Last Meeting: Defense Handles the Rapids, Earns 1-0 Win for United

WASHINGTON, DC (August 13, 2004) – Eliseo Quintanilla's first-half goal was the difference as D.C. United ended Colorado Rapids five-match league winning streak - while extending their own to three - in a 1-0 victory on Wednesday night at RFK Stadium.

Quintanilla's 31st-minute strike settled a lively match between two of the hottest teams in Major League Soccer over the recent weeks, and left United (7-6-6, 27 pts.) within striking distance of the top of the Eastern Conference after a poor start to the season. Colorado (7-9-3, 24 pts.) remained in third place in the West despite suffering their first loss since a 3-2 reversal by New England Revolution on June 28 - though the Rapids twice hit the post on Wednesday.

"We prepared all week," said United Head Coach Ray Hudson. "This was going to be a hard team to crack, but the main thing was persistence, persistence, persistence. A real good night. I'm proud of the guys' attitudes. We're getting better...it's getting better, but the results is what we need right now."

A bright and vibrant opening quarter-hour saw both goalkeepers tested - and the woodwork hit at each end. Kyle Beckerman forced a save from a well-positioned Nick Rimando with a shot on the turn after six minutes, before United raced to the other end where Ben Olsen sent a bending effort from outside the area that skimmed the top of the crossbar.

Then on 10 minutes, Quintanilla hit a powerful angled drive from a nicely worked movement that brought a save from Scott Garlick at full stretch, and just three minutes later John Spencer had a loose clearance fall right to his feet only to see his shot from 12 yards come back off the base of the post with Rimando rooted to his line.

United felt they should have taken the lead just after the half-hour, when Alecko Eskandarian skipped past Colorado defender Nat Borchers. As he shot Borchers appeared to pull him down, but only a corner was given after Garlick parried the shot around the post.

But the home side did take the lead in the 31st minute through a glimmer of the Marco Etcheverry of years gone by. Ben Olsen split two defenders to put the ex-Bolivia international in the area, and he sent a low cross through the heart of the penalty area where Quintanilla powerfully drove the ball home first-time.

Again the woodwork saved United seven minutes after the break. Spencer and Carrieri played a wonderful wall pass in midfield, Spencer sent racing into the United penalty area with yards of space. He cracked a powerful shot from just inside the box, only to see it come straight back off Rimando's left post.

Carrieri put a shot just over the bar on the turn in the 73rd minute, but it was the only quality chance Colorado had despite keeping United pinned in their own end for long stretches.

Though they were forced to defend on the back foot, United nearly doubled the lead in the final 10 minutes first

through substitute Hristo Stoitchkov's deflected shot, then when Quintanilla nearly punished a missed clearance, but both just flashed past the post with Garlick stranded.

Last Match: Second-fastest Hat Trick in League History Sinks United

WASHINGTON, DC (May 19, 2004) – A hat trick within eight minutes in the first half by Alejandro Moreno – answered in the second half by a wonderful goal from Freddy Adu – gave the Los Angeles Galaxy a wild 4-2 victory against D.C. United on Wednesday night at RFK Stadium.

Moreno's hat trick – all three goals set up by Andreas Herzog – was the second-fastest in MLS history, and was immediately followed by a fourth Galaxy goal and United's

first before halftime. But Adu also gave the RFK faithful a glimpse of his supreme talents with a superb strike of his own in the losing effort as United tried desperately to pull back into the game in the second half.

Moreno answered any questions about how the Galaxy offense would handle the absence of injured star and MLS-leading scorer Carlos Ruiz, out with a severely sprained ankle. United owned all of the early portion of the game – in fact, United goalkeeper Nick Rimando didn't even touch the ball until a half-hour was gone – but the Galaxy exploded shortly thereafter.

The goal-fest started in the 35th minute, after Rimando's first (and only) save of the night led to a corner. The United goalkeeper then came up empty as he charged from his goal in an attempt to punch Herzog's service clear. Moreno took a couple of stabs in the six-yard box, but finally poked the ball over the line before Dema Kovalenko could clear.

