NORFOLK TIDES EXECUTIVES



KEN YOUNG has been the President of the Norfolk Tides since 1993, the year the team moved into Harbor Park. The previous year, Young put together an investor group to purchase the Tides from the New York Mets. Since taking over day-to-day control of the Tides, the club has experienced unprecedented success, averaging approximately 425,000 fans per year.

Young has been in the recreational food business for more than 30 years since graduating from Penn State University in 1972.

Young has been involved in numerous Major League stadiums, arenas, and international events, and has worked the Super Bowl, the World Series and the Olympics.

In the fall of 2006 Young headed an ownership group which purchased the Bowie Baysox and Frederick Keys, both of which were Maryland-based Orioles affiliates. Young also serves as the President for the Triple-A Albuquerque Isotopes and the Double-A Biloxi Shuckers. Bowie and Frederick were later sold prior to the 2022 season.

Young is also on the Board of Trustees of Minor League Baseball, and heads up the licensing operations for college football's Outback Bowl in Tampa, FL. After the 2009 season, he was named as Baseball America's Minor League Executive of the Year.

JOE GREGORY was named General Manager of the Tides on October 4, 2011. He also served as the Vice President of the Norfolk Admirals Hockey Club from the 2008-2009 season through 2016.

Gregory came to Norfolk after serving as the General Manager of the Youngstown SteelHounds of the Central Hockey League from 2006-2008. In that capacity, Gregory ran the day-to-day operations of the SteelHounds. During Gregory's tenure in Youngstown, the season ticket base increased by 70 percent and he negotiated the team's first NHL affiliation.



Gregory graduated from Youngstown State University in 2001 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration. Upon graduation, Gregory worked as both the Coordinator of Tournament Operations and the Coordinator of Sales and Marketing at the Giant Eagle LPGA Classic in Vienna, Ohio. He had been working at the tournament as an operations assistant prior to that since high school. After his time with the LPGA, Gregory became the Director of Business Development for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers, a Short-Season Class-A baseball affiliate of the Cleveland Indians. There, he oversaw all sponsorship and advertising sales and cultivated community relationships.

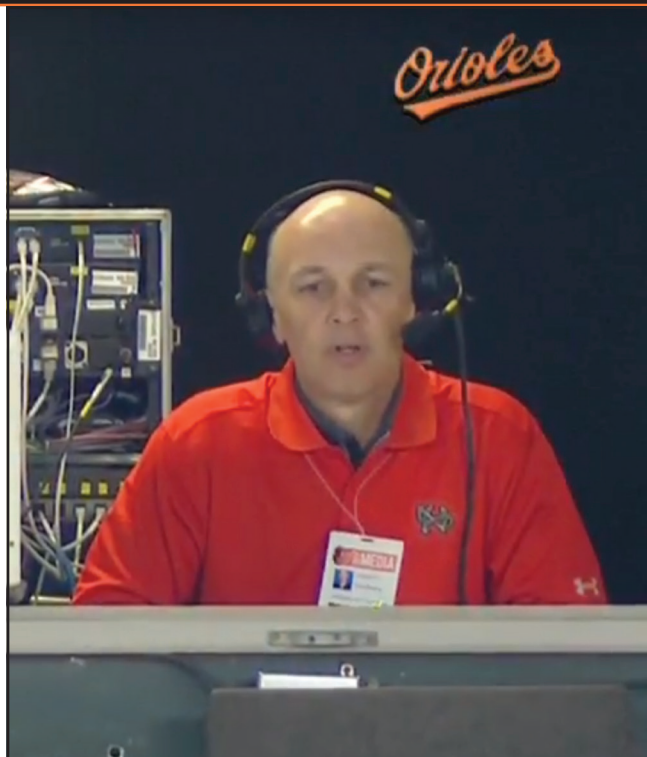
The 2022 season is the 17th for **PETE MICHAUD** as a broadcaster for the Tides on ESPN Radio 94.1. Previously, he's had stints as the play-by-play voice of the Springfield Cardinals of the Midwest League (1992-93), the Vero Beach Dodgers of the Florida State League (1995-96) and the Iowa Cubs of the PCL (1998).

