

Thank you again for your passionate support of Minor League Baseball and the Midwest League. I wish you a healthy and enjoyable season of baseball. Let's play ball!!







# **BASEBALL RULES OF INTEREST**

**All-Star Selection:** The Midwest League All-Stars are selected by the league's field managers. They may not vote for their own players.

**Batting Average:** Divide the number of safe hits by the total number of at-bats (at bats do not include walks, sacrifices, hit-by-pitch or times awarded first on obstruction or interference).

**Consecutive Hitting Streak:** A consecutive hitting streak shall not be terminated if the plate appearance results in a base on balls, hit batsman, defensive interference, or a sacrifice bunt. A sacrifice fly shall terminate the streak.

Consecutive Playing Streak: A consecutive game playing streak shall be extended if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance only shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before complying with these requirements, his streak shall continue.

**Designated Hitter Rule:** A hitter may be designated to bat for the pitcher in any spot in the batting order in any game without affecting the status of the pitcher. The designated hitter must be selected and be included in the lineup card presented to the umpire-in-chief prior to the game. The designated hitter is locked into the batting order, but may be removed for a pinch-hitter or pinch-runner who in turn becomes the designated hitter. The replacement player may stay in the game defensively, but the pitcher must take the place in the batting order of the replaced defensive player. This would terminate the role of the designated hitter for that game.

**Doctored Bat:** If a filled or "doctored" bat is used, the player is to be called out, ejected from the game and is subject to additional penalties. Any balls hit by an illegal bat do not count. If the umpire sees the illegal bat before it is used, he issues a warning, but there is no penalty.

**Earned Run Average (ERA):** Multiply the total number of earned runs by 9, then divide the result by the number of innings pitched.

**Earned Runs Rule:** A run for which the pitcher is held accountable. In determining earned runs, the inning should be reconstructed without errors and passed balls. The benefit of the doubt is always given to the pitcher in determining which bases would have been reached with errorless play.

**Fielding Average:** Divide the sum of putouts and assists by the total of putouts, assists, and errors (total chances).

**Magic Number:** Compute the number of games remaining, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the loss column of the closest opponent. This is the number of wins a team must have to secure the pennant.

**Night Game:** Any game scheduled to start after 5:00 pm (i.e.5:01 pm) will be considered a night game. If a game is scheduled to start before 5:00 pm and is delayed for any reason, it shall be considered a day game.

**On-Base Percentage:** Add the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitch and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by pitches, and sacrifice flies.

**Player Eligibility:** There are no age restrictions on player eligibility in the Midwest League, however, no more than two players on a team's active list may have five or more years of prior

service. A player shall be credited with one year of minor league service for each season he was active or on the Disabled List of a minor league club for at least 30 days.

**Qualifying Marks:** To qualify for the league batting championship, a player must have a minimum of 378 plate appearances. To qualify for the ERA title, a pitcher must have at least 112 innings pitched.

**Saves Rule:** One save per game may be credited to a team. Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following criteria:

- 1) He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- 2) He is not the winning pitcher; and
- 3) He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
  - a) He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
  - b) He enters the game with the potential tying run either on base, at bat, or on deck; or
  - c) He pitches effectively for at least three innings.

A "blown save" occurs when a pitcher who has entered a game in a save situation departs with the save situation no longer in effect because he has given up the lead. If the save situation still exists when he leaves the game, he is not charged with a save opportunity.

If he has not given up the lead when he leaves the game, even though the save situation may no longer exist, he is not charged with a save opportunity.

The "Hold": The hold is not an official statistic, but it was created as a way to credit middle relief pitchers for a job well done. Starting pitchers get win, and closers get saves, but the guys who pitch in between the two rarely get either statistic. So what's the most important thing one of these middle relievers can do? "Hold" a lead. If a reliever comes into a game to protect a lead, gets at least one out and leaves without giving up that lead, he gets a hold. But you can't get a save and a hold at the same time.

