Here is what Head Coach **Clint Peay** had to say following the team's 4-2 loss against NYCFC II:

Revolution II Head Coach Clint Peay:

On his assessment of the match:

Peay: "Yeah, I thought it was a match that I didn't think we were very good with the ball in critical situations. I think it took us a while to be a little bit more calm and composed to dictate things in possession, and I felt that we did a better job in the second half of that prior to going down a man, but yeah, for me it's just another game where the details caught up to us and not executing in the critical moments cost us, so it's a unfortunately another hard lesson for the group, and it's an area where, you know, individually we all need to sort of reflect and look at ourselves and figure out, 'how can I be better?'"

On Pierre Cayet's development through his 50 appearances with the team:

Peay: "Pierre [Cayet] is a tremendous leader. He's talking to the group now afterwards. He brings intensity every day. He shows it by example, and he's just what you want out of a player. You know what you're going to get from him every game and I can't speak highly enough of him."

MATCH PREVIEW VS. TORONTO FC II

New England Visits Toronto FC II on Sunday

Revolution II continue three-game road swing at York Lions University Stadium

TORONTO - New England Revolution II (3-3-1; 11 pts.) are set to visit Toronto FC II (1-4-1; 4 pts.) at York Lions University Stadium for the first of three meetings between the two sides this season. New England's second match of a three-game road swing kicks off at 7 p.m. and streams live on MLSNEXTPro.com.

Revolution II fell at New York City FC II last weekend, 4-2. Forward Marcos Dias recorded his second brace in as many matches, scoring on both penalty kick opportunities New England earned in the 38th and 70th minutes. Academy defender Peyton Miller was issued two yellow cards, leading to red card ejection in the 64th minute as New England would complete the remainder of the match down a man. NY-CFC II scored three times in the second half to hand Revolution II its third loss of the 2023 season.

With four goals over his last two games, Dias now stands as New England's leading scorer. Forward Jordan Adebayo-Smith and Home-grown midfielder Damian Rivera trail Dias closely with three goals each so far this season. Adebayo-Smith recorded three shots with one on target in last Saturday's match. Revolution II's 17 goals scored this season rank tied for third-most in MLS NEXT Pro.

"I think that's what they [Marcos Dias and Jordan Adebayo-Smith] are there to do. They're attacking players," Head Coach Clint Peay said postgame following last weekend's match in New York. "We expect and want them to be able to be dangerous for the group, and obviously they've been able to do that, and I still think there's more that they can give in that regard, but yes, that's their role and they're doing a decent job and I think there's even more for them."

New England holds a 3-3-1 all-time record against Toronto FC II, dating back to 2021 when both sides competed in USL League One. Revolution II went 1-1-1 in MLS NEXT Pro action with Toronto last season with Dias tallying twice across those three matches.

LAST TIME OUT: REVS II FALL TO NYCFC II, 4-2

QUEENS, N.Y. – New England Revolution II (3-3-1; 11 pts.) fell to New York City FC II (3-1-1; 10 pts.), 4-2, on Saturday night at Belson Stadium. Marcos Dias tallied his second brace in as many games as New England played the final 26 minutes with 10 men after Peyton Miller was shown a second yellow card in the second half.

"I thought it was a match that I didn't think we were very good with the ball in critical situations," Head Coach Clint Peay said postgame. "I think it took us a while to be a little bit more calm and composed to dictate things in possession, and I felt that we did a better job in the second half of that prior to going down a man, but yeah, for me it's just another game where the details caught up to us and not executing in the critical moments cost us, so it's a unfortunately another hard lesson for the group, and it's an area where, you know, individually we all need to sort of reflect and look at ourselves and figure out, 'how can I be better?'"



New York found the scoresheet first with John Denis' tally in the 11th minute. New England equalized with Marcos Dias drawing a penalty in the box as the Brazilian forward stepped up to tally his third penalty kick goal in two matches, and the two sides headed into halftime with one goal apiece.

Jordan Adebayo-Smith drew a foul in the box to give Revolution II its second penalty kick opportunity of the night in the 70th minute, allowing Dias to earn his second brace of the season. New York City went on to equalize in the 82nd minute and took control of the match with two penalty kick goals of their own in the final minutes as New England would walk away with its third loss of the season.

17 GOALS IN SEVEN GAMES: ACADEMY PRODUCTS LEADING THE WAY

Of New England's eight goal scorers so far this season, four are graduates of the Revolution Academy. Esmir Bajraktarevic, Brandonn Bueno, Malcolm Fry, and Damian Rivera have helped lead Revs II with 17 goals scored to kick off the 2023 season.