Michaud was the longtime voice of the Norfolk Admirals hockey team, spending over 22 years with the organization - including all 15 of their seasons in the American Hockey League. Additionally, Pete's resume includes five seasons of play-by-play work as the broadcaster for the Old Dominion University Monarchs men's and women's

basketball programs - including NCAA and NIT tournament games - and 10 years of area high school football play-by-play. He has previously worked in local radio at WFOS, WLTY, WNIS and WTAR, while also serving as a weekend sports anchor for WAVY-TV 10 and WVEC-TV 13.

Michaud has been honored three times by the Chesapeake Athletic Club as Hampton Roads' Most Outstanding Sports Broadcaster, taking home the honor in 2009, 2012 and 2015. In 2009, he was selected by the Norfolk Sports Club for the prestigious Abe Goldblatt Award for Outstanding Local Sports Coverage. In 2012, he was the recipient of the James H. Ellery Memorial Award, an honor presented annually by the American Hockey League in recognition of outstanding media coverage. Michaud was also selected to broadcast the 2015 Triple-A All-Star Game, and he broadcasted games on the Orioles Radio Network during the 2017 season.

When not on the air, Pete is an avid golfer and has worked for many years as a local baseball umpire with the Eastern Officials Association. Michaud is an honor graduate of Indian River High School in Chesapeake and Old Dominion University in Norfolk. He resides in Moyock, NC. To honor the 55 years that Dave Rosenfield spent with the Tides, the number 55 was retired in 2017. It is the only Tides number that has been retired.

Minor League Baseball lost an icon in the industry when longtime Tides General Manager Dave Rosenfield passed away on February 28, 2017 at the age of 87 years old.

Rosenfield first joined the Tides in 1962, and he served as the General Manager of the ballclub from 1963-2011. Under his guidance, the Tides joined the Triple-A International League in 1969 before moving into Met Park in 1970, a ballpark that saw the Tides capture five league championships. Rosenfield then helped usher in a new era of Tides baseball in 1993, as the team moved into Harbor Park in downtown Norfolk – a ballpark that routinely drew over half a million fans a season. After concluding his 48-year run as General Manager in 2011, Rosenfield was named the Executive Vice President and Senior Advisor to the President, and he continued his work in the Tides front office until his passing.

A four-time International League Executive of the Year, Rosenfield is a member of three Halls of Fame. He was an inaugural member of the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in 2008, and he was inducted into the International League Hall of Fame that same season – the first Tide to ever receive the honor. He was also inducted into the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame in 2016.

Rosenfield was named the “King of Baseball” at the Baseball Winter Meetings in Anaheim, CA in December, 2004. The “King of Baseball” is a long-standing tradition in which Minor League Baseball salutes a veteran from the world of professional baseball for long-time dedication and service to the game.

In addition to his work with the Tides, Rosenfield had a wide-ranging presence in the Norfolk area’s pro sports scene. He served as the General Manager of the Norfolk Neptunes (Continental Football League), was the interim GM of the Virginia Squires (American Basketball Association), and served as the GM of the Tidewater Sharks hockey club.

The uniform number 55 was retired by the Tides in 2017 - the only number the team has ever retired - to commemorate his 55 years of service to the team.

RON JOHNSON | 1956-2021

The Norfolk Tides would like to dedicate this page to long-time manager Ron Johnson, who sadly passed away on January 26, 2021 at the age of 64 years old.

A native of Long Beach, California, Johnson was a manager in Minor League Baseball for 24 seasons, compiling a career record of 1,752-1,770 over that span. Known around Harbor Park as 'RJ', Johnson managed the Tides during the final seven seasons of his career from 2012-18 and amassed 491 wins in that time, making him both the winningest and longest-tenured manager in franchise history.

After leading Norfolk to winning campaigns in each of his first two seasons with the Tides in 2012 and 2013, Johnson led his team to a third winning season and a division title in 2015, and was named the International League's Manager of the Year - just the fifth manager to win the award in team history. He also received the Cal Ripken Sr. Player Development Award from the Orioles that season, an award presented to a minor league staff member who exemplifies the qualities of Ripken who is regarded as the architect of "The Oriole Way."

A special time in Johnson's long managerial career came in 2017, when he had the opportunity to manage his son, Chris, marking the first time the Tides have ever had a son be managed by his father. That same season, Johnson was chosen by fans as the manager on Norfolk's 25-year All-Harbor Park Team.

