After eleven home games, United's average attendance is 17,301, trailing only Los Angeles and besting the league average by 2,200. The Black-and-Red roadshow is outpacing the league average by more than 7,000, more than 4,000 ahead of nearest competitors Colorado.

Last Meeting: Pair of "Beauties" From Eskandarian Busts Crew's Unbeaten Streak
 WASHINGTON, DC (June 19, 2004) – D.C. United scored three goals in the first half, including a pair of beauties from forward Alecko Eskandarian, and comfortably defeated the visiting Columbus Crew 3-1 on Saturday night at RFK Stadium, the Crew seeing their seven-match unbeaten streak come to an end.

Jaime Moreno got things going early with a tap-in from six yards and Eskandarian took care of the rest, looping a beautiful volley inside the back post and curling a free kick over the wall and into the corner to lead United to their fourth win of the season.

United came out blazing and put Columbus on the back foot from the start, Dema Kovalenko showing the home side's intentions early when his shot came back off the goalpost.

But it took only six minutes for United to take the lead, when Moreno poked home a low cross from strike-partner Ronald Cerritos from six yards out, after he was picked out on the left on a fine pass from Brian Carroll, his first professional point.

United goalkeeper Troy Perkins made two great saves to keep the home side in front. Just before the half-hour mark, Crew forward Jeff Cunningham -- who came into the match with a four-game goal-scoring streak -- got on the end of a long free kick into the box and had a shot on goal that Perkins knocked onto his crossbar and over the top. On the ensuing set piece, Perkins swatted away a goal-bound header with a great one-handed save. Three minutes later Columbus had another corner that Chad Marshall got on the end of, but he pushed his header wide of the right post.

Eskandarian's double then came in the space of twelve minutes, the first of which once again showed United's fine passing cohesion.

Eskandarian made a run up the left flank and laid the ball off to Kovalenko, who then made a quick pass to Moreno. He flicked the ball into the air past a defender and into Eskandarian's path just inside the left corner of the box, where the second-year striker's left-footed volley gave Crew 'keeper Jon Busch no chance as it flew in inside the back post.

Eskandarian's second on the night came after Cerritos was fouled at the top of the box and Eskandarian was given the responsibility of hitting the free kick. He hit an absolute world-class strike, lacing a left-footed curler over the wall and inside Busch's left-hand post.

Just before the half Marshall had appeared to have pulled a goal back for Columbus, but it was ruled out when Marshall was adjudged to have pushed defender Mike Petke in the back before heading home.

With a comfortable lead, United came out for the second half looking for even more. Five minutes after the restart Cerritos went for a spectacular finish, hitting a bicycle kick after Moreno had crossed the ball over his head to the back post, but hit it right at Busch. Then in the 55th minute Kovalenko came in to clean up a mess inside the Crew penalty area and smashed a shot against the left post.

Freddy Adu entered for the final minutes of the match and made a dangerous run towards the Columbus net against three Crew defenders. Robin Fraser wasn't fooled by the youngster's moves and was on hand to snuff his shot and keep the 15-year-old off the scoresheet.

Manny Lagos got the Crew their only goal of the game just before the final whistle to close the gap to 3-1, but the visitors still suffered their first defeat since April 24.

Last Match: Moreno Strikes for a Pair, United Settles for Draw

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Under the daunting skies of tropical storm Charley, D.C. United and the New England Revolution slogged out a tense 2-2 draw Saturday night in a physical Eastern Conference meeting at RFK Stadium.

United will feel unlucky not to have secured a crucial victory after dominating possession and playing more attractive soccer, but as they have so many times before, Steve Nicol's Revs came up with a dogged, workmanlike performance to steal a draw in the dying moments.

Jaime Moreno continued his inspiring revival with a two-goal performance, but goals from Steve Ralston and Andy Dorman secured a valuable point for the Revs, who remain just two points back of D.C. in the Eastern Conference standings.

United controlled possession in the early going, stringing together fluid combination play despite the soggy pitch, but in the seventh minute New England's Taylor Twellman worked hard to maintain possession in the box, setting up José Cancela. The Uruguayan playmaker laid off an inviting ball for Bryan Kamler, but the midfielder slapped his shot wide.

