Eleven Returns to League Play vs. Roots SC: After completing its first home stretch of the season over the last two weeks, Indy Eleven gets back on the road in a big way this weekend with a first-ever trek to Orange County SC, the first of two trips the Boys in Blue will take to California across the next month.

Indy Eleven will be looking to shake off its first defeat of 2023 last weekend, which came via a surprising 0-3 result to another Golden State squad in Oakland Roots SC. At the end of a three-game week – including a 120-minute run out in U.S. Open Cup play three days prior – Indy Eleven Head Coach Mark Lowry pointed out the energy level that kept the squad undefeated in its first four competitive matches this season just wasn't present, so a full week to rest and prepare for OCSC was indeed welcome for a roster that should indeed be back at 100% both injury and energy wise for this weekend.

Now it's time to address the elephant in the room – last year's two trips to California, the first two for Indiana's Team during its then five-season USL Championship tenure. Indy's 2022 campaign hit a pair of speedbumps after 0-5 defeats in different parts of the season at San Diego Loyal SC (June 25) and Monterey Bay F.C. (Sept. 17) – that's the bad news. The good news? Of the 10 players who have started all four matches in league play thus far, only one – Solomon Asante – was a part of those defeats,

so Lowry should not have to break out the Men in Black memory-eraser thingy as part of this week's preparations. New year, new players, new attitudes, new philosophy, new playing style ... you get the picture. If anything, those heavy defeats last season – combined with a disappointing result last Saturday – should provide the Boys in Blue with ample motivation to turn things around in short order against a so far struggling OCSC side.

The best way to go about that would be continuing to limit the opposition's changes. The squad's 8.5 shots allowed per game (30 shots in 4 games) is second lowest in the league, and last weekend's 11 shots allowed against Oakland fell right at league average per game. However, Roots SC gamed the system by putting seven of its 11 shots on frame, with those seven shots faced equaling the Eleven's total allowed from its first three games combined. Defense is always accentuated when taking to the road, and you can bet Lowry put a premium on shoring things up on that side of the ball throughout training this week.

For Orange County, the USL Championship's reigning Golden Boot holder Milan Iloski remains the primary focus. The 23-year-old striker from the San Diego area burst onto the scene with 22 goals in his first season with OCSC last year, and his two tallies on 14 shots early on in 2023 show he has no signs of slowing down. Brief Boy in Blue Kevin Partida has also stood out in his box-to-box role in Orange County's midfield, contributing team highs in interceptions (11), tackles/tackles won (12/10), duels/duels won (50/28) and, just for good measure, yellow cards (3), while also contributing a goal.

Between the posts, former U.S. Youth international and certified journeyman Cody Cropper has been the first choice 'keeper for OCSC's last four games, this after Colin Shutler conceded thrice in a 1-3 season-opening loss at home to Louisville City FC. Cropper has allowed multiple goals just once (2-2 draw vs. Las Vegas on March 25) in that stretch but has yet to notch a clean sheet, keeping Orange County as one of eight squads that have not posted a shutout thus far in 2023.

One thing to be on the lookout for on Saturday will be who breaks though first. For two teams that have failed to lead much in the early stages of the season – OCSC has led for 18% of its 450 minutes played, while Indy has led only 8% of the time in its 360 minutes of action – said first goal (assuming it happens) may carry added importance on Saturday.

Indy Eleven's lone meeting with Orange County SC was another early-season affair last April 24, when the Boys in Blue stormed back in the second half to register a 3-1 win at Carroll Stadium. Mikko Kununigas' 13th minute tally opened the scoring, and the then-defending USL Championship title holder kept the advantage through halftime and early into the second stanza. However, Noah Powder's 54th minute goal equalized before Stefano Pinho notched the eventual game-winner in the 65th minute. An insurance tally goal by Aris Briggs a minute into stoppage time secured the Eleven's third win on the trot during a torrid April stretch.

#OCvIND Familiar Faces

Only one current member of each squad has suited up for the opposite side heading into Saturday's affair. For Indy, that would be midfielder Aodhan Quinn, who had a standout three seasons with Orange County SC from 2018-20, when he registered 24 goals and an equal number of assists in 86 appearances. Quinn's initial All-USL Championship First Team accolade followed his first campaign with OCSC in 2018, when he finished second in the league with 15 assists to go along with 12 goals and a league-high 103 chances created, figures that also landed the San Diego native on the three-person shortlist for that season's USL Championship Most Valuable Player award.

The paragraph honoring current OCSC midfielder Kevin Partida's time in Indy will be a bit shorter, as the Nevada native joined Indiana's Team for a cup of coffee at the end of the 2021 season, when he started five of his six appearances.

