INDY TUSSLES WITH TULSA SEEKING FIFTH STRAIGHT HOME WIN: Fresh off its first away win in nearly four months' time, Indy Eleven returns to Carroll Stadium on the weekend looking to improve its four-game winning streak at "The Mike" against a FC Tulsa squad it just passed on the Eastern Conference table. While fighting for eighth place – one spot below the playoff line – is not what either club had in mind with three games remaining in the season, the contest between the evenly-matched sides could provide as reasonable a measuring stick as can be expected, with 10th place Hartford (33 pts.) being the only other squad within 9 points of the duo either above or below on the conference's ladder.

Both teams have gone in opposite directions since Tulsa eeked out a 1-0 win over Indy in their practical playoff elimination game on Aug. 20, with the Eleven bouncing back to go 5W-1L-1D since and Tulsa claiming just a win and two draws from its last six outings. Indiana's Team will be looking for a third straight win overall, this after it collected 1-0 victories both at home last Sunday against Loudoun United FC and on Wednesday evening at Atlanta United 2. Saturday marks the second time within the last month Indiana's Team has the chance to sweep a three-game week, with a 0-0 draw at Detroit City FC over Labor Day weekend dashing the last opportunity following wins over San Antonio and LouCity FC in late August.

Eleven Head Coach Mark Lowry rotated Wednesday's lineup with seven new starters, setting his squad up well to be as fresh as possible for a third game in seven days' time. With that, you can expect to see heavy doses of Stefano Pinho, Solomon Asante, and Juan Tejada in attack, while Ayoze and Neveal Hackshaw would be expected back in the midfield fray.

Tulsa has been led in attack this season by the forward tandem of Rodrigo da Costa (9 goals) and Dario Suarez (8 goals), who have combined to score 17 of their 42 goals on the campaign. While no other member of the Black and Gold has bagged more than three goals, five players currently share the team's lead with three assists, and with another quartet sitting on a pair of helpers, the distribution of crucial passes has clearly been a "by committee" job for the Oklahoman side.

In defense, Indy Eleven needs no reminder about goalkeeper Austin Wormell, whose 7-save effort at ONEOK in their August meeting helped him claim the USL Championship's Player of the Week honor. In front of Wormell, Adrian Diz Pe leads FC Tulsa in most defensive categories, while captain Bradley Bourgeois has provided a steady presence next to him at the center back position.

FC Tulsa's move to the Eastern Conference for the 2021 USL Championship campaign marked the start of a new series.

The Oklahoman side improved its lead in the series to 3-1-1 on August 20, when seven Austin Wormell saves thwarted a spritely Eleven attack and Machuca's 90th minute tally allowed the home side to claim the full points from a 1-0 win at ONEOK Field.

Tulsa took the 2021 series with a 2-1-1 ledger in four meetings across the unbalanced schedule played against largely fellow Central Division opposition. FC Tulsa made the Eleven's homecoming to IUPUI's Michael A. Carroll Stadium to start the home portion of its 2021 slate a rude one on May 8, as Joaquin Rivas' second half brace gave Tulsa a 2-0 triumph. Indiana's Team returned the favor at ONEOK Field on August 4, late goals by Gordon Wild and Peter-Lee Vassell helping the Boys in Blue claim a 2-0 road win of their own. A return to Oklahoma on Sept. 8 was not as kind for Indy, which saw Manuel Arteaga's 34th minute equalizer nullified by a late Daniel Suarez tally in a 1-2 defeat. The sides bookended the 2021 Carroll Stadium schedule on Oct. 23, when another goal by Vassell in the 71st minute was negated by Jason Johnson's tally seven minutes later in the 1-1 draw.

FAMILIAR FACES: Indy Eleven will face off against two former Boys in Blue on Saturday in Brian Brown and Noah Powder. We'll start with the more recent member in Powder, the seven-year USLC veteran who began the 2022 campaign with Indy and notched a goal and assist in 13 appearances before being traded for GK Sean Lewis on July 5. The 29-year-old Brown has logged plenty of miles since he scored five goals in 24 appearances for Indiana's Team all the way back in 2015, as Tulsa marks his sixth stop in the seven seasons since, including five different USL Championship sides (including Reno 1868, where he teamed with current Eleven defender Jared Timmer).

The above mention of Lewis obviously means that he brings familiarity into Saturday's contest as well. Prior to the July trade, Lewis was a member of the Tulsa organization since 2019, logging 61 games between the posts in three-and-ahalf seasons with the side, including 12 earlier this season.

Indy Eleven captured its second 1-0 win in four days' time, this time via a road victory over Atlanta at Fifth Third Bank Stadium. Defender Robby Dambrot's breathtaking strike midway through the first half proved enough to bring the full points back north thanks to the fourth shutout for the Boys in Blue and goalkeeper Tim Trilk over a seven-match span across the last month.

