#### HEAD COACH



### WILMER CABRERA

Cabrera enters year two at RGV FC as Head Coach and Sporting Director after a succesful 2021 USL Championship season which saw Rio Grande qualify to the Western Conference Semifinals for the first time in club history.

The 2021 USL Championship season marked Wilmer Cabrera's return to the Rio Grande Valley. He was previously named the first Head Coach in the club's history in December 2015. In the inaugural year he led the club to a successful first season, earning a second-place finish in the Western Conference in the regular season and a place in the USL Championship Playoffs.

The 53-year-old brings more than a decade of experience at U.S Soccer and Major League Soccer to the Toros.

Most recently, Cabrera managed Club de Foot Montreal in MLS late in 2019 where he led the team to the Canadian Championship title, defeating Toronto FC.


Prior to Montreal, Cabrera spent two-and-a-halfyears with Houston Dynamo FC (2016–19). During his tenure, Cabrera's side won the 2018 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, making him the first head coach to win both the U.S. Open Cup and Canadian Championship in consecutive years.

By earning the U.S. Open Cup, Houston qualified to the 2019 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League, but their course ended in the quarterfinal round. In 2017, Cabrera led Houston to a berth in the 2017 MLS Cup Playoffs.



#### GERSON ECHEVERRY

As (Director) [of] (Scouting) [and] [Assis-] (tant) [Coach] Gerson Echeverry, who holds the longest tenure by any Head Coach at the club. Echeverry has taken the lead in scouting all current and prospect players for the club. He was appointed as Head Coach in late 2017 and remained in the position for three seasons with the Toros. Prior to RGV, Echeverry served as Head Coach at Seton Hall University's Men's Soccer program for five years. He has also served as an assistant coach for the United States U-17 Youth National Team and residency program. At the residency program, Echeverry evaluated prospects and implemented training plans with an emphasis on developing attacking players.



PAU ROVIRA CRUA

**(Goalkeeper) (Coach)** Pao Rovira Crua is a native of Tortosa, Spain. He enters his first season on the technical staff at RGV FC.



### JOAN CASANOVA

As (Strength) (and) (Fitness) (Coach) Casanova brings extensive experience in his second season in the United States. Previously, Casanova was part of the coaching staff at Odisha FC of the Indian Super League during the 2019 and 2020 campaign. Prior to Odisha, Casanova was the strength and conditioning coach at Kitchee SC of the Hong Kong Premier League. Throughout his three seasons with Kitchee, the club earned nine total trophies - Hong Kong Premier League Championships (2017, 2019), Hong Kong Sapling Cup (2017, 2019), Hong Kong Senior Shield (2018), Hong Kong FA Cup (2017, 2018) and Hong Kong Community Cup (2017, 2018). In addition, the squad competed in the AFC Champions League - Asia's equivalent to the UEFA and Concacaf Champions League — and AFC Cup tournaments.





#### #1 - TYLER DERIC

Position: Goalkeeper Heiaht: 6'3" D.O.B.: 8/30/1988 Hometown: Houston, TX

Deric re-joins RGVFC after starting in 28 games during the 2021 USL Championship season under the direction of Head Coach Wilmer Cabrera.

The 33-year-old veteran recorded six clean sheets and earned a 61.3% save percentage during the past season. A native of Spring, Texas, Deric has made more than 150 professional appearances overall in his career, including 90 appearances and 24 clean sheets in Major League Soccer while competing for Houston Dynamo FC.

The veteran goalkeeper was a key piece in Cabrera's locker room in 2021 as the Toros made a historic playoff push, ultimately reaching the Western Conference Semifinals of the USL Championship Playoffs as the side returned to the postseason for the first time since the 2016 campaign.

"We are excited for another one of Tyler's seasons with the Toros," said Cabrera. "He is a solid and experienced goalkeeper who is hungry for success, and he wants to compete for the [title] of best goalkeeper in the USL Championship in 2022."

