League, but their course ended in the quarterfinal round. In 2017, Cabrera led Houston to a berth in the 2017 MLS Cup Playoffs.

Cabrera joins RGV FC as Head Coach and Sporting Director.



## GERSON ECHEVERRY

As **Director of Scouting and Assistant Coach** Gerson Echeverry, who holds the longest tenure by any Head Coach at the club. Echeverry has taken the lead in scouting all current and prospect players for the club. He was appointed as Head Coach in late 2017 and remained in the position for three seasons with the Toros. Prior to RGV, Echeverry served as Head Coach at Seton Hall University's Men's Soccer program for five years. He has also served as an assistant coach for the United States U-17 Youth National Team and residency program. At the residency program, Echeverry evaluated prospects and implemented training plans with an emphasis on developing attacking players.



## ARTURO SANCHEZ

**Goalkeeper Coach** Arturo Sanchez enters his first season on the staff at RGV FC. The Mexican national returns to the Valley having previously been part of the Toros' inaugural squad in 2016 as a goalkeeper. Most recently, Sanchez was part of the coaching staff with San Antonio City Soccer Club, Austin Bold FC, San Antonio FC and St. Mary's University.



## JOAN CASANOVA

As **Strength and Fitness Coach** Casanova brings extensive experience for his first season in the United States. Previously, Casanova was part of the coaching staff at Odisha FC of the Indian Super League during the 2019 and 2020 campaign. Prior to Odisha, Casanova was the strength and conditioning coach at Kitchee SC of the Hong Kong Premier League. Throughout his three seasons with Kitchee, the club earned nine total trophies — Hong Kong Premier League Championships (2017, 2019), Hong Kong Sapling Cup (2017, 2019), Hong Kong Senior Shield (2018), Hong Kong FA Cup (2017, 2018) and Hong Kong Community Cup (2017, 2018). In addition, the squad competed in the AFC Champions League — Asia's equivalent to the UEFA and Concacaf Champions League — and AFC Cup tournaments.

## RGV VS NM

RGV FC defeated New Mexico United on Saturday night, boasting a 1-0 first-ever win during a season-opener. Elvis Amoh opened the goal tab during the 65th minute after Murphy was able to connect with him. The win also marks the first win against NM in club history.

For NM, Isidro Martinez made his debut at H-E-B Park with his new squad. It was the first time in his career that Martinez played against RGV FC. The Toros totaled 12 shots, while New Mexico took 10. Tyler Deric saved two shots for RGV and Alex Tambakis had three for New Mexico.

## #1 – TYLER DERIC

**Position:** Goalkeeper  
**Height/Weight:** 6'3"/ 185LBS  
**D.O.B.:** 8/30/1988  
**Hometown:** Houston, TX

Deric re-joins RGV after his tenure with Dynamo FC. Most recently, the Houston native appeared in six matches for the Toros in 2019, on loan from the Dynamo...he returned to Houston where he made 7 appearances, including a Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup match which resulted in a 3-2 win over Championship side Austin Bold FC in the 4th Round on 6/12/2019... In 2018, Deric appeared & started in two games for Houston, making his season debut as a starter in a 4-2 loss at Los Angeles FC on 10/12/2018. In addition, he appeared in 6 matches for the Toros on loan, conceding 5 goals & recorded 2 clean sheets... was named Major League Soccer's Player

of the Month for October during the 2017 season where he started & played 90 minutes in 26 games. During the Audi 2017 MLS Cup Playoffs, Deric recorded his 2nd post-season career clean sheet & 8th on the year against the Portland Timbers in the First Leg of the Western Conference Semifinals... he began his professional career in 2009 as Houston's first Homegrown player. In 2010 he became the first Dynamo Academy player to start an MLS match when he made his competitive debut on 10/16/2010 at San Jose, recording 3 saves to post a shutout. He also became the first Homegrown goalkeeper in MLS history to record a shutout in his debut.

## #2 – CARTER MANLEY

**Position:** Defender

Manley played a key role in the back line for the Toros during the 2020 campaign. He started in 13 matches for RGV FC and contributed 2 assists and 6 key passes in a total of 1,147 minutes of action. The 24-year-old also totaled 39 clearances, 5 blocks and 22 interceptions and had a 54.4 percent duel success rate defensively... In 2019 Manley started in 20 games for USL League One club Forward Madison FC on loan from Major League Soccer's Minnesota United FC. With Madison, Manley completed 478 of 616 passes — a 77.6 percent accuracy rate, and also notched one goal and 15 key passes in 1,774 minutes of action. Defensively for the Flamingos, Manley totaled 29 clearances,

22 interceptions & 5 blocks while having a 53.9 percent duel success rate... During the 2018 campaign, he made 8 appearances for the USL Championship's Las Vegas Lights FC, again on loan from Minnesota United FC. The Maryland native totaled 13 clearances, 12 interceptions and a lone block and also registered a 67.9 percent passing accuracy rate... Manley brings 2 years of MLS experience to the Toros after beginning his professional career with Minnesota United FC. The defender was selected with the 23rd pick in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft and finished with 9 appearances for the Loons. The defender made 52 starts in 58 appearances over four years at Duke University, primarily at outside back.

## #3 – GRANT ROBINSON

Robinson started in 11 of 16 games for Las Vegas Lights FC during the 2020 season, totaling 959 minutes of action. Playing primarily in midfield, he totaled nine clearances, 17 interceptions and 4 blocks. Robinson had a 75.6% passing accuracy rate and notched two assists and 5 key passes... he appeared in one match in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup during the 2019 campaign while he was with The Villages SC of USL League Two. With Villages SC, Robinson played in 13 games during the League Two season and scored one goal... In 2016 Robinson was called-up to the U.S. U19 Men's National Team for the Copa de

Atlántico tournament but didn't see action. Robinson was a member of the 2016 Boys IMG Academy 150 Player Pool and the 2016 College Soccer News Top 160 selection.

## #4 – ERIK PIMENTEL

Pimentel joins RGV FC with a wealth of experience from his time at Club América. The 30-year-old made 82 appearances for the club while recording two goals and one assist, scoring his first goal in win against C.F. Monterrey on Mar. 2, 2014. Pimentel also found the net during the group stage of Copa MX on Aug. 15, 2012 against Correcaminos de la UAT... In addition, Pimentel earned four championships with Club América — two Liga MX titles (2014/2015, 2012/2013) and two Concacaf Champions League titles (2015/2016, 2014/2015), and has made appearances in the FIFA Club World Cup and the

Liga MX's Campeón de Campeones during his professional career... More recently, Pimentel competed for Correcaminos de la UAT from Liga Expansión MX during the 2020-21 campaign. The defender made 10 appearances and recorded 866 minutes of action. Prior to Correcaminos, Pimentel spent two seasons in Guatemala with Deportivo Mixco from the Liga Nacional Apertura, making 18 appearances with the club... Prior to moving to Guatemala, the center-back made 18 appearances in Liga MX during 2017 and 2019 with Puebla FC.

## #5 – JUAN DAVID CABEZAS

Cabezas competed for Major League Soccer's Houston Dynamo FC from 2017 to 2019. During the 2019 campaign, he made 15 regular season appearances, scoring one goal against New York City FC during the Audi 2019 MLS Cup Playoffs. He also recorded an 81.9% passing accuracy rate... Cabezas saw some action with RGV FC during the 2019 season, starting in 3 matches and logging 207 minutes of action. He had one key pass with 88.3 percent passing accuracy rate...
