AUSTIN E. KNOWLTON CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

Austin E. "Dutch" Knowlton is the chairman of the board of the Cincinnati Bengals and has been a firm supporter from the first day of the franchise's inception.

Knowlton, a well-known builder and sportsman, has been a founder, owner and director since the franchise began and often can be found watching his team play at some of the farthest waystops on the NFL map, in addition to his

regular attendance at games in Riverfront Stadium.

Knowlton also is an avid sportsman who spends as much of his free time as possible overseeing his second great interest—the breeding and selling of show horses at his Emerald Farm in Delaware County. He is also a Trustee of the Brown Jug Society which runs the Triple Crown for standardbred pacing horses. He also owns thoroughbreds that run in California, Kentucky, Chicago and Florida.

After receiving a degree in architecture and civil engineering from Ohio State University, Knowlton joined his father's construction company and later assumed ownership of the construction business. He now operates it under the name of Knowlton Construction Company. They are engaged in the construction,

leasing and management of commercial buildings.

The company designed, built and financed 54 college dormitories and other buildings for various colleges and universities in various states. Under Knowlton, it built the major portion of Ohio University, Bowling Green State University, Capital University, Otterbein College and numerous other schools and universities.

His offices are in Bellefontaine and Columbus, Ohio, and he resides in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and in Delaware County at

Emerald Farms.

MIKE BROWN PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER

Mike Brown relies on a lifelong background in football and a keen business sense in his role as President and General Manager of the Bengals.

A former Dartmouth quarterback and later a Harvard Law School graduate, he leads the effort to keep the Bengals thriving

as a football-only, family-owned enterprise.

Brown was instrumental in bringing the NFL to Cincinnati. He worked with his father, football legend Paul Brown, to close the deal which brought Cincinnati a pro franchise for the 1968 season. Mike Brown's efforts with civic and governmental leaders also made a reality of construction plans for Riverfront Stadium, which opened in 1970.

From the club's inception until August of 1991, Brown was Assistant General Manager, supervising most of the team's day-to-day operations. He assumed the role of General Manager after his father's death on Aug. 5, 1991. He played a major role in the building of the Bengals teams which reached the Super Bowl fol-

lowing the 1981 and 1988 seasons.

Brown is recognized throughout the NFL as a leader. He is a longtime member of the NFL Management Council's Executive Committee, He was named in early 1994 to a place on the league's Competition Committee, the primary body for analysis and consideration of rules changes.

Mike and his wife, Nancy, have a daughter, Katherine Brown Blackburn, and a son, Paul H. Brown. Katie is the team's secretary-treasurer, and Paul works with scouting and personnel as well as joining Katie on the team's Board of Directors.

RIVERFRONT STADIUM

Riverfront Stadium is situated on a 48-acre site bounded by Pete Rose Way to the Ohio River and from Elm Street to Broadway.

The seating capacity when the field is in football config-

uration is 60,389.

The playing surface at Riverfront is Astroturf.

Parking facilities on the immediate site will hold 4500 automobiles. Three parking decks, plus the plaza level, all 12 acre areas, completely surround the stadium.

Within a 12-block radius, there are 20,000 parking spaces. A massive scoreboard, 20 feet high by 180 feet long, contains 24,000 lamps and is capable of displaying scores, messages and cartoons through a computer.

The stadium opened in 1970.

The largest crowd ever to assemble for a sporting event in Cincinnati was at Riverfront when 60,284 fans saw the Bengals and Cleveland Browns on October 17, 1971.

JOHN SAWYER VICE-PRESIDENT

John Sawyer was one of the founders of the Bengals. He put in many hours of hard work and thousands of miles of travel to bring the National Football League franchise to Cincinnati.

Sawyer, Paul Brown and Mike Brown represented Cincinnati in the many NFL meetings held prior to awarding the franchise. He attends NFL owners' meetings and

played a part in the NFL realignment in 1970.

Sawyer is one of the Bengals' top fans. He has missed only four road trips with the Bengals since the team began playing in 1968.

He is president of J. Sawyer Co., a multi-faceted agricultural firm he developed. J. Sawyer Co. is one of the leading farm management and real estate brokerage firms in the Midwest.

He was inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame,

Ohio's highest honor in the field of agriculture, in 1983.

Sawyer, who was a B17 pilot in World War II, was a pioneer in

the aerial application of crop pesticides.

He is very active in charitable and civic endeavors and is vice president of fund-raising for Easter Seals, a social agency he became involved with through former Cincinnati quarterback Ken Anderson, who is now a member of the coaching staff. He's a member of the board of trustees of Children's Hospital, active with Springer School, Boy Scouts and the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Ohio.

Sawyer is a graduate of Princeton University and is the son of the late Charles Sawyer, former Secretary of Commerce. He and his wife, Ruth, live in Indian Hill and have four daughters, Anne Wetherill, Elizabeth Selnick, Catherine Ryall and Mary. They also enjoy nine grandchildren, John, Putnam, Meredith and Daniel Wetherill, William III and Anna Selnick, and Nicholas, Christina, Jonathan and Patrick Ryall.

PETE BROWN

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER; DIRECTOR OF PLAYER PERSONNEL

Pete Brown is the architect of the Bengals' annual draft of college players. He supervises the year-round effort to prepare for the team's most important source of player talent.

Brown keeps tabs on the efforts of the Bengals' scouting staff from his Riverfront Stadium office, and also scouts players himself when time allows. In the 1980s, his draft selections led the

team to two Super Bowls.

He added the role of Assistant General Manager in August, 1991. Brown is also among the club's owners, and is a member

of the Board of Directors.

A graduate of Denison University, Brown is the son of football legend Paul Brown and the brother of Mike Brown, Bengals' president and general manager.



KATHERINE BLACKBURN SECRETARY-TREASURER

Katie Blackburn joined the Bengals in October, 1991, following her graduation from the University of Cincinnati law school and a period of practicing law with the Cincinnati firm of Taft, Stettinius and Hollister.

