ABOUT US

For the first time since 1976, when the Kentucky Colonels basketball team ceased operations, Louisville fields a top-tier professional sports franchise in Racing Louisville FC, a National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) team.

Racing Louisville FC is run by Soccer Holdings, LLC, the same organization behind Louisville City FC, the two-time USL Championship-winning men's side. Both Racing and LouCity play at Lynn Family Stadium and train at the nearby Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center, a 30,000 square-foot facility.

Introduction of the NWSL to Louisville, which has experienced immense success on the pitch already with two-time USL Championship winner Louisville City FC, brings to Lynn Family Stadium household names, including members of the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup-winning U.S. Women's National Team.

Racing finished 2021 with a 5-12-7 record. Its 22 points earned set a new NWSL record for an expansion club — and that doesn't count a victory in The Women's Cup, an inaugural tournament held in August at Lynn Family Stadium that brought global powers FC Bayern Munich and Paris Saint-German to town.

Louisville ranked second in league attendance in Year 1 with an average of 6,585 fans per game. The NWSL will expand to 12 teams in 2022, adding franchises in Los Angeles and San Diego.

KEY DATES:

October 22, 2019: Louisville announced as the NWSL's fourth expansion market.

July 8, 2020: Racing's name and logo — designed by the renowned Matthew Wolff — unveiled.

Oct. 26, 2020: Trade with the Chicago Red Stars made Savannah McCaskill and Yuki Nagasato the club's first players.

Nov. 12, 2020: Racing acquired rights to 14 players during the 2020 NWSL Expansion Draft.

Jan. 12, 2021: Racing led off the 2021 NWSL College Draft by selecting Emily Fox at No. 1 overall.

Feb. 2, 2021: With snow cleared off the pitch, Racing was able to hold its first-ever training session.

April 10, 2021: Cece Kizer scored first and Brooke Hendrix equalized in stoppage time as Racing drew the Orlando Pride, 2-2, in a dramatic inaugural game to open the NWSL Challenge Cup.

May 21, 2021: Louisville native Emina Ekic scored a goal and assisted another in Racing's first victory, a 2-0 win over the Washington Spirit.

June 20, 2021: Forward Ebony Salmon scored seconds into her NWSL debut, propelling Racing to a 1-0 win over the Houston Dash with SportsCenter's top play of the day.

July 16, 2021: Racing's new facility, shared with Louisville City FC, officially opened as the Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center.

Aug. 21, 2021: Racing defeated FC Bayern Munich on penalty kicks, with substitute goalkeeper Katie Lund scoring the game winner in the 11th round, to hoist The Women's Cup trophy.

Oct. 16, 2021: Racing set a high attendance mark of 8,488 fans in a 3-1 victory over the Orlando Pride.

Nov. 20, 2021: Racing successfully hosts the NWSL Championship with 10,360 on hand at Lynn Family Stadium.

EXECUTIVE BIOS



JOHN NEACE CHAIRMAN & CEO

John Neace exemplifies the qualities of a true entrepreneur. He has demonstrated his persistence and independence of spirit early, when, after growing up in West Newport with his mother and two siblings, John put himself through college at Northern Ken-tucky University and then enhanced his educational base by earning his MPA at Xavi-er University. After that, he took the initiative to build one of the top insurance agencies in the United States, growing his agency from zero revenue to over \$100 million in just under 20 years.

In addition to his insurance success, John has demonstrated a willingness to take risks by simultaneously building other businesses, including Talon Logistics, NB Develop, GC International, Old 502 Winery, Falls City Beer, Allterrain Paving & Construction and franchise businesses Ashley Furniture and 1-800-GOT-JUNK among others. Exclud-ing insurance, his company's average north of \$100 million in annual sales.

John also holds the position as Chairman of the Louisville City Soccer Board of Direc-tors after serving as a member of the club's ownership and board of managers since their inception in 2014.

