MATCH PREVIEW

El Paso Locomotive FC (6-6-3, 21 pts., West-6) heads west to take on Phoenix Rising FC (7-6-0, 21 pts., West-5) this Saturday, June 11. Kickoff from Phoenix Rising Soccer Stadium at Wild Horse Pass is set for 8:30 p.m. MT and will be broadcast live on ESPN+.

It has been nearly two years since El Paso Locomotive FC and Phoenix Rising FC las met on the pitch. Their last meeting came at the end of the 2020 USL Championship playoffs in the Western Conference Final. After 90 minutes, the two sides ended level 1-1, taking the match to added extra time and ultimately a penalty shootout to determine the winner. In a 4-2 shootout, Locomotive fell to Rising FC in its second consecutive Western Conference Final.

Nearly two years later, both sides are set to compete on the field again. El Paso Locomotive is amid a resurgence following a rough start to the 2022 USL Championship season. Meanwhile, Phoenix Rising FC has been on the poor end of mixed results with a record of 2-3-0 in its last five games. Despite recent form, Locomotive is still the underdogs going into Arizona this weekend. After four matches in all-competitions against Rising, Locomotive has yet to walk away with points in hand, having lost all four meetings. As the two come together once again for a spiritual rematch of its 2020 Western Conference Final bout, Locomotive will be aiming to make use of its recent success to come back to El Paso with points in hand.

PREVIOUSLY VS OPPONENT

The last time these two sides clashed was in October 24 of 2020 for the year's Western Conference Final that saw the two sides end level 1-1.

For Phoenix Rising, Jordan Schweitzer found the back of the net in the 18th minute, forcing the Locos to chase the game from early on. A rocket from the top of the box from Bryam Rebellon in the 59th minute however, Locomotive equalized the scoring, forcing the game to go into Added Extra Time at the end of 90 minutes.

Through the extra 30 minutes of play, the drama heated up with eight yellow cards being shown. While both sides tried to find the advantage goal, the match came down to a penalty shootout that Phoenix claimed 4-2.

MATCH FAST FACTS

- Phoenix and El Paso last met in the Western Conference Finals in 2020. Prior to that, their last Regular Season meeting came in August 2020 in Phoenix where El Paso fell 3-1.
- Locomotive has never taken points away from Phoenix Rising at home, having fallen in all three regular season matches since 2019. Locos did earn a draw in the 2020 Western Conference Final, but ultimately lost in the resulting penalty shootout.
- Defender Eder Borelli will miss Saturday's contest as he will be suspended due to Yellow Card Accumulation.
- Locomotive is the underdog going into Saturday's match, thanks to history. FiveThirtyEight favors Phoenix Rising (39%) over Locomotive (37%) with the least likely outcome being a draw (24%)







HEAD COACH JOHN HUTCHINSON