A back-and-forth start to the match produced what ultimately proved to be the lone tally by Dambrot in the 23rd minute, when he struck a spectacular full volley from the top of the area, his left-footed effort slicing away from 16year-old debutante goalkeeper Nash Skogland to put Indiana's Team ahead. An active first half wrapped up with multiple dangerous looks from both sides, but despite Indy Eleven putting seven of its 11 shots on target during the opening half it settled for the 1-0 advantage heading into the locker rooms.

Indy professionally saw out the match in the second half, not allow Trilk to see a shot on target from Atlanta's eight attempts. However, some of those did cause concern, most notably Luke Brennan's back-post redirect from the side of the area that brushed across the front of the crossbar in the 78th minute, followed by Nicolas Firmino's darting header five minutes later that flashed wide to keep the full points with the visitors. The victory snapped an eight-game road winless streak (0W-7L-1D) for the Eleven, whose previous away win came back on June 4 at Charleston Battery (4-3).

TRIO BACK FROM NATIONAL TEAM CALLS: Indy Eleven saw three players – midfielder Neveal Hackshaw (Trinidad & Tobago) and forwards Rodney Michael (Sierra Leone) and Wilfredo Rivera (Puerto Rico) – earn call ups to their respective national teams last week, but all three had differing timetables away from Indiana's Team.

Hackshaw earned his 26th and 27th senior appearances for Trinidad & Tobago during play in the King's Cup tournament in Chiang Mai, Thailand over the last week. Hack went the full 90 minutes in a pair of 1-2 defeats last Thursday against Tajikistan and in Sunday's third place game against the host Thailand. After missing only last Sunday's match against Loudoun, Hackshaw hustled back to the United States in time to join the Boys in Blue in Atlanta on Wednesday night, when he made a three-minute cameo at the end of their 1-0 triumph.

Meanwhile, Michael was looking to make his full international debut for his native Sierra Leone after getting called into the West African nation's camp. It appears injury kept Michael from featuring in either of the *Leone Stars*' matches against South Africa last Saturday in Johannesburg and the Democratic Republic of Congo in Rabat, Morocco, on Tuesday.

Forward Wilfredo Rivera (8 caps) was beckoned by the Puerto Rican Men's National Team ahead of its scheduled friendly last Thursday against the Dominican Republic; however, that contest was cancelled as both nations bore the brunt of Hurricane Fiona in previous days. That gave Rivera time to get back to Indianapolis for Sunday's match against Loudoun, during which he played the final 10 minutes in the 1-0 win. Rivera also earned his second start since joining the Eleven over the summer in Atlanta on Wednesday, when he put all three of his shots on target across a 76-minute run out during the squad's 1-0 away win.

- Solomon Asante's six assists are T-23rd most across the USLC (T-12th in East)
- Goalkeeper Sean Lewis' 58 saves on the season between Indy (18) and Tulsa (40) rank 19th leaguewide.

DAMBROT MAKING DIFFERENCE: Head Coach Mark Lowry's roster makeover continued on August 2 with the signing of defender Robby Dambrot. The 27-year-old defender most recently put in five appearances (3 starts, 1 goal) with Pittsburgh across the first half of the 2022 season. Prior to that, Dambrot began his pro career in the USL Championship with 33 appearances for Loudoun United after signing with the D.C. United affiliate in August of 2019.

Despite a small sample (10GP/8GS, 650 min.) since making his debut with the Boys in Blue on Aug. 6 via late cameo against his former Riverhounds SC side, Dambrot has made noticeable contributions on both sides of the ball, including involvements in 4 of the squad's last 10 goals:

- Dambrot earned his first start on Aug. 13 at Hartford Athletic, playing 58 minutes and earning the penalty kick that led to Indy Eleven's tally in the 1-2 defeat with a nifty show of footwork inside the area that led to Modou Jadama's lunging challenge.
- Dambrot went a step further to open his Eleven scoring account on Aug. 27, courtesy of a gritty all-around play in the 40th minute that helped Indy seal a 1-0 win over San Antonio. He captured his second goal of the season and his second game-winner on Sept. 28, securing the only goal of another 1-0 win at Atlanta United 2 with a golazo of a volley in the 23rd minute.
- The Akron, Ohio-native registered his first assist on Sept. 10, finding Juan Tejada for Indy's third goal in a 4-3 win at Carroll Stadium.
- Has started all four of the squad's recent shutouts over the last month of action at his customary left back position.

TRILK STANDING TALL: Goalkeeper Tim Trilk has put together a solid first season with Indy Eleven, highlighted by a recent four-game undefeated run across late August and early September that saw him post his first two shutouts in an Eleven uniform. He's followed that up with back-to-back shutouts in Indy's last two outings, helping the squad claim 1-0 wins over Loudoun United FC on Sunday and at Atlanta United 2 on Wednesday.

The third-year pro has been especially impressive at Carroll Stadium in league play, allowing 1.14 goals per game and registering the first three of his shutouts across seven starts at "The Mike". Trilk is one of now seven 'keepers who have been on Indy's roster in 2022, along with Sean Lewis, Bryan Meredith, Elliot Panicco, Academy products Hayden Vostal and Alex Svetanoff, and loanee Tor Saunders.

