MLS ALL-STARS vs. ARSENAL FC

Audi Field, Washington, D.C. 8:30 p.m. ET; Wednesday, July 19, 2023 MLS Season Pass on Apple TV



The 2023 MLS All-Star Game features the Major League Soccer All-Stars taking on Arsenal FC, the renowned 13-time English league champions out of the Premier League, at Audi Field in Washington, D.C., on Wednesday, July 19. The 2023 MLS All-Star game will be a rematch of the 2016 MLS All-Star Game in San Jose at Avaya Stadium, which saw a hard-fought game end 2-1 in Arsenal's favor following a late goal by Chuba Akpom.

In addition, on Tuesday, July 18, the night before the All-Star Game, the best of MLS face off against Arsenal FC in the 2023 MLS All-Star Skills Challenge presented by AT&T 5G at Audi Field.

The MLS All-Star Game and MLS All-Star Skills Challenge will be available to watch in more than 100 countries and regions in English, Spanish, and French on MLS Season Pass on the Apple TV app. Fans can subscribe to MLS Season Pass now through the Apple TV app on Apple devices, smart TVs, streaming devices, set-top boxes, game consoles, and the web at tv.apple.com.

MLS AGAINST INTERNATIONAL CLUBS

Following back-to-back MLS All-Star wins over the LIGA MX All-Star team in 2021 and 2022, the 2023 MLS All-Star Game marks the 17th time MLS welcomes an elite international club for the midsummer showcase. The MLS All-Stars have previously faced clubs from the English Premier League, as well as clubs from Italy's Serie A, Germany's Bundesliga, Spain's La Liga, the Scottish Premiership, and Mexico's LIGA MX. The MLS All-Stars' most recent wins over European opponents came against Premier League giants Tottenham Hotspur (2015) and 32-time Bundesliga champions Bayern Munich (2014), with MLS greats Kaká and Landon Donovan earning MVP honors in those wins, respectively.

ABOUT ARSENAL FC

One of the most decorated clubs in the world, Arsenal has won 13 league titles, a record 14 FA Cups, and currently sit atop the English Premier League with 10 games to go. Led by manager Mikel Arteta, the team features a host of global stars, including U.S. Men's National Team goalkeeper and 2021 MLS All-Star Game MVP Matt Turner. Arsenal's roster of international superstars also includes reigning England Men's Player of the Year Bukayo Saka, four-time Premier League winner Gabriel Jesus, who won the 2019 Copa América with Brazil, and recent addition Jorginho, who won the 2020 UEFA European Championship with Italy, while also having won the FIFA Club World Cup, UEFA Champions League, UEFA Europa League, and UEFA Super Cup over the last five years.

THE REFEREES

Ted Unkel will referee his first All-Star game when MLS All-Stars take on Arsenal at Audi Field on July 19. He will be joined in the capital by assistant referees Ian McKay and Jeffrey Greeson, with Rubiel Vazquez named as the fourth official. Geoff Gamble and TJ Zablocki will provide support from the Video Operations Room, and Lyes Arfa has been selected as the reserve assistant referee.

Unkel made his MLS debut in June 2013 and has now officiated more than 160 regular-season games. He retired from the FIFA international panel at the end of 2021, and last year saw him take charge of 23 MLS regular-season games, the second-best tally of his career so far.

While this is his first major assignment in MLS, he has plenty of experience with showpiece games having refereed the 2014 NASL Soccer Bowl and then the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final a year later. In 2017, he was invited to China, where he took charge of the second leg of the Chinese FA Cup Final, and in 2021, he refereed the MLS Eastern Conference Final.

Ian McKay, the 2019 USL Assistant Referee of the Year, is approaching 100 MLS regular-season games and was AR for the USL Championship Final last year. Greeson steps up after being the reserve assistant referee for both MLS All-Star and MLS Cup in 2022, and FIFA official Arfa will provide support as the reserve assistant referee.

While this will be Vazquez's first MLS All-Star appearance, he was fourth official for the 2019 MLS Cup and refereed the 2021 USL Championship Final. Gamble has been named as VAR and Zablocki as AVAR, having worked a combined total of 38 MLS games from the booth already this season.

This will be the second time Arsenal have featured in this game having beaten MLS All-Stars 2-1 in 2016, and the first time the All-Stars have played foreign opposition in Washington, D.C. The RFK Stadium previously hosted All-Star games against USMNT in 2002 and the last meeting between East and West in 2004.

RULES OF COMPETITION

All players in the squad for both teams are eligible to play. At the end of 90 minutes, if the teams are tied, no extra time will be played and the game will be decided by kicks from the penalty mark.

