

METRO NOTES

Up Next, D.C. United: The MetroStars celebrate Independence Day weekend with their second game of the week when they hit the road this weekend to take on D.C. United on Saturday, July 5 at 4:00 p.m. ET (ESPN2, WADO 1280 AM) at RFK Stadium. The D.C. United game marks the beginning of the most rigorous stretch of the season, as the team's next five games are on the road. The MetroStars will not return home until after the MLS All-Star break on Wednesday, August 13, when they host Kansas City in a midweek clash, kicking off at noon ET.

Next week the Metros travel to New England, as they are set to take on the Revolution in the middle game of a Gold Cup-MLS-Gold Cup tripleheader being played at Gillette Stadium at 4:00 p.m. ET (ESPN2, WADO 1280 AM). The first match pits Costa Rica against Canada at 1:00 p.m. ET, with the night-cap between the United States and El Salvador kicking off at 6:30 p.m. ET.

Tickets are available for all MetroStars games at the Continental Airlines Arena box office and at all Ticketmaster outlets. Tickets will also be available through Ticketmaster by phone for callers in New Jersey (201-507-8900), New York (212-307-7171), and for Spanish-speaking customers throughout New York and New Jersey (212-307-4757).

Atlantic Cup Heats Up: The Metro-D.C. rivalry picks up new meaning with the Metros carrying five former United players on the roster. Mark Lisi, Jaime Moreno, Richie Williams, Craig Ziadie, and Eddie Pope have all played for D.C. and Metro coach Bob Bradley is a former United assistant coach.

Bradley vs. Hudson: MetroStars coach Bob Bradley has posted a 3-4-2 regular season mark against D.C. coach Ray Hudson.

Return of Jaime: MetroStars forward Jaime Moreno saw action for the first time in over a month for the Metros, when he played 12 minutes in the team's 1-0 win over Los Angeles on June 21. Moreno, who was sidelined with a strained lower back, last saw action for the 'Red and Black' on April 26, 2003 at Columbus, in 1-0 win. The Bolivian International also has seen time in the last two games, playing four minutes at Chicago on June 28 and 29 against San Jose on Wednesday.

Former Metros: There are currently 17 former MetroStars on other MLS teams. Each team in MLS has a former Metro on the roster. The Chicago Fire has the most with four former Metros. D.C. leads all teams with 18 former players and Dallas is the only team with no former players active in the league. The 17 ex-Metros still active in MLS are: Nelson Akwari (2002), Columbus; Mark Chung (1999-2001), Colorado; Ramiro Corrales (1998-2000), San Jose; Brad Davis (2002), Dallas; Rodrigo Faria (2001-2002), Chicago; Ezra Hendrickson (1997), Los Angeles; Daniel Hernandez (2000-2002), New England; Brian Kamler (2002), New England; Manny Lagos (1996-1997), San Jose; Alexi Lalas (1999), Los Angeles; Tony Meola (1996-1998), Kansas City; Ross Paule (2001-2002), Columbus; Orlando Perez (2000-2002), Chicago; Mike Petke (1998-2002), DC; Zach Thornton (1996-1997), Chicago; Andy Williams (2002), Chicago; Kerry Zavagnin (1997-1998), Kansas City.

Quick Shot: Amado Guevara's goal in the seventh minute of the MetroStars game against San Jose on Wednesday night marked the quickest goal the MetroStars have scored this season. The goal was Guevara's second of the season, to go along with his team leading five assists (tied with Mark Lisi).

Denting the net: The four goals scored by the MetroStars against San Jose on Wednesday evening is the most by the team this season, with the previous high being two (four times). The three first-half goals for the Metros in the contest is the most by the team in the first period this season. Prior to the game the Metros had only scored a combined three goals in the first halves of the season's first 12 games.

Mathis Out: With the yellow card that Clint Mathis was issued by official Ali Sahelli in the 79th minute on Wednesday's game, he has amassed a total of 11 caution points in three games that will keep him out of the next MetroStars contest.

Not Once, but Twice: Clint Mathis' goal in the 90+ minute of Wednesday night's game was the first time the MetroStars have had more than one goal by the same player this season. The last time Mathis had a multi-goal game was on May 2, 2001, against Kansas City when Mathis scored three goals at Giants Stadium in a 4-1 win. This was the Mathis' sixth MLS career multi-goal game, four of them have come with the MetroStars. The MetroStars are 21-0-4 when Clint Mathis scores a goal.