In his first game back from one-game suspension, D.C. defender Bryan Namoff overcame a frightening two-footed slide tackle from Marshall Leonard in the ninth minute. Namoff carried the ball into the New England box before dishing to Alecko Eskandarian, but the second-year forward could only scuff his shot wide.

The sloppy conditions were any goalkeeper's nightmare, as displayed by Troy Perkins' unsure reaction to an early Revs free kick that skipped though the six-yard box uncontested, spinning just wide of the D.C. goal.

In the 17th minute, off a free kick from the left wing, Cancela sent a dangerous service into the box that Perkins did well to punch clear. At the other end, Josh Gros was running rampant on United's left flank, but most of his crosses failed to connect with a teammate.

Four minute later, Earnie Stewart sent a towering corner kick to the far post, where big defender Ezra Hendrickson got his head onto the ball and flicked it across the face of goal. Gros found himself in scoring position but his volley sailed high over the crossbar.

In the 24th minute, desperate defending from United denied the Revs a goal after Pat Noonan beat Dema Kovalenko to a poorly hit square ball and carried into the D.C. box.

Noonan's centering pass looked like an easy finish for Twellman, but Brandon Prideaux slid in and blocked the shot from point-blank range. The RFK Stadium crowd was on the edge of its seats as the ball ricocheted around the box before the Black-and-Red could finally clear.

At the half-hour mark, Gros found space on the left side again, cutting inside and unleashing a drive from the edge of the New England box, but Matt Reis was perfectly positioned to gobble up the shot.

Three minutes later, Eskandarian thought he had netted his seventh goal of the year after stroking home Kovalenko's cross, but the assistant referee's flag was up for offside, much to the displeasure of the United faithful.

In the 38th minute, Revs veteran Steve Ralston gave his team a surprise lead with a classy finish. After Noonan carried the ball to the endline and centered, Ralston stepped around a sliding Stewart, then juked Ben Olsen and hit side netting from 12 yards out. A diving Perkins got a hand to the shot, but was unable to keep it out.

But United struck back immediately, gaining a well-deserved equalizer from Moreno. Gros pressured Heaps, preventing the Revs defender from clearing Kovalenko's cross, and the ball bounced around the box before falling to Moreno at the six-yard box. The Bolivian feinted and cut around a defender before slotting home from close range.

United was clearly the better side in the first half, but their season-long inability to take control of matches would come back to haunt them again.

Nicol must have given his team some inspiring words at halftime, because New England came out with renewed energy and purpose in the second stanza.

The Revs immediately pressured D.C.'s back line, and in the 48th minute, Perkins made his first save of the game with an acrobatic denial of Noonan from close range. The rookie keeper then came up big again moments later when he blocked a charging Twellman at the near post.

D.C. finally gained the lead in the 56th minute with more elegant play from Moreno.

Kovalenko had ample time in midfield to spot several gaping holes in the New England back line, and he placed a beautiful through ball into one of them to spring the Bolivian. The United veteran dribbled into the box and cut around the sprawling Reis, then patiently waited for the onrushing Ralston to slide past before finishing into an empty net.

In the 66th minute, Hendrickson preserved D.C.'s lead with a sprawling block of Shalrie Joseph's close-range shot off a New England corner kick, as United's ongoing inability to handle the Revs on set pieces continued to hamper their defensive efforts.

Nicol rolled the dice with a double substitution in the 68th minute, inserting Richie Baker and Felix Brilliant in search of an equalizer. D.C. coach Peter Nowak responded in kind with a defensive sub, bringing Mike Petke on in place of Eskandarian.

Freddy Adu's steadily increasing confidence was displayed in the 71st minute as he took off on a solo run at the Revs defense, forcing a hard foul from Rusty Pierce that earned the defender a yellow card. Adu also took the resulting free kick, hitting a swerving shot that glanced off the New England wall for a corner kick.

On the corner, Moreno was narrowly denied a hat trick as he rose to nod a header on goal, but Reis was on hand to grab the shot safely.

Olsen, showing his usual commitment and passion in the center of midfield, was harshly penalized for a sliding challenge on Ralston, and was further surprised to see a yellow card come out of Toledo's pocket in the 79th.

Moments later, Hendrickson made a marauding run out of defense, charging at Pierce before laying off a delicate pass for Stewart, who fired a disappointing shot into the outside netting of the goal.

