### Last Meeting: Perkins's Shutout Earns Full Marks for Black-and-Red

FOXBORO, MA (May 29, 2004) – Taylor Twellman endured a rough night, missing a second-half penalty kick before being injured as D.C. United took advantage of an early own goal to record a 1-0 victory against the New England Revolution on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium.

Revolution defender Brian Kamler turned a low cross into his own goal after just five minutes, then in the second half, Twellman saw his goal-scoring drought when he pushed his penalty wide though United rookie goalkeeper Troy Perkins guessed correctly with his dive.

Things went from bad to worse for the New England striker later in the match when he was taken from the field with a strained right hamstring. He was diagnosed after the game, and his status will be re-evaluated by the team's medical staff within the next two days.

United had a terrific opportunity to get on the board inside the first minute. Ronald Cerritos got in behind the Revolution back line and raced in alone, New England goalkeeper Matt Reis racing out of his box to challenge. Cerritos touched the ball past the Rev keeper before the two went down, but there was no call and the New England defense cleared.

But they received a dose of good fortune just a few minutes later. A cross-field pass that should have been dealt with by Revolution defender Marshall Leonard fell to Earnie Stewart on the right flank, and he sent in a low uncontested cross. But Kamler left his goalkeeper helpless when he turned the ball into his own goal from close range.

Twellman, who hasn't scored a goal for the Revolution since April 17, the longest such stretch in his career, almost put the home side on the board in the seventh minute. He played a clever give-and-go with strike-partner Pat Noonan before nutmegging defender Mike Petke, but his shot rolled wide.

Rookie sensation Freddy Adu made a darting run into the Revolution box in the 18th minute after collecting a pass from Bobby Convey, who returned to action after missing three games with a left hamstring injury. But Adu's shot from a tight angle on the left side, was smothered by Reis.

Adu then had a second chance 10 minutes later on the counter, again created by Convey, but his 20-yard shot skipped harmlessly past the right post. New England's best chance of the half came through rookie midfielder Clint Dempsey, who got up well for a clear header on a Jose Cancela freekick from the left, but his shot went over the bar.

United nearly went into the locker room with a two-goal advantage after they almost capitalized on a mistake by the Revolution defense, Stewart winning possession before finding Olsen with a quick pass, but his shot didn't have enough pace to beat Reis.

Five minutes after the break New England had a golden opportunity to draw level. Steve Ralston raced into the area and second-half sub David Stokes stepped in front of him and forced him to the ground, leaving referee Kevin Terry no choice but to point to the spot.

Twellman took on the responsibility of the penalty kick and struck a good effort, but Perkins flung himself to his left and would have had the shot covered had it not clipped the outside of the post as it sailed wide.

Perkins again denied Twellman at the 60-minute mark with a shot from outside the area to preserve the clean sheet. By the end of his night, he saw his scoreless streak extended to 561 minutes.

Twellman's misery was then compounded when he limped off the field with a hamstring injury midway through the second half, trying to chase down a ball deep in United territory when he came up lame and grasped his right leg.

Gros, who scored his first professional goal last Saturday, almost added to his MLS account in the 72nd minute. A streaking run by second-half sub Alecko Eskandarian created the chance, but Gros' strike to the near post was knocked away by Reis for a corner kick.

The Revolution had one final quality chance and it again fell to Dempsey, off a knockdown header from Noonan, but his attempt sailed into the outside of the goal, and United escaped with their first victory on their travels this season, coming back after losing twice in four days last week.

### Last Match: Dominant United Calms Rapids

WASHINGTON, D.C. (August 7, 2004) – Two sides in dire need of a positive result met Wednesday night at RFK Stadium. D.C. United rose to the occasion, dominating possession and play to earn a 3-1 win against the Colorado Rapids and snapping a four-game winless streak.

United peppered the Rapids goal throughout the match, getting goals five minutes apart late in the first half from Freddy Adu and Earnie Stewart, before sealing the contest with an own goal that was all thanks to some Jaime Moreno brilliance.