ONE (GOAL) IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: While Indy Eleven has captured four of its six shutouts of the season across the last month, it has also played 14 matches in which it has conceded only once. That's tied for the 3rd most single-concession games in the USLC in 2022 alongside Sacramento, Detroit & Memphis, and behind only New Mexico (15) and Tampa Bay (19!). The Eleven have gone 4-6-4 in those 14 games, with a solid 3W-1L-3D start through a 1-1 draw at Miami FC on June 8 being followed by a hard-luck 1W-5L-1D mark since.

That 40% win percentage is starting to pace behind the team's record in its 18 games decided by one goal, in which the Eleven have collected 9 wins and 10 losses (47%). Again, a 3W-1L record in one-goal games to start the season was offset by an agonizing 1W-9L run that began on May 14 at Memphis 901 FC. The close-game pendulum has swung back in Indy's direction, with all five of its wins over the last month coming via the slimmest of margins.

INGRAM FIRST INDY NATIVE TO EARN CAPTAIN'S ARMBAND: While a lot of new faces – including numerous veterans – have joined Indy Eleven for the 2022 campaign, a pair of Eleven stalwarts in Spanish midfielder Ayoze and Trinidad & Tobago international Neveal Hackshaw were named captains by Head Coach Mark Lowry as the season approached. Ayoze served in a similar role for the first time in Indy last season, while Hackshaw has sporadically donned the armband on the field throughout his four years with Indiana's Team. Between injuries to Ayoze and national team duty for Hackshaw throughout the first three months of the season, another veteran, center back A.J. Cochran, received the honor of wearing the captain's armband on seven occasions, mostly during the first half of the season.

Justin Ingram also joined the 2022 on-field captain's group on Wednesday, when the rookie midfielder became the first Indianapolis native in the club's nine-season history to don the armband in the Eleven's 1-0 win at ATL UTD 2.

IRONMEN STATS CLOSELY CONTESTED: When it comes to seeing the field in 2022, defender Jared Timmer has been setting the pace for Indiana's Team – but he's got plenty of competition on his heels. The former Butler Bulldog became the first player to cross the 2,000-minute threshold for Indiana's Team on Aug. 27 against Louisville, and center back Mechack Jerome surpassed with a 90-minute outing on Sept. 3 at Detroit. Here's how the squad's "Ironman" stats currently shake out:

REVOLORIO MAKES FIRST START, WHILE 21 MAKE DEBUTS IN '22: Of the now 25 new members added to the Indy Eleven roster at some point in 2022, 21 have debuted with the club. Robby Dambrot became the latest newbie, putting in the final 7 minutes of the squad's match on Aug. 6 vs. Pittsburgh at Carroll Stadium, just four days after joining the squad from the Riverhounds. Season Lewis and Juan Tejada saw their first time for Indiana's Team on July 23 in 90-minute stints versus Memphis 901 FC, while Jesus Vazquez (start, full 90 minutes) and Wilfredo Rivera (26 minutes off the bench) first featured on July 30 against Tampa Bay.

Fourteen players did so in the season opener at Loudoun United FC on March 12, and for Justin Ingram and Palmer Ault, their time at Segra Field in the opener marked their pro soccer debuts as well.

Another player making his pro debut this year was USL Academy signing Ecris Revolorio, who joined the roster in August 2021 but did not see the field for the first team until June 4 at Charleston. The 19-year-old native of Evansville followed that up on Sept. 28 with his first career start, playing the first half in a 1-0 win at Atlanta.

Goalkeeper Tim Trilk made his first start on April 6 in U.S. Open Cup play and followed with his league debut on May 28 vs. New Mexico United. The four remaining players on the roster with a chance to make their debuts include three USL Academy players signings – Vostal, Luca laccino & Diego Sanchez – and loaned-out goalkeeper Tor Saunders. **BRACE YOURSELVES:** When midfielder Neveal Hackshaw put away carbon copy back-post headers five minutes apart to open the scoring on Sept. 10 against Birmingham Legion FC, it registered as the first brace for the vice-captain in his 88th appearance for Indiana's Team (which tied him with Marco Franco for 6th place in career Indy caps). Hack's brace was Indy's fifth multi-goal performance of the 2022 season:

PINHO'S RENAISSANCE PERFORMANCE: Veteran forward Stefano Pinho has proven he has plenty left in the tank with 10 goals and three assists while appearing in 29 of the team's 31 games this season (20 starts). The Brazilian has rekindled his red-hot start to 2022 (7G/3A during the team's first 14 games) as of late with three goals in his last six contests, including the game-winner – his team-high fourth of the season – late in a 4-3 triumph over Birmingham on Sept. 10, and a crucial brace on Aug. 31 against Louisville City FC that led to massive 2-1 rivalry win and the USL Championship's Player of the Week presented by Konami eFootball honor for Week 26.