#### #2 - DANIEL LUIS SAEZ

Daniel Luis Saez has made (age 18) as a late-stage sub 19 appearances for the Cuba Men's National Team, including in FIFA World Cup Qualifying and the 2019 Concacaf Gold Cup. He joins RGV FC having most recently played for USL League Two club PDX FC in Portland, Oregon following his defection from Cuba during the Gold Cup three years ago.

"Daniel is a very athletic defender with international experience; despite his size he is very technical and talented with the ball which allows him to play as a midfielder also", noted Toros Sporting Director Wilmer Cabrera.

Saez made his debut with the Cuban National Team as an 18-year-old in 2012

#### #5 - JUAN DAVID CABEZAS

#### Position: Midfielder Height: 6'0" D.O.B.: 2/27/1991 Hometown: Cali, Colombia

Cabezas returns for a second season at H-E-B Park after having started in 15 of 19 appearances for the Toros a season ago, including appearing in both postseason contests. Cabezas has logged 21 appearances and 1,546 minutes of action in the Championship, captaining the Toros on 11 occasions. The Cali, Colombia native showed positive distribution a season ago, recording an 84.6 passing accuracy rate last year.

"Juan David is coming back to the team with a desire and mentality to play more games and become the leader of the team on and off the field," said Cabrera

Cabezas' experience will be crucial this season as RGV FC makes its first appearance in the historic Lamar Hunt U.S Open Cup, the oldest soccer tournament in North America. In 2018 while at Houston Dynamo he played a key role in the Open Cup Final that saw Houston defeat the Philadelphia Union

3-0 for the title. In the international ranks, Cabezas has played at the Under-20 level, representing his home country, Colombia, at the South American U-20 Championship in 2011, making six appearances of nine Colombia's matches, and at the 2011 FIFA U-20 World Cup, played in Colombia. Cabezas started all five of Colombia's matches at the U-20 World Cup that led to a Quarterfinal appearance. Cabezas played a key defensive midfield role in the tournament alongside of other Colombian stars such as forward James Rodriguez, defender Jeison Murillo, striker Luis Muriel and winger Fabian Castillo.

Beginning his professional career in 2010, Cabezas played on loan with Cúcuta Deportivo, La Equidad (2011-12), Once Caldas (2013-14) and Independiente Medellín (2016).

#### #3 - WAHAB ACKWEI

Position: Defender Height: 6'0" D.O.B.: 10/19/1996 Hometown: Accra,Ghana

Ackwei comes to the Toros roster with experience in both the USL Championship and League One. The Accra, Ghana native most recently competed for Championship club Loudoun United FC during the 2021 season where he recorded 23 clearances, 16 interceptions and six blocks in nine appearances. Ackwei also previously played in the Championship for the New York Red Bulls II in 2018, where he made seven appearances.

Additionally, Ackwei has seen action in League One for the Richmond Kickers, where across two seasons in 2019-20 he made 39 in all

competitions. While with the Kickers, Ackwei earned League One All-League Second Team honors in 2019 as he tied for fourth in the league with 49 interceptions while also recording 97 clearances and 22 tackles at a 75.9 percent success rate.

Earlier in his career, the now 25-year-old competed in his home country , of Ghana in the Ghana Premier League for Inter Allies FC between 2014-2017. where he made 23 appearances.

#### #6 - ISIDRO MARTINEZ

Position: Midfielder Height: 5'8" D.O.B.: 3/15/1997 Hometown: Brownsville, TX

Martinez makes his return home to the Rio Grande Valley after a lone season at USI Championship side, New Mexico United.

The yound midfielder adds control and experience to the mid line of the Toros as he pairs up with veteran teammate Juan David Cabezas.

In contrast to his previous stint at RGV, the Brownsville, TX native is self-claimed as a more patient and smart central piece. His ability to hold the press and distibute balls to the wings will make for a good fit in the new RGV FC system.