RON JOHNSON
1956-2021

Prior to joining the O's system, Johnson served as the first base coach for the Boston Red Sox in 2010 and 2011. He managed in the Red Sox system from 2000-2009, a stint that included a playoff berth for Triple-A Pawtucket in 2008 after an 85-58 campaign. Johnson was a coach in the Kansas City Royals system from 1986-91 before taking his first managerial job in 1992. He posted six winning seasons in eight years managing in the Royals organization, and he guided three clubs to the postseason: Baseball City (1992), Wichita (1995) and Omaha (1999). He was named the 1995 Texas League Manager of the Year after guiding Double-A Wichita to the playoffs.

While in high school, Johnson turned down football scholarships to UCLA and Fresno State, choosing instead to play baseball at Fresno State. He was a 1st Team All-American in 1978 before being selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 24th round of the 1978 draft.

Johnson played in 22 Major League games over parts of three seasons with the Royals (1982-83) and Expos (1984), batting .261. When he was playing for Montreal, his locker was next to Pete Rose's.

Buck Showalter, the Orioles manager from 2010-18, frequently called Johnson "the best Triple-A manager in baseball," and he was admired by the countless players he coached throughout his career. Johnson helped mold dozens of major league All-Stars over the years, and his players have described him as a motivator whose personality and love of the game brought out the best in everyone.

Johnson and his wife Daphne have five children - Savannah, Christopher, Christian, Cheyanne and Bridget. He will truly be missed by all.

HARBOR PARK



HARBOR PARK, with its outstanding view and sound design, was opened in 1993. The ballpark is located in downtown Norfolk on the Elizabeth River, and the Tides christened their new home on 4/14/93 with a 2-0 victory against the Ottawa Lynx.

Talks of a new stadium for the Tides began during the 1990 season. Several sites were discussed, and the area known as "Bessie's Place" in downtown Norfolk was selected due to the nationwide success of downtown ballparks. Ground was broken in February of 1992 and work began shortly after.

HOK Sports Facilities Group of Kansas City, Mo. (currently known as Populous) was chosen to design the crown jewel on the Norfolk waterfront. HOK Sports Facilities Group has also designed some of the finest major league parks, including Oriole Park at Camden Yards in Baltimore, PNC Park in Pittsburgh, Comerica Park in Detroit, PETCO Park in San Diego, Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia, Citi Field in New York and the new Yankee Stadium.

The design team, led by Earl Santee, elected to create a nautical image with shipyard crane-like light towers and arrays of colorful flags. However, it also had to fit into the downtown business scene, and the brick exterior of the stadium was selected for just that purpose.

Harbor Park features nearly 9,000 lower-deck seats, 2,800 upper-deck seats, and 400 seats in 24 luxury skyboxes. The park also features a 225-seat restaurant known as "Hits at the Park," a climate-controlled facility that offers a complete view of the playing field. Two LED video boards were installed in the right field scoreboard prior to the 2006 season, while three LED ribbon boards were installed prior to the 2013 season. New video boards were installed in left and right field prior to the 2022 season, setting the record for the most combined videoboard space in all of Minor League Baseball. An additional party deck was built in right field prior to the 2009 season which moved the right field fence in 20 feet. The playing surface was completely renovated prior to the 2014 season, with the center field fences moved in 10 feet. The picnic area in left field was completely renovated prior to the 2018 season. The Harbor Park field dimensions are 333 ft in LF, 400 ft in CF, and 318 ft in RF, and the capacity of the ballpark is 11,856.

The facility is owned by the City of Norfolk. Its construction was financed by rent paid by the Tides and other revenue from non-baseball events held in the facility. The total cost of construction for the stadium exceeded \$16 million.

Harbor Park was selected by Baseball America as the finest minor league facility in the United States in 1995.

