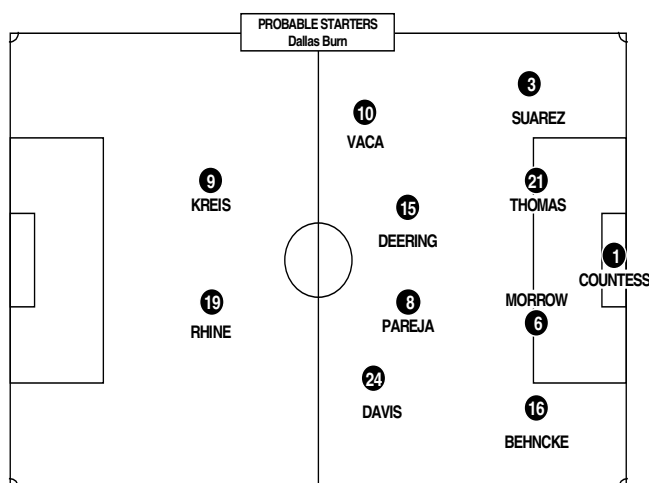

LAST MEETING vs. UNITED:

Burn 3, United 2

May 31 @ Dragon Stadium

The Burn earned their first victory of the season as they held off D.C. United in a 3-2 victory on May 31 at Dragon Stadium.

Dallas converted on an early scoring opportunity in the 16th minute as forward Jason Kreis sent a glancing header past D.C. United goalkeeper Nick Rimando. It was left midfielder Brad Davis who lofted a cross from the left flank and Kreis beat out D.C. defender Brandon Prideaux to the ball. It was Kreis' team-leading fourth goal of the season and it brought him within five goals of the all-time goal-scoring record set by Roy Lassiter (88 goals).

While D.C. could not capitalize on its scoring chances, Dallas took advantage of consecutive defensive lapses by its opponents to head into the locker room up 2-0. In the 41st minute Burn forward Bobby Rhine beat the offside trap and ran onto a ball in the box but a charging Rimando deflected his effort for a corner kick. On the ensuing set piece from the left corner taken by Davis, Gbandi was left unmarked at the center of the six-yard box and slotted home past Rimando for his first MLS goal in only his second career start.

D.C. United pulled one back early in the second half as midfielder Bobby Convey scored in the 51st minute on a powerful and accurate left-footed shot.

Eskandarian battled for the ball at the top of the Dallas box and poked the ball to an onrunning Convey, who blasted a low shot inside the far right post for his first goal of the season.

After Rimando kept United in the game with a save on a volley by Rhine in the 60th minute, the Burn earned a penalty kick in the 74th minute and converted on the spot kick to extend their lead to 3-1. United midfielder Earnie Stewart was judged to have fouled Dallas midfielder Joselito Vaca just inside the right side of the United penalty area. Second half substitute Ronald Cerritos stepped up to convert the PK for his first goal of the year.

Down by two goals, United brought on player/coach Hristo Stoitchkov and pushed forward with urgency. On United's best opportunity in the closing stages, Convey saw his right-footed shot saved by Countess, who collected the rebound off the left post before Eskandarian could get a foot on the ball (85th minute). Convey would eventually succeed in reducing the deficit to 3-2 in the 89th minute when he slid onto a Stoitchkov cross and poked the ball past Countess.

LAST GAME RESET:

Burn 0, Galaxy 3

June 28 @ The Home Depot Center

Led by three-point performances from Chris Albright and Carlos Ruiz, the Los Angeles Galaxy cruised past the Dallas Burn 3-0 at The Home Depot Center on Saturday night.

In the 20th minute the Galaxy's overwhelming edge in possession finally paid dividends as Sasha Victorine put the home side up 1-0. The play began when Alex Pineda Chacon spotted a wide-open Alejandro Moreno down the right wing. With plenty of time to survey his options, Moreno sent a cross through the six-yard box that was nodded down by Chris Albright at the near post. The ball skipped directly to Victorine at the far post, who blasted a left-footed volley directly at recovering Dallas goalkeeper D.J. Countess from close range. Although he made the initial save scrambling across the goal, Countess was unable to keep the ball out of the net as it glanced off his chest and into the goal.

Despite the Galaxy onslaught, Dallas almost tied the game in the 29th minute, but quick reactions from goalkeeper Kevin Hartman thwarted a Dallas counterattack as he swatted down a promising header from Bobby Rhine. Los Angeles continued to create quality chances though, nearly doubling their lead in the 31st minute when a tough-angle shot from Cobi Jones struck the crossbar. Los Angeles kept the pressure on in the second half and as the match reached the hour mark Albright gave his club a two-goal cushion. After a quick exchange by Jones and Ruiz in the heart of the Burn penalty area, Ruiz managed to lay the ball off wide left directly into the path of a charging Albright, who beat Countess high to the near post. The goal was Albright's third of the season coming off his two-goal performance in Wednesday's 2-2 draw at Colorado earlier in the week.

