- In the fourth quarter, New Orleans outshot the Clippers, shooting 11 -of-20 (.550) from the floor and a perfect 9 -of-9 from the free throw line, while the Clippers only shot 10 -of- 22 (.455) from the floor and 1 -of-2 (.500) from the charity stripe.
- Brandon Ingram scored a team-high 36 points, shooting 13 -of-22 (.565) from the floor and 10-of-11 (.909) from the free throw stripe. He added eight boards, four assists and one block. This marks Ingram's 10th consecutive game scoring 22-plus points, which is the second longest streak in Pelicans' franchise history
- Jonas Valančiünas notched his 42nd double-double, scoring 23 points and hauling in 12 boards.

Hard in the Paint: The Pelicans had their way in the lane this season.

- New Orleans finished the regular season ranked $9^{\text {th }}$ in the NBA in points in the paint per game, averaging 53.4 points.
- Through all 82 regular season games, the Pelicans scored 60 -plus points in the paint in 26 games and scored 70 -plus points in the paint three times, rather than last season when they only scored 60-plus points in the paint eight total times and never scored 70 -plus points in the paint.

Dish \& Swish: New Orleans distributed the ball well this season, as the Pelicans finished ranked $11^{\text {th }}$ in the NBA in assists per game (25.9) and tied for $8^{\text {th }}$ in assist percentage (61.6\%).

High Usage: Pelicans forwards Brandon Ingram, CJ McCollum and Zion Williamson filled up the stat sheet this season.

- Ingram has a usage rate of $\mathbf{3 2 . 3} \%$, falling in the $100^{\text {th }}$ percentile of all 'wing' players in the NBA.
- Additionally, McCollum is averaging 35.3 minutes per game which has led him to a usage rate of $\mathbf{2 7 . 8 \%}$, falling in the 89 th percentile of all 'combo' guards.
- Lastly, Williamson is averaging 33.0 minutes per game, which has led him to a usage rate of $29.6 \%$, falling in the $98^{\text {th }}$ percentile of all 'bigs' in the NBA.

Third Times the Charm: During the 2022-23 season, New Orleans has had seven players that have scored 35 -plus points in a game this season. This is the first time in franchise history that seven different players have scored 35 -plus points in a game during a season. Additionally, the 2022-23 Pelicans join the 1970-71 SuperSonics and 2020-21 Raptors as the only teams in NBA history to have seven different players score 35 -plus in a game in the same season. Jose Alvarado, Brandon Ingram, Herbert Jones, CJ McCollum, Trey Murphy III, Jonas Valančiūnas and Zion Williamson are the seven Pelicans players that have scored 35-plus points this season.

## Murph Madness

Trey Murphy III made 60 three-pointers during the month of March, which marks the most threes made in Pelicans' franchise history.

- During the month of March, he was ranked $4^{\text {th }}$ in three-pointers made per game (4.0).
- Murphy III ranked $2^{\text {nd }}$ in three-point percentage ( $\min .4 .03$ PM per game) shooting $45.1 \%$. Additionally, Murphy ranked $2^{\text {nd }}$ in three-point percentage (min. 8.03 PA per game) shooting $45.1 \%$ from behind the arc.
- Murphy was tied for $3^{\text {rd }}$ in three-pointers made (60).


## Brandon Ingram Player of the Week - Dec. 5-11:

- Brandon Ingram was named the Western Conference Player of the Week for games played March 20-26. Ingram led New Orleans to a 3-0 week, recording averages of 31.3 points, 10.0 assists, and 6.3 rebounds in 33.0 minutes per game, while shooting .525 from the field, .462 from deep, and 1.000 from the foul stripe. Among Western Conference players with winning records on the week, Ingram ranked first in points and assists per contest.
- Ingram began the week with a 32-point, seven-assist outing against San Antonio in the Pelicans' 119-84 win on March 21. In New Orleans's 115-96 win over Charlotte on March 23, Ingram notched the first triple-double of his career with 30 points, 11 rebounds, and 10 assists.
- Secured in the third quarter, Ingram became just the third player in franchise history to notch a triple-double before the fourth frame, and the third to notch 30/10/10 overall.
- Ingram also became the $8^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history to record a 30-plus point triple-double without committing a turnover, joining Nikola Jokić (2x), Dejounte Murray, James Harden, Nikola Vucevic, Antoine Walker, Grant Hill, and Charles Barkley.
- Ingram followed up this career milestone by notching 32 points and a career-best 13 assists in a 131-110 win over the LA Clippers on March 25.
- Ingram's Player of the Week honor is the fourth of his career. He has been named Player of the Week in each of his four seasons as a Pelican.