CREDENTIALS: Daily credentials are available to outside media upon request. To obtain media credentials, please email jstanley@norfolktides.com. All requests should be made at least 24 hours prior to game time to assure compliance. If given a credential, you will pick it up at the Harbor Park main entrance no earlier than four hours prior to first pitch the day of the event. When you arrive, a member of the Tides Media Relations Staff will meet you at the main entrance with your credential and escort you to your assigned workspace. Please note that due to local laws and orders, the Tides must limit the number of media at each game. That limit is determined on a game-to-game basis and the Tides may prohibit media access on any given day.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers may work out of the camera pits located in the outfield ends of both dugouts. Other areas are available, but must be approved by the Tides prior to the game. At no time will photographers be allowed to obstruct a fan's view of the game, interfere with play on the field, or interfere with players in the dugout. Photographers MUST stay in the designated areas during play.

GAME NOTES: Game notes, rosters, lineups and statistics are available in the press box approximately three hours prior to game time. Anyone needing information earlier should contact the media relations office. To be added to a game notes distribution list, please email jstanley@norfolktides.com.

FIELD, DUGOUTS AND CLUBHOUSES: A general code is to be observed by the media so uniformed personnel may do their pre-game work unimpeded. BUCK BRITTON is entering his second year managing in Norfolk and his 14th season in the Orioles organization overall. In 2008, he was drafted by the Orioles in the 35th round out of Lubbock Christian University. Britton would go on to play seven seasons in Baltimore's organization, including four seasons with the Norfolk Tides (2010, 2012 - 2014). He played for the Los Angeles Dodgers organization in 2015 and the Minnesota Twins organization in 2016 before retiring as a player. In 2017, Britton came back to the Orioles organization as a hitting coach for the Single-A Delmarva Shorebirds. He was elevated to manager for Delmarva in the 2018 season and then became manager of the Double-A Bowie Baysox in 2019. With the season getting cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020, he coached at the Orioles Alternate Training Site but returned as manager for Bowie in 2021. Bowie reached their league championship series in both of the seasons Britton managed, totaling a 5-7 career playoff record. He won the Eastern League Manager of the Year Award in 2019. In his first season with Norfolk, Buck went 74-76. In his four seasons as manager, Britton has 291 wins and 253 losses.

As a player, Buck totaled 828 Minor League games and hit .270 with 59 home runs and 407 RBI. In his four seasons with the Tides, he played 130 games and hit .245 with 44 runs, 22 doubles, 13 home runs and 62 RBI. He played 58 games at third base, 33 games at second, 18 games at first, six games in left field, and two games in right. He recorded a 21-game hitting streak with the Tides in 2013, tied for the third longest hitting streak in franchise history.

Britton was born in Panorama City, California and graduated from Weatherford High School (Texas). He played JUCO baseball at Lon Morris College and then played Division I baseball at Steven F. Austin University and Lubbock Christian University. Baltimore drafted Britton in 2008 in the 35th round of the MLB Draft from LCU. His brother, Zack, has 139 saves with Baltimore, ranking second in franchise history.

JUSTIN RAMSEY is entering his second season as Norfolk's Pitching Coach. The 2023 season will be his fourth as a coach in professional baseball, where he was the pitching coach for Delmarva in 2019, an Orioles Alternate Site coach in 2020 and was Double-A Bowie's pitching coach in 2021. In 2019, Delmarva led the South Atlantic League in ERA (3.00), WHIP (1.18), and strikeouts (1,389), and allowed the fewest home runs (67). Under Ramsey's guidance, Delmarva set the South Atlantic League record for the most strikeouts in a single season. He was then named 2019 South Atlantic League Coach of the Year. In his first season with the Tides in 2022, Norfolk set franchise records in strikeouts (1,386) and strikeouts per game (9.08).

Ramsey began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Sacramento City College (SCC) for six seasons from 2005 to 2010, spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 2012 to 2014, and then as pitching coach for Nova Southeastern University (NSU) from 2015 to 2018 before joining the Orioles organization. At NSU, Ramsey helped his team reach four straight NCAA Division II Regional Tournament appearances, including the program's first ever NCAA Division II National Championship win in 2016. Ramsey coached that year's Sunshine State Conference Pitcher of the Year Alejandro Mateo, as well as the MVP of both the South Regional and National Tournaments in Devin Raftery.

Outside of college and MLB-affiliated baseball, Ramsey coached in the Northwood League and the Cape Cod League. In 2010, he served as the pitching coach for the La Crosse Loggers. Later on, he was the pitching coach for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox of the Cape Cod League in 2013. That team featured future Major Leaguers Erick Fedde, DJ Stewart, Sam Coonrod and Jose Trevino among others.