The last multi-goal game by a member of the MetroStars came when Rodrigo Faria scored two goals at Dallas on September 5, 2002.

Eye Opening Game: The combined total of eight goals by the MetroStars and Earthquakes ties the largest total of goals ever scored between the two MLS teams at Giants Stadium. The previous eight goal-game came on June 24, 1998, when the MetroStars defeated the New England Revolution 5-3. The largest goal total in a MetroStars game is 10, which came on August 26, 2000, at the Cotton Bowl when the MetroStars beat the Dallas Burn 6-4.

The eight-goal total is the largest total ever in a San Jose Earthquakes history.

Magee Keeping Pace: With his goal Wednesday, his fifth of the season, MetroStars rookie Mike Magee is now just one goal behind Chicago's Damani Ralph for the MLS rookie league. The MLS rookie record is eight, held by former MetroStar Rodrigo Faria (2001), Columbus' Jeff Cunningham (1998), and then-Chicago Fire forward Josh Wolff (1998).

Creative Forces: All-Star candidate midfielders Amado Guevara and Mark Lisi, account for just under two-thirds of the MetroStars assists this season, as they have each tallied five helpers. In addition to the assists, Guevara has tallied two goals and has been named to the MLS Team of the Week twice this season.

2003 Open Cup: U.S. Soccer announced that the MetroStars will be playing the Mid Michigan Bucks of the Premier Development League (PDL) in the third round of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup on July 16, in Berkley, Michigan at 8 :30 p.m. ET . The winner of this game will battle the Columbus Crew in the fourth round of the tournament on August 6th, at a time and location to be determined at a later date. The Bucks defeated the Long Island Rough Riders (USL-PSL) 2-1 on June 25th in Berkley, Michigan to advance to the meeting against the MetroStars.

Metros Acquire Bartolomeu: Last week the MetroStars announced the acquisition of defender/midfielder Edgar Bartolomeu (BAR-toh-ah-MAY-oh) from the Chicago Fire as compensation for the rights to midfielder Andy Williams. Bartolomeu becomes the league maximum third senior international for the Metros, joining midfielder Amado Guevara and forward Jaime Moreno. The native of Angola joined the team on Thursday, June 25 for training at Giants Stadium.

The 26-year-old Bartolomeu spent the 2002-03 Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) season with the Philadelphia Kixx, scoring four goals and four assists in 31 games. In the 2001-02 season, he helped the Kixx hoist the MISL championship for the first time after dethroning the defending champion Milwaukee Wave. He played a total of 94 games with eight goals and 14 assists in three seasons in the MISL (previously the National Professional Soccer League) with the Buffalo Blizzard (NPSL) and the Kixx before joining the Long Island Rough Riders for the 2002 D-3 Pro season. At the Rough Riders, Bartolomeu played 15 games, logging 1,251 minutes with two goals scored. He helped the team defeat the Wilmington Hammerheads, 2-1, to claim the D-3 Pro championship.

Jolley Out: MetroStars defender Steve Jolley suffered a second-degree right hip flexor strain during training last week. MetroStars Team Doctor Ed Decter evaluated him on Wednesday, June 25, with the result of the visit revealing the injury. The All-Star defender will be sidelined for two months.

Jolley, 27, has played all 11 games for the Metros in 2003, anchoring the team's defense, while U.S. International Eddie Pope has been sidelined by injury for the past three games. Jolley tallied one goal this season in the MetroStars 2-1 win over the Dallas Burn on May 24th, and played every minute of every game he appeared in this season with 1,010. A product of the College of William and Mary, Jolley began his playing career with Los Angeles, and was acquired by the MetroStars in exchange for a second round draft pick in the 2001 MLS SuperDraft.

Hello, Farewell: Wednesday's game against San Jose marked the return of MetroStars Tim Howard and Clint Mathis to Giants Stadium, after competing with the U.S. National Team in the Confederations Cup in France. Mathis was named to the 18-man U.S. squad for the match against fellow 2002 World Cup finalists Paraguay on Sunday, July 6 at Columbus Crew Stadium in Columbus, Ohio at 2:55 p.m. ET, live on ESPN2.