In addition to his team-best three Team of the Week placements and a third-place finish in April's USL Championship Player of the Month voting, Pinho's 10-goal output (T-18th in USL Championship, T-9th in Eastern Conference) stands tied for the fourth-most in a single season in the Eleven's record books and also has him tied for seventh on the squad's career scoring chart. ASANTE'S ASSISTS ADD UP TO CLUB RECORD: Solomon Asante's trio of assists in the 4-3 win over Birmingham on Sept. 10 contributed to a dizzying list of impressive feats both for the two-time MVP, Indiana's Team and the USL Championship. The performance ...

- marked the first three-assist game by a player in Indy Eleven's nine-year history, at the time spanning 281 games in official competition (USL/NASL regular season and playoffs plus U.S. Open Cup)
- made Asante the first player in club history to notch a pair of multi-assist games for the Boys in Blue. Eight different players have recorded multi-assist games on now nine occasions, including Asante on June 4 at Charleston Battery (4-3 W) and the now-departed Nicky Law on June 18 at Colorado Springs (3-4 L) in 6/08 @ COS) thus far in 2022.
- gave Asante the first three-assist performance in USLC play in 2022. It marked the 25th such occasion in league play since 2014 – and Asante's second (w/ Phoenix Rising on July 17, 2021 vs. LA), making him one of three players in league history to accomplish the feat twice (Emmanuel Ledesma & Jose Barril).
- Moved him back into a tie for third place on the league's career assist chart on 47 alongside former Phoenix teammate Aodhan Quinn and just one behind Hartford's Danny Barrera; all chase Pittsburgh's Kenardo Forbes and his 54 career helpers.
- pushed Asante alone into the team lead with six assists on the season, which is tied also tied for the second-most helpers in a single-season for Indy:

The only "40-40" goal & assist player in Championship regular season history hit another milestone with his Indy account opener back on July 9 against Memphis, becoming just the 17th player in the 12-year history of the USL Championship to score 50 regular season goals with the 9th minute tally. The two-time USL Championship MVP (2019 & 2020) became the second fastest player to hit the half-century mark, doing so in just 114 matches (Chandler Hoffman, 100). Asante has now collected 55 goals and 48 assists in regular season and postseason games combined since he hit the ground running with a USLC All-First Team season with Phoenix Rising in 2018.

STEPPING UP TO "THE MIKE": Indy Eleven had enjoyed its home cooking at IUPUI Carroll Stadium to start the season after a draw and four straight wins resulted in an eight-game home undefeated streak in USLC play that included the final three games of 2021. A 1-2 loss to New Mexico on May 28 began a six-game slide (0W-5L-1D), but the Boys in Blue reclaimed their home-field advantage with four consecutive wins at "The Mike" wins over the last month

Indy Eleven posted the second-longest home undefeated streak in USL Championship history during its Lucas Oil Stadium tenure, going 28 games (21 wins, 7 draws) without defeat from July 2018-July 2020. It also collected a lengthy undefeated streak at "The Mike" during its NASL era, going 21 matches without a loss from Oct. 2015-May 2017.

NEW TURF CHRISTENED: While the Boys in Blue were away for the entire month of June, Indy Eleven's continuing collaboration with IUPUI resulted the installation of a new FieldTurf playing surface at Carroll Stadium, a significant upgrade that utilizes FieldTurf's CORE model used for game and/or practice usage by a dozen MLS sides. The squad's 1-0 triumph over San Antonio FC on Aug. 27 marked the first victory on the new surface since it was christened by Indiana's Team on July 2 vs. Miami FC.

ELEVEN PARK SEES LOCATION, 2025 DATE ANNOUNCED: Now for the team's future home ... after much anticipation, Indy Eleven announced on June 24 that the club's future home of Eleven Park will be located in downtown Indianapolis at the site of the former site of the Diamond Chain Company factory. Construction is anticipated to begin in spring 2023 and be completed in 2025. The new site will see a 20,000-seat, state-of-the-art stadium, in addition to hotel, office, apartments, retail and public spaces. The venue will be home to Indy Eleven's men's and women's teams, and is designed to also host NCAA and IHSAA events, international matches, concerts and various community events.

AYOZE CONTINUES TO CLIMB CLUB'S CAPS RECORD: With his start at Hartford Athletic on Aug. 13, Ayoze officially became the club's "king of caps", his 116th appearance in official competitions breaking his tie atop the category with Brad Ring. The Spanish maestro's now 123 performances include 117 USLC regular season appearances (breaking another club mark, surpassing Karl Ouimette), 4 USLC playoff (again tied with Ouimette as well as Matt Watson), and 2 U.S. Open Cup games.

The newly minted American citizen (along with his wife, Tamara, following their United States naturalization ceremony on Aug. 24) also claimed the club's top spot for career starts as his own on Sept. 3 at Detroit, his 102nd first XI placement surpassing the mark Ouimette set earlier this season on April 5 in the squad's U.S. Open Cup tilt against St Louis CITY 2. Ayoze was long ago crowned the club's leader in assists, as his 21 helpers outpace second place Dylan Mares by six in the category.

Indy Eleven marks the third team for which Ayoze has registered 100 appearances for, stacking on top of during his standout 19-year pro career, stacking on his time with CD Tenerife in his native Spain (104) and the New York Cosmos (135). In all, Ayoze has logged 397 appearances during an impressive 19-year professional career.

