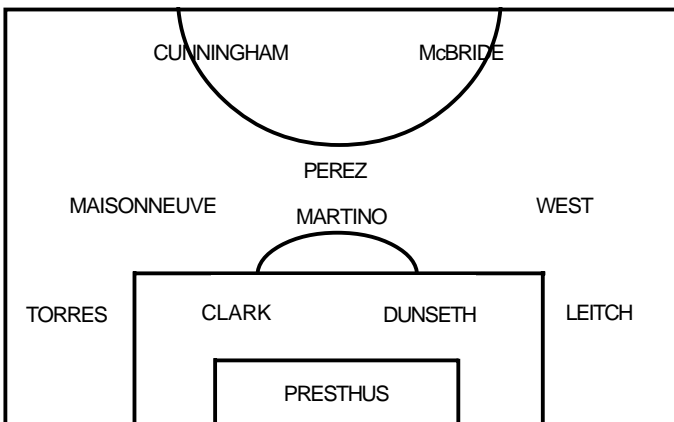

Crew Notes

MCBRIDE HAS FIVE POINTS IN TWO GAMES SINCE RETURNING

Crew and U.S. National Team star forward Brian McBride rejoined his Crew teammates on Monday (July 1), which was declared "Brian McBride Day" in Columbus by City Council President Matt Habash at post-practice ceremony. McBride then returned to game action on Thursday (July 4) by scoring The Crew's lone goal in a 4-1 loss at New England and followed that up with a three-point game (1g, 1a) in The Crew's 3-2 loss to the MetroStars on Saturday (July 6). McBride now has a club-record 46 goals and 130 points.

MCBRIDE WORKING ON THREE-GAME SCORING STREAK

With a goal and an assist in Saturday's 3-2 loss to the MetroStars, Crew forward Brian McBride ran his point-scoring streak to three games, spanning 10 weeks. All six of his points have come during the streak, which began on April 27 with an assist vs. D.C. United. That 1-0 victory was McBride's final game with The Crew before he left to join the U.S. World Cup Team. He scored a goal in his first game back, last Thursday (July 4) at New England. McBride has been involved in every one of The Crew's four goals in those three games.

WEST BECOMES FIFTH IN CREW HISTORY WITH 20 ASSISTS

Brian West became the fifth player in Crew history to reach the 20-assist plateau with his third of the season in Saturday's (July 6) 3-2 loss to NY/NJ. The point also moves West (13g-20a=46 pts.) into a tie for seventh place on the club's all-time point list with Pete Marino (1996-97).

LOCAL ROOKIE CHRIS LEITCH MAKES FIRST START MLS CAREER

Rookie Chris Leitch, the Pickerington High School product out of the University of North Carolina, earned his first MLS starting assignment Saturday (July 6), getting the nod at right back and playing the first 72 minutes of The Crew's 3-2 loss to NY/NJ. Leitch, 23, made his MLS debut on June 12 at New England, coming on for Eric Denton as a left-sided midfielder in the 66th minute. The 34-minute stint marked his league debut, though he did see action – and notch an assist – in The Crew's 7-2 exhibition win over FC Nurnberg (German Bundesliga) on May 15.

CREW STADIUM WELCOMES LARGEST CROWD OF SEASON

A crowd of 19,756 – as well as a national television audience (ESPN2) – witnessed The Crew's wild 3-2 loss to the MetroStars Saturday (July 6) at Crew Stadium. It was The Crew's largest home crowd of the season, to date, surpassing the throng of 19,085 who were on hand for the 2-0 Columbus win over San Jose on June 15.

OUGHTON EARNS FIRST CAP WITH NEW ZEALAND

Defender Duncan Oughton earned his first international cap last Friday (July 5), starting New Zealand's 4-0 win over Tahiti at right back. It was the "All Whites" opener in the Oceania Nations Cup, which continued on Sunday (July 7) with a 9-1 win over Papua New Guinea and Oughton still in the starting lineup. He will not play in New Zealand's final group match, Tuesday (July 9) against the Solomon Islands, having picked up a yellow card and with qualification for the semifinals already assured. Oughton had previously played for his homeland at the Under-23 level, but his inclusion in New Zealand's 20-man roster for the confederation championship marked the first time he has been called up at the senior international level. The tournament runs through July 15. Oughton is scheduled to miss The Crew's next two matches.