In the 85th minute, another New England corner kick created more chaos in the United box, as Joseph knocked down the ball and set up Andy Dorman for a one-time finish into the left corner. Dorman, who had come on as New England's final sub only moments before, stunned the crowd with his second goal of the season.

Momentum had clearly swung to New England's side, and almost immediately, Noonan collected the ball on the left wing and cut back on Petke before striking a rising shot towards the far post, forcing Perkins to lay out and palm the ball wide.

DC breathed a sigh of relief in injury time, when Hendrickson was caught out by a long ball to Noonan, who drew Perkins out before chipping just wide of the right post.

But when the final whistle blew, the Revs were more than happy to have stolen a draw in difficult circumstances, while United will ponder their misfortune at watching another victory slip through their grasp.

D.C. United holds a four-game edge in the all-time series between the two teams, and have never been below .500. United captured three of the first four season series between the teams, but has struggled of late. United dropped the 2003 series, 1-2-1, including a 3-2 overtime loss on October 19th. The Black-and-Red opened the 2004 campaign in fine form with a 1-1 draw in May, and followed it up with a 3-1 thrashing of the Crew on June 19th.

United will look to continue their success against the Crew this year in the face of a dismal record in Major League Soccer's first soccer-specific stadium. Since taking both road matches from the Crew in 1999, United has failed to capture full points from Crew Stadium in six straight matches. The Black-and-Red have only managed three goals over that stretch, leading to an 0-4-2 record.

A Year Ago Today

At the 21 game mark in 2003, D.C. United sat in third place in the Eastern Conference with a 7-8-6 record and 27 points. The Black-and-Red returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2000, collecting 12 points from their final nine matches. 2004 marked United's strongest position at the halfway mark of the season since 1999, when they led the Eastern Conference from wire to wire en route to their third MLS Cup title and second Supporter's Shield.

Season Accolades

D.C. United continues to earn the appreciation of their fans and peers for the 2004 campaign. Jaime Moreno was named MLS Player of the Week for Week 20. Moreno was involved in three of United's five goals, calmly potting a pair against New England to follow up the own goal he created off Ritchie Kotschau in the midweek. It is the second nod for Moreno on the 2004 campaign, and the third for a member of the Black-and-Red. He was also named to the starting lineup for the 2004 MLS All-Star Game and has tallied a Goal of the Week-worthy strike (Week 7) as well.

Alecko Eskandarian still remains the most-lauled member of the Black-and-Red, having earned three Sierra Goal of the Week selections to go along with his Player of the Week nod in week 12.

Spotless?

To date, D.C. United is the only team yet to earn a penalty kick. The MetroStars lead the league, having earned six spot kicks, converting all six. On the flip side, United has had the most penalty kicks called against them – four. However, the Black-and-Red have only given up three goals from the spot. Taylor Twellman missed his opportunity wide to the left, although GK Troy Perkins easily had the bid covered.

Thank You Sir, May I Have Another?

United also leads in another category – own goals received. The Black-and-Red received another gift from the Rapids, as Ritchie Kotschau deflected Jaime Moreno's cross past Joe Cannon. Of the five own goals scored in 2004, United has received three – the first courtesy of Brian Kamler knocking in an Earnie Stewart cross, and the second a Cory Gibbs tap-in of a Freddy Adu cross.

Mix It Up

Through the 2004 season, D.C. United has fielded the same first XI in back-to-back matches only once. In United's May 1st and May 8th

matches, 1-1 draws in San Jose and against Columbus respectively, Head Coach Peter Nowak earmarked the same starting lineup. The similarity was continued throughout the match, as in both matches Joshua Gros came on for Bobby Convey (SJ-86', CLB-27') and Alecko Eskandarian substituted Freddy Adu (SJ-78', CLB-60').

Staying on Target

In United's 21 League games this season, they have averaged just over 50% accuracy – 136 SOG from 271 shots (50.19% accuracy). The magic number for victory is 50%. United has averaged 54.76% accuracy (46 SOG from 84 shots) in the team's six victories. Ironically, the Black-and-Red's best shooting performance ended in a loss for United, as the team was a perfect 4-for-4 against San Jose on August 7th. Excluding that match, accuracy in losses is 48.42% (46 SOG from 95 shots). United have missed most when matches have ended on equal footing, suffering to a 45.45% average – 40 SOG from 88 shots.

