ACFC TEAM HISTORY

In July 2020, Angel City Football Club (ACFC) launched as a US-based National Women’s Soccer League (NWSL) expansion team and announced that we would be taking the pitch in April 2022. Academy Award-winning actor and activist Natalie Portman, technology venture capitalist Kara Nortman, media and gaming entrepreneur Julie Uhrman, and tech entrepreneur and venture capitalist Alexis Ohanian founded ACFC, taking the women’s soccer universe by storm. Our Soccer House is led by Sporting Director Eniola Aluko and VP of Soccer Operation and Player Development Angela Hucles Mangano. Aluko, who made 102 appearances for the England national team from 2004 to 2016, oversees Head Coach Freya Coombe, Assistant Head Coach and Performance Director Robert Udberg, Head of Goalkeeping Daniel Ball. Hucles Mangano, a two-time Olympic gold medalist and World Cup Champion, manages operations and player development staff.

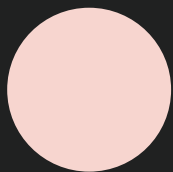

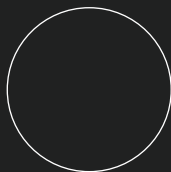

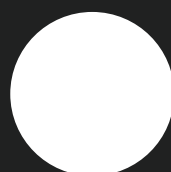

STADIUM AND FACILITIES

BANC OF CALIFORNIA STADIUM

3939 S FIGUEROA ST, LOS ANGELES, CA 90037

The Banc of California Stadium, designed by Gensler, a global design and architecture firm, is home to Angel City Football Club (National Women’s Soccer League) and Los Angeles Football Club (Major League Soccer). The 22,000 seat venue opened in April 2018 and is the first open-air stadium built in Los Angeles in over 30 years. The last open-air stadium built in Los Angeles was Dodger’s Stadium in 1962.

When Angel City Football Club (ACFC) opened seat deposits for their inaugural season, they decided to lead with purpose and tie in to the 22,000 seat number at the stadium. For every season ticket sold for the 2022 season, ACFC donates a Nike sports bra to a young female athlete. As of March 2022, 18,000 sports bras were donated, slightly eclipsing the current season tickets purchased of 15,000.

When it comes to the athletes on the field, they will play on 86,000 sq ft of natural Bermuda grass adapted for Southern

California weather on the pitch at Banc of California Stadium. Every seat at the Banc of California Stadium is within 135 feet of the pitch.

Located in Exposition Park, Banc of California Stadium anchors the South end of the Figueroa corridor and is framed by views of the Downtown Los Angeles skyline. The venue is conveniently located near the convergence of the 110 and 10 Freeways and accessible via the expanded Metro Expo line. Parking at Expo Park is limited and guests are able to choose from the blue parking structure, three general admission parking lots, and two lots adjacent to the University of Southern California. Additional detail is [HERE](#). Banc of California Stadium has a Clear Bag Policy in order to provide a safer environment for fans and will consequently also expedite entry into the Stadium. As for COVID-19 policy, the venue strongly recommended that all individuals, regardless of vaccination status wear a mask unless actively eating or drinking. Beginning on March 6, 2022, guests no longer need proof of vaccination or proof of a negative COVID-19 test for entry into Banc of California Stadium.

TAILGATING

Banc of California stadium tailgating is permitted in the designated area of Christmas Tree Lane only. No bottles are allowed; cans and cups only. Expo Park does not allow tailgating in the parking lots.

BOX OFFICE

The Banc of California Ticket Box Office is located on the Northwest corner of the stadium and is typically open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and on event days. Hours are extended to accommodate the needs of specific event times.

TRAINING GROUNDS

California Lutheran University is the inaugural team training facility for ACFC. The Los Angeles Rams have trained there since 2016. As a part of the ongoing partnership, ACFC will provide internships to Cal Lutheran students, have staff members serve as guest lectures in sports classes, and host entrepreneurial workshops at the team’s front office located in Santa Monica.



NATALIE PORTMAN FOUNDER, ACTRESS AND ACTIVIST

Angel City Football Club (ACFC) is founded by Academy Award-winning actress and activist Natalie Portman, technology venture capitalist Kara Nortman, media and gaming entrepreneur Julie Uhrman, and Seven Seven Six founder and former Executive Chair of Reddit, Alexis Ohanian.

Portman, who is on the board of Times Up, attended the Times Up Connect event and witnessed Abby Wambach speak about her playing career and the US Women’s National Team’s fight for equal pay. Portman was riveted and engaged in conversations about the pay equity issue in women’s sports. She approached Nortman, also on the Times Up board and a women’s soccer fanatic.