#### #4 - ERIK PIMENTEL

#### Position: Defender Height: 5'10" D.O.B.: 5/15/1990 Hometown: Coacalco de Berriozabal, MX

Pimentel returns to the RGV FC back line for the upcoming campaign having helped lead the side to the Western **Conference Semifinals** of the 2021 USL Championship Playoffs. The 31-year-old stood as a solid veteran for the Toros in his first season in the USL Championship, accounting for 30 tackles, 50 clearances, 11 blocked shots, and 46 interceptions. His prior experience - including time in Liga MX at Club America — made him a natural leader on the pitch, especially on the back line as he was a vocal piece, directing traffic despite language barriers.

#### #7 - NAFIU SULEMANA

Position: Forward Height: 5'9 D.O.B.: 10/11/99 Hometown: Janga, Ghana

Sulemana (5-foot-9, Forward) arrives at RGV FC via loan from Legon Cities FC, member of the Ghana Premier League. The 22-year-old native of Ghana is a dynamic and versatile addition for the squad that can play in both midfield and attack.

Sulemana appeared in nine contests for Legion Cities during the 2021-22 season, logging 440 minutes of action. Prior to signing with Legon Cities, he competed with Inter Allies FC, also a member of the Ghana Premier League. While at Inter Allies he made 26 appearances and recorded seven goals.

#### #10 - JOSE TORRES

#### Position: Midfielder Height: 5'5" D.O.B.: 10/29/1987 Hometown: Longview, TX

Torres joins the Toros after competing at Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC during the 2021 USL Championship season. The former United States international recorded one goal and three assists in 26 regular season matches as he helped quide the Switchbacks to their first postseason appearance since the 2016 season.

A Texas native, Torres has made 350 professional club appearances over the course of his career that included competing for Pachuca, Tigres and Puebla in Liga MX. The opportunity to continue his career in the Rio Grande Valley was a welcome one for the 34-year-old, who also made 26 appearances for the United States and was part of the country's squad for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Sporting Director and Head Coach Wilmer Cabrera was also excited to welcome Torres to the squad, with his experiences that saw him win four Liga MX titles, both the Concacaf Gold Cup and Concacaf Champions League, and a pair of Concacaf Champions Cup titles an invaluable asset to the club as it enters the new season.

#### #8 - EMILIO YCAZA

Position: Midfielder Height: 5'6" D.O.B.: 7/10/1997 Hometown: St. Petersburg, FL

Ycaza made 17 appearances for Austin Bold FC during the 2021 USL Championship season prior to his transfer to RGVFC on September 3. The 24-year-old then went one to make 13 appearances for the Toros and recorded two goals and two assists in the club's drive to the postseason.

"Emilio made a great impact last season despite arriving late," said Cabrera. "This season he is motivated to become one of the top players in this league and a leader with positive impact in the club."

Ycaza played collegiate soccer at the University of South Florida. He had

#### #11 - OLLIE WRIGHT

#### Position: Forward Height: 5'10" D.O.B.: 3/1/1999 Hometown: London, England

Wright is an English forward from London who last season played for the Toros' South Texas Derby rival San Antonio FC. Last season, Wright made 14 appearances for SAFC and recorded two assists and eight chances created across 368 minutes of action.

Wright competed in the academies of multiple English clubs such as Fulham and Brentford before making his move to the United States where he found a highly successful college career at NCAA Division II St. Mary's University in San Antonio. Wright had a breakout 2019 season for the side as he claimed the 2019 Lone Star Conference Player of the Year, Lone Star Conference Midfielder of the Year, South Central Region Player of the Year and Division II CCA

"Ollie is a very talented player with a good mentality and attitude to compete and create difficulties for the opponents," said Cabrera. "He is coming to become a solid forward in this

During his college career, Wright joined USL League Two side Corpus Christi FC during the 2019 season where he set a single-season assists record in the league with 15 in 14 regular season contests matches. Wright also notched seven goals for CCFC before concluding his college career at St. Mary's and joining the professional ranks.

