MATCH PREVIEW

El Paso Locomotive FC (9-7-6, 33 pts., West-5) will defend its Copa Tejas title against San Antonio FC (14-3-1, 43 pts., West-1) on Saturday, July 23 at Southwest University Park. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. and will conclude with a post-match firework show for fans in attendance.

In the 2021 USL Championship, El Paso Locomotive FC dominated its Texas competition to claim the Copa Tejas trophy and shield. Now in 2022, the title defense is threatened by a red-hot San Antonio FC that currently sits at the top of the league. After Locomotive, San Antonio, and Rio Grande Valley FC have played two games four games in the round robin tournament, San Antonio could claim the Texas trophy. Locomotive and Rio Grande Valley each currently have one point with a loss and a draw in the competition, while San Antonio has run away with two wins to sit at six points.

El Paso Locomotive FC will need a win against San Antonio FC to stay in Copa Tejas contention and continue its title defense. Should El Paso and San Antonio split the points at Southwest University Park on Saturday, the Locos will mathematically be eliminated from the Texas competition. Should San Antonio claim the full three points it will walk away as the USL Championship Copa Tejas champions. As Locomotive enters the weekend, it does so eight undefeated at Southwest University Park, which it will look to extend with a win over challenging competition.

Through a long ball on the counter attack, San Antonio swung momentum in their favor with Collier curved a shot for the opening goal. Despite the early goal, Goalkeeper Evan Newton kept San Antonio from advancing their lead.

Through the second half, San Antonio FC became careless with the ball going, though the Locos struggled to capitalize against the fine-man backline. Newton continued to rise to the occassion to keep Locomotive in the game, however, the match turned stale in the final 20 minutes, leaving the game to end in San Antonio coming out with a win.

### MATCH FAST

- San Antonio needs a win against El Paso Locomotive FC in order to walk away from Southwest University Park as the Copa Tejas champions. Locomotive will need a win to stay in contention for the Texas trophy as a draw will mathematically eliminate Locomotive from its title defense.
- Locomotive Midfielder Liam Rose will be eligible to play for El Paso for the first time since his signing in mid-May.
- After four matches at Southwest University Park against San Antonio FC, Locomotive has only lost once (2-1-1), falling 3-1 in July 2019. The remaining matches have ended in a Locomotive win, or most recently, a 3-3 draw.
- El Paso Locomotive FC is undefeated in its last eight games (6-0-2) at Southwest University Park, where it holds an all time record of 34-7-12.



Prior to his time with Locomotive, Gomez played with FC Juarez, recording five goals over three years in La Liga.