JAMES O'CONNOR INTERIM PRESIDENT

The former coach at Louisville City from 2015-2018 and coach at Orlando City in 2018-2019, O'Connor brings a wealth of experience in soccer at all levels. O'Connor was crucial in the development of Louisville City when the club began in 2015, helping the club win its first USL Championship Title in 2017. Prior to coaching Louisville City and Orlando City, the Dublin, Ireland, native played professionally with Stoke City, West Bromwich Albion, Burnley, along with Major League Soccer's Orlando City. Transitioning into his coaching career, O'Connor worked as a player-coach for Orlando City during his final season. Louisville City began as an affiliate of Orlando City, and when Orlando City sold their rights to their USL Pro team to Soccer Holdings in Louisville, O'Connor was tabbed to become Louisville City's first head coach. Following a stint coaching Orlando City, he returned to Louisville City as the Executive Vice President of Development. Leading the club, O'Connor was integral in leading the formation of Racing Louisville's inaugural roster, along with creating youth academy. In January 2022, he stepped in as the Soccer Holding's interim President, following Brad Estes' departure.






LYNN FAMILY STADIUM

Lynn Family Stadium in Louisville, Ky., is the largest soccer-specific stadium in the region with seating locations for 11,600 fans and a capacity of 15,304.

Home to Louisville City FC of the USL Championship and the NWSL's Racing Louisville FC, the stadium boasts 18 luxury suites, premium seating amenities like club and loge seats along with ledge tables, and a massive safe-standing supporter section.

The venue, owned by Soccer Holdings, LLC, and managed by ASM Global, is also available for concerts, festivals and other community events. It has already been bestowed Greater Louisville Inc.'s Silver Fleur-De-Lis Award, named Business First Louisville's Commercial Real Estate Deal of the Year and nominated for "Stadium of the Year" by StadiumDB.





TRAINING FACILITY

Soccer Holdings, LLC — the parent company of Louisville City FC and Racing Louisville FC — has collaborated again with the renowned Dr. Mark and Cindy Lynn and family on a partnership extending well beyond naming rights for the clubs' training facility.

Louisville's professional soccer teams and the Lynns operate side by side at what's now known as the Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center. In addition to housing day-to-day operations for LouCity, Racing and their back-office staff, the facility offers the same array of services to the community used to keep professional soccer stars at their peaks.

"We are very proud to expand upon our partnership with the Lynns, a family whose values and principles align with ours," said Soccer Holdings president Brad Estes. "It sounds cliche, but we absolutely would not be in this position without their support. The cutting-edge technology of Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training will be a game changer for not only our players but for athletes of all ages and crafts."

LouCity and Racing moved into the Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center, a privately financed, \$15 million project in July of 2021. The building includes customized locker rooms for both clubs, a weight room, dining hall, media/film room and several fields, both grass for the pros and state-of-the-art turf used for the youth academy, camps, clinics and community events.

Located at 801 Edith Road, ground was broken Aug. 4, 2020, on the facility, which was built by AML Construction and operated by ASM Global.





TECHNICAL STAFF



KIM BJÖRKEGREN HEAD COACH

Björkegren — a native of Sweden in his 15th year coaching — most recently led Cyprus's Apollon Ladies FC to an undefeated season before being named Racing's coach on Dec. 9, 2021. Apollon Ladies took 64 of a possible 66 points and advanced to the UEFA Women's Champions League's second round. Cyprus's players association awarded Björkegren its Coach of the Year award as a result.

Björkegren spent about a year and a half coaching in the island country following stints first in his native Sweden and then China.

Björkegren's playing career ended prematurely due to injury at age 23. He took a two-year coaching course to move on to his next calling, initially leading fourth division Karle IF's men's side in his hometown of Linköping, Sweden. Along the way, Björkegren switched to the women's side and climbed the coaching ladder.

He was in 2017 appointed manager of reigning first division winner Linköpings FC and repeated, clinching the league title with two rounds to go. The club also advanced to the UEFA Women's Champions League quarterfinal before falling to English powerhouse Manchester City.

Björkegren spent 2018 in China, coaching Beijing BG Phoenix in the nation's Super League. There, he also oversaw transfers, signing Spanish international Verónica Boquete, and made the semifinal round of two cup competitions before moving to Apollon Ladies FC in 2019.

