ABOUT NEW MEXICO UNITED

New Mexico is coming off an attempted midweek match against LA Galaxy II at Isotopes Park Wednesday that would ultimately be postponed due to unsafe playing field conditions from inclement weather. The match kicked off but was stopped less than seven minutes later by game officials and ultimately delayed. Despite the match postponement, New Mexico remains the No. 5 team in the Western Conference and is still looking to clinch a playoff berth. It is also winless in its last five matches with its last win coming on Aug. 20 at home against Monterey Bay FC.

LOOKING AHEAD AT THE MATCH

San Diego Loyal has clinched the handful of objectives it was trying to reach. A playoff berth. A home postseason match. A second place finish in the Western Conference. Coach Landon Donovan's team can now shift its focus to finishing the regular season earning as many points as possible in its two remaining matches. One of those is tomorrow's regular season home finale in front of a sold out Torero Stadium. SD Loyal will host New Mexico United at 3 p.m. on Fan Appreciation Day in the Week 31 USL Championship match. This is the second time the two clubs meet this season as they previously played to a 1-1 draw on May 4 in Albuquerque. SD Loyal is coming off a 2-2 draw at Orange County SC last weekend as the home team found the equalizer in the 90th minute. But despite allowing the late goal, SD Loyal secured second place in the Western Conference by earning the point.

LAST TIME THEY MET

After going down 10 men in the second half, San Diego Loyal SC allowed a stoppage time goal to slip through resulting in 1-1 draw against host New Mexico United on a hot Saturday afternoon in Albuquerque. SD Loyal appeared to be headed for its second consecutive road win as it defended well late in the match. It had taken a 1-0 lead with Kyle Vassell continuing to be an attacking force. The English striker scored in stoppage time of the first half to help his team to go up 1-0 at Rio Grande Credit Union Field. Combined with a standout outing by goalkeeper Koke Vegas, SD Loyal appeared to be on the cusp of another gritty road win. In the 79th minute, SD Loyal was trimmed down to just 10 men after second half sub Collin Martin was sent off for receiving his second caution of the match. The difference would come deep in stoppage time of the second half (90+4), when Harry Swartz scored for the home side after he put back a ball that came off the right-post.

ABOUT SD LOYAL

SD Loyal is in its third season after becoming an expansion and playing in its inaugural season in the USL Championship in 2020. It is coming off its first ever playoff appearance, a 2-0 loss against San Antonio FC in the first round. It was SD Loyal's first season playing more than 20 games with a revamped schedule that included 32 matches, mostly against teams in its geographical region. SD Loyal finished third in the Pacific Division with a 14-12-6 record and 48 points in a season that had several milestones.

It's first season in 2020 was a turbulent one for the club due the COVID-19 pandemic. It got to play its inaugural game in front of a sold-out home crowd then competition came to a halt in March. The league revamped the schedule and resumed play in July. SD Loyal went on to a 6-5-5 record under first-year coach Landon Donovan, finishing in fourth place in the Group B standings.

It finished the season with a forfeit in its regular season finale against Phoenix Rising FC after SD Loyal players walked off the pitch after a homophobic slur was used against one of its players before halftime. SD Loyal was in position to make a push for the playoffs before the forfeit. It was the second forfeit by SD Loyal in 2020. Donovan's team also forfeit a match against L.A. Galaxy II after a racial slur was used against one of its players.

Launched on June 19, 2019, San Diego Loyal is one of the newest members of USL Championship Western Conference. San Diego Loyal plays for America's Finest City and is led by some of the best in sport. The Club is led by Chairman Andrew Vassiliadis, who is the youngest principal owner in USL Championship. Team operations are led by President Ricardo Campos. The Executive Vice President of Soccer Operations Landon Donovan, one of the most decorated soccer players in the U.S., leads the technical side as both EVP and Team Manager. San Diego Loyal is built on four core pillars – Completion, Commitment, Connection, Camaraderie. San Diego Loyal holds training camps at the Chula Vista Elite Athlete Training Center.

Home matches are played at Torero Stadium located on the University of San Diego campus. It has hosted numerous important soccer events including the U.S. Women's National team and MLS clubs LA Galaxy, Chivas USA and Club Tijuana. It's also the temporary home to National Women's Soccer League's expansion team San Diego Wave FC.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- SD Loyal (18W-9L-5D, 59 points) clinched second place in the Western Conference with a 2-2 draw at Orange County SC Saturday.
- SD Loyal has scored in 28 of its 32 games, more often than any other team this season.
- This is the third all-time meeting vs. New Mexico United
- Coach Landon Donovan's team has two regular season matches remaining, including one at home on Oct. 9 vs. New Mexico United and one away on Oct. 15 at Sacramento Republic FC.

The Spanish goalkeeper comes from Levante UD of La Liga. He is coming off a season at Mallorca of the Spanish second division where he appeared in one match after being sent there on loan. He has played for a handful of teams in that division but has had La Liga experience with Levante since 2017. Vegas became the SD Loyal starting goalkeeper at the start of the 2022 season. He quickly dispalyed his global experience, helping SD Loyal to its best start in franchise history. Prior to coming to San Diego, Vegas made his La Liga debut in May 2018, keeping a clean sheet in a 4-2 away loss against Celta de Vigo. He was loaned to second division club Deportivo La Coruña for a year after spending the campaign as a third-choice behind Oier Olazábal and Aitor Fernández in July 2019.

