

## Crew Notes

### CREW STADIUM WELCOMES LARGEST CROWD OF SEASON

A crowd of 21,432 was on hand at Crew Stadium Saturday (July 20) for The Crew's 1-1 tie against the Colorado Rapids. It was The Crew's largest home crowd of the season, surpassing the throng of 19,756 who were on hand for the July 6 match vs. NY/NJ, the fourth largest ever at Crew Stadium and the ninth highest attendance figure for a Crew home game ever.

### CREW DEFEATS RICHMOND, MOVES ON TO FACE NY/NJ IN QUARTERS

The Crew advanced to the quarterfinal round of the U.S. Open Cup tournament for the fifth time in as many years last Wednesday (July 17) with a 3-0 win over the Richmond Kickers of the Division II A-League before a crowd of 7,887 at Crew Stadium. Brian McBride scored on a penalty kick in the 34th minute, after John Wilmar Perez was fouled in the box, to reclaim The Crew's all-time U.S. Open Cup scoring lead (7g-1a=15 pts), and Dante Washington converted two Kyle Martino feeds in the second half to account for the scoring. Jon Busch made five saves in goal for Columbus to record the shutout. With the win, Columbus moves on to face the NY/NJ MetroStars, 1-0 winners over Hampton Roads (A-League) on Tuesday, in the quarterfinals. That match will be played on Wednesday, Aug. 7, at the Mitchell Athletic Complex in Uniondale, N.Y., at approximately 9:15 p.m., as the second game of a doubleheader featuring the N.Y. Power and Carolina Courage of the WUSA in the first game. The game can be heard on The Crew's flagship radio station, 103.9 The New Eagle.

### MCBRIDE, MAISONNEUVE, HARKES NAMED TO U.S. SQUAD

U.S. Men's National Team head coach Bruce Arena has named an 18-man roster that will battle the best of MLS in the 2002 Pepsi MLS All-Star Game on Saturday, August 3, at RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C., and a trio of Crew players are on it. Forward Brian McBride and midfielders Brian Maisonneuve and John Harkes – all of whom have represented the U.S. in past World Cups – will play for the U.S. in the celebration of soccer in America that will kick off at 3:30 p.m. ET and be televised live on ABC. The United States, which advanced to the quarterfinals of the World Cup for the first time in more than 70 years and captivated a nation in doing so, featured 11 current and five former MLS players. The U.S. roster for the All-Star Game consists entirely of MLS players, with nine of 10 teams represented. McBride has the distinction of being the only player in U.S. history to score a goal in two World Cups (1998 and 2002). Harkes was a member of both the 1990 and 1994 U.S. World Cup Teams and Maisonneuve was a member of the 1998 squad, where he was one of just six U.S. players to start all three matches. A former captain of the U.S. National Team, Harkes' remarkable 13-year international career was highlighted by the fact that of his 90 matches in a U.S. kit, he was a starter in all but one.

### MCBRIDE HAS NINE POINTS IN FOUR GAMES SINCE RETURNING

Crew and U.S. National Team star forward Brian McBride rejoined his Crew teammates on July 1 – which was declared "Brian McBride Day" in Columbus by City Council President Matt Habash at post-practice ceremony – and he has been in red-hot form ever since. McBride returned to game action on July 4 by scoring The Crew's lone goal in a 4-1 loss at New England, followed that up with a three-point game (1g, 1a) in The Crew's 3-2 loss to the MetroStars on July 6, then tallied two more goals on Saturday (July 13) in a 3-1 Columbus victory at D.C. McBride now has a club-record 48 goals and 134 points. After adding the game-winning goal (on a penalty kick) in last Wednesday's (July 17) 3-0 win over Richmond in the U.S. Open Cup Round of 16, he was finally kept off the scoresheet Saturday vs. Colorado.

