Lake County Captains (0-1, 31-35) at Dayton Dragons (1-0, 34-33)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) host the Lake County Captains (affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians) in the fifth game of a six-game series. This is the second game of the second half season in the Midwest League split-season format.

Last Game: Friday: Dayton 3, Lake County 1. Four Dayton pitchers combined to allow just five hits and the Dragons scored three runs in the seventh inning to erase a 1-0 deficit. Austin Callahan's RBI double tied the game, and Justice Thompson's RBI triple gave the Dragons the lead. Dragons relievers Myles Gayman, Braxton Roxby, and Vin Timpanelli combined for five shutout innings, allowing just two base runners.

Current Series (June 20-25 vs. Lake County): The Dragons are 2-2 in the series.

Dayton team stats in the series: .171 batting average; 3.0 runs/game; 1 home run; 3 stolen bases; 2.19 ERA; 5 errors.

Last Series (June 14-18 at Fort Wayne): Dayton went 3-3 in the series.

Dayton team stats in the series: .278 batting average; 4.5 runs/game; 3 home runs; 7 stolen bases; 4.40 ERA; 2 errors.

Team Notes

- The Dragons finished the first half with a .500 record for the fourth time in franchise history (2003, 2006, 2011). In 2011, they followed their 35-35 first half record by going 48-22 in the second half, their all-time best half. That team featured Billy Hamilton, Tucker Barnhart, and Donald Lutz.
- The Dragons finished the first half in second place behind Great Lakes for the second straight year. In 2022, they went 39-27 in the first half and finished one game behind the Loons.
- The Dragons are 17-10 over their last 27 games. They are 27-20 (.574) since April 30. The Dragons team ERA since April 30 is 3.19, first in the Midwest League and second best in full season Minor League Baseball (120 teams).
- Dragons hitters have struck out 757 times in 67 games, the most of any team in Minor League Baseball. The Dragons are on pace to break the club record set in 2022.
- The Dragons have completed seven series since May 1 (all six-game sets), winning three, splitting three, and losing one.
- The Dragons are 8-16 in one-run games; 26-17 in games decided by more than one run.

Player Notes

- Jack Rogers went 0 for 3 with a walk last night as his 12-game hitting streak came to an end. Rogers is batting .340 with four doubles and a triple over his last 13 games to raise his batting average from .203 to .243.
- Edwin Arroyo in his last 20 games is batting .367 with three home runs, two triples, and six doubles while raising his batting average
- Dragons starting pitcher Julian Aguiar leads the MWL in ERA (2.19) and is first in opponent batting average (.173). He was named MWL Pitcher of the Month and Cincinnati Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Month for May. He allowed only one earned run in May covering 22 innings, just seven hits with four walks and 23 strikeouts with an ERA of 0.41.
- Dragons starting pitcher Chase Petty has an ERA of 1.29 in just 28 innings (seven starts).
- Jose Acuña has a 2.45 ERA, which would rank second in the league, but Acuña is 2.1 innings short of qualifying for the ERA rankings.
- Several Dragons relievers have had several recent strong outings: Jake Gozzo over his last 9 G: 2-0, 4 Sv, 12.1 IP, 0 R, 15 SO...Javien Sandridge over his last 6 G: 9 IP, 1 R...Owen Holt over his last 6 G: 11.2 IP, 1 R...Myles Gayman over his last 10 G: 4-0, 21.1 IP, 4 R, 3 ER, 1.27 ERA... Vin Timpanelli over his last 6 G: 10 IP, 3 R, 1 ER... Braxton Roxby over his last 9 G: 1-0, 3 Sv, 13.2 IP, 3 R, 2 ER, 1.32 ERA.
- The Dragons roster is headlined by **Edwin Arroyo**, a shortstop who entered spring training as the Reds #3 prospect (based on MLB.com and Baseball America). Arroyo, age 19, is the youngest position player in the MWL among players with at least 50 AB. Arroyo is the 10th player in Dragons history to enter a season ranked as the Reds #3 prospect or higher based on Baseball America's list. Others have included Homer Bailey, Adam Dunn, Jay Bruce, Billy Hamilton, and Hunter Greene. Dragons starting pitcher Chase Petty began the year ranked as the Reds #1 pitching prospect by both Baseball America and MLB.com. Petty, age 20, is the third youngest pitcher in the MWL.