TREY'S: On 3/25/23 at LAC, Trey Murphy III caught fire, hitting a career-high 10-of-12 (.833) from three-point distance. Below is a breakdown of how Murphy put his name at the top of many historical lists:

- Murphy III becomes the second-youngest player in NBA history to make 10 threes in a game. Anthony Edwards is the youngest player to sink 10 threes.
- Murphy III is just the $8^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history to make 10 -plus three-pointers and shoot $83 \%$ or better from behind the arc.
- Murphy III is now the third player in franchise history to make 10 three-pointers in a game, along with CJ McCollum and Peja Stojaković.
- Murphy III is the first player in Pelicans' franchise history to have at least two games with nine-plus three-pointers.

Bl's First Triple-Double: On 3/23/vs. CHA, Pelicans forward Brandon Ingram posted 30 points, 11 rebounds, 10 assists, one steal and zero turnovers which marked his first career triple-double.

- Ingram is the third player in Pelicans franchise history with a 30-point triple-double, joining Chris Paul (twice) and DeMarcus Cousins.
- With this triple-double, Ingram becomes just the third player in franchise-history to notch a triple-double before the fourth frame.
- Lastly, Ingram's 30 -point triple-double along with his zero turnovers makes him the $8^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history to record a 30-point triple double and finish the game with no turnovers, along with Nikola Jokić (twice), Dejounte Murray, James Harden, Nikola Vučević, Antoine Walker, Grant Hill and Charles Barkley.

40-Point Flock: During the 2022-23 season, New Orleans has had four players that have scored 40-plus points in a game this season. This is the first time in franchise history that four different players have scored 40-plus points in a game during a season. Additionally, New Orleans is one of two teams in the NBA to have four players score 40-plus points in a game this season (Cam Thomas, Kevin Durant, Kyrie Irving, Mikal Bridges).

Welcome to the Program: On $2 / 13$ at OKC, Pelicans newly acquired guard Josh Richardson made Pelicans history. In the win over the Thunder, Josh Richardson became the second player in franchise history to post five steals in his debut, joining DeMarcus Cousins (2/23/17). This also tied Richardson's career-high in steals.

Larry the Man is Here: On $2 / 5$ vs. SAC, Pelicans forward Larry Nance Jr. was plus-37 in under 20 Minutes (Net Rating of plus-102.8) which is the highest of any player this season who has played under 20 minutes and highest since '19-'20 season.

JV's $10,000^{\text {th }}$ Career Point: On $1 / 20$ at ORL, Pelicans center Jonas Valančiūnas scored 20 points and 10 boards on $9-0$ of 19 (.474) from the floor and a perfect 1 -of- 1 from behind the arc. Valančiūnas became the second Lithuanian-born player to record 10,000 career points at Orlando. He joins former Cavalier and Heat center Zydrunas Ilgauskas (10,596 career points).

Colt 45: On 1/4/23 vs. HOU, the Pelicans scored 45 points in the first quarter, which marks the sixth time in franchise history the Pelicans have scored 45 -plus points in any quarter.

Coach of the Month: New Orleans Pelicans Head Coach Willie Green has been named the Western Conference Coach of the Month for December 2022, the NBA announced.

- After guiding the Pelicans to a $10-5$ record in the month of December, the Pelicans sat third in the Western Conference rankings with a 23-14 record, a 10win improvement from last season and the franchise's third-best start through 37 games.
- New Orleans notched two separate five-game winning streaks in December, and finished the month with an 8-1 record at the Smoothie King Center.
- During the month of December, the Pelicans ranked third in the NBA, averaging 118.3 points per game. New Orleans was the only Western Conference team to finish the month in the top 10 in both offensive ( $10^{\text {th }}$ ) and defensive ( $6^{\text {th }}$ ) rating, and also finished sixth in the NBA and second in Western Conference in net rating (3.3).
- Green is the fourth coach in New Orleans franchise history to garner Coach of the Month honors, joining Monty Williams (January 2011), Byron Scott (January 2008, December 2008), and Paul Silas (April 2003).