HARKES INCHES CLOSER TO 75-POINT PLATEAU

John Harkes inched closer to the 75-point plateau for his MLS career with an assist on Brian McBride's goal at New England last Thursday (July 4). It was his fifth point with The Crew (5a) and the 74th of his MLS career (16g-42a).

CREW, FRIEDEL UNVEIL PREMIER SOCCER ACADEMIES CONCEPT

The Crew and U.S. World Cup Team goalkeeper Brad Friedel will partner to present an exciting new soccer-camp concept, called Premier Soccer Academies, starting in 2003. A total of three camps – in Columbus, Cleveland and Cincinnati, at sites to be determined – will be held in its first year, for boys 14-19 years old. The weeklong, overnight camps will be targeted toward serious players wishing to play at a high level. Friedel is a native of the Cleveland suburb of Bay Village, Ohio, who was the U.S.'s starting goalkeeper in the recently completed 2002 FIFA World Cup, where he had a superlative tournament. He starred for The Crew in 1996-97 and now plays for Blackburn Rovers of the English Premier League. Working with Friedel and The Crew are former U.S. National Team defender Desmond Armstrong, currently the head coach at Montreat College (N.C.), and ex-England international Barry Venison.

WASHINGTON BECOMES 12th TO REACH 50-GOAL PLATEAU

Forward Dante Washington became the 12th player in MLS history to reach the 50-career-goal plateau in scoring the game-winner in the 83rd minute of The Crew's 2-1 win over San Jose on June 15. It was his fourth goal of the season and his 26th as a member of The Crew. His other 24 were scored with the Dallas Burn between 1996 and 1999.

CREW TO HOST RICHMOND IN U.S. OPEN CUP ROUND OF 16

The Crew will play host to the Richmond Kickers of the A-League on Wednesday, July 17, at 7:30 p.m., at Crew Stadium, in the third round (Round of 16) of the U.S. Open Cup, when all eight participating MLS clubs enter the competition. Richmond defeated the Raleigh CASL Elite of the Premier Development League, 3-0, in the Round of 32 on June 26 to advance. Four amateur clubs (three PDL, one USASA) and four D3 Pro League teams took on eight A-League squads in the Second Round. Those winners – all eight A-League representatives – advanced to meet the eight MLS clubs. The Crew-Kickers match will be classified as "Special Game C" in all Crew season ticket packages, meaning that everyone with season tickets already has a ticket to the game. Single-game tickets, priced at \$10 for all seats, are on sale now. The A-League is the second division of professional soccer in America, one notch below Division I MLS. The winner of the Columbus-Richmond match will move on to play the winner of the Hampton Roads (A-League) vs. NY/NJ MetroStars (MLS) tilt in the quarterfinals. The Crew-Kickers winner is currently slated to play that match on the road on Wednesday, Aug. 7. The Kickers won the 1995 U.S. Open Cup, when they were led by soon-to-be Crew greats Mike Clark and the recently retired Todd Yeagley.

INJURIES FORCE YEAGLEY INTO RETIREMENT; JOINS FRONT OFFICE

Crew defender Todd Yeagley announced his retirement from professional soccer on June 25, due to chronic injuries, and he has accepted a position in The Crew's front office. The newly-created post is titled Assistant to the President/General Manager and it will focus primarily on scouting, camps, clinics, community outreach and other community relations programs. Injuries have limited Yeagley's playing time to eight games and 328 minutes over the last two seasons. A chronic injury in his right knee that will require surgery has limited his action to just three games this season, while a stress fracture in his left foot caused him to miss 18 weeks in 2001. Surgery will be scheduled soon for an arthroscopy of his right knee due to cartilage damage under his kneecap that has progressively worsened. Yeagley, 29, an original member of The Crew, having been selected in the inaugural 1996 MLS draft, finishes his career having played in 138 games – currently third on the club's all-time list – and totaled 20 points, on six goals and eight assists.

