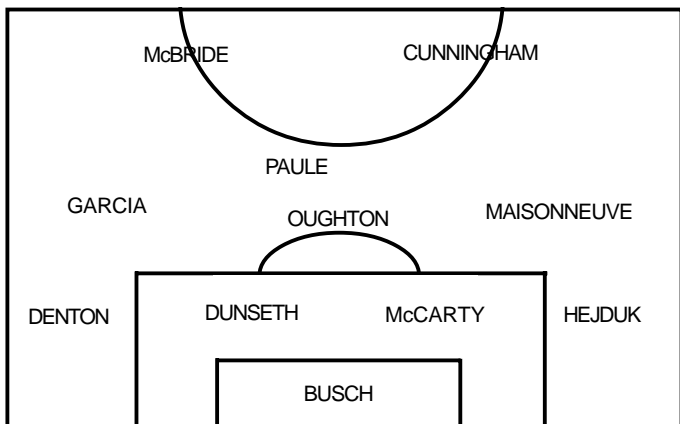

## Crew Notes

### CUNNINGHAM, HEJDUK, MARTINO AND OUGHTON RETURN

Crew and U.S. national team members Jeff Cunningham, Frankie Hejduk and Kyle Martino, as well as Crew and New Zealand international Duncan Oughton have returned to the states after participating in the 2003 FIFA Confederations Cup in France from June 18-29. Neither the U.S. nor New Zealand advanced out of group play. The U.S. went 0-2-1 while New Zealand went 0-3-0. Oughton played in all three games for the Kiwis, two starts, while Hejduk and Martino each played in one game.

### MARTINO GETS FIRST-EVER START FOR U.S., LEAVES GAME WITH INJURY AND OUT FOR D.C.

Crew midfielder Kyle Martino made his first-ever start for the U.S. national team in the team's third game against Cameroon, which ended in a 0-0 tie. It was Martino's third appearance for the U.S., but his stay wasn't as long as he would have liked after a vicious slide tackle in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute forced him out of the game with a sprained left ankle. The Cameroon player was issued a yellow card on the play. He will miss this Saturday's D.C. game and maybe the July 5 game vs. Dallas.

### BUSCH ON THE MEND WITH ANKLE INJURY, BUDDLE STILL OUT

Injuries continue to take its toll on The Crew. The Black & Gold lost goalkeeper Jon Busch with a sprained right ankle this past Saturday, June 21, at San Jose. Busch was attempting to punch away a ball in the box in the 31<sup>st</sup> minute when he collided with a San Jose player and Crew defender Brian Dunseth, coming down on Dunseth's foot and being forced to leave the game in the 37<sup>th</sup> minute. Busch is expected out for 2-3 weeks. Also, Crew forward Edson Buddle continues to be bothered by a painful right hip injury. After playing the first three games of the season, he finally returned to the field on June 14 at D.C. but looked uncomfortable. He again came on as a substitute on June 21 at San Jose but only played nine minutes before limping off after irritating the injury on a shot. He will be evaluated on a week-by-week basis.

### PRESTHUS TO GET HIS SECOND START OF THE YEAR

Due to Jon Busch's ankle injury suffered on June 21 at San Jose, Tom Presthus will get his second start of the year. He started the June 14 game at D.C. and then came on for Busch on June 21 in San Jose after Busch hurt his ankle.

### CLARK TO MISS D.C. GAME TO DUE RED CARD

Crew defender and iron man Mike Clark will miss the June 28 home game vs. D.C. United after getting a red card in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute of The Crew's game at San Jose on June 21. He was ejected for getting into an altercation with Earthquake forward Manny Lagos, who was also ejected.

### McBRIDE 3<sup>RD</sup> IN MLS IN SCORING, CUNNINGHAM TIED FOR 8<sup>TH</sup>

Brian McBride is third in Major League Soccer in scoring with 14 points on six goals and two assists, while Jeff Cunningham is tied for eighth at 11 points (4g, 3a). Preki leads MLS in scoring with 20 points, while Ante Razov has 19.

### McBRIDE NOW TIED FOR 7<sup>TH</sup> ALL-TIME FOR GAME WINNING GOALS, CUNNINGHAM STILL 4<sup>TH</sup>

Brian McBride tallied his 15<sup>th</sup> all-time game-winning goal in The Crew's 1-0 win over San Jose on June 7 at Crew Stadium. The 15 game-winning goals puts him tied for 7<sup>th</sup> with Clint Mathis and former MLS star Paul Bravo. Jeff Cunningham has 17 career game-winning goals and sits in 4<sup>th</sup> place all-time. Jason Kreis leads all-time with 27.

