LAST MEETING VS. D.C. UNITED

Revolution 1, United 0 RFK Stadium, Washington D.C.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The New England Revolution made a first-half Jay Heaps goal stand up for a 1-0 road victory over D.C. United in an intense and fast-paced match at RFK Stadium on Saturday, July 27. The Revolution, having allowed the most goals in MLS (42) including 11 tallies in their last three games, held a team scoreless for the first time since blanking United 2-0 on July 6. The return of U.S. World Cup defender Carlos Llamosa after a two-game absence due to a groin injury helped anchor the Revolution defensive effort.

"Team defense was the difference," said Heaps after the game. "Having Llamosa back was good for us and Adin Brown (goalkeeper) was unbelievable in the net for us. We took some harsh criticism in the last days and it was important for us to play good team defense. It's not just the back four but it's the midfield and forwards, too. It goes unseen in the box score but Taylor Twellman (forward) worked hard on defense all game."

The Revolution came out with urgency and purpose, pinning and pressuring United in its own half to start the game. But the first scoring chance of the game fell for D.C. United's Petter Villegas who fired a long-distance 35-yard shot in the 13th minute. Revolution goalkeeper Adin Brown, replacing Juergen Sommer, had to lunge at full extension near the right post to tip the ball away for a corner kick. On the ensuing set piece, New England midfielder Jim Rooney was forced to clear the ball off his line.

However, New England was rewarded for its early pressure with a goal in the 16th minute. The 1-0 lead originated from a Steve Ralston corner kick from the left side. The ball was headed by forward Ian Fuller and deflected to Heaps who controlled it and blasted a shot which caromed off Ivan McKinley into the back of the net. The goal was the second of the season for Heaps and Ralston's League-leading 15th assist of the campaign tied a Revolution single-season assist record, equaling Joe-Max Moore's 1998 total.

After taking the 1-0 advantage, the Revolution fell into a shell, allowing United to come forward with wave after wave of attacks. Finishing was again a problem for United, a club which entered the game on a 241-minute scoreless streak.

In the 25th minute McKinley had a favorable scoring opportunity as he ran unmarked down the heart of the Revolution defense. With just the goalkeeper to beat, his diving header on a pinpoint cross by Bobby Convey from the left side finished wide of the target. Four minutes later a series of United passes around the New England penalty area resulted in a shot by MLS debutant Eliseo Quintanilla, whose effort from 15 yards out was blocked by the 'keeper on a reaction save.

In the 32nd minute Quintanilla, a forward, turned provider as his header found midfielder Richie Williams making an unmarked run into the Revolution box. Williams beat the offside trap but could not gain full control of the ball before Brown came off his line to smother it.

Looking to add a spark to his squad, D.C. Head Coach Ray Hudson brought on charismatic midfielder Ben Olsen, who was making his first regular season appearance since August 19, 2000 against San Jose with several ankle surgeries forcing a lengthy layoff. It would have been a storied return to the team he led to MLS Cup '99 triumph, when he had a look at goal in the 56th minute. Olsen beat Revs defender Leo Cullen on a Quintanilla through ball down the left side of the box. But he poked a right-footed shot across the goalmouth and just wide of the right post.

New England was under siege for the rest of the match as United pushed numbers forward in a frantic effort to equalize, outshooting the Revolution 18-8 in the match. U.S. World Cup defender Eddie Pope was even brought on to play an attacking position for D.C. as he replaced Olsen in the 78th minute with the latter playing 32 minutes in his return. However, the Revolution succeeded in clinging to the 1-0 result, capturing an important three points in the chase for an MLS Cup Playoff spot.

LAST GAME RESET

Revolution 0, Crew 0 Crew Stadium, Columbus, OH 8/31/02

COLUMBUS, OH. – With a chance to further bolster their playoff hopes, the Columbus Crew and New England Revolution left the field with only frustration Saturday night following a 0-0 draw at Crew Stadium. The match was dotted with close chances for both clubs, including a golden last-second opportunity from the Crew's Jeff Cunnigham that rang off the goalpost with less than 15 seconds remaining in overtime.