One day at lunch, Portman asked Nortman why there wasn’t a professional women’s soccer team in LA, which led them

down a path neither could have envisioned. In August 2019, Julie Uhrman was brought on by Portman and Nortman to run the company and help them fulfill their mission and passion for bringing a professional women’s sports team to Los Angeles as part of the National Women’s Soccer League (NWSL). Off the pitch, Portman is an Academy award-winning actress (BLACK SWAN), director, and activist. Recently, Portman was seen in Brady Corbet’s film VOX LUX and Alex Garland’s highly anticipated second feature, ANNIHILATION. In October 2019, she hit the big screen once again in Noah Hawley’s LUCY IN THE SKY, and it was recently announced that Portman will return to the Marvel universe as Jane Foster in ‘Thor: Love and Thunder,’ which will release on November 5, 2021.

Previously Natalie appeared in Pablo Larraín’s film, JACKIE, in which she starred as First Lady Jacqueline F. Kennedy. For the role, Portman was nominated for an Academy Award, a Golden Globe, a Screen Actors Guild Award, a BAFTA Award, and won the Critics’ Choice Award. She wrote, directed, produced, and starred in A TALE OF LOVE AND DARKNESS, which made its world premiere at the 2015 Cannes Film Festival and its North American premiere at the 2015 Toronto International Film Festival. She also executive produced and narrated the recently released documentary EATING ANIMALS. The film examines mankind’s dietary choices and is based on Jonathan Safran Foer’s memoir. In addition to her film work, Portman also

devotes her time to several humanitarian causes.

As an Ambassador of WE, Portman lends her time to the organization that empowers youth to remove barriers that prevent them from being active local and global citizens. Natalie is also a founding member of Time’s Up, a campaign led by women in the entertainment industry for men and women everywhere to ensure equality and safety in the workplace for everyone. A Harvard graduate with a degree in psychology, Portman studied at Hebrew University in Jerusalem.



KARA NORTMAN

FOUNDING INVESTOR

Kara is a Managing Partner at Upfront Ventures, the largest venture capital firm based in Los Angeles. Her notable investments include Parachute Home, Time by Ping, Endgame, Writer, Open Raven, Britive, and Fleetsmith (acquired by Apple in 2020). Over 50% of her portfolio is led by women CEOs. Kara is also a founding member of All Raise, a VC-led group dedicated to increased diversity in funders and founders, and is a founder of LA’s women’s soccer team, Angel City Football Club. Before Upfront, Kara co-founded the children’s e-commerce company Moonfrye and also spent seven years at IAC where she co-headed the M&A group and acted as the Senior Vice President and General Manager of Urbanspoon and Citysearch.

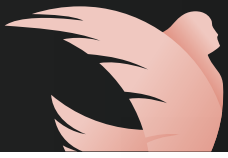
During her tenure at IAC, she led the initial investment in Tinder. Earlier in her career, she also spent time at Morgan Stanley, Microsoft, and Battery Ventures. She received her AB in Politics from Princeton University and her MBA from Stanford University. Kara resides in Los Angeles with her husband and three daughters.

ALEXIS OHANIAN

LEADING FOUNDING INVESTOR

Alexis Ohanian was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., and grew up in the suburbs of Baltimore, M.D. He wrote the national bestselling book, “Without Their Permission,” and has been a vocal advocate for the open internet, STEM education, and paid family leave. Out of college, Ohanian co-founded Reddit, one of the largest websites in the U.S., which was funded by Y Combinator in 2005 and sold to Conde Nast in 2006. He returned as executive chairman in 2014 to help lead the turnaround of the now independent company that today is valued at over \$10B. In 2016, he left Reddit to run the venture capital firm he co-founded, Initialized Capital and built it to \$100B in market value through early investments in companies like Coinbase, Opendoor, Instacart, Patreon, and Ro.In 2020, Ohanian resigned from the Reddit board in protest and left his role at Initialized Capital to found Seven Seven Six, a new firm built like a technology company that deploys venture capital. As an advocate for paid family leave, Ohanian has lobbied on Capitol Hill, penned a New York Times opinion piece, and launched the Business Dad podcast where he interviews other fathers about what it means to be a dad in today’s world and how they balance their careers and families. He is also the lead founding investor in the LA-based professional women’s soccer team, Angel City Football Club. Ohanian has a B.A. in History and a B.S. in Commerce from the University of Virginia.