### McBRIDE HITS 156 CAREER POINTS, IS 11<sup>TH</sup> ALL-TIME IN SCORING

With the lone goal in The Crew's 2-1 loss at San Jose on June 21 at Spartan Stadium, Brian McBride has now tallied 156 career points to rank 11<sup>th</sup> all-time in MLS in scoring. The forward has 56 career goals and 44 career assists, trailing 10<sup>th</sup>-place Marco Etcheverry by four points (160).

### McBRIDE 9<sup>TH</sup> ON ALL-TIME GOAL-SCORING LIST

Brian McBride has moved into ninth on the all-time goal scoring list after scoring a goal in The Crew's 1-0 win over San Jose on June 7 at Crew Stadium. His goal moved him past former MLS forward Diego Serna. He trails eighth-place Cobi Jones by three goals (59).

### CLARK OVER 200 CAREER REGULAR SEASON GAMES PLAYED, SURPASSES 17,000 MINUTES

When Crew captain Mike Clark took the field on Saturday, May 24, at home vs. New England, it was his 200<sup>th</sup> career regular season appearance. He now has 204 appearances to rank 6<sup>th</sup> all-time in MLS, with Steve Ralston leading at 214. Counting all competitions, Clark has appeared in 246 games (203 MLS regular season, 22 MLS Playoff, 17 U.S. Open Cup, one FC Giants Cup, and three CONCACAF Champions Cup games). Clark also became just the sixth player in league history to surpass 17,000 career minutes played on May 24. He now has played 17,288 minutes.

### CREW STADIUM TO HOST 3 SETS OF DOUBLEHEADERS FOR THE FIFA WOMEN'S WORLD CUP, INCLUDING THE U.S. WOMEN

U.S. Soccer President Dr. S. Robert Contiguglia and FIFA Executive Committee member Worawi Makudi have unveiled the entire 32-match, 23-day tournament schedule for the FIFA Women's World Cup USA 2003. RFK Stadium will be the site of the tournament's first U.S. Women's National Team match and opening ceremonies on Sunday, Sept. 21. The first game of the 2003 Women's World Cup will actually kickoff in

Philadelphia at Lincoln Financial Field with a doubleheader featuring matches from Groups A and B on Saturday, Sept. 20. Crew Stadium and Columbus will host three sets of doubleheaders, including the U.S. Women in their final first-round group game on Sunday, Sept. 28. Crew Stadium will also be one of two stadiums to host matches on the tournament's first day of action on Saturday, Sept. 20, which will feature "Welcome to the Women's World Cup Ceremonies." The other doubleheader at Crew Stadium is scheduled for Wednesday, Sept. 24. The doubleheaders on Sept. 20 and 24 will feature action from Group C. The entire Women's World Cup field is not yet set, with 14 of 16 countries having qualified. Ticket information, game times and match-ups for Crew Stadium will be forthcoming, but a private ticket pre-sale for members of the U.S. Soccer community has been confirmed. Crew season ticket holders and ticket purchasers for the July 6 U.S. Men's National Team match will be offered a priority purchasing opportunity.