Last Time Out – IND 0 : 3 OAK Sat., April 8 | IUPUI Carroll Stadium Recap & Highlights

Indy Eleven suffered the first blemish of its 2023 campaign after falling to Oakland Roots SC, 3-0, last Saturday to close out a three-game, weeklong homestand at Carroll Stadium.

Oakland started the match on the front foot, but close range attempts by Anaur Palaez and Lindo Mfeka in the opening 10 minutes were stymied by Eleven goalkeeper Yannik Oettl. Possession started to turn in the Eleven's favor around 20 minutes into the match, but Roots SC netminder Paul Blanchette's grab of Robby Dambrot's cross for Sebastian Guenzatti in the 25th minute negated Indy's best look. Oakland took the lead in the 43rd minute, when Oettl's aggressive patrolling outside his penalty area was used against him as Mfeka beat him to Dariuz Formalla's ball over the backline out of midfield, leaving an open net tapin to take the lead heading into halftime.

While Indy controlled the early positions of the second half, the pace of the game increased when the second goal for Oakland came in the 71st minute. Mfeka intercepted a pass deep in the Roots' attacking third, cut centrally into the area and rocketed a shot into the sprawled Oettl on the turf. The rebound skied into the area before being picked out of the air by Formella on the full volley to double the visitors' lead. A minute later Indy tried to scrape one back when Cam Lindley drove a free kick into the heart of the area that Adrian Diz Pe fired right into the chest of Blanchette.

Oakland was able to secure the clincher from Edgardo Rito in the 78th minute, when he was put behind the backline by Joseph Nane's long ball from midfield and chipped a stranded Oettl from 25 yards to put things all but out of reach. While a faint sense of hope came in the 83rd minute, when Oakland defender Emrah Klimenta saw his second caution after taking down Guenzatti near the corner of the area, the disappointing scoreline remained in tact.

USOC Recap – IND 3 : 1 Michigan Stars FC (aet) Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup – Second Round Wed., April 5 | IUPUI Carroll Stadium <u>Recap & Highlights</u>

Indy Eleven survived a scare in its 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup debut against Michigan Stars FC on April 5 but a second half equalizer from Harrison Robledo and a pair of goals in the first added time period lifted Indiana's Team to a 3-1 win in Second Round action. Halftime sub Solomon Asante provided a spark off the bench, dishing out assists on all three goals to spur the Eleven on to a hard-fought victory over the NISA side at IUPUI Carroll Stadium.

A dominant first half by Indy had surprisingly little to show for the efforts in the final third, with close-range halfchances by Sebastian Guenzatti that were blocked marking the home sides best looks of the opening stanza. Resigned to doing work on the counter, Michigan capitalized on its lone look of any danger in the first half during stoppage time, when Nebojsa Popovic was fouled inside the area to draw a penalty kick that he stroked low and right to give the visitors a shock lead heading into halftime.

With the insertion of Solomon Asante, Aodhan Quinn, and Robby Dambrot at the interval, Eleven Head Coach Mark Lowry showed the seriousness with which the home side had advancement in mind – and the moves would soon pay dividends. After seeing Sebastian Guenzatti's apparent goal in the 56th minute nullified for offside, Robledo indeed equalized three minutes later on a 15-yard poke that eluded the dive of Tatenda Mkuruva.

Michigan nearly stole the match twice late through forward Leon Maric, who saw a deflected shot leave Eleven goalkeeper Yannik Oettl stranded before bouncing wide in the 89th minute and four minute later forced Oettl into a big parry of a blast from 15 yards out. In between, Guenzatti saw a loose ball land at his feet eight yards from goal only to see Mkuruva get low for a miraculous save, while Tejada had the final chance of regulation to pick a winner, only to see his redirect pushed wide, sending the match into 30 minutes of added extra time. It didn't take long for the Eleven to stamp their claim in extra time, as just two minutes in Guenzatti finally got his goal on a re-racked corner kick opportunity that saw Asante's low ball from the right side find Guenzatti to knock in at the doorstep, giving Indy its first lead of the night at 2-1. A minute deep into stoppage time in the first extra period it was Tejada providing some insurance with a shot from the top of the area that was set up by yet another Asante service.

Stepping up to "The Mike": Last Saturday's defeat to Oakland marked Indy's second home defeat in its last nine outings at Carroll Stadium across all competitions dating back to last August.