IXI ON THE TEAM OF THE WEEK: The Week 27 Team of the Week nods to Neveal Hackshaw & Solomon Asante on Sept. 13 were the fourth and fifth given to Indy Eleven players in three weeks' time. Hackshaw's placement gave him a weekly distinction in each of his four campaigns in Indy since 2019. Asante became the third Eleven player with multiple weekly honors this season, joining Manuel Arteaga (2) and Stefano Pinho (3). Nine Indy Eleven players have now been named to the USL Championship Team of the Week on 13 occasions in 2022 – which includes Player of the Week performances for Pinho the week prior and Arteaga's similar star turn in Week 13.

The win against OCSC marked Indy's first come-from-behind win since a 2-1 triumph at LouCity FC last May 29. Of Indy Eleven's 58 victories in USLC regular season play since the start of the 2018 campaign, that win over LCFC was the eighth accomplished in comeback fashion – while the triumph over OCSC was the third such won by multiple goals. The only time Indy Eleven overcame a multiple goal deficit was on March 7, 2020, at Memphis 901 FC, when the Eleven put four straight past Tim Howard to storm back from an 0-2 hole within the first 15 minutes to post an emphatic win 4-2.

YOU'VE MADE YOUR POINT (TO THE SPOT): After going 22 matches without taking a penalty kick to start the season, Indy Eleven has earned – and converted – three in its last eight matches:

Meanwhile, the penalties taken against Indy by Tampa Bay on July 30 were the fourth and fifth taken by the opposition in 2022 – and marked the first game during Indy Eleven's USL Championship era dating back to 2018 in which the squad conceded two penalty kick opportunities in a game. Tim Trilk saved the sixth attempt on Indy's frame on Sept. 10 vs. Birmingham, although Enzo Martinez was able to convert the rebound. A quartet of Indy goalkeepers have seen only half of those six attempts converted past them ...

The most penalties conceded in a single season by Indy came in 2018, when Owain Fon Williams saved two of the eight PK's he faced. The squad allowed two penalties in both 2019 & 2020 and three in 2021.

ELEVEN SIGN VAZQUEZ TO NEW DEAL: Indy Eleven announced on Aug 18 it had acquired defender Jesus Vazquez via transfer from fellow USL Championship club Rio Grande Valley FC and signed the center back to a new contract. The transaction followed the cancellation of the prior loan agreement between the clubs that had initially brought Vazquez to the Circle City on July 25.

FIRST SCORE STREAK SNAPPED: Scoring first had been a favorable sign for Indiana's Team over the past two years, but its 1-3 defeat to Tampa Bay on July 30 snapped a 25game unbeaten streak in games that saw the Boys in Blue scratch the scoreboard first. That run started on July 11, 2020, when Tyler Pasher scored the opener in a 2-0 win over St. Louis FC at Lucas Oil Stadium.

Prior to the TBR loss, the last time Indy suffered defeat when scoring first was in the 2019 Eastern Conf. Final, a painful 3-1 setback to Louisville City FC in added extra time on Nov. 9, 2019. You have to go all the way back to April 28, 2019, to find the last occasion in regular season play, when Dane Kelly's 13th minute tally was negated by New York Red Bulls II goals in the 60' & 69' in a 1-2 road defeat.

Front foot wins over San Antonio, Birmingham, Loudoun, and Atlanta over the last month have started a new fourgame streak for Indiana's Team. It's a trend the squad would love to see more of after scoring first in only 12 of its 31 matches to date in 2022 (9W-1L-2D).

SCORELESS, WINLESS STREAKS SNAPPED: Indy's 1-0 win over league-leading San Antonio FC on Aug. 27 at Carroll Stadium helped the Boys in Blue snap a 12-game winless streak (0-10-2) that was its longest in USL Championship play and matched the longest in club history during the regular season, equaling a run during its NASL era that included the final game of 2016 and the first 11 games in 2017.

- The 12-game drought was twice as lengthy as the longest previous winless stretches during the Eleven's USLC era (Sept.-Oct of 2021 and last two games of last season/first four games of 2022)
- Included in the run was a six-game losing streak that marked the longest in the club's nine-year history (started with 3-4 loss on June 18 at Colorado Springs, snapped via a 1-1 draw with Memphis on July 23).
- Also within the winless drought was a club record scoreless streak of 459 minutes, which started with kickoff on June 25 at San Diego and ended with Solomon Asante's 9th minute tally on July 23 vs. Memphis 901 FC. The longest previous scoring drought in USL play was a 341-minute stretch in 2019 (Kelly 13' @ NY on Apr. 28 through Pasher 84' on May 18 vs. CHS).
- The 2-1 win over LouCity on Aug. 31 snapped a streak of 11 games without scoring multiple goals (last occurrence on June 18 in 3-4 loss at Colorado Springs)

SEEING RED: It took 21-and-a-half games, but a member of the opposition was finally shown a red card on Aug. 6, when Pittsburgh midfielder Marc Ybarra picked up his second yellow card of the match in the 54th minute. While Indy Eleven failed to capitalize on the man advantage over the final 36+ minutes, it did mark a refreshing change after thrice being on the wrong side of the numerical advantage.