**Slugging Percentage:** Divide the total bases of all hits by the total number of at-bats.

**Suspended Game Rule 4.11(d) (Official Baseball Rules):** A called game ends at the moment the umpire terminates play. EXCEPTION: If the game is called while an inning is in progress and before it is completed, the game becomes a SUSPENDED game in each of the following situations:

- 1. The visiting team has scored one or more runs to tie the score and the home team has not scored;
- 2. The visiting team has scored one or more runs to take the lead and the home team has not tied the score or retaken the lead;
- 3. The game has not become a regulation game (4.5 innings with the home team ahead, or five innings with the visiting club ahead or tied).
- 4. Any regulation game tied at the point play is stopped because of weather, curfew, or other reason.

- 5. If a game is suspended before it becomes a regulation game, and is continued prior to another regularly scheduled game, the regularly scheduled game will be limited to seven innings.
- 6. If a game is suspended after it is a regulation game, and is continued prior to another regularly scheduled game, the regularly scheduled game will be a nine inning game.

EXCEPTION: The Suspended Rule will not apply to the last scheduled game between the two teams during the championship season, or League Playoffs.

Winning and Losing Pitcher: The winning pitcher is the pitcher who is in the game when his team assumes a lead that it does not relinquish. The starting pitcher must complete five full innings to be eligible to earn the win. If the starting pitcher does not complete at least five innings, and his team holds the lead at the time he is removed from the game and maintains the lead over the remainder of the game, then the official scorer shall award the win to the relief pitcher judged to have been most effective. The losing pitcher is the pitcher who is charged with the run that gives the winning team a lead that it does not relinquish. Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.

Won-Lost Percentage: Divide the number of games won by the total number of games played.



# **GROUND RULES**

#### **BELOIT SNAPPERS**

Pohlman Field - Beloit, WI

- 1. Facing of both dugouts is live. If ball bounces off facing and lands in playing area, ball is live. If ball hits facing and drops into dugout, ball is dead.
- 2. A chalk line near the batting cage in the left field foul area marks the boundary between live and dead ball territory. If a ground ball crosses the line, the ball is dead. However, a player must come back into live ball territory to throw.
- 3. All balls hit into the bullpen area are live except for those that become lodged beneath the bullpen benches. Lodged balls are dead.
- 4. The first row of fence signs in the outfield are in play. The second row of fence signs, message center and scoreboard are recessed behind the fence and are out of play. Any ball striking the second level of fence signs, message center or scoreboard on the fly shall be a home run.
- 5. Any ball that goes beneath the deck area along the right field foul line is dead.
- 6. Players may lean on the tarp to catch a ball but cannot go on top of the tarp. Any ball caught while standing on the tarp shall be a dead ball.
- 7. The break on the backstop is anything above the horizontal wire located at the top of the support poles. Any ball going above the break shall be a dead ball.

#### **BOWLING GREEN HOT RODS**

Bowling Green Ballpark - Bowling Green, KY

- 1. The following are home runs:
  - Any ball that is hit over the 8' wall in left or the 13' wall in right field.
  - Any ball hit above the yellow stripe on the batter's eye.
  - Any ball striking either foul pole above 8' wall.
  - Any ball striking the scoreboard.
  - Any ball hitting on top of the LED sign in left field.
- 2. Any ball that hits field tarp is live. Ball lodged in, or behind tarp, is a dead ball. Player can lean on the tarp but not elevate himself by standing on the tarp to catch a ball.
- 3. A batted ball hit into the left corner that bounces and hits the wall railing is a ground rule double. A batted ball remains in play if it bounces off the wall pads and remains on the field.
- 4. Fair ball that rolls underneath the gate in left center is two bases.
- 5. Ball lodged in, on or behind backstop is a dead ball.
- 6. Player may reach into the dugout to catch foul pop fly.
- 7. Top step of the dugout and all railings of dugout are in play.
- 8. Player cannot enter the dugout steps to catch any foul pop fly.
- 9. Any ball entering the dugouts or striking the roof facing is considered a dead ball.
- 10. The handicap-access ramps on the 1st and 3rd base sides are dead-ball areas. A player cannot enter the area to make a catch, but can reach over the railings.
- 11. If a pitched or thrown ball becomes lodged behind or between sections of protective padding, the ball shall be ruled dead.

