

### Notes

#### LEADING IN

• The Breakers come into Saturday's match at Chicago on the strength of back-to-back victories over Saint Louis Athletica and the Washington Freedom. The wins vaulted Boston into sole possession of second place in the WPS standings, three points behind the Sol and one point clear of the Red Stars.

#### SCOUTING THE RED STARS

 The Red Stars were held to a 0-0 draw by Sky Blue FC in Chicago's home opener last weekend despite chances on both sides. It was the second-straight tie for the Red Stars after opening the season with a 1-0 victory at Saint Louis. Chicago's Swedeish goalkeeper Caroline Jönsson has come up big for the club over the past two weeks. Two weeks ago she came up with 13 saves to preserve the tie against Washington after Chicago captain and defender Frida Östberg was sent off in the 63rd minute. Last weekend Jönsson notched her second clean sheet of the year. Lindsay Tarpley has both Red Star goals on the year.

#### **LEAGUE LEADERS**

· Boston's Kelly Smith and Los Angeles' Marta are making a case as the early frontrunners for WPS MVP. The international stars are tied for the league lead in goals scored with three in as many matches, and they have their teams placed No. 1 and No. 2 in the league standings. Following this weekend's action, the two will face each other in back-to-back weeks. Boston hosts LA on May 2nd and will travel to face the Sol at the Home Depot Center on May 10.

#### MOMENTUM CHANGER

Boston goalkeeper Kristin Luckenbill was named the Goal.com WPS Player of the Week on Monday for Week 4 after her penalty kick save on Abby Wambach helped lead the Breakers to victory. With the game tied 1-1 and the Freedom starting to enjoy the better of play, Luckenbill's stop turned the momentum around, and four minutes later Christine Latham grabbed the winner for Boston en route to a 3-1 win. It was the second straight week a Breakers player received the award (Kelly Smith - Week 3).

#### **B**USY WEEK

Both Boston and Chicago have members of the English National Team, which defeated Norway, 3-0, in a friendly on Thursday in Shrewsbury, England. Boston's Kelly Smith and Alex Scott, as well as Chicago's Karen Carney all played the full 90 minutes in the match. All three players are expected to be back in Chicago for Saturday's match.

#### **O**UT OF **A**CTION

Chicago's Brazilian forward Cristiane will miss Saturday's match as she is with her national team competing in Europe. Brazil held Germany to a 1-1 draw on Wednesday in front of 44,825 fans in Frankfurt - the largest ever crowd to view a women's soccer match in Europe. Brazil wraps up its trip with a match versus 2009 Algarve Cup Champions Sweden on Saturday.

#### **REMATCH**

· The Breakers and Red Stars met once in the preseason, battling to a 1-1 draw in Lauderhill, Fla. Karen Carney opened the scoring for Chicago while Amy Rodriguez got the equalizer for Boston.

#### WEEK 3 ACCOLADES

 With a goal and an assist in the Breakers' 2-0 win over Saint Louis in Boston's home opener on April 11, both WPS and Goal.com recognized English forward Kelly Smith as their Player of the Week for Week 3. Smith is now eligible for the WPS Player of the Month award for April.

#### FIRST PLAYER EVER

· Boston forward Kelly Smith became the first player to have scored in both U.S. professional women's soccer leagues when she scored in the 79th minute of Boston's 2-1 loss **Goal Frequency** at FC Gold Pride in the season opener. Smith played three seasons with the WUSA's Philadelphia Charge, although she was injured for much of the final two campaigns.

#### THEY HAD THE BEAT

· Boston's Nancy Augustyniak-Goffi and Abby Crumpton were teammates with Chicago defender Ifeoma Dieke in 2003 with the Atlanta Beat in the WUSA. The Beat advanced to the championship game that season where they fell to the Washington Freedom.

#### **LONDON CALLING**

• In addition to all being teammates on the English National Team, Boston's Kelly Smith, Alex Scott and Chicago's Karen Carney all played for London-based Arsenal Ladies FC. They were all a part of the 2006-07 squad that

· Boston's Kristine Lilly and Chicago's Lindsay Tarpley each have had their numbers, 15 and 25, respectively, retired by the University of North Carolina. The number retiring at UNC is reserved for those who receive recognition as National Player of the Year.

#### A SORT OF HOMECOMING

· Defender Amy LePeilbet, a native of Crystal Lake, Ill., is going back to the area where she grew up for Saturday's match. In addition to some familiar faces in the stands, she has three former teammates from last summer's W-League champion Pali Blues squad now wearing the Red Stars jersey - Danesha Adams, Brittany Klein and Jill Oakes.

