Perry Van Der Beck's soccer career began at a young age. Since captaining the 1977 US National Youth Team, Van Der Beck has remained actively involved in the soccer community as a player, coach and mentor.

From 2004 to 2006, Van Der Beck was Head Coach and Technical Director of the Olympic Development Program for the Super Y League, a National Youth League. During the 2003 – 2004 season, Van Der Beck was a staff coach with the adidas Elite Soccer Program, which identifies the best high school players in the nation and invited them to a week long training program with US National team players.

From 1997 to 2002, Van Der Beck worked as Head Coach, Assistant Coach and Director of Community Relations for the Tampa Bay Mutiny of Major League Soccer. During the 1995 season Van Der Beck was an assistant coach, player and Director of Youth Development for the Tampa Bay Terror, a National Professional Soccer League team.

From 1988 until 1994, Van Der Beck was a professional soccer player and assistant coach for the former Tampa Bay Rowdies, then an American Professional Soccer League team.

Van Der Beck played in the Major Indoor Soccer League with the Wichita Wings, St. Louis Steamers and Dallas Sidekicks. He was a member of the US National Team when it played in the NASL as Team America in Washington DC. Among his many awards are 1985 US Player of the Year and captain of the 1980 US Olympic Team.

Van Der Beck's commitment to youth development and soccer is well known. He participated in Camp Kick in the Grass from 1979 until 1994. A true sports fan, Van Der Beck enjoys watching soccer live and on television, golf, cycling and skiing.



Paul Dalglish
Head Coach

Paul Dalglish began his soccer career almost from birth as the son of “King” Kenny Dalglish, one of Liverpool’s greatest players. Virtually immersed in the game his entire life, Dalglish brings his own pedigree to FC Tampa Bay Rowdies as Head Coach.

His playing career began in 1994 with Glasgow Celtic FC moving to Liverpool, Newcastle United FC playing under manager Ruud Gullit in the English Premier League, Norwich FC, Blackpool FC, Hibernian FC and finally to United States as a Houston Dynamo. While there, Dalglish helped lead the team to two MLS Cup titles in 2006 and 2007 and he was awarded the 2006 Western Conference Final MVP.

Dalglish retired in 2008 to pursue a career in coaching. Dalglish has studied coaching techniques and match strategy at Liverpool with manager Rafa Benitez and at Blackburn Rovers FC with manager and former Rowdies player Sam Allardyce. He also coached for the Houston Dynamo Academy and Space City Futbol Club.

Kwame "JJ" Adjeman-Pamboe is an American forward who most recently played for FC Viikingit in the Finnish First Division making nine appearances and scoring four goals.

Adjeman-Pamboe began his college soccer career in 2005 at St. Francis University in Pennsylvania, scoring eight goals in two seasons with the Red Flash. He then transferred to George Mason University where he played during the 2007 and 2008 season playing in 38 games and scoring 11 goals. While at George Mason, Adjeman-Pamboe received top honors including the most outstanding player at the CAA Men's Soccer Championship, CAA All-Tournament Team selection, First-Team NSCAA All-South Atlantic Region selection and First-Team All-CAA selection.

In 2008, the Colorado Rapids selected Adjeman-Pamboe in the second round of the MLS SuperDraft.

Also in 2006, Baltimore Blast selected Scott in the fourth round of the 2006 Major Indoor Soccer League Dispersal Draft. While with Baltimore, Scott played in 34 games, including the 2007 and 2008 MISL Championship, and scoring 11 goals.

Scott then signed with the Charleston Battery in 2009 making 28 appearances and scoring three goals.

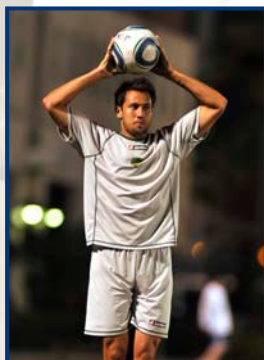
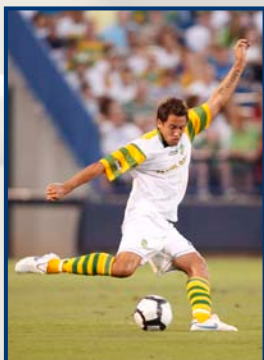
Jeremy Christie

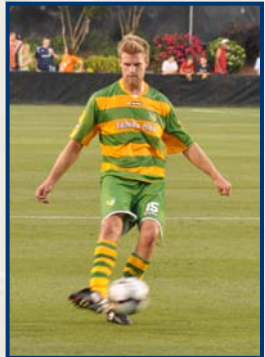

Most recently, Aaron played for Miami FC during the 2009 season scoring three goals during his five appearances.