Basics for 2023: This is the third year in which the league is classified at the High-A level of Minor League Baseball. The Midwest League was a Low-A league prior to 2021. The 12-team Midwest League operates with two six-team divisions.

The Midwest League will continue to utilize a Pitch Timer to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within a 14-second time limit (or 18 seconds with a runner on base). Defensive positioning rules require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Bryan LaHair is in his second season as Dragons manager and his sixth year in the Reds organization. Under LaHair's leadership last season, the Dragons posted a first half record of 39-27 to finish second in the Midwest League's East Division, one game out of first place. The 2022 Dragons broke the club record for home runs in a season, leading the league with 152. The Dragons also narrowly missed leading the league in stolen bases, finishing with five fewer than the league leader despite playing four fewer games. LaHair served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. As a player, LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005) World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. LaHair, 40, is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Todd Naskedov (NASK-uh-duv) joins the Dragons as pitching coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization. The 2023 season is Naskedov's sixth year in professional baseball after more than 20 years as a coach at the high school or college levels. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Daytona in the Reds organization in 2022. Naskedov spent four years as a coach in the Houston Astros organization before joining the Reds. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Fayetteville in 2021 after three years as the Astros pitching rehab coordinator at their complex in West Palm Beach, Florida. Naskedov coached college or high school baseball in Arizona, Oregon, Texas, and Washington, has coached with USA Baseball's national team, and has coached abroad in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands as a Major League Baseball international envoy. Naskedov, 46, is originally from Kelso, Washington.

Eric Richardson joins the Dragons as hitting coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization and 10th year as a professional coach. He was the hitting coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2022. Richardson began his coaching career in the Phillies organization with stints as hitting coach with Single-A Lakewood in 2004; the GCL Phillies in 2005; and Short-Season Batavia in 2006. He served as the hitting coach in the White Sox organization with Great Falls for three seasons from 2017-2019. Richardson played for seven seasons in the White Sox organization from 1991-97, spending two years in the Midwest League with South Bend. In 1994, Richardson played in the outfield with NBA legend Michael Jordan during spring training in Jordan's lone season as a professional baseball player. Richardson was a base stealing threat, leading the South Atlantic League in stolen bases in 1993. Richardson, 50, was drafted by the White Sox in the fifth round in 1991 out of Brenham High School in Texas.

Osmin Melendez joins the Dragons as a coach in 2023, his first year in the Reds organization and 21st year in coaching in professional baseball. Melendez served as a coach in the Chicago Cubs system for seven seasons from 2013-19 after coaching in the Pirates organization for 13 years. He spent the 2015 season in the Midwest League as the infield coach with South Bend. Melendez began coaching as the coordinator of the Pirates academy in Venezuela from 1999-2011. He was the manager of the Pirates affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League for six seasons, 2006-2011. His teams posted a record of 272-142 (.657), earning the VSL's best regular season record all six years and winning the league championship in 2008 and 2010. He served as manager of the Cubs affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League in 2013. He was the hitting coach for the AZL Cubs in 2014 and 2017. He was the hitting/infield coach at Double-A Tennessee in 2016; the hitting coach at Short-Season Eugene in 2018; and the hitting/infield coach with Single-A Myrtle Beach in 2019. Melendez is a former infielder who played for two seasons with the GCL Orioles in the Baltimore Orioles organization, 1993-94. Melendez, 47, was born in Barquisimeto, Venezuela and currently resides in Orlando, Florida.
