New Faces, Old Faces

The Tampa Bay Rowdies kick off their seventh season in the USL Championship at Al Lang Stadium this Saturday against Eastern Conference foe Indy Eleven.

Both squads have retooled their rosters n the offseason. For the Tampa Bay, the aim is for the changes to help them get over the last hurdle and claim a championship after reaching three straight conference titles and the league final two of the last three years. Meanwhile, Indy is hoping its refresh is enough to get the club in the playoffs for the first time since 2019.

The Rowdies have undergone their largest overhaul since the 2019 new season. Ten players on this year's squad were not with Rowdies last season.

"We'll really start learning about the group this weekend," said Rowdies Head Coach Neill Collins. Expectations are high as you can expect. We've kept a lot core guys that have been successful. The guys that we've added have all shown a real desire to be here. They all want to be here for all the right reasons. That's a great starting point."

However, two of those players who are very familiar to the Rowdies system and culture. Two-time USL Championship Defender of the Year Forrest Lasso has returned to Tampa Bay after a year spent playing in Sweden. Also returning is Irishman Jordan Doherty, who went back to his home country for the 2022 season but has chosen to rejoin the Rowdies for his fourth season. Both players are likely to play key roles for the Rowdies once again this year.

One new face to Indy's squad is a familiar one to Rowdies supporters. Tampa Bay's all-time leading scorer Sebastian Guenzatti now calls Indy home and will be returning to Al Lang this Saturday with the goal of taking three point off his former side.

Losing Leo

There's no getting around the hole left by 2022 USL Championship MVP Leo Fernandes' season-ending Achilles injury during preseason. With 19 goals and 9 assists, Fernandes accounted for nearly half of Tampa Bay's league-leading 73 goals last year.

Even before Fernande suffered his injury the Rowdies were looking to bolster their attacking with reinforcements. Forwards JJ Williams and Cal Jennings were signed after proving to be consistent producers in the USL. Jennings posted two straight 11-goal seasons while on loan to Las Vegas Lights FC from MLS' LAFC. Williams is coming off career season last year with 12 goals in USL play despite dealing with a transfer from Tulsa to Phoenix midway through the year.



Neill Collins

Head Coach

Collins was appointed head coach of the Tampa Bay Rowdies on May 18, 2018. He joined the Rowdies as a player prior to the 2016 season and made 67 appearances for the club as a center back before transitioning to the role of head coach. Collins holds a UEFA A license. A native of Troon, Scotland, Collins began his playing career for the amateur Glasgow club Queen's Park in 2001. As he progressed into the professional ranks, Collins signed with Dumbarton in 2002 became moving to England to sign with Sunderland in 2004. While with Sunderland, Collins had loan spells with Hartlepool United, Sheffield United and Wolves. He joined Wolves on a permanent basis in 2007 and later joined Preston North End on a permanent deal after a loan spell there. From Preston North End, Collins signed with Leeds United in 2010 after another successful loan spell. Collins signed with Sheffield United in 2011 and would spend five seasons there, making nearly 200 appearances for the Blades with a short loan to Port Vale. From Sheffield United, Collins made the jump to the United States by signing with the Rowdies. His professional career spanned 598 competitive matches. Collins was voted USL Championship Coach of the Year in 2021 after leading the Rowdies to the best record in the regular season.



Stuart Dobson Assistant Coach

Dobson joined the Tampa Bay Rowdies before the 2015 season as the goalkeeper coach. He has continued on as an assistant coach with an emphasis on working with the Rowdies' goalkeepers. Prior to joining the Rowdies, Dobson served as the goalkeeper coach at the University of Akron. Born in England, Dobson came to the United States to begin his

professional career in 1995 with the Continental Indoor Soccer Leagues's Portland Pride. In a professional career that lasted until 2006, Dobson played for a number of indoor professional teams, including the Tampa Bay Terror in 1996-97. Dobson then got into coaching with the indoor New Jersey Ironmen in 2007. He also served as goalkeeper coach for the UC-Santa Barbara Gauchos from 2008 to 2012 prior to joining Akron in 2013



Assistant Coach

Second season in Tampa Bay. Stead quickly jumped into coaching after a nearly 20-year career in England. Spent 2021 as an assist coach with Hartford Athletic before joining the Rowdies.





Eric Wilde Assistant Coach

Second season in Tampa Bay. Wilde joined the Rowdies after three seasons as a member of USL League One side Forward Madison's technical staff.

About the Rowdies

The Tampa Bay Rowdies are a professional soccer club and a member of the United Soccer League, beginning with the 2017 USL season. The Rowdies' home stadium is Al Lang Stadium in downtown St. Petersburg, Fla. The Rowdies were reborn in 2010 and quickly reestablished themselves as one of the United States' premier soccer clubs, winning the North American Soccer League's Soccer Bowl Champions in 2012.

The original Tampa Bay Rowdies were born in 1975 as an expansion team in the North American Soccer League. From 1975-1984, the Rowdies were one of the most successful teams in the NASL, winning the Soccer Bowl Championship in 1975 and reaching the final again in 19778 and 1979. The Rowdies featured iconic players such as Rodney Marsh, Derek Smethurst, Farrukh Quraishi, Perry Van Der Beck, Mike Connell and Steve Wegerle while winning over the hearts of the people of Tampa Bay and creating an internationally-recognized brand.

The Rowdies attracted a sellout crowd to their first home game in May 2010 at Tampa's Steinbrenner Field and have continued to boast strong local fan support. In 2011, the Rowdies moved across Tampa Bay to St. Petersburg's Al Lang Stadium, which has been home ever since.

In December of 2018, the ownership group of the Tampa Bay Rays of Major League Baseball purchased the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

USL Championship

The United Soccer League (USL) is the largest professional soccer organization in North America, possessing nearly a decade of experience in bringing the world's game to communities across the United States and Canada. Overseeing The USL Championship, USL League One, and USL League Two, the organization is built on a proven and recognized model in international football and counts more than 100 clubs in its membership.

Based in Tampa, Fla., the USL has grown over the past decade into a model organization with strong corporate partnerships, stable organizational leadership, and a dedicated staff that provides outstanding support to member clubs and outside partners. Sanctioned by the U.S. Soccer Federation and Canadian Soccer Association, the USL is #UnitedForSoccer, moving the game forward in the United States and Canada.

Al Lang Stadium

Fully renovated in 2015 and situated on the downtown St. Petersburg waterfront next to the Salvador Dali Museum and Mahaffey Theater, the iconic stadium used to be the spring training home of the Tampa Bay Rays. Since construction, several other Major League Baseball teams, including the Baltimore Orioles, New York Mets, New York Yankees and St. Louis Cardinals have used the stadium as their headquarters for spring training.

The St. Petersburg Athletic Park at the current site of Al Lang Stadium was the spring home for the Boston Braves and New York Yankees from 1923 until after World War II, hosting such greats as Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig and Stan Musial. The first incarnation of the current field was built for the St. Louis Cardinals in 1947.