Her role in the management of club

affairs has grown steadily over the past three years, and it is expected that trend will continue in seasons to come. She was instrumental in the signing last May of Dan Wilkinson, the No. 1 overall choice in the NFL draft, and handles many high-profile contract negotiations on her own.

She is involved in all discussions of stadium affairs with the City of Cincinnati, and works with the team's radio and television affiliates.

She is the daughter of Mike Brown, Bengals President and General Manager. She received her bachelor's degree from Dartmouth.

Katie's husband, Troy, practices law for the Taft firm and works with club management on a wide range of NFL-related legal matters. The Blackburns have a daughter, Elizabeth, 2.



PAUL H. BROWN ASST. SECRETARY/ASST.TREASURER SCOUTING/PLAYER PERSONNEL

Paul Brown enters his second full season in the Bengals' front office in 1994. He assists Pete Brown in the team's scouting effort, and also negotiates player contracts.

He was the lead negotiator last spring in the signing of safety Louis Oliver, the most widely touted unre-

stricted free agent signed by Cincinnati.

Brown is a graduate of Purcell High School in Cincinnati and Regis University in Denver, Colo. At Regis, he played varsity tennis and was a member of the debate team.

He is the son of Mike Brown, Bengals President and General Manager. He has been close to football all his life, beginning with the days when his grandfather, the late Paul E. Brown, was head coach as well as general manager of the Bengals.



DAVE SHULA

Dave Shula is no longer the new kid on the NFL's head coaching block. The Bengals boss has 32 games under his belt, and he'd be the first to say they've added a few lines to his face.

But Shula still is the NFL's youngest head coach as he heads into his third Bengals season. Though this is his 13th year overall in NFL coaching, he turned 35 only last May 28.

A feeling of youthful enthusiasm - of barely having scratched the surface - marks the Shula administration. Though the Bengals show an 8-24 record the last two years, including 3-13 in 1993, this is no team with a loser's hangover. Shula has his troops looking confidently toward hitting their stride in 1994.

It's a coach's job to keep people in it, and Dave did that last season - every week," says Bengals veteran Ken Moyer. "Win or lose, he'd say the same thing: 'All we can ask you to do is play as

hard as you can.'

The Bengals had their biggest free-agent signing season ever in preparation for '94, and the draft was headlined by the acquisition of super-prospect Dan Wilkinson of Ohio State. Shula's '93 Bengals, least-experienced team in the NFL, may have provided a sneak preview when they came off the canvas to post a 3-3 record over the final six weeks.

At season's end, Cincinnati Post sports columnist Paul Daugherty told his readers, "Shula never lost his players."

Daugherty added:

The best plays of the year were not made on the field, but in the meeting rooms and the press conferences, where Dave Shula was pulling hope from a hat."

Tim Sullivan, sports columnist for The Cincinnati Enquirer,

said this in his season summation:

Among the most difficult chores in coaching is to motivate players who can see no tangible reward. This Shula was able to do ... Better teams have unraveled under less trying conditions, but these Bengals were knit remarkably tight.

Shula was named Bengals coach Dec. 27, 1991, taking over a team that had unexpectedly run out of top personnel after making

two playoffs and a Super Bowl from 1988-90.

"I don't enjoy losing, but I enjoy the job," Shula says. "I enjoy the challenge of trying to right the ship.

Last season, that challenge included keeping the team focused when the cause could easily have seemed lost.

You get up in the front of the (meeting) room, and your staff and players are looking at you," Shula says. "They don't want to see a dog-faced, feeling-sorry-for-himself guy up there. They want to see a guy that's trying to find some way to help them get out of the situation they're in.

'You may not have every answer, but you have to come across

as if you're looking to find them."

Linebacker Steve Tovar, one of the Bengals rookies who bloomed late last season, credits Shula for his straightforward approach with young players.

"He was consistent in his coaching," Tovar says. "The honesty part was real important. He's not going to tell you what you want to hear. He's going to tell you the truth."

Mike Brown, Bengals general manager, signed Shula last

December to a contract extension through 1996.

"Dave has done a good job under trying circumstances." Brown said, "Sometimes you can judge a person better when things don't go well than when they do go well. During these tough times, Dave has never wavered."

Shula has revised and intensified the Bengals' off-season workout program, and has surrounded himself with quality assistants. Two of those, offensive coordinator Bruce Coslet and wide receivers coach Richard Williamson, are former NFL head coaches themselves.

Eldest son of Don Shula, the winningest coach in NFL history, Dave was 32 when he accepted the Cincinnati job. He was the second-youngest man in the NFL's modern era to become a head coach, older only than Harland Svare, who was 31 when named Los Angeles Rams coach in 1962.

Dave Shula was offered the Philadelphia Eagles head coach-

ing job in 1986, when he was only 26. He declined.

Don Shula was 33 when he first took the head coaching reins in Baltimore. Don and Dave are the first father-son combination to be head coaches in the NFL at the same time. When Dave's Bengals meet Don's Dolphins at Riverfront Stadium on Oct. 2. 1994, it will mark the first father-son head coaching matchup in North American major league sports history.

"I'm looking forward to it," Dave says. "I'm glad we have them

here in the Junale. It will be exciting."

Though Shula worked as an assistant under his father for seven seasons, his experience in football dates to his earliest recollections.

"I grew up around the game," Dave says. "I was always interested in what I was doing around the game. I paid attention."

BRUCE COSLET

One of the most successful assistant coaches in Bengals history, Bruce Coslet rejoins the club as offensive coordinator for the 1994 season.

Coslet, 47, was head coach of the New York Jets from 1990 through 1993. He was on the

Bengals' staff from 1981 through 1989, including 1986-89 as offensive coordinator.

During Coslet's prior term as offensive coordinator, the Bengals twice had the NFL's No. 1-ranked offense (1986, 1988), twice had the league's top-ranked rushing attack (1988-89), and three times led the AFC in total offense (1986, 1988 and 1989).

With the Jets, Coslet oversaw an offense that finished in the

NFL's top 10 two of the last three years.

"Bruce has a proven offensive track record in the NFL, both in New York and Cincinnati, and I'm pleased he has decided to join our staff," said Bengals head coach Dave Shula.