Howard started and played all three games for the United States team that posted a 0-2-1 record in the tournament. Howard registered 14 saves over the three contests, and was also named the Chevrolet's U.S. Man of the Match in the first two U.S. matches. Mathis started and played full matches in the final two contests, and came on in the 59th minute for Jovan Kirovski in the team's first match.

Mathis will be back with the U.S. National Team for the Gold Cup, while Howard will be a reserve player for the U.S. squad and will remain with the Metros. The tournament kicks off with the U.S. playing El Salvador on July 12th, at 6:30 at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, MA.

Ziadie Gets the Nod: MetroStars defender Craig Ziadie was called-up to the Jamaican National Team for the 2003 CONCACAF Gold Cup to compete in Group B. Ziadie will leave for the tournament on Monday, July 7, as Jamaica will take on Colombia on Sunday, July 13 at 3:00 p.m. at Miami. The team will then tangle with Guatemala on Tuesday, July 15 also at Miami.

Clark Not Your Average Rookie: Last weekend MetroStars rookie Ricardo Clark scored his first career MLS goal against the Chicago Fire on a blistering 20-yard shot, which rocketed past Fire goalkeeper Zach Thornton. The second overall pick in the 2003 MLS SuperDraft has shown the experience of a seasoned veteran this season for the MetroStars. The 20-year old midfielder has played every minute of every game (1,204 minutes) for the MetroStars this season, an amount of minutes that no other player on the team has matched. Clark's goal, coupled with his strong play in the midfield has made him an early candidate for the rookie of the year award.

Gaven Sets Mark: By starting in the June 14th game against the Fire, MetroStar rookie Eddie Gaven set the record for being the youngest player in MetroStars history to play for the club at 16 years, 232 days. With the start, Gaven also became the second youngest person to play in MLS history, as he ranks just behind DC United's Santino Quaranta, who first saw action at 16 years and 207 days. Gaven snapped the MetroStars mark, which was set earlier this season by rookie forward Mike Magee when he started on April 12 at the age of 18 years, 222 days.

Gaven, a native of Hamilton, NJ and a member of the US U-17 National Team saw 77 minutes of action and registered one shot in his professional debut.

14 Players Make Metro Debut: On June 28, Angolan defender/midfielder Edgar Bartolomeu became the 14th player to make his MetroStars debut this season. The other players are Kenny Arena, Ricardo Clark, Joey DiGiamarino, Juan Forchetti, José Galván, Eddie Gaven, Amado Guevara, Jacob LeBlanc, Chris Leitch, Mike Magee, Jaime Moreno, Eddie Pope, and Tim Regan.

Pope Out: MetroStars defender Eddie Pope underwent a MRI during the first week of June by Dr. William Hazel in Washington, D.C. revealing a non-displaced patella fracture in his left knee. The injury will sideline the U.S. international for 6-8 weeks. The Metro captain suffered the injury late in the first half of the 1-1 draw at the Columbus Crew on May 31. The three-time MLS Cup winner was called to the U.S. National Team for the 2003 FIFA Confederations Cup and was in camp with the team when evaluated.

Pope, 29, has played all eight games for the Metros in 2003, serving as the captain for the "Red and Black." The North Carolina product has been named to the MLS Team of the Week five times out of seven this season. The U.S. World Cup star was acquired by the Metros on December 23, 2002, in a trade with D.C. United, along with Jaime Moreno and Richie Williams, in exchange for defender Mike Petke, a 2003 MLS SuperDraft first-round pick (number five overall), and an allocation.

Bradley All Alone at the Top: MetroStars head coach Bob Bradley earned his 88th career regular season win on June 21st at Giants Stadium with a 1-0 win over Los Angeles. Bradley took the all-time coaching lead with his 83rd win on April 26 at Columbus in a 1-0 win. The win moved him to the top of the all-time MLS win charts, surpassing Thomas Rongen (DC, NE, TB) with 82. The Princeton graduate also owns 13 career playoff wins, putting him just one behind U.S. National Team and former DC United Head Coach Bruce Arena and two behind current Galaxy coach Sigi Schmid.

Metro Debut Scorers: The MetroStars have seen 20 players score a goal or record an assist in their MetroStars debut. Nine players scored a goal in their debuts (Michael Butler, Alex Comas, Antoney DeAvila, Mamadou Diallo, Jim Rooney, Giovanni Savarese, Mike Sorber, Chris Unger, and John Wolyniec).