Indy Eleven posted the second-longest home undefeated streak in USL Championship history during its Lucas Oil Stadium tenure, going 28 games (21 wins, 7 draws) without defeat from July 2018-July 2020. It also collected a lengthy undefeated streak at "The Mike" during its NASL era, going 21 matches without a loss from Oct. 2015-May 2017. **Oettl's Shutout Streak Ends:** New goalkeeper Yannik Oettl is quickly getting himself in the good graces of the Eleven faithful with strong performances out of the gate. The 26-year-old netminder from Munich stopped six of the seven shots he faced between Indy's season-opening draw at Tampa Bay (1-1) and a 1-0 win at Detroit City FC that followed, while he was not forced into a single stop in his second straight shutout on April 1 vs. Las Vegas Lights FC. Despite seeing his shutout streak snapped at 252 minutes late in the first half last weekend against Oakland, Oettl remains tied for second across the league with a pair of shutouts in the early going.

Oettl also got the call In U.S. Open Cup action on April 5, with his lone concession coming via a kick from the penalty spot late in the first half of the 3-1 win. The German goalkeeper was not called upon often but saved his best for late, with a massive parry in second half stoppage time keeping the match tied and headed to added extra time, when Indy scored twice to prevail.

Another Offseason Overhaul: Head Coach Mark Lowry was a busy man against this offseason, continuing his tinkering with the squad that began soon after his official welcome as the Eleven's sideline boss in November 2021.

Of the 24 players on the current roster, only six were full members of the squad for the Eleven's 2022 opener at Loudoun United FC at this time last March – GK Tim Trilk, DF Mechack Jerome, FW Jonas Fjeldberg, MF Bryam Rebellon, and Academy signings FW Luca laccino and MF Diego Sanchez (that doesn't count season-long loanee MF Alann Torres, who spent 2022 with Forward Madison FC).

This year's offseason overhaul includes 12 new faces (well, 11 new ones and 2020 returnee Cam Lindley), who'll join those six 2022 opening day holdovers, Torres, and five players – Solomon Asante, Jesus Vazquez, Juan Tejada, Robby Dambrot, and Academy goalkeeper Hayden Vostal – who were acquired during the 2022 season.

Asante At It Again: Solomon Asante's playmaking ability in his first season in Indy helped to rewrite the club's record books ... and he's carried that over into Season 2 with an unprecedented Open Cup performance ...

- His 3-assist game vs. Birmingham on Sept. 10, 2022, was the first in the club's nine-year history and second of his career (with PHX on 7/17 vs. LA2). He is one of only three players to accomplish the feat twice alongside (Emmanuel Ledesma & Jose Barril.
- Asante equaled that three-assist effort on April 5 against Michigan Stars FC, coming on at the halftime break to facilitate all three of Indy's goals in a 3-1 added extra time win in the Second Round of the U.S. Open Cup.
- Asante became the first player in club history to notch a pair of multi-assist games in league play (3 vs. BHM on 9/10 and 2 @ CHS on 6/04), and now has three such performances across all competitions.
- Asante finished 2022 tied for the second-most helpers in a single-season for Indy:

Indy Adds Douglas Martinez: Head Coach Mark Lowry's roster moves continued on March 17 with the addition of veteran forward Douglas Martinez via transfer from Sacramento Republic FC. The 25-year-old Honduran brings nine years of pro experience to the Circle City, including four seasons in the USL Championship, during which he's collected 27 goals and 12 assists in 90 combined regular season and playoff matches (64 starts) with SRFC, San Diego Loyal SC (2021), Real Monarchs SLC (2019-21), and New York Red Bulls II (2017). Martinez's 17 goals and 5 assists helped the Monarchs to the 2019 USL Championship title along with new teammate Jack Blake. Martinez also scored a pair of goals, both in 2020, across 25 appearances (10 starts) in MLS action with Real Salt Lake during parts of three seasons between 2019-21.

Martinez Ninth Boy in Blue to Debut: It didn't take long for Douglas Martinez to influence his new team, as the Honduran became the ninth player to make his first appearance for the squad already in 2023 on March 25 at Detroit City FC. In doing the math, that means the other eight must have made their Indy Eleven debuts in the squad's March 11 Season Opener at Tampa Bay, including seven in the starting XI: MF Jack Blake, DF Younes Boudadi, DF Adrian Diz Pe, FW Sebastian Guenzatti GK Yannik Oettl; MF Aodhan Quinn, DF Gustavo Rissi & MF Harrison Robledo (substitute)

In addition, MF Cam Lindley made his return to the squad as a member of the starting XI at Tampa Bay. The Carmel native appeared in 12 of Indy Eleven's 16 matches during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

From GOAT to Coach: Ayoze was one of those players from the 2022 season who will not be on the field for the Eleven ... but that doesn't mean he's still not on the roster. The club's all time leader in appearances (126), starts (106), and assists (22) – figures amassed during a standout five seasons from 2018-22 that also included 13 goals (5th in team history) – made the seamless transition from the field to the bench for 2023 and will serve as an assistant coach under Mark Lowry. In all, Ayoze logged 400 appearances during a 19-year professional career split nearly evenly between his native Spain and the USA.