"This should be a smooth transition, because of Bruce's knowledge of the game and because our offensive system is so

similar to the Jets'.

Coslet will install an attack with a wider range of options than

the 1993 Bengals possessed.

"Bruce's system is great," says quarterback David Klingler. "It's going to put receivers into position to make big runs after the catch. We'll be more diverse. It's an offense that puts you in position to succeed."

Says Coslet:

"I'm happy to be back with the Bengals, and grateful for the opportunity. I hope I can come and contribute something right away. I know all the coaches are on the same page. We all want this team to get better."

Coslet's wife, Kathy, is a Cincinnati native. They have two chil-

dren, son J.J. 19 and daughter Amy 17.

Coslet's birthdate is Aug. 5 1946. He's a native of Oakdale, Calif, and was a football standout at Joint High.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

The game won't be played at Nippert Stadium, but the Bengals will do their best to spark some memories when they host the New England Patriots on Sept. 18.

In conjunction with the celebration of the NFL's 75th anniversary, the Bengals will wear their original, 1968-style uniforms in the game. It's part of "Throwbacks Day," on which NFL

home teams around the league will wear vintage duds.

From 1968-80, the Bengals wore orange helmets with "Bengals" in block letters on each side. The jersey was black, with sleeves emblazoned with one orange stripe between two white stripes. The pants were white, with one orange stripe between two black ones down the side.



LARRY PECCATIELL DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

An experienced staff leader with proven skills at stopping the run. Larry Peccatiello joins the Bengals in 1994 as defensive coordinator.

Head coach Dave Shula has targeted improvement against the run as the

defense's prime directive. In Peccatiello, he gets a coach whose defenses ranked in the NFL's top 10 against the run for eight of the last 10 years.

Peccatiello was Redskins linebackers coach in 1981-82. defensive coordinator from 1983-92, and assistant head coach in 1993. Washington went to four Super Bowls during his tenure as defensive coordinator, and won three world championships.

'Number one, you have to stop the run," Peccatiello says. "You want to make your opponent one-dimensional. Then you go after the quarterback.

"If you're not capable of getting pressure with four lineman,

you have to find other ways to do it."

Dave Shula, Bengals head coach, knew Peccatiello's work after serving two seasons (1989-90) on the offensive staff of the Dallas Cowbovs.

"I chose Larry because I wanted a pressure-oriented style of defense that would take pride in attacking the offense," says Shula. "I want to be able to dictate to the offense what they can do, based on the way our defense lines up."

The Bengals played the Redskins in 1985, 1988 and 1991. Each time, general manager Mike Brown was impressed by Washington's work against the no-huddle offense of Sam Wyche and Boomer Esiason.

The Redskins were able to figure that out when others didn't," Brown says, "And Larry Peccatiello was a key person

in their hierarchy."

Peccatiello is installing a true 4-3 defense in the recent mold of NFC power teams. The Bengals will feature a true middle linebacker for the first time since the early '80s. The nose tackle position will no longer be seen on the depth chart, as two defensive tackle positions will be used instead.
Peccatiello's birthday is Dec. 21, 1935. He was born in Newark

N.J., where attended Barringer HS, and he was inducted last spring into the Newark Hall of Fame. He served as a lieutenant in the 101st Airborne Division and holds a masters degree in education. He and his wife, Betsy, have four children: Teri, 34; Arnie, 33; Kathy, 31: and Marcia, 29.

PAUL ALEXANDER TIGHT ENDS

The NFL watched with interest the last two years as Johnny Mitchell of the New York Jets developed into one of the league's best tight ends. Now, the Bengals have the coach who tutored Mitchell, and are anxious to see him

work with another top prospect in second-year tight end Tony

McGee.

Paul Alexander comes to Cincinnati with two years of valuable experience in New York under Bruce Coslet, now Bengals offensive coordinator. He understands the system, as well as how to

handle talented young players.

He's a product of distinguished teachers. Before joining Coslet, he coached under Joe Paterno at Penn State and Bo Schembechler at Michigan. He also was offensive line coach at Central Michigan, a school whose head coach, Herb Deromedi, ranks with Paterno and Schembechler among the top 10 winningest coaches in NCAA Division I history.

In three of Alexander's five seasons at CMU, the offensive line paved the way toward Mid-American Conference rushing titles.

"The players Paul has worked with have been very successful, and that's obviously a big measure in assessing a coach," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula. "And because of his association with Bruce (Coslet), he's going to know the intricacies of what Bruce wants to do better than the rest of us."

Alexander's birthdate is Feb. 12, 1960. He's a native of Rochester, N.Y., where he attended Cardinal Mooney High School. He was an academic All-American at Cortland State (NY) and holds a master's degree in physiology from Penn State. He and his wife, Kathy, have a daughter, Mary Beth, 4.

JIM ANDERSON RUNNING BACKS

Jim Anderson, with the third-longest tenure of service on the Bengals staff, has directed running backs who ranked among the NFL's top 10 in yardage six of the last eight years.

Anderson's troops won NFL rushing titles in 1988 and '89, and copped an AFC rushing championship in '86. From 1986 through 1990, the Bengals finished 2-4-1-1-5

in league rushing.

James Brooks, Cincinnati's all-time leading rusher, blossomed under Anderson. Both came to the Bengals in 1984. Brooks set a Bengals record with 1,239 yards in 1989, and Harold Green, another Anderson pupil, had the runner-up total of 1,170 yards in 1992.

Anderson also oversaw the brief but spectacular career of lckey Woods, which was derailed by a 1989 knee injury.

"Jim knows how to get production out of top players," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula, "and that includes teaching the little things that are really big things — like holding onto the ball."

The Bengals lost only nine fumbles last year, third-best mark

in the NFL.

KEN ANDERSONQUARTERBACKS

With a career passing performance that dominates the Bengals record book, Ken Anderson took his first coaching job in 1993. He ended a seven-year stint as a sportscaster by signing on as Cincinnati's quarterbacks coach.

What Anderson may lack in coaching experience, he has more than made up for in hard work and first-hand knowledge of the

pro passing game.