MARIO SANCHEZ INTERIM ASSISTANT COACH

Sanchez, who stepped in as Racing's interim head coach last September for the remainder of 2021, helped the club finish its inaugural season on a high note. Over its final three games, Racing picked up results from losing positions to finish with 22 points, most of any NWSL expansion team to date.

SERGIO GONZALEZ GOALKEEPERS COACH

Sergio Gonzalez has joined Racing after a stint as Indiana University's women's associate head coach coach. He boasts more than two decades of coaching experience, including eight years with both women's and men's Big Ten Conference programs. Internationally, he has also coached goalkeepers for the U-16 and U-17 national teams.



2021: Lund made her professional debut off the bench, becoming the hero of Racing's win over FC Bayern Munich in The Women's Cup final. Lund made four penalty kick stops and scored the trophy-winning kick in a dramatic shootout. She went on to make her first NWSL start Oct. 6 against the North Carolina Courage and took over the starting job between the posts toward the end of the season, tallying 16 saves as her side went 1-1-2.

Before Racing Louisville: Lund spent her first three seasons at Texas Christian University before transferring to Arkansas for her senior year. In her final season, she started all 23 matches for the Razorbacks and posted 11 shutouts. She led the SEC in save percentage (0.871) and was named 2019 All SEC-Second Team and All-Southeast Region Second Team. Lund signed with the Washington Spirit in February of 2020.

2021: In the club's inaugural season, Milliet was the only player to see game action in all 24 regular season matches. Earning 19 starts, the midfielder recorded 13 shots with three going on target.

Before Racing Louisville: During her college career, Milliet started in all 77 of her appearances, tallying 21 goals and 16 assists. The midfielder was the 14th overall pick in the 2019 NWSL draft as just the second player to be selected from Colorado College. She made two appearances as a rookie before getting more involved in 2020, most recently logging 278 minutes in four NWSL Fall Series appearances.

She signed with Sky Blue FC in 2016 after attending open tryouts and impressing the coaching staff in New Jersey. In two seasons with Sky Blue, Simon saw the pitch 26 times. In 2018 she joined West Ham United in England, where she helped the club reach the FA Cup Final. In January of 2020, Simon made her return to the NWSL, signing with the eventual Challenge Cup-winning Houston Dash.

2021: After joining the squad in June, Bonner appeared and started in 13 matches. Despite missing parts of the season with injuries, the veteran defender provided experience to the back line and helped the squad earn two shutouts.

Before Racing Louisville: A center back by trade, Bonner has played the balance of her career in England. Career highlights include winning the league cup in 2010 with hometown club Leeds United, an FA Cup Final appearance in 2012 with Chelsea, and two more league crowns in 2013 and 2014 while captaining Liverpool. From 2018 to 2021, Bonner has represented Manchester City, the second-place Women's Super League finisher in each of her seasons there.

International: In 2009, Bonner was part of a U-19 team that won England the European Championship. She made her senior team debut in 2013, with her most recent call up for the 2019 SheBelieves Cup won by England.

Before Racing Louisville: Having started in all 83 appearances at Ole Miss, her 48 goals and 119 career points for the Rebels remain program records. The 13th overall pick in the 2019 NWSL Draft by the Houston Dash, she played in 22 NWSL games before spending the fall of 2020 on loan with Kolbotn IL in Norway, where she scored three goals.

Howell finished her collegiate career by becoming only the sixth women's player to win the Hermann Trophy in consecutive years, joining Mia Hamm (1992-1993), Cindy Parlow (1997-1998), Christine Sinclair (2004-2005), Morgan Brian (2013-2014) and Catarina Macario (2018-2019)

International: The youth national team staple has four-times been capped by the USWNT, most recently in the 2022 SheBelieves Cup as a sub..

Before Racing Louisville: During a collegiate career interrupted by an Achilles injury, DeMelo still managed 75 appearances and helped USC to the postseason each year she was in the pitch (2017-2018, 2020-2021). Along the way she four times received All-Pac-12 honors and was recognized in 2018 as an All-American.

The Bellflower, Calif., native DeMelo returned to pre-injury form as a senior in 2021, scoring 4 goals and numbering 7 assists while starting all 20 of the Trojans' games. USC finished second in the Pac-12 with an 8-1-2 record in league play.