He later signed with the New Jersey Ironmen of the Major Indoor Soccer League playing in 32 games and scoring two goals in two seasons for New Jersey.

Gordon played most of his college career at Seton Hall University from 2004 to 2006 scoring one goal and five assists in 57 games. He was named a 2006 Preseason All-Big East selection and 2005 All-Big East honorable mention while at Seton Hall. While in college, Gordon also played three seasons for Orange County Blue Star in the USL PDL making 22 appearances.

Phil was also voted team captain for the 2007 season, when FAU won the 2007 ASC Conference Championship, and 2008 season. He currently holds FAU's career record for the most shutouts (14) and goalkeeper minutes (5,091) and holds second for the most saves (205) and wins (22).

In 2009, Phil transferred to Florida International University where he played in 15 games making 40 saves.

Millien also ranks third in UT history for game winner goals with 10 goals and second in career assists with 29 assists. Millien also helped lead UT to the NCAA Division II Final Four in 2008.

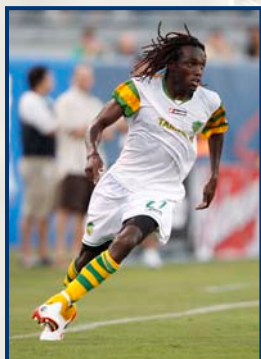

He finished his college career with 28 goals and 60 assists becoming the all-time assist leader at the university, as well as being named 2007 All American First Team and NAIA All American Scholar Athlete. In 2007, he also played for the Cape Cod Crusaders in the USL Premier Development League (PDL), where he made 14 appearances.

In 2008, Stanley signed with the Richmond Kickers of USL Second Division. During the 2008 season, he played in 16 games scoring eight goals and was named 2008 USL2 Rookie of the Year.

He also received numerous achievements including team captain and being named team MVP in 2002 and 2003, Missouri Valley Conference All-Freshman Team and All-Tournament Second Team in 2003.

After college, Daryl signed with the Nashville Metros of the USL PDL in 2003 where he started for four years and ranked second in the league for saves. He also was a member of the All Southern Conference team in 2003 and named team MVP. Most recently, Daryl played for the Wilmington Hammerheads and started in 13 games during the 2009 season.

After Zhong Shan, Long signed with Shanghai United FC and played for two seasons. He also played for Shanghai Seven Stars from 2007 season to 2008 and Shanghai Zobon from 2008 to 2009.

Most recently, Long played for the FC Atlanta Blackhawks in the USL PDL in 2009 where he was a top goal scorer.

After his youth career, Graham played for University of North Carolina at Charlotte from 2004 to 2008, captaining for 2007-2008 season. At UNC Charlotte, he was named MVP in 2007 and 2008, as well as being named to the A10 All Championship Team and the Davidson Adidas Classic Tournament in 2007.

Graham made his professional debut in 2009 making 13 appearances with the Wilmington Hammerheads, the 2009 USL 2 Regular Season Champions. He most recently played for Elgin City in Scotland, appearing in 11 games and scoring two goals.

Erik Ustruck is an American player versatile in several positions who previously played for the Houston Dynamo for three seasons, including the 2007 season when Houston won the MLS Cup.

Ustruck began his soccer career at Santa Clara University in 2003 and played for four seasons as a midfielder and forward. During his tenure with the Broncos, Ustruck started in 69 of the 82 games played and received several honors, including 2003 and 2006 All-WCC Second Team, National Player of the Week in October of 2005 and 2006 UCI Classic All-Tournament Team. He also played for the U.S. U-20 National Team in 2004 making several appearances for the team, including a 1-0 win over the Haitian U-20 National Team.

The Houston Dynamo drafted Ustruck in the third round of the 2007 MLS Supplemental Draft. He made his professional debut in 2008 during the third round of the U.S. Open Cup against Charleston Battery. Houston then loaned Ustruck out to Austin Aztex in 2009, where he played in five games.