### FIFA WOMEN'S WORLD CUP TICKET OFFER AVAILABLE TO ANYONE WHO BUYS U.S.-PARAGUAY TICKETS FOR JULY 6

Anyone who purchases tickets to the July 6 United States vs. Paraguay men's international match at Crew Stadium will receive a priority ticket offer to buy FIFA Women's World Cup USA 2003 tickets before they go on sale to the general public. FIFA Women's World Cup ticket pricing is not yet set but will be announced in the near future. In addition to ticket buyers for the U.S.-Paraguay match, Crew Season ticket holders and members of the U.S. Soccer community will also receive this priority offer. **To receive this priority offer for FWWC tickets, you must purchase your July 6 tickets in one of three ways: at the Crew Stadium box office, on-line at ticketmaster.com or via ticketmaster charge-by-phone at 614-431-3600. Fans who have already purchased tickets to the July 6 game on-line at ticketmaster.com or via ticketmaster charge-by-phone are automatically entered. Those who have purchased at a ticketmaster outlet or The Crew Stadium box office through June 25 who would like to receive the priority offer must mail a photocopy of their tickets as well as their name and address to: Columbus Crew Stadium, c/o Dept. O, One Black & Gold Blvd., Columbus, OH 43211.** Crew Stadium and Columbus will host three sets of doubleheaders, including the U.S. Women in their final first-round group game on Sunday, Sept. 28. Crew Stadium will also be one of two stadiums to host matches on the tournament's first day of action on Saturday, Sept. 20, which will feature "Welcome to the Women's World Cup Ceremonies." The other doubleheader at Crew Stadium is scheduled for Wednesday, Sept. 24. The doubleheaders on Sept. 20 and 24 will feature action from Group C. Tickets for the U.S.-Paraguay game are currently on sale and are priced at \$44 (club seats), \$34 (upper and lower midfield), \$26 (sidelines and corners) and \$20 (North and South endlines). The Paraguay match will be the U.S. men's only appearance in the Midwest this summer. Kickoff for the match is set for 3 p.m. ET, and the match will be broadcast live on ESPN2. The game will also be broadcast on Telemundo and the Radio Unica network, and fans can follow the match live online via ussoccer.com's MatchTracker, presented by Philips Electronics. The key international match against Paraguay comes just six days prior to the U.S. opening its defense of the CONCACAF Gold Cup championship, to be held July 12-23 in the United States and Mexico. Paraguay has advanced to the second round in the last two World Cups. Crew Stadium, which was named Best Soccer Stadium in U.S. Soccer's 2002 "Best Of" Series and is the home of the Columbus Crew of Major League Soccer, is playing host to its fourth U.S. Men's National Team game – and it marks the first time the U.S. men have been in Columbus in two years. The U.S. Men are undefeated and unscored upon at Crew Stadium, going 1-0-2 in the three previous games.

### "CUP HEADQUARTERS" AND McBRIDE PERFORMANCE NAMED TOP PROFESSIONAL COLUMBUS SPORTS MOMENT FROM PAST YEAR

Columbus Crew Stadium's "Cup Headquarters Viewing Parties" and Brian McBride's performance at the 2002 FIFA World Cup has been named the top professional sports moment that occurred in Columbus or involved local athletes from the past year (June 1, 2002 to May 31, 2003). The Greater Columbus Sports Commission recognized The Crew and McBride at "Columbus Celebrates Sports 2003" last night, June 26, at Nationwide Arena. Ohio State University's first national football championship in 34 years – capped by a shocking 31-24 double-overtime win over top-ranked Miami in the Fiesta Bowl – received special recognition last night as the top sports moment of the past 12 months. The fund-raiser for the Greater Columbus Sports Commission also honored the top sports moments in three categories – professional, collegiate and high school. The "Cup Headquarters Viewing Parties" at Crew Stadium allowed fans from around the country a place to watch every match of the 2002 FIFA World Cup in Korea/Japan live. Cup Headquarters turned into the place to be during the 2002 World Cup as over 27,000 fans visited Crew Stadium at all hours of the night and morning to watch games live with hundreds, and sometimes, even thousands of fans. Over 7,500 fans showed up at 7:30 a.m. on Friday, June 21, at Crew Stadium to watch the U.S. quarterfinal match against world-power Germany as the U.S. fell just short, losing 1-0 in their best World Cup showing in 72 years. Cup Headquarters truly was a special place for fans to watch the World Cup and cheer on their respective countries. The success of "Cup Headquarters" garnered national attention, including a feature in *USA Today*, live mentions by ESPN play-by-play announcers Jack Edwards and J.P. Dellacamera during different World Cup matches, and prominent mentions, accompanied by video footage, on ESPN2's nightly news and highlight show "World Cup 2Night." Crowds at Crew Stadium for the U.S. games continued to grow as the tournament moved on. "Cup Headquarters" welcomed estimated gatherings of between 1,500 and 2,000 for U.S.-Portugal on June 5 (5 a.m.); over 3,000 for U.S.-South Korea on June 10 (2:30 a.m.); more than 3,500 for U.S.-Poland on June 14 (7:30 a.m.); and over 4,000 on June 17 for U.S.-Mexico (2:30 a.m.) in the Round of 16. In addition to the huge crowd against Germany, that morning's viewing party was attended by cameras from