International: DeMelo received a number of United States youth national team call ups. She was a member of both the 2016 and 2018 U-20 World Cup squads in Papa New Guinea and France. She has also represented the U.S. at the U-14, U-15 and U-18 levels.

2021: In her first year playing outside of Sweden, Olofsson was a consistent figure in Racing's midfield. She made 22 appearances, including 20 starts. Olofsson recorded six shots with two on target.

Before Racing Louisville: The midfielder spent five years in the Damallsvenskan with KIF Örebro. In 2019, Olofsson suffered a setback in her career when she tore her ACL. She returned in 2020 and made 21 appearances, 18 of which were starts, and tallied two goals and an assist. She signed a two-year deal with Racing Louisville FC in December of 2020.

International: Having previously represented Sweden at the U-17 and U-19 levels, Olofsson also made two appearances — including a start — for the U-23 squad during a fall 2021 international window.

It came in at No. 1 on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays for the day. Salmon went on to lead Racing in goals scored (6), assists (3) and total shots (27) through 20 appearances and 14 starts.

Before Racing Louisville: Salmon starred during the 2020-2021 FA Women's Super League campaign, numbering a team-leading 6 goals to go with an assist. Bristol City named her its Women's Player of the Year just before the season's end. A Salmon moved to Bristol City for the 2019-2020 campaign. She led the club with 5 goals, including the only tally in a 1-0 away victory Jan. 5 over her former club, Manchester United, to mark Bristol's first victory of the season. In addition to her WSL accomplishments in 2020-2021, Salmon helped Bristol City to the FA Women's League Cup before a defeat to powerhouse Chelsea.

International: Salmon has earned multiple senior national team call ups and debuted for England when subbing on in a victory over Northern Ireland in February 2021. While wearing the captain's armband for the UEFA Women's U-17 Championship in 2018, Salmon registered a hat trick against Italy to secure her team a place in the knockout rounds.

Before Racing Louisville: Known as one of the world's most prolific scorers and humanitarian athletes, Nadim arrives to Louisville after two seasons with Paris Saint-Germain, where during the 2021 campaign she numbered 10 goals and 4 assists in helping the club to its first Division 1 Féminine title. In recent years, she also starred for NWSL power Portland Thorns FC (2016-2017) and England's Manchester City (2018).

International: Afghan refugees, Nadim and her family fled to Denmark during her childhood. There she discovered soccer and received citizenship. She now represents the Danish national team. Nadim was voted Denmark's Player of the Year in 2016 and 2017.

Before Racing Louisville: Fox enjoyed a decorated career as a Tar Heel, leading her team to College Cup appearances in 2018 and 2019. As a four-year starter for her school, Fox paced UNC with 11 assists in 2019, earned three-straight First Team All-ACC honors and was named a Hermann Trophy semifinalist, all while overcoming two ACL tears in three years.

International: As of November 2021, Fox has tallied eight U.S. Women's National Team caps. She took a step forward on the international level with a full 90-minute performance Oct. 26 in a 6-0 win over Korea Republic. The defender earned her first senior team call up in 2018, making two starts in friendlies against Portugal and Scotland before earning a spot on the 2019 SheBelievesCup roster.

Those standout seasons attracted attention from CSKA, which won back-to-back league titles in 2019 and 2020 and finished second in 2021. Gordon made two appearances for CKSA, both in Champions League qualifiers, including 45 minutes in a loss to Kim Björkegren's Apollon Ladies.

In 2021, as a fifth-year senior, she posted nine shutouts while helping the Badgers to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament, again earning the title of Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year.

Before Racing Louisville: Merrick logged a program-record 7,630 minutes at Kansas. As a senior she was named to the All-Big 12 First Team, earned Big 12 Defender of the Year honors and helped lead the Jayhawks to a conference championship. Following a standout senior season, she went as the 28th overall pick in the 2020 NWSL Draft and made her professional debut with the North Carolina Courage in the 2020 NWSL Challenge Cup. Merrick attended Kansas. She was selected by Racing Louisville FC in the 2020 NWSL Expansion Draft.