Just four minutes later Moreno struck for the second time. Herzog found the Venezuelan international with a long ball up the left flank behind defender Mike Petke, and Moreno raced into the penalty area before hitting a low shot from the corner of the goal area that slid under Rimando.

In the 43rd minute, the Herzog-Moreno combination struck again on a terrific goal. Herzog's measured cross from the left flank found Moreno cutting across the face of goal, and he flicked the ball with the outside of his foot and past Rimando into the far side netting.

The eight-minute span marked the second-fastest hat trick in MLS history, only to another Galaxy performance, when Harut Karapetyan scored three goals in five minutes in a Los Angeles 8-1 victory at Dallas on June 4, 1998. In addition, for Moreno, it was five goals on five consecutive shots (including his first two goals this season), the first player in MLS history to achieve that feat.

A shellshocked United squad continued to struggle and rookie striker Joseph Ngwenya took advantage moments later, scoring his first goal of the season. Former United player Chris Albright whipped in a good cross from the right touchline which Moreno headed back across the face of the goal where Ngwenya dived to make it 4-0 for the visitors. The four goals in nine minutes was the quickest ever allowed by United.

But the home side was able to end the half on a positive note thanks to a blistering shot by Ronald Cerritos, who hit home from just outside the area in stoppage time, curling the ball inside Kevin Hartman's right post for his second goal of the season.

United thought they had made it 4-2 at the 63-minute mark, but Kovalenko saw his headed finish on a rebound ruled out for offside.

But D.C., and Adu, sent the crowd into rapture four minutes later. Collecting the ball on the right flank, he cut inside and went on a brilliant individual run through the Galaxy penalty area, faking several defenders before depositing the ball in the top left corner with a left-footed strike.

United continued to press forward, but Hartman stood tall, making three saves in the final five minutes. The

best chance fell to Stewart after another mazy run from Jaime Moreno split the Galaxy defense, but Hartman closed the gap quickly and parried the shot.

The Galaxy had an opportunity to put the game completely out of reach at full time, when Marcelo Saragosa found the ball at his feet in front of United's goal with plenty of time. His shot beat Rimando, but not defender Bryan Namoff, who cleared the ball out of the goalmouth.

D.C. United have owned a healthy advantage over the Colorado Rapids over the years. United hold a +11 (37 for, 26 against) goal differential and have never lost a season series to the Rapids. The Rapids were United's final victims on the march to MLS Cup 1997 glory, with the Black-and-Red capturing a 2-1 victory on goals from Jaime Moreno and Tony Sanneh.

Recently, the Rocky Mountain road trip has been unfriendly to United, as they have not won in four consecutive trips to Denver. The hosts were gracious enough, however, to let D.C. United leave with a share of the points in both visits in 2003.

As Olsen Goes...

D.C. United's loss to the MetroStars marked the first time United has lost when Ben Olsen scores. Olsen has 20 career goals for the Black-and-Red, and the team is an amazing 14-1-0 in regular season play, 18-1-0 overall.

Youth Movement

With his first goal of 2004 against the MetroStars, Freddy Adu became the youngest player to score in Major League Soccer, and the sixth to notch his first professional goal before his 18th birthday. At the tender age of 14 years, 320 days, he surpassed teammate Santino Quaranta (16 years, 217 days) by nearly two years. Of the six players who scored their first goal before being able to vote, United has three. M Bobby Convey is also on the list, having scored his goal at the ripe old age of 17 years, 316 days.

Season Accolades

United's players have earned several individual honors this year. F Jaime Moreno was named MLS Player of the Week following his three-point performance against San Jose on April 3rd. Alecko Eskandarian earned Sierra Mist Goal of the Week honors in that game as well, and Ronald Cerritos's 68th minute strike against the Galaxy was chosen Goal of the Week for week two. Moreno became the third member of United's Goal of the Week club, as his single-handed effort against Kansas City was chosen the superlative for week seven.