In his playing career, Ramsey started with two seasons at SCC from 2001-02. He then transferred to Oral Roberts, selecting them over Belmont, Western Kentucky, UNLV and Fresno State. Ramsey was a closer and relief pitcher for Oral Roberts from 2003-04. A 2004 All-American, Ramsey posted a 7-0 record with 13 saves as a senior, posting a 2.91 ERA. A two-time All-Summit League selection, Ramsey led the Golden Eagles to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. He ranks fourth all-time with 18 career saves for Oral Roberts. After graduating as a Business Marketing major, he played three seasons for the Long Beach Armad of the independent Golden Baseball League from 2005 through 2007 while he coached at SCC. He finished third in voting for league Rookie of the Year. He retired after the 2007 season, going 18-11 with a save and a 3.75 ERA in 69 games.

The Norfolk Tides recorded 314 transactions in 2022, setting the franchise record (262 in 2021). The Tides had 83 different players appear on their roster, with 81 of them appearing in a game (Mason McCoy, Jesús Aguilar). 35 players appeared both on the Tides and Orioles ro

TIDES HISTORY

NORFOLK TIDES HISTORY (1955 - 2003)

The city of Norfolk had been without pro baseball since the Tars of the Piedmont League folded on July 13, 1955. The Portsmouth Merrimacs finished that season, but the league folded after the year.

A South Atlantic League exhibition game was held in Portsmouth at Lawrence Stadium and was followed by a study by Joe Ryan and Marshall Fox (who became the first General Manager of the Tides) to bring baseball back to the area. A Tidewater franchise in the South Atlantic League was granted in 1961 to businessman William McDonald of Miami, FL.

The name "Tides" was selected in a contest conducted by The Virginian-Pilot. Mariners was the name of choice, but editor Robert Mason liked the sound and alliteration of Tidewater Tides.

The team operated in the South Atlantic League for two years, the first as an independent, and the second with a Cardinals working agreement. Granny Hamner, the former Phillie Whiz Kid, was the first manager.

In 1963, the Sally League decided against continuing in Virginia because of travel requirements and the prospect of losing baseball again loomed. However, Dave Rosenfield, Assistant GM in 1962, led a local group to gain admittance to the Carolina League in tandem with a Peninsula franchise.

The Tides operated in the Carolina League for six years under Tidewater Professional Sports, Inc., which was led by the late Richard J. Davis, a former Lieutenant Governor of Virginia.

In 1969, the New York Mets moved their Triple-A International League franchise from Jacksonville, FL to Tidewater. T.P.S. Inc. continued to run the team, but it was owned by the Mets. That first year in Triple-A was played in Portsmouth's Lawrence Stadium and the Tides went on to win the pennant under manager Clyde McCullough. At the same time, the Mets helped the City of Norfolk finance the construction of 6,200 seat Met Park.

The Tidewater Tides enjoyed unparalleled success in the 70s and 80s, as Tidewater won Governors' Cup championships in 1972, '75, '82, '83 and '85. During that time, the Tides competed in the first and last Fall Classic of Minor League Champions, the last Junior World Series, and they won the first Triple-A World Series in 1983 - a fall classic that was not played again until 1998.

The Tides captured the 1982 Governors' Cup, beating Columbus and Rochester en route to the title. The team's playoff run was bolstered by a young outfielder named Darryl Strawberry, who also opened the 1983 season with the Tides before being promoted to New York, where he would embark on an All-Star career. The 1983 Tides were skippered by Davey Johnson, who led the Tides to the Governors' Cup Title before going on to manage the Mets in 1984.

The success in Tidewater translated to the major leagues as well. When the New York Mets won the World Series over the Boston Red Sox in 1986, they did so with a team that consisted of 14 former Tides, a list that included stars like Dwight Gooden, Darryl Strawberry, Kevin Mitchell, Mookie Wilson, Wally Backman, Ron Darling and Lenny Dykstra, among others. Former Tides skipper Davey Johnson managed that squad to their first World Series title since 1969.