Julian Valentin

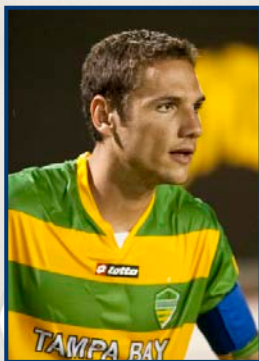

Julian Valentin is an American defender who previously captained the U.S. U-20 national team and played for the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Canada.

Most recently, the Los Angeles Galaxy selected Julian during the 2008 MLS SuperDraft as the 29th overall pick. He debuted on October 26, 2008 during the Galaxy's final regular season game against FC Dallas.

Julian began his soccer career as a member of the U.S. U-17 national team that participated in the 2003 World Championships in Finland. He was also a member of the U.S. U-18 national team, as well as the captain of the U.S. Residency program in Bradenton, Fla. and a two-time Adidas Youth All-American.

From 2004 to 2007, Julian played at Wake Forest University in 64 games, starting in 59, scoring nine goals. He received numerous achievements during the three years at Wake Forest, including Soccer America Preseason All-American, NSCAA First Team All-South and the Second All-America, ACC First Team honors and was named to ESPN's Academic All District III team. He was also a Soccer America First Team All-American in 2004 and 2005.

Rob Valentino began his soccer career playing for his local youth soccer club in California and continued into college at the University of San Francisco from 2004 to 2007. As a defender, Valentino led the USF Dons all four years as captain and was named WCC Defensive Player of the Year in 2005 and WCC Player of the Year in 2006. In addition to playing for USF, Valentino played with the San Jose Frogs in USL Premier Developmental League during the 2007 season.

In 2008, Valentino signed a Generation adidas contract and was drafted in the first round of the 2008 MLS SuperDraft by the New England Revolution. Valentino made his professional debut with the Revolution in July 2008 during the third round of the US Open Cup and was then traded to the Colorado Rapids in May 2009 where he previously played before joining the Rowdies.

Aaron then played for the USL PDL team, Reading Rage, where he received the league's MVP and top goals scoring awards during the 2009 season.

Takuya began his professional soccer career in the J. League with Tokyo Verdy (formerly Verdy Kawasaki) in 1997 making 235 appearances scoring 22 goals over eight years. He served as team captain for three years and helped lead Tokyo Verdy to win the 2005 J. League Xerox Super Cup against Yokohama F. Marinos in penalty kicks and the 2004 J. League Emperor's Cup against Jubilo Iwata.

Takuya also has four caps with the Japanese National Team between 2003 and 2004, including the 2004 Asian Cup in Beijing, where Japan defeated China 3-1.

Drew Yates is an American midfielder and forward who previously played for the University of Maryland.

Yates attended Maryland for four years and played in all 92 games of the Terps four seasons, including the 2008 NCAA National Championship. He ended his career at Maryland scoring 14 goals and having 13 assists, totaling 47 points for the squad. As a Terp, Yates received numerous honors including ACC All-Academic selection, Second Team All-Atlantic South Region selection and Second Team All-ACC selection.

Yates began his soccer career in high school playing for Curley High for two seasons and later attended the U.S. Soccer Residency Program in 2005. He then continued his career at DeMatha High School where he helped lead the squad to a perfect 23-0 record and the WCAC title his senior year. He was named the Washington Post Player of the Year and the Maryland Gatorade Player of the Year in 2006 and was a three-time NSCAA All-American.

FC Tampa Bay Rowdies is a member of the North American Soccer League (NASL) and competes in the U.S. Soccer Federation Division 2 Pro League (USSF D2). The Rowdies, who play at George M. Steinbrenner Field in Tampa, Fla., are owned by TBR Holdings, LLC. 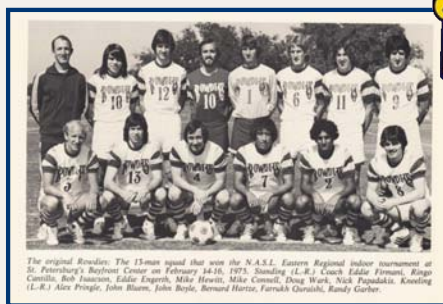
The FC Tampa Bay Rowdies honor one outstanding individual of the Bay area community at each match with the Striped Scarf Award.