CBS's "The Early Show," which also sent a correspondent; ABC's Good Morning America," and NBC's "Today Show," both of which did live look-ins throughout the match; Fuji TV, a Japanese network with outlets in New York and L.A.; Columbus' four major-network affiliates; WOCC-Westerville; and WHIZ-Zanesville; as well as writers from The Associated Press, *Columbus Dispatch*, *Cleveland Plain-Dealer*, *Cincinnati Post*, *Dayton Daily News*, *Akron Beacon-Journal* and *Lancaster Eagle-Gazette*. The Crew's Flagship radio station, Eagle 103.9, along with 610 WTVN, WNCI and Sports Radio 1460 "The Fan," were also on hand doing live updates. Crew fans also had extra reason to cheer as McBride made Columbus proud by scoring the game-winning goals in games against Portugal and Mexico. Other finalists for the top professional sports moment were the Columbus Blue Jackets' drafting of star rookie Rick Nash and Central Ohio's Jeg Couglin Jr. winning the 2002 NHRA pro-stock championship.

#### **HUNTINGTON CLUB VIEWING PARTIES FOR THE CONFEDERATIONS CUP DOWN TO SEMIFINALS**

The Huntington Club Viewing Parties for the FIFA Confederations Cup are down to the semifinals and has just four games left. The semifinals are Thursday, June 26, with Cameroon taking on Colombia at 7 p.m. (ET) in one semi and Turkey facing France at 9 p.m. (ET) in the second semifinal. Both matches are being shown on same day delay. The third place match is live on Saturday, June 28, at Noon, with the final slated for a live telecast on Sunday, June 29 at 3 p.m. The Huntington Club is also planning to televise select CONCACAF Gold Cup games when the television schedule is announced as well as select FIFA Women's World Cup games. Admission to the Huntington Club will be free and will open 30 minutes prior to the televised kickoff time of each game that is being shown. Fans attending will enter through Gate 4 in the Southwest corner of Crew Stadium. Aramark, Crew Stadium's concessionaire, will have a menu available for fans to order food, and a cash bar will be open. The Huntington Club at Crew Stadium will be open for select soccer viewing parties for the remainder of the year. #### **ATTENDANCE UP AN AVERAGE OF OVER 900 AFTER SIX HOME GAMES COMPARED TO LAST YEAR**

Despite temperatures in the 30's for the April 5 home opener and inclement weather for the May 10, May 24 and May 31 games, average attendance is 15,494, up an average of over 900 people after six home games compared to last season. It is also the highest average attendance after six home games in a non-inaugural year. Only the inaugural season in 1996 (20,694) and the inaugural year that Crew Stadium opened in 1999 (18,690) had higher attendance numbers after six games. Historically, the average attendance for The Crew goes up during the summer months and late in the season. The average attendance for the 2002 season was 17,429 (14,588 after six games). The Crew's record average attendance was set in 1996, when the Black & Gold averaged 18,950. The 1999 average was 17,696, which led MLS.

#### **CREW HIRES NEW GROUNDSKEEPER**

Columbus Crew Stadium General Manager Mark McCullers announced that Matt Williams has been hired as the new Head Groundskeeper for Columbus Crew Stadium. Williams replaces Darian Daily who was recently hired by Paul Brown Stadium and the Cincinnati Bengals as their new Head Groundskeeper. The Mt. Vernon, Ohio native and Ohio State University graduate comes to Crew Stadium after working the past two-plus seasons as Assistant Field Manager for the Cincinnati Reds. His past experience also includes working at the OSU Turfgrass Research Facility, Scioto Reserve Golf and Athletic Club, and Tartan Fields Golf Club. Williams will oversee The Crew Stadium playing surface as well as maintaining the area in and around Crew Stadium.