Franchise 3's: On 12/30/22 vs. PHI, CJ McCollum posted a season-high 42 points, shooting 13-of-20 (.650) from the floor, 11-of-16 (.688) from there-point range and $5-$ of-6 (.833) from the free throw stripe. McCollum's career-high 11 made three-pointers is a New Orleans franchise record, passing Peja Stojakovic's franchise record of 10 (11/6/2007). In the first half McCollum scored 23 points, converting 8 -of-14 (.571) from the floor and 7-of-11 (.636) from three-point range. McCollum's seven firsthalf threes ties the franchise record for three-pointers made in a half. McCollum joins Jonas Valančiünas, Ryan Anderson, and Peja Stojaković.

JV's $300^{\text {th }}$ Career Double-Double: On $12 / 26$ vs. IND, Pelicans center Jonas Valančiunas tallied 20 points and 12 boards which marks his $300^{\text {th }}$ career double-double. Valanciünas becomes the $88^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history and one of 12 active players to reach 300 career point/rebound double-doubles.

JV's Big Start: On 12/19/22 vs. MIL, Jonas Valančiūnas started the game off red hot for New Orleans. Below is a breakdown of just how hot he got:

- Jonas Valančiunas started the game scoring the first 15 points for New Orleans. His 15 straight points to start a game is ranked second in franchise history, behind Peja Stojaković who scored 20 points to start a game on 11/14/2006.
- Additionally, his 15 straight points to start a game ties the second-longest streak to start a game by any player over the last 10 seasons. He finished the first quarter with 15 points and six rebounds, converting 6 -of-8 (.750) from the floor and 3 -of-5 (.600) from three-point range.

## Zion Player of the Week - Dec. 5-11:

- Zion Williamson was named the Western Conference Player of the Week for games played December 5-11. Williamson led New Orleans to a 3-0 week, recording averages of 33.0 points (second among Western Conference players), 8.3 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.0 steals in 37.3 minutes per contest, while shooting 70.4 percent from the field (first in the NBA among players that registered 13.0 or more field goal attempts per game). Williamson finished the week as one of two players in the West to average at least 30 points per game and the only Western Conference player to average at least 30 points and eight rebounds. Williamson also averaged an NBA-best 24.0 points in the paint per game during this stretch.
- Williamson began the week by totaling 29 points (11-of-26 from the field), ten rebounds, five assists, one steal and one block in 33 minutes in a 104-98 win over Detroit, his fifth double-double of the season. Williamson followed up with back-to-back 35-point games against Phoenix. In Friday's 128-117 win over the Suns, Williamson notched 35 points on 13-of-17 from the floor, seven boards and four assists. In Sunday's 129-124 overtime win, Williamson tallied another 35 points, eight rebounds and three dimes while going 2-of-3 from deep and 5-of-7 at the foul line.
- Williamson's Player of the Week honor is the first of his career and makes him one of nine players in team history to win the award.


## Ice Cream Paint Job:

- On 12/9/22 vs. PHX, New Orleans defeated the Suns $128-117$, scoring 72 of their points in the paint, while Phoenix only scored 38 points in the lane. This marks the most points scored in the paint since $3 / 14 / 21$ vs. LAC when the Pelicans notched 72 points in the paint.
- On 12/11/22 vs. PHX, the Pelicans defeated Phoenix 129-124 (OT), scoring 70 points in the paint.
- This marks the second-consecutive game New Orleans has scored 70 -plus points in the paint since $1 / 23 / 19$ vs. DET - 1/24/19 at OKC.


## Franchise-Dubs:

- On $1 / 4$ vs. HOU, New Orleans defeated the Houston Rockets 119-108 in the Smoothie King Center, giving the Pelicans a 17-4 home record through their first 21 home games, which marks the best home record in franchise history through the first 21 home games.
- On $12 / 11$ vs. PHX, New Orleans defeated the Phoenix Suns $129-124$ in overtime, giving the Pelicans an 18-8 record through their first 26 games of the season. This marks the Pelicans recorded their best record through their first 26 games in franchise history. Additionally, New Orleans notched their seventh-straight win at home, which is the largest home win streak since the 2009-10 season.
- On 12/7/22 vs. DET, New Orleans defeated the Pistons $104-98$, giving the Pelicans a $16-8$ record through their first 24 games. With the win, the Pelicans have won their fifth consecutive game for the first time since April 4-11, 2018. Additionally, the Pelicans have won five straight home games for the first time since November 7-19, 2018.