From the outset United looked the hungrier. In the third minute some sweet one-touch passing opened up the Rapids right side with Josh Gros finding Dema Kovalenko open in the Rapids box,

but his curling shot spun wide of Joe Cannon's goal. Two minutes later, Gros blasted just high and wide after being set up by Adu, who was given his first start in several weeks.

Adu looked energetic in an attacking midfield role and played the full 90 minutes, another rarity for the teen phenomenon.

As they have all season, Colorado seemed content to surrender possession and bunker in. Tim Hankinson's side stacked numbers behind the ball and only ventured forth for the occasional counterattack or long-range effort. But the Rapids won their first corner in the seventh minute, a John Spencer header forcing a diving save from D.C. goalkeeper Troy Perkins.

Alecko Eskandarian started to show some danger signs in the Rapids defense, nearly poking home a Moreno layoff in the eighth minute as panic ensued, then forcing a diving save from Cannon in the 12th on a low blast that the veteran netminder did well to hold cleanly despite the wet pitch.

United continued to keep the Rapids on the back foot. Stewart's hard work on the left sprung Moreno, who ran at the defense before laying off to Adu, but his left-footed effort curled just over the crossbar. Then in the 23rd minute Ben Olsen woke up the crowd with a thunderous first-time strike from the top of the 18-yard box, but the shot caromed off a Rapids defender.

Nearing the half-hour mark, Olsen released Moreno on the left flank, and a goal seemed certain as the Bolivian carried the ball into the box and delicately lifted a cross to the back post. But Kovalenko's side-footed half-volley skipped wide of Cannon's right post.

In a rare foray upfield the Rapids nearly caught United's defense when Mark Chung's driven cross from the left wing seemed to startle Perkins, but Ezra Hendrickson rescued his 'keeper by clearing off the line. Then in the 35th minute, Colorado were again cursing their luck after Chung powered past Mike Petke and delivered to the far post, where an empty net beckoned for Henderson -- but to his dismay the veteran weakly scuffed the spinning ball over the crossbar.

United raced right back up the field and struck first blood. Collecting a loose ball on the left touchline, Gros saw Adu run into a huge hole in the Rapids defense and slid a low cross into his path. The youngster brought the crowd to life with a cool finish from just inside the penalty spot, notching his third goal of the season.

Five minutes later, Stewart doubled the lead with a composed, textbook finish from the corner of the penalty box, after Eskandarian had made space on the left and crossed to the far side.

The story was the same in the second stanza: United dominating possession and tormenting Cannon with shot after shot. Stewart's 50th-minute inswinging corner was headed down sharply by Hendrickson, but the dangerously skipping ball was blocked wide by Alberto Delgado.

Moments later, D.C. deserved a third tally when Adu floated out to the left wing and curled in a pinpoint cross for Moreno. But Cannon proved why many consider him to be the best 'keeper in MLS when he produced an impressive reaction save, palming away Moreno's flick when it seemed destined for the upper corner.

Eskandarian then tested the 'keeper twice in short order, first whizzing a measured drive just wide of the left post, then stinging Cannon's palms with a rising blast from distance. Colorado

was unable to clear and Moreno quickly found himself in his preferred position, with the ball at his feet, running at defenders.

The cagy striker bewitched two defenders, easing by Antonio de La Torre and nutmegging second-half sub Joey DiGiamarino before trying to slot a pass back into the area. But hard-charging Ritchie Kotschau got there first, unlucky to see the ball deflect off him and into his own net to give United a 3-0 lead after 64 minutes.

The Rapids finally pegged one back with an opportunistic strike nine minutes later. Brandon Prideaux turned the ball over deep in his own half and Delgado quickly centered to Chung, who slotted an inviting ball to Rapids captain John Spencer. The veteran Scotsman made no mistake with a confident shot into the upper right corner, scoring his first goal since the season opener against Dallas.

### Series History: 19-13-1

D.C. United holds a six game edge in the overall series against New England, and a +9 (51 for, 42 against) goal differential. The end of overtime comes as a blessing for United, as the Black-and-Red were unsuccessful in three tries to capture full points from the Revs in the added frame, earning a single point only once.