#### **BURLINGTON BEES**

Community Field - Burlington, IA

- 1. Behind home plate: Any batted or thrown ball which goes above the break is dead.
- 2. Dugouts: Any batted or thrown ball which hits the concrete lip or guard rails in front of the dugout is in play. Any batted or thrown ball which goes into the dugout, hits the facing of either dugout or the netting directly above the



dugout is a dead ball. Players may lean into the dugout to make a catch but may not elevate themselves on the concrete lip or steps to make a play.

The concrete pads extending from the dugout to the home plate side are considered part of the dugout, and all rules relevant to the dugout apply to them.

- 3. Third base foul area: Any thrown or batted ball which hits the nets is in play, unless the ball becomes caught in the net.
- 4. First base foul area: Any thrown or batted ball which hits a field exit gate, or the concrete wall is in play. Any thrown or batted ball which hits the netting above the concrete wall is dead.
- 5. Bullpens: Batted or thrown balls entering the bullpen areas are in play. Book rules apply.
- 6. Tarp: If a ball bounces off the tarp, it is in play. If a ball becomes lodged in the tarp it is dead. Players may lean on the tarp to make a play but may not elevate themselves onto the tarp to make a play.
- 7. Outfield fences: The batter's eye, the left field second tier billboard signs, as well as the single billboard signs attached to the left and right field light standards, are all recessed. Any batted ball which hits them on the fly is a home run. The second tier of billboard signs in right field are stacked on the lower level. Any batted or thrown ball hitting against them is in play.
- 8. Scoreboard: The scoreboard is recessed. Any batted ball hitting the scoreboard on the fly is a home run.

#### CEDAR RAPIDS KERNELS

Perfect Game Field at Veterans Memorial Stadium - Cedar Rapids, IA

- 1. Behind home plate: If a ball lodges between bottom of the screen and concrete facing, or in the padding around the entry door, it is dead.
- 2. Dugouts: A ball bouncing off the metal screens or concrete facings in front of the dugouts and photographer pits is in play. A ball lodging under the fence is dead. Players may stand on the top concrete step of the dugout to catch a ball. A ball thrown into the dugouts or pits is dead. Players may carry the ball into, but cannot throw from, the dugouts or pits.
- 3. Tarp: If a ball rolls into, under, or behind the tarp it is dead. Balls deflecting off the tarp are in play. Players may lean on the tarp to make a catch. They may not elevate themselves on the tarp to make a catch. The tarp is not considered a part of the bullpen. No players may sit on top of the tarp while the game is in progress.
- 4. Bullpens: Balls hit into the bullpens are in play. No benches or chairs are allowed in the bullpen areas.
- 5. Outfield: The ball must carry over the wall to be a home run. Balls hitting on top of the fence and bouncing over are home runs. Balls hitting on top of the fence and deflecting back into the field are in play. Batted balls lodging between or beneath pads are dead and automatic doubles. Thrown balls lodging between or beneath pads are dead.
- 6. Left field: In the portion of the 15-foot high wall that angles back toward the 8-foot wall; if a ball deflects off the 15-foot high wall over the 8-foot wall it is a ground rule double. If a ball strikes the wooden deck area ABOVE the yellow line over the 8-foot wall OR to the right of the vertical yellow line along the 15-foot high wall, it is a home run. Balls deflecting off the Tri- Vision advertising signs beyond the 8-foot wall back into the field of play are home runs.
- 7. Center field: Balls hitting the batter's eye, flagpole or scoreboard that deflect back into the field of play are home runs.
- 8. Right field: Balls deflecting off the Ribbon Board and Tri-Vision advertising signs beyond the 8-foot wall back into the field of play are home runs.
- 9. Any thrown ball that hits the extended netting over the dugouts and lands in a playing area, the ball is live. If a ball hits the netting and drops into the dugout, the ball is dead.