Bajraktarevic made his pro debut with Revolution II in August 2021 and signed his Homegrown deal in May 2022. Since then, the 18-year-old midfielder has made 30 appearances, netting three goals and two assists at the MLS NEXT Pro level.



Bueno and Fry both made their pro debuts with New England's second team last season with Fry tallying his first professional goal in September 2022 vs. Orlando City B. Bueno earned his first pro tally last weekend, drawing a penalty in the box and burying the penalty kick opportunity vs. Union II in the 89th minute of the match.

Rivera signed his Homegrown contract in November 2019 and continues to dominate with Revolution II in his fourth season with the team, owning three goals and two assists through five appearances so far this season.



15-year-old Peyton Miller became the youngest player to make his pro debut with Revs II on March 26 vs. Atlanta United 2 and recorded his first pro assist on Rivera's goal vs. Union II on April 10.

New England's firepower has also been bolstered by Marcos Dias' team-leading four goals and Jordan Adebayo-Smith's three tallies while Pierre Cayet and Jake Rozhansky each own one goal on the year from the team's season opener. With scoring coming from all across the roster, Revolution II's offensive depth has been on full display through the first seven games to start their 2023 MLS NEXT Pro campaign.

TEAM NOTES

DAMIAN AND DIAS: TWO BRACES IN ONE MATCH

On April 30, Revolution II and FC Cincinnati 2 each tallied five goals in the highest scoring match in MLS NEXT Pro history. Four of New England's goals came from Homegrown midfielder Damian Rivera and Revs II forward Marcos Dias, securing the fifth and sixth braces in team history.



Dias earned his first two goals of the season by burying two penalty kick opportunities, putting him a third of the way to matching his 2022 goal total (6). The Brazilian forward also recorded an assist in Sunday's match on Rivera's second goal.

Rivera opened the 2022 MLS NEXT Pro season recording the third brace in Revolution II history in the team's season opening 2-2 tie at New York City FC II. Through five appearances in 2023, the Cranston, R.I. native owns three goals, two assists with eight shots, five on target. He recorded his second assist of the season on Jordan Adebayo-Smith's goal in the first half of Sunday's match. In his 49 total appearances with New England's second team, Rivera owns 14 goals, five assists, continuing to be a standout when called upon.



"We actually had a conversation and it's always frustrating and difficult for the player to have to play second team minutes sometimes, but those minutes are important and valuable to keep him [Damian Rivera] sharp, to keep him growing as a player," Head Coach Cliny Peay said postgame. "And we just talked about having the right mentality, expressing himself the way he can, and being a difference maker. And he was that for us tonight."

EZRA WIDMAN MAKES REVS II DEBUT

The Revolution Academy saw another graduate make his Revolution II debut last weekend as midfielder Ezra Widman (2005 - New York, N.Y.) entered in the 85th minute at New York City FC II. Widman is the 28th Academy player to see action with New England's second team to date.



Widman joined New England ahead of the 2022-23 MLS NEXT season from New York Red Bulls Academy where he made his professional debut with Red Bulls II in USL Championship last season. The midfielder owns seven goals with the Under-19s so far this year and joined Revolution II for preseason, becoming a mainstay at training sessions since.

PEYTON MILLER CALLED UP TO U-17 U.S. YOUTH NATIONAL TEAM

New England Revolution Academy defender Peyton Miller (2007 - Unionville, Conn.) was called up to the U.S. Under-17 Youth National Team for a training camp in Palm Beach, Fla. from April 17-24 in preparation for the FIFA U-17 World Cup in November.

Miller, 15, makes his fourth appearance with the U.S. Youth National Team, his first with the Under-17 squad and is one of four players on the roster born in 2007.



The Unionville, Conn. native most recently appeared with the U-16s in January for a camp in Tampa, Fla. following his first appearance with the U-16s in the Football Federations Cup in Albur, Spain. Miller's first national team call-up came in February 2022 for a U-15 training camp in Chula Vista, Calif.

The defender became the youngest player in Revolution II history to make his professional debut with New England's second team on March 26. Miller has since made four starts in MLS NEXT Pro, recording one assist across 342 minutes played, helping Revolution II to a 3-1-0 record through the team's first four matches of the season.

Clint Peay is in his fourth season as the first head coach of Revolution II, the New England Revolution's developmental side that began play in USL League One in 2020, following his appointment to the position on Nov. 20, 2019. Peay brings more than 18 years of coaching experience to the club with a focus on youth player development including an eight-year tenure working in the U.S. Youth National Team program and 10 years as a collegiate head coach and assistant.