"Ken knows what it takes in terms of work," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula, "and when he walks into a room, even if he doesn't say word, he commands a lot of respect from young football players. The way he played the game (five Pro Bowls, one MVP award) says a lot right there."

Bengals quarterback David Klingler was an Anderson fan as a youngster, particularly when Anderson led the Bengals into Super

Bowl XVI.

"I only had two autographs as a kid – Nolan Ryan's and Kenny Anderson's, "Klingler says. "With Kenny as my coach, I like the idea that he's been there (in the games). There's not going to be

a situation I face that he hasn't seen.

Anderson played 16 seasons in a Bengals uniform (1971-86), most in franchise history. He leads the club in career completions (2,654), passing yards (32,838) and touchdown passes (197). His career computer passing rating of 81.9 is the highest in Bengals history and the No. 11 mark in NFL history. He holds the NFL record for highest completion percentage in a season – 70.55 in 1982.

Anderson's birthdate is Feb. 15, 1949. He was born in Batavia, III. Ken and his wife, Bonnie, have a son, Matt, 19, and two daugh-

ters, Megan, 15, and Molly, 11.

MARY BRADEN SPECIAL TEAMS

Marv Braden knows special teams, and his employment record proves it. He enters his 18th consecutive season as an NFL special teams coach, having started with Denver in 1977 and served terms with the Chargers and Cardinals

before joining the Bengals in 1990.

Braden has coached 13 Pro Bowl players who were special teams-related. He also has guided the development of two of the NFL's better current kickers, Lee Johnson and Doug Pelfrey of the Bengals.

He has brought an aggressive philosophy and pride in special teams play to Cincinnati. No visitor to the Bengals' practice complex could long harbor the misconception that "teams," as Braden calls them, are merely an afterthought for this coaching staff.

"Marv gets a lot out of players not only as a teacher, but as a motivator," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula, "and you've got to be a motivator to be a good special teams coach. I've been impressed since my first days on this staff with the way he works."

Four times from 1977-85, Braden's special teams units ranked first overall in the NFL in comprehensive team rankings. It happened in Denver in 1977 and '79, and in San Diego in 1982 and '85.

Braden's birthdate is Jan. 25, 1938. He's a native of Kansas City, Mo. He and his wife, Becky, have a married daughter – Janice Bartkowski – and became grandparents this past January.

A trusted lieutenant of Larry Peccatiello the last five seasons in Washington, Bobby DePaul accompanies Peccatiello to Cincinnati to work with the defensive line and to serve as administrative assistant for the defensive staff.

A fiery coach on the field, DePaul turns cerebral inside the office. He's on the cutting edge of computer technology in the coaching profession, and will work to coordinate day-to-day operations as well as preparing scouting reports on upcoming opponents for the defensive staff.

"Bobby and 'Pec' speak the same language, and that's going to be important," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula. "Whenever we need to make adjustments, during a game or between games, we

know those two are going to be on the same page."

DePaul played linebacker for two years at Maryland before a knee injury in the 1984 spring game cut short his career. He played there for Bobby Ross, current head coach of the Chargers.

JIM MCNALLY OFFENSIVE LINE

The dean of Bengals position coaches in years of service, Jim McNally carries a well-established reputation as one of the NFL's top offensive line tacticians.

"We've been fortunate to have a coach with Jim's combination of ability and loy-

alty to the organization," says general manager Mike Brown. "We know he's been courted by other teams in the past, and for good reason."

McNally enters his 15th Bengals season in 1994, having worked under head coaches Forrest Gregg and Sam Wyche

before joining the staff of Dave Shula.

For 13 years McNally was the tutor of Anthony Munoz, widely rated as the top offensive lineman in NFL history. Munoz was a first-round Bengals draft pick in 1980 – McNally's first season – but the coach also has earned much recognition for his

work in developing "longshot" players.

Two of those longshots – ninth-round draftee Bruce Kozerski and seventh-rounder Joe Walter – have been bulwarks of the Bengals' offensive line since well before Super Bowl XXIII. Undrafted free agent Kevin Sargent became a rookie starter at tackle for the Bengals before falling victim to an injury last season, and Ken Moyer – an undrafted free agent out of Toledo – is a starting center candidate in this, his fifth Cincinnati season. McNally's lines paved the way for NFL rushing championships for the Bengals in 1988 and '89, and Cincinnati won the AFC rushing title in '86. From 1986 through 1990, the Bengals finished 2-4-1-1-5 in NFL rushing.

McNally's birthdate is Dec. 13, 1943. He's a native of Buffalo, N.Y. He's a member of the University of Buffalo Hall of Fame, and is known nationwide for his clinics on offensive line coaching. He and his wife, Carolyn, have three children: Jenny, 23, Betsy, 20

and Jon, 19.

A hands-on coach toughened by five years' experience as a pro player in Canada, Ron Meeks was the point man in a muchimproved performance by the Bengals' secondary in 1993.

"Ron has been responsible for a lot of the

improvement in our cornerback position," says Bengals general manager Mike Brown. "We had experienced some real problems there, but this past season cornerback was one of our stronger

areas of play."

Meeks' work on techniques of playing the ball helped cornerback Rod Jones to perhaps his finest season. Free agent corner signee Mike Brim had a fine season under Meeks, and the aggressive coach continued the development of Darryl Williams into arguably the NFL's premier young safety.

Statistically, the Bengals improved from 25th to 2nd in the NFL

pass defense rankings from 1992 to '93.

"We're very comfortable with Ron in charge of our secondary," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula. "He hadn't coached a position on his own at the pro level when he first came here, but he's proven he's ready to handle it."

Meeks' birthdate is Aug. 27, 1954. He's a native of Jacksonville, Fla., where he attended Robert E. Lee HS. He holds a degree in jour-

nalism from Arkansas State.

Pascale spent the last eight seasons on the defensive staff of the Phoenix Cardinals. Phoenix linebackers Ken Harvey and Freddie Joe Nunn combined for 16 sacks last season, and over the past six years, they've combined for 92.5 guarterback traps.

Before coming to the Cardinals, Pascale coached six years in
the Canadian Football League and United States Football League.
His teams made the playoffs in each of those six years.