NWSL MEDIA POLICY

Media credentials and access will be granted only to individuals with a legitimate working function at a game, training session or event. The bearer must be on a specific assignment. Credentials are non-transferable. Any unauthorized use of a credential subjects the bearer to ejection from the stadium. Resale or attempted resale is grounds for seizure and cancellation.

The following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the stadium or training facility:

- Requesting autographs at any time.
- Taking photographs with players/coaches
- Using credential for family or friends of a working media member
- Conduction of unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (Cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages, failure to abide by posted rules, etc.)

Treatment of Credentialed Media

Postgame Media Access: Players from both teams will be available to media post-game in a mix-zone located outside the team locker rooms or in a location near the field of play. The mix-zone will begin 10 minutes after the conclusion of the match. Locker rooms will not be open to media at any point.

Team PR directors should be present to indicate the beginning and end of media access to players, and ensure media have access to the head coach and players after the match. All players are highly encouraged to be available to media post-game.

All regulations about post-game media access should be clearly communicated to team staff and security to ensure a secure environment.

No individuals other than League or Club representatives shall be allowed in Club locker rooms following a game.

Under no circumstances shall any club and/or its players discriminate in any fashion against an accredited member of the media based upon race, creed, sex or national origin.

Seating Access: Accredited media members will have access to the stadium, professional workrooms and stadium seating, if available. During the match, accredited media will have access to the press box which will be restricted to only those accredited media members.

In addition, each stadium should have a Press Box capable of seating no less than TEN (10) people, with separate areas for working press and electronic broadcasters, and sufficient power outlets for all needs. If possible, all accredited media members should be given a seat in the press box.

All credentialed media shall be seated in media seating areas, consistent with treatment afforded comparable media. In addition, all members of the media are to be afforded equal treatment and access to facilities and personnel, regardless of sex.

When the press box is fully occupied by working media, referee assessors or in-stadium observers shall be provided seating with a desk or table shielded from the weather and a vantage point to view replays (if available) from any telecast. The specific location may be determined by the Home Team but must provide these minimum accommodations.

In order to maintain the integrity of the working press box, seating is specifically reserved for media members. All other individuals (including player agents, VIP's and administrators) should be seated in overflow booths or assigned stadium seats.



Traveling Media: Members of the working media who travel with a visiting team are not to be treated in a discriminatory manner with regard to seating or any other privilege or facility accorded to the home media. Comparable seating and equipment should apply to home and road media (print and electronic).

Media Access to Practice: Clubs are encouraged to make all practices open to media. If a practice is closed, clubs must grant a 15-minute media access period at the start or end of practice, as well as making the coach and players available for interviews following the conclusion of practice. Clubs are strongly encouraged to ensure that ballwork is at least part of the 15-minute access period. If practices are open to the media, as defined above, they must be open to all media; if practices are closed to the media, they must be closed to all media.

Clubs violating the media access policies on practice days will be subject to fines or other discipline at the discretion of NWSL Commissioner Jeff Plush.

Guidelines for Photographers and Camera Operators: All photographers and television camera operators must stay behind the field boards at all times, unless released by the on-site photo marshal. The only exception to the field board rule will be when a staff photographer, a national rights-holder or NWSL has a crew at a game. These entities will be allowed to shoot from the area between the field boards and the touch lines in the area bounded by the top of the 18-yard box and the end line.

Each photographer will be permitted to use one monopod — but no tripods. No seats other than "lawn-type" photographer seats will be permitted.

Stand-alone remote units will not be permitted at any time on or around the goal posts. Units mounted on the top of field boards behind the end line will be permitted at the stadium's discretion, provided the equipment does not interfere with the clear display of the field board and does not impede the operation of broadcast equipment.

Live television crews located on the baseline or sideline will be limited to two (2) people — a camera operator and a cable-puller — and ENG crews will be limited to one (1) person. In either case, the crew must maintain actual possession of the camera and any other equipment during all game action. Cameramen and cable-pullers from all television crews must remain off the playing field at all times.


Photographer Access to field: Photographers and camera operators shall be permitted in the area between the field boards and the touch lines in the area bounded by the top of the 18-yard box and the end line (a C-shape that extends from the top of the 18, back behind the goal, and to the top of the 18 on the opposite side of the field).