San Diego Loyal SC signed goalkeeper Duran Ferree on Sept. 14, 2022. The San Diego native made club history as the first local product to climb the SD Loyal professional pathway, and the youngest-ever signing. Ferree first joined the inaugural Loyal Select team on April 22, 2021. After a standout season with Loyal Select, Ferree signed a USL Academy contract on Jan. 28, ahead of the 2022 USL Championship season. Training every day with the first team, Ferree continued to reach new heights and saw his first inclusion in the SD Loyal 18-man roster on April 30, 2022 at Tampa Bay Rowdies.

Tallying one goal and three assists in 2021, Martin uses his speed and physicality to help in the attack. Martin was named to the league's Team of the Week in September 2021 and was also part of the first XI for the team's first ever post season match. Martin was also a consistent starter in the inaugural season for SD Loyal, working the left side of coach Landon Dono-van's three-man defensive backline. He has quickly became a dominant force on the field.



JACK METCALF

The midfielder returns to the squad with perhaps more motivation than ever. The Liverpool native's 2021 season was cut short after he suffered a broken collar bone Aug. 2 that required season-ending surgery. Metcalf played in 16 matches, starting in 15. He scored one goal and recorded one assist in 1,394 minutes played.



GRANT STONEMAN

Stoneman is an impact defender. He helped solidify coach Landon Donovan's backline in 2021, often being one of the more physical players on the field. Stoneman made his USL Championship debut while starting for SD Loyal in the team's debut match against Las Vegas Lights.

He played there after being selected in the second round of the 2019 MLS SuperDraft by Sporting Kansas City and was subsequently signed by its USL Championship affiliate.

He played in 17 games and started in two in 2021, but when he was on the field it was quality work from the North Carolina native. Hackworth also saw extensive time on the pitch in the later part of the 2020 season, playing in seven games, logging 375 minutes.



CHARLIE ADAMS

As the team captain, Adams helped keep the squad working towards each match goals despite the ups and downs of losing streaks and then unbeaten weeks in 2021. The 27 year-old midfielder has been the heart of the midfield since his arrival in San Diego. He played in 33 matches while starting 29 in 2021. Adams showed off his quality as a ball distributor with an 87-per-cent pass accuracy and 29 accurate crosses. He had four assists while also displaying defensive capability with 64 interceptions and 58-percent of his challenges won last season. Adams will be tattooed into SD Loyal history. The English play maker scored the first official goal in SD Loyal history in a 1-1 tie against Las Vegas Lights in the team's debut.



JACK BLAKE

Blake was an immediate impact player for SD Loyal in 2021 with his dangerous shot from outside the penalty box. The Englishman was tied for second in the league with four goals from beyond the box. He played in 25 matches, starting in 23, scoring five goals in a season that had him miss a handful of games due to injury. Blake returned in time for the playoffs, finishing the year with four assists and 1,877 minutes played.

The 25-year-old comes from Indy Eleven where he is coming off playing in 29 USL Champion-ship matches, starting in 19 in 2021. He scored three goals and recorded four assists last season. He gives SD Loyal versatility as he can play at different areas of the pitch. From Wisconsin, Moon not only has experience at the USL Championship level but has also played in League One where he played in 16 matches for Indy in 2020.

LANDON DONOVAN

Regarded as one of the greatest U.S. soccer players in history, Landon Donovan brings his extensive knowledge of the game to San Diego Loyal's technical staff. During his 19-year professional career, Donovan's accomplishments span both his time domestically and internationally. In total, he played for five professional teams covering three leagues: Bayer 04 Leverkusen and Bayern Munich (Bundesliga); Everton (Premier League); San Jose Earthquakes and LA Galaxy (Major League Soccer). He played in six MLS Cups, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and earned two MLS Supporters' Shields. Individually, he was named to an MLS record 14-consecutive MLS All-Star games from 2001-2014, was honored with the Landon Donovan MVP Award in 2009 and won the Golden Boot in 2008, as well as being one of just two players to be named MLS Cup MVP twice. He still leads the MLS record books in assists (136), playoff goals (25) and co-leads MLS in playoff assists (14). He is second to Chris Wondolowski with most regular season goals at 145. Donovan's contributions to the U.S. Men's National Team continues to dominate the record books. He leads the USMNT in goals (57), assists (58), second in appearances (157) and is the only American player to surpass both 50 goals and 50 assists in his career. He was the fastest American to earn 100 caps and played for the U.S. in three FIFA World Cups. His individual awards include the 1999 FIFA U-17 World Championship Golden Ball Award, FIFA's Best Young Player of the 2002 World Cup, the CONCACAF Gold Cup MVP in 2013, a Gold Cup Best XI selection four times and U.S. Soccer Athlete of the Year a record four times.

Miller is in his third season with SD Loyal as the associate head coach. Miller joined the team in 2020 after serving as head coach of the Spring Arbor University men's soccer program for six seasons, where his accomplishments included an overall record of 86-32-15, one league championship title, two regular season titles and being named 2018 Crossroads League Coach of the Year. Miller was also the general manager and head coach of Lansing United – a former member of the Premier Development League (PDL) – and, in 2019, was the inaugural head coach of USL League One expansion side Lansing Ignite FC.