MLS ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTION

The 2023 MLS All-Star team was selected through a combination of a vote of MLS players, fans, and media, selection by MLS All-Star head coach Wayne Rooney (D.C. United) and by MLS Commissioner Don Garber. A total of 28 players were named MLS All-Stars.

Players were selected in seven specific positions: goalkeeper, right back, center back, left back, defensive midfielder, attacking midfielder, and forward/winger. MLS reviewed performance metrics from the current 2023 season to categorize players in the positions where they are most utilized.

The breakdown of the MLS All-Stars selected was:

- •12 were determined by a vote of MLS players, fans, and media. Each of the three voting groups will represent one-third of the combined vote.
- •14 were selected by MLS All-Star head coach Wayne Rooney of host team, D.C. United
- •Two were selected by MLS Commissioner Don Garber.

Players, fans and reporters cast their votes for 11 players: one goalkeeper, one right back, two center backs, one left back, one defensive midfielder, two attacking midfielders and three forwards/wingers. The top players in each position from the combined vote were named All Stars. The 12th player honored was the one with the next-highest total number of votes overall. To qualify for the ballot, players must have appeared in at least 50 percent of matches this season at the time the ballot was created on May 18. Players who did not qualify for the ballot were eligible for selection by Rooney or Commissioner Garber.

Every player from each of the 29 MLS clubs was provided a special link to vote for their peers. Approximately 500 members of the media who regularly cover MLS also made their picks for the league's top players.

WAYNE ROONEY AT THE HELM OF MLS ALL-STAR TEAM

The MLS All Stars will be coached D.C. United head coach **Adrian Heath**, who will be joined by his technical staff as assistant coaches. In his second year as head coach, Rooney, who twice played in the MLS All-Star Game, will be coaching his first MLS All-Star team.

Rooney officially arrived as D.C. United's head coach on July 12, 2022, after a season as the manager of Derby County. He was appointed as the full-time manager of Derby County in January 2021 following a successful stint as interim player-manager, where he navigated the club from the bottom of the English Championship table to safety, avoiding relegation by three points. Prior to his first full season in charge of Derby County, the club were given a 21-point deduction by the Football Association for admitting to breaches of Profitability and Sustainability. Despite this disadvantage, Rooney guided the club to a record of 14-13-19, totaling 55 points, which would have been enough to secure safety in the Championship for another season if not for the point reduction.

As a professional, Rooney's playing career began in the English Premier League on August 17, 2002 when he made his senior debut for Everton FC and assisted a goal helping the Toffees to a 2-2 draw against Tottenham Hotspur. After two seasons with Everton and at just 18 years old, Rooney joined Manchester United in a record transfer deal (\$35 million) where he played 13 seasons and scored 208 Premier League goals in 491 appearances, which is second best all-time, only behind Alan Shearer (260). During his time in Manchester, Rooney captured 16 major trophies, including five Premier League titles, the UEFA Champions League in 2008, and the FA Cup in 2006. On the international stage, Rooney holds the record for the most-capped field player in England history (120) and is also the all-time leader in goals for The Three Lions (53). He appeared in three World Cups (2006, 2010, and 2014), as well as three UEFA European Championships (2004, 2012, and 2016), and captained his country 24 times across all competitions.

Rooney joined D.C. United in June 2018 as a Designated Player. During his time with the Black-and-Red, Rooney appeared in 48 matches, scored 23 goals and assisted 15 others. He was voted MLS Best XI in 2018, an All-Star in 2019, and was an MLS MVP finalist in 2018. Rooney also played against the MLS All-Stars while with Manchester United in the 2011 MLS All-Star Game at Red Bull Arena.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN BY MLS CLUB

In all, 18 of the 29 MLS teams are represented on the MLS All-Star roster, led by a league-high three players from Supporters' Shield-leading FC Cincinnati -- midfielder **Luciano Acosta** and defenders **Álvaro Barreal** and **Matt Miazga**. ROSTER BREAKDOWN BY MLS ALL-STAR EXPERIENCE

Nineteen of the 28 players on the roster will be making their MLS All-Star Game debut, while Nashville SC's Walker Zimmerman is the most-capped All-Star on this year's team, making his fourth appearance, all of which have come consecutively (2019, 2021, 2022, 2023). New England midfielder Carles Gil, who was added to the roster as a coach's selection on July 7, is making his third consecutive All-Star appearance, while Cincinnati's Luciano Acosta, FC Dallas' Jesús Ferreira, Philadelphia's Jakob Glesnes, Nashville's Hany Mukhtar, and Seattle's Jordan Morris all made their second consecutive All-Star team.

MLS ALL-STAR DEBUTANTS

Nineteen players have been selected as an MLS All-Star for the first time, setting the single-game MLS All-Star record with was previously 18 players in 2015.