#### #9 - FRANK LOPEZ

Position: Forward Height: 5'9" D.O.B.: 2/25/1995 Hometown: Cienfuegos, Cuba

Lopez rejoins the Toros lineup after a productive performance in 2021. The Cuban national was previously acquired on Ioan from fellow USL Championship club OKC Energy FC on September 3, 2021 and quickly made an impact on the pitch.

The 26-year-old scored his first goal with RGV on September 11 in the 80th minute of a 1-1 draw against Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC on the road, and also added a pair of assists in 10 appearances for the club as the Toros advanced to the 2021 USL Championship Playoffs. Lopez has recorded 32 goals in 91 regular-season appearances in the Championship overall, having arrived in the league in 2018 with the LA Galaxy II. In addition, Lopez has also competed in the league for San Antonio FC and Sacramento Republic FC.

On the international level, Lopez has represented Cuba at . the U-23, U-20 and U-17 levels while competing for hometown club FC Cienfuegos. While with the U-20 squad, Lopez scored twice against Canada during the 2015 Concacaf U-20 Championship in Jamaica. Later that year, he defected to the United States during 2015 Concacaf Men's Olympic Qualifying in the United States, from where he joined the Miami Soccer Academy.

#### #12 - COLIN MILLER

Position: Goalkeeper Height: 6'3" D.O.B.: 10/25/1996 Hometown: Bel Air, MD

Miller spent two seasons at fellow USL Championship side Loudoun United FC prior to joining RGV FC prior to the 2021 season. In 2020, Miller made seven starts, recording one shutout and 28 saves overall. He denied two penalty kicks and kept a 65.1 save percentage on his way to claiming the Championship Fans' Choice Save of the Month award for August that season.

Last year for the Toros, the Maryland native appeared in eight matches, logging 643 total minutes across the regular season and playoffs. Miller made his debut on August 4 as a substitute for Tyler Deric following a first–half injury and helped conclude a shutout performance in a 3–0 victory.

Miller then served as a key piece in the late season push for RGV FC after . Deric suffered a season-ending injury late in the campaign. Miller came through crucially in the 2021 USL Championship Playoffs as he made a pair of penalty kick saves in a shootout against Phoenix Rising FC in the Western Conference Quarterfinals, which allowed the Toros to advance 4-3 in a shootout after the sides had played to a 3-3 draw after regulation and extra time.





#### #13 - DUILIO HERRERA

Position: Forward Height: 5'10" D.O.B.: 11/12/2004 Hometown: Edinburg, TX

As a USL Academy signing, Herrera will be available for selection for the Toros in both the USL Championship and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup throughout the upcoming season while retaining his NCAA eligibility. Herrerg is the first player signed by the Toros to a USL Academy contract since the restructuring of the club's partnership agreement with Major League Soccer's Houston Dynamo FC.

The 17-year-old academy product hails from Edinburg and has been competing within the RGV FC Academy ranks for five years, most recently in the U-19 division. In those five

years Herrera has accumulated more than 100 appearances across both MLS Next Academy and USL Academy competition. His performance on the field was showcased via 10 goals and 20 assists all-time as an attacking piece.

In 2021 Herrera appeared in 25 games, leading the team in assists as he was dubbed a free-kick specialist by academy director Rafael Amaya. Most recently he competed in the MLS Next Showcase in which he recorded one goal and dished out five assists in the competition. Additionally, Herrera tallied experience for the Toros in an exhibition contest against Liga MX club CF Monterrey in July.

#### #16 - FRANK DAVID GAVIRIA

#### **Position:** Forward Height/Weight: 6'0" D.O.B.: 6/11/2001 Hometown: Valledupar, Colombia

Frank David Gaviria joins the Toros after most recently competing for NK Špansko in Croatia's third division. A native of Valledupar, Colombia, the 20-year-old Gaviria will join the professional ranks for the first time with the Toros this season.