### MCBRIDE SEES FOUR-GAME POINT STREAK END

Brian McBride was held without a point in Saturday's 1-1 tie vs. Colorado, ending his four-game point-scoring streak. All 10 of his points came during the streak, which spanned 11 weeks, having begun on April 27 with an assist vs. D.C. United. That 1-0 victory was McBride's final game with The Crew before he left to join the U.S. World Cup Team. He scored a goal in his first game back, July 4 at N.E., then collected a goal and an assist in the 3-2 loss to the MetroStars on July 6. Finally, he added two goals in the 3-1 win at D.C. on July 13.

### FIVE CAPS, FIVE WINS FOR OUGHTON AND OFC CHAMP NEW ZEALAND

Defender Duncan Oughton earned his first international cap for his native New Zealand on July 5 in the "All Whites" opening match in the Oceania Nations Cup. Oughton went on to see action in all five matches the Kiwis played in the Oceania Football Confederation championships, distinguishing himself in New Zealand's run to the tournament title, which was culminated by a 1-0 win over arch-rival Australia in Sunday's (July 14) final.

### VETERANS YEAGLEY AND LAPPER RETIRE, JOIN FRONT OFFICE

Veteran Crew defenders Todd Yeagley and Mike Lapper retired recently and accepted positions in the club's front office. Yeagley is now Assistant to the President/General Manager, a position that will focus primarily on scouting, camps, clinics, community outreach and other community relations programs. Lapper is the new Director of Soccer Business Development, which will focus primarily on the development, growth, marketing and implementation of The Crew's year-round camp, clinic and academy programs, and act as the organization's primary liaison with its Premier Soccer Academies.

### CREW SIGNS GUATEMALAN MIDFIELDER FREDDY GARCIA

In a major player-personnel move, the Crew signed Guatemalan National Team midfielder Freddy Garcia on Monday (July 15). Terms of the deal were not disclosed. The 25-year-old Garcia is a fixture on the Guatemalan National Team and comes to Columbus from CSD Comunicaciones, one of Guatemala's premier clubs. Garcia, who made his full national team debut in 1997, is known as the "La Rata" or the "The Rat." Garcia joined the team last Friday (July 12) in D.C. where he watched his new team defeat D.C. United 3-1. Because Garcia possesses a green card, he will not count against the limit of three Senior International players per team. Garcia was an important cog in Guatemala's attempt to qualify for the 2002 World Cup. He appeared in 10 games during the Central American preliminary and semifinal round of qualifying, notching five goals. Guatemala fell just short in final-round qualifying, losing in a one-game playoff to Costa Rica. He played in both qualifiers against the U.S., a 1-1 tie in Guatemala and a 1-0 loss at RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C. New Crew teammate Brian McBride scored the lone goal for the U.S. in the 1-0 game at RFK Stadium. He has also excelled at the U-23 and U-20 levels for Guatemala and captained Comunicaciones this past season.

### WEST IS FIFTH TO 20 ASSISTS, NOW SEVENTH IN CAREER SCORING

Brian West became the fifth player in Crew history to reach the 20-assist plateau with his third of the season in the 3-2 Columbus loss to NY/NJ on July 6. He followed that up with another assist in the 3-1 Columbus victory at D.C. on Saturday (July 13), which moved him into sole possession of seventh place on The Crew's all-time point-scoring list with 13g-21a=47 pts.). West has now surpassed Pete Marino (1996-97) by a point.

### CREW, FRIEDEL UNVEIL PREMIER SOCCER ACADEMIES CONCEPT

The Crew and U.S. World Cup Team goalkeeper Brad Friedel will partner to present an exciting new soccer-camp concept, called Premier Soccer Academies, starting in 2003. A total of three camps – in Columbus, Cleveland and Cincinnati, at sites to be determined – will be held in its first year, for boys 14-19 years old. The weeklong, overnight camps will be targeted toward serious players wishing to play at a high level. Friedel is a native of the Cleveland suburb of Bay Village, Ohio, who was the U.S.'s starting goalkeeper in the recently completed 2002 FIFA World Cup, where he had a superlative tournament. He starred for The Crew in 1996-97 and now plays for Blackburn Rovers of the English Premier League. Working with Friedel and The Crew are former U.S. National Team defender Desmond Armstrong, currently the head coach at Montreat College (N.C.), and ex-England international Barry Venison.