Both teams entered the match carrying two-game winning streaks, but the League's most remarkable trend in seven years continued as the opportunity to win three consecutive matches during the campaign was left unfulfilled for the 28th and 29th times on the season. Both Columbus and New England failed in their second attempts to reach the three-straight win threshold in 2002.

The game was not without its chances, especially for Cunningham, who also had a clean breakaway chance stuffed by Revolution goalkeeper Adin Brown in the 78th minute, setting the stage for his spectacular heart-wrenching near-miss in overtime.

The first half-hour of the game saw neither goalkeeper severely tested, although in the 36th minute New England narrowly avoided surrendering the opening goal when midfielder Brian Kamler launched his body horizontally to clear a deflected Brian McBride cross off the goal line. McBride's cross had handcuffed New England defender Jay Heaps, who played the ball of his chest inside the six-yard box, deflecting it past Brown and towards the net as Kamler rushed in to save the day.

New England's found little success offensively in the first half as Revolution midfielder Steve Ralston was effectively corralled by the Crew's left back Daniel Torres, forcing New England to play through Winston Griffiths down the left side. Columbus was also unsuccessful playing the ball over the top of the Revolution defense in an attempt to exploit the speed of Cunningham and Brian West. When Columbus did manage to work the ball down the wings their crosses into the middle failed to connect with target man Brian McBride.

The first 20 minutes of the second half were evenly balanced, as both clubs looked for a clear opportunity. New inserted Revolution forward Wolde Harris came agonizingly close to putting New England in the lead, but his knuckling 20-yard shot was desperately punched away by Crew goalkeeper Jon Busch.

Four minutes later Brown made game-saving stop on Cunningham after the Crew striker had successfully out-dueled Dauoda Kante for a head ball sent over the defense by McBride. Brown held his ground however and went low to push Cunningham's effort wide in an omen of things to come.

Cunnigham's poor luck continued as the game neared stoppage time of regulation. The forward pounced on a deflected shot by Brian Maisonnevue inside the penalty area and quickly poked it past Brown on his first touch only to see his effort flagged for offside. Replays showed the call to be the correct decision, much to the disappointment of the near capacity crowd of 24,422. New England's best chance of the extra session came on a left-footed shot by Heaps that sailed just wide left of Busch's net in the sixth minute of overtime.

Desperately pushing forward in order to claim the win at home, Columbus repeatedly pushed the ball through late-substitution Edson Buddle in hopes of finding a spark. With less than 30 seconds remaining, Buddle lofted a perfectly time ball to Cunningham down the right side, springing the forward on another unhindered run at Brown. Again Cunningham went low with his shot, but Brown made a sprawling dive to his right and the ball glanced off his arm before striking the post and rolling out for a corner kick. Columbus attempted a last gasp effort on the corner, but the ball was cleared as the final whistle sounded.

Brown Comes Up Big: With the scoreless draw notched last week against the Crew, Revs goalkeeper Adin Brown has now pitched three shutouts this season as the Revs starting keeper. Brown made five saves, all in the second half and overtime, in the crucial Eastern Conference matchup versus Columbus this past Saturday. Two of these saves were particularly big as Brown stopped Crew striker Jeff Cunningham's two breakaway attempts in the 78th and 100th minutes. Brown is now ranked seventh amongst MLS goalkeepers with a 1.44 GAA.

Clamping Down: While the Revs lead MLS in goals allowed this season, giving up 48 in 25 games, they do have some success this season in containing the D.C. United attack. In the past two matches versus United, the Revs have shutout D.C., while tallying two victories and six points. This is in marked contrast to their first 2002 meeting with United, in which the Revs were downed 3-2.