#### **CLINTON LUMBERKINGS**

NelsonCorp Field- Clinton, IA

1. Fence behind home plate: If ball hits the break point between stadium roof and fence, it is dead.

# GROUND RULES

- Dugouts: If the ball hits the netting located above the dugouts, it is dead. The perimeter facing of the dugouts is dead. Both feet need to be on the first step of the front lip to be playable. If the ball hits the lip and goes into the dugout, it is dead.
- 3. Tarp: If ball bounces off tarp, it is in play. If ball is lodged in the tarp, it is dead. A player can lean on the tarp with both feet on the ground, no elevation.
- 4. Right field: If the ball hits any upper row fence sign it is a home run.
- 5. Left field: If the ball hits the scoreboard, it is a home run.
- 6. Bat Boy Area Located Outside of the Dugout: In each corner closest to home plate there is a portable protective screen that sits in front of the bat boy's seat. If the ball hits the front of the net it is a live ball. If the ball goes behind the screen it is a dead ball.

#### DAYTON DRAGONS

Day Air Ballpark - Dayton, OH

- 1. Backstop: No break in the backstop net.
- 2. Dugouts: The facing of the dugouts are considered dead. The camera pits located in the dugout are considered dead.
- 3. Netting: Any ball that hits the back stop netting from camera well to camera well is considered in play. Any ball that hits the netting from camera well to foul pole(s) is considered dead.
- 4. Tarp: The player may not use the tarp as a step.
- 5. Railings: The railings along the first base and third base lines are considered in play.
- 6. Left and right field foul lines: If any batted ball hits any part of the foul pole, it is a home run If any batted ball clears the yellow break line, located on the wall padding, it will be considered a home run.
- 7. Outfield Wall: Any batted ball that clears the yellow line on wall pad or hits recessed railing located beyond outfield fencing is a home run.
- 8. Batter's Eye: Any batted ball that clears the yellow break line will be considered a home run.

#### FORT WAYNE TINCAPS

Parkview Field - Fort Wayne, IN

- 1. Behind home plate: No break in the backstop net.
- 2. Dugouts: Netting in front of both dugouts is live. If a ball bounces off netting and lands in playing area, ball is live. If a ball hits netting and drops into the dugout, ball is dead. The top step of either dugout opening is in play.
- 3. Tarp: If a ball rolls into, under or behind the tarp, it is dead. Balls deflecting off the tarp are in play. Players may lean on the tarp to make a play, but may not use it as a step to make a play.
- 4. The railings along the first and third base lines are in play; however if a ball hits the railing down the left field and right field, respectively, it is deemed dead and a ground rule double. If a ball bounces over the railing and into the stands, it is dead.
- 5. Bullpens: All fair balls hit or thrown into the bullpen area are live except those that become lodged beneath the bullpen benches. Lodged balls are dead.
- Outfield wall: Any batted ball that clears the yellow line on the fly is a home run. This includes any batted ball that hits the railing above the wall. If a ball becomes lodged between or under padding or LED boards, it is dead.

#### **GREAT LAKES LOONS**

Dow Diamond - Midland, MI

1. No break in backstop or dugout netting.

# GROUND RULES

- 2. The camera pits located in the dugouts are dead.
- 3. The facing of the dugouts are dead. The top step of either opening is in play.
- 4. All fair balls in the bullpen are in play.
- 5. A player may not use the tarp as a step to make a play. Any diving on or over to make a play is permitted.
- 6. All padded railings along the first and third base lines are in play.
- 7. All concrete steps beyond the first and third base bullpens are dead.
- 8. Any batted ball that hits any part of the foul pole is a home run.
- 9. Any batted ball that clears the yellow line on wall pad or hits recessed railing located beyond outfield fencing is a home run.
- 10. Balls lodged in outfield gate, first and third base marketing gates, and first base field maintenance gates are dead.