"I've been aware of Joe as a fine coach for some time," says Bengals head coach Dave Shula. "When I first got the job here (in

1992), I talked with him about joining the staff.


"He ended up staying in Phoenix, but when things opened up out there again, I contacted him again. He has coached players who have been very productive, and he's knowledgeable in many different schemes."

JOE WESSEL DEFENSIVE LINE

A longtime friend and respected associate of Bengals head coach Dave Shula, Joe Wessel makes his NFL coaching debut this season. He comes to Cincinnati from a college playing and coaching career marked by consistent success.

Wessel was a player on three bowl teams with Florida State, and coached in six bowls while on the staffs at Louisiana State and Notre Dame. He becomes Bengals defensive line coach after coaching the defensive secondary at Notre Dame in 1993, but in 1992, he was defensive ends coach for an Irish squad that produced NFL players in Karmeeleyah McGill of the Bengals and Devon McDonald of the Indianapolis Colts.

"Joe's had great experience with two of the better college programs in the nation, and I've seen the results of what he's done as a coach," says Dave Shula. "We've known each other for years. We both grew up around the same time in Miami. We've never coached or played together, but we stayed in touch and followed each other's careers."

As a Florida State player, Wessel set an NCAA record for most blocked punts returned for touchdowns with two against Arizona State and three overall during the 1984 season. Several publications named him the All-America special teams player of the year. He came to Florida State as a quarterback, but became starting free safety by the beginning of his junior season.

Wessel's birthdate is Jan. 5, 1962. He is a graduate of Pace High in Miami, and he holds a degree in business from Florida State. He spent the 1979-80 school year at Fork Union (Va.) Military Academy, where he starred in football and baseball.

He is married to the former Mary Gayle Hamilton of Baton Rouge, La.

RICHARD WILLIAMSON WIDE RECEIVERS

A former NFL head coach with 31 years experience in the profession, Richard Williamson is a congenial but firm taskmaster for Cincinnati's wide receivers.

The Alabama native was a pupil of legendary coach Paul "Bear" Bryant — both as

a player and as one of Bryant's assistant coaches.

"Coach Bryant was a strict disciplinarian. He ingrained that in me and it's something I still believe in strongly," Williamson says.

But Cincinnati receivers know that when Williamson makes a point, the barb will be accompanied by a touch of humor and delivered with appropriate timing.

"I've learned you can't just hammer players all the time," Williamson says. "You have to hammer on them some, but you also have to pat them on the back once in a while. Otherwise, they'll tune you out because they'll think they're never going to please you."

Williamson came to the Bengals in 1992 from Tampa Bay, where his five-year stint included the head coaching job for the last three games of 1990 and the entire '91 season. He also was head coach for six years at Memphis State University, twice earning hon-

ors as Southern Independent Coach of the Year.

Williamson's resume as a receivers coach includes Pro Bowl players in 1984 (Kansas City's Carlos Carson) and 1989 (Tampa Bay's Mark Carrier). Williamson was Kansas City's receivers coach when Stephone Page set an NFL record with 305 yards receiving in one game, and two of his Tampa players—Bruce Hill in 1988 and Carrier in '89 — were named Bucs' Most Valuable Players.

Williamson's birthdate is April 13, 1941. His hometown is Fort Deposit, Ala. Richard and his wife, Norma, have two children—

This past spring, at the urging of Bengals line coach Jim McNally, Munoz visited voluntary workouts to help coach Eric Moore, Cincinnati's new starting left tackle.

"When you have an asset like Anthony around town, you use it whenever you can," said Bengals coach Dave Shula.



KIM WOOD STRENGTH

Entering his 20th season with the Bengals, Kim Wood is the dean of NFL strength and conditioning coaches.

A hard-driving coach who still maintains an easy rapport with his players, Wood has set up strength and conditioning

programs for a number of NFL teams.

He is known nationwide for his outspoken pleas against the use of steroids in strength training. The Bengals' training program was aggressively steriod-free long before official sanctions against the drugs became a nationwide norm.

Wood has seen many of his athletes perform impressive feats

in the weight room, but that's not his goal.

"We train very hard, but we're not training our people to be weight lifters or power lifters," Wood says. "We always keep the perspective that we're working with these guys to be the best football players they can be."

An outstanding running back at the University of Wisconsin during his college days, Wood has also been connected with Hammer Strength corporation, a leading strength and training

equipment manufacturer.

Wood's birthdate is July 12, 1945. His hometown is Barrington, III. He has four children: John, 14, twin daughters Becky and Alyssa, 12, and Jacqueline, 10.

His drop has gotten much smoother and quicker, and he's much more relaxed. It's very encouraging, because he gave us three winning performances late last year that showed the potential he has in this league. His No. 1 area to focus on this year is being an accurate deep thrower.'

Tim Krumrie has never missed a Bengals game (excluding 1987 players strike), and his relentless play in the trenches has made him one of the most admired players in club history ... "It wouldn't matter if you put Timmy on the field with 10 nuns on his side," says general manager Mike Brown. "He'd still be thinking he could win, and trying just as hard" ... Quickness and aggressive effort key his success against offensive linemen outweighing him as much as 50 pounds ... Set this season to become the ninth player to play in 12 or more seasons with the Bengals.

DAVE SHULA SAYS: "Tim's like that Energizer rabbit. He just keeps on going. We've had ideas about reducing his playing time to keep him fresh, but we have a hard time getting him out of the lineup."

KRUMRIE DATA: The '94 season dawns with Krumrie having started 155 of the Bengals' last 156 games. Add in five playoff games, and the total is 160 of 161. But those numbers don't satisfy the player. Krumrie's lone missed start in the last 10 seasons KRUMRIE(Cont.)

came Oct. 14, 1990, at Houston, and he wasn't injured. "We changed up our fronts at the last minute, trying to rig up something against Houston's run-and-shoot," he recalls. Mike Hammerstein started in Krumrie's place. "But I still played almost the whole game," Krumrie adds. And at the final gun, one thing still looked normal. Krumrie had led the defensive line in tackles for the day.