Jose's Big Day: Jose Alvarado scored a career-high 38 points in a win over Denver on 12/4, converting 12-of-19 (.632) from the field, 8-of-11 (.727) from deep and 6-of7 (.857) from the free throw line. He added three rebounds, two assists and one steal. That afternoon, Alvarado put his name at the top of many historical lists:

- Most points off the bench by an undrafted player in NBA history, previously held by Golden State's lan Clark (36) on 3/11/17.
- Most points off the bench in a game in New Orleans franchise history, besting Cleveland's Marcus Thornton's 37 on 2/23/10.
- Became one of nine players in franchise history to hit eight three-pointers in a game and just the third to do it off the bench (Ryan Anderson [Twice], JJ Redick).
- Third most points scored off the bench by any NBA player this season.

Zion Williams-HIM: On 11/30/22 vs. TOR, Zion Williamson posted a stat line that only two other NBA players have ever posted in NBA History. Williamson notched 33 points, 10 rebounds, five assists, four steals and two blocks while shooting $80.0 \%$ ( 12 -of-15) from the floor. The only other two players to ever accomplish this feat are Ben Simmons ( $1 / 20 / 20$ ) and Amar'e Stoudemire (11/5/08).

Lock Down D: On 11/28/22 vs. OKC, Pelicans guard/forward Herbert Jones became the seventh player in franchise history to notch at least four steals and three blocks in a single game.

Franchise Margin: On 11/21/22 vs. GSW, New Orleans outscored the Warriors 128-83, which marks the second-largest margin of victory in franchise history (45 points). The largest margin of victory came on 11/14/14 against the Minnesota Timberwolves, when the Pelicans outscored the Wolves by 48 points.

Wine \& Dime: CJ McCollum notched 23 assists over a two-game span (10/23 vs. UTA - $10 / 25$ vs. DAL), which is the most assists McCollum has ever had over a twogame stretch in his NBA career.

Pelicans Scoring History: To start the season, the Pelicans scored 110-plus points in 11 consecutive games ( $10 / 19$ at $\mathrm{BKN}-11 / 9$ at CHI ), which is the longest streak in the NBA to begin a season in the last 30 seasons.

TMIII Perfect Night: Trey Murphy III started his first game of the season against the Dallas Mavericks (10/25), posting a team-high 22 points on a perfect 8-of-8 from the floor, 4-of-4 from three-point range and 2-of-2 from the charity stripe. Murphy III finished tonight's game with 22 points on 8 -of- 8 shooting, the third-highest point total in franchise history without missing a shot.

Keeping it 100: Zion Williamson played his $100^{\text {th }}$ career game against the Oklahoma City Thunder on $11 / 28 / 22$. Throughout Williamson's first 100 career games, he has been historic statistically and is ranked among elite company. Below are several stats of Zion Williamson's excellence through his first 100 games:

- Williamson is averaging 25.2 points on $60 \%$ shooting for his career. No player to debut in the shot-clock era has ever averaged those numbers through his first 100 career games. In fact, the only players with those numbers over any 100-game span in the shot-clock era are Charles Barkley, Shaquille O'Neal, Kevin McHale and Wilt Chamberlain.
- Williamson $(2,524)$ is the $12^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history with 2,500 points in his first 100 career games. He's the first player since Michael Jordan to accomplish the feat. The others to pull it off were Wilt Chamberlain, Walt Bellamy, Oscar Robertson, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, George Mikan, Rick Barry, Elvin Hayes, Elgin Baylor, David Thompson and Billy Knight. (Thompson and Knight played in the ABA prior to their NBA debuts.) All players except for Knight are in the Hall of Fame.
- Williamson has 42 career games with 20 points in the restricted area. No other player to debut over the last 25 seasons has done it 10 times through their first 100 career games.
- Williamson has scored 1,898 career paint points. Over the last 25 seasons, the only player to score that many in the paint over any 100 -game span is Shaquille O'Neal.
- Williamson has 54 career games with 25 points and $50 \%$ shooting, tied with Abdul-Jabbar for the second-most by any player through his first 100 career games in the shot-clock era; only Walt Bellamy has more (57).
- Williamson has 98 games with at least 10 points. Among players to debut in the last 25 seasons, only Joel Embiid (98) and Blake Griffin (99) can match Zion.
- Williamson scored at least 20 points in 83 of his first 100 games. That's the most of any player through their first 100 games since Michael Jordan (85).
- Williamson scored 30 points on $60.0 \%$ or better from the field in 17 games through his first 100 games played, which is $2^{\text {nd }}$ in NBA history behind Kareem Abdul-Jabbar with 24.