The Tides continued their strong performances in the late 80s, as Mike Cubbage's 1987 team won the International League pennant by virtue of having the best record. Several team records were set during that 1987 campaign, and the Tides advanced to the IL Finals only to be upset by the Pawtucket Red Sox. The Tides advanced to the IL Finals in 1988, but fell in four games to the Rochester Red Wings.

The Tides franchise saw many changes during the early 1990s, as the Mets agreed to sell the franchise to a group led by businessman Ken Young in 1992. That year ground was also broken on a new state-of-the-art facility in downtown Norfolk. The club dropped the Tidewater name in favor of Norfolk to give the team a national geographic presence. Also, the City of Norfolk was quite instrumental in keeping the team in the area by getting the new stadium financed and built.

Harbor Park was opened on April 14, 1993, as the Tides beat the Ottawa Lynx 2-0 in front of a capacity crowd of 12,113. The Tides set a franchise record for attendance in 1993 when 542,040 fans bought tickets to a game at Harbor Park. General Manager Dave Rosenfield won his 4th IL Executive of the Year Award and the team won its first John H. Johnson President's Trophy from the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues. This award is emblematic of the "complete" baseball franchise. It is based on the club's history, commitment to the community, and success financially and at the box office.

In 1994, the Tides won the Triple-A Bob Freitas Award from Baseball America, and the club once again set an attendance record with 557,586 fans. The Tides established another new attendance record in 1995, as 586,317 fans watched the Tides advance to the International League postseason for the first time since 1988.

The 1995 season was Harbor Park's first foray into postseason play as the Tides tied the franchise record with 86 wins, a mark last accomplished in 1975. The Tides were selected by Baseball America as its "Team Of The Year" as more than a dozen players graduated to the Major League level during the year. Norfolk swept the IL postseason awards, as Jason Isringhausen was named Rookie of the Year and Pitcher of the Year, Butch Huskey was named IL MVP, and Toby Harrah was named IL Manager of the Year. The Tides beat Richmond in the IL Semifinals, but fell to Ottawa in six games in the IL Championship series.

1996 saw a return to postseason play, and also the return of a manager. Bobby Valentine returned to skipper the Tides, becoming the first manager to serve a second tour of duty at the helm of the Tides. Valentine's return did not last the full season, however, as he was promoted to New York to replace Dallas Green as the Mets manager on August 26th, taking longtime pitching coach Bob Apodaca with him. The Tides went on to drop the IL Semifinals to Columbus.

Harbor Park played host to some large concerts near the turn of the century, as Leann Rimes (1996), Tim McGraw (1997), Willie Nelson (2009), John Mellencamp (2009) and Bob Dylan (2009) all played the venue.

The Tides hosted the 11th Annual Triple-A All-Star Classic in 1998 to rave reviews in front of a national television and radio audience. Outfielder Benny Agbayani made the All-Star Game a memorable one, as he and his wife were married at home plate prior to that night's contest. Manager Rick Dempsey and his team finished the season with a 70-72 record as they finished 2nd in the South Division of the expanded IL, behind newcomer Durham.

Former player John Gibbons returned to manage the Tides in 1999, as he led the Tides to a 77-63 mark. Gibbons skippered the Tides in both 2000 and 2001, and he led the club to the IL postseason in 2001 after posting an 86-57 mark. The 2001 squad won the division by 12 games, but a series of September callups decimated the squad as Norfolk fell in the first round of the playoffs to Louisville.

The Tides suffered back-to-back losing campaigns in 2002 and 2003, but the 2003 campaign featured New York's top prospect in shortstop Jose Reyes. The youngster dazzled in his brief time with the Tides, swiping 26 bases before his promotion in June. Later during that 2003 season, the Tides set numerous attendance records when fans flocked to Harbor Park to get a glimpse of future Hall of Famer Mike Piazza in a rehab assignment. Piazza homered once during his five-game stint with the Tides.

NORFOLK TIDES HISTORY (2004 - PRESENT)

The 2004 season was highlighted by the promotion of Chesapeake native David Wright to the Tides in mid-June. Wright hit .298 with 8 home runs and 17 RBI in just 31 games with Norfolk before being promoted to New York in July. Wright would go on to become a seven-time All-Star with the Mets, helping New York to the postseason in 2006 and 2015.