#### **ACT OF COURAGE**

· Breakers goalkeeper Kristin Luckenbill is familiar with Chicago Red Stars general manager Marcia McDermott. McDermott was Luckenbill's head coach with the WUSA's Carolina Courage. Luckenbill was the league's Goalkeeper of the Year in 2002 en route to winning the Founders Cup with Carolina.

#### **BACK IN THE WUSA**

- The Breakers have eight players on their roster that played in the previous American women's pro soccer league, including two that have returned to the Breakers - Kristine Lilly and Angela Hucles.

- · Chicago has two players who played in the former league: Scottish defender Ifeoma Dieke (Atlanta) and defender Bonnie Young (N.Y. Power).

- Several Breakers missed the first two weeks of preseason training after competing in Europe for their respective National Teams.

Canada finished runner-up.

- Kelly Smith scored the winning goal in the championship game to lift England to the Cyprus Cup title with a 3-1 win over Canada.
- · Angela Hucles, Heather Mitts and Amy Rodriguez all started for the U.S. National Team as they placed second at the Algarve Cup in Portugal

#### CENTURY MARK

 Heather Mitts became the 25th American woman to reach 100 career caps with her start in the Algarve Cup final on March 11. She followed Angela Hucles, who had been the most-recent American to hit the century mark, doing so back on Nov. 8 in a 1-0 friendly win over Korea Republic.

#### **Preseason Friendlies**

March 6: Kristine Lilly and Brittany Cooper each scored to lift the Breakers past UConn, 2-0, in Storrs, Conn.

March 11: Kelly Schmedes notched a hattrick while Kristine Lilly added a goal and an assist as the Breakers downed Boston College, 6-1, in Chestnut Hill, Mass.

March 18: In their first action against another WPS club, the Breakers battled to a 1-1 draw with the Chicago Red Stars in a rain-filled contest in Lauderhill, Fla. Amy Rodriguez equalized for Boston in the 36th minute after Karen Carney had opened the scoring after 17 minutes.

March 21: The Breakers received goals from Kelly Schmedes and Jennie Nobis in a 2-0 victory over the University of Florida, in the Breakers' final scrimmage in the Sunshine State before returning to Boston.

# Offense Explodes for Three Second-Half Goals in Win Over Freedom

Boyds, Md. (April 18, 2009) – The first two penalty kicks in league history each turned out favorably for Boston as Kelly Smith opened the scoring from the penalty spot while Kristin Luckenbill saved what would have been a go-ahead Abby Wambach penalty 16 minutes later in the Breakers' 3-1 win over the Washington Freedom in Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) action Saturday evening at the Maryland SoccerPlex in Boyds, Md.

Smith, the reigning WPS Player of the Week, put the Breakers (2-1-0) in front with her league-leading third goal of the season in the 56th minute. Angela Hucles was fouled inside the area by Freedom goalkeeper Briana Scurry to lead to the spot kick.

The Freedom (0-2-1) came right back and leveled the score just four minutes later on a goal from Lori Lindsey, assisted by Rebecca Moros, and then had a chance to take the lead in the 72nd minute after Boston defender Amy LePeilbet was called for a hand ball in the box. Wambach's penalty attempt was saved by a diving Luckenbill, who read correctly toward the lower right hand corner.

The Breakers made the Freedom pay for the miss by capitalizing four minutes later on a header by second-half substitute Christine Latham. After a nice run by Kristine Lilly led to a Latham cross that was cleared by Scurry, Alex Scott sent the ball back in to Latham, who headed the ball past Scurry.

Angela Hucles added to the Breakers lead in the 81st minute with an unassisted goal from the edge of the penalty area into the upper corner of the goal.

"There was some good and some bad," said Breakers head coach Tony DiCicco. "I thought our back line and our goalkeeper Luckenbill defended very well. Offensively we finished very well in the second half. I didn't think we passed the ball as well as we normally have, and we gave a lot of balls away, but give credit to Washington for that.

"I'm proud of this team though. The best teams find a way to get results even when not playing their best, and I thought we did that tonight."

The teams battled an evenly contested first half with chances on both sides despite the 0-0 scoreline. Boston's best chance of the first half came in the 36th minute when Lilly turned and beat a Freedom defender in side the penalty area, beat Scurry, but had her effort headed away by Becky Sauerbrunn in time to prevent the goal.