## Road Warriors:

- Through the first two games of the 2022-23 season, the Pelicans did not trail at any point through the entire 96 minutes of play. This marks the most minutes the Pelicans have led by to start the season in franchise history. The previous franchise high was set during the 2006-07 season when the Pelicans led for the first $81: 42$ minutes of play to start the season.
- The Pelicans started the season off with two road wins, marking the fifth time in franchise history that New Orleans has won their first two road games to start the season. Compared to last season (2021-22) when the Pelicans did not record their second road win until the $21^{\text {st }}$ game of the season, the $11^{\text {th }}$ road game of the year.

- Griffin was named the Vice President of Basketball Operations for the Cleveland Cavaliers in September 2010 and was elevated to General Manager on


## February 6, 2014.

- During Griffin's tenure in Cleveland, the Cavaliers reached the NBA Finals for three consecutive seasons from 2015-17, winning the NBA Championship in 2016, becoming the first team in NBA Finals history to overcome a 3-1 deficit.
- Prior to joining Cleveland, Griffin spent 17 seasons with the Phoenix Suns, moving to the basketball operations department in 1997 after beginning in media relations. Along the way, Griffin held titles of senior vice president of basketball operations, assistant general manager, director of player personnel, assistant director of player personnel and basketball operations assistant.

Coaching Notes

- Appointed head coach on July 22, 2021, his first head coaching position in the NBA. Green enters his second season with New Orleans.
- In his first season with the Pelicans, Green led the team to its first playoff appearance since 2018. Praised around the league for his steady and calm demeanor, Green helped the Pelicans overcome a 1-12 start to the season to earn the ninth seed and reach the postseason Play-In Tournament. The Pelicans defeated San Antonio and the LA Clippers to clinch a First Round matchup against the Phoenix Suns, in which they pushed the one-seed to six games.
- Spent the previous two seasons (2019-21) as an assistant coach for the Phoenix Suns. Helped guide the 2021 Western Conference Champions to their first NBA Finals appearance since 1993. As the Suns' defensive coordinator, Phoenix finished the regular season with the NBA's sixth-best defensive rating. He also served as the Phoenix's head coach for NBA Summer League in 2019, leading the Suns to a 3-1 record in Las Vegas.
- Helped the Warriors win back-to-back NBA Championships in 2017 and 2018 before returning to the NBA Finals in 2019. He also served as the Warriors' head coach for NBA Summer League in 2018, leading Golden State to the California Classic's only 3-0 record.
- A 12-year NBA veteran as a player, Green averaged 8.3 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 731 regular season games (297 starts) with Philadelphia, New Orleans, Atlanta, the LA Clippers and Orlando from 2003-2015.
- Was selected $41^{\text {st }}$ overall by Seattle in the 2003 NBA Draft.
- Was a four-year standout at the University of Detroit Mercy. A native of Detroit, he won Horizon League Player of the Year as a senior in 2003 and helped the Titans to two NIT appearances in 2001 and 2002, including a trip to the semifinals at Madison Square Garden in 2001. Green remains fourth in program history in career points scored.