Peay spent the 2019 season as an assistant coach with USL Championship side North Carolina FC, where he worked alongside Dave Sarachan and helped guide the club to an Eastern Conference playoff berth. An experienced scout and evaluator of up-and-coming talent, Peay worked on U.S. Soccer's technical staff from 2012-19, beginning as a member of the Under-17 staff. He was later named head coach of the U-14 Boys' National Team in 2016, before advancing to manage the U-15 Boys' National Team in 2018, where he succeeded current Revolution Assistant Coach Dave van den

Bergh in that role.

Prior to joining U.S. Soccer, Peay built his resume over four coaching stints at the collegiate level, including four seasons as head coach at Richmond University from 2009-12. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Georgetown University in 2003, before moving on to Davidson College from 2004-07, where he helped the Wildcats to back-to-back appearances in the conference final in his first two seasons. He later worked as an assistant coach with George Mason in 2008, helping guide the Patriots to the Colonial Athletic Association conference title in 2008.

A proven winner at the game's highest levels, Peay enjoyed a decorated playing career spanning a decade from his collegiate days at the University of Virginia (1991-95) through five MLS seasons with D.C. United (1996-2000).

MARCELO SANTOS

Marcelo Santos is in his fourth season as assistant coach of Revolution II and his fourth with the club, having spent 2018-19 as a head coach in the New England Revolution Academy. 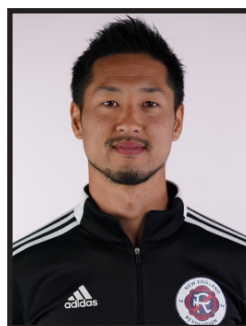

Yuta Nomura is in his fourth season as the goalkeeper coach for Revolution II, the New England Revolution's developmental side, following his appointment to the position on Feb. 3, 2020. Nomura spent the 2017-19 seasons tutoring goalkeepers on the coaching staff at the University of Central Arkansas in NCAA Division I.

In Nomura's first season at Central Arkansas, he was part of a coaching staff that collectively won the Missouri Valley Conference Coaching Staff of the Year award. Central Arkansas finished 8-6-4 overall in 2018, including 4-1-1 in conference play. Nomura helped guide UCA to a 2018 Missouri Valley Conference title and a berth in the D-I NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament. After switching to the Sun Belt Conference in 2019, Nomura stayed on staff to help guide the Bears to a Sun Belt Conference regular season title with a 4-1 league record and a 10-7-1 finish overall.

Prior to his coaching days, the native of Tokyo, Japan spent parts of two seasons playing professionally in Sweden for BK Olympic, based out of Malmö, from 2017-18. In his first season, he helped lead the club to promotion back to the Västra Götaland followed by a ninth-place finish in Tier 4 for the 2018 season.

Nomura played collegiately for NAIA school Lindsey Wilson College in Columbia, Kentucky where he majored in communications. As a freshman in 2011, Nomura started all 23 games for the Blue Raiders, leading the team to an NAIA National Title and an undefeated season. That year, he set career-highs in save percentage (.838), shutouts (14), goals allowed (12), and saves (62).

CURT ONALFO

TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is entering his fifth season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy, and the scouting department.

Since arriving in New England, Onalfo spearheaded the launch of Revolution II ahead of its inaugural season in USL League One in 2020, elevating the club's player development process by providing a fully defined pathway from the Academy to the professional ranks, facilitating growth through higher-level competition and a professional structure. In its three seasons, Revolution II paved the way for 42 players to make their professional soccer debuts, including 25 current and former Revolution Academy members.

Onalfo has overseen a renaissance in the club's Academy following the establishment of the new MLS NEXT Academy league. In two seasons, the Revolution Under-15 team reached the 2021 MLS NEXT Cup Quarterfinals and the Revolution Under-19 side won the 2022 MLS NEXT Cup National Championship. In addition, eight Revolution Academy players have signed directly to Revolution II and three additional players have been inked to Homegrown Player contracts with the first team side.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. Product brings his experience to the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. He owns 13 years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017).

While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 51, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring as a defender at Ridgefield High School in Connecticut, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons as a defender with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.