Seven Remaining: The MetroStars now have seven players from the 2002 team to Bradley's refurbished 2003 squad. Joe Addo, Paul Grafer, Tim Howard, Steve Jolley, Mark Lisi, Clint Mathis, and Craig Ziadie.

Bradley's Search: MetroStars new Head Coach Bob Bradley underwent an extensive search to assemble the 2003 team. The Montclair native looked at 95 players, since being appointed to the position on October 22, 2002. The players came from nations all over the world including France, Scotland, England, Cayman Islands, Cameroon, Ireland, Argentina, Spain, Korea, Australia, South Africa, Sweden, and Jamaica.

MLS on the Big Screen: Major League Soccer and Regal CineMedia(RCM) have teamed up to show four MLS midweek games in HD equipped theaters in New York, Chicago, Denver and Los Angeles. Three games have already been show, however there is one match remaining. The date for the game is July 30th and will be shown to the New York market at UA Union Square Stadium 14. Tickets are \$12 for adults and \$8 for youths.

Heard in the News:

"We let ourselves down. When we needed to use our experience to say, 'It's a crazy game but we've put ourselves ahead with a couple minutes to go; let's make sure we go in with three points' – we didn't know how to handle it. That was pretty obvious. That's the part that sticks with me. We earned a good victory. It's disappointing." – MetroStars Head Coach **Bob Bradley** in the *New York Post* on the result of the game.

MetroStars Head Coach:

Bob Bradley METROSTARS 1st SEASON 2003 Record: 6-4-3 (21 pts.)

Bob Bradley, the winningest coach in Major League Soccer history, was named head coach of the MetroStars on October 22, 2002, becoming the seventh head coach in team history and the first to be born and raised in the Garden State.

Bradley, a native of Essex Fells, NJ, won a state championship at West Essex High School in 1973, played collegiately at Princeton and later coached the Tigers to the NCAA Final Four in 1993.

Before coming home to take over the MetroStars, Bradley coached the Chicago Fire from the team's inception in 1998 through the 2002 season. He coached the Fire to both the MLS Cup title and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in the team's very first season, earning 1998 MLS Coach of the Year honors along the way, and guided the Fire to the MLS Cup finals and another U.S. Open Cup title in 2000.

In five years with Chicago, Bradley compiled a regular-season record of 82-54-15 (.593), tying him with Thomas Rongen for most wins in league history. He also compiled an MLS playoff record of 13-8-2 (.609), guiding his team to the postseason every year and to at least the MLS Cup semifinals in four of five seasons.

Born in Montclair, Bradley, 44, played high school soccer under legendary coach Ralph Dougan at West Essex HS in North Caldwell, leading the team to the Group III state championship in 1973. After graduating from West Essex in 1976, Bradley moved on to play four years at Princeton, leading the team in scoring as a senior in 1979 and earning All-Ivy League honorable mention.

Upon graduation, Bradley accepted the head coaching position at Ohio University, guiding the Bobcats to a 10-5-2 record in 1981. He then accepted an assistant coaching position on Bruce Arena's staff at the University of Virginia, where over the next two seasons the Cavaliers posted a 32-7-2 record.

Following the 1983 season, Bradley returned to Princeton as head coach, and over the next 11 seasons he built the Tigers into an Ivy League and NCAA powerhouse. From 1984-95, Bradley's teams won two Ivy titles and earned three NCAA tournament bids, and in 1993 Bradley's Tigers advanced to the NCAA Final Four for the first--and only--time in school history.

Bradley reunited with Arena in 1996, joining Arena's staff as an assistant coach at D.C. United for the inaugural season of Major League Soccer. Over the next two seasons, D.C. United proceeded to win the first two MLS Cup championships and also captured the U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Bradley earned his bachelors degree in history from Princeton in 1980, and also earned a masters degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 1982. He and his wife Lindsay are the parents of three children--son Michael, 15, who is currently in residence as a member of the U.S. under-17 national team pool in Bradenton, FL; daughter Kerry, 13, and daughter Ryan, 11.

Bradley's brother Scott, the head baseball coach at Princeton, was a major league catcher for nine seasons, playing with the New York Yankees, Chicago White Sox, Seattle Mariners and Cincinnati Reds. His brother Jeff, a feature writer for *ESPN The Magazine*, was also the first director of public relations for the MetroStars, serving in that capacity during the team's first two seasons in 1996 and 1997.