### "THE LIVING AMERICAN FLAG" AT CREW STADIUM SEPT. 11

On Wednesday, Sept. 11, at about 6 p.m., "The Living Flag" will be formed in Columbus Crew Stadium, comprised of 5,000 of central Ohioans. The interactive event – sponsored by NBC 4, Sunny 95, The Columbus Crew, Mayor Michael Coleman and the City of Columbus – will honor those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001, as well as those currently fighting for our freedom. Those wishing to participate in forming "The Living Flag" will be included on a first-come, first-serve basis. Doors open at Crew Stadium at 4 p.m.

### CREW STADIUM TO HOST 2002 MLL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Major League Lacrosse (MLL), the premier professional outdoor lacrosse league, today announced it will bring its brand of hard hitting, fast moving and high-scoring excitement to Columbus as the two elite teams of Major League Lacrosse battle it out for the 2002 Major League Lacrosse Championship at 4 PM on Sunday, September 1 at Columbus Crew Stadium. Tickets are on sale now and can be purchased at all participating TicketMaster outlets, by calling 866-MLL-TIXX or at the Columbus Crew Stadium Box Office. The MLL Championship Game will also be televised live to nearly 60 million homes across the country on the Major League Lacrosse Television Network.

## Match Preview and Review – Columbus Crew vs. D.C. United, July 24, 2002

Back together in the Eastern Conference, The Crew and United take to the field for the fourth and final time this season and for the second time in less than two weeks. Columbus earned a big 3-1 victory at RFK Stadium in Washington on July 13, in the most recent meeting. The Crew held onto a valuable point in the other matchup at RFK, May 12, when Crew keeper Tom Presthus saved a Jaime Moreno penalty kick deep into second-half stoppage time to preserve a 1-1 tie. The Crew also defeated United in the season's first match between the two, 1-0, on a Brian Maisonneuve goal at Crew Stadium on April 27. Columbus is 4-1-2 in its last seven games vs. D.C., with United's lone victory in that span coming on 8/25/01 at RFK (2-1). Their first meeting of 2001, 5/19 at Crew Stadium, was a classic. Jeff Cunningham scored a golden goal with less than a minute left in overtime to give Columbus an improbable 2-1 win after playing two men down for 32 minutes. On 6/3/00 at Crew Stadium, the longtime rivals played to the first draw (1-1) in the all-time series, and in the first game of 2000 season series, 5/3/01 in Washington. The Crew ended the RFK Jinx, which had seen it go winless in 13 previous trips to the nation's capital (eight regular-season and five playoff games). The Crew had also lost seven-straight regular-season meetings to United, all by one goal, before that 2-1 triumph. Robert Warzycha scored the first Columbus goal on a 52nd-minute free kick and a late own goal (Richie Williams in the 88th minute) proved to be the game-winner. The two teams have had an eventful postseason history, as well, having met in the Eastern Conference Finals in three successive seasons (1997-99), with D.C. advancing to MLS Cup on all three occasions.

### SERIES NOTES

- The Crew's two-goal victory on July 13 (3-1) was the first game in the last 15 between the two teams that was decided by more than one goal. A total of 17 of the 23 all-time matches, have been decided by one goal or less (including five shootouts and two ties).
- D.C. leads the all-time regular-season series 13-8-2, but The Crew has outscored D.C. by one goal, 38-37, in those 23 games and Columbus is 4-1-2 in the last seven matches between the longtime rivals.
- No player on either team has played in all 23 regular-season matches, but The Crew's Mike Clark has appeared in 22 of them.
- The Crew won at RFK Stadium for the first time ever on May 3, 2000 (2-1) following 13-straight setbacks there (8 reg. season, 5 playoff). That win also snapped United's seven-game regular-season winning streak vs. Columbus.