An own goal from Brian Kamler gifted the win to United on the Black-and-Red's last trip to the friendly New England countryside, the reception. The Revolution and United have split points, with the visitors from the nation's capital holding a 8-9-0 record and a goal differential of -1 (17 for, 18 against). The Black-and-Red have been more antagonistic on East Capitol Street, with an 11-4-1 edge over the Revs.

### A Year Ago Today

At the 20 game mark in 2003, D.C. United sat in third place in the Eastern Conference with a 7-7-6 record and 27 points. The Black-and-Red returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2000, collecting 12 points from their final 10 matches. 2004 marked United's strongest position at the halfway mark of the season since 1999, when they led the Eastern Conference from wire to wire en route to their third MLS Cup title and second Supporter's Shield.

### Mama's Home Cooking?

The friendly confines of RFK Stadium have certainly been good to the Black-and-Red in 2004. D.C. United sits atop the league with a 5-2-3 home record, with a +7 goal differential (19 for, 12 against). United hasn't lost a home match since May 19<sup>th</sup>, and carry a +8 (12 for, 4 against) in that five game stretch.

### Season Accolades

D.C. United have been much appreciated by their fans and peers during 2004. Forward Jaime Moreno was elected to the starting XI for the Eastern Conference All-Stars, the third starting nod of his career. Defender Ryan Nelsen was also elected to the starting XI, but was forced to miss due to injury. Ben Olsen, Alecko Eskandarian, Dima Kovalenko and Freddy Adu were all named to the East squad as well, along with Bobby Convey, who transferred to Reading FC before the mid-season break. United's six representatives were the most of any single team in the East, and tied with Los Angeles for most league-wide.

Eskandarian has been the most lauded member of the Black-and-Red in 2004, collecting his third Sierra Mist Goal of the Week honor for Week 14, United's sixth on the year. He adds the honor to his resume alongside his Player of the Week recognition for week 12. In addition to the weekly honors, Eskandarian sits atop the league in game-winning goals (three) and multi-goal games (two).

Moreno has also been busy on the honors sheet, earning MLS Player of the Week for his performance against San Jose in United's league opener and claiming Goal of the Week for week seven.

### Iron Man Football

Wednesday's match against Colorado marked the first time Brian Carroll was not in the starting lineup for D.C. United. Carroll missed his first minutes on the 2004 season, but entered the game as a 48<sup>th</sup>-minute substitute for Ben Olsen.

In 2003, the West Springfield, VA native didn't make a single appearance in League play for United, seeing only limited action in United's U.S. Open Cup run.

### Spotless?

To date, D.C. United is the only team yet to earn a penalty kick. The MetroStars lead the league, having earned six spot kicks, converting all six. On the flip side, United has had the most penalty kicks called against them – four. However, the Black-and-Red have only given up

three goals from the spot. Taylor Twellman missed his opportunity wide to the left, although GK Troy Perkins easily had the bid covered.

### Thank You Sir, May I Have Another?

United also leads in another category – own goals received. The Black-and-Red received another gift from the Rapids on Wednesday night, as Of the five own goals scored in 2004, United has received three – the first courtesy of Brian Kamler knocking in an Earnie Stewart cross, and the second as a Cory Gibbs tap-in of a Freddy Adu cross.

### Mix It Up

Through the 2004 season, D.C. United has fielded the same first XI in back-to-back matches only once. In United's May 1<sup>st</sup> and May 8<sup>th</sup> matches, 1-1 draws in San Jose and against Columbus respectively, Head Coach Peter Nowak earmarked the same starting lineup. The similarity was continued throughout the match, as in both matches Joshua Gros came on for Bobby Convey (SJ-86', CLB-27') and Alecko Eskandarian substituted Freddy Adu (SJ-78', CLB-60').

### A Long Time Coming

Today's match marks the first time that New England sets foot on East Capitol Street in 2004, more than a year since their last visit. In a strange quirk of scheduling, the Black-and-Red have finished their season series with four of the five Western Conference teams before hosting all of their Eastern Conference foes.

United will close out the 2004 season in firm control of their playoff destiny, facing opponents from the east in nine of their 10 remaining matches. The Dallas Burn (Sept. 11) are the only team from the West that United will face during the final third of the season.