#### KANE COUNTY COUGARS

Northwestern Medicine Field - Geneva, IL

- 1. Behind home plate: If ball lodges between the screen and the top of the padding, or lodges underneath the gate directly behind home plate, it is dead.
- 2. Dugouts/Pit Areas: A ball bouncing off the metal steps or railing at the end of the dugout is live. A ball lodging under the metal steps at the ends of the dugout is dead. A ball bouncing off the face of the dugout roof is dead. Players may carry the ball into, but cannot throw from the dugout or pits. The pit areas to the outfield sides of the dugouts are dead. A ball hitting the concrete facing at the end of the pit areas and bouncing back into play is live. If a thrown or deflected ball strikes the fence in front of either dugout but does not enter the dugout, the ball remains in play. If a thrown or deflected ball becomes wedged under the fence, the ball becomes dead. If a thrown or deflected ball enters the dugout (any area inside of the fence in front of the dugout), the ball becomes dead. The front façade of the dugout shall be considered within the dugout for the purpose of this rule. Defensive players may reach over the fence but may not elevate themselves on the fence or step inside of the fence line in order to make a play.
- 3. Tarp: If the ball lodges underneath the tarp, it is dead. Players may lean on the tarp to make a catch, but cannot elevate themselves on the tarp to make a catch.
- 4. Bullpens: Balls hit into the bullpens are in play. If the ball lodges underneath a sandbag or bench, it is dead. If the ball strikes the metal railing above the concrete wall on the first or third base side of the field and bounces back into play, it is live.
- 5. Outfield: The ball must be hit over the distance markers to be a home run.
- 6. Left field: The scoreboard is recessed and any batted ball striking it is dead (HR or 2 base hit). The deck is recessed and any batted ball that hits any part of the deck in fair territory is dead (HR or 2 base hit). The recessed portion of the deck is marked by a yellow line that is beyond the field of play.
- 7. Center field: If the ball becomes lodged under the gate in center field, or goes through a gap in the gate on a fly or bounce, it is dead. The hitting background is recessed and any batted ball that hits any part of it is dead (HR or 2 base hit). The deck is recessed and any batted ball that hits any part of it is dead (HR or 2 base hit). The recessed portion of the deck is marked by a yellow line that is beyond the field of play.
- 8. Right field: The deck is recessed and any batted ball that hits any part of the deck in fair territory is dead (HR or 2 base hit). The recessed portion of the deck is marked by a yellow line that is beyond the field of play.
- 9. Should a ball become wedged (lodged) between the ground and the bottom of any padding surrounding the playing field in either fair or foul territory, the ball is dead. If the ball becomes wedged in fair territory, it is a ground rule double. If in foul territory, it shall be treated the same as if the ball had been thrown out of play.



#### LAKE COUNTY

Classic Park - Eastlake, OH

- 1. Bullpens: Any ball hit into the bullpen either visitors or home shall be considered a live ball unless the ball becomes lodged in equipment, etc., in which the ball is ruled dead.
- 2. Dugouts: Any ball that rolls into either dugout shall be considered a dead ball. The concrete stairways leading into the dugout are out of play. A player may reach into the dugout to touch the rail and make a catch provided he is not touching the concrete steps. Any ball entering the dugouts or striking the roof is considered a dead ball.
- 3. Outfield Wall: Any batted ball, in fair territory, that hits the front of the protective rail is to be considered a home run. Any batted ball that hits the batters eye windscreen is considered a home run. Any batted ball, in fair territory, that becomes lodged into the outfield wall or under gate pieces (Centerfield and Rightfield gates) shall be ruled a ground rule double.
- 4. Tarp: If a thrown or batted ball becomes lodged behind the rolled tarp or in the tarp roll itself, it is considered dead. A player may lean on but not stand or attempt to climb on the rolled tarp to catch a ball.
- 5. Foul Territory Wall or Field Gates: If a thrown ball becomes lodged in or under any field access gates or related protective padding, the ball shall be considered dead. All other areas between the lines shall remain as the rule book play.

