LAST MEETING vs. METROSTARS:

Burn 3, MetroStars 0 August 11, 2001 @ Cotton Bowl

Burn forward Antonio Martinez set a team record for assists in a game with three and goalkeeper Matt Jordan registered his league-leading eighth shutout of the year as the Burn (8-9-4, 28 points) blanked the NY/NJ MetroStars, 3-0, August 11, 2001 at the Cotton Bowl. Dallas struck first in the 25th minute following a beautiful run by Antonio Martinez. Martinez received a ball from Chad Deering at midfield and worked his way down the left sideline. Nearing the touchline, Martinez cut the ball into the box, hitting Joselito Vaca in stride eight yards from goal. Vaca took one touch before slotting the ball to the lower left corner of the goal. The Burn would double the lead in the 34th minute off of a corner kick. Martinez played a short corner to Oscar Pareja with Pareja sending the ball back to Martinez. Martinez then sent a cross into the box with Jason Kreis snapping a header into the lower right corner of the goal. The Burn's fortunes improved even more in the 39th minute as Metros defender Mike Petke was ejected after receiving his second yellow card of the match. Dallas tallied its third goal of the match in the 74th minute with Martinez again taking a ball from midfield and dribbling deep into the Metros' half of the field. He then sent a through ball onto the left side of the field for a breaking Eddie Johnson. Johnson cut the ball back to his right, beating the defender, before unleashing a right-footer into the lower left corner of the goal for the final 3-0 score.

LAST GAME RESET:

Burn 1, Wizards 1 April 27, 2002 @ Cotton Bowl

Despite playing with a man advantage for the final 38 minutes of the match, the Burn settled for a 1-1 draw with the Kansas City Wizards last Saturday at the Cotton Bowl. The Wizards took a 1-0 lead in the 15th minute on a clinical through ball from Preki. From his own half of the field, Preki sent a long through ball to Chris Klein streaking down the right flank. Klein outran Oscar Pareja and broke in one-on-one with Burn 'keeper Matt Jordan. With Jordan charging off of his line to cut the angle, Klein kissed the ball off the right post and into the goal. Dallas evened the game in the 52nd minute on Jason Kreis' fourth goal in as many games after Wizards defender Matt McKeon dragged Pareja down 22-yards from goal. Kreis sent the ensuing free kick through the right side of the wall and into the net for his fourth goal of the season. The Burn's fortunes improved even more in the 62nd minute as Wizards midfielder Kerry Zavagnin was red-carded for a tackle on Jorge Rodriguez. Dallas' best opportunity at the game-winner came six minutes later as Kreis received the ball at the top of the box and noticed Tony Meola cheating off of his line. Kreis sent a left-footed chip that caromed off of the crossbar and was corralled by Meola, denying the Burn their second victory of the season.

LAST MEETING vs. REVOLUTION:

Burn 1, Revolution 5 August 4, 2001 @ Foxboro Stadium

The Dallas Burn suffered one of its worst losses of the year, dropping a 5-1 decision to the New England Revolution last August at Foxboro Stadium. Dallas conceded three of the five goals in the final 14 minutes of the match following the ejection of Justin Evans for receiving two yellow cards. New England tallied the first goal of the match in the ninth minute as William Sunsing received a throughball about 35 yards from goal and proceeded to dribble through three Burn defenders before burying the ball into the lower left corner of the goal. With just seconds remaining in the first half, New England broke through for the second goal of the game. In the third and final minute of stoppage time, Cate sent a through ball to Ted Chronopoulos at the top of the box. With Jordan charging off of his line, Chronopoulos chipped the ball past a diving Jordan, with the ball hitting the underside of the crossbar and falling behind the goal line. Any hopes of a Burn second half comeback were thwarted in the 70th minute when Evans was ejected from the match after receiving his second yellow card. New England wasted little time in capitalizing on the man-advantage, netting their third goal in the 76th minute. An errant header by Eric Dade fell to Cate 25 yards from goal. Cate vollied the ball to Matt Okoh at the top of the box with Okoh blasting the ball down the center of the goal. After the Revolution netted the game-clinching third goal, the flood gates opened and the Revs added insurance goals in the 79th minute by Cate and by Chronopoulos in the in the 81st minute. Dallas did finally tally in the 86th minute as Aleksey Korol converted a Graziani cross for the final 5-1 score line.

MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES:

BURN AT METROSTARS TONIGHT ON 1190 AM

The Burn will hit the road for only the second time this season as they travel to New Jersey to face the MetroStars at 7:00 p.m. (CT) at Giants Stadium. Tonight's game will be broadcast on Fox Sports 1190 AM with Glenn Davis providing play-by-play.

THE SERIES

The overall series between the Burn and the MetroStars is tied at seven games apiece...both teams hold a 4-3 edge in home games...including the 2000 playoffs, the Burn has currently lost three straight matches at Giants Stadium...all four road losses to the Metros have been by one goal...Dallas won the most recent meeting, 3-0, last August at the Cotton Bowl...Jason Kreis has enjoyed the most success against the Metros, tallying eight goals and four assists for 20 points in 14 matches.

BURN CARRIES FOUR-GAME UNBEATEN STREAK INTO TONIGHT'S MATCH

After dropping the season opener 2-0 at home to San Jose, the Burn has since compiled a four-game unbeaten streak (1-0-3). The unbeaten streak is the team's longest unbeaten streak since a five-game unbeaten streak to end the 1999 season. Their current record of 1-1-3 represents the fewest losses through five games in team history.

KREIS CONTINUES SCORING TEAR

With a goal last Saturday vs. Kansas City, forward Jason Kreis has now tallied a goal in four consecutive games, one game shy of the team record set by Damian in 1997 and Kreis in 2000. He is now just three points shy of becoming the third player in league history to amass 200 career points. Kreis has accounted for four of the Burn's five goals this season.

BURN ATTENDANCE CONTINUES UPSWING

With 14,065 fans in attendance at last Saturday's game, the Burn is currently averaging 13,808 fans through four home games. The 13,808 average is 10% ahead of last year's regular season average and the highest average after the first four home games since 1996.

FIRST HALF WOES

Five games into the 2002 season, the Burn has yet to register a first half goal. Fortunately for Dallas, the opposition has not lit it up in the first half either, amassing just three first half goals. The Burn has been outshot 39-24 in the first half this season.

COMEBACK KIDS

The Burn has conceded the first goal in four of their five matches this season. They have lost only one of those matches, compiling a 1-1-2 record when allowing the first goal. Last season, the team was only 2-7-2 when allowing the first goal of the match.

BURN'S NEW AND IMPROVED DEFENSE COMING TOGETHER

One of the biggest question marks surrounding the Burn as they entered the 2002 season was just how long it would take the revamped defense to gel. Five games into the season, the results have been favorable. In the first five games, the Burn has conceded only six goals for a 1.13 goals-against average. At this point last year the Burn had conceded ten goals through the first five games en route to a 1.81 goals-against average for the year, the second-worst goals-against total in team history.

INTERNATIONAL BURN

The 2002 Burn squad features the most international mix of players in the team's history. In all, the Burn roster lists players born in ten different countries: Bolivia (Joselito Vaca), Canada (Josue Mayard), Colombia (Oscar Pareja), El Salvador (Ronald Cerritos and Jorge Rodriguez), Liberia (Chris Gbandi), Mexico (Antonio Martinez), Northern Ireland (Steve Morrow), South Africa (Richard Farrer), Uganda (Tenywa Bonseu) and the United States.