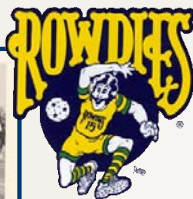


Team History

The Tampa Bay Rowdies were originally founded in 1975 as a North American Soccer League (NASL) franchise by George Strawbridge. The Rowdies were the first professional sports franchise in Tampa Bay and played at Tampa Stadium from 1975 to 1984. In their inaugural year, the Rowdies won the NASL Championship defeating the Portland Timbers 2-0. The Rowdies continued to succeed in the NASL where they finished first in the regular season and won the Eastern Division title five out of the nine years (1975, 1976, 1978, 1979, 1980).

In 1984, the NASL folded and the Rowdies became an independent team owned by Cornelia Corbett and coached by Rodney Marsh from 1985 to 1986. The Rowdies then joined the American Indoor Soccer Association (AISA) for the 1986/1987 season.

After one season in AISA, the Rowdies joined the American Soccer League (ASL), which later became the American Professional Soccer League (APSL), in 1988 and played until the team folded in 1993.

Some of the most well known Rowdies include Derek Smethurst, Rodney Marsh, Steve Wegerle, Mike Connell, Farrukh Quraishi, Winston DuBose and Perry Van Der Beck.



USSF D2 Pro League

The United States Soccer Federation Division-2 Professional League is the second division professional soccer league in the United States. In 2010, the United States Soccer Federation formed an agreement between United Soccer Leagues (USL) and the North American Soccer League (NASL), under which the USSF would operate the league in the 2010 season and work alongside the USL and NASL on day-to-day activities.

The league consists of two conferences of six teams named the USL Conference and the NASL Conference. The USL Conference includes the Austin Aztex, Minnesota Thunder, Portland Timbers, Puerto Rico Islanders, Rochester Rhinos and FC Tampa Bay Rowdies. The NASL Conference is made up of Crystal Palace Baltimore, Carolina RailHawks, Miami FC, Montreal Impact, AC St. Louis and Vancouver Whitecaps. Each of the 12 teams will play 30 regular season games for a total of 180 games. The season will run from the second week of April until early October, with the playoffs to be contested during the following weeks.

Rules and Regulations

League Structure

The twelve (12) USSF D-2 Teams are divided into two conferences:

- **USL Conference:** Austin Aztex, NSC Minnesota Stars, Portland Timbers, Puerto Rico Islanders, Rochester Rhinos and FC Tampa Bay Rowdies
- **NASL Conference:** AC St Louis, Carolina Railhawks, Crystal Palace Baltimore, Miami FC Blues, Montreal Impact and Vancouver Whitecaps

League Schedule Each team plays a 30-game Regular Season schedule. Each team will play 15 home and 15 away games.

Point System Teams will receive three points for a win, one point for a tie and zero points for a loss.

Referees All Referees are National Referees assigned by the United States Soccer

Federation. The Canadian Soccer Association assigns Referees for all games played in

Canada. U.S. Soccer will assign Referees for games played in Puerto Rico as well.

Game Clock The official game time for all D-2 games will be managed on the field by the Referee. If necessary, the Referee may also allot extra time (a.k.a. "stoppage time") at the end of each period (first half, second half, and if applicable, first overtime period and second overtime period during Playoff Games) to allow for injuries, time-wasting or other disturbances. The stadium clock will display the time from 0:00 to 45:00 and from 45:00 to 90:00 (plus stoppage time where applicable in each half). For statistical purposes, the minutes for goals, substitutions, yellow cards, etc., will be listed from the first minute until the 90th minute. A goal scored at 15 minutes 10 seconds will be listed as having been scored in the 16th minute. Events occurring during stoppage time will follow the international norm by being demarcated with a "+" sign and the extra minutes. For example, a goal scored three minutes into first half stoppage time will be officially identified as happening at "48+".

Game Day Rosters

Each team can nominate 18 players for a Game Roster. Teams are allowed five (5) substitutions per game.