"CUP HEADQUARTERS" ATTRACTS OVER 27,000 FOR 64 MATCHES

Over 7,500 fans were on hand at Columbus Crew Stadium's "Cup Headquarters" on June 21 to witness the U.S.'s incredible run in the 2002 FIFA World Cup come to end with a 1-0 loss to soccer superpower Germany. In total, the "Best Buy Viewing Parties" attracted over 27,000 people. Crowds at Crew Stadium for the U.S. games continued to grow as the tournament moved on and the success of "Cup Headquarters" garnered national attention, including a feature in the Tuesday, June 11, edition of *USA Today*, live mentions by ESPN play-by-play announcers Jack Edwards and JP Dellacamera during different matches, and prominent mentions, accompanied by video footage, on the June 17 edition of ESPN2's nightly news and highlight show "World Cup 2Night." In addition to the huge crowd on June 21, the viewing party was attended by cameras from CBS's "The Early Show," which also sent a correspondent; ABC's Good Morning America, and NBC's "Today Show," both of which did live look-ins throughout the match; and Fuji TV, a Japanese network with outlets in N.Y. and L.A.

"THE LIVING AMERICAN FLAG" AT CREW STADIUM SEPT. 11

On Tuesday morning (July 9), NBC 4, Sunny 95, The Columbus Crew, Mayor Michael Coleman and the City of Columbus announced "The Living American Flag", an event designed to commemorate the first anniversary of September 11, 2001. The announcement was made at Crew Stadium on both NBC 4 and Sunny 95. On Wednesday, Sept. 11, at about 6 p.m., "The Living Flag" will be formed in Columbus Crew Stadium, comprised of 5,000 of central Ohioans. The interactive event will honor those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001 and also honor those currently fighting for our freedom. Those wishing to participate in forming "The Living Flag" will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. Doors open at Crew Stadium at 4 p.m.

Match Preview and Review – Columbus Crew at D.C. United, July 13, 2002

Back together in the Eastern Conference, The Crew and United take to the field for the third of four meetings this season and the second time at RFK Stadium. Columbus held onto a valuable point in the most recent match between the two teams, when Crew keeper Tom Presthus saved a Jaime Moreno penalty kick deep into second-half stoppage time to preserve a 1-1 tie. The Crew defeated United in the season's first match between the two, 1-0, on a Brian Maisonneuve goal at Crew Stadium on April 27. Columbus is 3-1-2 in its last six games vs. D.C., with United's lone victory in that span coming on 8/25/01 at RFK (2-1). Their first meeting of 2001, 5/19 at Crew Stadium, was a classic. Jeff Cunningham scored a golden goal with less than a minute left in overtime to give Columbus an improbable 2-1 win after playing two men down for 32 minutes. On 6/3/00 at Crew Stadium, the longtime rivals played to the first draw (1-1) in the all-time series, and in the first game of 2000 season series, May 3 in Washington, The Crew ended the RFK Jinx, which had seen it go winless in 13 previous trips to the nation's capital (eight regular-season and five playoff games). The Crew had also lost seven-straight regular-season meetings to United, all by one goal, before that 2-1 triumph. Robert Warzycha scored the first Columbus goal on a 52nd-minute free kick and a late own goal (Richie Williams in the 88th minute) proved to be the game-winner. The two teams have had an eventful postseason history, as well, having met in the Eastern Conference Finals in three successive seasons (1997-99), with D.C. advancing to MLS Cup on all three occasions.

SERIES NOTES

- Each of the last 14 games, and 17 of 22 all-time, have been decided by one goal or less (including five shootouts and two ties).
- D.C. leads the all-time regular-season series 13-7-2, but has only outscored The Crew by one goal, 36-35 in those 22 games and Columbus is 3-1-2 in the last six matches between the longtime rivals.
- No player on either team has played in all 22 regular-season matches. The Crew's Mike Clark has appeared in 21 of them.
- The Crew won at RFK Stadium for the first time ever on May 3, 2000 (2-1) following 13-straight setbacks there (8 reg. season, 5 playoff). That win also snapped United's seven-game regular-season winning streak vs. Columbus.