Just minutes later, another heads up play from Ruiz erased any hopes of a Burn comeback. After receiving a ball deep in the midfield, Ruiz wheeled away from pressure by the Burn's Shavar Thomas and picked out Pineda Chacon streaking down the left flank. As he received the ball and moved into the penalty area, Pineda Chacon was ridden to the turf by the Burn's Ryan Suarez and referee Ali Saheli immediately signaled for a penalty kick. Ruiz, who played his first match since serving a two-game suspension, easily tucked home his shot to give the Galaxy a 3-0 lead.

MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES:

BURN TO HOST DC WEDNESDAY, AT COLUMBUS ON SATURDAY

For the second time in three weeks, the Burn will play a pair of games this week as they host DC United on Wednesday at 8:00 p.m. at Dragon Stadium and travel to Columbus to face the Crew on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. The Burn (2-6-3, 9 points) are currently tied for fourth in the Western Conference while United (2-4-6, 12 points) are in fifth place in the East.

THE SERIES

The Burn leads the all-time series vs. United, 12-7-1...the two teams have met twice this year, a 0-0 draw at DC on May 3 and a 3-2 Burn victory on May 31 in Dallas...Dallas currently has a seven-game unbeaten streak vs. DC, going 5-0-1 and outscoring United 16-6 over that span...Dallas has won the last five home games vs. DC while outscoring them 12-3...Jason Kreis has nine goals and four assists for 22 points in 20 career matches vs. United.

“A SHOT AT HISTORY” NOW JUST FOUR GOALS AWAY

With his goal in the 45th minute on June 21 vs. Colorado, Burn forward Jason Kreis moved even closer to “A Shot At History.” Kreis now has 85 career goals, just four shy of becoming the all-time leader in goals in league history. Kreis trails only former MLS striker Roy Lassiter, who amassed 88 goals in his career.

SCORING WOES CONTINUE FOR BURN

The Burn's scoring woes continued in Saturday's match at Los Angeles as the team was blanked 3-0 by the Galaxy. Dallas has scored one goal or less in nine of 11 games this season and ranks seventh in the league in scoring at 1.18 goals per game. Dallas has scored more than one goal in a match on only two occasions this year, which were their only two victories of the season. Burn forward Jason Kreis has accounted for six of the team's 13 goals.

BURN TO ENTER LAMAR HUNT US OPEN CUP ON AUGUST 6

The Burn will enter play in the 2003 Lamar Hunt US Open Cup on August 6 against the winner of the July 16 match between the Atlanta Silverbacks (A-League) and the Wilmington Hammerheads (USL-PSL). The Burn faced Atlanta in the US Open Cup last year, posting a 2-1 overtime victory at Atlanta.

BURN SIGNS TONI NHLEKO, WAIVES BUSSEY

The Burn announced on June 10 that the team had signed South African forward Toni Nhleko (KLECK-o) and waived midfielder Carl Bussey. Nhleko has spent the last year playing with SK Brann in Norway, appearing in 20 matches, including two UEFA Cup matches in 2002. Prior to joining Brann, Nhleko played for the Jomo Cosmos in South Africa from 1998-2002. He has seven caps with the South African National Team and has represented South Africa at the U-20 and U-23 levels and also played at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Nhleko is expected to arrive in Dallas as soon as he secures his work visa.

KREIS GOALS USUALLY EQUAL WINS FOR BURN

In the seven-plus years of MLS play, the scoring prowess of Jason Kreis has largely influenced the team in the win/loss column. Of Kreis' 85 career goals, 66 have come in wins and only 13 in losses (the other six have come in ties). All time, the Burn is 54-14-6 in games in which Kreis scores at least one goal.

The 2003 Burn squad features the most international mix of players in the team's history. In all, the Burn roster lists players born in twelve different countries: Bolivia (Joselito Vaca), Colombia (Oscar Pareja), El Salvador (Ronald Cerritos), Germany (Matt Behncke), Ireland (Ronnie O'Brien), Jamaica (Shavar Thomas), Liberia (Chris Gbandi), Mexico (Antonio Martinez), Northern Ireland (Steve Morrow), South Africa (Toni Nhleko), Uganda (Tenywa Bonseu) and the United States.