KRUMRIE ON KRUMRIE: "I had a good, solid year (in '93), and toward the end I played much better. I'm like an old diesel tractor out in a farm field. The Bengals are pleased in 1994 to continue their association with John A. Ruthven, who has brought the world some of its most beautiful and truthful wildlife art.

Ruthven's Bengal tiger artwork will be featured again this season on the Bengals' GameDay Magazine cover. His tiger art also will be displayed, courtesy of the Bengals, at an international fund-raiser for Save the Tiger in New York next spring.

In addition to numerous major awards and commissions, Ruthven was selected as Ducks Unlimited's "First Artist of the Year." He also was chosen to design Ohio's first Duck Stamp. His originals and limited edition prints hang in museums, corporate offices and private collections all over the world.

John's first one-man show was held in Chicago in 1966, and its total success established him as a major wildlife artist. In 1971, to control reproduction and distribution of his work, he founded Wildlife International, Inc.

John and his wife, Judy, have become the driving force behind historic preservation in their hometown of Georgetown, Ohio, boyhood home of Ulysses S. Grant. Today, the Grant homestead, owned by the Ruthvens, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is also a National Landmark.

DAVE SHULA SAYS: "There is always an adjustment period for rookies, and often the public's expectations are unrealistic. But there's no question we expect Dan to be a big factor in a muchimproved performance by our team. This is a player who truly deserves to be the top pick in the draft."

BIG DADDY DATA: In his first Bengals practice, at mini-camp in May, Wilkinson set a club record for the 275-pound bench press with 23 lifts. "You could hear guys whispering," said DT John Copeland, top defensive line pick in the '92 NFL draft. "I've never seen anything like it. He just got that thing up there and was playing with it." Kim Wood, Bengals strength coach, said: "It's hard for pros to be in awe. But they were impressed."



WHY BENGALS?

Paul Brown picked the name Bengals for Cincinnati's football team "to give it a link with past professional football in Cincinnati."

From 1937 through 1941, the Bengals were a famous unit in the Cincinnati area. In 1938 they played three teams from the National Football League. They beat the Chicago Bears, 17-14, and the Pittsburgh Steelers, 38-0, and tied the Chicago Cardinals, 7-7.

"If we can pick up a thread of tradition, we think it's good," said Brown when he named the team.

Hundreds of names were suggested by fans in an effort to name the new Cincinnati team and the most popular was Buckeyes. It was rejected for obvious reasons.

"The owners rejected it because we didn't want it to be confused with the Ohio State Buckeyes and wanted something to embody four states rather than just one," said Brown. "We feel at home with the name Bengals."

ALL-PRO TACKLE ANTHONY MUNOZ

... says goodbye.

Paul Brown, who had left the Cleveland Browns following the 1962 season with an NFL record of 115-49-6, seven conference titles, and three NFL championships, had the urge to get back into football. His son Mike did a study on pro football expansion and recommended Cincinnati as a potential site. In **1965**, Brown met with Ohio Governor James Rhodes and the two agreed the state could accommodate a second pro football team.

1966 Fearful the Reds baseball team would leave town and feeling pressure from local businessmen pushing for a pro football franchise, Cincinnati's city council approved the

construction of Riverfront Stadium.

1967 Brown's group was awarded an AFL expansion franchise. Brown called the team the Bengals, the name of the previous Cincinnati AFL franchises in 1937, 1940, and 1941. The Bengals acquired quarterback John Stofa by trading two draft choices to Miami.

1968 The Bengals were awarded 40 veteran players in the allocation draft. In the college draft they selected Tennessee center Bob Johnson as their first pick. Other draftees included running backs Jess Phillips and Essex Johnson, tight end Bob Trumpy, linebacker Al Beauchamp, and tackle Howard Fest. The Bengals lost their first preseason game 38-14 to Kansas City before 21,682 fans at Nippert Stadium. The Bengals played respectably during the regular season, upsetting Denver 24-10 and Buffalo 34-23 in their first two home games. Paul Robinson led the AFL in rushing with 1.023 yards and was named rookie of the year.

1969 Brown drafted quarterback Greg Cook of the University of Cincinnati in the first round. The same draft also produced linebacker Bill Bergey. The Bengals jumped to a 3-0 record, But the club finished 4-9-1. Brown was named AFL coach of the year. Bergey was honored as AFL defensive rookie of the year, and Cook won the AFL passing title.

1970 After his arm went bad in training, Cook was placed on the injured reserve list. Virgil Carter, a castoff from two other NFL teams, was signed to play quarterback. The Bengals lost six of the first seven games, then rallied to win the last seven for an 8-6 record. They became the first third-year expansion team to win a division title, the AFC Central. They lost to Baltimore 17-0 in the playoffs.

1971 The Bengals picked up quarterback Ken Anderson and tackle Vernon Holland in the draft, then went 5-0-1 in preseason play. After a 37-14 victory over Philadelphia, the Bengals lost seven in a row on the way to a 4-10 record.

1972 Looking for defensive help, Brown drafted end Sherman White, safety Tommy Casanova, linebacker Jim LeClair, and cornerback Bernard Jackson. Anderson unseated Carter as starting quarterback, and the Bengals won three of their last four to post an 8-6 record. Chip Myers set a club record with 57 pass receptions.

1973 Brown drafted wide receiver Isaac Curtis and runners Boobie Clark and Lenvil Elliott. The Bengals split their first eight games, then swept their last six and won their second AFC Central Division championship. Cincinnati lost to Miami 34-16 in the AFC playoffs. Clark, who finished the year with 988 yards rushing and 45 pass receptions, was

named AFC rookie of the year. Essex Johnson led Cincinnati with a career-high 997 yards rushing and Curtis caught 45

1974 Cincinnati traded Bergey to Philadelphia for two first-round draft choices and third-round pick in 1977. LeClair replaced Bergey at middle linebacker. The Bengals won four of their first five games but couldn't keep pace with Super Bowlbound Pittsburgh. Anderson won the NFL passing championship and completed a club-record 64.9 percent of his attempts. Cornerback Lemar Parrish led the NFL in punt returns.