Two of Indy's trio of red cards have seen the damage limited to the final moments of matches. Indy had a player ejected in each in the first two games of the 2022 campaign, this after the squad had gone 39 games without a sending off (Ayoze, 50' of 1-0 win vs. PIT on Aug. 5, 2020, at Lucas Oil Stadium) ...

Manuel Arteaga – July 23 vs. MIA (94+') Alex McQueen – March 12 at LDN (90') Raul Aguilera – March 19 at TBR (59')

INDY ADDS ACADEMY GOALKEEPER, RELEASES FOUR FROM CONTRACTS: August 18 also saw five moves on the Academy player front, highlighted by the signing of goalkeeper Hayden Vostal, a recent Indiana Fire Pro Academy addition who made a fast appearance on the Eleven's 18-man roster on Aug. 20 at Tulsa. The 6'3" netminder from Geneva, Ill., was one of just two sophomores named to the 125-player United Soccer Coaches All-Central Region Team following his standout season at Geneva High School last fall, when he also earned IHSCAA All-State honors for his efforts.

As Vostal joins the ranks of the first team, four other USL Academy players have been released from their contracts – Palmer Ault, Aiden Benitez, Alex Svetanoff, and Bryce Warhaft. The Butler University-bound Ault was the only member of the outgoing quartet to see first team action, with his three substitute appearances across the first half of the regular season totaling six minutes.

SEAN LEWIS STANDS OUT IN DEBUT: Indy Eleven made the first trade of the "Mark Lowry Era" on July 5, when the club acquired veteran goalkeeper Sean Lewis from FC Tulsa in exchange for D/M Noah Powder.

Lewis' debut for the Boys in Blue at home on July 23 against Memphis was a trial by fire, as he made six of his seven saves on the night in the first half of the 1-1 draw, a performance that equaled the most stops in a single half for an Eleven netminder since joining the USL Championship. He also faced seven more shots on July 30 against Tampa Bay, making four saves in a 1-3 defeat.

Lewis has been reunited with Lowry, who coached the native of Rockford, Mich., in 2016 with Jacksonville Armada FC. Since then, Lewis has played in 90 regular season, postseason and U.S. Open Cup matches over seven seasons with Jacksonville (2016), Penn FC (USL Championship, 2017-18), and FC Tulsa, where he made 61 appearances since 2019, including 12 in 2022.

ELEVEN IN SEASON 9: The 2022 campaign marks Indy Eleven's ninth season of play in franchise history – and its fifth in the USL Championship since it joined the league ahead of the 2018 season. This year's results have the Boys in Blue flirting with the .500 mark in 147 games of USLC regular season play (59W-57L-31D, 50.7%); the Eleven have also recorded two wins and two losses in the USL Championship Playoffs during its appearances in 2018 (1 loss) and 2019 (2 wins, 1 loss). BACK-TO-BACK SCORERS: Stefano Pinho became the third player to score in three consecutive games this season when he bagged goals on 5/28 vs. NM, 6/04 @ CHS & 6/08 @ MIA. The now-departed Jonas Fjeldberg was the second to accomplish the feat (May 14 @ MEM & May 21 vs. NYRB II). Aris Briggs was the first to go back-to-back, doing so in stoppage time in wins over both Orange County SC (April 24) and Atlanta United 2 (April 16).

FOUR SCORE AND EVEN MORE: The four goals Indy Eleven put up in 4-3 wins over Birmingham on Sept. 10 and at Charleston on June 4 equaled the highest scoring output of Indy's now 147-game USLC regular season tenure, matching its previous high during a 4-2 season-opening win at Memphis 901 FC on March 7, 2020. The contest against the Battery also equaled the most road goals scored in club history.

That four-goal haul against Legion FC marked the 19th output of 3+ goals in those 147 games, and while only seven of those have come in the 74 games since the start of 2020, four of them have come this season. Indy's all-time ledger of games with at least four goals includes:

SEVEN-UP: It wasn't just Indy putting up prolific numbers on Sept. 10 at Carroll Stadium, as the Eleven and Legion FC combined for a seven-goal shootout – and the third game decided by a 4-3 for the Eleven in 2022 (this after none such scores across the team's first eight seasons). Seven of the now 16 games in which Indy has been involved in a 6+ goalfest have come in USLC action; the all-time list of such games includes:

ELEVEN ADD TWO MORE IN VAZQUEZ & RIVERA, SEND FJELDBERG TO RGV: Indy Eleven announced a pair of additions on July 25 in Rio Grande Valley FC defender Jesus Vazquez and Orlando City Ioanee forward Wilfredo Rivera. Both players saw their debut on July 30 against Tampa Bay, with Vazquez playing nearly every minute of the six matches he's been eligible for and Rivera entering off the bench in his five of six available outings.