Rebellon & Diz Pe Named to Team of the Week for Week 3: Indy Eleven defender/midfielder Bryam Rebellon's effort on both ends of the pitch on March 25 against Detroit City FC helped earn the Colombian left back a spot on the USL Championship's Team of the Week for Week 3. In addition, one of Rebellon's backline mates, Adrian Diz Pe, was slotted into one of the Team of the Week's seven honorable mention "bench" spots.

Both players were integral to Indy Eleven's first shutout of the 2023 season, which in turn helped the Boys in Blue to a first victory of the campaign courtesy of Rebellon's goal that led the Eleven to a 1-0 road result at Keyworth Stadium.

Rebellon and Diz Pe join goalkeeper Yannik Oettl on the early season list of Team of the Week honorees, this after Oettl earned the nod following his Week 1 performance in a 1-1 draw at the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

Eleven on the Championship Charts

Solomon Asante ranks right behind Quinn in career assists with 47 helpers (4th). His 17 assists (1st), 123 shots (2nd), and 19 goals (3rd) for Phoenix in 2019 also stand out on the league's single-season records list, as does his 7-game scoring streak that season (T-2nd).

Sebastian Guenzatti – who will make his 150th USL Championship regular season appearance the next time he takes to the field – is tied with Enzo Martinez and Cameron Iwasa for 10th in career regular season goals with 59. That mark is also the second most for a Championship player on a single team, his haul with Tampa Bay placing behind only Cameron Lancaster's 69 tallies for LouCity FC.

Cam Lindley ranks in or near the league's top 10 this season with 8 chances created (T-11th) and 317 passes (9th), while **Jesus Vazquez** ranks right behind with 311 passes (10th).

Eleven Claim Two Titles in USL Academy Cup: Indy Eleven would like to congratulate all four teams who represented the club proudly during the USL Academy Cup in the Tampa area from Mar. 30-Apr. 2. In all, the Boys U-13, U-15 & U-19 and Girls U-19 teams went a combined 9W-4L-3D across the weekend while outscoring their opponents 30-13.

The Eleven U-19 Boys used three shutouts in as many games to win their group and earn a spot in the Elite Final, where Grayson Elmquist's goal in extra added time lifted the squad to a 1-0 win over Tampa Bay United and a second straight title. Grey Berglund was between the posts for all four matches and claimed tournament Golden Glove honors for his clean tournament, while Elmquist's four goals during the competition earned him the U-19 Golden Boot as top scorer as well as the Golden Ball for Most Valuable Player. USL Academy Contract signing Deigo Sanchez captained the Boys in Blue throughout the tournament – which also saw first team cohort Benji Chavarria feature in all four contests – while Head Coach Kiki Wallace was named the Coach of the Tournament.

Not to be outdone, the U-15 Boys followed up last year's runner-up finish with a first title of their own, coming back from a goal deficit while down a man to take their own Final against Tampa Bay United to penalties, where it converted all five penalties to claim the crown following a 2-2 draw. Kahdri Bello won the Golden Boot for the U-15s, while Head Coach Peter Baah was also named the Coach of the Tournament for the U-15 level.

Comeback Around: Of Indy Eleven's 61 victories in USLC regular season play since the start of the 2018 campaign, nine were accomplished in comeback fashion, including three during the 2022 season, including the team's final victory of the season (4-1 W vs. Charleston on Oct. 8).

The only time Indy Eleven overcame a multiple goal deficit was on March 7, 2020, in its season opener at Memphis 901 FC, when the Eleven put four straight past Tim Howard to storm back from an 0-2 hole within the first 15 minutes to post a 4-2 victory.

Eleven Park on the Horizon: In February, Indy Eleven and Keystone Group unveiled new designs for the Eleven Park neighborhood development that will transform the SW Quadrant of downtown Indianapolis – which includes a new 20,000-seat home for Indy Eleven and other events. Groundbreaking on the 20-acre site that was home to the former Diamond Chain factory will take place this May, with the team expecting to play games in the new venue by the summer of 2025. Eleven Hits Season 10: The 2023 campaign marks Indy Eleven's tenth season of play in franchise history – and its sixth in the USL Championship since it joined the league ahead of the 2018 season after a four-year stint in the NASL. The Boys in Blue have split their 154 games of USLC regular season play almost right down the middle with a 61W-60L-33D record (50.3%); the Eleven have also recorded two wins and two losses in the USL Championship Playoffs during its appearances in 2018 (1 loss) and 2019 (2 wins, 1 loss).