Reversal of Fortune

United D Brian Carroll did not appear in a single minute of League play for the Black-and-Red in the 2003 season. In the 2004 season, Carroll has played every minute of every match. The West Springfield HS product has been a vital part of United's new-look midfield throughout 2004.

Western Conference Scheduling Quirks

This is the final match of three games in a span of eight days – Kansas City, Los Angeles, Colorado – that sees D.C. United facing off against Western Conference opponents. United will play six of their first 10 games against teams from the West, but only one of their final 10. D.C. United will embark on a road swing, visiting Colorado, New England and Chicago before hosting the Rapids on Saturday, June 12th.

On the Mend

Forward **Santino Quaranta** underwent surgery on April 21st to smooth calcium deposits on his pubic bone that were causing small tears in the adductor tendon. The surgery was performed by Dr. William Meyers at the Hahnemann University Medical Center in Philadelphia, PA. Quaranta underwent a second procedure to clear up an infection near the incision on May 3rd.

Eliseo Quintanilla has returned to full training with the Black-and-Red. Quintanilla suffered a broken fibula during the preseason, missing the first month of the 2004 campaign. **Thiago Martins** is also recovering well, and has rejoined his teammates in full training. Martins, who suffered an ACL tear at the tail end of the 2003 season is nearing full health.

Birthday Boys

May is a popular month for birthdays among members of the Black-and-Red. Ben Olsen celebrated his 27th birthday on Monday, May 3rd. Later in the month, the birthday cake will be a shared effort, as Bobby Convey, David Stokes and Bryan Namoff all make one more wish in the space of a day. Convey will turn 21 on May 27th, and Stokes (22) and Namoff (25) share May 28th.

Head Coach Peter Nowak

Peter Nowak's reign as United's fourth Head Coach in club history became official with his signed contract on January 7, 2004. Nowak, 39, begins his coaching career with Major League Soccer's most decorated franchise following an illustrious professional playing career of nearly 23 years. After captaining the Chicago Fire for five seasons, he accepted a position in the club's front office for the 2003 campaign. In his role as the Director of International Relations and Soccer and Business Adviser, Nowak worked closely with nearly all of the club's departments, including the coaching staff, youth player development, community relations, broadcasting and marketing.

His five years on the field for the Fire made him a fan favorite not only in Chicago, but around the entire league. During his half-decade playing career in MLS, Nowak accumulated 100 points on 26 goals and 48 assists. He led the expansion Fire to an MLS Cup championship in 1998 and U.S. Open Cup titles in 1998, 2000 and 2001. Three times each, he was an MLS All-Star (1998, 1999, 2000), a member of the MLS Pepsi Best XI (1998, 2000, 2001) and the Fire's MVP (1998, 2000, 2001). Nowak was also selected as the MVP of MLS Cup 1998.

Nowak's success in MLS surprised very few who were familiar with his prior performances in Europe. Before coming to America, the native of Pabianice, Poland, saw action in 116 games in the German Bundesliga. During his five years in Germany, Nowak lent his services to such world-renowned clubs as 1860 Munich (1994-1997), Kaiserslautern (1994) and Dynamo Dresden (1993-1994). He scored a combined 17 goals in Germany's top league.

Prior to his time in Germany, Nowak also was a member of Switzerland's Young Boys Berne (1992-1993) and Turkey's Bakirkoyspor (1990-1992). He began his career with his hometown team in Pabianice in 1979 as a 15-year-old and played with four teams in Poland before moving to Turkey. Nowak's Polish clubs, in addition to Pabianice (1979-1983) included Motor Lublin (1984-1985), Widzew Lodz (1985-1986) and WKS Zawisza Bydgoszcz (1983-1984 and 1986-1990).

Nowak's myriad of successes at the club level led to a distinguished international career as well. He was the captain of the Poland National Team for three years and was named Poland's Player of the Year in 1996. In 24 appearances for his country, Nowak scored three goals.