Vazquez was involved a "loan swap" that saw forward Jonas Fjeldberg head back to RGV Toros FC. The 27-yearold defender joined the Boys in Blue after half a season with RGV, where he started in 11 of 16 appearances and served as captain in four early season contests. Prior to his time with Toros, the San Luis Obispo, Calif.-native logged two seasons of Championship play with LA Galaxy II, scoring twice and serving as Los Dos' captain in all 42 regular season and playoff appearances from 2020-21. The dual American and Mexican citizen came up through the U-20 and reserve ranks of Mexican sides Pumas UNAM, Santos Laguna, and CF Atlante from 2014-19 before making his pro debut with the latter side in the Mexican second division.

The 18-year-old Rivera has been in the OCSC set-up since 2020, playing for their USL League One side that season before signing a Homegrown contract with the MLS side prior to 2021 and suiting up for their MLS NEXT Pro squad in 2022. He has also made eight caps for Puerto Rico's Men's National Team since his senior debut last January.

ELEVEN ADD TEJEDA, SEND LAW TO TAMPA: Lowry began to shake up his roster on July 21, when Indiana's Team brought forward Juan Tejada to the Circle City in a trade that sent midfielder Nicky Law to the Tampa Bay Rowdies in return. Tejada started in his first four eligible contests, starting with his debut against the Rowdies on July 30, before making his first appearance off the bench on Aug. 20 at FC Tulsa. Tejada came to the Circle City after three-and-a-half seasons with Tampa Bay, where he tallied 13 goals and 5 assists in 68 regular season appearances and also played in five postseason contests. Law departed after a season in a half with the Boys in Blue, having scored four goals and notched five assists in 49 appearances following a 15-year career in England and Scotland.

RECORD SCORING STREAK SNAPPED ... Well, it was fun while it lasted! Indy's club-record run of 12 consecutive contests in which it scored at least once was snapped on June 25 in San Diego, this after the squad was shut out its first two games in 2022. The streak beat out a 9-game run across July and August last year; Indy also scored in 10 straight games including postseason play spanning the 2019-20 seasons.

After scoring multiple goals in only 8 of 32 games (25%) in 2021 (and none in its final 12 games), Indy did so in 6 of its first 14 games (43%) to start the season. However, the team went 11 games without multiple goals to follow, with the streak snapped in a 2-1 win over Louisville on Aug. 31.

ARTEAGA SCORES FOURTH HAT TRICK IN ELEVEN HISTORY: For last year's Indy Eleven leading scorer

Manuel Arteaga (10 goals in 2021), it seemed like once he finally opened his 2022 account that more would be soon to come ... but even he couldn't expect that he would tally thrice in nine minutes to notch the fastest hat trick in Indy Eleven annals – and just the fourth in the club's now nine-season history. Arteaga became just the third Eleven player to register a hat trick when he put goals low and to the left of Charleston 'keeper Daniel Kuzemka in the 25th, 28th, and 37th minutes of a 4-3 win over the Battery on June 4 – with the last blast ending up serving as an unlikely game-winner.

5/28/14: Blake Smith vs. Dayton Dutch Lions (PDL)

 26', 30' & 88' goals in a 5-2 win at Carroll Stadium over Dayton in the 3rd Round of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, which served as the first win in official competition in Indy Eleven history

6/11/16: Eamon Zayed vs. Carolina RailHawks

• Zayed made "The Miracle at The Mike" possible by scoring in the 16', 65' & 85', with his final tally giving Indy Eleven a 4-1 win. The four goals and +3 goal differential gave the Eleven precisely the result needed to win the 10-game NASL Spring Season title via 3rd tie-breaker over the New York Cosmos.

8/03/16: Eamon Zayed vs. Jacksonville Armada

• In a result that helped pave the way for Mark Lowry's installation as JAX head coach just four days later, the Irishman Zayed hit paydirt in the 15', 58' & 65' of a 5-2 result at Carroll Stadium. The five goals from that match still stands as the Eleven's highest scoring output in a regular season match.

6/04/22: Manuel Arteaga at Charleston Battery

• The three-goal in 12 minutes outburst by el arquero staked Indy out to a 4-1 advantage that helped it to an eventual 4-3 win. Arteaga's hat trick was the fastest in Indy Eleven history, the first notched in the team's now 128-game regular season tenure in USL Championship play, the only one notched during one half, and the club's first ever on the road.

LOWRY LEADS OVERHAUL: After a subpar 2021 campaign, the Indy Eleven brass got to work immediately to remake the squad in the offseason – starting at the top with the appointment of Mark Lowry (click here for full bio) as the fourth full-time head coach in club history.

Lowry lands in the Circle City after a three-season stint with El Paso Locomotive FC, which he guided to a 42W-19L-29D record in USL Championship regular season, USL Championship Playoffs, and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup action from 2019-21. The native of Birmingham, England, improved Locomotive FC's record across each of their first three seasons of play, the first two of which culminated in back-to-back appearances in the Western Conference Final. Lowry's 40 regular season victories over those three years rank as the fourth most amongst USL Championship coaches across that span.