TEAM EXECUTIVES



JULIE UHRMAN CO-FOUNDER & PRESIDENT

Julie Uhrman is the Co-Founder and President of Angel City Football Club (ACFC). Uhrman founded ACFC with Academy Award-winning actress and activist Natalie Portman, technology venture capitalist Kara Nortman, and seven seven six founder and Reddit co-founder Alexis Ohanian. ACFC is one of the only majority female-founded and run professional sports teams in the world and, in 2021, was named one of the world’s most innovative companies by Fast Company Magazine.

In addition to leading ACFC day to day, Uhrman is active in the Los Angeles sports and technology communities. She is a board member of the LA Sports and Entertainment Council, The Rose Bowl Institute, the LA Sports Council, an active executive in the LA Chapter of WISE (Women in Sports and Events) and is part of two SPACs focused on sports and gaming/ entertainment. She is also part of the DraftKings’ All-Star Network as an Advisor to Drive by DraftKings. Before ACFC, Uhrman served as

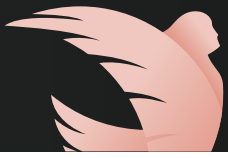

the EVP and General Manager of OTT Ventures at Lionsgate, charged with building and managing the company’s multiple streaming franchises. She oversaw key properties, including Tribeca Shortlist, Comic-Con HQ, Laugh Out Loud in partnership with Kevin Hart, and Pantaya—all while launching new services and growing the company’s digital footprint domestically and internationally. Uhrman also served as Head of Platform Business Development at Jaunt, a virtual reality content startup. In 2013, she founded OUYA, a pioneering Android-based game console for the living room, and raised a record-breaking \$8.6 million from more than 63,000 backers in just 29 days through Kickstarter. At the time, OUYA was the fastest fundraiser to reach \$1 million on the crowdfunding platform. Currently, OUYA is still the eighth most successful Kickstarter campaign of all time. Uhrman secured venture funding from Kleiner Perkins and Alibaba before selling OUYA to Razer in 2015.

Born and raised in Los Angeles, Uhrman attributes her entrepreneurial spirit to her stepfather’s example of starting his own company. From early on, it was ingrained in Uhrman to be her own boss. Before her professional career, Uhrman’s entrepreneurial side came to life at Washington University in St. Louis. Julie, her twin sister Amy, and two friends founded and operated an on-campus laundry and dry cleaning business for three years. They also launched a successful storage company before Uhrman graduated with a degree in finance and management in 1996. Uhrman’s accolades include

being named a member of Adweek’s 2021 and 2020 Most Powerful Women In Sports, one of the 100 Most Creative People in Business by Fast Company, and to the Creative 50 list by Advertising Age. Outside of running Angel City FC and between shuttling her two children between activities across Los Angeles, Uhrman can be found on the basketball court (note: she was a member of the 1994 NCAA Basketball Div III National Runner Up at Wash U), playing goalie for Angel City’s community 7 on 7 team, learning how to dominate her favorite new skill, Teqball, brushing up her soccer skills and running up and down the LA canyons with the family’s beloved pup, Widget.

FREYA COOMBE

HEAD COACH

Freya Coombe is the inaugural Head Coach for Angel City Football Club (ACFC). Prior to joining ACFC, Coombe served as head coach of NWSL's NJ/NY Gotham FC. Coombe joined NJ/NY Gotham in 2019 as Interim Head Coach and the appointment was made permanent at the end of the 2019 season. Coombe guided the team to a Challenge Cup semi-final in 2020 and the Challenge Cup final in 2021. Coombe, a Buckinghamshire, England native, also played and coached for English side Reading FC for seven years. During her time on staff, she served as Director of Coaching for the Reading FC Centre of Excellence and as the Women's Development Team Manager for Reading FC Women. Coombe was recruited to the US in 2014 to fulfill the role of Director of Coaching for Everton America CT, a position she held for four years. In 2018 Coombe was appointed the Director of Scouting and Development Academy Coach at New York Soccer Club. She holds USSF A and UEFA B licenses as well as a Masters in Sport Science.

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH

Robert Udberg is the Assistant Head Coach and Performance Director for Angel City Football Club (ACFC). Udberg will oversee the management of the multi-disciplinary performance team at ACFC, directing the club's strategy for sports science, nutrition, strength and conditioning, and the training environment. Before joining ACFC, Udberg spent nine years with Chelsea Football Club, seven years spent as the Head of Player Development & Performance Management for Chelsea FC Women.

He also had two stints with The Football Association. Both roles allowed him to travel extensively and gain knowledge of practices in different countries and cultures, including time spent with clubs and colleges in the United States. Udberg holds a UEFA A license in coaching and an MSc in Environmental Psychology from the University of Surrey.