#### LANSING LUGNUTS

Cooley Law School Stadium - Lansing, MI

- 1. Dugout Railings (Green Padded and Gray Metal): If the ball bounces off and lands in playing surface, it is in play. If ball hits and goes into dugout, it is dead.
- 2. Railings along first and third base lines: If thrown or batted ball bounces off railing and stays in playing surface, it is in play. If ball bounces over railing and into the stands, it is dead.
- 3. Tarp: If ball bounces off tarp, it is in play. If ball lodges in tarp, it is dead.
- 4. Bullpens: Balls hit into bullpens are in play.
- 5. Outfield Wall: Any batted ball landing above the yellow line is a home run. Any batted ball hitting off the yellow line and caroming over the wall is a home run. If a ball hits off the yellow line and bounces back into play, it remains in play.

#### **PEORIA CHIEFS**

Dozer Park - Peoria, IL

- 1. Railings along first and third baselines: If thrown or batted ball bounces off railing and stays in playing surface, it is in play. If ball bounces over railing and into the stands, it is dead.
- 2. Tarp: If ball bounces off tarp, it is in play. If ball lodges in tarp, it is dead.
- 3. A batted or thrown ball lodging in field or bullpen tarp or in cylinder is dead.
- 4. A batted ball that enters the centerfield Ivy and bounces out or can be seen is still in play. A ball that becomes lodged in the Ivy and sticks in the vines is a ground rule double.
- 5. Bullpens: Balls hit into bullpens are in play.
- 6. Left and right field foul lines: Any batted ball that hits any part of the foul pole screen is a home run. Any batted ball that clears the yellow break line on the wall padding is a home run.
- 7. Outfield wall: Any batted ball that hits the recessed railing located behind the left or right field outfield wall is a home run.
- 8. Batter's eye: Any batted ball that clears the yellow break line is a home run.
- 9. No break in the backstop net.
- 10. The camera pits located in the dugouts are dead.



#### **QUAD CITIES RIVER BANDITS**

Modern Woodmen Park - Davenport, IA

- 1. Tarp: A ball bouncing off tarp is in play. A ball lodging in or behind tarp is dead.
- 2. Bullpens: Balls hit into the bullpen are in play.
- 3. Dugout railings: If the ball hits railing and bounces back to playing area, it is in play. If ball enters the dugout area, it is dead.
- 4. Center field: If ball hits any part of the batter's eye above the yellow line or the railing at the top of the wall, it is a home run.
- 5. Outfield pads: If ball lodges between or under a pad, it is dead.
- 6. Backstop pads: If ball lodges between or under a pad, it is dead.
- 7. Left field foul fence: If ball rolls under the left field fence down the line, it is dead.
- 8. Foul Poles: If ball hits any part of the foul pole, it is a home run.
- 9. Right field ribbon board: If ball lodges between, behind or under pads, it is dead.
- 10. Outfield Tri-vision signs: If ball lodges in signs it is dead.

#### **SOUTH BEND CUBS**

Four Winds Field - South Bend, IN

- 1. Ball lodged in, on or behind backstop is a dead ball.
- 2. Dugouts: Netting on rails in front of both dugouts is live. If a ball bounces off netting and lands in playing area, ball is live. Netting behind dugouts is dead. If a ball hits netting and drops into the dugout, ball is dead. Any ball that hits directly over the dugout is dead. The top step of either dugout opening is in play, any other area past top step is dead. If a fielder, after catching a fly ball, steps into a dugout, but does not fall, the ball is in play and runners may advance at their own peril, and the fielder may throw from the dugout.
- 3. The camera pits located in the dugouts are dead.
- 4. The railings along the first and third base lines are out of play. If a ball bounces over the railing and into the stands, it is dead.
- 5. Tarps: If a ball rolls into, under or behind the tarps, it is dead. Balls deflecting off the tarps are in play. A player may not use the tarp as a step to make a play. Any diving on or over to make a play is permitted. No elevation allowed on tarp.
- 6. If any ball gets lodged underneath or in between the steel steps on each side of the dugout, the ball is dead. A player may not use the steel steps to make a play.
- 7. Bullpens: All fair balls hit or thrown into the bullpen area are live except those that become lodged beneath the bullpen benches. Lodged balls are dead. All chairs are to remain up against the wall.
- 8. Outfield wall: Any batted ball that clears the yellow line is a home run. Any batted ball that clears the yellow line and hits any railing and bounces back into the field of play is a home run. If a ball becomes lodged between or under padding, it is dead.
- 9. Any batted ball that hits any part of the foul pole is a home run.
- 10. If a ball hits any part of the batter's eye and above the yellow line it is a home run.
- 11. Center field: If the ball becomes lodged under the gate in center field, or goes through a gap in the gate on a fly or bounce, it is dead and ruled a double.