Twellman Closes In: Taylor Twellman needs just one more goal to tie the Revolution's all-time record for goals in a single season. The record is currently held by Raul Diaz Arce, who tallied 18 goals and eight assists for 44 points in the 1998 season. Twellman currently has 17 goals and five assists thus far with three games remaining in the regular season.

Trouble Away from RFK: The Revs opponent this evening, D.C. United, has yet to win an away match this season. This should prove an interesting stat as this match has considerable implications in both team's late-season playoff run. While both squads do not currently occupy a playoff spot, only three points separate the teams. A victory would greatly enhance the Revs' playoffs chances, while making it very difficult for United to qualify for the postseason. A United victory would tie the two squads up with 29 points and even their head-to-head record on the season at 2-2. With the second tie breaker being goal-differential, to overtake the Revs, United would have to win by three goals or more.

Parity, Anyone?: There has not been a three-game winning streak posted by any team in MLS thus far in the 2002 season. Last Saturday's game between the Revs and the Crew was an ideal chance to stop this trend as both the Revs and the Crew were riding two-game win streaks going into that match. Their scoreless draw kept this peculiar trend going in the 2002 MLS campaign.

History Repeating????: The Revs need to rattle off several wins in a row as well as get help from other teams in order to secure a postseason berth. Statistically speaking, tonight's match versus United and the 9/14 vs. DAL look particularly promising for the Revs as they have a combined record of 3-1 record this season against the opponents they will face on those dates, outscoring their opponents 7-3.

MLS Cup 2002 Tickets Now Available: Single-game tickets are now on sale for Major League Soccer's premier event, MLS Cup, which now calls New England's sparkling jewel, Gillette Stadium, home for 2002. Gillette Stadium will host the League's seventh championship game, MLS Cup 2002, on Sunday, October 20, 2002 at 1:30 p.m. ET. The championship match will be broadcast live on ABC Sports. Tickets went on sale at the state-of-the-art Gillette Stadium and all TicketMaster outlets Thursday morning, 8/29, at 9:00 a.m.

Injury Report: Jim Rooney and Shaker Asad will be sitting out this match for the Revs. Carlos Llamosa is listed as QUESTIONABLE [50/50] as he is still recovering from a pulled hamstring suffered in the 11th minute on 8/28 against the Rapids. STEVE NICOL New England Revolution 2nd Season [1999, 2002] 2002 Record: 7-10-1

The New England Revolution announced on 5/23/02 that Steve Nicol will serve as interim head coach after the dismissal of former head coach Fernando Clavijo. Nicol, 40, had been a player/coach for the Boston Bulldogs since 1999. Also in 1999, he served as interim coach for the Revolution, winning both games he coached to close out that season.

"Steve Nicol is a logical choice as our interim head coach. He is familiar with our players having performed as the assistant coach for our team throughout this season. He has also the experience of leading the team as an interim coach late in the 1999 season," commented Revs GM Todd Smith.

Nicol made 467 appearances for English powerhouse Liverpool between 1981 and 1995, during which time the club was one of the world's top teams. Nicol anchored the Liverpool defense that won four English League Titles, three English F.A. Cup Titles, and reached two European Championship Finals. In 1984, Liverpool and Nicol defeated Italian club Roma to capture the 1984 European Cup. He has made 27 appearances for the Scottish National Team, and started for Scotland in the 1986 World Cup in Mexico. He made his last appearance for the Scottish national side in 1992. He also played with Sheffield Wednesday and Doncaster Rovers in England. He served as player/coach for First Division club Notts County in England in 1995.

Last year, Harris scored New England's lone goal in the Revs first-ever championship appearance, a 2-1 loss to LA in the Open Cup final on 10/27/01. "Woldinho" tied the MLS all-time scoring streak, finding the back of the net in seven consecutive games in 2000. In 1999, Harris, 28, finished second on the Rapids in scoring with eight goals and eight assists while starting in a career high 24 games.