The trend has even continued in friendlies. In United's 2-1 defeat of Rochester earlier this year, the Black-and-Red sent five of seven shots on frame, but could only muster nine of 22 shots on goal in a regulation tie with Nottingham Forest.

Doing It In Style

D.C. United's 29 goals rank fourth in Major League Soccer. On the style sheet however, United ranks first, with six goals being selected by fans nationwide as the Sierra Mist Goal of the Week. Alecko Eskandarian leads the pack with three, and is one of only two players league wide with multiple wins on the year. The United forward can claim a bit of bad luck not to have four honors, as he had two goals nominated for recognition in week 12 – the second a curling free kick into the upper 90.

For Club and Country

Earnie Stewart and Ezra Hendrickson were missing from training with D.C. United this week on national team duty, Stewart with the United States and Hendrickson with St. Vincent and The Grenadines. Both players started for their respective teams, with Hendrickson going the full 90 in St. Vincent and The Grenadines 2-0 loss to Haiti. Stewart yielded to another member of the century club, Cobi Jones, in the 68th minute as the USMNT fought back to snatch a 1-1 draw against Jamaica.

Roster Moves

D.C. United announced last Saturday that the club had agreed to contract terms with Argentine midfielder Christian Gómez. Upon completing his international transfer paperwork, he will be available for selection in the Black-and-Red lineup. He made a name for himself with Nueva Chicago, helping them earn promotion to the Argentine first division in 2000.

Also joining the Black-and-Red this week is Tim Lawson. Lawson was signed on Wednesday, completing his transfer from SV Elversburg of the Regionalliga Sud in Germany. Lawson will be available for selection for Saturday's match.

Head Coach Peter Nowak

Peter Nowak's reign as United's fourth Head Coach in club history became official with his signed contract on January 7, 2004. Nowak, 39, begins his coaching career with Major League Soccer's most decorated franchise following an illustrious professional playing career of nearly 23 years. After captaining the Chicago Fire for five seasons, he accepted a position in the club's front office for the 2003 campaign. In his role as the Director of International Relations and Soccer and Business Adviser, Nowak worked closely with nearly all of the club's departments, including the coaching staff, youth player development, community relations, broadcasting and marketing.

His five years on the field for the Fire made him a fan favorite not only in Chicago, but around the entire league. During his half-decade playing career in MLS, Nowak accumulated 100 points on 26 goals and 48 assists. He led the expansion Fire to an MLS Cup championship in 1998 and U.S. Open Cup titles in 1998, 2000 and 2001. Three times each, he was an MLS All-Star (1998, 1999, 2000), a member of the MLS Pepsi Best XI (1998, 2000, 2001) and the Fire's MVP (1998, 2000, 2001). Nowak was also selected as the MVP of MLS Cup 1998.

Nowak's success in MLS surprised very few who were familiar with his prior performances in Europe. Before coming to America, the native of Pabianice, Poland, saw action in 116 games in the German Bundesliga. During his five years in Germany, Nowak lent his services to such world-renowned clubs as 1860 Munich (1994-1997), Kaiserslautern (1994) and Dynamo Dresden (1993-1994). He scored a combined 17 goals in Germany's top league.

Prior to his time in Germany, Nowak also was a member of Switzerland's Young Boys Berne (1992-1993) and Turkey's Bakirkoyspor (1990-1992). He began his career with his hometown team in Pabianice in 1979 as a 15-year-old and played with four teams in Poland before moving to Turkey. Nowak's Polish clubs, in addition to Pabianice (1979-1983) included Motor Lublin (1984-1985), Widzew Lodz (1985-1986) and WKS Zawisza Bydgoszcz (1983-1984 and 1986-1990).

Nowak's myriad of successes at the club level led to a distinguished international career as well. He was the captain of the Poland National Team for three years and was named Poland's Player of the Year in 1996. In 24 appearances for his country, Nowak scored three goals.

With United leading the pack at the midpoint of the 2004 season, Nowak was selected to coach the Eastern Conference All-Stars in the 2004 Sierra Mist All-Star Game. He pulled double duty for the July 31st match, as he was also chosen to play in a Celebration Game commemorating stars of the 2004 FIFA World Cup who also enjoyed playing success in Major League Soccer.