During El Paso's 2021 campaign, Lowry led Locomotive FC to an impressive 18W-4L-10D (64 points) ledger that easily clinched the Championship's Mountain Division title and marked the third highest point total across the 31-team league. Lowry earned the July 2021 USL Championship Coach of the Month honor, which coincided with the club's 23-game home undefeated run that stretched over a calendar year and was, at one point, the longest such streak in North American professional soccer.

Prior to El Paso, Lowry's first stop as a head coach came with the NASL & NPSL's Jacksonville Armada from 2016-18, which was preceded by four seasons at MLS side Orlando City SC with their Academy squads and U-23 team in the then USL PDL (now USL League 2). Lowry is joined on the sideline by Assistant Coach Matt Williams and Director, Sport Performance & Assistant Coach Gabe Zapponi, both of whom worked with Lowry in both El Paso and Jacksonville. Andy Swift is the lone holdover on the Coaching Staff, returning for his fifth season as GK Coach.

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN: While the Indy Eleven brass did plenty to back up its claim as "Indiana's Team" on the roster side, it also balanced out the other half of its motto – "The World's Game" – by stocking its roster with talent from across the globe. The active roster (not included loaned out players) features 11 players who are either full or dual internationals:

Hackshaw (27 caps from Trinidad & Tobago since 2015) and McQueen (16 caps for Grenada since 2017) are stalwarts on their respective national teams. Jerome ranks second on Haiti's all-time cap sheet with 76, while Asante suited up for the Black Stars of Ghana 21 times during his international career.

A special mention on this list goes to newly-minted dual national Ayoze, who along with his wife Tamara officially became American citizens during a naturalization ceremony in Indianapolis on Aug. 24.

INGRAM HIGHLIGHTS HOOSIER CONTINGENT: Five current players on the squad either hail from or attended college in the Hoosier State, including rookie midfielder and Indianapolis native Justin Ingram, a Pike H.S. grad starting his pro career after standing out for Loyola University Maryland, and DF Jared Timmer, a graduate of Butler University. After some roster shuffling in August, now two of the team's four players on USL Academy Contracts are "homegrown Hoosiers" – as is "Academy graduate" Alann Torres ...

MF **Justin Ingram:** Indianapolis native (Pike H.S.), also played with Indiana Fire Academy

DF **Ecris Revolorio**: Evansville native (Washington H.S.), played with Indiana Fire Academy

MF **Diego Sanchez**: Indianapolis native, played with Indiana Fire Academy

DF **Jared Timmer**: played at Butler University (Indianapolis)

MF **Alann Torres**: Elkhart native (Bethany Christian H.S.), played with Indiana Fire Academy

YOUTH SERVED THROUGH ACADEMY SIGNINGS: For the first two-thirds of the season through mid-August, nearly a full quarter of the Eleven's roster consisted of seven USL Academy Contract signings.

Prior to his release to attend the University of Louisville on Aug. 18, goalkeeper Alex Svetanoff was in his third partial season with Indy as an Academy player, while DF Ecris Revolorio, MF Aiden Benitez, and MF Diego Sanchez returned for their second season after initially signing developmental contracts last August; Benitez was also released from his contract along with Svetanoff on Aug. 18.

New Academy Contracts signings for 2022 include Palmer Ault, DF Bryce Warhaft, FW Luca laccino, and August acquisition GK Hayden Vostal.

Prior to reporting to Butler in August, Ault made three appearances via late cameos off the bench, with the latest coming June 4 at Charleston, which is also when Revolorio made his pro debut in second half stoppage time.

ELEVEN U19s CAPTURE SECOND TROPHY AT USL ACADEMY CUP: Indy Eleven entered four teams in the USL Academy Cup down in Tampa from March 31-April 3 – and all four returned with "podium finishes" in the top 3, including the Boys U19 squad that won its Elite Group, following in the footsteps of their 2021 USL Academy League triumph last December. USL Academy Contract signings FW Palmer Ault, FW Luca Iaccino, and GK Alex Svetanoff all contributed to the U19 squad's latest hardware run, with Svetanoff coming up big in a 5-4 penalty kick triumph that followed Indy's 2-2 regulation draw against Tampa Bay United.

Meanwhile, the youngest first-team signing in club history, Academy Contract midfielder Aidan Benitez, represented the Boys U15 side that placed as the runner-up in the age group's Elite bracket, the Silver Medal finish coming after a 2-3 result to Weston United. Also making the final in Elite play was the Girls U19 squad helmed by the Eleven's W League Head Coach Paul Dolinsky, which dropped a narrow result of its own via a 0-1 scoreline to NC Fusion. Finally, the Boys U13 squad garnered a third place finish in Elite play, closing solidly with a 3-0 rout of Ironbound SC in the third place game. In all, the four teams combined to go 9W-3L-4D (+13 GD) in the USL Academy's showcase tournament, helping to further establish Indy Eleven as the premier club in the United Soccer League umbrella in regards to its commitment to its youth development model.