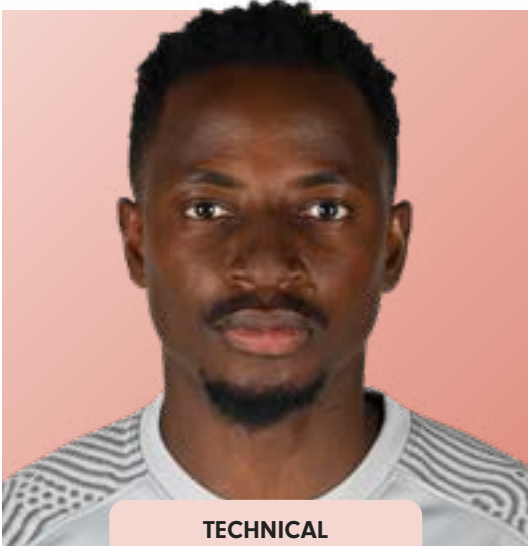
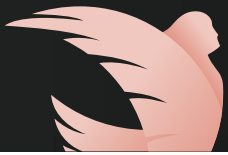

THE ACFC SPONSORSHIP MODEL

ACFC is widely-credited for its innovative sponsorship model that changes the way sports properties and brands look at partnerships and deals.

The ACFC model reframes sponsorship through the lens of making a meaningful impact in local communities. The passion for reinventing the sponsorship model manifested as the first-of-its-kind Angel City Sponsorship Model that no sports team has ever attempted. See [“The Angel City Effect”](#) from The Athletic.

The game-changing approach reflects the team’s core value of impacting on and off-the-field. ACFC puts its mission into action by locking record-setting sponsors to support the team financially and show their support and belief in women’s athletics.

Head of partnerships, Jessica Smith, dreamt up the model and presented it to co-founder and team president, Julie Uhrman. Smith proposed that ACFC structure sponsorships in a groundbreaking way that would generate revenue for the club while allowing the team and brand partners to activate ACFC’s core pillars of equity, essentials, and education.

Here’s how it works: Angel City reallocates 10% of all sponsorships off the top (cash or assets) to go directly back into the community year-over-year. ACFC sees the investment as a ‘win-win-win’ for the team, the brand, and the local community. Each sponsor that joins the Angel City family lends their expertise and collaborates with the front office to better Los Angeles.

The inaugural Angel City kit features sponsorship presence by Doordash, Birdies, and Sprouts. Doordash’s front-of-kit logo marks one of the most significant deals in NWSL history, with a giveback element of 80,000 meals and counting delivered to the Los Angeles community. Sleeve sponsor Birdies supported three local high school students with paid internships, including \$9,000 in educational stipends. Sprouts Farmer’s Market, the founding back-of-jersey sponsor, reallocates their funds to local causes that address and provide children’s nutrition education and fresh food access throughout Los Angeles. To date, the Sprouts partnership has refreshed eight school gardens and distributed over 15,000 pounds of fresh produce. Front of practice partner Klarna rounds out ACFC’s kit sponsorship, and is also integrated as a payment option on Angel City’s online store. The multi-year deal marks Klarna’s first official partnership with a sports organization globally and their 10% is focused on environmental support.

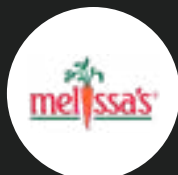

17.6.1 LIVE WRITTEN UPDATES

Online ortext reports (e.g., live blogs, Twitter, etc.) concerning Games while they are in progress ("Live Written Updates") are subject to the following:

- While a Game is in progress, any form or account of the Game must be time-delayed and/or limited in amount so that the Game coverage provided cannot be used as a substitute for authorized play-by-play accounts.
- Any suggestion by an individual or entity that live updates are being provided as a substitute for authorized play-by-play accounts is strictly prohibited.
- Live updates may not use any audio, video or graphic simulations of Games.
- Live updates must provide other broadcast information for that Game. For example: "Tonight's Game is being broadcast (or streamed) live on (provide information)."
- All live updates must be free of charge to readers.

Note: This policy does not prohibit the posting of the facts of a Game (e.g., goals scored, cards given, Game score, and time remaining)

17.6.2 STILL PHOTOGRAPHY

Still photographers are permitted to photograph Games from behind the field sign boards in either end zone. At events where space allows, photographers may also photograph on the **sideline** opposite the benches, between the end line and the 18-yard line. At no time are photographers allowed on the field.