- On $12 / 2$ at SAS, notched his ninth double-double of the season ( $295^{\text {th }}$ career double-double), posting 21 points and 11 rebounds, while shooting $8-$ of- 11 (.727) from the field and a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw stripe.
- On $12 / 19$ vs. MIL, started the game scoring the first 15 points for New Orleans. His 15 straight points to start a game is ranked second in franchise history, behind Peja Stojaković who scored 20 points to start a game on 11/14/2006. Additionally, his 15 straight points to start a game ties the second-longest streak to start a game by any player over the last 10 seasons. He finished the first quarter with 15 points and six rebounds, converting $6-0 f-8(.750)$ from the floor and 3-of-5 (.600) from three-point range. On the night Valančiūnas scored a season-high 37 points and grabbed 18 rebounds. Additionally, he tied a career-high with seven made three-pointers. Tonight's performance marks his $298^{\text {th }}$ career double-double and his $12^{\text {th }}$ on the season.
- On $1 / 9$ at WAS, scored 27 points, converting 10-of-15 (.667) from the floor and 7-of-8 (.875) from the free throw line. He added 12 boards and one assist. This marks his $20^{\text {th }}$ double-double of the season.
- On $1 / 13$ at DET, notched his $21^{\text {st }}$ double-double of the season, posting 33 points and 16 rebounds. He converted 12 -of- 15 (.800) from the floor, 1 -of- 3 (.333) from threepoint range and 8-of-10 (.800) from the free throw line.
- On $1 / 20$ at ORL, scored his $10,000^{\text {th }}$ career point. He posted 20 points and 10 boards on 9 -of- 19 (.474) from the floor and a perfect 1 -of- 1 from behind the arc. Valančiūnas became the second Lithuanian-born player to record 10,000 career points at Orlando. He joins former Cavalier and Heat center Zydrunas llgauskas (10,596 career points).
- On $3 / 17$ at HOU, notched a season-high four blocks and 14 defensive rebounds to go along with 17 total rebounds and 22 points.
- On 3/27 at POR, grabbed a season-high 21 boards to go along with 10 points and two blocks.

## 1 ZION WILLIAMSON - F - HT: 6-6 WT: 285 - BORN: 7/6/00 - DUKE - 4TH NBA SEASON



- On 11/23 at SAS, finished the game with 32 points and 11 rebounds, notching his fifth-career $30 / 10$ game. He scored 28 of his 32 total points in the paint, which is tied for the most points anyone has had in a single game all season. Williamson only played 26 minutes and posted 32 points and 11 rebounds, there are only eight other players in NBA history to have been able to do that. Lastly, Williamson finished the last three quarters of the game shooting perfect 11-of-11 from the floor.
- On 11/28 vs. OKC, led the way scoring a team-high 23 points to go along with eight boards, eight assists and a career-high three blocks. Williamson converted 11-of-18 (.611), which marks his third consecutive game shooting $50.0 \%$ or better from the field. At the $8: 54$ mark of the first quarter, Williamson received his first technical foul call of his career.
- On 11/30 vs. TOR, scored 33 points, converting 12-of-15 (.800) from the field and 9-of-12 (.750) from the free throw line. This marks the fourth consecutive game he has shot $50.0 \%$ or better from the floor. Additionally, Williamson posted his third double-double of the year and his 19th career double-double.
- On $12 / 2$ at SAS, notched his third 30-point game of the season, scoring 30 points to go along with a career-high 15 rebounds and eight assists. Williamson converted 9-of-14 (.643) from the floor, which marks the fifth consecutive game that he has shot $50.0 \%$ or better from the floor. Additionally, Williamson sunk 12-of-13 (.923) from the free throw line. This marks his fourth double-double of the season.
- On $12 / 9$ vs. PHX, scored 35 points, shooting 13-of-17 (.765) from the floor and 9-of-12 (.750) from the charity stripe along with 10 rebounds to mark his sixth double-double of the season.
- On $12 / 11$ vs. PHX, scored 35 points, converting 14-of-21 (.667) from the floor, 2-of-3 (.667) from three-point range and 5-of-7 (.714) from the free throw line. This marks his ninth consecutive game shooting $50.0 \%$ or better from the floor.
- On 12/17 at PHX, tossed out a career-high nine assists to go along with 30 points, three rebounds and a block.
- On $12 / 28$ vs. MIN, returned to the Pelicans lineup after missing three games due to health and safety protocols. He posted a career-high 43 points, converting 14 -of-2 (.667) from the field, a perfect 1-of-1 from three-point range and a career-high 14-of-19 (.737) from the free throw stripe. In the second half, Williamson scored 33 points, which is tied for the most points in any half in franchise history.
- On $12 / 30$ vs. PHI, tallied 36 points five rebounds, two assists, converting 13-of-19 (.684) from the field and 10-of-16 (.625) from the free throw stripe. This marks the ninth time Williamson has scored 30-plus points this season.