#### **STAR-STUDED LINEUP OF JERSEYS HIGHLIGHT WEEK 3 OF "SOCCER AID," \$4,118 HAS BEEN RAISED FOR JUVENILE DIABETES**

"Soccer Aid," a unique adrenaline-loaded fundraiser for Juvenile Diabetes Research that was introduced in the United States by Crew Head Coach Greg Andrulis and launched just over two weeks ago, has raised \$4,118.01 to date. Starting on Thursday, June 5, soccer fans began bidding on-line at TheCrew.com for a chance to win autographed soccer jerseys of premier soccer players, as well as a chance to experience the thrill of match day at Columbus Crew Stadium. The bidding period for week two ended on Sunday, June 22, at Noon, with Crew defender Mike Clark and Crew midfielder Kyle Martino's jerseys drawing the highest bids, each going for \$355. Crew defender Brian Dunseth still owns the highest bid at \$510. #### **SCHEDULE CHANGES**

Columbus Crew President/General Manager Jim Smith announced that The Crew's Saturday, August 30 home game has been switched to Sunday, August 31 at 7:30 p.m. (ET) due to Ohio State football's home opener being switched from a day game to a night game on August 30. Ohio State's home and season opener vs. the University of Washington was originally scheduled to be played during the day on August 30 but was moved to Saturday night at 8 p.m. to accommodate ABC. #### **McBRIDE AND CLARK VOTED CAPTAINS**

The 2003 team has voted Brian McBride and Mike Clark as team captains for the season.

#### **THE ORIGINALS**

There are only three players remaining who have been with The Crew since 1996. Only forward Brian McBride, defender Mike Clark and midfielder Brian Maisonneuve were with the team from day one. McBride was the first overall player taken in the Inaugural MLS Draft.

#### **WEST FIRST PROJECT-40 PLAYER TO GRADUATE FROM COLLEGE**

Columbus veteran Brian West became the first Project-40 player to graduate from college. West recently graduated from Ohio State University with a 3.46 grade point average in Management Information Systems. West left the University of Virginia after his sophomore season to turn pro in 1998 as a member of the league's P-40 program. The P-40 program allots players who leave school early money for school while pursuing a soccer career.

#### **CREW PART OF HISPANIC HERITAGE NIGHT ON JULY 12 AT K.C.**

On July 12, the Columbus Crew will be a part of a doubleheader at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City on Budweiser Hispanic Heritage Night. The Crew will take on Santos Laguna of the Mexican First Division at 5:15 p.m. ET, with the Kansas City Wizards regular season contest against the Dallas Burn to follow at 8:00 p.m. ET. The match fills an open weekend in The Crew's MLS schedule. The Crew play at home on July 5 vs. Dallas and at home on July 19 vs. K.C..

#### **CUNNINGHAM BECOMES 14<sup>TH</sup> PLAYER IN MLS TO REACH 50 GOALS**

When Jeff Cunningham scored the first goal in The Crew's 2-0 win over Colorado on May 10, he became just the 14<sup>th</sup> player in MLS history to hit the 50-goal plateau. Cunningham connected on a 25<sup>th</sup> minute penalty kick after he was taken down in the box by Robin Fraser.

#### **McBRIDE AND CUNNINGHAM BECOME FIRST TEAMMATES TO TALLY 50 GOALS WITH SAME TEAM**

Crew forwards Brian McBride and Jeff Cunningham became the first teammates to tally 50 goals for the same team on May 10. McBride has 54 career goals and Cunningham 51. Cunningham notched his 50<sup>th</sup> career goal in The Crew's May 10 2-0 win over Colorado, with McBride scoring the second goal. The next closest pair are former D.C. United strikers Jaime Moreno and Raul Diaz Arce. Moreno, who currently plays for the MetroStars, had 69 goals for D.C., while Diaz Arce scored 44 times for United.

## Match Preview and Review – Columbus Crew vs. D.C. United, June 28, 2003

This is the second of four meetings between The Crew and United, and the first of two at Crew Stadium. The last time the teams met was on 6/14/03, at RFK Stadium, where The Crew fell 3-0 with a goal from Mike Petke and two goals from Alecko Eskandarian. Prior to that match, the two teams battled on 7/24/02, at Crew Stadium, where The Crew came away with a 1-0 victory on a Dante Washington goal in the 52nd minute. Prior to that game, Columbus earned a big 3-1 victory at RFK Stadium in Washington on 7/13/02, with two goals scored by Brian McBride. The Crew held onto a valuable point in the other matchup at RFK, 5/12/02, when Crew keeper Tom Presthus saved a Jaime Moreno penalty kick deep into second-half stoppage time to preserve a 1-1 tie. The Crew also defeated United in the 2002 season's first match between the two, 1-0, on a Brian Maisonneuve goal at Crew Stadium on 4/27/02. The two teams have also had an eventful postseason history, as well, having met in the Eastern Conference Finals in three successive seasons (1997-99), with D.C. advancing to MLS Cup on all three occasions.