Cautions and Suspensions

A Player will be suspended for one game upon receiving his fifth yellow card - regardless of the nature of the infraction, which resulted in his being awarded the yellow card. A second suspension of one game would result after the awarding of an additional three cards as would a third suspension after the awarding of card number eleven. Reference Section 11.3.1A

PLAYOFFS FORMAT

Who Qualifies Top one (1) team in each Conference qualify. The six (6) Teams with the next most points, regardless of Conference, receive the remaining Playoff Game berths.

Playoff Format All Playoff Games will be conducted in a home-and-home, aggregate-goal series. Quarterfinals will be the week of October 4, 2010 with four (4) teams advancing. Semifinals will be the week of October 11, 2010. The higher seeded team will have the first choice to play home game first or second. The team that scores the most goals in the home-and-home series advances to the next round. If the teams are tied after 180 minutes in the semifinal series and Championship Series, a 30-minute extra time period (divided into two 15-minute periods) will be played, followed by kicks from the penalty mark, if necessary.

TEAM-STANDINGS TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

The team awarded the highest position in the standings will be the team with the greatest number of points (3 points for a win, 1 point for a tie, 0 points for a loss). In the event that two teams finish the regular season with an equal number of points, the following system will be used to break the tie:

The highest position shall be awarded to the team with the better win/loss record in current Regular Season games against all other teams equal in points. (Head-to-head competition)

If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team with the greater goal difference against all other teams during the Regular Season. (Goal differential)

If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team scoring the greatest number of total goals against all other teams during the Regular

Rules and Regulations

Season. (Total goals)

If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played on the road by each team against all other teams during the Regular Season. (Road 1-3)

If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played at home by each team against all other teams during the regular season. (Home 1-3)

If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position in the standings shall be determined by the toss of a coin.

The first tiebreaker in a three-way tie is also head-to-head, but it is determined via points-per-game versus the other two teams. If two teams are tied in points-per-game head-to-head, the next tiebreaker is goal difference.

NOTE: If two clubs remain tied after another club with the same number of points advances during any step, the tiebreaker reverts to step 1 of the two-club format.

COMPETITION D-2

Teams play in various types of competitions including but not limited to: D-2 League Season Games, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Games, International Exhibition Games, Practice Games, charity games and games played outside the United States. Playing rules as well as operational procedures vary for the different types of competition.

D-2 LEAGUE SEASON GAME

D-2 Regular Season games and D-2 Playoff Games comprise the D-2 league season. An individual team's league season will conclude with its last Regular Season or Playoff Game, which may be prior to the conclusion of the league season.

D-2 REGULAR SEASON GAME

All Regular Season games shall be played according to the latest rules of FIFA and USSF Division-2 Pro League between two D-2 Teams, the results of which count toward the Regular Season D-2 standings. D-2 Regular Season games are exclusive of all Playoff Games, as well as the Championship Game.

D-2 PLAYOFF GAME

A Playoff Game shall be played between two D-2 Teams, which have qualified for the playoffs leading up to and including the D-2 Championship Game.

EXHIBITION GAME

Any non-League season Game between two D-2 Teams, or between a D-2 Team and a non-D-2 Team, which is promoted and/or which generates revenue is classified as an Exhibition Game. All Exhibition Games require League approval and submittal of a letter to USSF and D-2 Pro League requesting approval at least two (2) weeks prior to the Game.

GAME PLAYED OUTSIDE THE U.S.

U.S. Soccer must grant permission for a U.S.- based, D-2 Team to travel/play outside the United States. At least two (2) weeks prior to such travel a Team must notify the League in writing to secure such permission from the League Office.

2.12 U.S. OPEN CUP GAME

U.S. Open Cup is a non-D-2 Game administered by U.S. Soccer and played under Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup rules, leading up to the Lamar Hunt Championship Game. Games may be between D-2 Teams or between D-2 and a non-D-2 Team. U.S. Soccer will inform all participating Teams of the rules of competition for U.S. Open Cup Games.

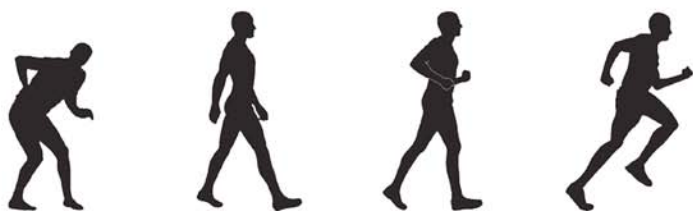