The Tides returned to the playoffs in 2005, as manager Ken Oberkfell helped the Tides win the IL South by a record 14.0 games. Pitcher Jason Scobie earned the starting nod at the Triple-A All-Star game and eventually tied a Tides franchise record with 15 wins, while Brian Daubach powered Norfolk's offense throughout the season. The Tides fell to eventual league champion Toledo in five games in the IL semis.

Norfolk struggled to a 57-84 mark in 2006, using a season-ending five-game winning streak to avoid posting the worst record in franchise history. 26 different Tides appeared in the major leagues, including John Maine and Oliver Perez, who both pitched tremendously for the parent New York Mets during the postseason. 2006 turned out to be the 38th and final year for the Tides as the Mets Triple-A affiliate, as Norfolk partnered with the Baltimore Orioles after the season concluded.

The 2007 season got off to a great start, as the Baltimore Orioles defeated the Washington Nationals in a Major League spring training game in front of a sellout crowd at Harbor Park. During the regular season, Mike Cervenak became the first Tides player to lead the league in hits in 11 years.

On October 28, 2008, Democratic presidential nominee Barack Obama campaigned before a crowd of over 20,000 at Harbor Park. One week later, he was named the 44th president of the United States.

The 2009 Tides found themselves with the top record in all of minor league baseball (34-15) when play began on June 1, but that success was limited once the club lost several players to Baltimore, including Nolan Reimold, Matt Wieters, Brad Bergesen, and David Hernandez. Strong pitching performances by youngsters Chris Tillman and Jake Arrieta, as well as a solid offensive season from infielder Justin Turner helped Norfolk end the year with a 71-71 record.

The 2010 season saw a midseason managerial change, as Bobby Dickerson replaced Gary Allenson on June 4 after Allenson was promoted to the Baltimore Orioles coaching staff. The season was highlighted by a nine-inning no-hitter from 22-year-old Chris Tillman, who tossed the gem on April 28 at Gwinnett.

Norfolk returned to its winning ways in 2012, as new manager Ron Johnson navigated a staggering amount of roster moves to guide the Tides to a 74-70 record - Norfolk's first winning season as an Orioles affiliate. The Tides set an IL record by using 75 different players, and Baltimore advanced to the postseason for the first time since 1997.

The 2013 Tides nearly returned to the postseason, as Norfolk took a one-game lead in the Wild Card standings into the final day of the season, only to see Rochester pull even with a last day win. Norfolk and Rochester each finished with identical 77-67 records, but the Red Wings advanced to the playoffs due to winning the season series. Norfolk closer Jairo Asencio led the league with 28 saves and was named to the postseason All-Star team.

2014 was Ron Johnson's third year at the helm of the Tides, and Norfolk finished in third place in the IL South. Twenty one different players played for both the Tides and Orioles, as Baltimore won the American League East Division for the first time since the 1997 campaign. The O's defeated the Detroit Tigers in the ALDS before falling to the Kansas City Royals in the American League Championship Series.

Norfolk returned to the postseason in 2015 by finishing 78-66 atop the difficult IL South - the first division in league history to have each of its teams finish above the .500 mark. Ron Johnson was named IL Manager of the Year, while closer Oliver Drake and outfielder Dariel Álvarez were both named to the postseason All-Star Team. Norfolk lost a five-game series to eventual IL Champions Columbus in the semifinals.

The Tides missed the postseason in 2016, but several former Tides were instrumental in helping the Orioles advance to the AL Wild Card Game - Baltimore's third playoff appearance over a five-year span.

2017 kicked off with an Exhibition Game between the Tides and Orioles, the fifth time the O's had played in Norfolk since 2007. In the 25th season of baseball at Harbor Park, Norfolk finished with a 66-76 record. Veteran slugger Pedro Álvarez was named to the postseason All-Star team after ranking among league leaders in home runs (5th, 26) and RBI (2nd, 89).

In 2018, the Tides were in the thick of a playoff chase all season long, but a late-season skid dropped Norfolk to 69-71. The Tides saw 33 different players appear with Norfolk and Baltimore, with 13 players making their Major League debuts with the Orioles.

The 2019 Tides were led by Ryan Mountcastle, Norfolk's first league MVP since 1997. Mountcastle hit .312 with 25 home runs and 83 RBI, leading the league in hits and total bases. LHP Keegan Akin paced the circuit with 131 strikeouts and led qualifying pitchers in average against.