1975 The Bengals opened with six straight wins. LeClair preserved a 21-19 victory over Houston, making all four tackles in a goal-line stand. The Bengals won their eighth game in nine starts against Buffalo as Anderson completed 30 of 46 passes for 447 yards, the tenth-highest one-game total in NFL history. Cincinnati scored 27 points in the first quarter to crush San Diego 47-14 and finish 11-3, its best regular-season record. The Bengals qualified as the AFC wild card team for the playoffs, but their losing postseason record continued with a 31-28 setback to Oakland. Anderson won his second NFL passing championship. A serious blow was the loss of defensive tackle Mike Reid, who retired at 26 to pursue a career in music.

1976 Brown announced his retirement after 41 seasons of coaching and named Bill Johnson, his long-time assistant, as the successor. Brown continued to serve as the club's general manager and vice president. The Bengals acquired defensive end Coy Bacon in a trade with San Diego and drafted halfback Archie Griffin, the two-time Heisman Trophy winner from Ohio State. The Bengals set a fast pace in the AFC Central Division, winning 9 of their first 11 games. The season came down to games against Pittsburgh and Oakland and the Bengals lost both. Those defeats not only cost Cincinnati the division title but the AFC wild card spot as well. Cornerback Ken Riley led the AFC with nine interceptions.

1977 A loss to Houston in the final game cost the Bengals a spot in the playoffs. The team finished with an 8-6 record. Curtis missed the final six games with a knee

injury, Bob Trumpy retired.

1978 The Bengals played the first four games without Anderson. Johnson was replaced as head coach after 0-5 start. Homer Rice took over, but the losing streak continued; the Bengals won only once in the first three months of the season. Wins over Atlanta, Los Angeles, and Cleveland at

season's end improved the record to 4-12.

1979 After six straight losses to open the season, the Bengals stunned Pittsburgh 34-10, recovering seven Steelers fumbles. Ray Griffin ran back an intercepted pass a club-record 96 yards in a 26-24 loss to San Diego. Pete Johnson powered his way to 15 touchdowns, but the Bengals struggled to their second successive 4-12 record. Former Cleveland coach Forrest Gregg was named to replace Rice as head coach.

1980 Scoring touchdowns was the major problem as the Bengals went 6-10 in 1980. They managed only 244 points, lowest in the AFC. Anderson had a sub-par year with only six

touchdown passes. The Bengals won only one of their first five games but upset defending Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh twice. First-round draft choice Anthony Munoz

impressed at offensive tackle.

1981 The Bengals unveiled new uniforms with tigerstriped helmets, jerseys, and pants. They had at least a share of the AFC Central lead the entire season, and on December. 6 Anderson threw two touchdowns as the Bengals clinched the division with a 17-10 victory over the Steelers. Cornerback Louis Breeden tied an NFL record when he returned a pass interception 102 yards for a touchdown in Cincinnati's 40-17 victory over the Chargers in San Diego. Anderson led the NFL in passing with a 98.5 rating. On January 3, the Bengals defeated the Buffalo Bills 28-21 in an AFC divisional playoff game. A week later, playing in their first AFC Championship Game, the Bengals defeated the San Diego Chargers 27-7 in a temperature of nine degrees below zero with a wind-chill factor of minus 59. In Super Bowl XVI on January 24, the Bengals trailed 20-0 at halftime and couldn't make up the deficit, losing to San Francisco 26-21.

1982 The Bengals followed up their Super Bowl season with another strong showing. They finished the strike-shortened season behind only the Raiders with a 7-2 mark. The Jets caught them sleeping in the first round of the playoffs, though, beating them 44-17. Anderson led the AFC in passing for the fourth time as the Bengals boasted the second-best offense in the NFL. Their defense ranked third in the NFL

against the run.

1983 The Bengals' season looked promising at the start of 1983, but a horrendous opening brought about a premature ending. Cincinnati started the season by losing six of its first seven games. The Bengals never recovered and finished 7-9. Despite the losing record, the Bengals claimed the top overall defense in the NFL. In the off-season, Gregg resigned as head coach and Sam Wyche was named as his replacement.

1984 Pete Johnson was traded to San Diego for running back James Brooks. The Bengals lost their first five games and then bounced back to win eight of the last 11 and force the AFC Central Division championship race into the final week of the season, only to fall a game short of Pittsburgh.

Cincinnati finished 8-8.

1985 Wide receiver Eddie Brown from Miami (Fla.) was the Bengals' top draft choice. Wide receiver Isaac Curtis, a premier Bengal for 12 years, retired shortly before training camp opened. Cincinnati got off to another slow start, losing its first four games. The Bengals finished 7-9 and were in the thick of the AFC Central race, which was won by Cleveland with an 8-8 record. Second-year quarterback Boomer Esiason replaced Ken Anderson. Offensive tackle Anthony Munoz was named to the AFC Pro Bowl team the fifth consecutive time. The Bengals set a club scoring record with 441 points.

1986 Cincinnati's No. 1 selection in the college draft was linebacker Kelly, who played at Washington. Wide receiver Tim McGee of Tennessee was drafted later in the first round. Punter Pat McInally retired. The Bengals unleashed a high-powered offense in their battle for the AFC Central Division

title and finished 10-6 and narrowly missed a playoff berth. Offensive tackle Anthony Munoz was selected to the AFC Pro Bowl team for the sixth year in a row. He was joined by guard Max Montoya, running back James Brooks and quarterback Boomer Esiason. Linebacker Reggie Williams was selected "One of the Top 10 Young Men In America" by the United States Jaycees. Later, Williams was selected NFL Man of the Year for his efforts to charity and the community and was honored at the Pro Bowl in Honolulu, Hawaii. Munoz was named Seagrams' top offensive lineman of 1986.

1987 Jason Buck, a defensive end and Outland Trophy winner from Brigham Young, was the Bengals' No. 1 draft choice. Kicker Jim Breech led the AFC in scoring with 97 points. Offensive tackle Anthony Munoz was voted to the AFC Pro Bowl team for the seventh consecutive year. Munoz did not play in the Pro Bowl game because of a shoulder operation. Nose tackle Tim

Krumrie played in his first Pro Bowl game.