**BRUCE ARENA****SPORTING DIRECTOR**

Bruce Arena is in his fifth season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first four seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has led the side to three MLS Cup Playoff appearances. His .601 winning percentage with New England entering 2022 is the best of any manager in the club's history. In 2021, Arena won his record fourth Supporters' Shield, the first in Revolution history, after guiding the team to 22 wins, 73 points, and 2.15 points per game – all MLS records. For his efforts, Arena was awarded with his league-leading fourth MLS Coach of the Year honor.

In 2022, Arena became the all-time winningest head coach in MLS history. New England's victory on March 5, 2022 gave Arena his 241st career victory in MLS regular season play, surpassing Sigi Schmid for the most in league history. Arena reached 250 career wins on October 1, 2022, the first coach in the history of MLS to do so.

In 2020, his first full season in New England, Arena led the Revolution to the Eastern Conference Final. Arena's impact in New England was immediately evident upon his arrival in Foxborough. Arena made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games at the helm and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club. The team's historic renaissance came despite Arena only making one in-season addition to the roster, bringing in Argentine striker Gustavo Bou via a club-record transfer in July.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, four Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 16 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With 285 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS entering the 2022 season, and a regular season record of 250-147-124 (.598), Arena is the league's all-time winningest head coach and owns the best winning percentage in MLS history. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 55 (35-13-7), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 71, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup – the country's best showing since 1930 – as well an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Following the 1998 FIFA Men's World Cup in France, the United States Soccer Federation turned to Arena, who helped the team qualify for the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup. In the tournament, Arena's team recorded an impressive win over powerhouse Portugal and topped Mexico, 2-0, in the Round of 16 en route to the nation's first appearance in the Quarterfinals in a 72-year span. That same year, Arena led the USMNT to the Concacaf Gold Cup title, one of his three triumphs in the competition. In 2005, Arena won his second Concacaf Gold Cup ahead of the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup in Germany. In the 2006 tournament, the United States earned a 1-1 draw against Italy, but a 2-1 defeat to Ghana sent the USMNT home early.

The next season, Arena took charge of the New York Red Bulls, where he spent the end of the 2006 season and all of the 2007 campaign. In 2008, Arena joined the LA Galaxy for what would be an incredible nine-year tenure that included three MLS Cups in a four-year span and two Supporters' Shields in 2010 and 2011. Following his decorated career with the Galaxy, Arena rejoined the U.S. Men's National Team in November 2016. In his second run as head coach, he lost only two out of 18 games at the helm, though the United States fell short of qualification for the 2018 FIFA Men's World Cup. A 2010 National Soccer Hall of Fame inductee, Arena was named the 2015 Werner Fricker Builder Award recipient, earning U.S. Soccer's highest honor for his more than 40 years of service to the game.

A talented lacrosse player, Arena grew up on Long Island and would go on to attend Nassau Community College, where he played both lacrosse and soccer. Arena then transferred to Cornell University in 1971, where as a goalkeeper, he led his team to the 1972 NCAA College Cup Final Four and earned the tournament's Most Valuable Defensive Player award. During the 1973 season, Arena contributed as an assistant coach with Cornell, before then accepting a head coaching position at the University of Puget Sound.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16 and is now an assistant coach with FC Cincinnati.

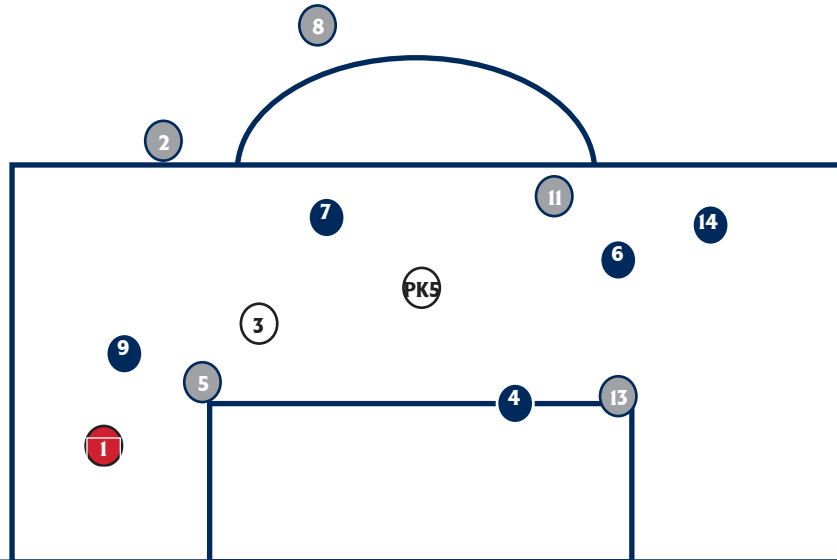