Once situated, no movement between the two halves of the field shall be permitted until halftime. Changes in this policy will be allowed in cases where stadium facilities dictate alterations. No photographers shall be allowed to move from end to end on the bench side of the field.

Photographer Identification: In addition to their regular credential, it is strongly recommended that photographers and camera crews be issued with colored bibs or armbands. This makes them easy to identify, and they would presumably enjoy quick and easy access to their designated areas. This will necessitate a special area in or near the stadium where they can pick up their bibs, on presentation of their accreditation, either the day before the match or on game day, at the time media gates are opened. If they are not to be allowed to keep the bib, then it should be exchanged for a press card to be picked up following the game, or else signed out.

Photography Work Area: A work area should be provided for photographers, near the field where appropriate, with high-speed internet access. The size of the room may vary, but it should be sizeable enough for at least 5 – 10 people to work on desktops/tables. Like the press section of the stands, the photographers' work room should have sufficient electrical sockets and compatible with the equipment being used for transmission.

Accreditation: Care should be taken when processing credential requests for photographers shooting for commercial agencies. NWSL does not permit the accreditation of photographers shooting specifically for commercial agencies. However, since many agencies offer editorial and commercial sales options (Getty Images, AP, Reuters, etc.) this must be handled on a case-by-case basis.



Non-Rights Holder Video Guidelines

Video Footage: All rights to match footage including all applicable copyrights belong to NWSL and its rights holders who broadcast each specific match. NWSL has one rights holders that will broadcast select matches in 2017: Lifetime. If an organization is interested in recording video footage at a NWSL match for non-news gathering purposes they should contact NWSL Communications.

Television Broadcasters

Game Action: Television broadcasters can use footage of NWSL events obtained either via 1) their own recording or 2) action dubbed from a NWSL rights holder broadcast (Lifetime) with credit only in connection with its regularly scheduled news programming within a week of the game. This footage should not exceed two (2) minutes. Highlights aired as part of a continuous news program should not be longer than one (1) minute per 30-minute segment. Credits: NWSL Media / Lifetime (for the Game of the Week); NWSL Media (for all other games).

Filming – Game Action: For televised events, non-rights holders / ENG cameras may record the first 15 minutes of each half (from 00:00 to 15:00 and 45:00 to 60:00 on the game clock). For non-televised events, non-rights holders / ENG cameras may record the entire game but are still subject to the aforementioned limits. This includes events that are web streamed live online.

Filming – Interviews and Scene Sets: There is no limit to the gathering of footage pre-game, at halftime and post-game. All footage gathered is subject to the usage guidelines indicated in this document.

Filming – In Seating Area: Video cameras looking to shoot in the concourse or seating area must contact home team and NWSL in advance of the event for approval.

Previews or Advances: In advance of a NWSL event, television broadcasters can use two (2) minutes of archival game action to preview an upcoming event. In the local/regional markets, broadcasters should mention the time and location of the game along with their report. Outside of the local markets, broadcasters should mention the time and broadcast information.

Television Broadcasters' Web Sites: Video produced for air as part of regular programming that is simulcast or archived online must be accompanied by a link to NWSLsoccer.com. Content produced exclusively for the Internet is subject to the guidelines for Online Video.

Online Video

Game Action: Online organizations (including print publications that post video online) are not permitted to film or use game action video without prior written approval by NWSL Media. Game action includes any footage of the field, teams, etc., following the beginning of the television broadcast window. Only video of off-field activities (i.e. interviews, training sessions) may be recorded.

Non-Game Video: Any video posted online that is recorded as part of media access is limited to the use of eight (8) minutes per day/activity date. Online video may not incorporate integrated advertising and must be accompanied by links to NWSLsoccer.com.

Professional Presentation: Online video is expected to be recorded, edited and presented in a professional manner. Video must be presented/hosted on an organization's website, and not solely on a site provided by a third-party (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, Facebook, etc.).

Online Video Sites: Organizations who regularly post video to online video sites (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, etc.) may not include advertising with video gathered as a result of media access. Allowing users to embed these videos is not permitted, and the description of any video must include a link to NWSLsoccer.com.