1988 The Bengals brought about the biggest turn-around in NFL history by rising from a 4-11 team in 1987 to a 12-4 regular season mark in 1988, the AFC Central Division title, the AFC championship and a berth in Super Bowl XXIII against the San Francisco 49ers. The Bengals fell in the Super Bowl, 20-16, when the 49ers scored a touchdown with 34 seconds remaining. Coach Sam Wyche and his Bengals recorded a 14-5 record in regular and post season play, the best in the NFL. Wyche received numerous honors for his brilliant coaching and nine Bengals were selected for the Pro Bowl – quarterback Boomer Esiason, nose tackle Tim Krumrie, tackle Anthony Munoz, guard Max Montoya, tight end Rodney Holman, wide receiver Eddie Brown, running back James Brooks, safety David Fulcher and cornerback Eric Thomas, Esiason was voted the NFL's most valuable player and Munoz the top offensive lineman. Linebacker Reggie Williams received the "Sportsman of the Year Award" from Sports Illustrated. The Award was presented to Williams by President Reagan in an Oval Office ceremony prior to the 1988 season. Defensive back Rickey Dixon, an All-American from Oklahoma, was the first selection in the 1988 draft. "Ickey" Woods, the top rusher in college football in 1987 while at Nevada-Las Vegas, was Cincinnati's second choice. Woods led the Bengals in rushing in 1988 with 1066 yards.

1989 The Bengals defeated the Buffalo Bills, 21-10, to win the AFC championship, on January 8 at Riverfront Stadium. Cincinnati lost to San Francisco, 20-16, in Super Bowl XXIII on January 22 in Miami, Fla. The Bengals traded their first round draft choice to Atlanta for three later selections. Eric Ball, a running back from UCLA, was Cincinnati's first selection, coming in the second round. Guard Freddie Childress of Arkansas was the Bengals' second choice in the second round. The Bengals, hit hard by injuries throughout the season, went 8-8 and narrowly missed gaining a spot in the playoffs. Six Bengals were selected for the Pro Bowl — tackle Anthony Munoz, quarterback Boomer Esiason, strong safety David Fulcher, running back James Brooks, tight end Rodney

Holman and guard Max Montoya.

1990 The Bengals obtained running back Paul Palmer and wide receiver Mike Barber and lost Montoya.

wide receiver Ira Hillary and tackle Rob Woods in Plan B. Cincinnati drafted Baylor linebacker James Francis in the first round of the draft. Running back Harold Green of South Carolina was the second round choice. Cincinnati posted a 9-7 regular season record to win the AFC Central Division Championship and move into the playoffs where the Bengals belted the Houston Oilers, 41-14, before losing to the Los Angeles Raiders, 20-10, in the second round. Three Bengals were selected for the Pro Bowl game – tackle Anthony Munoz, tight end Rodney Holman and strong safety David Fulcher.

1991 The Bengals acquired linebacker Alex Gordon and running back Derrick Fenner and lost safety Solomon Wilcots, nose tackle Mike Hammerstein and quarterback Todd Philcox in Plan B. Cincinnati drafted outside linebacker Alfred Williams, an All-American from Colorado, in the first-round of the 1991 draft. Paul Brown, founder of the Bengals and a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, died August 5. The Bengals had a 3-13 season record. Dave Shula replaced Sam Wyche as head coach following the season.

1992 The Bengals made quarterback David Klingler, who played in college for the University of Houston, their No.1 draft choice. Klingler started four of the final five games of the season in which the Bengals finished 5-11. Harold Green rushed for 1170 yards and was selected to play in the Pro Bowl. All Pro Anthony Munoz played his final game for the Bengals. Michael Pope was named offensive coordinator after the season, and Ken Anderson was signed as coach of

the quarterbacks.

1993 Defensive lineman John Copeland, an All-American from Alabama, was the Bengals' first-round draft choice. The Bengals acquired cornerbacks Sheldon White and Mike Brim and quarterback Jay Schroeder, who were unrestricted free agents, and lost cornerback Eric Thomas, wide receiver Tim McGee and safety Barney Bussey and tight end Jim Riggs. Quarterback Boomer Esiason was traded to the New York Jets for a third-round draft choice. The young Bengals lost their first 10 games before defeating the Los Angeles Raiders, 16-10. Cincinnati then had wins over the Los Angeles Rams, 15-3, and the Atlanta Falcons, 21-17, in the final weeks of the season and finished 3-13.

1994 The Cincinnati coaching staff underwent a change when Bruce Coslet, former head coach of the New York Jets, returned as the offensive coordinator and Larry Peccatiello became the defensive coordinator after Ron Lynn resigned. The Bengals signed eight veteran free agents while losing only one, and they used the top pick in the draft on Ohio

State defensive tackle Dan Wilkinson.

Sept. 19, 1982 – Pittsburgh 26, Cincinnati 20, at Pittsburgh; Bengals win toss. Anderson's pass intended for Kreider intercepted by Woodruff and returned 30 yards to Cincinnati 2. Bradshaw completes two-yard touchdown pass to Stallworth on first down at 1:08.

Dec. 2, 1984 - Cincinnati 20, Cleveland 17, at Cleveland; Browns win toss. Simmons returns Cox's punt 30 yards to Cleveland 35. Breech kicks 35-yard field goal seven plays later

at 4:34.

Sept. 14, 1986 – Cincinnati 36, Buffalo 33, at Cincinnati; Bills win toss. Zander intercepts Kelly's first down pass and returns it to Bills' 17. Breech kicks 23-yard field goal two plays later at 0:56.

Sept. 13, 1992 - Cincinnati 24, Los Angeles Raiders 21, at Cincinnati: Raiders win toss, fumble kickoff and Cincinnati

recovers. Jim Breech kicks 34-yard field goal.

Nov. 8, 1992 – Cincinnati 31, Chicago 28 at Chicago. Chicago wins toss. Bengals defense stops drive, takes over after punt and drives to Chicago 18-yard line. Breech delivers a 36-yard field goal.