### Staying on Target

In United's 20 League games this season, they have averaged just over 50% accuracy – 129 SOG from 256 shots (50.39% accuracy). The magic number for victory is 50%. United has averaged 54.76% accuracy (46 SOG from 84 shots) in the team's six victories. Ironically, the Black-and-Red's best shooting performance ended in a loss for United, as the team was a perfect 4-for-4 against San Jose on August 7<sup>th</sup>. Excluding that match, accuracy in losses is 48.42% (46 SOG from 95 shots). United have missed most when matches have ended on equal footing, suffering to a 45.206% average – 33 SOG from 73 shots.

The trend has even continued in friendlies. In United's 2-1 defeat of Rochester earlier this year, the Black-and-Red sent five of seven shots on frame, but could only muster nine of 22 shots on goal in a regulation tie with Nottingham Forest.

### Jump Right In

United's newest signing, Nana Kuffour, made an immediate impact for the Black-and-Red. Four minutes after making his D.C. United debut, the Ghanaian found himself on the end of a Freddy Adu corner kick. He put the ball into the back of the net, tallying the only strike in United's 2-1 U.S. Open Cup loss to Richmond.

### Roster Moves

D.C. United has again called up goalkeeper Andrew Terris for Saturday night's game with the New England Revolution. Terris, a 2002 graduate of Stanford University, is currently under contract to Major League Soccer as part of the goalkeeper pool and available for assignment to League teams. He was called to action with the Black-and-Red for last Saturday's match in San Jose and Wednesday's match against Colorado, but he was not summoned from the substitutes bench in either game.

## Head Coach Peter Nowak

Peter Nowak's reign as United's fourth Head Coach in club history became official with his signed contract on January 7, 2004. Nowak, 39, begins his coaching career with Major League Soccer's most decorated franchise following an illustrious professional playing career of nearly 23 years. After captaining the Chicago Fire for five seasons, he accepted a position in the club's front office for the 2003 campaign. In his role as the Director of International Relations and Soccer and Business Adviser, Nowak worked closely with nearly all of the club's departments, including the coaching staff, youth player development, community relations, broadcasting and marketing.

His five years on the field for the Fire made him a fan favorite not only in Chicago, but around the entire league. During his half-decade playing career in MLS, Nowak accumulated 100 points on 26 goals and 48 assists. He led the expansion Fire to an MLS Cup championship in 1998 and U.S. Open Cup titles in 1998, 2000 and 2001. Three times each, he was an MLS All-Star (1998, 1999, 2000), a member of the MLS Pepsi Best XI (1998, 2000, 2001) and the Fire's MVP (1998, 2000, 2001). Nowak was also selected as the MVP of MLS Cup 1998.

Nowak's success in MLS surprised very few who were familiar with his prior performances in Europe. Before coming to America, the native of Pabianice, Poland, saw action in 116 games in the German Bundesliga. During his five years in Germany, Nowak lent his services to such world-renowned clubs as 1860 Munich (1994-1997), Kaiserslautern (1994) and Dynamo Dresden (1993-1994). He scored a combined 17 goals in Germany's top league.

Prior to his time in Germany, Nowak also was a member of Switzerland's Young Boys Berne (1992-1993) and Turkey's Bakirkoyspor (1990-1992). He began his career with his hometown team in Pabianice in 1979 as a 15-year-old and played with four teams in Poland before moving to Turkey. Nowak's Polish clubs, in addition to Pabianice (1979-1983) included Motor Lublin (1984-1985), Widzew Lodz (1985-1986) and WKS Zawisza Bydgoszcz (1983-1984 and 1986-1990).

Nowak's myriad of successes at the club level led to a distinguished international career as well. He was the captain of the Poland National Team for three years and was named Poland's Player of the Year in 1996. In 24 appearances for his country, Nowak scored three goals.

With United leading the pack at the midpoint of the 2004 season, Nowak was selected to coach the Eastern Conference All-Stars in the 2004 Sierra Mist All-Star Game. He pulled double duty for the July 31<sup>st</sup> match, as he was also chosen to play in a Celebration Game commemorating stars of the 2004 FIFA World Cup who also enjoyed playing success in Major League Soccer.