Eight players who are plaking their All-Star debut arrived in MLS in 2022 or later: **Thiago Almada** (Atlanta United), **Christian Benteke** (D.C. United), **Dénis Bouanga** (LAFC), **Roman Bürki** (St. Louis CITY SC), **Giorgos Giakoumakis** (Atlanta United FC), **Héctor Herrera** (Houston Dynamo FC), **Djordje Petrović** (New England Revolution), and **Riqui Puig** (LA Galaxy)

Other All-Star debutants include: goalkeeper **Tyler Miller** (D.C. United), defenders **Álvaro Barreal** (FC Cincinnati), **Jon Gallagher** (Austin FC), **Ryan Hollingshead** (LAFC), **Matt Miazga** (FC Cincinnati), **Tim Parker** (St. Louis CITY SC) and **John Tolkin** (New York Red Bulls), midfielders **Mathieu Choinière** (CF Montréal), **José Martínez** (Philadelphia Union), and **Aidan Morris** (Columbus Crew), and winger **Cristian Espinoza** (San Jose Earthquakes).

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

The 28 players on the MLS All-Star roster have ties to 16 different countries: Argentina (four players), Armenia (one), Belgium (one), Canada (one), Gabon (one), Germany (one), Greece (one), Ireland (one), Mexico (one), Norway (one), Serbia (one), Sierra Leone (one), Spain (two), Switzerland (one), the United States (nine), and Venezuela (one).

LUCHO NAMED ALL-STAR CAPTAIN

FC Cincinnati midfielder **Luciano Acosta** was named the 2023 MLS All-Star captain following the MLS All-Star Captain Fan Vote presented by Captain Morgan. Acosta was one of four finalists for the MLS All-Star Captain Fan Vote presented by Captain Morgan and was joined by Christian Benteke of D.C. United, Roman Bürki of St. Louis CITY SC, and Walker Zimmerman of Nashville SC.

Making his second All-Star appearance, Acosta is having a sensational season for the Supporters' Shield leaders, FC Cincinnati, tying his career-high with 12 goals and adding eight assists for the club. Acosta's 20 goal contributions are the second-most in MLS, trailing only fellow All-Star midfielder Hany Mukhtar (21). Earlier this season, the 29-year-old Argentine midfielder became the only active MLS player to reach 70 career assists (72) and 50 career goals (53).

New to the All-Star voting process in 2023, fans had the opportunity to nominate one of their 11 player selections as the captain of the MLS All-Star team. Of the players selected for the 2023 MLS All-Star team, the four players who received the most captain nominations from the fan vote were placed on a ballot and were eligible to be selected by fans as the MLS All-Star captain. Fans voted from Friday, June 30 through Saturday, July 8, with Acosta emerging victorious in the voting process.

Acosta will wear a custom armband designed by local Washington D.C. artist, MasPaz. The armband is unique to the 2023 MLS All Star Game and highlights the importance of celebrating fans that add spice to the game and their communities.

MLS ALL-STAR JERSEY UNVEILED

This year's All-Star Game jerseywas inspired by the Nation's Capital's famous landmarks and the three stars of the District of Columbia's flag. Jerseys are on sale starting today at MLSstore.com and in D.C. at various All-Star activations.

The All-Star jerseys are available for purchase now at MLSstore.com and will be available at select retail stores in D.C. at various All-Star activations.

THE FORMAT

This is the 19th time the MLS All-Stars have taken on international competition in the All-Star Game. The MLS teams hold an 10-5-3 record, while the scoring across those matches is netted at 30 goals apiece. Below is a recap of each of those 19 matches played against international competition.

2022: The MLS All-Stars defeated the LIGA MX All-Stars 2-1 at Allianz Field in Minneapolis. Minnesota United FC goalkeeper Dayne St. Clair was named the MVP of the game in the first All-Star appearance of his career. MLS goal scorers included LAFC's Carlos Vela – his first in an MLS All-Star Game – and a penalty-kick score from Seattle's Raúl Ruidíaz, while LIGA MX's lone goal was scored by Kevin Álvarez in the 84th minute.

2021: The MLS All Stars defeated the best of LIGA MX in a penalty shootout (3-2), after completing 90 minutes of regulation tied at 1-1 at Banc of California Stadium in Los Angeles, CA. LAFC defender Jesús Murillo scored the lone MLS goal in regulation in his home stadium, leveling the contest in the 53rd minute. Matt Turner was named the All-Star Game MVP after recording two saves in the penalty shootout, and the three converted MLS penalties came via Damir Kreilach, Daniel Sallói, and Ricardo Pepi.

2019: Atlético de Madrid of Spain's La Liga claimed a 3-0 victory in the last MLS All-Star Game, played at Exploria Stadium in Orlando. Marcos Llorente was named All-Star Game MVP after scoring the opening goal late in the first half; João Félix and Diego Costa put the game away with late goals.

