

Team History

Washington was selected as one of eight teams to participate in the NWSL's inaugural season in 2013. In December 2012, the team's name was announced as the Washington Spirit.

After joining the club as a minority investor in 2021, health information technology visionary Michele Kang became the majority owner of the Spirit prior to the 2022 season.

Since its start in the NWSL, the Spirit has participated in all ten seasons of the league, with its best result coming in 2021 when Washington defeated the Chicago Red Stars to win its first-ever NWSL Championship.

The Spirit began playing select games at Audi Field in Washington, D.C. during the 2018 season and set a still-standing attendance record on August 24, 2019 when the club hosted 19,871 fans in a 2-1 win over the Orlando Pride.

Effective at the start of 2023 season, the Spirit will play all home matches at Audi Field as part of Michele Kang's vision to build a 'premier, professional and proudly DC' women's soccer team.

Majority Owner Michele Kang



A visionary in the field of health information technology, Michele founded Cognosante in 2008 to disrupt and challenge the status quo in the U.S. healthcare system. Leveraging a unique set of business, data, and technical expertise in a fundamentally different way, Cognosante began by providing solutions central to carrying out national healthcare transformation. Under Michele's leadership, Cognosante has grown rapidly, and emerged as a trusted provider of innovative health and safety solutions for key Federal health, military, and intelligence agencies as well as state health and social services agencies.

To further her goal of transforming the healthcare system, Michele established Cognosante Ventures to fuel promising health IT startups. By investing in and mentoring these companies, Cognosante Ventures supports the development of technologies that will fundamentally change the way U.S. citizens experience public services and programs.

Michele's commitment to equity, inclusion, and opportunity for all is reflected in Cognosante's culture and the philanthropic initiatives she established. Her efforts promote economic sustainability through entrepreneurship and focus on increasing opportunities for Veterans, under- resourced young adults, and persons with disabilities. With a mission to promote the dignity of work, the Cognosante Foundation, established in 2012, focuses on supporting members from underserved communities as they pursue financial independence through meaningful careers. In 2021, Michele launched Cognosante's HBCU Partner Alliance, a new program built through a targeted collaboration with Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). The HBCU Partner Alliance prepares students of color for promising careers in IT and government contracting. Michele is also actively engaged in promoting Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) studies and careers for girls and women.

In recognition of her entrepreneurial success and philanthropic efforts, she has received numerous accolades including the Palm Beach Atlantic University 2019 American Free Enterprise Medal, the 2015 EY Entrepreneur of The Year[®] for the Washington, DC region, and the U.S. Award for Services. She was elected along with U.S. senators, high-ranking government officials, and top executives of Fortune 500 companies as an inaugural member of 100 Women Leaders in STEM in 2012 and one of the "Top 100 CEO Leaders in STEM" in 2016.

In 2020, Michele laid the groundwork for women's ownership of major sports franchises by becoming the first female co-owner of a National Women's Soccer League club, the Washington Spirit. In March 2022, Michele became the club's majority owner, committing to substantial investments in culture and infrastructure for the team's growth and success. Michele is also an active supporter of the arts and technology; she is a Trustee on the Boards of the Washington National Opera and the Norton Museum of Art, and the Northern Virginia Technology Council. Michele earned a bachelor's degree in economics from The University of Chicago and a master's degree in public and private management from Yale School of Management.

Audi Field

Audi Field is a state-of-the-art soccer-specific venue that is home to the the NWSL's Washington Spirit, MLS' D.C. United and the XFL's DC Defenders. Located in Washington, D.C.'s Buzzard Point, the stadium officially opened its doors on July 14th, 2018.



In 2018, the Spirit coordinated with D.C. United to start playing select home matches at Audi Field, located in Buzzard Point, Washington D.C. The Spirit played its first-ever game there on August 25, 2018. A year later, on August 24, 2019, the team hosted a club record 19,871 fans. After hosting seven games at Audi Field in 2021 and another nine in 2022, the Spirit will play all 14 home fixtures of 2023 at the Buzzard Point venue. Washington enters 2023 with an overall record of 11-3-6 at Audi Field.

MARK PARSONS Head Coach

Mark Parsons returns to the Spirit as Head Coach after his most recent tenure as the manager of the Netherlands Women's National Team. Parsons previously held the role of Head Coach for the Washington Spirit from 2013 to 2015, his first managerial position in the NWSL.

Since managing the Spirit in 2013, Parsons established himself as one of the top coaches in professional women's soccer. In 2015, he became head coach of Portland Thorns FC where he led the team to two NWSL Shields (2016, 2021), an NWSL Community Shield (2020), an NWSL Challenge Cup Championship (2021) and an NWSL Challenge Cup Championship (2021) and an NWSL Championship (2017). In his six years as head coach in Portland, the Thorns made every available postseason and did not finish worse than the NWSL Semifinals. He was named the 2016 NWSL Coach of the Year.

Following his stint with Portland, Parsons was named the manager of the Netherlands Women's National Team in 2021, before returning to the Spirit in November of 2022.



Earned a pair of NWSL Save of the Week honors, in Week 9 and Week 12... Joined Australian side Sydney FC on loan during the NWSL's 2017-2018 offseason to compete in the Westfield W-League. 2018: Kingsbury finished her first season as a member of the Spirit with an NWSL regular season record 108 saves... She racked up four clean sheets on the season and made a career-high 10 saves in her Spirit debut in the club's regular-season opener on March 24 against Seattle Reign FC... Kingsbury won back-to-back NWSL Save of the Week awards in Weeks 5 and 6, and was named the NWSL Player of the Week for Weeks 11 and 12. 2019: Started all 24 matches... played a total of 2,149 minutes of game time... Secured 9 clean sheets and 86 saves in 24 matches... had a success rate of saves of 0.775 and a goals-against-average of 1.05... Was named to the Team of the Month in the months of May, June and August, and was named the 2019 NWSL Goalkeeper of the Year. 2020: Started all nine matches... played a total of 810 minutes of game time... Secured three clean sheets and 20 saves in nine games... had a save success rate of 66.7% and a goals-against-average of 0.8 in the Challenge Cup and a success rate of 75% and a goals-against-average of 1 in the Fall Series. 2021: Started all 25 matches... played a total of 2,310 minutes of game time... 



The forward scored 47 goals and recorded 21 assists for the Cougars in her four years on the team, earning her All-WCC First Team honors. Her senior year, Hatch was the first player in the nation to score 10 and 15 goals in the 2016 NCAA Season. She was a finalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy Award and scored two hat tricks in 2016.

PROFESSIONAL

Ricketts signed with the Spirit on March 2, 2023, becoming the youngest player in NWSL history at that time. At just 15 years old, Ricketts impressed on her youth club, AFC Ann Arbor to earn her first professional contract.