#### WEST MICHIGAN WHITECAPS

Fifth Third Ballpark - Comstock Park, MI

- 1. No break in homeplate screen.
- 2. Dugout facia and dugout poles out of play.
- 3. Dugout area: Catch ball in play; feet must remain in play and in line with protective screen; if player crosses line, play is dead.


# GROUND RULES

- 4. Low wall and railing at the end of dugout corner inside of protective screen out of play.
- 5. Railing on top of box seat wall out of play.
- 6. Box seat wall in play except area behind low wall at end of dugout.
- 7. No climbing on tarp or tarp cylinder (3rd base side).
- 8. Play baseballs as per rule with bullpen benches.
- 9. Baseball hit over centerfield batter's eye must clear 2' extension above 8' wall; if not clearing ball is in play.
- 10. Rightfield Deck: Baseball must clear extension for homerun; if not clearing ball is in play.
- 11. Leftfield Deck: Baseball must clear extension for homerun; if not clearing ball is in play.
- 12. Fly ball or bouncing baseball striking and remaining in padded billboard: Ground Rule Double.
- 13. Baseball bouncing over outfield wall after landing in fair territory: Ground Rule Double.
- 14. Batted or thrown baseball reaching 1st and 3rd base concrete runways out of play: One base advancement.
- 15. Batted or thrown baseball remaining on warning track between 1st and 3rd base concrete runways: In play.
- 16. Foul poles are outside of playing field.
- 17. Batted baseball striking any portion of the foul pole and/or foul pole screen: Homerun.

#### WISCONSIN TIMBER RATTLERS

Neuroscience Group Field at Fox Cities Stadium - Grand Chute, WI

- 1. Dugouts: The protective netting and railing in front of the dugout is live. If a player falls into the dugout while attempting to make the play, the play is dead. If the ball goes into the dugout, the play is dead. If a ball caroms off the concrete facing of dugout, the play is dead.
- 2. Media pits: If a player falls into one of the media pits while attempting to make a play, the play is dead. If the ball goes into either media pit, the play is dead. If the ball caroms off the concrete facing of the media pits or the dugouts or the protective netting above the media pits or dugouts, the play is dead.
- 3. Backstop net: There is no break in the net. A thrown ball into the net is in play. A batted ball that deflects off the net is dead.
- 4. Railings along first and third base lines are in play.
- 5. Tarp: No Elevation. Player must catch ball with two feet on ground. If a fair ball bounces off tarp onto playing surface, it is in play. If a ball lodges in tarp, it is dead.
- 6. Outfield: Any batted ball that clears the fence or hits the scoreboard is a home run. If a ball becomes lodged under padded wall signs, it is dead.
- 7. Centerfield: The centerfield wall is 16' high. The black batter's eye tarp is set beyond the wall and is not part of the wall. A batted ball must only clear the 16' high wall to be home run.
- 8. Outfield Light Towers: A batted ball that hits a light tower beyond the outfield fence on the fly is a home run. A batted ball that hits a sign hanging on a light tower beyond the outfield fence on the fly is a home run.

#### **RISK FACTORS**