2018: Juventus FC of Italy defeated the MLS All-Stars in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta. Andrea Favilli gave Juventus the lead on 21 minutes, but All-Star Game MVP Josef Martínez (of host club Atlanta United) leveled terms just five minutes later. All four Juventus players then scored in winning the shootout 5-3.

2017: Real Madrid of Spain defeated the MLS All-Stars in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw at Soldier Field in Chicago. All-Star Game MVP Borja Mayoral gave the visitors the lead just before the hour, but Dom Dwyer netted the leveler three minutes from full time. All four Real players then scored in winning the shootout 4-2.

2016: Arsenal FC of England defeated the MLS All-Stars 2-1 at Avaya Stadium in San Jose, Calif. Joel Campbell converted a penalty kick to give Arsenal the lead after 11 minutes, but Didier Drogba equalized for the MLS side in first-half stoppage time. With three minutes to play, substitute Chuba Akpom scored the match-winner for Arsenal, earning his All-Star Game MVP honors.

2015: The MLS All-Stars defeated Tottenham Hotspur of England 2-1 at Dick's Sporting Goods Park in Commerce City, Colo. Kaká converted a penalty kick in the 20th minute to send the MLS side on their way, and David Villa doubled the lead just three minutes later. Harry Kane pulled a goal back for Spurs in the 37th minute, but the MLS side held out for the win. Kaká was named the All-Star Game MVP.

2014: The MLS All-Stars defeated FC Bayern München of Germany 2-1 at Providence Park in Portland, Ore. Robert Lewandowski gave Bayern the lead after just eight minutes, but Bradley Wright-Phillips leveled the score six minutes after the halftime break. Then in the 70th minute, Landon Donovan – making his record 12th All-Star Game appearance in his final season – netted the match-winner. Donovan was named the All-Star Game MVP.

2013: AS Roma defeated the MLS All-Stars 3-1 at Sporting Park in Kansas City, Kan., the fourth victory by the foreign

opposition in five MLS All-Star Games.

2012: The event was a rematch, as the MLS All-Stars defeating Chelsea FC of the English Premier League 3-2 at PPL Park in Chester, Pa. It was a rematch of the 2006 game, won 1-0 by the MLS All-Stars at Toyota Park in Bridgeview, Ill.

2011: Manchester United FC provided the opposition each of the two previous years. United won 4-0 in 2011 at Red Bull Arena in Harrison, N.J., after winning 5-2 in 2010 at Reliant Stadium in Houston.

2009: English Premier League side Everton FC ended the five-game winning streak by the MLS All-Stars in a penalty kick shootout after a 1-1 draw over 90 minutes. Everton FC goalkeeper Tim Howard received the game's Most Valuable Player award after making three saves in the penalty decider.

2008: The MLS All-Stars defeated English Premier League side West Ham United 3-2 in Toronto, the first All-Star Game played outside the USA.

2007: The MLS All-Stars defeated Scottish Premier League power Celtic FC 2-0.

2005: The MLS All-Stars defeat English Premier League club Fulham FC 4-1 at Columbus Crew Stadium.

2003: The MLS All-Stars downed Mexican club CD Guadalajara 3-1 at The Home Depot Center. The contest was the second consecutive year a single team of MLS All-Stars was selected for the midseason classic, as the year before the MLS All-Stars took on a U.S. national team selection following the USA's historic quarterfinal performance at FIFA World Cup 2002 Korea/Japan. All 18 of the players selected by Bruce Arena for the match plied their trade in MLS.

1998: An international theme was also used in the MLS All-Star Game as a team of U.S. MLS stars took on a squad comprised of international MLS stars. Each of the other seven All-Star Games has featured an East vs. West format.



Rising Stars Compete in Washington, D.C. for Second Annual MLS NEXT All-Star Game Presented by Allstate

The second-annual MLS NEXT All-Star Game presented by Allstate will provide a world-class experience for North America's rising stars to showcase their talents in an East vs. West format at the Naval Academy's Glenn Warner Soccer Facility in Annapolis, Md., on Wednesday, July 19 at 10:30 a.m. ET.

MLS NEXT and Allstate will provide the selected players with a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity during MLS All-Star Week, which will include a full slate of evening programming events and activities in advance of the match. The players will be fully integrated into MLS All-Star Week festivities, which include team training, the All-Star Skills Challenge presented by AT&T 5G on July 18 and the MLS All-Star Game on July 19.



Among the players who were selected to the inaugural game in 2022, 24 of those have gone on to sign professional contracts, including nine as Homegrown players. Notable standout players who have made an impact in MLS include New England's Esmir Bajraktarevic and Jack Panayotou, along with Inter Miami CF's Benjamin Cremaschi.