The 2020 season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Unfortunately, the Tides did not play a game for the first time since 1960.

Baseball returned to Norfolk for the 2021 season. Triple-A started in May and played 130 games through the first weekend of October, the first October baseball in Tides history. The season was highlighted with the arrival of Adley Rutschman on August 10, who was ranked as the #1 prospect in baseball by MLB.com and Baseball America at the time.

2022 was the first season under Tides new manager Buck Britton. The Tides went 74-76 in the first season of the International League having 150 games since 1964. Throughout the season, the Tides totaled six players ranked in the Top 100 Prospects by MLB.com: Adley Rutschman, Grayson Rodriguez, Gunnar Henderson, DL Hall, Colton Cowser and Jordan Westburg. Rutschman and Rodriguez were a pitching battery three times, each while they were respectively the #1 hitting and pitching prospects in baseball. Henderson would later be ranked as the #1 prospect in baseball by Baseball America; highlighted after he hit for the cycle on June 28. Gunnar would be named Top MLB Prospect in the International League. 2022 was also the introduction of the Tides' new video boards, which at the time provided the most combined video board space in all of Minor League Baseball.

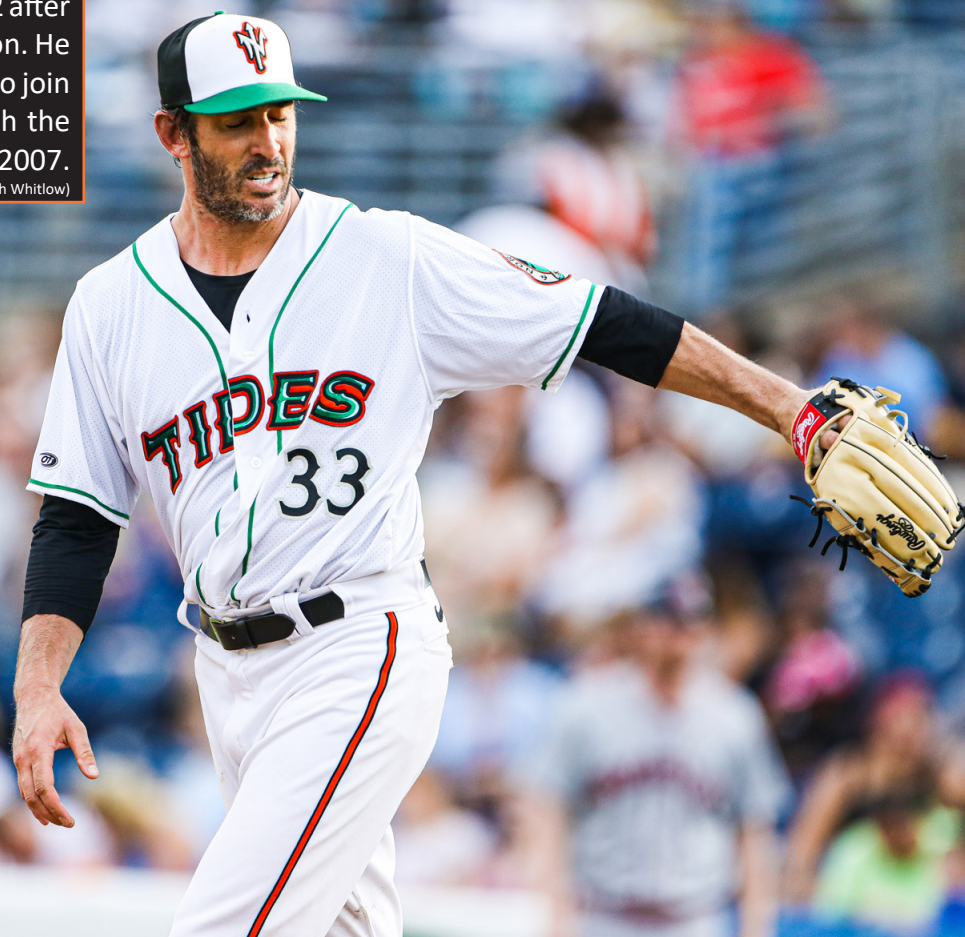
